Reservation for SC employees PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, July 1: In a first, the Supreme Court has introduced a formal reservation policy for the direct appointment and promotion of its staffers belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

The decision was communicated in a circular issued June 24 to all Supreme Court employees. "As per the directions of the Competent Authority, it is to notify for the information of all concerned that the Model Reservation Roster and Register has been uploaded on the Supnet (internal email network) and it is made effective from June 23, 2025," the circular said.

As per the circular and the model roster now in effect, top court employees will receive a 15 per cent quota and ST employees a 7.5 per cent quota in promotions.

₹1.07L-cr scheme to create 3.5 crore jobs

New Delhi, July 1: The Central government Tuesday approved an Employment Linked Incentive (ELI)scheme with an outlay of ₹1.07 lakh crore to create 3.5 crore jobs over the next two years through social security schemes run by the retirement fund body EPFO.

The ELI scheme to support job generation, enhance employability and social security across all sectors, with special focus on the manufacturing sector, was approved by the Union Cabinet in a meeting, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Information & Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said. The scheme aims to incentivise the creation of more than 3.5 crore jobs in the country over two years. The scheme will provide incentives to employees as well as employers to boost job creation. P9

Balasore/Bhogarai, July 1: The flood situation in Balasore remained critical Tuesday, as people of around 100 villages in northern parts of the district grapple with inundated roads and fields, officials said.

The villages have been impacted in four blocks - Bhograi, Baliapal, Jaleswar and Basta, due to the recent flood in Subarnarekha river following heavy rain and discharge of water by Jharkhand, officials said. The flood in Jalaka river has affected some villages under Basta and parts of Balasore Sadar block, they said.

Though the water level in river Subarnarekha and Jalaka was gradually receding, it is still running above the danger mark or remains just below that at Rajghat and Mathani, respectively, for three days, the officials said. The Balasore collector along with senior officials visited and monitored the present flood situation in Basta, Jaleswar, Baliapal and Bhograi.

"We are alert and field officials are taking measures in the flooded areas," Jajpur Collector P Anvesha Reddy said.

Meanwhile, two persons were swept away in floodwa-They were identified as Rakesh C, 32 of ward no-3 in Bishnupur village under Baliapal block and Shatrughna Bindhani, 50, of Kalanda village under Singla police limits in the district. Rakesh was going home wading through floodwater when he fell off a bridge and

Special teams to meet health emergencies

BHUBANESWAR: In view of the post-diarrhoea care and health conditions arising out of flood situation, the state government has deployed two specialised health teams in Keonjhar, Balasore, and Mayurbhanj districts to monitor, manage, and support the local response efforts. A dedicated team under Dr. Prameela Baral, Additional Director of Public Health, has been deployed to Keonjhar district to oversee the situations while another team led by Dr. Binay Das Mohapatra, Joint Director, has been sent to Balasore and Mayurbhani districts to assess the impact of the ongoing flood situation and to help prevent the emergence of water-borne diseases.

CM ASKS PRIVATE BANKS TO EXPEDITE LOANS TO POOR

Bhubaneswar, July 1: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Tuesday asked major private banks to extend more credit to poor people of the state under various welfare schemes.

Majhi said this while meeting representatives of ICICI, Axis and HDFC Banks and suggested that they should provide more loans to the poor in various welfare schemes, an official statement issued by the CMO said.

The CM issued such a suggestion after it was noticed that the performance of these banks in various welfare schemes such as agricultural loans. Pradhan Mantri Rozgar Shrusti Yojana, PM Swanidhi Yojana, Standup India Yojana, housing loans, education loans and export loans is very low.



Given their dismal performances, the state government has removed these banks from its empanelled List June 21,

sources said. Majhi informed the private banks that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the central government is implementing many poor welfare schemes. The government's goal is to involve people in economic activities through loans and increase their in-

The CM categorically told the representatives that the performance of these three banks in all these schemes is not at all satisfactory in the state.

Stating that the banks are a big medium in the government's poor welfare schemes. Majhi suggested that all these banks should provide more loans to people under various schemes that benefit the poor.

The representatives of the banks accepted Majhi's suggestion and said that they are interested in providing loans to people in all these schemes and they assured the CM that this performance will improve soon, the release said. The Principal Secretary of Finance Department, Shashawat Mishra, apprised the chief minister about the performance of these banks.

Bhubaneswar, July 1: Employees of the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC), including sanitation workers, Tuesday launched a 'ceasework' protest over the alleged assault on an on-duty senior colleague the previous day.

Due to the protest by the sanitation workers, cleanliness activities have been stopped and garbage has not been cleared.

On the other hand, police arrested two more accused in the assault case, taking the total number of arrests to five. They were identified as Sanjeev Mishra and Sachikant Swain. residents of Bhubaneswar.

Wearing black badges, all employees of BMC arrived at the office this morning and staged a 'cease work' protest demanding immediate arrest of all persons involved in the incident and adequate security for them at the office.

"The way in which our senior officer was dragged from the office and assaulted despite the presence of security guards, we are all shocked and are feeling insecure in the office," a woman employee of the BMC said.

BMC commissioner Rajesh Prabhakar Patil said, "Our officers and employees are hurt by the unfortunate incident which happened in our office on Monday. They are staging a protest over the incident." P3

5 BJP men suspended Bhubaneswar: The state unit of

the BJP Tuesday suspended five of its workers, including corporator Jeevan Rout, from the preliminary membership of the party for their alleged involvement in the violence in the BMC office. The suspended members were Rout, Rashmi Ranjan Mohapatra, Debashish Pradhan, Sachikant Swain and Sanjeev Mishra. The action comes after a group of people assaulted an on-duty Odisha Administrative Services (OAS) office in his office chamber on BMC premises. The assailants slapped, punched and kicked the official, dragged him from his office and forced him to apologise to BJP leader Jagannath Pradhan, according to reports.

As Musk renews criticism on Trump's tax-cut & spending bill and calls for a new political party, the latter suggests review of subsidies to former's companies.

"Elon may get more subsidy than any human being in history, by far, and without subsidies, Elon would probably have to close up shop and head back home to South Africa. No more Rocket launches, Satellites, or Electric Car Production, and our Country would save a FORTUNE. Perhaps we should have DOGE take a good, hard, look at this? BIG MON-EY TO BE SAVED!!!," Trump said in a post on Truth Social. referring to the federal Department of Government Efficiency



In response to Trump's post, Musk, on his own social media platform X, said "I am literally saying CUT IT ALL. Now.

Trump previously threatened to cut Musk's government subsidies and contracts when their relationship dissolved into an all-out brawl on social media in

early June over the bill, which non-partisan analysts have said would add about \$3 trillion to the US debt.

Musk's businesses include rocket company and government contractor SpaceX, which has about \$22 billion in federal contracts, and its satellite unit

caused volatility for Tesla, with shares of the electric car company losing about \$150 billion of its market value June 5, the largest single-day decline in the company's history, though it has since recovered. Tesla shares trading in Frankfurt tumbled 5% on Tuesday. After weeks of relative si-

lence following his earlier feud with Trump over the legislation, Musk rejoined the debate Saturday as the Senate took up the package, calling it "utterly insane and destructive" in a post on X.

On Monday, he said lawmakers who had campaigned on cutting spending but backed the bill "should hang their heads in shame!" "And they will lose their primary next year if it is the last thing I do on this Earth," Musk added.





OAS officers condemn attack, seek stern action

The brutal assault on BMC Additional Commissioner Ratnakar Sahoo. a senior OAS officer, Monday, has not only drawn widespread condemnations but also raised serious concern over the safety of on-duty public officials. Immediately after the incident, the Odisha Administrative Service (OAS) Association called for a statewide cease-work protest beginning July 1, and met CM Mohan Charan Majhi demanding stringent action against perpetrators. However, despite the CM's assurance for ensuring justice, arrest of five of the accused by Kharvel Nagar police and the association's decision to withhold the stir, OAS officers across Odisha went on cease-work

Highly condemnable

Khurda ADM Pratap Chandra Beura said, "The incident of a senior OAS officer and Additional Commissioner, Ratnakar Sahoo, being assaulted inside the BMC office is highly condemnable. Such actions should be condemned by all sections of society. On Tuesday, OAS officers from the Khurda district association wore black badges in protest."

Exemplary action should be taken

According to Bhadrak Sourav Chakrabarty, the incident of a working OAS officer being attacked in a pre-planned and organised manner is highly condemnable. "Officers must be provided with safety and security at their workplaces. In addition, all

those involved in this attack should be arrested, and exemplary action should be taken against them. Administrative officers, while sincerely performing their duties to serve the public, often become targets of anger or even physical assault," Chakraborty said, adding the government must take necessary steps to find a permanent solution to such issues.

Ensuring security is essential Gajapati ADM Falguni

Maihi said the Gajapati OAS and ORS Association strongly condemns the incident of the attack on BMC Additional Commissioner. "OAS officers have no proper security arrangements while on duty If this can happen to an OAS officer, it raises serious concerns about the safety of ordinary citizens. It is imperative to ensure the security of OAS officers," Majhi said.

An unpardonable crime

Sub-Collector Angul Behera said Mayadhar attacking a BMC officer in the office is an unforgivable crime. "No amount of condemnation is enough. When administrative officers are attacked, they feel threatened, and as a result, they cannot effectively fulfill their responsibility of delivering public services as entrusted by the government. Such disgraceful acts must be completely stopped," Behera added.

Such incidents must not be repeated

According to Athamallik Sub-Collector Upendra Luha, everyone should condemn such inhuman incident. "No one should take the law into own hands. To ensure

that such incidents are not repeated, administrative officers must be provided with security personnel. If everyone works according to the law, it will benefit all," said

Taking law into hands is unacceptable

Cuttack Sadar Sub-Collector <mark>Dibyajyoti Smruti Ran</mark>jan Deo said, "An attack on a working officer is never acceptable. It is inappropriate for anyone to take the law into their own hands. We, the OAS officers, strongly oppose such actions. The culprits must be punished appropriately. In protest, we have decided to go on mass leave. We also demand that working officers be provided with adequate security,' added Deo.

