Reuters' X unblocked

New Delhi, July 6: International news agency Reuters' X account was withheld in India for a few hours but restored later Sunday after the government intervened to say it had not sought the blocking of the handle.

Reuters' X account was blocked from being accessed in India overnight, leading to speculations.

The government asked the Elon Musk-owned platform for an explanation and said that it had not sought such a move. X restored access to the account shortly after.

The Reuters account remain blocked for nearly 24 hours, from Saturday evening to Sunday evening. The notice displayed on X till Sunday evening showed that Reuters' X account had been withheld in India 'in response to a legal demand'.

However, a government spokesperson said no legal requirement was made to withhold the account. Earlier in the day, sources said a demand for blocking the account alongside several hundreds of other accounts was made during Operation Sindoor in May. While many of them were blocked, the Reuters handle wasn't.

X seems to have now acted on that request and blocked Reuters' handle in India. And since the issue isn't relevant now, the government has asked X to explain the blocking and lift the embargo, they said.

2 women dead, child hurt in Nuapada wall collapse

Nuapada, July 6: Two women died and a minor girl was injured Sunday when a wall of an under-construction poultry farm collapsed in Patparpali village under Silbha panchayat in Lakhna police limits of Nuapada district following incessant rains.

The deceased were identified as Rupe Sabar, 70, and her granddaughter-in-law Balamati Sabar, 28. The injured child, Siddhi Sabar, 5, is the daughter of Balamati.


According to reports, Dibakar Sabar, wife of Balamati, was constructing a poultry shed with Rs 1.8 lakh financial assistance under an animal husbandry scheme under the Komna veterinary hospital for rearing 500 broiler chickens. The construction had reached up to the roof level, and plastering work was underway when the disaster struck.

Around 11 am Sunday, Balamati, Rupe and Siddhi were collecting fallen bricks around the structure when a section of the wall suddenly collapsed. While Balamati and Rupe died on the spot, Siddhi sustained moderate injuries and was discharged after treatment at Nuapada District Headquarters Hospital.

The district administration provided Rs 10,000 from the Red Cross fund for funeral expenses.

Dalai Lama rings in 90th birthday

Dharamshala, July 6: Thousands gathered in the main courtyard of Tsuglagkhang, the Dalai Lama temple, Sunday to celebrate the 90th birthday of the 14th Dalai Lama, while greetings poured from across the world for the Tibetan spiritual leader.

Political leaders from India and abroad also shared the stage with the Dalai Lama, throwing their support behind the Buddhist leader, who has been living in exile in India and has been fighting for the rights of the Tibetan people since the region came under Chinese occupation in the 1960s.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who is abroad, extended warm wishes to the Dalai Lama, and said he has been an enduring symbol of love, compassion, patience and moral discipline.

Modi said on X, "I join 1.4 billion Indians in extending our warmest wishes to His Holiness the Dalai Lama on his 90th birthday. He has been an enduring symbol of love, compassion, patience and moral discipline."

He added, "His message has inspired respect and admiration across all faiths. We pray for his continued good health and long life." Union ministers Kiren Rijiju and Rajiv Ranjan Singh, Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister Pema Khandu, Sikkim minister Sonam Lama, and Hollywood actor Richard Gere addressed the gathering here.

Suna Besha: One dead, 70 hospitalised in Puri

Puri, July 6: One devotee died, and more than 70 others were injured and hospitalised in various incidents in Puri where lakhs of people gathered to witness the 'Suna Besha' (golden attire) ritual of the Rath Yatra festival Sunday, officials said.

The 52-year-old deceased, identified as Babaji Behera of Jagatsinghpur district, fell and suffered head injuries after he was disturbed by a monkey near the 'Singha Dwar' (Lion's Gate) of Srimandir.

Accompanied by his wife, Behera was witnessing the Suna Besha ritual from the premises of Radhaballav Mutt when the incident occurred, police said.

The devotee was first taken to the district headquarters hospital in Puri. After his con-



dition deteriorated, he was shifted to Capital Hospital in Bhubaneswar where doctors declared him brought dead.

About 70 other people were also injured in multiple mishaps in Puri and were admitted to the district headquarters hospital, doctors said. Around 40 of them have bone fractures. The condition of a woman, who suffered serious injuries, is stated to be critical.

A large number of people were also given first aid treatments at the outpatient department of the hospital and released, a senior doctor said. The incidents occurred a week after three devotees were killed and 50 others injured in a stampede outside the Gundicha temple in Puri.

