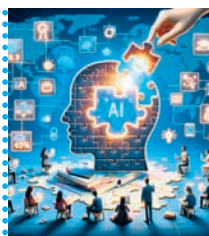

## HOUSELISTING OPS FROM APRIL 1, 2026

**New Delhi:** The houselisting operations for the forthcoming Census will begin from April 1, 2026, marking the start of the first phase of the decennial exercise, the Registrar General of India has said. In a letter to chief secretaries of states and Union Territories, Census Commissioner and Registrar General of India Mrityunjay Kumar Narayan said the Houselisting Operations and Housing Census shall begin April 1, 2026. Before that, the appointment of supervisors, enumerators and work distribution among them shall be done with cooperation from states and district administration, it said. The Census is a two-phase exercise -- in phase one i.e. Houselisting Operation (HLO), the housing conditions, assets and amenities of each household will be collected.

## MONSOON COVERS COUNTRY; 2 DEAD IN UTTARAKHAND

**New Delhi/Shimla/Uttarakshi, June 29:** A cloudburst in Uttarakhand's Uttarkashi district early Sunday left two construction workers dead and seven missing as monsoon covered the entire country almost a week earlier than usual, bringing rain in the national capital and other northern states, triggering landslides in several hilly areas and sending rivers into spate.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a red alert for heavy rainfall June 29 and 30 in various districts of Uttarakhand, including Uttarkashi, Rudrapur, Dehradun, Tehri, Pauri, Haridwar and Nainital. Authorities have put the Chardham yatra on hold for a day for the safety of pilgrims.

The Shimla Meteorological Centre has also issued a red alert for very heavy downpour in 10 districts of Himachal Pradesh, where the death toll from rain-related incidents climbed to 20 since the onset of monsoon in the state June 20.

In Uttarakhand, a landslide triggered by a cloudburst destroyed the shelters of workers engaged in the construction of a hotel along the Yamunotri National Highway in Uttarkashi district, officials said. **More P8**

# Deadly stampede at Puri

**Puri, June 29:** Three persons, including two women, were killed and over 50 others injured in a stampede near Shree Gundicha Temple in Puri early Sunday during a ceremony related to the ongoing Rath Yatra festivities, officials said.

The incident took place around 4.20am when thousands of devotees had gathered near the chariots parked in front of the temple, they said. The injured have been admitted to a nearby hospital where the condition of six people is stated to be critical. The Gundicha Temple, located around 3km from the 12th century shrine, is the aunt's house of Lord Jagannath and his siblings Subhadra and Balabhadra.

During Rath Yatra, the deities visit their aunt's home, stay there for seven days, and then return to their main abode — Srimandir.

According to police, chaos ensued after two trucks carrying 'Charamala' materials for rituals reportedly entered the crowded spot near the chariots of Lord Jagannath

and his sibling deities.

"Thousands of devotees had assembled outside the temple since the early hours to catch a glimpse of the deities when the 'Pahuda' (cloth) covering the front portion of the chariots was to be removed, as part of the rituals, the officials said.

The deceased were identified as Basanti Sahu,36, from Gobardhanpur (Khurda), and Premakant Mohanty, 78, from Nayapalli (Bhubaneswar) and Pravati Das,42, from Balipatna.

Their bodies have been handed over to family members. Following the stampede, Chief Minister Mohan Majhi ordered the transfer of District Collector Siddharth Shankar Swain and SP Vineet Agrawal.

He also suspended two police officers, DCP Bishnu Pati and Commandant Ajay Padhi, an official release said.

The CM ordered an administrative inquiry into the matter to be carried out under the supervision of Development Commissioner Anu Garg.

In another order, senior bureaucrat Saswata Mishra was appointed Principal Sec-



retary to the CM in addition to his current responsibilities. The 1996-batch IAS officer is presently posted as Principal Secretary in Finance department with additional charge of Chairman, IDCO. The state government will provide financial assistance of Rs 25 lakh each to the next of kin of the deceased, the release added.

Another notification issued by the General Administration Department stated that senior bureaucrat Aravind Agarwal will be in-charge of Rath Yatra supervision.

Earlier in a post on X, Majhi sought forgiveness from devotees of Lord Jagannath for

**Bhubaneswar:** Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan Sunday said that an administrative inquiry into the Puri stampede incident that left three people dead and 50 others injured would be completed within 30 days. He said Development Commissioner Anu Garg will submit her inquiry report to the Chief Minister within the stipulated 30 days.

the stampede, and tendered an apology on behalf of his government for the incident.

"Due to intense eagerness among devotees to have a glimpse of Mahaprabhu... an unfortunate incident occurred because of the resulting jostling and chaos. I and my government seek forgiveness from all Jagannath devotees. We express our condolences to the families of devotees who lost their lives... pray to Mahaprabhu Jagannath to grant them the strength to bear this profound sorrow," Majhi said.

He also said that security lapses behind the incident would be probed and those found guilty will face stringent action.

State Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan said the situation is now normal at the Shree Gundicha Temple, where devotees are offering prayers to the deities. According to officials, devotees gathered to witness the sacred 'Pahandi Bij' of Lord Jagannath and his siblings. During the ritual, known as 'Adapa Mandap Bij', the sibling deities were ceremonially taken in a grand procession to the Gundicha Temple.

Puri's titular king, Gajapati Maharaja Divyasingha Deb, expressed shock over the stampede, and appealed to the state government to carry out a comprehensive inquiry.

Health department sources said among those critically injured, one has been shifted to the SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack, while five others are in ICU.

A host of political leaders, including Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, Rahul Gandhi and BJD chief Naveen Patnaik condoled the deaths, with many criticising the state government over arrangements for the Rath Yatra. **More P3**

## 'Sevikas' in 'sishu vaticas' to aid pre-primary edu

**Bhubaneswar, June 29:** The government Sunday decided to appoint 'sevikas' to take care of children in all 'sishu vaticas' across the state to support pre-primary education and reduce the non-teaching workload of school teachers.

The decision was approved by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, the CMO said in a statement. 'Sishu vaticas', launched in the current academic year under the National Education Policy (NEP), are functioning in over 45,000 government primary schools across the state.

These centres provide pre-primary education to children aged 5 to 6 years.

"The 'sevikas' will assist

children in the classrooms and take care of their basic needs, which will help ease the burden on teachers and improve the quality of early education," the statement said.

The 'sevikas' will receive remuneration on par with cooks engaged under the Mid-Day Meal (MDM) scheme.

A recent situational study conducted by the government found that teachers were overburdened with managing classroom discipline and childcare in 'sishu vaticas', impacting the teaching process.

The CM expressed hope that the move would help in improving the quality of education of children at the pre-primary stage. "Managing and taking care of small children in classrooms is a major responsibility. If this responsibility is left to the teachers, the education system will be disrupted," the statement said.

## Storm over Indian defence attache's Op Sindoor remarks

**New Delhi, June 29:** A comment by India's defence attache to Indonesia, Captain Shiv Kumar, explaining India's strategy in the initial phase of Operation Sindoor has led to a huge political storm.

During a recent presentation at a seminar in an Indonesian university, Captain Kumar said the operation faced 'constraint' as the 'political leadership' did not want the Indian Air Force (IAF) to attack Pakistani military installations and their air defence assets.

"India did lose some air-

craft, but it was because of constraints given by the political leadership to not attack Pak military establishment or their air defences," Captain Kumar was quoted as saying at the seminar in Indonesia June 10.

Meanwhile, the Congress Sunday cited the reported comments of Captain Shiv Kumar and accused the government of having 'misled' the country. The party also asked why Prime Minister Narendra Modi is 'refusing' to preside over an all-party meeting to take the Opposition into confidence and why the demand for a special session of Parliament has been rejected. **P9**

## Mumbai mosques go digital with 'azan app'

**Mumbai, June 29:** In the backdrop of curbs over the use of loudspeakers, half-a-dozen mosques in Mumbai have registered on a dedicated mobile phone application which relays the 'azan', or call to prayer, directly to the faithful in real-time.