Such behaviour not healthy for

CDA Secretary Sweta Kumar Dash said in a democratic country, such behaviour towards a working officer is never desirable. "There is a legal system in place, and no one is above the law. Therefore, both public and government officials should act responsi bly. At the same time, we officers must also adopt a positive mindset and focus on addressing people's problems with sincerity. Incidents like these discourage us from performing our duties with enthusiasm,' added Dash

Deploy PSOs

Keonjhar ADM Rabindra Kumar Pradhan said senior officials should be provided with security guards. "The attack on BMC Additional

Commissioner Ratnakar Sahoo is very inhuman. Such incidents should not happen again. We have decided to go on a mass leave in protest. Strict action should be taken against the culprits. Personal security officers (PSOs) should be provided for the protection of senior officials,' Pradhan said.

Attack condemnable

ADM Mayurbhani Netrananda Mallick said the attack on the BMC Additional Commissioner is condemnable. "The OAS Association members have decided to go on leave demanding concrete action against the culprits. The protest will continue until a permanent solution is reached. We hope that the IAS association, engineers' union, revenue inspectors' union and civil servants union will also support our demand," Mallick said.

Protection needed

According to Balasore ADM Sudhakar Naik, the attack on the BMC Additional Commissioner is very unfortunate. "The government should take legal action against all the accused. The working officers should be provided with protection. All the officers working in the district are on leave till the next step of the government. Government measures should be implemented for the safety and security of the officers serving the public," Naik added.

Dignity at stake

Soudamini Sethi, Special Secretary to Panchayati Raj & Drinking Water department, said, "We provide service to the people. The attack on a public servant in broad day light reflects a negative state of society. Our dignity is at

Crime Branch identifies 23 fake hotel websites

Bhubaneswar, July 1: The social media team of the cybercrime unit under the Crime Branch (CB) has identified 23 fake hotel websites and has sent them for immediate blocking, official sources said Tuesday. adding that 15 websites have already been blocked, while action is underway to block the remaining ones.

The cybercrime unit is on high alert this year, especially during the Rath Yatra, as many people from Odisha and other states were defrauded by similar scams last year, they said.

This year, the team began its vigilance drive in June and has been actively working to identify fake hotel websites. report them promptly, and issue timely alerts to the public, they added.

Innocent tourists, especially those in urgent need of accommodation, are being tricked by these fraudulent sites. These fake websites are made to closely resemble genuine hotel websites in design, branding, and even URL, making it difficult for users to tell the difference.

Once the victims are convinced, fraudsters demand full payments via UPI, digital wallets, or bank transfers and issue fake booking confirmations. CB sources noted that these fraudulent websites are often promoted to appear at the top of Google search results.

The CB has urged the public to book hotels only through trusted platforms or official tourism websites.

It also advised verifying the hotel's phone number and location through Google Maps, and to always confirm the booking by calling the hotel directly. Additionally, people are advised not to make full advance payments, to use only secure payment gateways, and to avoid transferring money

through UPI or wallets. "If anyone comes across suspicious hotel websites or fake listings, they are urged to report them immediately by calling the cyber helpline

DA CASE Soil Conservation Jt Director arrested

Bhubaneswar, July 1: Vigilance officials Tuesday arrested the Joint Director of Soil Conservation & Watershed Development, Dayanidhi Bagh, for possessing assets disproportionate to his known sources of income.

He was produced before the Court of Special Judge, Vigilance, Bhawanipatna, which sent him to judicial custody.

According to the Vigilance report, Bagh was found to be in possession of a three-BHK flat (No. 1-D) at Mahanadi Apartment in Gothapatna, Bhubaneswar, an under-construction house covering 3,000 sqft near Majhiguda Square in Nabarangpur town, a shopping complex comprising five shop rooms over 1,400 sqft in Nabarangpur town, a plot with a house in the Chandrasekharpur Housing Board Colony in Bhubaneswar, a 40-acre farmhouse in Bijaraguda under Tentulikhunti Tehsil of Nabarangpur district, which includes agricultural equipment and inputs worth Rs 1 crore, another farmhouse on 6 acre at Patakot village under Nabarangpur tehsil. The total area of land possessed by Bagh was estimated to be 27 acres in Nabarangpur district and 11

acres in Bhawanipatna town. The Vigilance Technical Wing is making efforts to determine the actual market value of the houses, flats, farmhouses, and other properties.

Additionally, 312 grams of gold jewellery were recovered from his house. It was also found that he holds bank deposits amounting to Rs 58,41,422.

Furthermore, one benami four-wheeler (a Maruti Brezza), a two-wheeler, and household items worth Rs 9 lakh were also found in his possession. He failed to satisfactorily ac-

count for these assets during searches conducted by Vigilance officials A case (24/2025) has been

Bhubaneswar, July 1: The controversy surrounding the Combined Recruitment Examination (CRE) 2023 (IV), conducted by the Odisha Sub-ordinate Staff Selection Commission (OSSSC), has deepened with the announcement of revised main exam dates. The recruitment drive — for posts like Revenue Inspector (RI), Assistant Revenue Inspector (ARI), Amin, ICDS Supervisor, and Statistical Field Surveyor (SFS) — will now be held from August 1 to early September 2025

Concerns over the integrity of the recruitment process are not new. Last year, hundreds of aspirants staged protests in Bhubaneswar and Cuttack, alleging major irregularities in the preliminary exams conducted by OSSSC. Held between September 20 and October 20, 2024, the exams drew flak for being outsourced to a blacklisted private firm and conducted at privately-run cyber cafes and computer centers.

Adding fuel to the fire, OS-SSC declared that all candidates-except nine caught

and launching a probe into the alleged corruption, with strict action against those involved. Critics have flagged the sus-

picious timing of official moves Former OSSSC chairman Saswat Mishra was removed amid controversy but appointed Principal Secretary to the Chief Minister June 29. The very next day, OSSSC announced the new exam in the same disputed online format, which Mahapatra called a 'conspiracy'. He also questioned what action was taken against the firm behind the original irregularities. SAC has warned of a statewide strike starting July 4 if their demands remain unmet.

parency since 2023, pushing many deserving candidates to the brink of severe mental distress. He urged the government to restore trust by holding the exam offline in a single shift

Earlier, Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Suresh Pujari acknowledged issues, particularly with exam centers run by private agencies. He assured the public of the government's commitment to transparency in future exams. The state has also announced plans for a new law imposing strict penalties to curb cheating and malpractices in public recruitment exams.

Despite assurances, discontent is rising among job seekers, many believing the system favours the corrupt. Candidate Umakanth Sahoo urged the Odisha government to immediately revise OSSSC's decision and adopt a more transparent exam format. Shuvendu Pradhan slammed OSSSC for its 'corrupt mindset', saying that despite protests and evidence from students, the commission repeats mistakes, indicating that corruption has become a deliberate practice rather than a mere incident.

49,818 students in final UG merit list

Bhubaneswar, July 1: The State Higher Education department Tuesday released the Phase-I third and final merit list for Undergraduate (UG) admissions for the 2025-26 academic sessions, with a total of 49,818 students shortlisted. So far. 1.09.400 students have taken admission through the first and second rounds.

While the first round saw 1,75,722 students selected from 2,65,590 applicants, only 79,752 students took admission. In the second round, 45,502 candidates were selected, with 29,468 confirming admission.

In the third and final round, 49,818 students have been shortlisted, including 21,023 males,

28,792 females, and three transgender students.

Just like in the first and second rounds, Ravenshaw University, Cuttack, has remained the top choice in the third round as well, leading across all three streams — Science,

Commerce, and Arts.

In the Arts stream, Ravenshaw University recorded the highest cut-off at 90.83 per cent in Political Science. For Physical Science, the cut-off stood at 92.33 per cent, while Biological Science saw a 91.83 per cent

cut-off. The university also led in Commerce, with a cut-off of 89.83 per cent, reaffirming its position as the most sought-after institution.

In self-financing courses Buxi Jagabandhu Bidyadhar Autonomous College, Bhubaneswar recorded a cut-off of 87.33 per cent for Computer Science.

In the Law stream, University Law College, Utkal University posted a cut-off of 82.83 per cent for the five-year Integrated BA LLB programme.

Authorities have stressed the importance of timely reporting at the allotted institutions between July 2 and July 4, from 10am to 5pm, for candidates to confirm admission and com-

plete the necessary formalities


ECoR records 9.69 pc growth in freight loading

According to ECoR sources. From April to June 2025, the zone loaded a total of 68.19 million

In June 2025 alone, freight loading reached 23.15 million tonnes, reflecting a 7.72 per cent increase over the 21.49 million tonnes loaded in June 2024.

UIDAI CEO Bhuvnesh Kumar provided a national perspective, stating that India conducts near-



Joda-Bamebari road works in limbo

Due to the poor condition of this crucial route, over 50,000 people in Joda and Jhumpura blocks continue to face hardships

Joda, July 1: Inordinate delay in Joda-Bamebari road works has severely hit development in the mineral rich Joda region of Keonjhar district.

For the past eight years, work on the expansion and construction of the Joda-Bamehari section of State Highway-2 has not begun. Due to the poor condition of this crucial route, over 50,000 people in Joda and Jhumpura blocks continue to face hardships.

Locals blamed the stagnation on administrative apathy and a lack of political will. Repeated appeals have yielded no results, leaving the residents frustrated over the long neglect of the region's mining belt. The Joda-Bamebari stretch

and Bamebari-Palaspanaga stretch connect two major national highways and facilitate the daily movement of over 30,000 trucks loaded with minerals. After decades of relentless heavy transport, the road and several bridges have become dangerously rickety. Serious traffic problems, frequent accidents and fatalities are now a common occur-



rence owing to potholes and poor road conditions. In 2018, around ₹50 crore was sanctioned from the District Mineral Foundation (DMF) fund for construction and expansion of approximately 15-km stretch of the Joda-Bamebari road. However, due to inefficiencies and apathetic attitude of the Works and Revenue departments, the project remains incomplete. The road continues to remain narrow at the Banshpani overbridge, while it is reportedly in hazardous condition at Jurudi Square, Hatapada Chhak, and Antaramantara bridge

Though some patchwork was done in scattered areas four years after the funds were sanctioned, the poor quality of repairs has left the road in a dilapidated state. Even necessary land acquisition processes remain stuck due to lapses on part of the Works and Revenue departments.