Meanwhile, Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan said that around 15 lakh devotees witnessed the Lord's 'Suna Besha' smoothly abiding by the norms near the chariots. All arrangements are made keeping in view the safety and security of the devotees, he said.

One nation, one election: Former CJs flag 'issues'

The ambitious 'one nation, one election' bill proposed by the Union government that calls for holding synchronised Parliament and Assembly polls across the country, has raised fresh concerns. A string of former Chief Justices of India (CJIs) have flagged the 'sweeping powers' the bill seeks to offer to the Election Commission (EC). In fact, former CJs DY Chandrachud and Ranjan Gogoi have suggested in unison to lay down guidelines for the EC in exercising discretion to curtail or extend the tenure of a state Assembly beyond the constitutionally mandated five years using simultaneous elections as a pretext. However, as against the Opposition's criticisms, at least three ex-CJIs have not questioned the constitutionality of the concept of simultaneous polls

New Delhi, July 6: Former chief justices of India (CJIs), who have conveyed their views to a parliamentary committee on the bill proposing simultaneous polls, have endorsed the constitutionality of the 'one nation, one election' concept but have raised concerns over its various aspects, including the power given to the Election Commission

(EC), and offered suggestions.

Former CJI DY Chandrachud, in his opinion submitted to the Joint Committee of Parliament, has dismissed the Opposition's criticism that the synchronisation of Lok Sabha and state Assembly polls violates the Constitution's basic structure, saying the Constitution never mandated holding national and state elections separately.

However, he has joined another ex-CJI Ranjan Gogoi in questioning the 'sweeping powers' granted to the Election Commission in the proposed constitutional amendment law 'without laying down any guidelines for the exercise of the discretion', according to the opinion submitted to the parliamentary panel.

Chandrachud and another former CJI JS Kehar are scheduled to appear before the committee headed by BJP MP PP Chaudhary July 11 so that members can interact with them over the bill's provisions and seek their views on their queries.

Questioning the vast powers the bill seeks to bestow on the EC, Chandrachud said such 'unbounded authority' could enable the poll body to curtail or extend the tenure of a state Assembly beyond the constitu-

tionally mandated five years, under the pretext that simultaneous elections with the Lok Sabha are not feasible.

The Constitution must define, delineate and structure the circumstances under which the ECI may invoke this power, he added. Two former CJs, UU Lalit and Ranjan Gogoi, had appeared before the committee in February and March, respectively. During the interaction, Gogoi agreed with the concerns of some members over the excessive power given to the EC, sources have said.

Lalit had suggested that simultaneous polls should be rolled out in a staggered manner and not at one go, as he had said that cutting short the remaining terms of assemblies with substantive tenure left for the purpose of synchronising election cycles could be legally challenged.

However, all three ex-CJIs have not questioned the constitutionality of the concept of simultaneous polls.

Chandrachud said in his written opinion that simultaneous elections will not infringe upon the voters' right to elect their representatives and that the bill ensures that electors remain continuously represented by their duly elected MPs or MLAs.

Serial cabbie killer nabbed after 25 yrs on run

New Delhi, July 6: A 49-year-old man, who was on the run for around 25 years, has been arrested in Delhi in connection with a string of crimes where he allegedly hired taxis, killed the drivers, dumped their bodies in remote forested areas of Uttarakhand and sold the vehicles off across the Nepal border, a senior police officer said Sunday. The accused, Ajay Lamba

alias Banshi, was wanted in four brutal robbery-cum-murder cases across Delhi and Uttarakhand. He was declared a proclaimed offender in all the cases, including a 2001 murder case registered at the New Ashok Nagar police station here, police said.

Lamba was the alleged mastermind behind a string of heinous crimes committed between 1999 and 2001, in which he, along with associates, targeted taxi



drivers, killed them, looted their vehicles and dumped the bodies in remote forested areas of Uttarakhand to evade identification, the officer said.

"Born in 1976 and originally a resident of Delhi's Krishna Nagar, Ajay dropped out of school after Class 6 and became involved in crime at an early

age. He was previously declared a 'Bad Character' by the Vikas Puri police under the alias 'Banshi'. In 1996, he changed his name to Ajay Lamba and shifted base to Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh, where he teamed up with accomplices Dharendra and Dilip Negi," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime)

Aditya Gautam said.

Together, they operated a violent criminal enterprise in which taxis were hired, the drivers killed, the vehicles looted and resold across the Nepal border, he added.

