# Eliminate 'dark patterns'

In a big relief for consumers suffering loss due to deceptive product and service advertisements on various e-commerce platforms, the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has issued an advisory, urging these platforms to conduct self-audits within three months to identify and eliminate these manipulative practices, or 'dark patterns'. The guidelines outline 13 specific dark patterns, including false urgency, basket sneaking, and subscription traps, which mislead consumers and cause financial loss. The apex consumer protection watchdog has warned that non-compliance with these guidelines can result in penalties under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019, including potential fines and imprisonment. The move is likely to help build consumer trust and create a fairer digital marketplace.



## WHAT ARE DARK PATTERNS

Dark or deceptive patterns are techniques used by online platforms to manipulate users into making purchases or decisions not best in their interest. These might include telling a user that a single piece of an item is left, thereby creating urgency, or adding an additional item in purchase without explicitly taking consent.

practices that undermine consumer choice or constitute unfair trade practices. "All e-commerce platforms have been advised to conduct self-audits to identify dark patterns, within 3 months of the issue of the advisory, and take necessary steps to ensure that their platforms are free from such dark patterns," the ministry said in a statement. Based on their audit findings, platforms are encouraged to provide self-declarations confirming their sites are free from deceptive

practices. The CCPA said these declarations would help build consumer trust and create a fairer digital marketplace. The authority has already issued notices to some e-commerce platforms found violating guidelines for preventing dark patterns, though, it did not name specific companies. Dark patterns include practices like false urgency alerts, hidden costs added at checkout, subscription traps, and disguised advertisements that manipulate consumer decision-making. The government established a Joint Working Group, comprising representatives from min-

istries, regulators, consumer organisations and national law universities (NLUs), to monitor violations and suggest awareness programmes. The government notified guidelines for preventing dark patterns in 2023, identifying 13 specific practices, including basket sneaking, confirm shaming, forced actions, interface interference, bait and switch tactics, drip pricing, and subscription billing traps. The directive is part of the government's broader strategy to strengthen consumer protection in the digital economy as online commerce continues to expand rapidly across the country.

## PM to attend BJP govt's 1st anniv function June 20

Bhubaneswar, June 7: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Odisha June 20 and attend a mega celebration for the first anniversary of the BJP's maiden government in the state, Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari said Saturday. The first anniversary of the BJP dispensation in the state falls June 12, but the main function will be held June 20 as the PM will visit the state on that day, the senior minister said. "There have been several changes in the programmes for the completion of the first year of the Mohan Charan Majhi government in Odisha. The government was formed June 12, 2024, and the anniversary falls June 12 this year. However, the main function will be held June 20, keeping in view the PM's schedule," Pujari said. He said that the state government had earlier urged the PM and other dignitaries to attend the function June 12.



# Survivors of Franco-era 'fallen women' centres seek apology

Consuelo Garcia del Cid was 16 when the family doctor came into her bedroom in Barcelona, Spain with her mother in 1974, grabbed her left arm and pushed a needle into a vein. She blacked out then woke up in a strange room a day's drive away in Madrid – one of thousands of girls and young women who were accused of a range of perceived moral failings and taken to state-run Catholic rehabilitation institutions during the dictatorship of Francisco Franco. On Monday, a Catholic body that includes most of the communities of nuns that helped operate some of the centres, will hold a ceremony to formally ask the women for forgiveness, the first event of its kind in Spain, announced in April but delayed by the death of Pope Francis. A start, but not enough, say campaigners who want a national apology for what they went through in the network



of Patronato de Proteccion a la Mujer (Board for the Protection of Women) institutes – along the lines of Ireland's 2013 apology for the abuses in its Magdalene Laundries. "It's just the tip of the iceberg," said Pilar Dasi, 73, who spent several months at a centre in Valencia in 1971. "The event is good for the Church as it cleans its own image, but the government must also act." She said she was held after her cousin, a police officer, reported her for keeping 'bad company', a reference to left-wing boyfriends. The operation was set up

in 1941 by Franco's Justice Ministry, overseen by the board chaired by his wife Carmen Polo. It was active until 1985, 10 years after Franco's death. Spain's Democratic Memory Ministry – a body set up to tackle the legacy of Spain's civil war and Franco's regime – told Reuters it applauded the decision by the Spanish Confederation of Religious Entities (CONFER) to ask for forgiveness. The ministry said in a statement it hoped to hold its own ceremony later this year that would recognise the women as victims of the

Franco regime. "They will be considered victims and will be given a declaration of recognition and reparation," it said, without going into further detail on the timing or substance of any event. Garcia del Cid said her family had called in the doctor in 1974 because they were worried about what they saw as her rebelliousness after she attended a number of demonstrations against the dictatorship. The centre where she went was "a sinister place, with extreme religious indoctrination, and life was reduced to working, scrubbing and praying," said the now 66-year-old who has written five books on the subject. "If you are told all day long that you are crazy, a slut, a lost cause, on the wrong path, there comes a point when you might start to believe it if you don't have a strong inner core." She said she was held until 1976.

## Five Balasore cops suspended on disciplinary grounds

Sources said that the suspended police personnel attended a birthday celebration of their colleague for three days. It is alleged that they also indulged in some illegal activities, the sources said. A DSP-ranked police officer has been entrusted with conducting an inquiry.

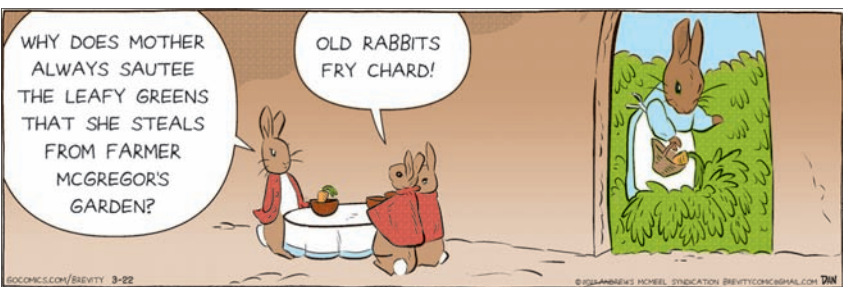

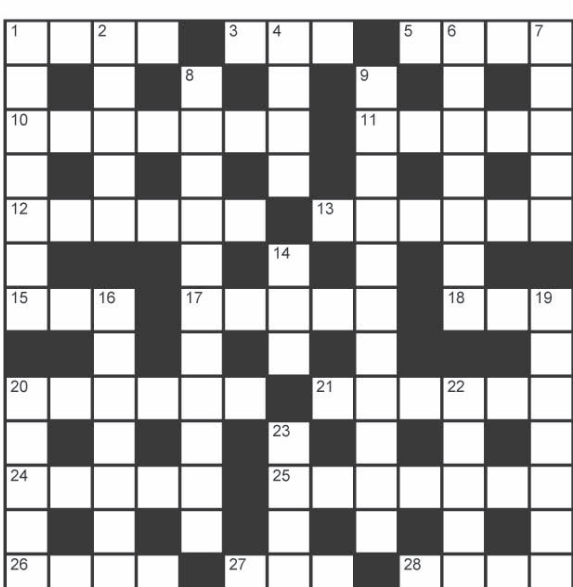

# Govt's free sand scheme for PMAY beneficiaries



Govt to introduce a new standard operating procedure (SOP) to prevent illegal mining and transportation of sand

**Bhubaneswar, June 7:** The Odisha government Saturday announced that the beneficiaries of the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) would be provided up to two tractor-loads of sand for free of cost for construction of house under the scheme.

“The state government would provide up to two tractor-loads of sand without any charges to the beneficiaries of PMAY,” Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari said.

Pujari also said that the beneficiaries would be issued permits to avail sand at an

affordable rate across the state, adding that the move aims at reducing the construction cost on financially weak beneficiaries.

According to reports, the government will introduce a new Standard Operating Procedure (SOP), to prevent illegal mining and transportation of sand. Besides, the SOP will also feature regulation of vehicle weight, focusing on to protect the public infrastructures at rural areas where roads constructed under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) are getting damaged due to the movement of heavy vehicles involved in illegal sand smuggling.

