## State to announce new Excise policy by June 20: Min

Bhubaneswar, May 23: The state government's new Excise policy will be announced by June 20. Excise Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan said Friday.

'We are going to implement a three-year-long Excise policy in a calibrated manner. We have formed several teams to study the Excise policies of various states, and these teams have already started their visits. That is why the government is taking some time to formulate the new policy," Harichandan told reporters.

A team led by the Excise secretary is scheduled to visit Andhra Pradesh soon.

"After the team's visit, the new policy will be announced, most likely between June 15 and June 20," the minister

Previously, the BJD government had prepared an Excise policy for each financial year.

While the new BJP government issued a similar one last year, it now plans to implement a policy that will remain in force for three years.



## People gambling in name of IPL: SC

New Delhi, May 23: The Supreme Court Friday said people were betting and gambling in the garb of Indian Premier League (IPL) and sought the Centre's response on a PIL seeking to regulate betting applications.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kotiswar Singh issued notice to the Centre on a plea filed by KA Paul, who claimed many children had died by suicide after using online betting and gambling ap plications.

The petitioner alleged several online influencers, actors and cricketers were promoting such online apps, luring chil dren in the process.

Paul said in case of cigarettes, packs had pictures indicating the ill-effects of smoking, but in case of betting apps, no such caution was pub licised and even former Indian team cricketers promoted the applications during the ongo

The bench said, "In the name of IPL, a lot of people are betting and indulging in gambling. This is a serious issue.

## 19 razed mutts to be rebuilt

ne state government has announced plans to rehabilitate the the Srimandir Parikrama project in Puri. Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan stated Friday that the rehabilitation of 19 mutts in the pilgrimage town is already underway. He explained that all the mutts will be constructed at a single location to make it convenient for devotees to visit these sacred sites. The land for the mutts has been identified, Harichandan said. "The process for rehabilitating the 19 mutts affected by the Srimandir Parikrama project has begun. We have decided to consolidate the mutts in one location for the convenience of devo-tees," he said. The minister stated that the issue has been examined twice with the Chief Administrator of the Shree Jagannath Temple Collector, and the Endowment Commissioner. Culture enthusiasts and devotees of Lord Jagannath have voiced their concerns regarding the demolition of several ancient mutts under the guise of the Srimandir Parikrama project in Puri undertaken by the previous

## Trump's fresh blow to 'made-in-India' iPhones Reiterating that he doesn't want

iPhones to be made in India, US president Donald Trump has threatened that Apple would have to pay a 25 per cent tariff if phones sold in America were not made within its borders. Apple is positioning India as an alternative manufacturing base amid Trump's tariffs on China that have raised supply-chain concerns and fears of higher iPhone prices. The iPhone maker said most of its smartphones sold in the US would originate from India in the June quarter. However, during his recent trip to the Middle East, Trump had categorically said that he doesn't want Apple to manufacture in India and had chided the company's CEO Tim Cook for moving iPhone production from China to India rather than the US.

The threat delivered over social media could dramatically increase the price of iPhones, potentially hurting sales and the profits of one of America's leading technology companies.

New Delhi, May 23: The World Bank is likely to review next month its \$20 billion lending to Pakistan under the Country Partnership Framework agreed in January this year.

The funds to cash-starved Pakistan were for areas like clean energy and climate resilience for a period of 10 years beginning 2026. India will next month oppose the funding, just as it had done in case of IMF, arguing that Islamabad had used such funds in the past to procure arms and ammunitions, a government source said.

Jaipur, May 23: Shakespeare may not have found much in a name but some in this Rajasthan capital could disagree as they tuck into 'Moti Shree' instead of 'Moti Pak' and 'Mysore Shree' not 'Mysore Pak' -- the sweets the same, the moniker changed in keeping with the an-

ti-Pakistan mood of the times. The name change is complete in at least three famous confectionaries, which have dropped 'Pak' from the entire range of their traditional sweets and replaced it with 'Shree' instead.

So, 'Aam Pak' is 'Aam Shree', 'Gond Pak' is 'Gond Shree' and so on. Luxury offerings 'Swarn Bhasm Pak' and 'Chanrechristened 'Swarn Shree' and 'Chandi Shree', a move intended as giving expression to the patriotic spirit in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack and Operation Sindoor that struck terror targets in Pakistan.

Anjali Jain, the owner of Tyohaar Sweets, a premium shop known for its elaborate and festive sweet offerings in the city's Vaishali Nagar area, said their delicacies must also reflect national pride. "The spirit of patriotism shouldn't just reside at the border but in every Indian home and heart," Jain told PTI. The decision, she said, is not

about linguistics but sentiment. "Customers are also appreciating the decision and are hap-



py to see the changed names. We were also not happy after Pahalgam and Operation Sindoor," she added.

Joining the culinary rebranding movement are Bombay Misthan Bhandar, a decades-old chain of sweet shops in the city, and Agarwal Caterers. All the sweets with the 'Pak' suffix have been renamed.

"We wanted to send a clear message -- those who dare raise their eves against India will have their names erased, and every Indian will respond in their own

way. This is our sweet, symbolic retaliation," said Bombay Misthan Bhandar general manager Vineet Trikha. The name changes have struck an appre ciative chord with customers.

Pushpa Kaushik, a retired gov ernment teacher, said, "Hearing the 'Mysore Shree' name instead of 'Mysore Pak', I smiled with pride. After Operation Sindoor, this initiative feels like a sweet salute to our soldiers - simple, symbolic, and heartfelt."

According to the Rekhta dictionary, the origins of the word 'pak' are Persian. It means 'sweetmeat or confection' as well as 'pure, clean and holy' The Hindi dictionary shabdkosh.com defines 'pak' as 'cook ery, cooking, preparation'.





Bhubaneswar, May 23: Ahead of the monsoon season, the Housing and Urban Development (H&UD) department Friday asked the urban local bodies (ULBs) to follow an action plan in order to prevent water-logging and flood-like situations arising out of 'above normal rainfall' as forecast by the weatherman.

According to the action plan, ULBs would have to inspect, desilt and repair all drains and manholes to ensure free flow of

"Special attention will be given to repairing damaged drain covers and removing encroachments that obstruct drainage channels. Bar screen and wire mesh will be installed in tertiary drains to filter solid waste and prevent blockages during heavy rains," the H&UD department told ULBs, adding local personnel will monitor these sites and carryout continuous waste removal.

## OMFED booth owner among 2 held for assaulting BMC official

Bhubaneswar, May 23: An OMFED booth owner and his associate were arrested by the Badagada police Friday for allegedly assaulting a BMC official during an eviction drive

The civic body staffer had suffered arm injuries after the miscreants chased and attacked him

The civic body staffer had suffered arm injuries after the miscreants chased and attacked him, said Badagada police station Inspector-in-Charge (IIC) Trupti Ranjan Nayak.

IIC Nayak identified the miscreants as Chaturbhuja Behera, 38, a resident of Nuasahi area, and Rakesh Kumar Jena. 35. who lives in Majhi Sahi under the police station limits. Chaturbhuja runs an OMFED booth near Daya west canal road.

Nayak said the incident occurred around 12:10 pm Wednesday when BMC Enforcement Inspector Sanjay Kumar Swain, along with his colleagues, were conducting a field review of illegal establishments for eviction in the area. When Saniay asked Chaturbhuia to produce documents of his OM-FED booth, the latter teamed up with Rakesh and launched a vicious attack on the BMC team. While others managed to run to their safety, Sanjay was chased down and attacked violently by the duo. They even threatened Sanjay with dire consequences while leaving the scene, the IIC added.

The Badagada Police has booked the duo under Sections 126 (2), 115 (2), 121 (1), 132, 351 (2), and 3 (5) of BNS. They were produced before a local court Friday for remand.

## 'NRI' fraud held for duping job aspirants

Bhubaneswar, May 23: The Odisha Police Crime Branch arrested a 'suave NRI' conman for allegedly duping highly qualified professionals to the tune of lakhs of rupees on the pretext of helping them get well-paid jobs abroad.

DGP, Crime Branch, Vinaytosh Mishra identified the accused as Bishnu Prasad Pattnaik alias Biranchi Narayan who hails from a place under Begunia police station limits in Khordha district.

'The accused cheated a qualified aeronautical engineer, who passed out from a college in Coimbatore, to the tune of Rs 90 lakh on the pretext of providing him a job in British Airways. and thereafter, Lufthansa Airways," Mishra said Friday.