Police said Lamba was never arrested in the four robbery-cum-murder cases lodged against him in Delhi, Haldwani, Almora and Champawat. He was declared a proclaimed offender in all cases and also faced earlier charges, including theft and arms possession, dating back to the 1990s.

Lamba managed to remain undetected for more than two decades by frequently changing locations and identities.

From 2008 to 2018, he lived in Nepal with his family and later, moved to Dehradun. In 2020, he became involved in narcotics smuggling, allegedly working in the ganja-supply network from Odisha to Delhi and other parts of India, the DCP added.

He was arrested in a case under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act by the Sagarpur police in 2021 and again in connection with a jewellery-shop dacoity in Odisha's Berhampur in 2024. He was out on bail in both cases and never disclosed his fugitive status to anyone, police said, adding that they apprehended Lamba from Delhi in a coordinated operation.

Kareena calls out Prada



Kareena's post comes just days after Prada stirred up controversy for showcasing footwear that closely resembled traditional Kolhapuri chappals without crediting their Indian origins.

For the unversed, Prada recently introduced a pair of footwear called 'Toe Ring Sandals,' which closely resemble India's traditional Kolhapuri chappals. These sandals were showcased at the Prada Men's Spring/Summer 2026 fashion show in Milan June 22. However, the design was presented under the European brand's label without any clear credit to its Indian roots.

In response, a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) has been filed in the Bombay High Court, demanding compensation for Kolhapuri chappal artisans, whose work the plea claims has been copied without acknowledgment.







LAKHS WITNESS SUNA BESHA

Puri, July 6: Around 15 lakh devotees Sunday witnessed Suna Besha (golden attire) ritual of Lord Jagannath and His siblings Lord Balabhadra and Devi Subhadra on chariots parked in front of the 12th-century shrine here amid unprecedented security arrangements. The servitors decorated the idols with golden attire. The ritual started at 4:45pm, much ahead of the scheduled time of 6:30pm, an official said. Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan said that around 15 lakh devotees are witnessing the Lord's Suna Besha smoothly abiding by the norms near the chariots. All arrangements are made keeping in view the

safety and security of the devotees, he said. In Suna Besha ritual, the deities are decorated with various types of gold ornaments like gold diadems, locally called 'Kiriti', hands and feet made of gold. While Lord Jagannath holds a gold Chakra (disc) in his right hand and a silver conch in his left hand, elder brother Lord Balabhadra wields a golden plough in his left hand, a gold mace in his right hand. Goddess Subhadra also wears different ornaments, the official said. The ritual, which is also called 'Bada Tadhau Besha' in temple terminology, continues in the 12th-century shrine since 1460 since King Kapilendra Deb's regime. He donated

cart loads of gold ornaments to the temple after winning some battles in south India, said Shree Jagannath culture researcher Bhaskar Mishra. As Lord Jagannath's Ratna Bhandar was being repaired by the ASI now, the gold ornaments are currently stored in the temporary strong room after valuables were shifted from the outer chamber of the sacred treasury. Escorted by armed policemen and temple officials, 'Bhandara Mekap' servitor (store in-charge) bring the gold jewellery laced with invaluable stones and hand it over to Puspalaka and Dai-tapati servitors for decoration of the deities. Meanwhile, Odisha Police have deployed around 205 pla-

toons (1 platoon comprise 30 people) of state police personnel apart from 800 jawans of the central armed police force for crowd management and law and order. In view of the huge flow of devotees to Puri, DGP YB Khurania himself was monitoring the crowd management from the Integrated Crowd Control Centre (ICCC) and urged people to follow the advisory. "Like Rath Yatra and Bahuda Yatra, police are using drones and AI-powered cameras to control crowds and regulate traffic. Adequate parking lots have been created in and around Puri," Khurania said, adding that there was a "non-stop flow of devotees to Puri since Saturday night.



CM: Mukherjee a source of inspiration for every Indian

Bhubaneswar, July 6: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Sunday paid tributes to Shyama Prasad Mukherjee on his birth anniversary saying that the towering leader's life serves as an enduring example and a source of inspiration for every Indian. "India will always take pride in a great public figure like Dr Mukherjee," he said while attending the 125th state-level birth anniversary celebration of Mukherjee. It aims to raise public awareness and encourage community

participation in ecological conservation.