The minister also stressed on taking measures to reduce the illegal methods and vehicles involved in the illegal

sand mining which is affecting the river-beds.

Citing a recent incident in Kaptipada, where an additional tehsildar was attacked while trying to intervene in smuggling activities, Pujari issued a stern warning to the illegal sand traders and expressed serious concern over the rising activity of sand mafias in the state.

He also said that the attacks on the government officials would not be tolerated and stringent action will be taken against the mafias involved.

On the other hand, highlighting the severity of systematic looting of minor minerals across the state, BJD spokesperson Lenin Mohanty pointed to the dramatic decline in revenue from minor minerals from ₹1,485 crore in 2023-24 to just ₹600 crore in 2024-25.

“This sharp 60 per cent drop in revenue clearly indicates the extent of unchecked illegal mining activities, and the obvious patronage.”

Mohanty further said, “The deteriorating situation under the state government within just one year raises serious concerns about Odisha’s future. This administration’s effort to control illegal mining activities and protect revenue officials is concerning”.

# Concerns rise in Kendrapara as Mahanadi dispute lingers

**Kendrapara, June 7:** Residents of Kendrapara district have expressed growing concern over the unresolved Mahanadi river water dispute between Odisha and Chhattisgarh, fearing its adverse impact on agriculture and drinking water supply in the region.

The long-pending issue, currently before a tribunal, remains unresolved despite years of deliberations. Recently, activists from organisations such as the Mahanadi Banchao Andolan, Daya Suraksha Abhiyan, Chilika Banchao Andolan, and Nadi Suraksha Samiti submitted a memorandum to Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, urging for immediate intervention in February. They also sought the Prime Minister's involvement in the interstate dispute.

Locals allege that dam construction in Chhattisgarh has already affected water flow downstream. Local intelligentsia Ganesh Chandra Samal

and power generation.

Panda warned that the construction of multiple barrages in Chhattisgarh will directly impact various developmental projects, including the proposed Akhadashali port. "In a federal structure, interstate disputes are undesirable. All political parties must unite to safeguard the state's interests," he urged.

Echoing similar concerns, Sheikh Fazrul Haque, chairman of the Patkura Anchalik Vikash Committee said that Chitrotapala river has originated from Mahanadi at Gualainsi in Cuttack district and flows about 36 km from Mohammedpur to Kuanpur in Kendrapara district, sustains farming activities and the daily needs of local residents.

"The river is vital for irrigation, domestic use and even religious practices. If the Mahanadi's water flow reduces, Chitrotapala will dry up, leading to widespread disruption," Haque stated.

Farmers' leader Bijay Kumar Parida emphasised the need for an urgent resolution to the dispute. "Any delay will severely impact Kendrapara's agriculture, drinking water supply, and environment. Several rivers and canals depend on the Mahanadi's flow. If that stops, the region could face salinisation," he cautioned.

Parida appealed to all political parties, along with local educators and intellectuals, to rise above politics and speak in unison for Odisha's water rights.

highlighted that the Mahanadi's flow through Kendrapara, from Mahanangala under Mahakalapara block to Gadaramita, spans just 10 km. Tributaries like the Chitrotapala, Luna, Paika, and Birupa rivers rely heavily on Mahanadi's flow.

The Chitrotapala canal system, including the Gobari, Patamundai, and Jobra extension canals, irrigates over 41,681 hectares. Moreover, the people of Rajnagar, Mahakalapara, and Kendrapara town depend on the river for potable water.

Two mega drinking water projects and the proposed national riverine port near Akhadashali further underscore the district's reliance on the river. Any upstream reduction in flow, residents warn, would significantly affect the region's ecological and economic stability.

Former councillor Hiranya Kumar Panda has alleged that the Chhattisgarh government is unilaterally exploiting the Mahanadi river's water, posing a serious threat to Odisha's agriculture, drinking water supply

## Man dies in train-hit while on video call

**Balasore, June 7:** A 31-year-old man died after being struck by a train near Balasore railway station Saturday afternoon. The deceased was reportedly on a video call using his headphones while crossing the tracks.

Deepak Panigrahi of Haripur Begunia under Sahadevkhunta police limits was crossing the railway tracks near the overbridge close to the station when the incident occurred.

According to police sources, Panigrahi was walking along the Malgodown road and attempting to cross the tracks towards the Pandi Square side while on a video call. At that time, the Hyderabad-bound East Coast Express had just departed from the station. Due to the headphones, Panigrahi likely did not hear the train's horn and was struck fatally.

Personnel from the Government Railway Police (GRP) rushed to the scene upon being alerted, recovered the body, and sent it for post-mortem examination. An unnatural death case (48/25) has been registered, and further investigation is underway.

## 4 youths arrested from Andhra for gangrape of minor cousins

**Berhampur, June 7:** Police Saturday arrested four youths from Andhra Pradesh on charge of abduction and gangrape of two minor cousins under Golanthara police limits in Berhampur police district.

The accused, identified as K Shiva, 21, K Sai, 21, G Gareya, 21, and N Srinu, 22, were arrested from undisclosed locations in Andhra Pradesh during multiple raids at various places.

Accused K Sai is the mastermind behind the crime and is the son of the village head. This was stated here by Berhampur SP Sarvana Vivek M at a presser held at the police headquarters Saturday.

All the four accused were produced in the court after a medical examination was conducted on them and the two survivors. A case (240/25) was previously registered in this connection. The mobile phones and bikes of the accused have been seized.

The court remanded them to judicial custody after rejecting their bail pleas. Police produced the survivors before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and later, in the court where they recorded their statements.

The clothes worn by the



accused youths and the survivors will be seized and sent for chemical examination.

According to the case diary, two minor cousins were allegedly gangraped after being abducted by four miscreants in Ganjam district, police said.

A woman, resident of Ganjam police limits, had come to her parent's house under Golanthara police limits to attend a function few days back. Her daughter and niece aged 14 and 11, respectively, accompanied her during the visit.

During their stay, the village head's son K Sai managed to collect the phone number of the 14-year-old and talked to her frequently. She called the girl to an isolated place June 3 and raped her despite her resistance. Later, he called three of his friends and they took turns to rape the girl. Her 11-year-old cousin grew apprehensive and

searched for her after she failed to return home. The accused youths did not spare her also.

As evening descended, the two girls took shelter on the terrace of a house while the accused fled. However, they again reached the place June 4 morning and lured the girls promising to drop them in their village.

However, they took turns to rape the two girls near Chhatrapur and dropped them near Ganjam before absconding. Family members, who were searching for them, rescued and brought them back home.

The girls narrated their ordeal after reaching home. The mother of one of the girls confronted the village head over the issue but the latter took the issue lightly. Left with no option, she lodged a complaint at Golanthara police station leading to the arrests.

## Student goes missing in sea

**Paradip:** A college student went missing while bathing in the sea in Paradip town Saturday, police said. Sk Aman Ullah (19) was enjoying himself with his friends at the beach near the Light House when the incident happened, they said. A group of seven students of Kendrapara Autonomous College were holidaying in Paradip, and he was part of the group, they added. The CISF and Fire Services personnel launched a search operation in the Bay of Bengal, but he could not be found, said Fire and Emergency Services officer Kartik Kumar Biswal.

## Nurse, lover found hanging

**Mahanga:** A young nurse and her male friend committed suicide by hanging in Khandola village under Mahanga police station limits in Cuttack district Saturday. The deceased have been identified as Chinmayee Bhoi, a nurse working at CHC, and Debendra Munda, a resident of Sauria village under Salipur police limits. Chinmayee hailed from Balisahi Machhuati, also in Salipur. According to police sources, the two had recently taken a house on rent in Khandola village—only seven days prior to the incident. Local residents noticed the house locked from inside for a prolonged period and, suspecting something amiss, informed the police. In the presence of local authorities and villagers, the door was forcibly opened and both were found hanging from the ceiling fan, tied with ropes around their necks.