The app, Online Azan, has been developed by a Tamil Nadu-based company.

Given the restrictions and sensitivities surrounding the use of loudspeakers for the call to prayer, the dedicated mobile app helps relay the azan directly to worshippers from local



mosques, Fahad Khalil Pathan, managing trustee of Mahim Juma Masjid, told PTI.

The free app will allow users to listen to the azan at home, especially during Ramadan

(the Islamic holy month of fasting) and other times when public announcements are restricted, he explained. "The initiative comes after a police crackdown on the use of loud-

speakers, where officers visited the mosque (Juma Masjid) and warned loudspeaker use could result in action. This led to the mosque temporarily disabling its sound system," Pathan stated. To ensure that spiritual experience remains uninterrupted, especially for the elderly and those residing nearby (the mosque), the Juma Masjid in the Mahim area has adopted the app, he said.

The app was developed with technical support from a team of IT professionals from Tirunelveli in Tamil Nadu, and is now available on Android devices and iPhones.

The app plays a live audio

stream of the azan through mobile phones, exactly when it is delivered from the mosque. Worshippers who cannot physically hear the azan due to sound restrictions can now receive it through this app in real-time, Pathan said. The app also serves a larger community purpose by notifying users about prayer times and can be used like a smart watch alert system. Once installed and configured, it runs automatically.

Worshippers have praised the initiative, stating that even when loudspeakers are off, they can now still stay connected to their neighbourhood mosque's azan through their mobile phones.

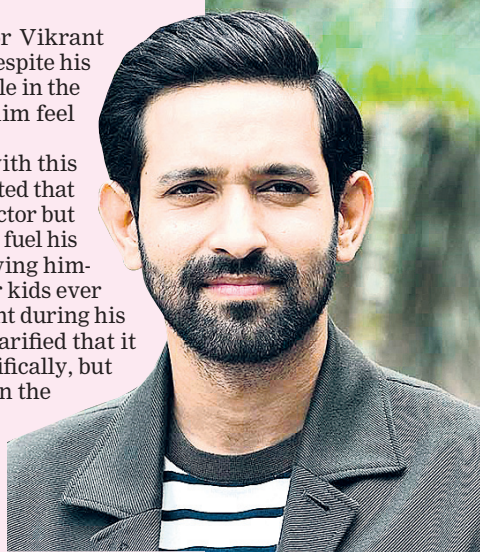

"They help keep the fire inside you burning. I actually think we need people like that—those who challenge you, who look down on you. They still exist, and I'm thankful for their presence."

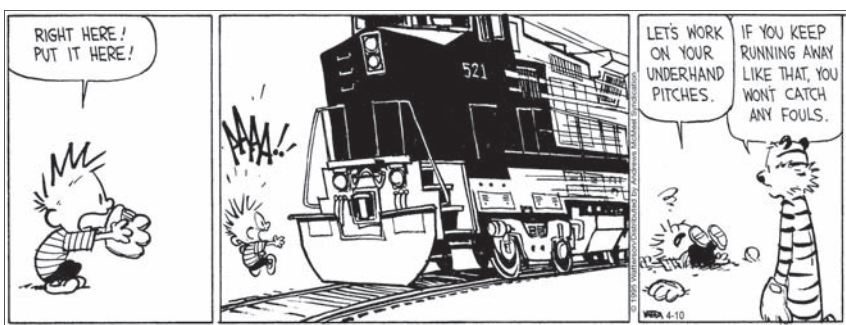

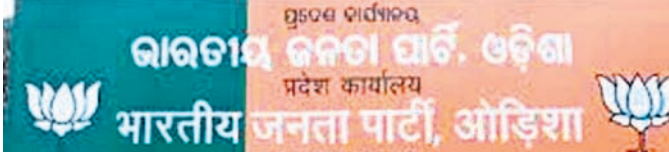
He held discussions with officials to assess the current status and urged timely completion of the process to ensure smooth delivery and support to farmers.

## BJP defers state chief poll over Puri tragedy

**Bhubaneswar, June 29:** In view of the tragic incident in Puri that claimed three lives and injured several devotees, the Odisha unit of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Sunday postponed its organisational election for the state president and national executive members, originally scheduled for July 1, until further notice.

The announcement was made in the presence of BJP state general secretary Jatini Mohanty.

Announcing the decision, BJP returning officer for Odisha and Balasore MP Pratap Chandra Sarangi expressed deep sorrow over the incident. "The unfortunate stampede-like situation in Puri has shaken us all. The last rites of the deceased have not yet been performed, and many injured devotees are still undergoing

treatment. In such a moment of grief, continuing with the election process would be inappropriate," he said.

Sarangi added that all activities related to the ongoing organisational elections stand suspended with immediate effect. A fresh schedule will be announced in due course.

The party extended its heartfelt condolences to the families of the deceased and wished a speedy recovery to those injured.

Earlier Sunday, the BJP had announced the schedule for the election of its state president and members (Rastriya Parishad) national executive members during a press conference at the party headquarter in the City.

**Bhubaneswar, June 29:** In a major breakthrough under 'Operation "Yatri Surakshya", the Detective Wing of the Railway Protection Force (RPF) arrested a six-member criminal gang from the Coaching Complex in Puri.

According to East Coast Railway (ECoR) sources, the gang was apprehended while allegedly planning to rob a night train operating between Puri and Khurda Road.

During the search operation,



the RPF recovered 23 stolen mobile phones, cash amounting to ₹24,450, and other incriminating materials. The total value of the recovered property is

estimated at ₹7,13,450.

Preliminary interrogation revealed that the accused were involved in multiple cases of mobile phone theft from passengers at railway stations and crowded passenger areas. They were also actively plotting robberies onboard trains.

The arrested individuals, along with the recovered items, were handed over to the Government Railway Police (GRP) in Puri. A formal case has been registered under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC).

## Heart disease rising among Odisha youth

**Bhubaneswar, June 29:** Odisha is witnessing a worrying rise in heart-related ailments among its younger population, mirroring a nationwide trend that experts are calling a silent epidemic. According to state government data, heart attacks account for 282 deaths per lakh population, marking it as a leading cause of mortality in the region.

Heart disease, once considered a condition of the elderly, is increasingly striking India's youth — with fatal cases now reported in individuals as young as 17. Nationwide, heart-related ailments contribute to nearly 25 per cent of all deaths, with the Cardiology Society of India estimating around 3 million heart attacks annually.

Several high-profile deaths have brought the issue into focus — actor Siddhaanth Suryavanshi, singer KK, comedian RajuSrivastava, and reality TV star SidharthShukla all died young due to cardiac

arrest. More recently, reports claimed that Shefali Jariwala, known for the song Kaanta Laga, also died of cardiac arrest.

Beyond the headlines, similar tragedies are unfolding across the country — people collapsing suddenly in gyms, markets, or even during wedding celebrations. Experts warn that changing lifestyles, poor diets, stress, and lack of awareness are major contributors to the alarming trend.

"Heart disease takes many forms — including congenital defects, coronary artery disease (causing heart attacks), valve disease, cardiomyopathy, and arrhythmias," explained SusantaPradhan, cardiologist at Utkal Institute of Medical Sciences and Hospital. "It's important to distinguish between heart attack and cardiac arrest. A heart attack occurs when blood flow to the heart muscle is blocked, while cardiac arrest happens when the heart suddenly stops pumping, which can result from a heart attack



or an arrhythmia," he said.

He added, "Warning signs like chest pain, sweating, dizziness, or lightheadedness should never be mistaken for gas or indigestion. Timely medical help can save lives. A balanced lifestyle — including moderate exercise, stress control, healthy eating, and regular check-ups — is our strongest defense."