With the situation worsening, the Joda Truck Owners' Association took it upon themselves to repair stretches near the Banshpani overbridge using murram and soil June 22.

Senior Executive Engineer Sambit Mohanty confirmed that road repairs have recently commenced. He added that the state government has allocated ₹1,400 crore to widen the entire 45-km Joda-Palasapanga stretch into a six-lane road. The tender process is complete and work will begin following land ac-

Following the illegal mining and unchecked mineral transportation activities that came to light in 2009, the Justice MB Shah Commission, tasked with investigating the issue, highlighted the severe lack of basic infrastructure in the mining regions pointing out poor road connectivity, inadequate education and healthcare services, and lack of access to drinking water.

Following the commission's recommendations, the state government constituted the District Mineral Foundation (DMF) in 2015 to support development in mining-affected areas. Since then Keonihar district has collected an estimated ₹11.000 crore

in mining revenues, according to sources in the state's Mines department.

In a bid to streamline fund utilisation, the state government has introduced new guidelines prioritising expenditure within a 5-km radius of mining zones. These directly impacted areas will now receive the lion's share of the DMF funds. In contrast, areas within a 10-km radius will receive proportionally lower funding.

The revised norms indicate the new government's intent to bring reforms in DMF governance. However, in practice, the policy's effectiveness remains questionable, particularly in Joda-arguably one of the most affected areas by mining. Despite being at the heart of the mineral belt, Joda still lacks basic infra structure.

A glaring example is the poor condition of roads in the region. Though large sums have been sanctioned from DMF for development works, it remains unclear how much has actually been invested in road construction. So far, there is no clear public record detailing the expenditure and implementation status of these projects.

Gas leak from tanker: NH-49 closed, Section 144 imposed

Thousands of vehicles on the busy highway stranded near Odisha-Jharkhand border POST NEWS NETWORK

Baripada, July 1: A propylene gas leak from a tanker near the Odisha-Jharkhand border Tuesday triggered panic and paralysed movement on National Highway 49, prompting the imposition of Section 144 to ensure public safety.

The incident occurred near the Jio petrol pump at Jamshola in Mayurbhanj district.

Police said around 10 am, the tanker, which was carrying propylene gas from Kolkata to Jharpokharia in Mayurbhanj, developed a leak near the Jio fuel station under Baharagoda police limits in East Singhbhum district of Jharkhand. As the gas began escaping, fears of a potential explosion gripped the area.

The leak was traced to a faulty valve which occurred near Bell Square, close to Gambharia, between Baharagoda and Jamshola. Given the highly flammable nature of propylene, the local administration swiftly cordoned off the area and enforced Section 144, prohibiting public movement within a 2km radius.



Odisha and Jharkhand police jointly deployed security person nel at the site. The Fire Brigade remained on high alert at the scene. A special technical team from Balasore arrived to assess the chemical composition of the gas and determine whether it poses toxic risks.

With authorities and experts still trying to contain the leak, vehicular traffic on NH-49 has been completely halted, leaving hundreds of heavy vehicles on either side of the highway stranded. Communication be tween Odisha and Jharkhand has also been temporarily severed. Meanwhile, residents have been advised to remain indoors and avoid unnecessary move ment. District officials have appealed to the public to stay calm, not panic, and refrain from spreading or believing in rumours.

Mayurbhanj Collector Hema Kanta Say urged citizens to cooperate with the administration, assuring that necessary precautions are being taken to resolve the situation safely.

2 killed in road mishap, another critical

Keonjhar/Champua: Two scooterists were killed while another sustained critical injuries after a speeding truck hit the two-wheeler they were riding near Taduabahal under this police limits in Keonjhar district Tuesday morning. 2 farm labourers swept away in swollen Malkangiri river

July 1: Two farm labourers drowned in a swollen river in Malkangiri district Monday after being swept away by strong currents while returning from paddy field.

The deceased were identified as Sampati Laba Dora, 46, and Shukri Pataka, 40, residents of Naliguda and Patakaguda villages, respectively, under Khairput block. According to reports, the

two had left for the fields Monday morning along with Debaki Dora, 38, Laba's wife, to transplant paddy seedlings. The trio crossed a river and

worked in a field across it. By afternoon, continuous rainfall had significantly raised the water level and intensified the current in the river.

While returning home, Shukri Pataka attempted to cross the river first, but lost her footing and was swept away. Laba Dora, who was right behind her, jumped in to rescue her. However, he too was dragged away by the strong current. Despite his efforts, neither could survive.

Debaki Dora, who was on the riverbank, screamed for help. Hearing her cries, local villagers rushed to the spot, but the strong current made rescue impossible. The Fire


Brigade was informed and arrived soon after to begin a search operation.

Laba Dora's body was recovered later Monday, while Shukri Pataka's body was found Tuesday morning, about one kilometre downstream from the incident site.

Police sent both bodies for post-mortem before handing them over to their respective families.

Relative held for raping Class VII student

Gopalpur/Berhampur: Police Tuesday arrested a 22-year-old man in connection with the rape of a Class VII student in Ganjam district which came to the light Monday. The accused, who happens to be a distant relative of the survivor, was arrested from a village under the jurisdiction of Golanthara police station, a police officer said. The incident happened June 28, while the complaint was registered with the police June 30, the officer said. The incident came close on the heels of the gang rape of a college student at Gopalpur sea beach June 15 present case, the accused and the 11-year-old victim have undergone medical tests, the police said. The survivour's statement has also been recorded. The officer said that the accused and the survivor are residents of the same village According to the complaint lodged by the girl's mother, the accused forcibly took the survivor to a toilet of a school. He then tied her hands and legs before raping her, Berhampur SP Saravana Vivek M said, quoting from the complaint. The accused had fled the spot, leaving the girl in distress. She was, however, located by a villager and rescued. Police have registered a case against the accused under various BNS Sections and Protection of Children from Sexual Of fences (POCSO) Act and launched an investigation, the SP said.






NIT Rourkela research to boost Mars mission plans





Rourkela, July 1: In what could enhance both robotic and human mission planning on Mars and deepen understanding of its habitability, a collaborative research by scientists from the National Institute of Technology Rourkela, UAE University and Sun Yat-sen University in China have examined how spinning dust devils, powerful dust storms and widespread wa-



by the researchers through the analysis of more than two decades of satellite data with a view to improve weather prediction models for Mars. The study was recently published in New Astronomy Reviews (impact factor 26.8). Data from multiple Mars missionsincluding India's Mars Orbiter Mission (MOM)—was used to analyse how dust and water ice interact to shape Mars' climate and temperature.



Lead author Prof Jagabandhu Panda, Department of Earth and Atmospheric Sciences, co-authored the paper with NIT Rourkela research scholar Anirban Mandal. Other contributors include Dr Bijay Kumar Guha and Dr Claus Gebhardt of UAE University's National Space Science and Technology Center, and Dr Zhaopeng Wu from Sun Yat-sen University (now at the Chinese Academy of Sciences).

The study focused on three main atmospheric elements: dust devils, large-scale dust storms, and water-ice clouds-including the aphelion cloud belt and polar hood. Their formation is driven by seasonal changes and dust concentration.

"Advancing weather prediction on Mars is crucial not only for safe missions but also for understanding the planet's habitability," said Prof. Panda. He also urged greater ISRO involvement and university-based investment in space research.

Hungary Lessons

evolting against oppression and seeking freedom is ingrained in human nature, something that a repressive regime finds out sooner or later. Change is the only constant and therefore it is difficult to hold people under sway for an indefinite period of time through aggressive measures. This is exactly what is happening in Far-Right controlled Hungary as was revealed in the government ban on Hungary's annual Pride Parade 28 June when over 200,000 people marched through its capital, Budapest, far more than have taken part in previous such events. The punitive measure backfired. Prime Minister Viktor Orban had warned people a day before the event to stay away from the banned parade, threatening "clear legal consequences" for anyone taking part. Government warnings, however, only turned what is usually a low-key event attended by a few thousand LGBTQ+ activists and their friends, into a mass rally against Orban's government. This is what happens when empty threats are issued against the public without a plan. It helps in consolidating opposition.

Common people, including women and children, travelled from distant places to take part in the rally to showcase their opposition to Orban's policies. Their common refrain was "it is painful for us to see how stupid they think we all are," as a 46-year-old woman, Edit Rocza, who is a special-education teacher, put it. These kinds of bans and restrictions are believed to be merely a distraction from the massive corruption, economic downturn and other real problems Hungarians are facing in their country.

In fact, only in March, Orban's party rushed a legislation through Parliament, that amended the right of assembly, to make it illegal to hold gatherings like Pride parades under an earlier law banning material that "propagates" homosexuality. Participants in such gatherings faced fines of nearly \$600 apiece, while organizers risked imprisonment

The ban was the outcome of the increasing nervousness of Orban and his party, Fidesz, over the rising popularity of Peter Magyar, a conservative opposition leader. To stop Orban's government from derailing this year's Pride parade, an annual fixture since 1995, Budapest's liberal mayor, Gergely Karacsony, recast it as a municipal event celebrating Hungary's full freedom after Soviet troops pulled out in June 1991. He allowed it to go ahead, renamed as Budapest Pride Freedom. Authorities of the Orban regime were undeterred, insisted it was illegal and threatened the mayor with jail, though they gave permission to an anti-gay march planned on the same day by a Far-Right party.

Orban, a populist nationalist, has long projected Hungary as a bastion of conservative values in his attempts to distract attention from Hungary's faltering economy and to consolidate his Right-wing rural base. Hungary's gay community has become one of his favourite targets, as has been the case of many Right-wing parties across the globe.

The rally is a tell-tale indication that Orban faces great risk in the next elections. Most opinion polls give the party of his challenger, Magyar, a comfortable lead over Fidesz. This suggests Orban's party, in power for 15 years after four landslide election victories in a row, could suffer defeat in the general election next year.