## Tusker critical in attack by suspected poachers

**Keonjhar, June 7:** A critically injured tusker was found wandering in Atei reserve forest near Dhokotha under Ghatagaon forest range in Keonjhar district, after an alleged attack by poachers.

Forest department sources said that the elephant is estimated to be over 25 years old and appears to have sustained an injury on its front left leg possibly from a sharp weapon or arrow by suspected poachers.

On being informed by locals who spotted the distressed animal Friday morning around 10:10am, a team of forest officials and a veterinary unit rushed to the spot and started its initial treatment.

A specialised elephant rescue

team tranquilised the animal to administer further medical care Saturday. Preliminary findings suggest that the tusker might have strayed from the Satkosia forest range. It was last seen resting near Mushala riverbank inside Dhokotha forest area and appeared to be in pain.

Keonjhar DFO HD Dhanraj, Anandpur DFO Abhaya Kumar Dalai, and veterinary staff, are closely monitoring the situation. Forest guard Ashok Das stated that the elephant is currently unable to eat and vomiting shortly after attempting to consume food, raising concerns about possible complications in its throat or digestive system.

Treatment with antibiotics is already underway as the team works round the clock to ensure the animal's recovery.

## Woman seeks help to bring husband's body from Oman

Anupama said her husband had been working in the Gulf countries for about 15 years as a cook. For the last six years, he had been employed in a private hotel in Oman.

Nityananda had last visited Balasore last year and returned to Oman December 13.

## RSP sees excellence in major production areas in April-May

**Rourkela, June 7:** The Rourkela Steel Plant (RSP) has registered excellent performance across major production units during the first two months of the current financial year, 2025-26.

A release from RSP said that Blast Furnace-5 'Durga' produced 552,027 tonnes of hot metal in the first two months, achieving its best-ever April-May performance. This marks an impressive 23.8 per cent growth over the corresponding period last year (CPLY).

Similarly, with a production of 292,371 tonnes of slabs, CCM-3 recorded its best-ever April-May performance, reflecting a

24.5 per cent increase over the CPLY.

The sinter plants collectively produced 1,198,655 tonnes of sinter, registering a growth of 11.1 per cent over the CPLY. Sinter Plant-III recorded its best-ever April-May performance with a production of 629,110 tonnes of sinter.

The Sheet Shearing Line of HSM-2 rolled 45,316 tonnes of HR sheets, also achieving its best-ever April-May performance.

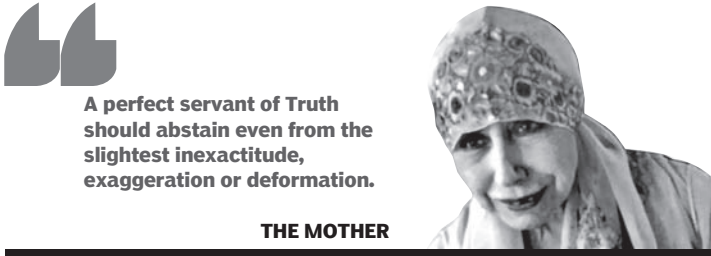

## Doomsday Clock

The Doomsday Clock is a visual tool designed to warn the public about how close humans are to destroying our world with dangerous technologies. The time on the clock is set by experts to reflect how far away from annihilation (midnight) we are, and if it is accurate we are currently the closest we have ever been to the end. The clock was created in 1947, the year of India's independence, when the great global threat was of course that of nuclear weapons. The bombs had gone off over Nagasaki and Hiroshima only two years before that, and the Soviets were developing their own nuclear weapons. They achieved this capability in 1949, then the United Kingdom went nuclear in 1952, France in 1960 and China in 1964. India weaponised its programme in 1974, and then in the 1990s Pakistan also demonstrated its capability. Israel and North Korea are understood to have the weapons and it is likely only a matter of time before Iran acquires them. In the 1980s, when I was a student in the United States, the most important related element was something called the Strategic Defence Initiative, nicknamed Star Wars. Under it the Ronald Reagan administration was developing a system that would allow the US to shoot down incoming missiles while retaining its own offensive capability. This likely sent the Doomsday Clock forward.

After the Soviet Union perished, the Doomsday Clock was moved back to 17 minutes to midnight in 1991, the farthest it has ever been. The threat of nuclear weapons appeared to have abated to a large extent. At least this was how the news reported it. There were many more reports, analysis, civil society groups (like Pugwash) then and more activism on nuclear weapons before 1991 than is visible today.

Currently the setters of the clock according to its website are 18 individuals, including three of South Asian origin (one is a professor at IIT, Delhi).

Two decades ago, the Doomsday Clock had begun to include other threats, including climate change and now it has to accommodate further new ones, like artificial intelligence. Humankind is accelerating the invention of all sorts of new ways to destroy itself.

At the beginning of this year, on 28 January, they posted the following justification for concluding that in 2025 we were closer to annihilation than in 1947. "Closer than ever: It is now 89 seconds to midnight. In 2024, humanity edged ever closer to catastrophe. Trends that have deeply concerned the Science and Security Board continued, and despite unmistakable signs of danger, national leaders and their societies have failed to do what is needed to change course. Consequently, we now move the Doomsday Clock from 90 seconds to 89 seconds to midnight — the closest it has ever been to catastrophe. Our fervent hope is that leaders will recognize the world's existential predicament and take bold action to reduce the threats posed by nuclear weapons, climate change, and the potential misuse of biological science and a variety of emerging technologies."

Since that day in January, much has happened. A drone attack on Russian air bases, taking out a chunk of its most valuable air assets, escalated the Ukraine war. The Israeli genocide in Gaza has continued and now its government is starving the Palestinians, with open conflicts against nations as close as Lebanon and as far away as Yemen. The United States has come under the guardianship of a particularly unpredictable leader. The tension the US has built up against China on matters ranging from trade to Taiwan have escalated. And of course only a few weeks ago India fought in a conflict that the US president repeatedly claims was in danger of going nuclear.

And to all of the above we must add the threats from the impact of climate change and artificial intelligence. In the second of these areas, things are proceeding at such a rapid pace that there is no real understanding of how near the threat is, or even of how what the nature of the danger will be. Those closest to the technology are both the most fearful (in this case the academics) and the most dismissive (if they happen to be corporations profiting from the development of AI) and so it is not easy for us on the outside to judge.

In any case, given that this is now a race in the corporate sectors of the US and China as opposed to the state-managed nuclear arms race, it is likely impossible to control. We will know whether the end result is disaster or windfall if and when it arrives. The role of AI in disinformation on social media and in military applications such as drones already gives us hints that the bad is likely to outweigh the good.

Notice that we have not even discussed the possibility of another pandemic. Or the chaos and turbulence that will come soon in a world containing a handful of trillionaires and billions of those who are poor.

The Doomsday Clock seeks to raise awareness and encourage action to reduce existential risks. But in my opinion it largely fails in this task. If we consider what sort of news is consumed nightly around the world, including in India, we can conclude that mankind is more troubled by other events. To some these events might be trivial in comparison with the far graver things that we are sliding the planet into. However we must concede that they are important enough for most of mankind to be kept entertained while the clock is ticking.

a money-making, MBA, lawyer-run, hedge fund-cum-real estate operation, with a minor sideline in education, where money has determined everything, where respect for pedagogy is at a minimum."

Trump and his friends might agree as they gather under the label of Trumpism to declare what in effect is a war on the education system in America. The overall picture today is of universities with their back to the wall, straining to defend their freedoms without going for an all-out fight and holding on only where the administration's demands are so egregious that they are almost impossible to meet.

Mostly, the picture is of looking for a way out. For example, while there are some statements of support from across universities, the institutes have not put up a robust joint front against Trump, or are unwilling and/or unable to take the issue aggressively straight to the public or are willing to set up regulations that meet some demands and in the process showing up the once-powerful bodies as weak, easily

trampled upon and with little fire in the belly to stand up.