Pratap Kumar Das, senior consultant at Capital Hospital and PGIMER, Bhubaneswar, emphasised the difference between the two conditions: "Heart attacks occur when blood flow to part of the heart muscle is blocked, often due

to hypertension, diabetes, or high cholesterol. The heart may continue beating, though sometimes irregularly. Cardiac arrest, however, is caused by an electrical malfunction that makes the heart stop completely — the person collapses, has no pulse or breathing, and loses consciousness."

Echoing the concerns, DibyaRanjanBehera, consultant, Interventional Cardiologist at Manipal Hospitals, Bhubaneswar, said, "Coronary Artery Disease is the most common and dangerous form of heart disease in adults. Alarming numbers of young people are affected due to smoking, poor lifestyle choices, stress, and unhealthy diets. Fast food will make you fast — towards disease."

Experts are urging young Indians to prioritise heart health. Behera warned, "Fatigue, breathlessness, chest pain, blackouts, palpitations — these are red flags. Don't wait for tragedy to strike before acting."

## Similipal monsoon closure from July 1

**Baripada, June 29:** Similipal Tiger Reserve (STR) will be closed for tourists and visitors from July 1 because of monsoon, an official order said Sunday.

In a notification, S’TR Field Director and Regional Chief Wildlife Warden Prakash Chand Gogineni stated that the exact date for reopening of the national park would be announced later and published in newspapers.

However, the ecotourism complex at Jamuani, Gurgudia, Kumari, Barehipani and Ramtirtha will remain open for tourists, he said. Gogineni said in all 38,483 tourists, including 26,083 from Odisha, 12,388 from other states, and 12 foreign nationals, visited Similipal in 2024-2025, generating revenue of ₹4.26 crore.

While ₹1.22 crore was earned from jungle safaris, ₹2.75 crore was collected from nature camps inside the national park and ₹29 lakh from entry permits, he said. Each year, entry to Similipal is restricted during the monsoon season due to safety concerns. Heavy rainfall often washes away roads within the sanctuary, making travel hazardous. The temporary closure ensures tourist safety and allows time for necessary road repairs and infrastructure maintenance.

## MAJOR RIVERS IN SPATE

**Bhubaneswar/Balasore/Baripada, June 29:** The state government Sunday placed the Balasore and Mayurbhaji district administrations on high alert with an impending flood threat looming over the northern part of the state as several major rivers in the region continue to swell, an official said.

Rivers such as Budhabalanga, Subarnarekha, Jalaka, Jambhira and Sona are witnessing rising water levels and may cause flooding by Monday, he warned.

Balasore Collector Suryawanshi Mayur Vikash has cancelled the leaves of all government employees. The fresh flood situation has panicked people as they are yet to recover from the scare of a flash flood in Subarnarekha which hit them June 20.

The Balasore district administration has already started evacuating the people in low-lying areas of Baliapal and Basta blocks with the support of ODRAF and fire and emergency services teams. All are advised to move to nearby shelters to prevent any type of mishaps during the flood, an official said.

This apart, the administration is also using a public address system to make people aware of the impending flood in the low-lying areas of Balasore, he said, adding that sandbags have been strategically deployed in large numbers to strengthen vulnerable riverbanks and prevent flooding.

Safety measures are in full swing to protect lives and prop-

erty, he said.

Torrential rainfall has disrupted normal life in Balasore and Mayurbhanj districts. Fishermen have been advised through public address systems not to venture into the sea as it remains rough after the new moon day.

According to another official, people of around nine villages under the Saraskana and Rasgovindpur blocks of Mayurbhanj have been evacuated to safe places and provided cooked food and relief.

The rise in water level has led to flood scare in low lying areas of Badasahi, Betanoti, Gopabandhu Nagar, Saraska-

na, Rasgovindpur and Morada blocks in Mayurbhanj district.

The Mayurbhanj district administration declared a holiday for all schools Monday. The Anganwadi centres will remain closed for three days in the district while the supplementary high school certificate examination will continue, the official said.

To oversee the situation on the ground in flood management, an engineer-in-chief and a chief engineer have been deployed in Balasore.

Water levels of Budhabalanga, Jalaka and Subarnarekha rivers were rising fast and have crossed the danger levels. The

water levels of all the rivers will rise further by midnight of Sunday, Central Water Commission sources said.

In this backdrop, peak flood is expected in Subarnarekha at 11.25 metres at midnight, in Budhabalanga at 8.20 metres at 9am Monday and in Jalaka at 6.82 metres at 6pm Sunday, another official said.

The State Flood Cell in the Department of Water Resources is working round-the-clock and the situation is being closely monitored, he said.

Meanwhile, a fresh low-pressure area has formed over the northwest Bay of Bengal and adjoining West Bengal and

Bangladesh coasts and northern Odisha is likely to receive heavy rainfall, India Meteorological Department (IMD) said in a bulletin Sunday.

Under the influence of the upper air cyclonic circulation over southwest Bangladesh and Gangetic West Bengal, another low-pressure area formed over northwest Bay of Bengal and adjoining West Bengal and Bangladesh coasts at 5.30am June 29, it said.

The system is likely to move slowly west-northwestwards across north Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand during the next two days.

The IMD has forecast isolated heavy rainfall in the state from June 29 to July 4. Some places in the state may also witness very heavy rainfall till July 1, it said.

The low pressure is likely to trigger very heavy rains in parts of Odisha between Sunday and Tuesday. As the southwest monsoon is active over the state, heavy rainfall activity is expected to prevail next week, said Manorama Mohanty, the director of Meteorological Centre, Bhubaneswar.

The deceased was identified as Inda Marandi, 65, while her sister-in-law Pana Tudu sleeping beside her sustained critical injuries. She was rescued in critical condition and admitted to the PRM Medical College and Hospital at Baripada where she succumbed during treatment Sunday. The injured woman is undergoing treatment.

## Youth murdered in organised attack

**Chhatrapur:** A man was killed in an organised attack Saturday at Brahmaniapalli village under Chhatrapur police limits in Ganjam district. The deceased was identified as A Lachheya Patra, 32, a resident of Brahmaniapalli village. He hailed from Sasanapalli village under Purushottampur block but had been staying at his maternal grandfather's house at Brahmaniapalli since his childhood. According to reports, around seven to eight persons allegedly attacked Lachheya near a railway crossing close to the village Saturday over some reason. On being informed, his father, A Dilu Patra, rushed to the spot to rescue his son. He rescued Lachheya in a critical condition and rushed him to Chhatrapur hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries during treatment that night. Following the death, his father lodged a complaint at Chhatrapur police station. He reportedly named the accused in his complaint, stating he recognised them. Chhatrapur police registered a case (399/2025) and launched an investigation. The accused are currently absconding. The body has been handed over to the family members after a post-mortem.

## Facelift for Muniguda rly station under ABSS

## 6-ft-long croc rescued from pond, released

**Kendrapara:** A six-foot long female saltwater crocodile which had strayed into a pond in a village in close proximity to Bhitarkanika National Park in Kendrapara district was rescued and released to the wild Sunday, an official said. The reptile had been roaming in Endalapur village for more than two weeks. The locals informed the forest officials, who later rescued it from the pond. "The forest officials managed to net and rope it after a two-hour-long exercise. Later it was released in the wild. The reptile did not cause any harm either to humans or domesticated animals," said Chittaranjan Beura, the forest range officer of the park. Crocodiles stray in search of food in village areas. They often leave the place for their original habitat within a few days as per their natural instinct, he said.

## Malkangiri's 'scary' spot turns selfie haven

**Malkangiri, June 29:** A crematorium once avoided by people out of fear is now drawing crowds armed with smartphones — not for funerals, but for selfies.