The accused even created fake offer and appointment letters to deceive the victim who is a resident of Gunupur.

Based on the complaint lodged by the victim, a case was registered at Gunupur police station of Rayagada district October 29, 2018.

The Crime Branch later took up the investigation after registering a fresh case, the DGP

The Crime Branch, during the course of investigation into both these cases, also came across the involvement of Pattnaik in another fraud case registered at the Bissamcuttack Police Station of the district April 9, 2002.

The police there have also submitted a chargesheet in the case showing Pattnaik as an absconding accused.

'It is found that Pattnaik would introduce himself as a doctor, professor and engineer to his unsuspecting victims and charmed them into believing the same. However, during the inquiry his credentials were appeared dubious and are under

investigation," said the Crime Branch in a press note. It further added that the ac-

cused created forged offer and appointment letters of international consultancy companies. Pattnaik also forged identity

documents like address proof and driving license to conceal his identity and whereabouts. "While the investigation

was in progress, the accused fled to Cambodia and purportedly created a second passport to conceal his identity. Lookout Circular (LoC) was issued against Bishnu Prasad Pattnaik 17.01.2019 which was requested to continue in 2020 also. To evade arrest, the accused has been staying in Cambodia since 2012 and claims to have started an IT firm there which is under investigation," added the Crime Branch.

However, despite the issu-

ance of LoC, Pattnaik managed to visit Odisha often by misleading the law enforcement agencies. The cops also ascer tained that Pattnaik is involved in several other cases related to job fraud in Visakhapatnam Berhampur, Bhubaneswar and

other parts of the country. "He last came to Odisha in 2023 and his movements were kept under watch. It was found that he came to India in May, 2025 and the Crime Branch team, based on tech intelligence, kept surveillance and tracked him down on his arrival in India before arresting him from Bhubaneswar Wednesday," claimed Crime

DGP Mishra revealed that police will soon approach the court seeking remand for Pattnaik for further investigation.

# STF nabs key operative in gun running racket

Bhubaneswar, May 23: The Special Task Force (STF) of Odisha Police has apprehended the key figure behind the state's illegal arms trade from Munger in Bihar, an official claimed

The STF with the help of Munger police May 20 arrested Md Aslam, STF DIG Pinak Mishra stated.

The accused was apprehended in connection with a case of illegal firearms manufacturing in Cuttack district.

One manufacturing unit of illegal firearms operating in a house in Bada Dhuleswar village was detected by the police March 13, 2025.

During searches, a huge quantity of 7 mm pistol manufacturing materials was seized from the possession of five accused persons who were subsequently arrested.

Stating that Aslam was also involved in crimes in Bihar and Kolkata, Mishra said, "The STF will appeal to the court for remand of the accused to ascertain the other aspects of the

The DIG further informed that Aslam made several visits to Bada Dhabaleswar village to collect half-made small firearms



from the alleged offenders.

Mishra said the police had earlier arrested five people in the case involving illegal firearms manufacturing in Cuttack district. Md Azam - referred as Budhu - and Md Abid Husain were among the arrested per sons from Cuttack earlier.

"Accused Md Azam who al so goes by the alias Budhu, and Md Abid Husain have made several transactions with ac cused Md Aslam on different dates for running illegal arms manufacturing unit located at Bada Dhuleswar village in Cut tack district," the DIG said.

Mishra said Aslam was produced before a local court in Munger and brought to Bhubaneswar on a three-day transit remand.

# Congress vows to take fight for SEBC quota to villages

Bhubaneswar, May 23: Opposition Congress Friday ended its 24-hour dharna near Chief Minister Mohan Charan Maihi's residence demanding 27 per cent reservation in education and jobs for Socially and Economically Backward Classes (SEBCs) in the state.

However, the party vowed to take the fight for enhanced quota for SEBCs, or OBCs as categorised in Odisha, to the villages.

The party staged a peaceful protest at Mahatma Gandhi Marg here opposing the state government's announcement of 11.25 per cent of quota for SEBC students in higher education. The 24-hour dharna began at 11am Thursday and ended at 11am Friday.

The party also strongly condemned the government for not extending the SEBC quota to medical, engineering and technical courses in the state.

"I would like to thank all the Congress workers who staged an overnight dharna amid cided to fight till the end for the protection of the interests of the people belonging to SEBC category, who comprise 54 per cent of the state's population. The Congress will take the agitation to each village in the state," Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) president Bhakta Charan Das said, while wrapping up the dharna.

Das said that apart from SE-BCs, the party is also committed to fight for the interests of people belonging to the Scheduled Tribe and Scheduled Caste cat-

"Altogether, STs, SCs and SEBCs comprise 94 per cent of Odisha's population," he said, alleging that tribals and Dalits are being denied their rights under the BJP government.

He said the party has already submitted a five-point charter of demands to the Governor and had plans to submit a memorandum to the Chief Minister

"However, the CM was not available... the party hopes that the Governor would forward the Congress memorandum to Majhi," the OPCC president said.

Other Congress leaders, including Prasad Harichandan, Jaydev Jena, Srikant Jena, also came down heavily on the BJP government and dubbed it as

"While all the states have made provisions for 27 per cent reservation for OBCs (SEBC in Odisha) in jobs and education, Odisha's BJP government is giving only 11.25 per cent quota, which is a clear discrimination against the community," Harichandan said. Meanwhile, the ruling BJP alleged that both the BJD and Congress were 'shedding crocodile tears' for SEBCs.

'What did the BJD do for the SEBCs during its 24-year rule? Within 11 months in the government, the BJP has made a provision for 11.25 per cent quota for SEBC students in higher education," BJP state president Manmohan Samal said, adding that the government will soon extend the SEBC quota to medical and

## SIT to probe illegal mining in Sundargarh

Bhubaneswar, May 23: Vigilance department Friday set up a special investigating team (SIT) to probe into alleged illegal mining at Hemagiri and Koida in Sundargarh district, officials said.

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi has directed the department to initiate the probe in Sundargarh, "adopting a zero-tolerance policy against corruption", a release issued by the CMO said. The state government's action came after Steel and Mines Minister Bibhuti Bhushan Jena submitted a report to the CM in this regard.

"It was alleged that more than 9,843 tonnes of coal have been illegally extracted from 22 mines in Hemagiri tehsil of Sundargarh district. The estimated value of illegal mining was more than ₹2 crore," the release in Odia stated. Extraction of manganese and iron ore has been detected from "50 illegal manganese and iron ore mines in Malda, Pataweda, Sanputuli, Kolmang and Rusivenua under Koida tehsil of Sundargarh district", it said.

'More than 20,000 metric tonnes of manganese ore and more than 1.200 metric tonnes of iron ore have been illegally extracted from these mines. The estimated value of the minerals is more than ₹37 crore,' the release added.

## Experts call for compassion, early intervention

Bhubaneswar, May Schizophrenia, termed as a chronic mental disorder, affecting how a person thinks, feels, and behaves, continues to be misunderstood and stigmatised across the society, despite of increasing awareness and treatment options. Experts on mental health urge the public to treat schizophrenia like any other medical condition—one that is diagnosable, treatable, and manageable with the right support.

Consultant psychiatrist at Manipal Hospitals SA Idrees explained, "Schizophrenia doesn't appear overnight. It often develops gradually due to genetic predispositions or environmental stressors. Patients may experience hallucinations, delusions, disorganised speech, or even believe they are someone else-like a saviour or a victim of conspiracies. These are not mere eccentricities.



They are signs of a serious mental health condition.'

The World Health Organisation (WHO) estimates that schizophrenia affects approximately 24 million people worldwide, about one person in 300. In India, the prevalence is about 0.3 per cent to 0.5 per cent of the population, which translates to over 4 million people, according to the National Mental Health Survey report.

Despite its prevalence, schizophrenia remains a taboo

topic. "The stigma is the real illness," added Idrees. "People are quick to use derogatory terms like 'mad' or 'psycho, which isolates patients and delays their recovery. We must normalise mental health treatment, the same way we do for diabetes or hypertension," he

Schizophrenia typically begins between the age group of 20 and 30, and its early symptoms are often mistaken for personality quirks or result of stress. Senior consultant in Neuromedicine at Manipal Hospital Dr Pradyut Ranjan Bhuyana highlighted the biological roots of the disorder and said, "Schizophrenia can stem from genetic factors, chemical imbalances, or structural abnormalities in the brain. These can distort a patient's perception of reality and trigger severe agitation or fear.