Consider the imposing Massachusetts Institute of Technology, MIT. The 164-year-old institution runs a rather popular and fun game (they call it a "serious game") called The Moral Machine to understand how humans might want autonomous vehicles to respond to unavoidable accident scenarios in the real world. The Moral Machine has collected 39.61 million decisions in 233 countries, dependencies or territories, according to one paper. For all its efforts to understand the moral dilemmas brought up by use of modern systems, it took one student and one small speech of less than four minutes to hold a moral mirror to MIT and shame the university worldwide. MIT is among the universities in America to have research ties, funding or contracts with the Israeli military that runs what today is beyond any shadow of doubt a genocidal operation in Palestinian territories. MIT has received over US \$11 million in research funding from the Israeli Ministry of Defence,

according to May/June 2024 'The MIT Faculty Newsletter', an independent forum for the expression of faculty views and concerns.

Taking the stage at the pre-convocation festivities, the elected Indian American President of MIT's Class of 2025 Megha Vemuri torched the institute she is graduating from: "The Israeli occupation forces are the only foreign military that MIT has research ties with; this means that Israel's assault on the Palestinian people is not only aided and abetted by our country, but our school. We are watching Israel try to wipe Palestine off the face of the earth, and it is a shame that MIT is a part of it."

The bold protest speaks of the merits of a US campus, where students find ways to be engaged in events beyond the textbooks and learn to take a stand, add to it the passion, energy and care-a-damn attitude of their youth to turn it into a potent protest for the world to see. This is unlike India, where voices don't emerge and are put down when raised, as seen in cases like a teacher who was dismissed in one Mumbai school just because she liked a post that spoke of Israel's genocide.

On the other hand, MIT's statement in favour of free speech that followed Vemuri's speech rang hollow because the President of the Class was barred from attending her own graduation. While MIT runs the moral machine and does some exemplary research, Vemuri and her classmates showed that they are moral humans pointing to holes in the imposing edifice of MIT and indeed the entire lot of US schools.

## The ocean is not just a carbon sink

Next week, governments and civil-society organizations from around the world will gather in Nice, France, for the United Nations Ocean Conference.

The timing is fitting, because changes in our oceans have become a familiar barometer for the severity of the climate crisis. Island populations, such as the inhabitants of the largest of Panama's Carti Islands, are being forced to abandon their homes in the face of rising sea levels. And many coastal communities, often some of the poorest in the world, are being ravaged by increasingly severe cyclones.

As the ones on the front line, small island developing states are also leading sources of climate innovation. We have become test beds for solutions that can guide action globally. From our perspective, the ocean is not just a symptom of a changing climate, but also a major part of the solution.

The High-Level Panel for a Sustainable Ocean Economy (of which the Seychelles is a member) estimates that some 35% of the emissions reductions needed by 2050 could come from the ocean. Most of this potential lies in industrial sectors – from decarbonized shipping to marine-based renewable energy. But the protection and restoration of certain "blue carbon ecosystems" – mangroves, seagrasses, salt-marshes – can also measurably contribute to climate-change mitigation efforts.

In our own 2021 NDC, the Seychelles committed to mapping and subsequently protecting all seagrasses across our exclusive economic zone—an area totaling 1.3 million square kilometers (503,000 square miles)—by 2030. Now, I am proud to say that we have already met that goal, protecting over 99% of our seagrass meadows five years ahead of schedule. In doing so, we have set a benchmark for ocean-climate leadership.

In addition to serving as a measurable source of carbon storage, these ecosystems are some of the most effective and cost-efficient forms of natural infrastructure available for stabilizing shorelines and buffering storms. They provide a vital first line of defense for islanders and coastal dwellers, absorbing wave energy, filtering water, and preventing erosion. And they also underpin the blue economy on which

billions of livelihoods depend. In fact, seagrasses alone "provide valuable habitat to over one-fifth of the world's 25 largest fisheries," including many species that are key to local food security and incomes. Healthy coastal ecosystems mean healthier economies, more resilient communities, and greater long-term stability.

Our experience offers important lessons. While the ocean has long been described as the planet's greatest "carbon sink," that is an outdated construct. The ocean has indeed absorbed most anthropogenic heat and carbon dioxide emissions since the start of industrialization. But its capacity to do so is not unlimited. There is no magic "plug hole" where heat and carbon simply disappear. Depicting the ocean this way risks obscuring the tangible, place-based role of marine ecosystems in supporting many communities' cultures, diets, identities, and survival. For Seychellois, seagrass meadows are far more important as a habitat for the rabbitfish that sustain artisanal fishers, or as a source of food and shelter for the turtles that attract so many tourists, than they are as carbon sinks.

Reducing the value of three-quarters of our planet to the singular role of carbon sink overlooks the ocean's vast contributions to food security, cultural identity, and economic resilience. This narrow framing reinforces the inequities baked into how we assess, govern, and invest in planetary systems.

Ultimately, industrial marine sectors and natural ecosystems are underused tools in addressing climate change and other development needs. As world leaders gather in Nice and prepare for the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Belém (COP30), they can take inspiration from the Seychelles in championing ocean-based climate action.

We must not treat the ocean as an afterthought or a technical fix, but rather as a central pillar of the climate agenda. The ocean's role as a "carbon sink" has bought us precious time, but at a huge cost in terms of its vibrancy and abundance. For the long-term health of people and the planet, preserving ocean health is essential.

# CCB: Beware of fake PM-Kisan apps, links

**Jaipur, June 7:** Rajasthan Police's cyber crime branch (CCB) has cautioned people against registering for the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-Kisan) scheme through fake mobile app links and issued an advisory in this regard.

The police said that cyber-criminals are trapping people by sharing a fake link or APK file on social media, claiming it to be the mobile app of the scheme.

Under this scheme, eligible farmers get financial assistance of Rs 6,000 in three instalments every year.

According to this, fake APK files of PM Kisan Registration and PM-Kisan scheme are being shared on WhatsApp groups and other means. It is being claimed that through this app, farmers can register for the scheme from the comfort of their homes and get benefits immediately.

Superintendent of Police (Cyber Crime) Shantanu Kumar said that the investigation has

revealed that through the fake APK file, backdoor malware gets installed in the mobile. This gives control of the mobile to cybercriminals.

Criminals are then able to illegally withdraw money from bank accounts by obtaining mobile screen recordings, OTP, banking apps and other sensitive information.

The Branch has clarified that registration in PM-Kisan can only be done through the tehsil-level agriculture office, central government portal, pm-kisan.gov.in, or CSC (Common Service Centre).

According to the police, people should only download the official app from Google Play Store.

It has appealed to the general public, especially farmers and e-mitra operators, to be cautious of any fake link or app. If any such activity is reported, immediately inform the cyber helpline number 1930 or the nearest police/cyber police station, the advisory stated.

# Messi will surely visit Kerala: Abdurahiman

**Thiruvananthapuram, June 7:** Kerala Sports Minister V Abdurahiman Saturday asserted that Argentina national football team, led by legendary player Lionel Messi, would surely visit the state as announced by the government earlier and the sponsor has paid the match fee for the event.

He said the foreign team is more likely to come in October-November months this year and they would be treated as the state guests and their security, accomodation and other facilities would be met by the government.

The sports minister kept the hopes of soccer buffs in the state alive months after a section of the media reported that the Argentina team cancelled its scheduled visit to Kerala as the sponsors breached the contract norms. Both Abdurahiman and the sponsor, Reporter Broad-



casting Company, had strongly rejected the reports then and reiterated that the world champions would play a friendly match in the southern state.

The Minister, who put a brief FB post Friday saying that "Messi will come", brought the issue to the limelight again.

He also thanked the sponsor, the Reporter Broadcasting Company, in the post.

While talking to the media Saturday, Abdurahiman said there was some delay in the payment of the match fee by the sponsor and it is resolved now.

"The sponsor has paid the amount now. There is no other obstacles in this regard. As per the FIFA window, October-November is the time allotted for the world teams to take part in such events. So, the same time

is likely to be allotted for us also," he said.

As per the contract between the sponsor and the Argentina Football Association (AFA), the team management would reach the state after the payment of the match fee and they would announce the date and other details through a joint statement, he said.

While replying to a question, Abdurahiman said it was the sponsor who informed the government about the payment of the match fee and they are yet to get an update from the Argentina team management in this regard.