The launch event saw active participation from key stakeholders, including Parisad Secretary Gobinda Chandra Farak, educationist Chinmaya Vibek, environmentalist Soumya Ranjan Biswal, and palm conservationist Bijay Kumar Bhatt.

Local representatives such as Ward Member Satyabham Swain, SHG members, and youth volunteers also joined the initiative, which emphasised sustainable protection measures for the newly-planted saplings. The event was coordinated by Bikram Dutta Parida and Pradipta Kumar Nayak.

Building on last year's successful plantation of 5,000 seeds along the Dhanua River stream near the Nua Nai River Bank—where most saplings have now grown to a height of 12 to 18 inches—the organisation has set an ambitious five-year target to establish 25,000 palm trees across the region.

ECoR warns against stunt reels on tracks

Bhubaneswar, July 6: The East Coast Railway (ECoR) has cautioned the general public against dangerous and unlawful practice of making social media reels or stunt videos on railway tracks, which involves severe life and safety risk.

In a recent incident July 5, ECoR received a video clip from a reliable source showing a boy lying on the concrete sleepers of a railway track while a train passed over it. Acting swiftly, the Bolangir RPF inspector rushed to Purnapani Station and alerted the local Baunsuni

police station.

A joint inquiry by RPF and local police, along with the villagers, led to the identification of a 12 year old adolescent who had gone to the railway track June 29 and performed the life-threatening stunt while his friend, aged about 15 years, recorded the video.

The RPF team, accompanied by villagers and parents of the children, visited the incident spot located between Purnapani and Jharmunda Railway Stations. After necessary formalities, the children, along with their guardians, were taken to the RPF Post at Bolangir for



legal action. Accordingly, Case No C3C/439 has been registered against both minors under Sections 153, 145(b), and 147 of the Railways Act, 1989.

ECoR reiterates that such acts are not only illegal but can also result in fatal accidents. Railway tracks are no place for stunts or social media content creation. Trespassing on tracks for entertainment puts lives at extreme risk and disrupts railway operations.

“Your life is precious. Say no to 'Stunts On Tracks'. Stay safe, stay away from railway lines,” ECoR said.

motorcycle, while others face hurdles like financial constraints. But one father from Cuttack found a clever way to turn his son's wish into reality despite limited means.

Shiva Shankar Sahoo, a 50-year-old mechanist from Rajendra Nagar, grabbed attention with his inventive spirit. When his eight-year-old son insisted on a motorcycle to ride around the city together, Sahoo's limited budget and lack of riding skills stood in the way. Rather than giving up, he chose to create something extraordinary.

Using his mechanical expertise, Sahoo transformed his old bicycle into a motorcycle repli-

ca by fitting parts from a 'Hero Honda CD 100'—all except the engine, meaning his son still needs to pedal to move it. The project took about 1.5 months

and cost roughly ₹20,000. “My son always wanted a bike, but buying one was beyond my reach,” Sahoo shared. “So, I made this bike-like bicycle for him.”

Riding this one-of-a-kind creation around town often leaves people puzzled. Police have even stopped him, thinking he's a helmet-less motorcyclist—only to be surprised when they realise it's actually a bicycle. Meanwhile, his family and neighbours are filled with joy.

well-established eating approaches: one known for its heart-healthy foods and another designed to manage blood pressure. The Mind diet builds on these by including certain foods believed to specifically support brain health.

What makes the Mind diet stand out is its focus on nutrients that are particularly beneficial for brain function. These



include flavonoids and polyphenols found in colorful produce, folate from leafy greens and legumes, and Omega-3 fatty acids from oily fish and seeds.

Numerous studies have backed the effectiveness of this approach. In one, older adults who closely followed the Mind diet experienced slower cognitive decline over several years. Another study found that long-term followers had fewer signs of brain changes typically as-

sociated with Alzheimer's disease, with leafy greens standing out as a particularly important food group. A broader review of multiple studies also supported a link between this diet and better cognitive performance, with one study suggesting it could reduce Alzheimer's risk by more than half.

Even small dietary changes can make a real difference. Swapping ingredients, using healthy oils in dressings, choosing frozen or canned produce when fresh isn't available, or adding legumes to meals can all contribute to better brain function over time.

As understanding of the connection between food and cognitive health deepens, the Mind diet offers a simple, evidence-based way to help protect memory and mental sharpness through the years.