With the right care-including antipsychotic medication. cognitive behavioural therapy,

and family support—many patients live stable, fulfilling lives "Continuous psychiatric care is

crucial," quoted Bhuyana. Experts agree that India has made significant strides in making mental healthcare accessible. Cultural awareness through several films like 'Dear Zindagi', 'Kartik Calling Kartik', and 'Chhichhore' has helped destigmatise therapy and portray mental illness with sensitivity. "Cinema, when used responsibly, can spark conversations and change attitudes," added Bhuyana.

"Let us stop labeling and start listening. Mental health issues affect children, women, professionals-everyone. Acknowledging pain, sharing stories, and encouraging treatment can make a world of difference," addressed Idrees, calling for united effort.

Experts also urge policymakers, educators, media houses, and citizens to join hands in breaking the silence

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## **Pollution in Brahmani** raises health concerns

Among the 11 rivers tested across the state, the Brahmani displayed some of the poorest water quality indicators

Rourkela, May 23: The Brahmani River, often referred to as the lifeline of Rourkela, is facing alarming levels of pollution posing serious health risks unless immediate corrective experts warn.

According to the latest annual report from the Odisha State Pollution Control Board (SPCB), the river's water quality has deteriorated sharply due to the discharge of untreated sewage and industrial waste. The report highlights the infiltration of chemically contaminated water into the groundwater as a major source of river

Among the 11 rivers tested across the state, the Brahmani displayed some of the poorest water quality indicators. The mand, or BOD, ranged from 1.8 mg per litre to as high as 39 mg per litre — far above the safe limit of 5 mg per litre. High BOD levels signal severe organic pollution and elevate the risk of waterborne diseases, the board noted.

Despite efforts by the Rourkela Municipal Corporation



(RMC), the SPCB and the Sewerage Board, implementation gaps persist. Several major drainage and sanitation projects remain stalled due to land encroachment issues, halting the completion of critical infrastructure intended to protect the river.

For fiscal year 2023-24, crores of rupees were allocated to upgrade the city's drainage system. However, much of the work remains incomplete. Many major hotels, private medical facilities and industrial units are still not connected to the main sewer network, resulting in the direct discharge of toxic waste into the Brahmani.

To curb pollution from chemicals arising out of idol immersion, a dedicated immersion ghat was built in 2023-24 at Balughat at a cost of ₹1.69 crore. Yet the ramp meant for removing residual waste remains unfinished. The temporary mud ramp has eroded, and the ghat's drainage channels are clogged with stagnant water, creating foul odours and exacerbating pollution.

Additionally, the gallery area at the Balughat site is unplastered, and concrete layers are already peeling, further exposing lapses in project execution.

Asked about the worsening pollution in the Brahmani, Rourkela Municipal Commissioner Ashutosh Kulkarni said, "We will hold consultations with relevant departments regarding the increased pollution levels. Plans are also underway to set up a sewage treatment plant in Koel Nagar, which will significantly reduce contamination in the Koel River, a tributary of Brahmani. In addition, steps will be taken to integrate every pollution-generating establishment into the city's sewerage system, ensuring more robust drainage management.

Local environmentalists and intellectuals have stressed the urgent need for coordinated action. Cleaning the Brahmani River — the city's only major water source — is vital not only for environmental preservation but also for protecting public health.

# NIT Rourkela develops biosensor for affordable diagnosis of breast cancer

New Delhi/Rourkela, May 23: Researchers at National Institute of Technology (NIT). Rourkela have developed a novel semiconductor device-based biosensor that can identify breast cancer cells without the need for complicated or expensive laboratory procedures, according to officials.

The developed biosensor does not require any added chemicals to work. It is highly effective in distinguishing the cancerous cells from the healthy breast cells, offering improved accuracy compared to the existing methods of biosensing devices for breast cancer diagnosis, they said.

The research has been published in the prestigious Microsystem Technologies journal. According to Prasanna Kumar Sahu, Professor at the Department of Electrical Engineering, the rise of potentially fatal illnesses has drawn attention in recent years to the global emphasis on biomolecule evaluation and Point-of-Care (POC) testing. Among these diseases, cancer is a significant global public health concern. In this context, India has seen a significant rise in breast cancer cases in the past few decades.

"Since cancer cells often do not show any initial signs of progression, it is crucial to di-



for prevention and cure. While several diagnostic procedures such as X-ray, mammography, Enzyme-Linked Immunosor bent Assay Test (ELISA), Ultrasonography and Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) are used to identify the disease. they require specialised equip ment and trained personnel.

"Additionally, these diagnostic methods are often inaccessible to people in remote areas,' Sahu said.

The COVID-19 pandemic further highlighted these challenges due to the relocation of medical resources, resulting in delayed cancer screenings and treatments, he said.

"This underscores the urgent need for simpler, faster, and more affordable diagnostic tools that do not rely on complex infrastructure," Sahu added. The NIT team has designed a novel approach that uses the physical properties of cancer

ous breast tissues, which hold more water and are denser than healthy tissues, interact differently with microwave radiation. These differences, known as dielectric properties, make it possible to distinguish between

healthy and cancerous cells.

The research team has proposed an electronic device, Tunnel Field Effect Transistor (TFET), based on TCAD simulation results that can effectively detect breast cancer cells. FETs are commonly used in electronics but here they have been adapted to function as a sensitive detector of biological materials. Unlike many traditional tests, this biosensor does not need any added chemicals or labels to work.

"A small cavity is etched into the transistor under the gate area and an equivalent material of biological sample of cells is placed in the cavity to check the sensitivities of the device. The

electrical signals based on the properties of the sample, essentially 'sensing' whether the

cells are cancerous or healthy "Because cancer cells like T47D have a higher dielectric constant than healthy ones like MCF-10A, the sensor picks up these differences quickly and with high precision," Sahu said

The findings show that the sensor is sensitive in detecting T47D cancer cells due to their high density and permittivity It is also highly effective in distinguishing cancerous cells from healthy breast cells, offer ing improved sensitivity compared to existing technologies.

Another key feature of the developed technology is its affordability.

"TFET-based biosensor is affordable compared to the conventional testing methods and other existing FET-based biosensors. The developed tech nology holds significant prom ise for future medical applica tions, resulting in low-cost and easy-to-use diagnostic devices that bring early breast cancer detection to clinics, mobile test ing units and home settings, said research scholar Priyanka

As the next step, the research team is exploring potential collaborations for fabrication and scientific validation of the developed technology.

## **Baripada municipality** clerk in Vigilance net

**BARIPADA:** Vigilance sleuths Friday caught a senior clerk of the Establishment department of Baripada Municipality redhanded while accepting a bribe of ₹10,000. The accused, identified as Gopal Krushna Pradhan, allegedly demanded the bribe from the complainant to process a request for change in ownership of a municipal shop run by his deceased father. According to sources, Mohammed Jabhir of Puruna Hatsahi in Baripada had repeatedly applied to transfer the ownership of the shop following the death of his father. Despite running from pillar to post for over two years, the request was not processed. Eventually, Pradhan allegedly demanded ₹10,000 to carry out the transfer. Unable to bear the harassment, Jabhir approached the Baripada Vigilance department. Acting on his complaint, a team led by unit in-charge Bikash Swain laid a trap at the municipality office, where Pradhan was caught red-handed while accepting the chemical laced currency notes and arrested.

## Mastermind in armed robbery case arrested

Balasore, May 23: Police Friday arrested the alleged mastermind of an armed robbery in which a family in Soro was targeted and valuables worth over ₹10 lakh were stolen along with ₹50.000 in cash.

The accused, identified as Bapi Pani, is the leader of a nine-member gang that carried out the robbery in Davanidhipur village within the jurisdiction of Soro police station Wednesday night.

According to police, the gang entered the residence of Rabindra Navak by breaking the main door and tied up five family members using torn window screens. The intruders physically assaulted the victims during the robbery, police said.



When two neighbours tried to help, the robbers climbed onto the roof and opened fire to scare them off. One of the neighbours sustained a bullet injury to his chest and was critically injured, police added.

Balasore SP Raj Prasad said, "Within 24 hours of the crime, we arrested the prime accused. Search is on to nab the other accused." Police recovered some gold ornaments, two guns, 20 live cartridges and one car from the accused.