What used to be a grim and neglected cremation ground in Malkangiri town has undergone a remarkable transformation and now resembles a public park, rather than a place associated with death. Locals who once walked past the area with dread now step inside freely, admiring the gardens, colourful lighting, and a towering statue of Lord Shiva, and often



snapping selfies against the backdrop.

Cremation grounds traditionally evoke fear, especially at night. The fear of wandering spirits, eerie sounds, and unsettling silence keeps most people at bay. In this Malkangiri crematorium, the situation was no different. It was once

surrounded by filth, with most visitors choosing to remain outside the gates during funeral rites. But that image is now history.

The Malkangiri Municipality spent ₹1.30 crore to renovate the facility, turning it into what is now officially called an "Ideal Cremation Ground."

constructed for visitors to rest under, and by nightfall, the entire site glows with vibrant lighting, further reducing the eerie atmosphere once associated with the place.

"This was my dream project," said Manoj Kumar Barik, chairperson of the Malkangiri Municipality. "The old crematorium was in a dilapidated state. I wanted to create a space that not only served its purpose with dignity but also didn't evoke fear. We've succeeded in doing that."

Barik added that the transformation isn't stopping here. The municipality is also working on rejuvenating the nearby Balisagar pond, aiming to develop its surroundings into a full-fledged park in the coming days.

Nowadays, people visit the crematorium not just to pay their final respects to loved ones — they come to walk, sit, reflect, and even take selfies at what is now one of the cleanest, most serene spots in Malkangiri town.

With manicured flower gardens, decorative pathways, and artistic installations surrounding the funeral area, the crematorium now offers a space of calm and even visual beauty.

At the entrance stands a 15-foot-tall statue of Lord Shiva with a Shivling just ahead. A shed has been

## Proof To Vote

Months ahead of the Assembly polls in Bihar, the Election Commission of India (ECI) on 28 June launched a 'special intensive revision' of electoral rolls in the state, a move that critics argue undermines the core principles of democracy, especially, universal adult franchise as guaranteed in India. This initiative requires nearly 2.93 crore voters to provide documentary proof of their birth and parental origins. Likening the exercise to a covert implementation of the National Register of Citizens (NRC), Opposition parties have warned that this extensive and complex verification process could potentially lead to mass disenfranchisement.

Bihar has approximately 7.89 crore voters, of whom 4.96 crore are already on the electoral rolls as of 2003. For these voters, the process is straightforward: they only need to verify their names and submit a form. However, for the remaining 2.93 crore individuals, the procedure is far from simple. The exercise requires that any voter whose name was not included in the electoral rolls during the last revision in 2003 must now provide valid proof of their own birth details, as well as those of their parents, including their place of origin. This revision places the entire burden of proof on the individual voter, marking a significant departure from previous practices. Placing the onus of eligibility on the voter, without providing access to necessary documents, legal support, or information, transforms a fundamental right into a challenging obstacle course. Under the exercise, voters born before 1 July, 1987 are required to present documents that verify their date and place of birth. Those born between 1 July, 1987, and 2 December, 2004 must provide similar documentation, along with proof of identity for one parent. And, for individuals born after 2 December, 2004, documentation for both parents is necessary. In a nation where official records can be difficult to access or may be incomplete—especially for rural, low-income, and migrant communities—these requirements could deprive many of their voting rights.

Calling the exercise a Constitutional obligation, the ECI has said it is carrying out the intensive review of electoral rolls to weed out foreign illegal migrants by checking their place of birth and ensure that only Indian nationals are included. The move, which would be later expanded to other states like Assam, Kerala, Puducherry, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal where elections are scheduled in 2026, assumes significance in the wake of a crackdown in various states on illegal foreign migrants, especially those from Bangladesh and Myanmar.

Opposition parties have charged the ruling BJP and the ECI with trying to manipulate electoral results under the guise of administrative efficiency. They condemned this initiative as a Nazi-like effort to trace ancestry and infringe on people's democratic rights. Voicing its concern over the voter list revision, the Congress has cautioned against “deliberate exclusion” of people belonging to Muslim and Dalit communities from the voter list through misuse of government machinery.

Nevertheless, the ECI, which of late is being perceived by some as being subservient to the government in power, has to come out clean on this exercise. Otherwise, erosion of people's faith in a Constitutional body could spell doom for India's democracy.

# THE NEW INDIAN ORDER



It seems India's foreign policy is adrift in the high seas in an increasingly transactional global disorder

It is not quite clear whether the disclosures of CDS Gen Anil Chauhan on the margins of the Shangri-La Dialogue in Singapore to the international media on 31 May or its later reiterations at a lecture in Pune regarding attrition levels of India in the 4-day conflict with Pakistan were a gaffe or a strategic leak. Like many things which remained obscure or loudly proclaimed by the media giving a perception advantage to Pakistan during Operation Sindoor, this also shall remain a puzzle.

The government's snap decision of sending out 7 multi-party delegations to over 30 destinations in all directions except for its own neighbourhood, to sensitize foreign governments of the menace of terrorism emanating from Pakistan failed to have the desired impact mainly because terrorism is a global issue and every country's terrorism has to be tackled through counter-terrorism by the concerned state. Pakistan, being a non-permanent member of the UNSC on the other hand got to manipulate the resolution moved against terrorism deleting mention of the Resistance Force (an offshoot of the banned LeT) which perpetrated the killings in Pahal-gam, and instead bagged two prize assignments, Chair of the Taliban Sanctions Committee and vice Chair of the UNSC Counter-Terrorism Committee.

In hindsight it is not difficult to see why India was bereft of friends (with the singular exception of Israel) to support its efforts in its fight against terrorism, and why consequently international financial bodies - World Bank, IMF, ADB - instead of withholding funds were instead releasing them against India's plea that these would largely go towards funding further terrorist activities of Pakistan. India's ideological

preferences seem to go against its image framed in the Constitution, the coda of good and ethical governance. There are disturbing reports of China preparing to send a cache of its top-of-the-line super technology and AI driven aircraft and missiles, besides other armunitions, to prepare Pakistan for another assault on India. PM Modi's three-pronged security doctrine, viz. any act of terror will be deemed an act of war, India will call the nuclear bluff of Pakistan and India will make no distinction between terrorists and their backers could prove counter-productive and inimical to India's long-term interests. In the absence of a codified national security doctrine (unlike Pakistan or China which have enunciated their security doctrines) the Modi doctrine will be hitherto operational in all future conflicts.

Meanwhile, the efforts which India made to 'internationalize' Operation Sindoor and build a credible victim image for India have been overshadowed by the 12-day war between Israel and Iran, both strategic and friendly partners of India. The war, which saw both sides severely damaged, came to an abrupt halt with the US call for ceasefire on 21 June (allegedly at Israel's instance and brokered by the Emir of

Qatar) following a massive missile attack by Iran on the largest US airbase in Al-Hadeid, Qatar. Trump's calling for a ceasefire 48 hours after a massive aerial bombardment of Iran's nuclear sites, ostensibly to disable Iran's vaunted nuclearization process on Fordow, and submarine-launched Tomahawk missiles on Natanz and Isfahan, came after a UN Security Council special resolution the following day moved by Pakistan along with China and Russia, and anticipating more Iranian attacks on US bases and personnel in the Gulf along with purported closure of the Strait of Hormuz. Furthermore, Trump's MAGA persona having forsaken the principle of no entry into “forever wars” may have outweighed the US President's thinking of solidly backing Israel in its unilateral assertion of supremacy by launching the war on 13 June against Iran to defang its nuclear capability, go for regime change and install a West-supported puppet government. The following day Trump was leaving for a NATO Summit in The Hague (where Russia's continuing operations in Ukraine and NATO's consistent support for Ukraine would dominate the discussions) and therefore had to maintain a façade of equanimity and strategic

abstinence from wars in another region, crucial to the Arab Gulf states and the world in general.