For his part, Magyar made an intelligent move by staying away from the parade, delivering nonetheless an oblique message through social media that he supported Budapest Pride, accusing Orban of trying "to turn Hungarian against Hungarian, in order to create fear and divide us."

Another sign of the decline of popular support for Orban is that while Budapest Pride had in the past attracted a few foreign diplomats, this year's march drew more than 70 members of the European Parliament and scores of politicians from across Europe. This wasn't as much about the Alphabet community's rights but more about a general opposition

The march ceased to be an expression of protest by a particular group of the populace and became a rallying point for all those who are fed up with the government. It is time for leaders like Orban to realise that people cannot be taken for granted for an indefinite period and actual work must overtake threats and propaganda.

THE IRAN NUCLEAR QUESTION

Union, the UK, France, and China not only were the only countries that possessed nuclear weapons; they also had enough wisdom to recognise the dangers posed by nuclear proliferation. Despite their many and deep political differences, they arrived at a consensus to halt the further dissemination of "nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices.' Under the resulting 1970 Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty (NPT), non-nuclear states agreed not to pursue nuclear weapons and to accept International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) safeguards on all their nuclear activities. In return, the five nuclear-weapon states committed to negotiate "in good faith on effective measures relating to cessation of the nuclear arms race ... and to nuclear disarmament."

With 191 signatories, the NPT is the most widely adopted international agreement after the UN Charter. The only countries not to adhere to it were India, Pakistan, and Israel. Each went on to develop nuclear weapons. North Korea, which initially joined the treaty, later withdrew to build its own nuclear arsenal. The five original nuclear-weapon states did not keep their end of the bargain regarding disarmament. On the contrary, they have been using AI and other technologies to modernize their arsenals. The world's nuclear warheads total more than 12,000 and have become the preeminent sign of a country's power and prestige.

Just listen to Russia's leaders. Throughout their war in Ukraine, they have brandished their nuclear arsenal as a badge of invincibility. They know that the risk of a nuclear holocaust will deter all other powers from challenging them directly. Similarly, because North Korea has armed itself with nuclear weapons, the US has taken a softer approach in dealing with it, relying on diplomacy and economic incentives. By contrast, in Libya, Muammar al-Qaddafi agreed to abandon his nascent nuclear programme and ended up dead, following a NATO aerial campaign against his regime. Among the lessons that have

emerged in recent decades are that nuclear-weapons states have no intention of fully disarming. Worse, there is now only one nuclear arms-control treaty between Russia and the US (New START), and it is due to expire next February. The most powerful deterrent for any state is possession of nuclear weapons or membership in an alliance that offers a nuclear umbrella (like NATO). Around 30 states either have nuclear weapons or enjoy such protection. The rest of the world, meanwhile, must hope that the nuclear powers remain on their best behaviour.

The situation is especially fraught in the Middle East, a region plagued by wars, violence, instability, and a lack of comprehensive security arrangements. Add the fact that Israel is the only state in the region known to have nuclear weapons and you have the makings for chronic insecurity.

The wild card, of course, has been Iran, a country that has endured violence and tumult since the 1950s, when a US- and UK-organized coup ousted the country's first democratically elected government. In the 1980s, Iraq invaded Iran with the support of Western powers and neighbouring countries determined to crush its fledgling Islamist regime. Following eight years of brutal violence, with Iraq deploying chemical weapons extensively, the Islamic Republic came to the predictable conclusion that it needs to master nuclear-weapons technology. According to the IAEA, US, and other intelligence agencies, however, that programme essentially ended in 2003. For the last 20 years, the challenge has been to get Iran to come clean about its past undeclared activities. After a period of sanctions, US President Barack Obama decided to pursue diplomacy. The idea was to use economic incentives and various technical measures to prevent Iran from developing nuclear weapons and pressure it to reveal its past undeclared nuclear activities. These were the main features of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action, which Iran and the five permanent members of the UNSC, plus Germany and the European Union, signed in 2015. This framework was func-

tioning as intended, with full compliance by Iran, until President Donald Trump abruptly withdrew the US from the agreement in 2018. Arguing that the JCPOA was only a stopgap measure, he insisted on a deal that would control not only Iran's nuclear programme but also its "disruptive" activities in the Middle East (such as its support for Hamas, Hezbollah, and the Houthis in Yemen). As a result, Iran refused to implement some of the JCPOA's key inspection measures and started to enrich uranium to a level approaching weapons-grade

During Joe Biden's term as president, the US tried unsuccessfully to revive the JCPOA. When Trump returned to the White House this year, he demanded that Iran "surrender" its right to enrichment altogether. Following a few rounds

US and Iran, Israel and the US, lacking credible evidence of a nuclear-weapons programme, launched their illegal attack against Iranian nuclear and military targets. The ostensible aim was to destroy all of Iran's nuclear fuel-cycle facilities, though there have also been murmurings about triggering regime change in Iran – a stark reminder of the rationale for the similarly illegal military in-

terventions in Iraq and Libya.

The root cause of nuclear proliferation is a state's sense of insecurity or aspiration to increase its power and influence. Iran's focus on nuclear capability stems from a yearning to prevent foreign interference, a sensitivity to the region's security imbalance, and a desire to be recognised as a regional power. Far from curtailing its nuclear ambitions, the use of force and humiliation is just as likely to strengthen its resolve. We saw this in Iraq after Israel destroyed its research reactor in 1981.

The only solution to Middle East nuclear proliferation is to engage in dialogue based on mutual respect, meaningful security assurances, and economic incentives. In other words, resolving the Iran nuclear question ultimately will require a return to a JCPOA-like agreement - albeit one of unlimited duration, perhaps supplemented with an agreement on the scope of Iran's missile programme.

Addressing the longstanding challenges to peace and security across the Middle East ultimately will also require a comprehensive agreement that deals with the Palestinian question, Israel's nuclear weapons, and economic and social development needs. Frozen Fun offers gelato ice cream in about two dozen flavours. Customers used to be able to sample several flavours before making their choice, but that got out of hand, apparently.

Here's what the sign says: "Our policy allowed customers to try any flavour until they found their favourite. However, we noticed that many people were taking advantage of this generosity. There have been numerous instances where individuals and groups of friends requested to sample 5 to 10 flavours and then left without ordering anything. No business can sustain such costs. Therefore we are now offering two sample tastings per client. We hope you sympathise with and understand our perspective.'

Arvind's photo of the Frozen Fun sign was also shared on the Reddit group "IndiaSpeaks" under the title "Every time there's something nice, we find a way to spoil it.'

The title implies that Indians like to take advantage of free stuff, and one Reddit user was quick to share an example from his workplace in the United States. He works at a company that would stock the breakroom with snacks and drinks for employees to enjoy while working. His desi co-workers would take the free stuff home, filling their bags and emptying the shelves. When he asked them why they did this, the typical response would be: "Bro, it's kept for us only, bro.'

But it's not just Indians who take advantage of free stuff. It's people in other countries too -- and not just the ones who

emigrated from India.

As another Reddit user states: "Only in India, customers are seen as culprits. So many times, I have seen customers pass by Cold Stone (Creamery), trying samples but not picking an order, outside of India -- who are not Indians. You can get an entire meal there, as long as you're willing to walk around to each sample station. Wearing a fake mustache will help you get two samples at each station. If you're a woman, you may get a raised eye brow, but don't worry: It's worth it.

J&K orders opening of 'buried' cases for families of terror victims

Srinagar, July 1: A special cell and a toll-free number will be established in the secretari at of Jammu and Kashmir lieu tenant governor for addressing the concerns of the families of terror victims and to bring the culprits to justice.

Chairing a high-level meet ing Tuesday, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha also direct ed deputy commissioners and SSPs to reopen terror cases which were "deliberately" buried.

The development comes days after Sinha met the family members of some of the Kash miri civilians killed in terror attacks and said justice was denied to victims of terrorism for decades before 2019.

"Special Cell to be estab lished in LG Secretariat to address concerns of families. A similar cell to be set up in Chief Secretary's office. Every possible assistance would be provided to terror victim fami lies & culprits roaming free for many decades will be brought to justice," Sinha posted on his official X handle.

Sinha said a toll-free number should also be notified for

The LG chaired the meeting to discuss issues concerning victim families whose loved ones were brutally killed by Pakistan-backed terrorists.

"Directed DCs & SSPs to reopen cases which were deliberately buried & file an FIR and ensure jobs are provided to NoKs (next of kin) on priority, Sinha said.

He said the deputy commissioners and senior superintendents of police were directed to free the property and land grabbed by terrorists or their

New Delhi, July 1: With monsoon drenching the capital, Delhi's pilot cloud seeding project to curb air pollution was deferred to the end of August. Delhi Environment Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa said

The minister announced the change in schedule during a press conference here, citing ongoing rains that may not provide ideal conditions and could fail to yield the desired results.

Last week, he revealed that the initial time window for cloud seeding was set between July 4 and July 11, as conditions were not suitable before July 3.

However, following consultations with meteorological experts and in light of the current weather patterns, the project team proposed a revised window -- August 30 to September 10 -- when the monsoon is expected to recede.

Sirsa expressed confidence that this new period is likely to offer more suitable cloud formations for the seeding

The cloud seeding sorties will be conducted using aircraft VT-IIT (Cessna 206-H), fully equipped with cloud seeding instruments.

According to the tentative flight plan, the aircraft will cover Alipur, Bawana, Rohini, Burari, Pavi Sadakpur, and regions along the Eastern Peripheral Expressway, including areas near the Kundli border zones, identified for their combination of low-altitude cloud potential and high pollution

The operation will be carried out by the Department of Aerospace Engineering, IIT Kanpur, which has prior experience in similar airborne missions. The crew has undergone training, and all necessary DGCA certifications and permissions were obtained, he said

The cloud seeding process involves releasing hygroscopic particles, such as sodium chloride, into clouds to trigger precipitation. "This not only helps generate rain but also improves pollutant washout in the lower

atmosphere," said Sirsa.