"The sponsors said they settled the contract amount to be paid before the match. The government has no connection with any financial dealings in this regard. The contract is between the sponsor and the team management," he said. The proposed friendly match is more likely to be held at the greenfield stadium here as it meets international standards.

# Govt to send 50,000 elderly on pilgrimage

With the launch of the next phase of the extensive campaign -- the registration of volunteers -- we are ushering in a major change in the field of palliative care, he said.



## New Coast Guard jetty at Vizhinjam

**Thiruvananthapuram:** A new coast guard jetty, aimed at ensuring safe berthing and swift deployment of surface assets, was inaugurated at Vizhinjam here Saturday, sources said. The new jetty was inaugurated by Director General S Paramesh, AVSM, PTM, TM of Indian Coast Guard in the presence of Inspector General Bhisham Sharma, PTM, TM Commander Coast Guard Region(West) in an official ceremony, a Defence release said. It said the coast guard jetty "will be a cutting edge in safe berthing and swift deployment of surface assets". The newly inaugurated berth with 76.70 meter length, 8 meter breadth and 4-6 meter depth can accommodate the present coast guard vessels held at Vizhinjam. "The construction of the jetty was executed through the Harbour Engineering Department (HED) of the Kerala State Government and constructed by RTF Infra Pvt Ltd, Thiruvananthapuram," it said. Senior officers from Vizhinjam International Seaport Ltd (VISL), Government of Kerala, Kerala Maritime Board, Port authorities, officers from Army, Air Force, State Police, Adani Port Pvt Ltd, Fisheries Department, and representatives from private and public sectors were also present at the event, the release said.

# Op Sindoor inspires tribute from GIB conservation

**Jaisalmer, June 7:** To honour the armed forces following Operation Sindoor, a special tribute is taking shape in the border state of Rajasthan - rare Great Indian Bustard (GIB) chicks born under a conservation project in Jaisalmer have been named after key officers and significant milestones linked to the operation.

Names like 'Sindoor', 'Atom', 'Mishri', 'Vyom', and 'Sophia' now resonate through the conservation centres at Sudasari and Sam, where science, strategy and national pride are working together to revive one of India's most endangered bird species.

"By giving these chicks these names, we are connecting the story of wildlife conservation with the story of national courage," said Brijmohan Gupta, Divisional Forest Officer of Desert National Park.

This year alone, 21 chicks have hatched under the Project GIB initiative, including seven in May and the latest one June 1.

The naming began with a chick born May 5 being called 'Sindoor'

after the military operation.

Others followed: 'Atom' (May 9) signifies the mission's strategic power; 'Mishri' (May 19) honours an undercover cyber intelligence officer; 'Vyom' (May 23) is named after Wing Commander Vyomika Singh and 'Sophia' (May 24) is dedicated to Colonel Sophia Qureshi, the two officers led the official media briefing of the operation.

Operation Sindoor was launched early May 7 by Indian military to destroy nine terror infrastructures in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied-Kashmir in

retaliation to the April 22 Pahal-gam terror attack. Subsequently, India responded strongly to Pakistan's attempts to target its military and civilian areas with drones, missiles and other weapons.

"It's not just about saving a bird, it's about preserving the values that define us as a nation," Gupta added.

Once found across India's grasslands, the Great Indian Bustard has been pushed to the brink of extinction due to habitat loss, poaching, and infrastructural threats like power

lines. Presently, fewer than 150 remain in the wild, most of them in Rajasthan.

To counter this crisis, Project GIB was launched in 2018 as a joint initiative of the Ministry of Environment, the Wildlife Institute of India, and the Rajasthan Forest Department.

The breeding centres at Sudasari and Sam are equipped with AI-enabled surveillance, temperature-controlled incubators, and sensor-based monitoring systems. This advanced infrastructure ensures real-time tracking of egg conditions and chick health. Till date, the centres have successfully hatched and nurtured 65 chicks.

The newly born chicks are being gradually trained in semi-natural enclosures to help them adapt to wild conditions. The eventual goal is their re-introduction into open desert landscapes, where their survival and breeding in the wild will mark a turning point in India's conservation journey.

Gupta said the department's next focus is to enhance survival rates and reduce infant mortality. AI monitoring has already improved outcomes, allowing for early intervention and round-the-clock care.

The team also involves local communities to foster a sense of shared responsibility for protecting this critically endangered species.

**Jaipur, June 7:** Heatwave has intensified its grip over Rajasthan as the maximum temperature in several places was recorded above the 40-degree mark Saturday, the Jaipur Meteorological Centre said.

Jaisalmer was the hottest place in the state Saturday, recording a high of 45.3 degrees Celsius.

The weather department

has predicted that the heatwave will intensify further in the state.

Bikaner recorded a high of 45.2 degrees, while it was 44.6 degrees in Barmer and Ganganagar each, 44.2 degrees in Phalodi, 44 degrees in Kota, 43.6 degrees in Churu, 43.3 degrees in Chittorgarh, 42.5 degrees in Jodhpur, 42.4 degrees in Bhilwara, 42.2 degrees Celsius in Pilani.

There is every possi-

bility of an increase of 1 to 2 degrees in maximum temperature in the next 48 hours and heatwave in western Rajasthan.

The maximum temperature in the Bikaner division and Shekhawati region of north-western Rajasthan can be 45-46 degrees on June 8 to 10. Strong winds with a speed of 30-40 km per hour will blow in these areas during this period.

# Queue management system in all Rajasthan govt hosps

**Jaipur, June 7:** A modern 'queue management system' is being introduced across hospitals affiliated to medical colleges in Rajasthan to ease the process of patient registration and reduce waiting times, officials said Saturday.

After successful implementation of the system on a pilot basis at Jaipuria and Kanwatia hospitals in Jaipur, the initiative will now be expanded to other hospitals across the state, an official statement said.

Medical Education Secretary Ambrish Kumar visited both hospitals Saturday to inspect the functioning of the new system. He observed the



patient registration process at OPD counters and interacted with doctors and patients to gather feedback. Kumar said preparations are underway to implement the system at Jaipur's Sawai Mansingh (SMS) Hospital, where work is progressing at full pace.

Superintendents of other hospitals affiliated with Sawai Man Singh Medical College also visited Jaipuria Hospital to review the system, and it will be rolled out in their facilities soon, the statement added.

Three militants held in Manipur

Imphal:

Security forces have arrested three militants, belonging to two proscribed outfits in Manipur, police said Saturday. All the arrests were made Friday in Bishnupur, Kakching and Imphal West districts, a senior officer said. One active cadre of the banned Kangleipak Communist Party (Peoples' War Group) was apprehended from Wangoo Samushang area in Bishnupur for allegedly being involved in extortion activities, he said.

Five Naxalites gunned down in Chhattisgarh

Bijapur:

Five Naxalites were killed in two encounters with security forces in an ongoing operation in the Indravati National Park area of Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, police said Saturday. With the latest casualties, seven Naxalites, including top leaders Sudhakar and Bhaskar, were neutralised in the operation in the last three days, they said. "Security forces have recovered the bodies of seven Maoists during the ongoing anti-Naxal operations in the Indravati National Park area of the district," a senior police official said.

2 morning walkers killed by speeding car

Ghaziabad (UP):

Two neighbours who were out on a morning walk were killed by a speeding car in the Rajnagar Extension area, the police said Saturday. Subhash Singh Chauhan (57) and Kamlesh Yadav (45), residents of Brij Nagri Colony, were struck from behind by a car that then fled the scene, ACP Nandgram Poonam Mishra said. CCTV footage captured the gruesome details of the accident in which Chauhan's head was crushed under the car while Yadav was thrown into a deep roadside pit.

Dog seen carrying dead newborn in its jaws

Mhow:

In a disturbing incident, a stray dog was seen clutching a dead newborn in its jaws near the toilet of a government hospital in Madhya Pradesh's Indore district Saturday before a security guard managed to retrieve the body after shooting away the animal. Authorities at the civil hospital in Mhow, some 25 kilometres from the district headquarters, and police have begun a probe into the antecedents of the newborn and the chain of events that followed.