According to police, Pani is involved in 19 criminal cases and was out on bail.

### Man killed, 2 injured in wild boar attack

KENDRAPARA: In yet another case of humanwildlife conflict, one person was killed and two others, including a woman, were critically injured following a wild boar attack in the Mahakalapara forest range of Kendrapara district. According to Santanu Dalai, ranger of the Mahakalapara forest range, Siddharth Mirdha, a resident of Jamboo village, succumbed to his injuries Thursday after being attacked by a wild boar that entered the village and went on a biting spree, spreading panic among residents Two others — Rabin Mirdha and Ashalata Mandal - also sustained critical injuries in the attack. Siddharth Mirdha was rushed to SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack but died while undergoing treatment. Forest personnel are closely monitoring the movement of the wild boar in the area. ## All Smoke, No Fire

ith just days to go before acting DGP Prashant Kumar hangs up his boots on May 31, the race to lead Uttar Pradesh's police force is heating up—but so far, all smoke, no fire. The state government hasn't yet sent a shortlist to the UPSC, nor has it kickstarted the process under its newly minted DGP appointment rules, leaving the top job dangling in a curious mix of suspense and speculation. These new rules—brought in with fanfare as a way to cut through the bureaucratic red tape—introduce a state-led selection committee headed by a retired High Court judge, but observers say it's just a slick way to reduce the Centre's role and retain tighter political control over who gets the badge.

The field is wide open, with a few familiar names doing the rounds in the power corridors and grapevine chats alike. The most talked-about is Tilottama Verma, a 1990-batch officer and DG (Training), who, if chosen, would become the first woman DGP of India's most populous state—a move both symbolic and long overdue. Her CBI credentials are solid, her seniority isn't in doubt, and the buzz around her has only grown since her husband, senior IPS officer Ashish Gupta, took voluntary retirement last month, possibly clearing the decks for her elevation. Then there's Daljit Singh Chaudhary, currently at the BSF, with boots-on-ground experience in central forces; Alok Sharma, guarding the highest of the high as SPG chief; and Rajiv Krishna, steering the state's police recruitment board with a reputation for being calm and competent. But none of this matters if the government doesn't act—and soon.

Because while the rules have changed, the old concerns remain: will the appointment be based on merit, integrity, and experience, or will political convenience win the day yet again? A historic appointment is within reach, but the longer the delay, the more it starts to look like just another backroom chess match, where strategy matters more than service.

#### rom trees to trouble

In Telangana, weekends are not just for lazy brunches but also great for bulldozing forests when you think no one's looking. But the Supreme Court was definitely watching—and it isn't amused.

In a blistering hearing, the Court tore into the Telangana government over the felling of hundreds of trees in the Kancha Gachibowli forest, right next to Hyderabad Central University. The timing? A long weekend when the SC's forest bench was conveniently unavailable. The message? Clear and scathing: either restore the forest in two months, or the state Chief Secretary should start prepping for a stint behind bars.

Chief Justice of India B.R. Gavai didn't mince words, warning the state government that it should be prepared to face contempt. He further called the operation "preplanned" and "deliberate."



The state's defence—that the land wasn't technically forest and that only "exempted" trees were felled—was laughed out of court. No EC, no paperwork, and now, possibly, no freedom.

A report from the Court-appointed Central Empowered Committee confirms what many feared: over 100 acres were razed without approvals. The land is home to wildlife corridors and natural water bodies. Yet someone thought it was ripe for an IT park.

The SC has now drawn a line. This is about more than a patch of green—it's about state impunity and the hope that no one's watching. The Court has made it clear: weekends won't save you from conse-

## Online trolling: A chilling new normal

In an era where outrage goes viral in seconds, the internet has become a coliseum, and public servants' families are easy prey.

Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri recently found himself in the eye of such a storm. Not for a diplomatic misstep, but for merely doing his job. The real target? His daughter, a private citizen, was mercilessly doxxed and branded "anti-national" for studying abroad. Her photos were circulated like evidence in a trial she never signed up for.

This wasn't anonymous trolling from the digital abyss. It was vicious, orchestrated, and met with deafening silence from the government, including Mistri's own ministry.

The abuse didn't stop there. A few weeks ago, Lieutenant Vinay Narwal, a newlywed naval officer, was killed in the Pahalgam terror attack. His wife, Himanshi, in an extraordinary display of grace, appealed against communalising her husband's death. For that, she too was savaged online—her grief trampled by political hate.

Civil service bodies like the Association of Diplomats and the IAS and IPS associations, as well as prominent citizens, spoke out in support of the foreign secretary and slammed the vicious online attack. So did political leaders like Akhilesh Yadav, who rightly questioned whether the Centre's silence amounts to tacit approval. Even the Supreme Court described social media trolling as "atrocious."

This isn't free speech—it's the public lynching of private grief. If we can't draw a line here, the question isn't whether we've lost our moral compass. It's whether we even want one anymore.

## **NEW DELHI'S PRAGMATISM**

n mid-May, the foreign ministers of India and Afghanistan had a phone conversation. among other things, about the terrorist attack in Kashmir. This was perceived as a signal of Delhi's pragmatic approach to the Taliban government and readiness for selective cooperation. Time will tell whether it is a temporary diplomatic maneuver or the beginning of a new chapter in bilateral relations based on strategic interests. On May 15, India's foreign

minister, Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, had a phone conversation with Afghanistan's acting foreign minister, Amir Khan Muttaqi. He thanked Kabul for condemning the terrorist attack in Pahalgam and for not accepting Pakistan's narrative about tensions in Afghan-Indian relations. The conversation also touched on issues of economic, visa, and infrastructure cooperation, including the outline of further strengthening trade and transport links between India and Afghanistan through Iran's port of Chabahar-bypassing

Pakistani territory. Although this contact does not mean formal recognition of the Taliban government by India, it is a clear signal of growing pragmatism in New Delhi's approach to Afghanistan's political reality. The importance of this dialogue is further emphasized by unofficial reports of an earlier visit by Mullah Muhammad Ibrahim Sadr-the influential deputy minister of interior affairs for security-to India's capital. According to an anonymous source in Kabul, this visit took place in the first week of May, during serious Indian-Pakistani tensions after the attack in Kashmir. In this context, the possible tightening of Delhi's contacts with

selected Taliban factions takes on a strategic dimension.

India, long perceiving Pakistan as the main source of regional destabilization, seeks to limit its influence in Afghanistan. The contemporary Taliban movement is not a uniform structure—internal factions differ both in their stance towards Islamabad and their approach to cooperation with external actors. Mullah Ibrahim Sadr, seen as a representative of the more independent Taliban wing, maintaining close contacts with Iran, is known for his cautious or even hostile attitude towards Pakistani interests. In the eyes of Indian strategists, he is seen as a potential partner in the policy of limiting operational space for terrorist groups linked to Pakistan.

For India, one of the security priorities remains to curb the smuggling of fighters across the Afghan border, especially in the context of the situation in Kashmir. Mullah Sadr, responsible for internal security in the Taliban gov-

ernment, is considered a key decision-maker who can influence the control of smuggling routes and the movement of armed groups. Closer ties with the more autonomous Taliban faction could bring India tangible benefits in this regard—even if the cooperation were to remain informal and behind the scenes.

An important topic of Jaishankar's conversation with Muttaqi was the possibilities of developing transport infrastructure to strengthen Indian-Afghan economic and trade cooperation. Of particular importance is India's involvement in the development of the port of Chabahar in Iran, which not only allows them access to Afghanistan and Central Asia bypassing Pakistan but also serves as a strategic tool for limiting Chinese influence.

Reports of Sadr's visit may indicate that Kabul is interested in further developing this infrastructure. This would be beneficial both for the Afghan economy and for India's strate-

gic positioning in the region.

The observed trend of tightening contacts between India, Iran, and selected Taliban factions indicates the possibility of forming an informal alliance aimed at balancing the Pakistan-China axis.

Iran, maintaining an extensive network of ties in Afghanistan, especially with Shiite minorities and factions hostile to ISIL, can serve as a geostrategic link that binds this configuration. However, Iran's policy—burdened by sanctions and tensions around the nuclear program—requires India to maintain great flexibility and caution.

It is also impossible to ignore the growing role of China in the region. Beijing, through the CPEC project and economic presence in Afghanistan, is intensifying its presence in the region, perceiving a possible rapprochement between India, Kabul, and Tehran as a threat to its own interests. India, not being part of the Belt and Road Initiative, seeks alternative routes and partnerships. If cooperation with Afghanistan and Iran gains durability, it could result in a deeper reformatting of the balance of power in South and Central Asia.