The DGCA laid down stringent conditions: the flights must operate under Visual Flight Rules (VFR), with full visibility of terrain and obstacles. No aerial photography is permitted, and the aircraft must stay within approved airspace unless further clearances are secured. Operators are also required to inform the DGCA of any unusual incidents and follow all safety and documentation protocols under the applicable Civil Aviation Requirements (CAR). Sirsa also stated that this

pilot trial is part of the government's broader Environment Action Plan 2025, and the data gathered from these flights will help boost efforts during the winter season when Delhi's AQI levels typically spike.

'These trials are not just symbolic but are part of a data-driven strategy. We are preparing now so that when October and November arrive, we have a tested, ready mechanism to combat pollution," he said.

Calling it a "historic milestone," Sirsa underlined that Delhi is the first state to receive the DGCA's approval for cloud seeding aimed at pollution control.

"We're ending the era where action only followed court intervention," he said. "The previous governments wrote letters for ten years. We held multiple rounds of meetings, got clearances in just four months, and now, we are ready with aircraft. crew, and equipment."



Pilgrims make beeline for Amarnath yatra registration

Jammu, July 1: Hundreds of pilgrims from all over the country flocked to Jammu Tuesday as the administration started on-the-spot registration of devotees for the Amarnath vatra.

The vatra to the 3,880-metre shrine in south Kashmir Himalyas will formally begin July 3.

The 38-day pilgrimage will commence from the twin tracks-- the traditional 48-km long Nunwan-Pahalam route in Anantnag district and the 14-km shorter but steeper Baltal route in Ganderbal district-- July 3.

"On-the-spot re gistration has begun for devotees arriving in Jammu city from other parts of the country for their onward journey to Amarnath. This is being done after devotees are given tokens," Sub Divisional Magistrate Manu Hansa said.

While on-the-spot registration centres have been set up for unregistered pilgrims in

Shalimar area of the city, a special camp for registration of sadhus has been set up at the Purani Mandi-based Ram

temple complex, officials said. 'The registration is being done at three centres — Vaishnavi Dham, Panchayat Bhawan, and Mahajan Sabha. Saraswati Dham is the only centre from

where devotees can get the token. The centres opened at 7 am," he said. The registration of sadhus

has begun at the Ram temple in Jammu, officials said, adding all arrangements have been put in place for them.

Over 300 sadhus from various parts of the country have complex, which serves as the base camp for them, they said, adding boarding and lodging arrangements have been made

Amid multi-tier security ar rangements, over 1,600 pilgrims have arrived at the Bhagwati Nagar base camp here for their onward journey to Kashmir tomorrow, officials said.

"Arrangements have been made to provide boarding and lodging facilities for over 50,000 people at various lodgement centres across the Jammu region, from Lakhanpur to Banihal. A total of 106 lodgement centres have been set up for the purpose," Divisional Commissioner Ramesh Kumar told reporters here

Kumar said the yatra will commence from Jammu July 2 and Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha will flag it off from the Bhagwati Nagar base camp amid tight security.

New Delhi, July 1: Seven years after the mysterious deaths of 11 family members inside their home in north Delhi's Burari July 1, 2018, life in the neighbourhood has seemingly returned to normal. Coaching centres and shops operate as usual, vet the building. which once captured national headlines and inspired numerous theories, still draws quiet glances and recognition from passersby.

"Sometimes, students, especially girls from the nearby academies, point to the build-

ing, stop for a moment, speak in whispers, get scared, and then turn away," Madan, an ironing shop worker who has lived in the area for nearly two Ten of the 11 members of the

Chundawat family were found hanging from an iron mesh in the ceiling, while the body of 77-yearold Narayan Devi, the head of the family, was lying on the floor in another room of the house. Devi's daughter Pratibha (57)

and her two sons, Bhavnesh (50) and Lalit (45), were among the deceased. Bhavnesh's wife Savita (48) and their three children-Maneka (23), Neetu (25), and Dhirendra (15)—were also found dead. Lalit Bhatia's wife Tina (42) and their 15-year-old son Dushyant were among those who died. Pratibha's daughter Priyanka, who had gotten engaged in June 2018. was also found hanging.

The police tried their hand at everything, including the occult, psychology, superstition and used the latest investigative techniques to crack one of the most sensational cases in the national capital.

A senior officer, involved in the investigation of the case, stated, "When the bodies were found, the district police initially registered a murder case. However, when family members were questioned, no motive was discovered. Then the registers were uncovered, and gradually the mystery began to unravel.'

He added that it was a challenging case since authorities had to go through eight registers filled with detailed entries made over a period of 11 years

about a set of rituals on how to replicate 'badh tapasya' a banyan tree formation.

The factor that seems to grab the most eyeballs in this case is that of Lalit Chundawat allegedly being 'visited' by his dead father, who dictated instructions for the family.

"In 2006, his father had passed away and a few months after his death, Lalit met with an accident and lost his voice. He appeared to have gained his voice back after some time and started believing that he was being visited by his father. He would give sermons to his family members who would make the notes in those registers. the officer recalled.

This discovery led to widespread media attention, speculation, and multiple investigations. A psychological autopsy revealed that none of the family members had any intention of taking their own lives; rather, it was an accident that occurred during a ritual that went wrong.

Monica, a teacher at an academy directly across from the Chundawat residence, noted that while the fear surrounding the house has subsided, some rare instances of superstition still persist.

"Everything's calm now, but there are still a few superstitious parents. They link minor illnesses, like headaches or stomachaches, to the building. One student missed class for a few days, and when she returned, she told me her mother had taken her to a spiritual guru instead of a doctor. The guru supposedly said that a spirit might still be around because of what happened there.'

According to Inspector General Police (Law and Order) Akhilesh Kumar Singh, a suo-motu drive was initiated across the state to check reported incidents of illegal cattle slaughter and selling of beef in restaurants unauthorisedly.

India. France hold ioint military drills

New Delhi: Indian and French militaries carried out a twoweek wargame in France that focused on boosting joint operational preparedness to deal with security challenges About 50 armoured and tactical vehicles and fighter jets were deployed in the Indo-French army exercise Shakti that was held from June 18 to July 1. The exercise involved more than 500 legionnaires and military personnel from various units of the French Army, the Foreign Legion, as well as the French Air and Space Force, and the French Navy, according to a French readout.

Man sentenced to 25 years RI

Shillong: A court in Meghalaya's Shillong has sentenced a man to 25 years of rigorous imprisonment for sexually assaulting a girl five years ago, an official said Tuesday. Special POCSO Judge MK Lyngdoh Monday pronounced Teiboklang Wahlang guilty of sexually assaulting the minor in 2020 and sentenced him to 25 years of rigorous imprisonment, they said.

Oppn mounts pressure on DMK Siddaramaiah flags

Chennai/Sivaganga, July 1: The Opposition in Tamil Nadu Tuesday mounted pressure on the ruling DMK over the custodial death of a temple security guard in the state's Sivaganga district, demanding a CBI probe into the matter, even as the state government initiated action against policemen, including putting the district police chief on "compulsory wait". Also, a DSP was placed under suspension.

The matter also came up before the Madras High Court bench in Madurai, which appointed an Enquiry Officer to look into the issue and submit a report July 8, while allowing a CB-CID probe into the case. The victim's family had filed a writ petition. Ajithkumar of Tiruppuvanam was picked up last week by the local police in connection with a theft case and was allegedly repeatedly thrashed by a "special team' and died later. His death has sparked outrage from political parties and civil societies alike.

Amid criticism from various quarters, the Chief Minister spoke to the family of the deceased over the phone and consoled them. "I am very sorry, have asked action to be taken, serious action. Stay strong," he told the victim's mother.

The CM shared the video of his telephonic conversation with the family on his 'X' handle. In the accompanying message, Stalin said, "The cruelty faced by the Tiruppuvanam (in

Sivaganga) youth should not happen to anyone; it's an unjustifiable mistake. This government will ensure punishment for those who have failed to do their duty (policemen), will stand by the family," he said.

The Opposition lashed out at the DMK over the incident. The principal Opposition party, AIADMK, demanded a CBI probe into the custodial death, saying people have lost faith in the state police.

AIADMK chief and Leader of Opposition, Edappadi K Palaniswami, slammed Stalin over the incident and said "people and us" don't believe the "drama" enacted by the CM on the matter.

Referring to reports, Palaniswami claimed that the post-mortem on the victim revealed a number of injuries on his body and called it a "murder that happened due to police

In a social media post, he said, "Some media may believe in your drama, like holding a review meeting or transferring the case to the CB-CID. Whether the people or us-- we just don't believe in the drama.'

Actor and Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) leader Vijay sought the constitution of a Special Investigation Team to probe the matter. Meanwhile, addressing a press meet here, CM Stalin said action has been taken in connection with the death of the security guard. Lawyer-activist Henry Tiphagne said in Madurai that a "special team" operating under the Manamadurai DSP was involved in the incident. In the HC, the government side submitted that the official concerned has been placed under suspension. Ti-

M K Stalin Tuesday ordered transferring to the CBI, the probe into the custodial death. Bangalore, July 1: In the wake of recent cases of deaths due to heart attacks in Hassan, Karnataka, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah Tuesday said that "hasty approval and distribution" of the Covid vaccine to the public could also be a reason for these deaths.

He urged everyone to visit the nearest health center immediately for a check-up if they have symptoms such as chest pain or difficulty breathing, and not to ignore these signs.

The Chief Minister said that more than twenty people have died due to heart attacks in the past month alone in just one district of Hassan.

To identify the exact cause of these series of deaths and to find solutions, a committee of experts has been formed under the leadership of Dr Ravindranath, Director of Jayadeva Institute of Cardiovascular Sciences and Research, and they have been instructed to submit a study report within 10 days," he said, in According to him, orders

were given to the same committee back in February to conduct a thorough study on the reasons behind sudden deaths among young people in the state, and whether the COVID vaccines could have

In this regard, the process of examining and analysing heart patients is also underway. "We too value the lives of children, youth, and innocent people who have their entire lives ahead of them, and we share the concerns of their

families." he said. Siddaramaiah condemned the actions of BJP leaders, alleging that they are using such matters for their political gains. "It cannot be denied that the hasty approval and distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine to the public could also be a reason for these deaths, as several studies worldwide have recently indicated that COVID vaccines could be a cause for the increasing number of heart attacks. Before the BJP criticise us on this matter, they should ask their conscience, he added.