Nilagiri MLA files complaint against three BJD leaders

Nilagiri, July 6: Political tension has escalated in Nilagiri following a dispute between BJP MLA Santosh Kumar Khatua and senior BJD leader Lekhasri Samantsinghar. While several police stations across the state have received complaints from the BJD against Khatua demanding his arrest, the matter has taken a new turn with counter-allegations from the BJP side.

Two days ago, a BJD woman leader filed a complaint against Khatua at Nilagiri PS. In response, the BJP held a press conference Friday, describing the allegations made by Samantsinghar as baseless and fabricated.

Further intensifying the controversy, Zone 12 Zilla Parishad member Ranjita Singh lodged a complaint Saturday at Nilagiri PS against Samantsinghar and two other BJD leaders—Jyotiprakash Panigrahi and former MLA Sukanta Kumar Nayak.

Later that evening, Khatua filed a formal complaint alleging that the three BJD leaders had subjected him to mental harassment, conspired to sabotage his political career, and issued threats to kill him and his family.

According to sources, Nilagiri police have registered a case (252/25) in connection with the complaint.

Injured in suspected IED blast, elephant calf dies

Hirakud: First floodwater released

Sambalpur/Cuttack, July 6: The authorities of Hirakud dam in Sambalpur district Sunday released the season's first floodwater after sounding an alert to the districts in downstream of Mahanadi, officials said.

The season's first flood water was released after a traditional puja. The sluice gate number 7 was first opened as done every year, Chief Engineer SK Behera told reporters. He said that at least 20 such gates were opened by 6pm Sunday.

The chief engineer said the decision to release floodwater was taken to manage the rising water level in the reservoir following incessant rain and increased inflow from upstream areas of Chhattisgarh.

Though the authorities opened eight gates in the first phase by 12 noon, later it was decided to open more such gates to discharge flood water. While the inflow into the reservoir was about 2.50 lakh cusec,

Nandapur, July 6: Amid row over Andhra Pradesh's continued encroachment in remote Raipahad village under Golur panchayat in Nandapur block of Koraput district, the district administration and the state government have taken a proactive step towards the development of the village.

A pucca (paved) road will soon connect the village to the PMGSY road near Dumuriguda, officials said.

Funds worth ₹1.68 crore have been sanctioned from the District Mineral Foundation (DMF) fund for this road project. According to District Collector V Keerthi Vasan, the tender process has already been completed through the Sunabeda Rural Development Division, and construction will commence shortly.

The move comes amid growing dissatisfaction over Andhra Pradesh's continued encroachment in the area. Andhra Pradesh had allegedly been implementing various welfare



measures including housing under Central schemes, MGN-REGS employment, health services, education, electricity, and water to claim administrative control over Raipahad. Reports suggested that despite bilateral discussions between the two states, the Andhra government continued to implement its schemes discreetly in the village.

The silence of the Odisha government on this issue had sparked local resentment and was highlighted in media reports. Subsequently, the district administration in Koraput and state authorities have accelerated efforts to assert their presence and initiate development work in the village.

Kid drowns in pit


Jaleswar: A five-year-old boy tragically drowned after falling into a pit in the backyard of his house Sunday around 3pm. The deceased has been identified as Sagun Hansda, son of Basanta Hansda from Ghadaghada village under Raibania police limits of Jaleswar block in Balasore district. According to sources, the child was playing near his home when he accidentally fell into the pit and drowned. After a frantic search by family members, his body was found floating in the pit behind the house. He was immediately rescued and rushed to the Hatigarh Community Health Centre, where doctors declared him dead on arrival.

11 ill after eating toxic mushrooms

Rayagada/Tikiri: Eleven members from three families of Tikarapada village in Kashipur block of Rayagada district fell ill after consuming toxic wild mushrooms. All of them are currently undergoing treatment. Six of the affected are being treated at Osapada hospital. Five others including a minor from two neighbouring families were initially treated at Osapada. However, as their condition did not improve, they were shifted to Rayagada DHH around 11pm Saturday. Doctors have reported signs of improvement in their condition. According to sources, three women from the village had gone to the nearby forest Saturday morning and collected wild mushrooms. The mushrooms were later cooked and consumed by the families. By evening, all began experiencing symptoms such as vomiting and dizziness.