The Congress leader targets EC after it rejects rigging charge

New Delhi, June 7:

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi claimed Saturday that the 2024 Maharashtra Assembly elections were a "blueprint for rigging democracy" and alleged this "match-fixing" would next happen in Bihar, even as the Election Commission rejected the charge saying defaming the poll panel after an unfavourable verdict is absolutely absurd.

The BJP also hit out at Gandhi over the allegations with party chief JP Nadda accusing the Congress leader of cooking up "bizarre conspiracies" and "fake narratives" out of desperation after losing a series of elections.

As the two rival parties and EC sparred over the issue, Gandhi again hit out at the poll panel after sources in the Commission debunked his charges, saying evasion would not protect its credibility but

telling the truth would.

Gandhi made the allegations related to Maharashtra polls in an article published in several newspapers and later in his posts on X.

"My article shows how this (rigging) happened, step by step: Step 1: Rig the panel for appointing the Election Commission. Step 2: Add fake voters to the roll. Step 3: Inflate voter turnout. Step 4: Target the bogus voting exactly where the BJP needs to win. Step 5: Hide the evidence," Gandhi alleged in his post.

Gandhi said fixed elections are a "poison" for any democracy, and the side that cheats may win the game, but it damages institutions and destroys public faith.

Lashing out at Gandhi, Nadda said his article is a "blueprint for manufacturing fake narratives", owing to his sadness and desperation of losing election after election.

He said, "Here's how he does it, step by step. Step 1: The Congress Party gets defeated in election after election due to its antics. Step 2: Instead of introspecting, he cooks up

The pan-India superstar's latest film "Thug Life", the 234th in a 65-year career, released in theatres this week amid controversy over his comment that Kannada was born out of Tamil. He refused to apologise and the film did not release in Karnataka.

"I am the actor from 'Ek Duuje Ke Liye'," Haasan told PTI during a recent visit to the news agency's headquarters, referring to his 1981 hit Hindi film about a Tamil boy and his romance with his Hindi speaking neighbour.

to education... and not put hurdles in its way" the actor said.

Tejashwi escapes unhurt as his convoy hit by truck in Bihar; 3 hurt

Vaishali (Bihar), June 7:

RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav escaped unhurt as a speeding truck hit two vehicles of his convoy, injuring three security personnel in Bihar's Vaishali district early Saturday, police said.

The vehicle of the leader of the opposition in the Bihar assembly was not hit by the truck, a senior officer said. The accident took place around 12.30 am when Yadav's convoy had stopped for a tea break on the Patna-Muzaffarpur National Highway near Goraul, he said. They were returning to Patna from Madhepura when the accident took place.

"Yadav escaped unhurt in the accident. Three security personnel sustained injuries and were taken to the nearest government hospital, where their condition is reported to be stable. Yadav had also visited the health facility and enquired about the condition of the injured personnel," the police officer said. Talking to reporters at the hospital, Yadav said, "The accident took place when we were returning from Madhepura to Patna. We had stopped for a tea break near Goraul. A speeding truck rammed into two vehicles of my convoy, injuring three security personnel. I immediately alerted the district police and the administration. The accident took place just five feet away from my vehicle."

The police arrested the truck driver and his helper and seized the vehicle, the officer said.

"Action should be taken against those who violated traffic rules," Yadav said.

Vaishali SP Lalit Mohan Sharma - told PTI, "Three policemen - two security personnel of the convoy and one from the district police - suffered injuries in the accident.

Shubhanshu Shukla to dock at ISS June 11 after 28-hr flight

The mission will mark India's return to space 41 years after Rakesh Sharma's historic spaceflight onboard Russia's Soyuz mission in 1984

New Delhi, June 7:

Indian astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla and three others are set to embark on the Axiom Space's fourth human spaceflight from NASA's Kennedy Space Centre in Florida June 10 and are likely to dock at the International Space Station June 11 at about 10 PM IST, after a nearly 28-hour journey.

Shukla, the mission pilot of the Axiom-4 (Ax4) commercial mission to the ISS, will be accompanied by mission commander Peggy Whitson and specialists Tibor Kapu from Hungary and Slawosz Uznanski-Wisniewski from Poland.

The Axiom-4 mission will mark India's return to space 41 years after Rakesh Sharma's historic spaceflight onboard Russia's Soyuz mission in 1984.

"The crew will travel to the orbiting laboratory on a new SpaceX Dragon spacecraft after launching on the company's Falcon 9 rocket. The targeted docking time is approximately 12:30 pm, Wednesday, June 11," NASA said in a statement.

ISRO Chairman V Narayanan visited Axiom Space last week to review the preparations for the spaceflight.

The astronauts have been in quarantine since May 25 to prepare for the trip and have been

ISRO has lined up a set of seven experiments for Shukla, who will also participate in five joint studies planned by NASA for its human research program

Shukla will also expose the seeds to the macrobiotic conditions and bring them back to earth where they will be cultivated into plants not just once but over generations

training ahead of the launch June 10. "The #Ax4 crew undergoes extensive emergency training, featuring a range of scenarios such as underwater escape drills," Axiom Space said in a post on X, and shared a video of the training programme.

During the 14-day stay at the ISS, the Ax-4 crew is expected to interact with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, school students, and space industry leaders among others.

Earlier this week, the crew addressed a press conference to give an update on the training ahead of the launch.

### China okays some rare-earth exports

Beijing, June 7: China Saturday approved some export license applications for rare earth-related metals -- critical components used in manufacturing of automobiles, semiconductors, mobile phones and a host of other industries.

The approval was granted considering rising global demand for medium and heavy rare earth elements driven by industries such as robotics and new energy vehicles, a spokesperson of the Ministry of Commerce here said.

Rare earth-related items have dual-use attributes for both military and civilian purposes, the spokesperson said, noting that imposing export controls on such items is in line with international practice.

The spokesperson said the controls aim to better safeguard national security and interests and fulfil international obligations of non-proliferation, which reflects China's commitment to world peace and regional stability.

## Kharkiv faces fiercest Russian attack

Kyiv, June 7: Russian attacks targeting the eastern Ukrainian city of Kharkiv killed at least four people and wounded more than two dozen others Saturday, officials said, as hopes for peace dimmed further.

The first wave on Ukraine's second-largest city was a large Russian drone-and-missile attack in the early hours. It killed at least three people and wounded 21 others, according to local officials.

In the afternoon, Russia dropped aerial bombs on the city centre, killing at least one person and wounding five more, Kharkiv's mayor said.

The warring sides also accused each other of trying to sabotage a planned prisoner exchange, nearly a week after Kyiv embarrassed the Kremlin with a surprising drone attack on military airfields deep inside Russia.

Saturday's barrage -- the latest in near daily widescale attacks on Ukraine -- included aerial glide bombs that have become part of a fierce Russian onslaught in the all-out war,



which began February 24, 2022.

#### Residents describe fiery trap

As firefighters and emergency workers bustled around attack sites in Kharkiv, residents described the strikes that damaged their homes and nearly took their lives Saturday morning.

Alina Belous said that she had tried to extinguish flames with buckets of water to rescue

a young girl -- trapped inside a burning building -- who had called out for help.

"We were trying to put it out ourselves with our buckets, together with our neighbours. Then the rescuers arrived and started helping us put out the fire, but there was smoke and they worried that we couldn't stay there. When the ceiling started falling off, they took us out," she said.

## Trump says he has no plans to speak to Musk as feud persists

Washington, June 7: US President Donald Trump said Friday that he has no plans to speak with Elon Musk, signaling the president and his former ally might not resolve their feud over a sweeping tax-cut bill any time soon.

Addressing reporters aboard Air Force One, Trump said he wasn't "thinking about" the Tesla CEO.

"I hope he does well with Tesla," Trump said.

However, Trump said a review of Musk's extensive contracts with the federal government was in order. "We'll take look at everything," the president said. "It's a lot of money."

Trump may get rid of the red Tesla Model S that he bought in March after showcasing Musk's electric cars on the White House lawn, a White House official said, speaking



on condition of anonymity.