Despite signs of pragmatic rapprochement, Delhi has yet to formally recognize the Taliban government. India is gradually opening communication channels-including the functioning of the consular representation in Mumbai and ministerial-level talks—but this process is fraught with numerous risks. Ideological differences, still vivid ties of some Taliban factions with Pakistani intelligence, and the presence of terrorist organizations in Afghanistan make any rapprochement need to be

## The IMF is missing in action

ccording to the International Monetary Fund's Articles of Agreement, the Fund's main purpose is to facilitate the balanced growth of international trade and thereby promote high levels of employment and real (inflation-adjusted) income. Yet with globalization facing its greatest threat in the postwar period, and with global external economic imbalances set to rise, the IMF seems to be missing in action. Instead of pursuing an active role in reducing external imbalances, it is focusing on issues that lie beyond its remit, such as climate change and

gender equality.

Why hasn't the IMF called attention to the principal reason for today's global external imbalances? Contrary to what US President Donald Trump seems to think, these imbalances result not from import tariffs or exchange-rate manipulation, but rather from inappropriate macroeconomic policies maintained by deficit and surplus countries alike.

Those countries with large trade deficits follow monetary

and fiscal policies that induce them to spend more on consumption and investment than they produce. Conversely, those running large trade surpluses have macroeconomic policies that induce them to spend less on consumption and investment than they produce. Or, as John Maynard Keynes taught us, deficit countries are those where national savings fall short of investment, and surplus countries are those where national savings exceed investment.

Viewed through this lens. it is easy to understand why, despite the first Trump administration's higher import tariffs, the US external current-account deficit actually increased by some 35% (from \$480 billion to \$647 billion) between 2016 and 2020. This was because the administration's trade policies - tariffs on imports from China and on steel and aluminum - were accompanied by the 2017 Tax Cut and Jobs Act (TC-JA), which reduced domestic savings by increasing the budget deficit, and increased investment by incentivizing such activity through lower

corporate tax rates.

Fast-forward to 2025. Even though the US budget deficit stands at a worrying 6% of GDP, the Trump administration is proposing another major tax cut that will increase it further. Trump aims not only to extend the TCJA, but also to eliminate income taxes on tips and overtime pay, and provide a \$4,000 tax deduction for those over 65. According to the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget, these changes could add over \$5 trillion to the budget deficit over the next decade. Once again, a larger budget deficit can be expected to widen the US external trade deficit for much the same reason it widened during the first Trump administration.

So, where is the IMF? Why isn't it pounding the table about the dangers that Trump's tax cuts would pose to the world economy, if enacted? A further widening of the US trade deficit at this juncture could lead the Trump administration to double down on its retaliatory import tariff policy. And if it does, US trade partners can be expected to re-

taliate, resulting in the kind of economically destructive beggar-thy-neighbor policies that proved so disastrous in the 1930s.

Beyond warning about the likely worsening of external imbalances as a result of a wider US budget deficit, the IMF should be devising a blueprint to resolve today's global imbalances in a manner that does not bring on a global recession. Such an undertaking could include recommendations as to how the US might restore order to its public finances; how China can increase household consumption through an improved social safety net; and how Germany can stimulate European investment through substantially increased public spending.

Globalization is in real danger of breaking down, and one of its premier institutions is nowhere to be found.

Sir, Apropos, "ED crossing all limits," Orissa POST, May 23. The Supreme Court's stern warning to the Enforcement Directorate (ED) over its investigation into the Tamil Nadu State Marketing Corporation (TASMAC) is a timely and necessary intervention. The ED, mandated to probe financial crimes, has increasingly come under fire for selective and politically motivated actions—focusing disproportionately on opposition-led states while turning a blind eye to similar issues in BJP-ruled regions. In the TASMAC case, the Court questioned the very basis and timing of the ED's probe, especially when the matter had already been scrutinized by state agencies. This raises serious concerns about federal overreach and misuse of central agencies to settle political scores. The pattern is hard to ignore: investigations often coincide with elections or dissent against the central government. By calling out the ED's conduct, the Supreme Court has reaffirmed the principle that investigative agencies must function independently and without bias. New Delhi, May 23: The Supreme Court Friday grilled the Rajasthan government over the surge in student suicides in the city of Kota calling the situation "serious"

A bench of Justices JB Pardiwala and R Mahadevan said 14 suicide cases were reported from the city so far this year.

"What are you doing as a state? Why are these children dying by suicide and only in Kota? Have you not given a thought as a state?" Justice Pardiwala asked the counsel representing state of Rajasthan.

The counsel said a special investigation team (SIT) was formed in the state to examine cases of suicides.

The top court was hearing a matter over the death of a 22-vear-old student studying in IIT, Kharagpur. The student was found hanging in his hostel

It was also dealing with another case of a girl, who was a NEET aspirant and was found hanging in her room in Kota where she lived with her parents. The bench learnt that an FIR was lodged in connection with the death of IIT Kharagpur's student.

The top court, however, questioned the four-day delay

of the IIT Kharagpur counsel and the police officer.

'We could have taken a very strict view of the matter. We could have even proceeded for contempt against the police officer in-charge concerned of the jurisdictional police station," it said. The bench then refrained with the FIR being lodged and progressing investigation.

The investigation, it said, should be carried out expeditiously in the right direction.

In the Kota suicide case, the bench disapproved non filing of

The state's counsel said the investigation in the case was ongoing and the SIT was aware of suicide cases in the state.

"How many young students have died so far in Kota?" the bench asked the counsel.

After the counsel said 14, the bench retorted, "Why are these students dying?

It said the task force constituted by the apex court would take its time before giving a composite report to the court.

'You are in contempt of our judgement. Why have you not registered the FIR?" the bench asked Rajasthan's counsel.

The bench said the student was not residing in the accommodations provided by her institute, which she left in November 2024 and started living with her parents

"However, in line with our decision, it was the duty of the police concerned to register the FIR and carry out the investigation. The officer in-charge of the concerned territorial police station has failed in his duty. He has not complied with the directions issued by this court," the bench said

The bench, as a result, summoned the police officer concerned in the Kota case July 14 to explain the situation.

## Advisory on cybercriminals' new deceptive techniques

Jaipur, May 23: The Rajasthan Police Friday issued an advisory warning citizens about cybercriminals' new deceptive techniques for hacking mobile devices and stealing sensitive information.

Under the directives of DGP. Cyber Crime, Hemant Priyadarshi, cyber commandos and cybersecurity experts at the Police Headquarters are actively working to raise public awareness and prevent online fraud.

A detailed advisory has been issued to educate citizens about a growing threat.

Mahesh Kumar, Cyber Commando at Police Headquarters. explained that the attack often uses a technique called 'Steganography', where malicious code is secretly embedded inside a photo, video, or audio file.

This hidden data becomes active once the file is opened, allowing the attacker to forward messages and calls from your device, steal bank OTPs and withdraw money, download malicious APK files without your knowledge, gain complete control of your personal data and phone functions and many more," Kumar said. He shared that in many cases,

cvbercriminals send fake emails or SMS messages with enticing offers, lottery wins, or government scheme benefits. These messages contain links that lead to counterfeit websites - clones of banking sites, government portals, or e-commerce platforms. Once you input personal details like bank account numbers, passwords, or OTPs, the data is captured and used to siphon

funds or commit identity theft. "A new scam involves sending users a photo of a person with a message asking them to identify. If the recipient downloads the image, it ac tivates malicious code that gives the hacker access to the user's phone and social media accounts," it said.

The police advisory asked users to turn off auto-download of media files in WhatsApp and other messaging apps, not open or download files or click links sent by unknown or suspicious contacts, avoid sharing person al information on unverified websites or through unfamil iar messages, update device software regularly and install reliable antivirus apps.

People should report cyber incidents immediately to their nearest police station or the Cyber Crime Helpline (1930) and protect their digital iden tity by following these essential precautions, it said.

## Heatwave hits Rajasthan; red alert in three districts

Jaipur, May 23: Rajasthan continues to grapple with an intense heatwave, with large parts of the desert state experiencing scorching temperatures. However, scattered thunderstorms in a few areas have provided some relief from the relentless summer heat.