Man hacked to death by nephew

Nayagarh/Daspalla: A 70-year-old man was hacked to death by his nephew with an axe over suspected past enmity at Buguda Colony under Takara panchayat and Daspalla police limits in Nayagarh district Sunday morning. Preliminary inquiry indicated that the deceased identified as Kabir Pradhan was attacked and killed by his nephew Ashok Mallick. Chatters were abuzz that the murder is fallout of suspected witchcraft and sorcery. However, the police complaint mentions that the murder appears to have been motivated by past enmity. After the incident, local villagers overpowered Ashok and handed him over to police. A case (189/25) has been registered in Daspalla police station and an investigation is underway. Sources said Ashok, known in the locality for his erratic behavior and substance abuse, often created disturbances in the village. About two years ago, Kabir had reportedly objected to Ashok's unruly conduct while he was intoxicated. Police believe the old confrontation might have triggered Sunday's attack. Police recovered the bloodstained axe used in the murder and sent it for forensic examination.

Torrential rain plays havoc; roads, bridges washed away in Keonjhar

Keonjhar, July 6: Continuous rainfall over the last three days has caused widespread damage across various blocks in Keonjhar district.

Heavy downpour Saturday night led to the washing away of several roads and collapse of culverts and small bridges, severely impacting connectivity. Even in Keonjhar town, poor drainage led to water entering homes, leaving residents stranded and disrupting normal life.

In low-lying areas, rainwater entered houses, throwing normal life into disarray. Local administration officials have been visiting affected areas to assess the situation and are reportedly providing emergency assistance. The Dhaladihi Sahi village under Banspal block has been completely surrounded by floodwater. At least 30 families there remain cut off from the

outside world. Left with no option, distressed villagers appealed to the administration through video messages, urging immediate intervention. Responding to the call, BDO Raja Ranjit Bal and officials visited the area Sunday and took stock of the situation.

The panchayat authorities have distributed two months' worth of rations to families in the affected village. Dry food supplies are also being arranged for those still marooned. The BDO stated that discussions are underway with higher authorities for project approvals to ensure longer-term relief and connectivity solutions.

Besides Banspal, villagers in hilly and remote pockets of Telkoil, Harichandanpur, Joda, and Sadar blocks are also waterlogged and struggling to access basic services.

Rain has brought vehicular movement to a standstill across the district as several roads and

bridges remain submerged or damaged.

Traffic on the Phuljhar-Cheliabeda road was disrupted after rainwater from nearby forests and hills overflowed on the route. Similarly, the Banspal-Kadakala road has become impassable at multiple stretches due to stagnant rainwater.

Roads connecting Patunga-Palashpanga and Kasirapatana-Padmapur in Parjanpur panchayat under Sadar block have been cut off after water washed away parts of the road and nearby bridges. Moreover, the Kusumita-Shankari road was severely damaged and washed away, halting movement completely.

A major landslide at Baninda Ghat along the Raisuan-Phuljhar road has further blocked access, while flooding at Guhadihi station Saturday night caused the Vande Bharat Express to be delayed for nearly three hours.

Moreover, both ends of the bridge over the Aradei river connecting Palashpanga with Parjanpur railway station were washed away, leaving it highly vulnerable and unusable for vehicular traffic.

Locals have demanded immediate road repair and restoration of connectivity, as several villages remain cut off due to the deluge.

Diarrhoea: 10 infected, 2 critical in Digapahandi

Digapahandi, July 6: At least 10 persons have been hospitalised as a diarrhoea outbreak has been reported in Ustapalli village, a remote tribal pocket in Digapahandi block of Ganjam district.



The affected individuals were admitted to Digapahandi Community Health Centre (CHC) Sunday morning. Following initial treatment, two patients—Damayanti Sabar and Anita Sabar—were referred to the MKCG Medical College and Hospital in Berhampur as their condition deteriorated.

The region has witnessed

continuous rainfall over the past four days, and it is suspected that contaminated water has triggered the spread of diarrhoea. Upon receiving information about the outbreak, ASHA worker Sudeshna Sahu reached the village, raising awareness among residents and distributing essential supplies, including medicines, ORS packets, and halogen tablets. She also kept a close watch on the developing situation.

With the outbreak appearing to spread Sunday morning, affected villagers were carried about 2 km by slings to reach a point where ambulances could transport them to the health centre.

Later in the afternoon, a health team along with officials from the block's Rural Water Supply and Sanitation department visited the village, conducted a detailed inspection, and collected water samples for testing.

1,300 nurses appointed in Delhi govt hospitals

New Delhi, July 6: The Delhi government Sunday appointed over 1,300 new nursing officers and launched Ayushman Bharat registration vans to strengthen the healthcare system in the national capital.