The ceasefire was expectedly fragile with attacks continuing from both sides until Trump had to reprimand Israel to stop its attacks on Iran. In the whole game, India was noticeably quiet except voicing its support for the ceasefire and talking the language of dialogue and diplomacy. It seemed in preserving its strategic autonomy, morphed into strategic silence, India had decided to be everywhere but not consequential anywhere. Silence is not a strategy nor deterrence; it is deemed pusillanimity.

India's attendance at the SCO meetings at the NSA, Defence Minister and Summit levels in China when it had distanced from the SCO statement condemning Israel after its unprovoked aggression seemed contradictory. Difficult indeed to gauge which side India belongs to, G7/ Quad belonging to the Global North or SCO/ BRICS, belonging to the Global South where China and Russia are clearly gaining strategic advantage over India. The coming meetings of Quad which EAM Jaishankar is attending and the forthcoming BRICS Summit in Brazil will be an acid test for India to juggle its diplomacy in the face of Pakistan's rising popularity and support of America.


It seems India's foreign policy is adrift in the high seas in an increasingly transactional global disorder. What India needs to stand by are not only peace and humanity but justice and fairness as well. Only then can our nation chart a course, resolute and farsighted, which is the abject need of the hour.

AAP suspends Punjab MLA

**Chandigarh:** The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Sunday suspended Amritsar North MLA and former IPS officer Kunwar Vijay Pratap Singh from the party for five years for allegedly indulging in anti-party activities. Singh's suspension came days after he questioned the manner in which a Vigilance Bureau team raided the residence of Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader Birkram Singh Majithia in Amritsar in a disproportionate assets case. The decision to suspend Singh from the party was taken by the AAP's political affairs committee, party sources said, adding the government's message is clear that politics cannot be tolerated in the campaign against drugs.

Monsoon covers entire country

**New Delhi/Shimla/Uttarakashi, Jun 29:** A cloudburst in Uttarakhand's Uttarkashi district early Sunday left two construction workers dead and seven missing as monsoon covered the entire country almost a week earlier than usual, bringing rain in the national capital and other northern states, triggering landslides in several hilly areas and sending rivers into spate.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a red alert for heavy rainfall June 29 and 30 in various districts of Uttarakhand, including Uttarkashi, Rudraprayag, Dehradun, Tehri, Pauri, Haridwar and Nainital. Authorities have put the Chardham yatra on hold for a day for the safety of pilgrims.

The Shimla Meteorological Centre has also issued a red alert for very heavy downpour in 10 districts of Himachal Pradesh, where the death toll from rain-related incidents climbed to 20 since the onset of monsoon in the state June 20.

In Uttarakhand, a landslide triggered by a cloudburst destroyed the shelters of workers engaged in the construction of a hotel along the Yamunotri National Highway in Uttarkashi district, officials said.

There were 29 labourers at the campsite when the landslide occurred washing away around 10 metres of the highway. Twenty of them were evacuated to safety while nine went missing, the district emergency operation centre said.

Bodies of two missing labourers were recovered from the banks of the Yamuna River near Tiladi Shaheed Smarak, about 18 km from the place where the landslide occurred, police said. The labourers are said to be of Nepalese origin.

at the site, District Magistrate Prashant Arya said.

The highway was blocked by landslide debris, he said, adding pilgrims returning from Yamunotri have been asked to stay at safe locations due to the blocked highway, he said.

The Chardham Yatra has been postponed for a day as a precautionary step and a decision on further travel will be taken after reviewing the weather conditions along the routes Monday, Garhwal Commissioner Vinay Shankar Pandey said.

In Himachal Pradesh, three more deaths were reported in rain-related incidents since Saturday. One person each drowned in Una and Bilaspur districts while a person died after falling from a height in the Shimla district, according to the state emergency operation centre.

Services on the Shimla-Kalka rail line -- a UNESCO world heritage -- were suspended Sunday after boulders and trees fell on the tracks following overnight rains in Solan district. A bridge in Solan's Barotiwala industrial area was also washed away. A landslide near Koti on the Shimla-Kalka National Highway (NH-5), connecting Shimla and Chandigarh, damaged

some stretches of the road, resulting in a two to three-km-long traffic jam for hours.

All five spillway gates of Pandoh Dam were opened Sunday morning, resulting in an increase in water level in Beas River. According to IMD data, this is the earliest the monsoon has covered the entire country since 2020, when it did so by June 26.

The monsoon arrived in Delhi two days after the normal date of June 27, the IMD said. According to the Met department, Chandigarh received 119.5 mm of rain in the last 24 hours ending at 8.30 am Sunday. Among other places in Punjab, rains lashed Ferozepur, Mohali, Ludhiana, Patiala, Pathankot and Rupnagar.

The IMD said that heavy to very heavy rain is likely to continue in many parts of northwest, central, east and northeast India over the next seven days.

The IMD Sunday issued a 'red' alert, predicting extreme heavy rainfall in parts of Jharkhand till July 1, an official said.

Jharkhand's capital Ranchi, which has been experiencing light to moderate rainfall since Sunday morning, is likely to receive heavy rainfall till the morning of July 2, the IMD

TMC acts against MLA over student gangrape remarks

**Kolkata, June 29:** The Trinamool Congress Sunday show caused party MLA Madan Mitra stating that his comments over the alleged gangrape of a law student in her college were uncalled for and insensitive.

In a letter to Mitra, who is the former minister, TMC state president Subrata Bakshi show caused him for breaking party rules and to reply within three days.

"This incident has sent a message to girls that if someone calls you when the college is closed, don't go, nothing good will come of it. If that girl had not gone there, this incident wouldn't have happened," Mitra said.

Rallies held

**Kolkata:** Senior BJP leader Suwendu Adhikari led a rally Sunday in protest against the alleged gang rape of a first-year student of a state-run law college in the city demanding security for every daughter across West Bengal. Similar rallies were also taken out by the Congress, CPI(M) and civil society members in the city and its outskirts. Adhikari, the Leader of the Opposition in West Bengal Assembly and other party activists walked a distance of less than one km demanding protection for "our daughters".

Friday said, "If a friend rapes a friend, how can you ensure security? Will the police be there in schools? This was done by students to another student. Who will protect her (victim)?"

The TMC distanced itself from the comments of the two leaders and termed those as their personal statements. "The remarks made by MP Kalyan Banerjee and MLA Madan Mitra concerning the heinous crime at South Calcutta Law College were made in their personal capacities. The party unequivocally disassociates itself from their statements and strongly condemns the same. These views do not reflect the position of the party in any manner whatsoever," the Trinamool Congress posted on X. Immediately, Banerjee, the TMC's Serampore MP, questioned whether the party was "indirectly supporting" those leaders who were "shielding the criminals".

Tragedy strikes as soil cave-in claims four lives

**Jaipur, June 29:** Four labourers died and three got injured after soil caved in during pipeline excavation work in Rajasthan's Bharatpur Sunday morning, police said.

According to the police, some labourers were filling a 10 feet deep trench dug to lay a pipeline near Jangi ka Nagla village when the soil caved in and the labourers got trapped underneath. Upon hearing the cries, other workers and project staff started rescue attempts, but the depth and heaviness of the soil made immediate efforts difficult, they said.

District administration, police and disaster management teams reached the site soon after being alerted.

The rescue teams used earth-moving machines to remove soil and retrieve the trapped labourers. They managed to pull out seven labourers, four of whom -- Anukul (22), Vimla Devi (45), Vinod Devi (55) and Yogesh Kumari (25) -- died.

Shah rules out talks with Maoists

**Hyderabad, June 29:** Union Home Minister Amit Shah Sunday ruled out any talks with Maoists and said the cadre of the proscribed outfit should give up arms, surrender before police, and join the mainstream.