According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), heatwave conditions are expected to persist in 16 districts Friday, with no immediate relief in sight. A red alert has been issued for Jaisalmer, Sri Ganganagar, and Bikaner, while thundershowers are forecast in 19 districts, including Jaipur and Kota.

On Thursday, Sri Ganganagar recorded the highest maximum temperature at 47.3 degrees Celsius, which is 4.8 degrees above normal.

## With new chief in place, Kerala Congress set for major overhaul

Thiruvananthapuram, May 23: Less than two weeks after appointing Sunny Joseph as the new Kerala Pradesh Congress Committee (KPCC) president. the Congress high command is preparing for a major organisational overhaul at both the state

and district levels in the state. According to sources familiar with the development, the restructuring will be guided by two key reports -- one by strategist Sunil Kanugolu and another by the AICC general secretary in charge of Kerala, Deepa Das Munshi.

Both reports highlight the Congress party's weak grassroots presence in Kerala, especially when compared to rivals CPI(M) and BJP, who have robust booth-level machinery. The reports recommend urgent corrective steps to address this structural gap.

The decision to revamp the party also stems from a shift in leadership dynamics. The once-dominant figures like K Karunakaran, AK Antony, Oommen Chandy, Vayalar Ravi, and Ramesh Chennithala no longer wield the influence they



While Karunakaran and Chandy have passed away, Ravi has largely withdrawn from public life, Antony is in the twilight of his career, and Chennithala's influence declined sharply after the Congress-led UDF's unexpected defeat in the 2021 assembly polls.

A political observer, speaking on condition of anonymity, noted that the high command has asserted itself more since 2021, especially after choosing VD Satheesan as the Leader of the Opposition over Chennithala, despite the latter having greater support within the legislative party.

They also appointed Kannur strongman K Sudhakaran as KPCC chief -- who has now been replaced with Joseph.

'With Sudhakaran's exit, another round of restructuring appears imminent. Unlike earlier eras, where key posts were shared among senior leaders, this revamp will have the unmistakable stamp of the high command and could bring in many new faces," the political observer said.

The urgency is also linked to the upcoming local body elections later this year and the state assembly polls in April-May 2026.

The CPI(M)-led Left Front has already announced that the Pinarayi Vijayan government is aiming for a third consecutive term.

Observers are watching closely to see whether Congress will revert to forming jumbo committees or follow the two reports' recommendation to keep

## Kerala woman's journey to peak of Mt Everest

Thiruvananthapuram, May 23: Kannur native and a resident of Qatar, Safrina Latheef was a banker and a baker be-

fore she turned to mountaineering, a long term desire of hers, and became the first woman from Kerala to scale the over 8.000 feet Everest peak. Latheef describes herself as

a "jack of all trades" as she did a bit of banking and baking before moving on to mountain-

Describing the momentous feat as one of the "toughest" things she has done in her life till now, Latheef said that not just physical fitness, but mental strength was also very important to make the climb.

She reached the Everest base camp April 19, began the climb April 28, started the final push for the summit May 12 and reached the top May 18.

"It is a mental struggle, as we see a lot of unexpected things like avalanches, rock falls and dead bodies of climbers who tried to scale the summit with the same aspirations and dreams as us. The dead bodies shake you up. You could be the next body on the line -- that thought crosses your mind.



You have to fight all that to reach the summit," she said in a voice note shared with PTI

from Nepal. However, reaching the peak is worth all that gruelling effort because of the view from there, said Safrina Latheef, who is in

her late 30s. But, her decision to take off

view with her naked eyes proved a bit costly as she got blinded by the snow and had to make the descent with poor vision and was subsequently, briefly hospitalised for it, she said.

her goggles to experience the

Earlier in the day, speaking to a news channel from Nepal, Latheef said that she did not realise the heights she was climbing while scaling the summit, but on the way down "I came to realise the enormity of it".

"I am excited with the experience and happy that I got back alive." she added.

Giving details of the effort she put in to achieve the feat,

she said that it was during the Covid-19 pandemic that she and her husband realised the importance of health and physical fitness.

'We became health conscious, joined a gym and began running. It was a longterm desire of mine to do adventure trekking. So, after we became healthier, when we had time, we climbed Mt Kilimanjaro (5,895 meters) in Tanzania with some friends," she said in the voice note. Since then, her only thought was to climb the highest peak on Earth -- Mount Everest which stands at 8,849 meters.

The advisory, issued by the Health Department, comes in porting Covid cases.

The government has asked health institutions to send all positive samples for genome sequencing to Lok Nayak Hospital. "The hospitals must ensure preparedness in terms of availability of beds, oxygen, antibiotics, other drugs and vaccine, All equipment such as ventilators. Bi-PAP, oxygen concentrators and PSA (Prostate-Specific Antigen) must be in functional condition," it stated.

Daily reporting of all parameters must also be done on the Delhi State Health Data Management Portal, the advisory

According to the advisory, refresher training of dedicated staff mav be conducted and daily reporting of Influenza-like Illness (ILI) and Severe Acute Respiratory Illness (SARI) cases in all health facilities (OPD/ IPD) on the Integrated Health Information Platform (IHIP) portal must be ensured. Confirmed influenza and Covid-19 cases may also be reported on IHIP under the L form.

## Delhi govt issues advisory on Covid-19 All-party delegations meet top leadership

Moscow/Tokyo/Abu Dhabi, May 23: Indian Parliamentary delegations Friday put across New Delhi's 'zero-tolerance' policy on terrorism to top officials in Russia, the United Arab Emirates and Japan and exchanged views on furthering cooperation in counter-terrorism and combating radicalism following Operation Sindoor.

"#TeamIndia sends a strong and united message on combating terrorism," External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, who is on a three-nation tour of Europe, said in a post on X.

India is sending out seven multi-party delegations to 33 global capitals to reach out to the international community on Pakistan's designs and India's response to terror in wake of the Pahalgam terror attack after which India launched Operation Sindoor.

In Moscow, the all-party delegation led by DMK MP Kanimozhi Karunanidhi met Deputy Foreign Minister of the Russian Federation Andrev Rudenko to sensitise the Russian side about terror emanating from Pakistan, a month after the Pahalgam attack that left 26 people dead. In Japan,

## UP: 49 killed in rain-related incidents

Lucknow (UP), May 23: At least 49 people died across and storm-related incidents between 8 PM May 21 and 4 PM May 22, according to the Integrated Disaster Control Centre, Relief Commissioner's Office, Lucknow. Strong winds and heavy rainfall lashed several districts, leading to fatalities caused by falling trees, collapsing walls and roofs, and lightning strikes.

Kasganj and Fatehpur each reported five deaths, while four people died in Meerut and Auraiva. Three fatalities were reported in Bulandshahr, Gautam Buddha Nagar, Kannauj, Kanpur Nagar, and Etah. Ghaziabad, Firozabad, Etawah, and Kanpur Dehat reported two deaths each. Aligarh. Hathras, Chitrakoot, Ambed kar Nagar, Amethi, Ayodhya, Azamgarh, and Unnao each reported one death.

The Relief Commissioner's Office has instructed local officials to provide relief and compensation to the victims'

Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav expressed condolences and criticised the BJP-led state government for inadequate disaster response.

He urged the government to provide real, on-ground assistance rather than just making announcements. Yaday stated that in the past three days, lakhs were affected, many houses collapsed, and waterlogging occurred even in Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's home district, Gorakhpur. He accused the BJP government of neglecting farmers and the poor, alleging it had failed to deliver on previous promises of aid during disasters

Yadav emphasised that it is the government's duty to ensure public welfare and equitable support during calamities.

The SP chief also said that the government should not make announcements on paper. It should really help the families affected by storms, he said.

## IndiGo flight denied entry into Pak airspace during hailstorm: DGCA

New Delhi, May 23: Aviation watchdog DGCA Friday said the crew of the IndiGo flight from the national capital to Srinagar on Wednesday had sought permission to enter Pakistan airspace to avoid turbulence but the request was rejected.

In a detailed statement about the incident, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said there was no injury to any passengers who were on the flight and that the aircraft's "nose radome" was damaged.

The incident of the aircraft encountering turbulence is being probed by the DGCA. On Wednesday, IndiGo's A321 neo aircraft operating flight 6E 2142 encountered hailstorm and severe turbulence near Pathankot. "As per crew statement, they

requested Northern control

(IAF) for deviation towards left (International Border) due to weather on the route, however, it was not approved. "Later, the crew contacted Lahore to enter into their airspace to avoid the weather

but the same was refused too,'

DGCA said. The DGCA statement confirms PTI report of May 22 that the Lahore ATC had rejected the flight pilot's request to use the Pakistan airspace to avoid turbulence.