The event was attended by BJP president J P Nadda, Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, Health Minister

Pankaj Singh, and other senior ministers.

Addressing the gathering, Chief Minister Gupta sharply criticised the previous government, alleging that

it had allowed the capital's health infrastructure to deteriorate significantly.

"In the past, Delhi's healthcare was in such a poor state that there were only 0.42 hospital beds available per 1,000 people," she said.

"In 38 hospitals, there were only six MRI machines and 12 CT scan machines. Patients were frequently turned away due to a shortage of medicines," she added.

Gupta further alleged widespread corruption under the



Mohalla Clinics initiative. "There was corruption in medicine procurement and hospital construction — 22 hospitals were announced but never completed," she claimed.

Speaking on the status of Arogya Mandirs, she stated that over 21,700 crore was provided by the central government to the previous administration over a five-year period for their

construction, but the funds remained unutilised.

"Now, it is my responsibility to ensure that all 1,150 Arogya Mandirs are completed in the remaining months," Gupta said.

She added that 34 Arogya Mandirs have already been inaugurated, with several more to follow this month. "We plan to add 100 Arogya Mandirs every

month and aim to complete all 1,150 by March next year," she said.

Delhi Health Minister Pankaj Singh, addressing the newly appointed staff, said their contribution would be crucial in strengthening the city's healthcare system.

"These nurses and health workers will become the backbone of a new, robust healthcare structure in the capital," he said.

Singh also noted that nearly 4 lakh people have been registered under Ayushman Bharat in Delhi, including more than 2 lakh senior citizens above the age of 70. As many as 2,258 patients have already availed treatment under the scheme, he said.

BJP president J P Nadda congratulated the new appointees and termed the occasion a historic moment. "After 15 years, these nursing officers have finally received job secu-

rity. This was not the result of a mere government order — it is the outcome of the people of Delhi choosing the BJP," he said.

He criticised the previous government for its alleged inaction across departments, especially in the health sector. Nadda pointed out

that "21,700 crore allocated in 2021 for improving Delhi's health infrastructure remained unused by the former administration."

"Now, under Chief Minister Rekha Gupta's leadership, it is our responsibility to ensure this amount is fully utilised in the next eight months to complete the Ayushman Mandirs," he said.

Nadda also highlighted that since September 2017, the Modi government has approved free treatment of up to 25 lakh for nearly 40 lakh residents of Delhi, particularly those living in slums and underprivileged areas.

DELHI'S SUMMER BIRD CENSUS

Over 160 bird species, 21 1st-time sightings recorded

New Delhi, July 6: More than 160 bird species including endangered and migratory ones like the greater flamingo and Indian pitta have been recorded across the national capital as part of the Delhi Bird Atlas.

The summer phase of the atlas -- a pioneering citizen science initiative supported by Wildlife SOS and the Delhi Forest and Wildlife Department -- reported 21 first-time sightings and saw over 600 checklists uploaded to the eBird platform, surpassing the winter documentation efforts, according to a statement.

The project, which divides Delhi into 145 observation zones, is aimed at building a long-term understanding of avian distribution patterns across seasons, officials said.

Alongside this documentation drive, Wildlife SOS has intensified its rescue efforts during the scorching summer, saving nearly 500 birds till May



2025. These included raptors and migratory species impacted by extreme heat, electrocution, collisions, and habitat stress.

Shyam Sunder Kandpal, Chief Wildlife Warden, said the Delhi Bird Atlas is not just a scientific initiative but a "community-powered effort" to reconnect people with nature and create a data-backed conservation strategy for the capital. The initiative also underscores the growing role of citizens in spotting and reporting injured or distressed birds, often triggering rescue operations.

Delhi sets Nov deadline to clear Yamuna floodplains

New Delhi, July 6: The Delhi government has directed agencies to remove all encroachments from the Yamuna floodplains by November under a 45-point action plan for cleaning and rejuvenation of the river, officials said Saturday.

The plan, approved by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, was discussed in a recent meeting chaired by the chief secretary. It involves key departments and agencies including the Delhi Jal Board (DJB), Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC), Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD), Irrigation and Flood Control (I&FC) Department, and Delhi Development Authority (DDA), they said.

According to the plan, the DDA has been instructed to ensure the removal of encroachments wherever necessary along the floodplains of the Yamuna by November. In



the past, the agency has acted against illegal nurseries and other unauthorised structures along the river.

Officials said encroachments, including waste dumping, unauthorised habitations, and illegal farming, are commonly reported from the floodplain areas in east, northeast, and south Delhi.