The chief minister said the state government is fully committed to finding the true cause behind these sudden series of deaths in Hassan district and across the state and to prevent ing them.

"With this goal, we have already implemented schemes like Hridaya Jyothi and Gruha Arogva to monitor public health. Based on the report from the expert committee under Dr Ravindranath's guidance, necessary actions will also be taken. As a government, we are making every possible effort to protect the health of the people," he said.

According to the health department, a directive has also been issued to form a district-level committee to verify the facts of each reported cases of heart attack death in the media. The committee headed by Dr Ravindranath has been instructed to investigate this matter in collaboration with Hassan Institute of Medical Sciences and to submit a report within 10 days.

"We've taken it seriously. If there are any factors beyond medical reasons, those will also be examined and verified A proper scientific analysis will be done once the report is ready. We have asked the committee to submit the report within 10 days, and based on that, we will take further deci sions," he told reporters here

Record: 14th judge refuses to hear defamation case

Nainital, July 1: In a unique record in the country, 14 judges have refused to hear a criminal defamation case filed by Indian Forest Service officer Sanjeev Chaturvedi against Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) judge Manish Garg.

Chaturvedi enjoys the reputation of a whistleblower officer who uncovered the Haryana forestry case and blew the lid off various scams in the health sector during his stint as the chief vigilance officer, AIIMS, New Delhi.

In the latest instance, additional chief judicial magistrate Neha Kushwaha recused herself from hearing Chaturvedi's case in which he accused Garg of using foul language against him during open court proceedings in

With Kushwaha, the tally of judges who have recused from cases in which Chaturvedi was a party stands at 14.

So far, two judges of the Supreme Court, two judges of the Nainital High Court, CAT chairperson, a judge of a subordinate court in Shimla and seven CAT judges of Delhi and Allahabad bench have recused themselves from Chaturvedi's

According to Chaturvedi, this is a unique record in the country in which 14 judges recused themselves from hearing a person's case.

The devastating fire gutted the unit and left many injured, police said. Smoke that billowed from the factory as the firecrackers burst, could be seen from a distance. Police and fire and rescue services personnel who reached the spot rushed the injured to the hospital. The fire was later brought under control, a fire and rescue services official said. Revenue officials who arrived at the private firecracker manufacturing unit in Chinnakaman patti near Siyakasi and police are inquiring into the incident. The CM announced a relief of ₹1 lakh each to those who were seriously injured and undergoing treatment in the hospital, besides ₹50,000 to those who sustained simple injuries and were admitted to the hospital, an official release said.

₹1.07L-cr ELI scheme to create 3.5 cr jobs in 2 yrs

New Delhi, July 1: The central government Tuesday approved an Employment Linked Incentive scheme with an outlay of Rs 1.07 lakh crore to create 3.5 crore jobs over the next two years through social security schemes run by the retirement fund body EPFO.

The ELI scheme to support job generation, enhance employability and social security across all sectors, with special focus on the manufacturing sector, was approved by the Union Cabinet in a meeting, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Information & Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said

The scheme aims to incentivise the creation of more than 3.5 crore jobs in the country over two years, an official statement said.

The scheme will provide incentives to employees as well as employers to boost job creation.

Under the scheme, while the first-time employees will get one month's wage (up to Rs 15.000), the employers will be given incentives for a period of two years for generating additional employment, with extended benefits for another two years for the manufacturing sector.

The ELI scheme was announced in the Union Budget 2024-25 as part of the package of five schemes to facilitate employment, skilling and other opportunities for 4.1 crore youth with a total budget outlay of Rs 2 lakh crore. The ELI scheme aims to

incentivise the creation of more than 3.5 crore jobs in the country over a period of 2 years, it stated. Out of these, 1.92 crore beneficiaries will be first timers, entering the workforce. The benefits of the scheme would be applicable to jobs created between August 1, 2025, and July 31, 2027. The plan consists of two parts, with Part



Cabinet clears 11-crore plan to boost pvt R&D investment

NEW DELHI: The Union Cabinet Tuesday approved the Research Development and Innovation Scheme with a corpus of Rs one lakh crore to spur private sector investment in research. The scheme, approved by the Cabinet at a meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. aims to encourage the private sector to scale up research, development and innovation in sunrise domains and in other sectors relevant for economic security, strategic purpose, and self-reliance, "Today's Cabinet decision relating to Research Development and Innovation (RDI) Scheme will be a game changer in the world of research and innovation. This scheme, with a corpus of Rs. 1 lakh crore will have a major impact on emerging and sunrise sectors. It will also boost private sector participation in the world of R&D," Modi said in a post on X.

Targeting first-time employees registered with EPFO, this Part A will offer a one-month wage up to Rs 15,000 in two instalments.

Employees with salaries up to Rs 1 lakh will be eligible. The first instalment will be payable after 6 months of service, and the second instalment after 12 months of service and completion of a financial literacy programme by the employee.

Part B of the scheme will cover the generation of additional employment in all sectors, with a special focus on the manufacturing sector. The employers will get incentives with respect to employees with salaries up to Rs 1 lakh.

The government will incentivise employers, up to Rs 3,000 per month, for two years, for each additional employee with

least six months. For the manufacturing sector, incentives will be extended to the 3rd and 4th years as well.

Establishments, which are registered with EPFO, will be required to hire at least two additional employees (for employers with less than 50 employees) or five additional employees (for employers with 50 or more employees) on a sustained basis for at least six months.

The benefit to the employer (per additional employment per month) will be up to Rs 1,000 for employees with a monthly wage of Rs 10,000, while this will be Rs 2,000 for employees with wages of more than Rs 10,000 and up to Rs 20,000.

Employees with wages up to Rs 10,000 will get a proportional incentive. The benefit will be Rs 3.000 per month to the employers for employees with a wage of more than Rs 20,000 (up to a salary of Rs 1 lakh/month).

Delhi HC asks panel to examine afresh convict's plea for early release

New Delhi, July 1: The Delhi High Court Tuesday set aside the decision refusing the premature release of the convict serving life term for the rape and murder of law student Priyadarshini Mattoo in 1996.

Justice Sanjeev Narula outlined "an element of reforma tion" in Santosh Kumar Singh and referred the matter to the sentence review board (SRB) to consider afresh his plea for premature release.

"I have found some elements of reformation in him. The SRB decision is set aside and I have referred back the matter to SRB to consider it afresh," the judge

The court also framed certain guidelines to be followed by SRB while considering prisoners' pleas. It found the current framework of SRB not contemplating a formal psychological evaluation of a convict by a competent medical professional. In such a situation, it is difficult for the SRB to take an informed assessment as to whether a convict has lost the propensity to commit the crime, the court said. It fur ther said the SRB must conduct psychological assessment of the convicts while considering their pleas which was not done in the present case.

The court also set out various timelines to be adhered to by the board. A detailed judgment is awaited. Singh, in his 2023 petition, sought quashing of the recommendation of the SRB rejecting his premature release in the meeting held October 21, 2021. His counsel said the convict had already spent 25 years in incarceration, including remission

Hyderabad, July 1: The toll in the explosion at the Sigachi Industries' pharma plant in Sangareddy District of Telangana rose to 36 and the state government will engage with the management of the firm to ensure that a compensation of Rs 1 crore is paid to the kin of those who died in the horrific accident. Chief Minister A Reavnth reddy said Tuesday.

A senior police official said 34 people who were injured in the blast are undergoing treatment in various hospitals. The toll has risen from 15 last night after more bodies were found during the removal of debris, officials said. The fatal accident Monday is suspected to have been caused by a chemical reaction. The Chief Minister, who visited the site, also said those who are

seriously injured will receive Rs 10 lakh, while those who are injured but can resume work after some recovery will be provided Rs 5 lakh. "Thirty-six people have lost their lives. Some are still missing. Officials are in the process of collecting information," the CM said, adding that stringent action will be taken against those responsible for the incident. "The state government will talk to the company management to ensure that each Rs 1 crore compensation is paid to the deceased families. I have issued orders that from both the government side and company side Rs 1 Crore compensation will be paid." Reddy said.

He said the state government will pay Rs 1 lakh each to the family of the deceased and Rs 50,000 to the injured to meet any immediate and emergency expenses.

Shimla, July 1: Cloudbursts and flash floods triggered by heavy overnight rains battered Himachal Pradesh's Mandi district, leaving five people dead, five injured and 16 missing, of-

ficials said Tuesday. The state witnessed 11 cloudburst incidents, four flash floods and a major landslide on Tuesday, most of them in Mandi district, disrupting normal life. Mandi received extensively high rainfall of 253.8 mm since Monday evening.

Two teams each of National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) along with police and home guards are engaged in search and rescue operations in the district. The water was released after the water level of Pandoh Dam reached 2,922 feet against the danger mark of 2,941 feet. The Chandigarh-Manali four-lane road is currently blocked at multiple locations, including nine miles, Dwada, Jhalogi, and Banala while the route via Kamand-Kataula-Bajaura is open for Light Motor Vehicles (LMVs) only. Commuters are facing inconvenience due to traffic issues at several places.

IAF airstrip used in 3 wars illegally sold in 1997

Ferozepur, July 1: An airstrip used by the Indian Air Force during the 1962, 1965 and 1971 wars as an advanced landing ground at a village here close to the Pakistan border was allegedly sold by a woman and her son in collusion with some revenue officials in 1997.

But after a retired revenue official filed a complaint that led to an inquiry, the land was given back to the defence ministry, officials said. On June 28, police registered a case against Usha Ansal and her son Naveen Chand Ansal, both residents of Dumni Wala village, under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code including 420 (cheating), 465 (forgery) and 120-B (criminal conspiracy) at



Kulgarhi police station.

This piece of land was part of 982 acres of land earlier acquired by the British government in 1939 for the use of the Royal Air Force during World War II. Even the IAF used this air strip during 1962, 1965 and 1971 wars for emergency landings and defence purposes. Deputy Superintendent of

Police Karan Sharma said that based on the complaint submitted to the Chief Director Vigi-

lance Bureau by Nishan Singh, a retired revenue official, an inquiry was conducted and after the report was submitted, the FIR was registered against the accused. According to the inquiry

report, the accused allegedly sold the air force land to private persons in collusion with some lower rung revenue officials. The matter was first raised by Nishan Singh.