Indian Air Force (IAF) sources said the Northern Area Control advised the IndiGo crew within the frame of the NOTAM, ensuring safety of aircraft and passengers.

Pakistan civil aviation au thorities have issued the NO TAM (Notice to Airmen) shutting the country's airspace for Indian aircraft.

The sources said the Indi-Go aircraft was immediately assisted in co-ordinating their route diversion by contacting Delhi Area and passing req uisite contact frequencies of Lahore control for overflight weather diversion request.

Once Lahore refused over flight clearance, and the aircraft proceeded towards Srinagar, the flight was subsequently professionally assisted till a safe-landing at Srinagar airfield by giving control vectors and groundspeed readouts, the sources said.

According to the DGCA, the IndiGo flight crew initial ly attempted to return but as they were close to the thun derstorm cloud, they decided to penetrate the weather.

'Subsequently, they encoun tered hailstorm and severe turbulence. Crew chose to continue at the same heading to exit the weather by the short est route towards Srinagar, the statement said.

While in a thunderstorm cloud, the regulator said warnings of Angle of Attack fault Alternate Law protection lost backup Speed scale unreliable were triggered.

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## Speculation rife over possible BRS-BJP tie-up





Hyderabad, May 23: A purported handwritten "feedback" letter by BRS leader K Kavitha to her father and former Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao has stirred political discussions in Telangana. The letter, reportedly written in Telugu and English, evaluates the BRS's recent Silver Jubilee celebrations in Warangal, mixing praise with pointed criticism.

While the authenticity of the letter remains unverified, neither Kavitha's office nor KCR's has issued a comment. Kavitha, currently in the US for her son's graduation, was unavailable for comment. In the letter, Kavitha expressed dis-

appointment that KCR spoke for only two minutes at the Warangal event, suggesting it led to speculation of a future alliance with the BJP. She wrote, "You should have targeted the BJP some more, Daddy," attributing her concerns to her own troubles allegedly caused by the BJP. Kavitha criticised the omission of

key issues like 42% reservation for backward classes, SC categorisation, the Waqf Amendment Act, and the lack of mention of Urdu.

She also pointed out that Telangana movement activists were not given due recognition at the event. She noted a

growing perception among BRS cad-

res that the BJP is a viable alternative, partly due to BRS's decision not to contest the recent MLC elections. Kavitha urged her father to call a party plenary to gather cadre feedback and provide clear political direction. However, she did commend KCR

for his stance on "Operation Kagar" and his moment of silence for Pahalgam terror attack victims, concluding the letter with congratulations on the event's success. BRS MLC Sravan Dasoju responded

that even if Kavitha did write the letter, it was a "normal feedback" from a daughter or party leader, not indicative of internal discord. He said more pressing public concerns include paddy procurement and unemployment. Ruling Congress MLA Beerla Ilaiah

Yadav claimed Kavitha had inadvertently admitted that minorities and the Urdu language were ignored, revealing a tacit BRS-BJP understanding. He questioned her silence during the previous BRS regime regarding marginalised communities. BJP Assembly floor leader A Ma-

heshwar Reddy alleged in a video statement that the letter stemmed from internal family disputes within KCR's circle over wealth and power distribution.

Despite the buzz, the Opposition has not issued a formal denial of the letter's content or authenticity.

#### Kardashian robbery case nears end

Paris: The Paris robbery of Kim Kardashian lasted only minutes but its impact reverberated for nearly a decade. A court in the French capital will decide the verdict Friday in one of the most audacious celebrity heists in modern French history - the night masked men stormed the star's luxury apartment, tied her up at gunpoint and vanished into the dark with \$6 million in jewels. Nine men and a woman stand accused of carrying out or aiding the crime during the Paris Fashion Week in 2016.

#### 3 TTP terrorists killed in Pakistan

Lahore: Three terrorists of the banned Tehreek-e-Talibar Pakistan (TTP) militant group were killed in Pakistan's Punjab province Friday, an official said. A Punjab Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) statement said it received information about the prese of the terrorists in the Mianwali district, about 325 kilometres from Lahore when they were planning to attack police posts near Rehmani Khel Mor. Acting on intelligence, a CTD team surrounded their hideout and asked the terrorists to surrender when they opened fire at them. "During the exchange of fire, three terrorists were killed on the spot while six of their accomplices managed to escape," the CTD statement said.

## Record floodwaters in **Australia leave 4 dead**

Melbourne: Record floodwaters on Australia's east coast have left four people dead and one missing officials said Friday as rain eased over the disaster area. Some 50,000 people have been isolated by flooding along the coast of New South Wales state north of Sydney after days of heavy rain. The low-pressure weather system that brought the deluge had moved further south to Sydney and its surrounds Friday. Four bodies have been retrieved from floodwaters in New South Wales since Wednesday.

#### 4 dead, 17 trapped in China landslides

Beijing: Landslides in a rural area in China's southwestern Guizhou province have killed at least four people with 17 others still missing in the debris, state media said. Two bodies were found in Changshi township Thursday, and two others in nearby Qingyang village, where a landslide buried 19 people from eight households. according to state-run Xinhua News Agency.

# Judge blocks Trump's move

Boston, May 23: A US judge Friday blocked the Trump administration from revoking Harvard University's ability to enroll foreign students, a move that ratcheted up White House efforts to conform practices in academia to President Donald Trump's policies.

US District Judge Allison Burroughs' order provides temporary relief to the thousands of international students who were faced with being forced to transfer under a policy that the Ivy League school called part of the administration's broader effort to retaliate against it for refusing to "surrender its academic independence.'

The Trump administration may appeal Burroughs' ruling. Spokespeople for the Justice Department and the Department of Homeland Security did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

In a lawsuit filed in Boston federal court earlier Friday, Harvard called the revocation a "blatant violation" of the US Constitution and other federal laws, and had an "immediate and devastating effect" on the university and more than 7,000 visa holders

"Without its international students, Harvard is not Harvard," the 389-year-old school said in the lawsuit filed in Boston federal court, Harvard enrolled nearly 6,800 international students in its current **HARVARD VISA RULING** 



school year, equal to 27% of total enrollment.

The termination of Harvard's Student and Exchange Visitor Program certification, effective with the 2025-2026 academic year, was announced Thursday by Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem.

In her brief order blocking the policy for two weeks, Burroughs said Harvard had shown it could be harmed before there was an opportunity to hear the case in full. The judge, an appointee of Democratic President Barack Obama, scheduled

hearings for May 27 and May 29 to consider next steps in the

Trump's pressure on Harvard is part of the Republican's broader campaign to compel universities, law firms, news media, courts and other institutions that value independence from partisan politics to align with his agenda.

The campaign has included efforts to deport foreign students who participated in pro-Palestinian protests but committed no crimes, retaliate against law firms that employ lawyers who have challenged Trump, and a suggestion by Trump to impeach a judge for an immigration ruling the pres ident didn't like.

Harvard, based in Cambridge, Massachusetts, has pushed back hard against Trump, having previously sued to restore some \$3 billion in federal grants that had been frozen or canceled

"Harvard should spend their time and resources on creating a safe campus environment instead of filing frivolous law suits," she added.

Seoul, May 23: North Korea has begun a full-scale investigation into the accident that occurred during the launch of a warship this week, state media KCNA reported Friday.

Pyongyang has said the incident Wednesday was caused by a loss of balance while the vessel was being launched, and sections of the bottom of the warship were crushed. An internal inspection found

that there were no holes at the warship's bottom, but the starboard hull was scratched and seawater flowed into the stern section through the rescue channel, the report said.

The extent of damage was "not serious," the report said, adding the investigation group was ordered to find the cause of the accident and those respon sible for it. The report did not mention any injuries or deaths as a result of the accident.

The isolated state's leader Kim Jong Un, who watched Wednesday's launch of the 5,000-ton destroyer at the northeastern shipyard of Chongjin, berated it as a "criminal act" that could not be tolerated, according to state media. The mishap likely occurred

in front of a large crowd, increasing the public humiliation for Kim, military analysts said. South Korea's military said

Thursday that the ship was lying on its side in the water.