Addressing a rally after inaugurating the National Headquarters of the Turmeric Board in Nizamabad in Telangana, Shah also said Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, who is still raising questions on Operation Sindoor, should see the weak appearance of Pakistan to understand the effectiveness of the Operation. "Congress asks (the Centre) to hold discussions with these people (Maoists). Our government's policy is 'no talks'

with those who hold arms. Give up weapons, surrender, and join the mainstream," Shah said.

He further said that about 10,000 people in the Northeast gave up weapons and joined the mainstream. They even contested elections held for positions ranging from the Taluk level to state assemblies. Similarly, more than 2,000 Maoists have surrendered in the past one and a half years.

"Give up weapons and surrender. If you don't surrender, we have decided that before 31 March 2026, Naxalism will be finished in this country," the Home Minister said.

He said 40,000 people lost their lives since about four decades in Naxal violence in Adivasi regions.

Many Adivasis lost their limbs or even their lives, he said. Those who talk in favour of Naxalism, what would they reply to the family members of Adivasis and security personnel who lost their lives in Maoist violence, he asked. He said he fears that Congress should not give shelter in Telangana to Naxals who are on the run across the country.

EC to upload 2003 Bihar voter list for special revision drive

**New Delhi, June 29:** The Election Commission will soon upload the 2003 Bihar electoral roll on its website to facilitate the nearly 4.96 crore voters whose names figure on it extract the relevant portion to be attached with the enumeration form for the special intensive revision of the voters' list.

As Opposition parties questioned the revision exercise, Chief Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar told PTI Sunday that the purpose is to ensure that no eligible citizen is left out of the electoral rolls and no ineligible person is a part of it. Several Opposition parties have said that the intensive revision carries the risk of wilful exclusion of vot-

ers using the state machinery.

A senior functionary asserted that anyone opposing the exercise is also opposing Article 326 and should therefore clarify their stand.

Article 326 says that all eligible citizens should be included in the electoral rolls, and those not eligible or not citizens of India cannot be part of the voters' list.

EC functionaries pointed out that during the ongoing SIR in Bihar, the poll authority advised political parties to appoint their workers as booth level agents (BLAs) in all polling stations now rather than finding faults with the electoral rolls later.

On Saturday, the commission said all recognised national and state political par-



ties have already appointed 1,54,977 BLAs. They can still appoint more, it pointed out.

BLAs are party workers who coordinate with booth level officers (BLOs) during the preparation or revision of the voters' list. According to the instructions issued by

the poll authority to its Bihar poll machinery, the 4.96 crore voters -- 60 per cent of the total electors -- who were listed in the 2003 special intensive revision need not submit any supporting document to establish their date or place or birth except the relevant portion of

the electoral roll brought out after the revision.

The other three crore -- nearly 40 per cent -- will have to provide one of the 11 listed documents to establish their place or date of birth.

Here too, the voters whose parents have been named in the 2003 voters' list, will have to only give documents about their place/date of birth. They will not have to give documents regarding the place/date of birth of their parents as their entry in the 2003 list will be considered as proof, underlined an official.

Bihar, as of now, has more than 7.89 crore voters spread across 243 assembly seats. Polls in the state are due later this year. According to EC instructions, the electoral registration

officer (ERO) of each assembly constituency will be responsible for ensuring that "no eligible citizen is left out and no ineligible person is included in the electoral roll" while carrying out the revision. The EROs will satisfy themselves regarding the eligibility of every person before entering their name in the electoral roll.

The EC said every existing elector, as on the date, will be provided available an enumeration form through a BLO. The elector can download the enumeration form from a dedicated website.

The BLO will collect a copy of the enumeration form and sign the acknowledgement of receipt on the second copy to be retained by the existing elector.

**Pak shuts key border crossing with Afghan**

**Peshawar:** Pakistan has temporarily closed a key border crossing with Afghanistan due to security threats, until further notice, officials said Sunday. The Ghulam Khan border has been closed after Saturday's suicide attack in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's North Waziristan district and skirmishes in the province, bordering Afghanistan, a senior Pakistani security official said. "Following the attack, a curfew has been imposed in North Waziristan, and the border (Ghulam Khan) has been shut down for an unspecified period," he said. At least 13 security personnel were killed and three others injured in the suicide attack.

**SL Navy arrests 8 Indian fishermen**

**Colombo:** The Sri Lankan Navy Sunday arrested 8 Indian fishermen and seized their trawler for allegedly poaching in the island nation's waters, according to an official release. The arrests were made during a search operation in the north of Mannar, the Navy said in a press release. The eight fishermen and their trawler would be handed over to the Fisheries Inspectorate in Mannar for legal proceedings, it said. Fishermen from both India and Sri Lanka are arrested frequently for inadvertently trespassing into each other's waters. The fishermen issue is a contentious one in the ties between India and Sri Lanka, with Lankan Navy personnel even firing at Indian fishermen in the Palk Strait and seizing their boats in several alleged incidents of illegally entering the island nation's territorial waters.

CHINESE CRACKDOWN

**Hong Kong, June 29:** Hong Kong's League of Social Democrats said Sunday that it would disband amid "immense political pressure" from a five year-long national security crackdown, leaving the China-ruled city with no formal pro-democracy opposition presence.

The LSD becomes the third major opposition party to shutter in Hong Kong in the past two years.

Co-founded in 2006 by former lawmaker Leung Kwok-hung as a radical wing of the pro-democracy camp, the LSD is the last group in Hong Kong to stage small protests this year.

Mass public gatherings and marches spearheaded by political and civil society groups had been common in Hong Kong until 2020, but the threat of prosecution has largely shut down

Drones blanket Ukrainian skies

Russia launches biggest aerial attack since start of war, says Ukraine

**Kyiv, June 29:** A Ukrainian F-16 fighter pilot died in a crash while repelling a Russian air attack that involved hundreds of drones, cruise and ballistic missiles, authorities said Sunday, as Moscow intensifies nighttime air barrages in the fourth year of war.

The Ukrainian military said in total Russia launched 477 drones and 60 missiles of various types to Ukraine overnight. Ukrainian forces destroyed 211 of the drones and 38 missiles, it said, while 225 more drones were either lost due to electronic warfare or were decoys that carried no explosives.

"Moscow will not stop as long as it has the capability to launch massive strikes," Zelenskiy said on X. He said Russia had launched around 114 missiles, 1,270 drones, and 1,100 glide bombs just in the past week.

Russia's state-run RIA Novosti news agency said one person was killed by a Ukrainian drone in the Russian-controlled part of Ukraine's Luhansk region. Both Ukraine and Russia say they do not attack civilian targets.

President Volodymyr Zelenskyy called for more support from Washington and Western allies to bolster Ukraine's air defences after the attack, which damaged homes and infrastructure across the country and injured at least 12 people, according to local authorities.

Trump's sweeping tax-cut, spending bill clears first US Senate hurdle

Beijing rolled over \$2.1 billion, which has been in Pakistan's central bank's reserves for the last three years, and refinanced another \$1.3 billion commercial loan, which Islamabad had paid back two months ago, the source said.

Outrage in B'desh over minority community woman's rape video

**Dhaka, June 29:** The alleged rape of a woman belonging to a minority community three days ago in central Bangladesh's Cumilla district sparked nationwide outrage Sunday after a video of the assault went viral.

The main suspect of the alleged rape has been arrested along with several others, police said.

Cumilla district's police chief Nazir Ahmed Khan said the main accused was arrested in a predawn raid at Dhaka's Sayedabad area and four others were apprehended for revealing the picture and identity of the woman on social media.

Students of Dhaka University staged marches in the campus condemning the rape while residents of its Jagannath Hall dormitory, dedicated for minority community students, took out processions calling for justice.