Musk, for his part, did not directly address Trump but kept up his criticism of the massive Republican tax and spending bill that contains much of Trump's domestic agenda.

On his social-media platform X, Musk amplified remarks made by others that Trump's "big beautiful bill" would hurt Republicans politically and add to the nation's \$36.2 trillion debt. He replied "exactly" to a post by another X user that said Musk had criticized Congress and Trump had responded by criticizing Musk personally.

Musk also declared it was time for a new political party in the United States "to represent the 80% in the middle!"

## Israel retrieves body of Thai hostage

55 HOSTAGES REMAIN IN GAZA, AND ISRAEL SAYS MORE THAN HALF ARE DEAD

Tel Aviv, June 7: Israel said Saturday it had retrieved the body of a Thai hostage abducted into Gaza during the October 7, 2023 attack that sparked the war, as it continued its military offensive, killing at least 95 people in the past 24 hours, according to Gaza's health ministry.

The prime minister's office said Nattapong Pinta's body was returned to Israel in a special military operation. Pinta was seized from Kibbutz Nir Oz and killed early in the war, the government said.

Thailand's foreign ministry in a statement confirmed that the last Thai hostage in Gaza was confirmed dead. It said the bodies of two others are yet to be retrieved.

The news came two days after the bodies of two Israeli-American hostages were retrieved. Fifty-five hostages remain in Gaza, and Israel says more than half are dead.



Israel's defence minister said Pinta's body was retrieved from the Rafah area in southern Gaza. He had come to Israel to work in agriculture.

The army said he was seized by the Mujahideen Brigades, the small armed group that it said also abducted and killed Shirbi Bibas and her two small children. The same group took the two Israeli-American hostages, Judih Weinstein and Gad Haggai, whose bodies were retrieved Thursday.

Thais were the largest group of foreigners held captive by Hamas militants. Many of the agricultural workers lived in compounds on the outskirts of southern Israeli kibbutzim and towns, and Hamas militants overran those places first.

A total of 46 Thais have been killed during the conflict, according to Thailand's foreign ministry. Separately, Hamas issued an unusual warning about another hostage, Matan Zangauker, saying Israel's military

had surrounded the area where he is held and that any harm to him during a rescue attempt would be Israel's responsibility.

#### Israel continues its military offensive

Israel continued its military offensive across Gaza.

Four strikes hit the Muwasi area in southern Gaza between Rafah and Khan Younis. In northern Gaza, one strike hit an apartment, killing seven people including a mother and five children. Their bodies were taken to Shifa hospital.

"Stand up, my love," one weeping woman said, touching the shrouded bodies.

Another strike in Gaza City killed six members of a family, including two children, according to the Shifa and al-Ahli hospitals. Israel said it was responding to Hamas' "barbaric attacks" and dismantling its capabilities. It said it takes all feasible precautions to mitigate civilian harm.

Late GST returns can't be filed after 3 years

GSTR-3B to become non-editable from July

**New Delhi, June 7:** The Goods and Services Tax Network (GSTN) announced major changes on Saturday, stating that from the July 2025 tax period, the monthly GST payment form GSTR-3B will become non-editable.

Alongside this, taxpayers will also not be allowed to file any GST returns after three years from their original due dates.

In its advisory, GSTN explained that while GSTR-3B will still be auto-filled based on sales data from forms like GSTR-1, any changes or corrections must be made before filing, using form GSTR-1A.

This revised data will then automatically show up in GSTR-3B. Once that is done, taxpayers will no longer be able to edit the GSTR-3B manually, as is currently possible.

“For the July 2025 tax period, to be filed in August 2025, the auto-populated tax liability in GSTR-3B will be final and cannot be changed after filing,” the advisory stated.

This move is aimed at improving data accuracy between different GST forms and preventing tax leakage.

GSTR-3B is a monthly summary return used to report tax liability and is filed between the 20th and 24th of each month, depending on the type of taxpayer.

Currently, businesses receive a pre-filled version of this form, but they can still make edits before final submission.

That flexibility will no longer be available after the new rule kicks in.

In another important update, GSTN said that starting from July 2025, taxpayers will not be able to file any GST return if it is more than three years late.

This includes monthly returns like GSTR-1 and GSTR-3B, annual returns like GSTR-9, and other returns such as GSTR-4, GSTR-5, GSTR-5A, GSTR-6, GSTR-7, and GSTR-8.

This rule was introduced through the Finance Act, 2023, and will now be implemented on the GST portal.

It means that if a return is not filed within three years of its due date, it will become permanently time-barred and cannot be submitted.

GSTN has advised all taxpayers to reconcile their accounts and file any pending returns as soon as possible to avoid being locked out by the new time limit.

Having been with the group since the early days of its retail journey, Mohanty shares his experience so far and aspiration to build customer-first infrastructure across the state. Excerpts...*

DEEPAK KUMAR DEHURY, OP

How do you assess Reliance Retail's current presence in Odisha?

There has been substantial growth in Reliance Retail's operations in Odisha. We have multiple stores across the state and many more in the pipeline, especially in the grocery sector. Today, our grocery operations are active in every part of India, including Jammu and the Northeast. Odisha is no exception—we're growing faster here than the national average.

Could you share the scale of your store network in Odisha and nationally?

We currently have around 3,300 stores across India, with new ones opening almost every day. In Odisha, we operate about 10 premium 'Signature' stores, like the one at Gopabandhu Square in Bhubaneswar, along with several small-format grocery outlets under the 'Smart Bazaar' brands. Out of the state's 30 districts, 25 already have Smart Bazaar outlets, and property deals have been signed in the remaining five.

What explains this growth surge in Odisha?

We are expanding beyond cities into blocks, sub-divisions, and even police station jurisdictions. We've reached 46 such jurisdictions already. Cities with populations of 75,000 to 1 lakh also have aspirational consumers—and we are meeting their expectations.

Reliance is also working with farmers. Tell us more.

We're bridging supply chain gaps—especially for perishables like mangoes. Farmers often lose out due to middlemen. Through about 10 collection centres, farmers can now view real-time prices and get instant digital payments directly into their accounts.

How did your career evolve from banking to retail?

I started in retail banking with HDFC and ICICI, working across deposits, treasury, and foreign exchange. Around 2005, due to family needs, I returned to Kolkata. That's when Reliance approached me. It was the right time to build something from the ground up—and that's exactly what we did in Odisha.

What's your long-term vision for Odisha?

Lending rates may fall by 30 bps after policy rate cut: SBI

**Mumbai, June 7:** Lending rates are expected to drop by about 30 basis points (bps) after the recent cut in policy rates, according to a new SBI report.

This change will be felt most immediately in loans linked to the External Benchmark Lending Rate (EBLR), which account for around 60 per cent of all loans given by Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs), as per the data compiled by State Bank of India (SBI) Research said.

The report said that because of this high share of EBLR-linked loans, the impact of the policy rate cut will be passed on quickly, making loans cheaper for many borrowers. “This move is aimed at reducing borrowing costs and boosting demand in the economy,” the report added.

However, the fall in lending rates could hurt banks' profit margins. To help ease this pressure, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has also lowered the Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR), which will reduce the cost of funds for banks.

**Washington, June 7:** Tesla is the worst-performing large-cap stock this year, thanks to declining electric vehicle demand, Chief Executive Elon Musk's political controversies over his ties to far-right groups, and now, his public feud with President Donald Trump.

Tesla shares slumped Thursday, after Trump on social media threatened to cut off government contracts with Elon Musk's companies, following Musk's sharp criticism of the president's signature tax and spending bill on his X social media platform.

The market capitalisation of Tesla Inc has fallen 29.3% to \$917 billion so far this year, the



biggest drop among big companies in the world.

Tesla, which ranked eighth globally in market capitalization at the beginning of the year, slipped to tenth as of June 5.

The company's shares rose in early trading Friday, as investors took some comfort from White House aides scheduling a call with Musk to broker peace after a public feud with Trump.