## Russia, Ukraine each YUNUS MULLS RESIGNATION free first 390 prisoners



Chernihiv Region, Ukraine, May 23: Russia and Ukraine each released 390 prisoners Friday and said they would free more in the coming days, in what is expected to be the biggest prisoner swap of the war so far.

The agreement to exchange 1,000 prisoners each was the only concrete step towards peace to emerge last week from two hours of talks in Istanbul, the first direct talks between the warring sides in more than three years

They failed to agree to a ceasefire proposed by US President Donald Trump.

The Russian ministry of defence said each side had released 270 soldiers and 120 civilians Friday. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy confirmed the total of 390 each, and said more would be released Saturday and Sunday.

Earlier, Ukrainian authorities told reporters to assemble at a location in the northern Chernihiv region in anticipa-



# Trump re-escalates trade threat Markets rebound

The announcement of 50% tariffs on EU post i-phone tariff threat call has intensified the trade war. Experts believe that the decision is revengeful and inappropriate as tariff uncertainties pose growth risks

Washington, May 23: US President Donald Trump Friday threatened a 50% tax on all imports from the European Union as well a 25% tariff on Apple products unless iPhones are made in America.

The threats, delivered over social media, reflect Trump's ability to disrupt the global economy with a burst of typing as well as the reality that his tariffs have yet to produce the trade deals he is seeking or the return of domestic manufacturing he has prom-

The Republican president said he wants to charge higher import taxes on goods from the EU, a long-standing US ally, than from China, a geopolitical rival that had its tariffs cut to 30% this month so Washington and Beijing could hold negotiations. Trump was upset by the lack of progress in trade talks with the EU, which has proposed mutually cutting tariffs to zero even as the president has publicly insisted on preserving a baseline 10% tax on most imports.

"Our discussions with them are going nowhere!" Trump posted on Truth Social (social media platform) "Therefore, I am recommending a straight 50% Tariff on the European

The international passenger traffic for Indian carriers stood at 3.38 crore in FY25, vearly growth of 14.1 per cent, higher than the pre-Covid level of 2.27 crore by 49 per cent, according to a report by ratings agency

In April 2025 alone, domestic passenger traffic was estimated at 1.45 crore, which was 10.2 per



2024. Airlines also increased their capacity deployment by 6.9 per cent in April 2025 over The domestic aviation in-

dustry recorded a healthy passenger load factor (PLF) of

86 per cent in FY25, reflecting strong demand and efficient operations across airlines. The highest single-day domestic air traffic was reported February 23, with 5,35,343 passengers flying across the country, driven in part by increased travel around the Maha Kumbh event in Prayagraj.

Looking ahead, ICRA has maintained a 'Stable' outlook for the Indian aviation indus try. Domestic passenger traffic is expected to grow by another 7-10 per cent in FY26, while international traffic may increase by 15-20 per cent.

In FY25, the growth in EV sales was similar to the growth in Series Hybrid Electric Vehicle (SHEV) sales, despite incentives being offered on SHEVs by Uttar Pradesh, the largest PV-selling state in India. This trend sug gests that SHEV adoption is hav ing a positive effect on BEV sales. the report pointed out.

Asserting that the perception that promoting SHEVs will hin der EV adoption is misplaced, the report said, This is not a zero-sum game, but rather an incremental opportunity where incentivising SHEVs contrib utes to the broader development of the clean mobility ecosystem, benefiting BEVs and advancing overall market growth.

#### **Djoko survives knee** scare to enter semis

Geneva: Novak Djokovic celebrated his 38th birthday with hard-fought revenge at the Geneva Open. The second seed held firm for a 6-4, 6-4 victory over Matteo Arnaldi to reach the semi-finals at the clay ATP 250 event for the second consecutive year. Djokovic, who fell to Arnaldi at the ATP Masters 1000 in Madrid last month, reeled off five straight games from 1-4 in the second set to seal a one-hour, 40-minute victory. "It's great to be in the semi-finals again. Hopefully this year I can go at least a step further, that's the goal. I think I'm playing really good tennis. A straight-sets win, but it was much closer than the score indicates. I was 4-1 down in the second, but somehow I didn't lose a game," he said. Djokovic is now within two victories of claiming his 100th tour-level trophy, with which he would join Jimmy Connors (109) and Roger Federer (103) as the only men to hit the triple-digit mark in the Open Era.

Shuttler enters semifinal, lone Indian left in the draw

Kuala Lumpur, May 23: Seasoned Indian shuttler Kidambi Srikanth stormed into his first semifinal in over a year with a hard-fought three-game win over higher-ranked Toma Junior Popov of France at the Malaysia Masters badminton tournament here Friday.

Ranked 65th in the world, Srikanth displayed remarkable resilience and tactical maturity to outwit world no.18 Popov 24-22, 17-21, 22-20 in a fiercely-contested quarterfinal that lasted one hour and 14 minutes.

The 32-year-old from Guntur, a 2021 World Championships silver medallist, has endured a rough patch over the past few seasons, struggling with form and fitness.

However, he battled through the qualifiers and has now



notched up five straight wins to reach the business end of a BWF World Tour event.

"It's been a while since I've won this many matches in a tournament and I hope I can continue to do so," said Srikanth. "I've always been trying to better myself and this win just proves that whatever I'm doing is working," added the former world no 1, who had won four titles in a stellar 2017 season and was part of India's historic

Thomas Cup triumph in 2022. Srikanth will take on Yushi Tanaka of Japan in the last four match, which will be his first semifinal appearance in over

The Japanese, who has won two Super 300 titles -- the Orleans Masters and the US Open -- beat France's Christo Popov, brother of Toma Junior, 21-18 16-21 21-6 in another men's singles quarterfinal duel on Saturday.

The other men's singles semifinal will be played between fourth seed Kodai Naraoka of Japan and second seed Li Shi Feng of China.

## **Chopra finishes 2nd** in Poland event

## Alcaraz, Sinner rivalry takes centre stage in French Open

Bangalore, May 23: Defending champion Carlos Alcaraz and world number one Jannik Sinner resume the hottest rivalry in men's tennis at the French Open, where Novak Djokovic will fly the flag for the old guard as the clavcourt Grand Slam enters the post-Rafa Nadal era.

After Nadal exited the 2024 edition of the major he won a record 14 times, Alcaraz emerged as the Spaniard's heir apparent with his first Roland Garros title.

Alcaraz has geared up for his title defence with a sparkling campaign on clay this season, with the 22-year-old capturing his first Monte Carlo crown and defeating Sinner in the Italian Open final Sunday to complete his set of elite claycourt honours

"All eyes are on Paris now, on Roland Garros," said the world number two.

"Beating Jannik, winning Rome, both things mix together and give me great confidence going to Paris. I always say 'the final isn't about playing, the final is about winning'. "I just repeat that approach

every time I play a final." Sinner showed little sign of

rust in his first event back from a three-month ban for two doping violations, and fans will be hoping the world number one scythes through the draw to meet Alcaraz in the final.

Former Roland Garros champion Jim Courier said both players would be feeling confident after the level they showed in Rome. "Alcaraz continues this run,

four wins in a row against Sinner, which no one else is able to come close to, so that's going to give him a little extra boost, Courier said on the Tennis Channel.

Djokovic celebrates his 38th birthday Thursday and while he has suddenly looked vulnerable against the hungry young stars on the tour, few will write him off completely when he returns to the venue where he won gold at the 2024 Paris Olympics.

"It's a new reality for me ... trying to win a match or two, not thinking about getting far in the tournament," Djokovic said after his Madrid exit. "It's a completely different feeling from what I had in 20-plus years of professional tennis, so it's a challenge mentally to face these kinds of sensations on the court.'

While Djokovic goes in search of a 25th Grand Slam crown, Germany's Alexander Zverev continues his bid for a first after being hammered by

Sinner in the Australian Open final -- his third straight defeat in a major championship title match.

The world number three, who came close to breaking his duck at last year's French Open when he lost to Alcaraz in five sets, won in Munich last month but has gone off the boil since and is looking to find his rhythm at the Hamburg Open this week.

A host of other contenders will be in the mix in Paris, including Barcelona champion Holger Rune, Madrid winner and former French Open finalist Casper Ruud, as well as the fast-rising duo of Lorenzo Musetti and Jack Draper.

While Nadal's name will not be etched onto the trophy this year, the 22-times major champion will return to his happiest hunting ground for a grand celebration of his achievements on the opening day of the tournament.

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