Secretary General of former prime minister Khaleda Zia's Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir demanded exemplary punitive action against the culprits.

Some media reports suggested the police action came only after the video went viral. According to a report, people in the neighbourhood initially released the culprit after a mass beating and took him to a hospital instead of handing him over to police. The suspect allegedly fled from the hospital.

Ousted prime minister Sheikh Hasina's son Sajeed Ahmed Wazed, who has served as his mother's advisor, took to X to express his outrage at the incident. He blamed the Yunus administration for a rise in incidents of mob attacks, terrorism and rape in the last 11 months.

Bangladesh witnessed incidents of violence against members of minority communities following the fall of the Hasina-led Awami League government in August last year.

**Washington, June 29:** A 24-year-old Indian woman who arrived in the United States for a reported arranged marriage has gone missing, authorities have said.

Simran Simran was last seen shortly after her arrival from India in New Jersey June 20. Surveillance footage reviewed by Lindenwold police showed her checking her phone and seemingly waiting for someone. Officers said she did not appear to be in distress in the video.

Simran was reported missing Wednesday, five days after her arrival, police confirmed. Officials investigating her disappearance said a preliminary probe revealed she travelled to the US for an arranged marriage.

Authorities are also exploring the possibility that the marriage was an excuse to obtain free airfare to America, as per reports.



Simran has no known relatives in the United States and does not speak English, police said. Her only phone is an international device that functions solely through Wi-Fi. Authorities have so far been unable to reach any family members in India.

"At this time there are no known family members in India to contact to obtain information on her possible whereabouts," Lindenwold police said Thursday.

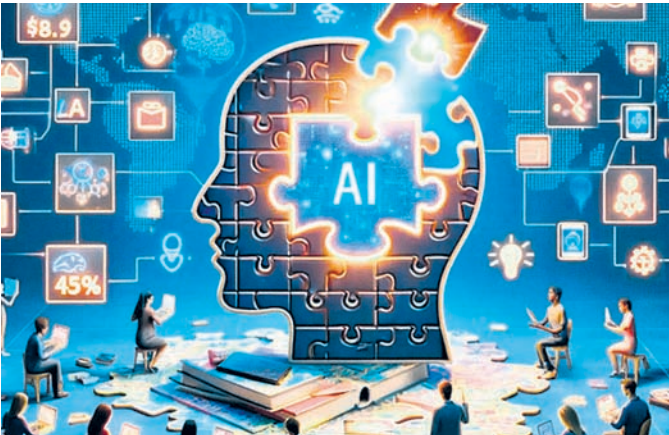

in the Middle East and a steep decline in crude oil prices. Last week, the BSE benchmark surged 1,650.73 points or 2 per cent, and the Nifty climbed 525.4 points or 2 per cent.

"As the first quarter earnings season draws near, investors are turning their focus to corporate results for early indications of growth trends. There is also heightened anticipation around trade agreements that the United States is expected to finalize with major global partners in the coming week.

Gold likely to remain bearish next week

**New Delhi, June 29:** Gold prices are likely to remain under pressure in the coming week as investors await key US macroeconomic data for cues on the Federal Reserve's potential direction on interest rates, which in turn will influence the trajectory for the precious metal, according to analysts.

Meanwhile, US Federal Reserve remains cautious about interest rate cuts, as Fed Chair Jerome Powell during his testimony last week had said that while interest rate cuts are possible, they are not imminent. This has led to a recalibration of gold holdings globally, keeping prices under pressure.

Friday, gold futures declined by Rs 1,563 or 1.61 per cent to close at Rs 95,524 per 10 grams on the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCX).

Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst at LKP Securities, said the outlook remains pressured due to waning geopolitical concerns, particularly in the Middle East. Gold could move within the range Rs 93,000-97,500 per 10 grams mark on

the MCX and \$3,175-3,325-level in the international markets in the coming week.

The movement will largely depend on the tone of key US macroeconomic data including unemployment figures, non-farm payrolls, and the ADP employment report, he said, adding that any unforeseen geopolitical developments could also influence the sentiment.

Echoing a similar tone, NS Ramaswamy, Head of Commodities & CRM at Ventura, said gold has been struggling to breach the \$3,300-mark in the overseas markets. The safe-haven demand has dampened and the only consolation is a weaker dollar, which is supporting the precious metal.

Ramaswamy highlighted that the dollar Index couldn't get enough support from US-China deal. However, there could be a positive impact to the yellow metal on a likely postponement of reciprocal tariffs from the July 9 deadline. Most catalysts currently remain bearish, with limited upside triggers unless there is a reversal in the dollar or a surprise from the US Federal Reserve, Ramaswamy added.

Tata Steel receives show cause notice

**New Delhi, June 29:** Tata Steel Sunday said it has received a show cause-cum-demand (SCN) notice from tax authorities over an alleged irregular availment of input tax credit amounting to over Rs 1,000 crore between FY19 and FY23.

According to the notice, the steel major is required to show cause before the Additional/ Joint Commissioner of Central GST & Central Excise, Jamshehpur, Jharkhand within 30 days to question against the notice, Tata Steel said in a stock exchange filing.

The notice, issued by the Office of the Commissioner (Audit), Central Tax, Ranchi, June 27, said the input tax credit was availed in contravention of the provisions of Section 74(1) of the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017/State Goods and Services Act, 2017 (CGST/SGST) read with Section 20 Integrated Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017. The company said it has already paid a GST of Rs 514,19,36,211 in the normal course of business.

"The above GST amount is proposed to be appropriated in the notice and therefore alleged GST exposure is Rs 493,35,47,131 only," the filing said.

India's auto sector powers \$5 trillion economy

**New Delhi, June 29:** As India moves closer to achieving its \$5 trillion economy dream, the automobile sector is emerging as a strong pillar of growth by contributing around 7.1 per cent to the country's GDP and nearly 49 per cent to its manufacturing GDP.

Additionally, it supports over 3.7 crore jobs and accounts for close to 8 per cent of India's total exports. Clearly, the performance of this sector is closely linked to the overall economic growth of the country.

More than just a commercial industry, the auto sector is now seen as a reflection of India's growing power in global manufacturing and innovation.

As of financial year 2024-25,

India is the third-largest automobile market in the world by sales and the fourth-largest in terms of production. The country produced over 31 million vehicles across various segments. This included more than 5 million passenger cars, 1 million commercial vehicles, 1 million three-wheelers, and nearly 24 million two-wheelers.

In terms of exports, India shipped around 5.7 million vehicles to markets like Japan, Mexico, Latin America, and Africa.

This rapid growth has been supported by government policies aimed at boosting local manufacturing, reducing imports, promoting clean technologies, and making India a key player in global supply chains.

One of the most important schemes has been the Produc-



tion Linked Incentive (PLI) for the automobile and auto components sector.

With a budget of Rs 25,938 crore, this scheme is focused on promoting electric vehicles (EVs), hydrogen vehicles, autonomous systems, and advanced vehicle technologies.

By early 2025, this scheme had attracted investment pro-

posals worth over Rs 67,000 crore. It is expected to generate Rs 2.3 lakh crore in additional sales and create 7.5 lakh direct jobs.

However, out of the total \$23 billion approved under PLI schemes across all sectors, only \$1.7 billion has been disbursed so far, raising concerns about slow implementation.

Another major initiative is

the FAME-II scheme (Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Hybrid and Electric Vehicles), launched with a budget of Rs 11,500 crore.

It supports the adoption of electric two-wheelers, three-wheelers, buses, and taxis. Over 1.3 million EVs have already been supported under this scheme.

Originally planned to end in March 2024, the scheme has been extended until March 2025 to keep up the EV push.