Apple, which began the year as the world's most valuable company, has slipped to No 3 this year, dragged down by weak demand in China, Trump's tariff threats, and slower progress in AI. Its market capitalization has declined over 20% this year, falling to \$2.99 trillion as of Thursday.

# Gukesh blunders against Caruana

## CARLSEN WINS NORWAY CHESS TITLE FOR SEVENTH TIME

**Stavanger, June 7:** World champion D Gukesh committed a costly blunder against American Grandmaster Fabiano Caruana in the final round to finish third, as five-time world champion Magnus Carlsen clinched a record-extending seventh Norway Chess title here.

Gukesh, after being in a disadvantageous position against 2018 Norway Chess champion Fabiano Caruana, tried to stage a late comeback but ran out of time and committed a blunder, instantly realising his chances had slipped away.

Gukesh offered a handshake, grimaced, closed his eyes, and buried his face in both hands in frustration.

It was a golden opportunity for the young Indian world champion to win his maiden Norway Chess title in only his second appearance, after a roller-coaster tournament that saw him start on a poor note before turning things around with impressive Classical wins over Magnus Carlsen, compatriot Arjun Erigaisi, and China's Wei Yi.

Defending champion Carlsen, who was the overnight leader with 15 points after round 9, ended the tournament with 16 points after fashioning the great escape against GM Erigaisi and steering the game to a draw in the 10th round on Friday.

Gukesh finished third - the same as in the 2023 edition - with 14.5 points, while Caruana was second with 15.5 points. Erigaisi finished fifth with 13 points.

Erigaisi won the Armageddon tie-break against Carlsen following the miraculous draw by the Norwegian, but it did not matter in the end as the five-time world champion had already secured a point with the stalemate to win the title.

While Gukesh quietly walked out of the arena after losing to Caruana, Carlsen said he had to "literally fight for his life" to stay in the match against Arjun Erigaisi.

A defeat for the Norwegian would have been catastrophic, as the Gukesh-Caruana game was still in progress, and a Classical win for either would have dashed his hopes of a seventh Norway Chess title and the accompanying prize purse of approximately \$69,500.

In fact, had Gukesh managed to draw his game against the American Grandmaster,



he would have secured the title—provided Carlsen had lost his Classical encounter against Erigaisi.

Under the Norway Chess format, a Classical win earns three points, while a draw gives each player one point. A drawn game is followed by an Armageddon tie-break to decide the winner, who is awarded an additional half point.

Carlsen said he would not be playing a lot of classical chess in times to come.

"Not a lot (of classical chess) for sure. I'm not going to say that this tournament was my last for sure but I enjoy other forms of chess a lot more."

### Muzychuk wins women's title

In the women's section, overnight leader and two-time world blitz champion, Ukraine's Anna Muzychuk won the title with 16.5 points despite an Armageddon tie-break loss to India's R. Vaishali in the final round.

Muzychuk's draw in the classical game against the Indian earned both players a point each, while Vaishali secured another half a point by beating the Ukrainian in the Armageddon sudden death to finish on 11 points.

Had Vaishali defeated Muzychuk - who was on 15.5 points overnight - in the Classical game, she would have deprived the Ukrainian Grandmaster of three points, which would have propelled Koneru Humpy to the title had the two-time world rapid champion too got the better of Chinese world champion Ju Wenjun in the Classical game.

Unfortunately, Humpy, who was on 13.5 points overnight after round 9, could only manage a draw with white pieces to earn one point. She got another half point by overcoming Wenjun in the Armageddon tie-break to earn 1.5 points, and finish with 15 points and a third-place finish.

## SHORT TAKES

### 30 wrestlers suspended

**New Delhi:** Cracking down the whip on overage wrestlers competing at junior level, the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) has handed temporary suspension to 30 of them in the past month after investigating more than 400 such cases. The WFI acted on complaints, largely from coaches and wrestlers from the Delhi 'Akharas' that many wrestlers from Haryana have procured fake certificates to show they were born in the national capital and are eligible to compete at junior level. Much to the exasperation of WFI, two overage wrestlers even won medals at the recent Khelo India Games in Bihar. "We do not want to spoil careers of wrestlers, so we have just barred them from the junior level competitions, like U18 and Cadets. They should compete at the senior level, if they are over 18 they must represent their original state," a senior WFI official told PTI.

### Norway decimate Italy

**Oslo:** Erling Haaland scored and Norway humbled Italy 3-0 for the first time in 25 years in qualifying for the 2026 World Cup. Haaland Friday collected a through ball from playmaker Martin Odegaard and rounded goalkeeper Gianluigi Donnarumma in the box for the third goal three minutes before halftime. It was his 41st goal in his 42nd match for Norway to the delight of the spectators at Ullevaal Stadium in Oslo, including King Harald V of Norway. Haaland also scored when Moldova was beaten 5-0 and Israel 4-2. Norway remained perfect in qualifying after three games in Europe Group 1.

### Starting on bad note

**Amstelveen:** The Indian men's hockey team squandered a one goal lead to lose 1-2 to Olympic champions Netherlands in the first match of the European leg of FIH Pro League here Saturday. India will face Netherlands again Monday in the second match of the European leg.

# Archery hopes crash in Antalya debacle

**Antalya, June 7:** Indian archery endured a forgettable outing at Stage 3 of the World Cup here Saturday, returning empty-handed in a performance that raised serious questions over team selection, preparation and mental fortitude, especially with the Asian Games just a year away.

The high of Shanghai last month, where India stood second on the medal tally with two gold, one silver and four bronze medals, now seems like a distant past.

The third leg in Antalya saw both recurve and compound archers flop spectacularly, with not a single podium finish, even in their traditionally strong



compound category.

A day after India's compound archers crashed out in both individual and team events, the

recurve results were equally dismal, with seasoned names like four-time Olympians Deepika Kumari and Tarundeep Rai

also failing to reach the medal rounds.

The only fight came from Simranjeet Kaur, who shocked everyone by stretching Korean Olympic gold medallist An San to a shoot-off in the quarterfinals Saturday.

An San, meanwhile, defeated Indian star Deepika three times in a row. The South Korean had earlier ousted the Indian star in the second round with a 6-0 rout (29-30, 27-28, 28-30) dashing her hope for a successive medal. Deepika had bagged a bronze in Shanghai last month. Deepika, the former world number 1, continues to falter against elite opponents and has failed to learn from repeated mistakes, particularly against the dominant Koreans.

# Gauff defeats Sabalenka to bag first French Open title

**Paris, June 7:** Coco Gauff won the French Open for the first time by defeating top-ranked Aryna Sabalenka 6-7 (5), 6-2, 6-4 in Saturday's final.

The second-ranked Gauff came out on top of a contest that was full of tension and momentum swings to claim her second major trophy after the 2023 US Open, where she also came from a set down to beat Sabalenka in the final.

Gauff raised the winners' trophy aloft, then kissed it several times. She held her hand over her heart when the U.S. national anthem played.

It was the first No 1 vs No 2 final in Paris since 2013, when Serena Williams defeated Maria Sharapova, and just the second in the last 30 years.

After Sabalenka sent a backhand wide on Gauff's second match point, the 21-year-old American fell onto her back, covering her face with both hands as she started to sob, then got up and held her hand over her mouth. She continued to sob as she patted the clay with her left hand.

After greeting Sabalenka at the net with a warm hug and thanking the umpire, Gauff screamed out with joy and re-

lief, then got to her knees and crouched forward, continuing to cry as she savored the win.

She hugged later film director Spike Lee and celebrated with her entourage in her box, three years after she lost in her first Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros.

In her on-court speech, she said that defeat in 2022 at the age of 18 put her in a "dark place"

and then thanked the fans on Court-Philippe Chatrier, who were rooting mostly for her.

Sabalenka was in tears moments earlier when she made her speech. Struggling to find her words, she praised Gauff for being a "fighter" and said she deserved the win, but added that the windy conditions made for an error-strewn contest.

"This will hurt so much. Coco, congrats, in the tough conditions you were a better player than me," she said. "Well done, great two weeks, and congrats on the second Grand Slam, it's well deserved." Gauff now owns two French Open trophies after winning last year's women's doubles title.