After the matter regarding fraudulent sale of chunk of land (measuring 118 Kanal 16 Marla) situated at Fattuwala village came to fore, the Commandant of the Air Force Station Halwara through Station Headquarters Ferozepur April 16. 2021 wrote to the then deputy commissioner Ferozepur to conduct an inquiry into this matter. Nishan Singh also filed a petition over inordinate delay in the inquiry, after which the Punjab and Harvana High Court directed the Ferozepur DC December 21, 2023 to complete it in six months. Later, the DC Ferozepur sub-

mitted a three-page report which stated that the land was in the same condition as per the revenue record of 1958-59 and its possession was still with the IAF. However, not satisfied with

the report, Nishan Singh, filed another petition in the high court alleging that several facts had been concealed in the report submitted to the state government, further accusing that the mutation of this land was executed in favour of private persons in 2001 in connivance with the revenue officials.

Prophet cartoon: 3 more held in Turkey

Istanbul: Turkish police detained three more employees of a satirical magazine Tuesday, raising the number of people taken into custody over a cartoon that allegedly depicted the Prophet Muhammad to four. The cartoon, published in LeMan magazine, drew a string of condemnation from government officials who stated it represented the Prophet Muhammad and sparked an angry protest outside the magazine's Istanbul office. LeMan, in a statement late Monday, denied the allegations and insisted the drawing was intended to portray a Muslim man named Muhammad and was meant to highlight the suffering of Muslims. The pro-government Yeni Safak newspaper said the cartoon showed "two figures alleged to be Prophet Muhammad and Prophet Moses — with wings and halos - shaking hands in the sky, while a war scene unfolds below with bombs raining down," The independent Birgun newspaper also said the winged figures hovering in the sky were interpreted by some as Prophets Muhammad and Moses. A government official said two terrorists were killed when security forces resisted the attempt of around a dozen militants to take control of a town in Mastung district in the restive province. No group immediately claimed responsibility for the attack. **Deputy Commissioner** Mastung Athar Abbas Raja said that the militants attacked government offices and the bank around 11:00 AM and there was panic after multiple gunshots and explosions in the area. "But the security forces, including police and Frontier Constabulary, responded swiftly to the situation and the affected areas were placed under lockdown," he said. He said two terrorists were killed while one 16-year-old boy also lost his life in exchange of firing. "Around eight people were injured during the firing by the terrorists," he said, adding that they have been taken to hospital for treatment and the situation is under control now.

Court suspends Thai PM

Bangkok, July 1: Thailand's Constitutional Court suspended Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra Tuesday, pending an ethics investigation over ential to a senior Cambodian leader when the two discussed a recent border dispute in a phone call that was leaked. Paetongtarn has faced grow-

ing dissatisfaction over her handling of the dispute, which involved an armed confrontation May 28 in which one Cambodian soldier was killed. In a call with Cambodian Senate President Hun Sen, she attempted to defuse tensions — but instead set off a string of complaints and public protests by critics who accused her of being too fawning.

Paetongtarn's suspension raises the possibility of renewed instability in Thailand, a still fragile democracy that has suffered several similar bouts of uncertainty. At the root of much of that were concerns from the conservative establishment, including the military, that the political dynasty started by Paetongtarn's father, the popular but divisive former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, was growing too powerful.

She is the third member of her family to hold the prime minister's office — and the third to face the possibility



ended. Thaksin was removed from office in a 2006 coup and driven into exile, while his sister and former Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawtra was removed by a court order in 2014, followed shortly after by a coup.

The suspension also comes at a time when the country is facing an economic slowdown and growing discontent with Paetongtarn and her Pheu Thai party, in general, with critics saying her government's performance has been

Senate passes Trump's tax-cut, spending bill

Washington, July 1: Senate Republicans hauled President Donald Trump's big tax breaks and spending cuts bill to passage Tuesday on the narrowest of votes, pushing past opposition from Democrats and their own GOP ranks after a turbulent overnight session.

Vice President JD Vance broke a 50-50 tie to push it over the top. The three Republicans opposing the bill were Sens Thom Tillis of North Carolina, Susan Collins of Maine and Sen Rand Paul of Kentucky.

The outcome capped an unusually tense weekend of work at the Capitol, the president's signature legislative priority teetering on the edge of approval, or collapse.

The difficulty it took for Republicans, who have the majority hold in Congress, to wrestle the bill to this point is not expected to let up. The package now goes back to the House, where Speaker Mike Johnson had warned senators not to deviate too far from what his chamber had already approved. But the Senate did make changes, particularly to Medicaid, risking more problems as they race to finish by Trump's Fourth of July deadline.

The outcome is a pivotal moment for president and his party, which have been consumed by the 940-page "One Big Beautiful Bill Act," as it's formally titled, and invested their political capital in delivering on the GOP's sweep of



power in Washington. Trump acknowledged it's "very compli cated stuff," as he departed the White House for Florida. "I don't want to go too crazy

with cuts," he said. "I don't like cuts." What started as a routine but laborious day of amend ment voting, in a process called vote-a-rama, spiralled into a round-the-clock slog as Repub lican leaders were buying time to shore up support.

The droning roll calls in the chamber belied the frenzied action to steady the bill. Grimfaced scenes played out on and off the Senate floor, amid exhaustion. Senate Majority Leader John Thune of South Da kota was desperately reaching for last-minute agreements be tween those in his party worried the bill's reductions to Medicaid will leave millions without care and his most conservative flank which wants even steeper cuts to hold down deficits ballooning with the tax cuts. The GOP lead ers have no room to spare, with narrow majorities. Thune can lose no more than three Republican senators, and already two Tillis, who warned that mil

lions of people will lose access to Medicaid health care, and Paul, who opposes raising the debt limit by \$5 trillion — had indicated opposition.

Zohran Mamdani wins NYC's Democratic mayoral primary

New York, July 1: Indian-origin politician Zohran Mamdani has won New York City's Democratic mayoral primary, a new vote count confirmed Tuesday, cementing his stunning upset of former Gov Andrew Cuomo and sending him to the general election.

The Associated Press called the race after the results of the city's ranked choice voting tabulation were released.

Mamdani's win had been widely expected since he took a commanding lead after the polls closed a week ago, falling just short of the 50% of the vote needed to avoid another count under the city's ranked choice voting model.

The system allows voters' other preferences to be counted if their top candidate falls

out of the running. Mamdani, who declared victory the night of the June 24 primary, will face a general election field that includes incumbent Mayor Eric Adams as well as independent candidate Jim Walden and Republican Curtis Sliwa.

Cuomo conceded defeat on the night of the June 24 primary but is contemplating whether to run in the general election on an independent ballot line.

Mamdani, a 33-year-old democratic socialist and member of the state Assembly, was virtually unknown when he launched his candidacy centered on a bold slate of populist ideas.


But he built an energetic campaign that ran circles around Cuomo as the older, more moderate Democrat tried to come back from the sexual harassment scandal that led to his resignation four years ago.

Europe swelters under punishing heat wave ASSOCIATED PRESS

Paris, July 1: France and the rest of Europe were still in the grips of the first major heat wave this summer with health warnings in effect Tuesday, even as conditions began to improve in some parts of the region

Punishing temperatures were forecast to reach 40 degrees Celsius (104 degrees Fahrenheit) in Paris and to stay unusually high in Belgium and the Netherlands. In contrast, temperatures were falling in Portugal, where no red heat warnings were issued.

In France, the national weather agency Meteo-France placed several departments under the highest red alert, with the Paris region particularly hard hit. The heat wave defined as consecutive days of very high temperature — is expected to intensify Tuesday and more than 1,300 schools



Farther south, 17 of Italy's 27 major cities were experiencing a heat wave, according to the Health Ministry.

Meteo-France also warned of the heightened risk of wildfires

due to the drought-stricken soil, compounded by a lack of rain in June and the recent surge in temperature.

Climate experts warn that future summers are likely to be hotter than any recorded to date. By 2100, France could be up to 4 C (39 F) warmer, with temperatures exceeding 40 C expected every year and extreme heat spikes potentially reaching 50 C (122 F). According to Meteo-France,

the country may face a tenfold increase in the number of heat wave days by 2100.

In Portugal, Lisbon was forecast to reach 33 C (91 F), typical for this time of the year, though some inland areas could still see peaks of 43 C (109 F), according to the national weath er agency. June temperature records were broken in two lo cations in Portugal on June 29.

Barcelona recorded its hot test month of June since re cords started over a century ago, Spain's national weather

service said Tuesday. The Fabra Observatory, located on a hill overlooking Barcelona, reported an aver age temperature of 26 degrees Celsius, breaking records since 1914. The previous hottest average for June was 25.6 C in 2003.

The same weather station said that a single-day high of 37.9 Celsius for June was re corded Monday, June 30.

Ancient Himalayan village relocates as climate shifts reshape life

Samjung (Nepal), July 1: The Himalayan village of Samjung did not die in a day.

Perched in a wind-carved valley in Nepal's Upper Mustang, more than 13,000 feet (3,962 meters) above sea level, the Buddhist village lived by slow, deliberate rhythms — herding yaks and sheep and harvesting barley under sheer ochre cliffs honeycombed with "sky caves" - 2.000-year-old chambers used for ancestral burials, meditation and shelter.

Then the water dried up. Snow-capped mountains turned brown and barren as, year after vear, snowfall declined. Springs and canals vanished and when it did rain, the water came all at once, flooding fields and melting away the mud homes. Families left one by one, leaving the skeletal remains of a community transformed by climate change: crumbling mud homes, cracked terraces and unkempt

The Hindu Kush and Himalavan mountain regions stretching from Afghanistan to Myanmar — hold more ice than anywhere else outside the Arctic and Antarctic. Their glaciers feed major rivers that support 240 million people in the mountains — and 1.65 billion

more downstream.