To reduce dependency on imported batteries, the government also launched a PLI scheme for Advanced Chemistry Cell (ACC) Battery Storage with an outlay of Rs 18,100 crore. Three companies are already working on building battery gigafactories under this

scheme. This is important because batteries make up more than 40 per cent of the total cost of an EV.

The Vehicle Scrap page Policy is another key effort aimed at removing old and polluting vehicles from Indian roads. This is expected to improve air quality, road safety, and increase the demand for newer, more efficient vehicles.

The electric vehicle market in India is steadily growing. In 2024-25, EVs made up over 6 per cent of all vehicles sold, with two-wheelers and three-wheelers leading the trend.

In May 2025, electric car sales touched 12,304 units, crossing the 4 per cent mark in market share for the first time -- up from 2.57 per cent in May 2024.



# Rohit relives T20 World Cup triumph

*Sunday marked the first anniversary of the memorable win in Barbados that broke 13 years of World Cup title drought for India*

New Delhi, June 29: It's already a year since India beat South Africa by seven runs to win the 2024 ICC Men's T20 World Cup and Rohit Sharma, who captained the team to championship glory in Barbados, said it was a surreal feeling to be crowned as winners of the glittering silverware.

As a youngster, Rohit was a member of the team winning 2007 Men's T20 World Cup in South Africa. But after winning 2013 Champions Trophy, India had their so close yet so far moments of winning titles till that glorious day in Barbados arrived, where Rohit & Co broke the trophy drought in style in an unbeaten campaign.

I played in the inaugural 2007 T20 World Cup and we won under MS Dhoni's captaincy. And now, to win it again with Rahul Dravid as head coach—it meant everything to this group.

"We've seen heartbreak. We've come so close. That's

why this one was so special. We worked and planned relentlessly—every day. And when we finally won, all the emotions came pouring out. The younger players, especially those playing their first World Cup, realised how hard it is to win one. Nothing can be taken for granted. It was magical," said Rohit to JioHotstar.

What was going through his mind before taking the field for the final, which also became

his last game for India in T20Is after the championship glory was achieved? Rohit admitted that he didn't sleep well in the night before the final and nervous energy led to him waking up much earlier than expected.

"Thirteen years is a long time. Most people don't even have a 13-year career. So, to wait that long to win a World Cup... the last one I won was in 2007. For me, it couldn't have gotten any bigger than this. I didn't sleep the whole night. I was only thinking about the World Cup. I was nervous. I couldn't feel my legs. Did I feel nerves? Of course."

"I just don't show it—but inside, it was a lot. We were supposed to leave around 8:30 or 9 in the morning. But I woke up at 7. From my room, I could see the ground and just kept watching it. I remember thinking—"In two hours, I'll be there. And in four hours, the result will be out. Either the Cup will be here or it won't."

With the bat, India posted 176/7, thanks to Virat Kohli's crucial 76 and his 72-run partnership with Axar Patel in the title clash.

### Doping: AFI cracks down on coaches

New Delhi: The Athletics Federation of India (AFI) has set July 31 deadline for mandatory registration of all the coaches -- qualified and unqualified -- in the country in its bid to tackle spiralling doping cases, making it clear that non compliance of the directive will lead to their blacklisting. In its latest circular, following its decision in the January Annual General Body Meeting (AGM) to crack the whip on coaches suspected to be involved in doping of their wards, the AFI said that unregistered coaches, regardless of their qualifications, will not be permitted to impart training to athletes. "AFI has decided to register all coaches, qualified or unqualified who are engaged in training athletes across various venues throughout the country," the national federation said in a circular Saturday. "Registration with AFI is mandatory for all coaches, regardless of their qualifications as unregistered coaches will not be permitted to impart training to athletes and will not be engaged in any activity of the AFI under any circumstances."

### Shuttlers reach finals

Iowa: Talented Indian shuttlers Tanvi Sharma and Ayush Shetty moved into the finals of the US Open badminton tournament in contrasting fashion as they continued their impressive run in the Super 300 Tournament here. The 16-year-old unseeded Indian Tanvi defeated Ukraine's seventh-seeded Polina Buhrova 21-14, 21-16 in the women's singles semifinal in just 34 minutes to make it to the title round. This was the teenager's second career victory against the Ukrainian in as many outings. Tanvi will take on top seed Beiwen Zhang of the United States in the final. Ayush, seeded fourth here, created a big upset by overcoming the challenge of top seed and world No. 6 Chou Tien Chen of Chinese-Taipei 21-23, 21-15, 21-14 in a gruelling men's singles contest that lasted more than an hour. Ayush will face another tough opponent in third-seed Brian Yang on Canada. Yang overcame the challenge of Chinese-Taipei's Liao Jhuo-Fu 21-10, 21-12.

# Back-to-back win for Blue Tigresses

Chiang Mai (Thailand), June 29: The Indian senior women's team continued their impressive run in the AFC Women's Asian Cup 2026 Qualifiers with a commanding 4-0 victory over Timor-Leste here Sunday.

With the win, India now sit atop Group B with six points from two games, ahead of Iraq and Thailand, who are set to face each other later in the day.

The top spot in the five-team group remains up for grabs, but India have certainly staked a strong claim with back-to-back dominant displays.

Fresh from the record-breaking 13-0 triumph over Mongolia in their opening fixture, India entered the match brimming with confidence.

Right from kick-off, India picked up from where they left off against Mongolia, applying pressure high up the pitch and creating opportunities with slick passing and energetic wing play.

The first chance came as early as the sixth minute when Tamang latched onto a through ball, but Timor-Leste goalkeeper Gorlette Da Costa did well to deny her at the near post. However, the breakthrough came soon after.

A neat one-two between Manisha and Tamang unlocked the left side of Timor-Leste's defence. Tamang released Manisha with a perfectly weighted pass, and the forward showed blistering pace to beat her

# Robotic football kicks off China's leap in humanoid robot innovation

## China's humanoid robots generate more football excitement than human counterparts

Beijing, June 29: While China's men's soccer team hasn't generated much excitement in recent years, humanoid robot teams have won over fans in Beijing based more on the AI technology involved than any athletic prowess shown.

Four teams of humanoid robots faced off in fully autonomous 3-on-3 soccer matches powered entirely by artificial intelligence Saturday night

in China's capital in what was touted as a first in China and a preview for the upcoming World Humanoid Robot Games, set to take place in Beijing.

According to the organisers, a key aspect of the match was that all the participating robots operated fully autonomously using AI-driven strategies without any human intervention or supervision.

Equipped with advanced visual sensors, the robots were able to identify the ball and navigate the field with agility.

They were also designed to stand up on their own after falling. However, during the match several still had to be carried off the field on stretchers by staff, adding to the realism of the experience.

China is stepping up efforts



to develop AI-powered humanoid robots, using sports competitions like marathons, boxing,

and football as a real-world proving ground.

Cheng Hao, founder and

CEO of Booster Robotics, the company that supplied the robot players, said sports compe-

titions offer the ideal testing ground for humanoid robots, helping to accelerate the development of both algorithms and integrated hardware-software systems.

He also emphasised safety as a core concern in the application of humanoid robots.

"In the future, we may arrange for robots to play football with humans. That means we must ensure the robots are completely safe," Cheng said. "For example, a robot and a human could play a match where winning doesn't matter, but real offensive and defensive interactions take place. That would help audiences build trust and understand that robots are safe."

Booster Robotics provided the hardware for all four

university teams, while each school's research team developed and embedded their own algorithms for perception, decision-making, player formations, and passing strategies—including variables such as speed, force, and direction, according to Cheng.

In the final match, Tsinghua University's THU Robotics defeated the China Agricultural University's Mountain Sea team with a score of 5-3 to win the championship.

Wu, a supporter of Tsinghua, celebrated their victory while also praising the competition.

"They (THU) did really well," he said. "But the Mountain Sea team (of Agricultural University) was also impressive. They brought a lot of surprises."