Such high-altitude areas are warming faster than lowlands. Glaciers are retreating and permafrost areas are thawing as snowfall becomes scarcer and more erratic, according to the Kathmandu-based International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development or ICMOD.

Kunga Gurung is among many in the high Himalayas already living through the irreversible effects of climate change. "We moved because there was no water. We need water to drink and to farm. But there is none there. Three streams, and all three dried up," said Gurung, 54.

Climate change is quietly reshaping where people can live and work by disrupting farming, water access, and weather patterns, said Neil Adger, a professor of human geography at the University of Exeter. In places like Mustang, that's making life harder, even if people don't always say climate change is why they moved. "On the everyday basis, the changing weather patterns ... it's actually affecting the ability of people to live in particular places," Adger said. Around the globe, extreme

weather due to climate change is forcing communities to move, whether it's powerful tropical storms in The Philippines and Honduras, drought in Somalia or forest fires in California. In the world's highest

mountains, Samjung isn't the only community to have to start over, said Amina Maharjan, a migration specialist at ICMOD. Some villages move only short distances, but inevitably the key driver is lack of water. "The water scarcity is getting

chronic," she said. Retreating glaciers — rivers of ice shrinking back as the world warms — are the most tangible and direct evidence of climate change. Up to 80% of the glacier volume in the Hindu Kush and Himalayas could vanish in this century if greenhouse gas emissions aren't drastically cut, a 2023 report warned.

It hasn't snowed in Upper Mustang for nearly three years, a dire blow for those living and farming in high-altitude villages. Snowfall traditionally sets the seasonal calendar, determining when crops of barley, buckwheat, and potatoes are planted and affecting the health of grazing livestock. "It is critically important," Maharjan said.

For Samjung, the drought and mounting losses began around the turn of the centurv. Traditional mud homes built for a dry, cold mountain climate fell apart as monsoon rains grew more intense - a shift scientists link to climate change. The region's steep slopes and narrow valleys funnel water into flash floods that destroyed homes and farmland,

triggering a wave of migration that began a decade ago.

Moving a village — even one with fewer than 100 residents like Samjung — was no simple endeavour. They needed reliable access to water and nearby communities for support during disasters. Relocating closer to winding mountain roads would allow villagers to market their crops and benefit from growing tourism. Eventually, the king of Mustang, who still owns large tracts of land in the area near ly two decades after Nepal abol ished its monarchy, provided suitable land for a new village.

Pemba Gurung, 18, and her sister Toshi Lama Gurung, 22 don't remember much about the move from their old village But they remember how hard it was to start over. Families spent years gathering materials to build new mud homes with bright tin roofs on the banks of the glacial Kali Gandaki river nearly 15 kilometers (9 miles) away. They constructed shelters for livestock and canals to bring water to their homes. Only then could they move.

Some villagers still herd sheep and yak, but life is a bit different in New Samjung, which is close to Lo Manthang a medieval walled city cut off from the world until 1992 when foreigners were first allowed to visit.

Power consumption dips by 1.5%

New Delhi: Power consumption in the country dipped slightly by 1.5 per cent to 150.04 billion units (BU) in June, compared to the year-ago period, mainly due to reduced usage of cooling appliances amid early onset of monsoon. Power consumption was recorded at 152.37 BU in June, 2024, according to official data. Experts believe the early arrival of monsoon affected the power consumption as well as demand in June. The highest supply in a day (peak power demand met) in June also dipped to about 242.49 GW last month, from around 244.52 GW in June 2024. The peak power demand was about 231 GW. It had touched an all-time high of about 250 GW in May 2024. The previous all-time high peak power demand of 243.27 GW was

New Delhi: Competition Commission has penalised the Federation of Publishers and Booksellers' Association in India (FPBAI) and its three office-bearers for unfair business practices. New Delhi, July 1: The price of jet fuel (ATF) was sharply increased by 7.5 per cent Tuesday, while the cost of LPG used in commercial establishments was reduced by Rs 58.50 per cylinder, reflecting shifts in international benchmark rates

After three rounds of price cuts, aviation turbine fuel (ATF) price was increased by Rs 6,271.5 per kilolitre, or 7.5 per cent, to Rs 89,344.05 per kl in the national capital - home to one of the busiest airports in the country, according to stateowned fuel retailers.

The increase amounts to half of the total reduction implemented over three monthly installments since April.

ATF price was last reduced by Rs 2,414.25 per kl (2.82 per cent) to Rs 83,072.55 per kl June Prior to that, rates were cut by 4.4 per cent (Rs 3,954.38 per kl) May 1 and a steep reduction of 6.15 per cent (Rs 5,870.54 per kl) April 1.

The increase in ATF price is in line with the spurt in international oil rates that fol-



lowed Israel's attack on Iran last month.

This increase will add to the burden on commercial airlines. for whom fuel makes up for almost 40 per cent of the operating cost.

No immediate comments could be obtained from the airlines on the impact of price hike.

The ATF price in Mumbai was hiked to Rs 83,549.23 per kl from Rs 77,602.73 per kl, while those in Chennai and Kolkata were increased to Rs 92,526.09 and Rs 92,705.74 per kl, respec-

DoT launches Saral Sanchar portal

New Delhi, July 1: The telecom department has started the process to reassess fresh spectrum demand for captive non-public networks, also known as 5G private networks, according to an official memo-

This is the second such exercise by the Department of Telecom after issuing a provision for 5G private networks in June 2022. "The Department has decid-

ed to assess a fresh demand for spectrum in various prospective frequency bands and carry out a demand survey, through the Saral Sanchar portal to identify the prospective frequency bands for the direct assignment of spectrum for CNPN (captive non-public network) based services," the memorandum dated June 30 said. CNPN providers can set up

a network by leasing out spectrum allocated to telecom operators or even by directly taking it from the DoT. Telecom operators have opposed the direct allocation of spectrum to enterprises or entities that want to set up 5G private networks. The DoT said that certain

frequency bands were initially

proposed for direct assignment of spectrum to CNPN licensees. However, it was observed that there was a lack of a device ecosystem in the frequency band identified for them. The Telecom Regulatory

Authority of India had recommended spectrum in the frequency range of 3700-3800 MHz, 4800-4990 MHz and 28.5-29.5 MHz for CNPN.

The department said it has observed during a recent anal ysis that the device ecosystem for CNPN is mostly available in IMT bands, and 5G technology has also considerably advanced with different use cases.

The memorandum said system integrators are keenly interested in establishing CN-PN-based networks. The DoT has invited com-

ments from enterprises that have a net worth of more than Rs 100 crore and are willing to set up CNPN by obtaining spectrum directly from the de partment, and system integra tors interested in establishing CNPN networks for enterprises by July 31. Tidal Wave Tech nologies CEO Ankit Dixit said enterprise and industrial adoption of private 5G networks re mains at a nascent stage, with active deployments to date re maining in low single digits.

"This slower pace can be at tributed to factors, such as the high cost of spectrum, slow re sponsiveness to enterprise-spe cific needs, and expectations of free trials or proof-of-concepts, Dixit said.

Financial services MFs Mfg sector growth hits 14-month high see 37% surge in AUM

New Delhi, July1: Investment in banking and financial services sector-based mutual funds jumped 37 per cent year-on-year to Rs 48.000 crore in May 2025.

The surge in assets is backed by the strong performance of the segment. Industry data showed that these funds have delivered returns ranging from 22 to 30 per cent over the past year, highlighting the sector's robust fundamentals and growing appeal.

According to the industry data, there are currently 22 banking and financial services mutual funds in the Indian market. managing combined assets under management (AUM) of Rs 48,000 crore in May 2025 against about Rs 34,971 crore in May 2024.

The sharp rise suggests growing investor confidence in the long-term potential of the BFSI (Banking, Financial Services, and Insurance) sector.

The BFSI sector, which holds the distinction of being the largest by market capitalisation in India's listed space, has remained resilient amid recent market volatility. BSE financial services index has gained nearly 14 per cent in the first three months of the current financial year alone, while BSE Bankex rose 10 per cent during the period under review.

Moreover, the BFSI space is likely to expand further with unlisted players in insurance, fintech, wealth management, and digital lending expected to access public markets. This trend will further broaden the investment landscape within the sector and encourage wider market participation.

The new fund offer (NFO) is open until July 11 and aims to provide investors with an opportunity to participate in the sector's growth story through a portfolio aligned with current market dynamics.

New Delhi, July1: India's manufacturing sector growth rose to a 14-month high of 58.4 in June marked by improved trends in output and new orders, alongside a record upturn in employment, a monthly survev said Tuesday.

The seasonally adjusted HS BC India Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index - an indicator of sector performance was 57.6 in May.

In the Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) parlance, a print above 50 means expansion. while a score below 50 denotes

"India's manufacturing PMI reached a 14-month high of 58.4 in June. Robust end-demand fuelled expansions in output, new orders, and job creation," said Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC.

June also saw a quicker upturn in new order inflows. The rate of expansion was the strongest in close to a year. According to panel members, the increase was supported by mar-



keting efforts and a substantial rise in exports. Indeed, growth of new export orders gained considerable momentum in June.

"To keep up with strong demand -- particularly from international markets, as evidenced by the substantial rise in new export orders -- Indian manufacturing firms had to tap deeper into their inventories. causing the stock of finished goods to continue shrinking," Bhandari said.

Companies also welcomed one of the fastest increases in external orders in the over 20 years of survey history. Goods producers lifted input buying to the greatest extent in 14 months, which supported a further expansion in stocks of purchases 'Finally, input prices moderated while average selling prices rose as some manufacturers passed on additional cost bur-

Robust sales boosted hiring among manufacturers, the survey said, adding that employment rose at a record pace, with anellists mostly pointing to short-term recruitment.

On the price front, cost infla-

Iron ore output rises

New Delhi, July 1: Country's iron ore production rose marginally by 0.6 per cent to 53 million metric tonnes (MMT) ir the April-May period of the on going fiscal. As per provisional data, production of iron ore was 52.7 MMT in the same period of the previous fiscal.

India is the second largest aluminium producer, among top ten producers in refined copper, and third largest iron ore producer in the world. Continued growth in production of iron ore in the current financial year reflects the robust demand conditions in the user industry viz. steel.