In recent years, the DDA has reclaimed 224 acres of floodplain land and developed

public green spaces like Asita in East Delhi.

The DDA, in April, informed the National Green Tribunal that it had freed 24 acres of land from encroachment under the Yamuna Vanasthali project between Wazirabad Barrage and ISBT Kashmere Gate.

However, officials acknowledged that anti-encroachment drives often face resistance from squatters and are hindered by the absence of proper

demarcation of the floodplain zones.

A DDA survey last year claimed that two-thirds of the Yamuna floodplain land in Delhi has been encroached upon in recent years.

The action plan also includes directives for agencies to remove all forms of encroachment from drains flowing into the Yamuna.

The MCD, New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) and DDA have been tasked with clearing encroachments from all stormwater drains through a focused drive, while the MCD and I&FC departments will address encroachments along drain alignments.

Ongoing and new projects related to Yamuna rejuvenation have been consolidated under ten working heads, including drains, sewage, solid waste management, ecological flow enhancement, and enforcement, with specific deadlines.

UP madrassa reform panel seeks 3-month extension

Lucknow, July 6: The implementation of the Uttar Pradesh government's ambitious project aimed at reforming and modernising madrassa education may face further delay, as the committee entrusted with drafting recommendations has sought a three-month extension of its tenure.

"The committee, constituted May 30 this year to propose reforms in madrassa education, has been unable to submit its report within the one-month deadline due to the extensive nature of the task," Registrar of the Uttar Pradesh Madrassa Education Board, R P Singh, told PTI Sunday.

Singh said the committee was initially directed to submit its report by June 30. However, the assignment requires detailed deliberations on several aspects, including proposed amendments to the Uttar Pradesh Madrassa Education Act and relevant regulations. Accordingly, a request has been made to extend the panel's term by at least three months.

The six-member committee, headed by the Director of the Minority Welfare Department, includes Special Secretaries from the Minority Welfare and Waqf Department, Basic Education Department, Secondary Education Department, Finance Department, and Law Department.

Based on its recommendations, the government plans



to amend the Uttar Pradesh Madrassa Education Act, 2004, and the Uttar Pradesh Non-Governmental Arabic and Persian Madrassa Recognition, Administration and Service Regulations, 2016.

The committee is also tasked with suggesting revisions to subjects and curricula for Classes IX to XII in madrassas. Further recommendations are expected to cover rationalisation of the teacher-student ratio, formulation of recruitment and transfer policies for teachers, alignment of qualifications with subject requirements, provision of training and bridge courses in modern subjects, redefinition of madrassa recognition norms, and structural reforms to enhance functioning and improve future prospects for students.

Minister of State for Minority Welfare Danish Azad Ansari told PTI that the primary objective of forming the committee is to align madrassa education with the needs of a rapidly evolving world and equip Muslim children accordingly.

However, concerns have been raised over the composition of the committee. Maulana Kaab Rashidi, Legal Advisor to Jamiat Ulama-e-Hind (AM), flagged the absence of representatives from madrassas, questioning how core issues would be addressed without input from the community directly involved.

Rashidi also challenged the notion that madrassas solely offer religious instruction, noting that many already provide

modern education and have produced students who have qualified for prestigious institutions such as the IITs. Diwan Sahab Zaman Khan, General Secretary of the Teachers Association Madaris Arabia Uttar Pradesh, expressed hope that the reforms would not interfere with religious teachings. He also cautioned against overburdening students with additional subjects and highlighted the absence of madrassa education experts in the committee, given the magnitude of its mandate.

Khan further stated that even six months may prove insufficient for the committee to complete its work. He also raised concerns over the government's inaction following the Supreme Court's declaration of Kamil and Fazil degrees as invalid, which has left pathways for higher education uncertain for madrassa students.

Since 2017, the Yogi Aditya nath-led government has initiated several steps to modernise and regulate madrassa education, including launching a dedicated portal for registration and conducting a comprehensive survey of all madrassas. The formation of this committee marks the latest move in that direction.

According to official data, there are around 25,000 madrassas in Uttar Pradesh, of which approximately 13,000 are recognised by the state's Madrassa Education Board. Out of these, only 561 receive government aid, while the remainder operate without formal recognition.

Doc delivers baby with hair clip, knife at station

Major Dr Rohit Bachwala (31), a medical officer with the Army Medical Corps, was waiting for his train when he witnessed a railway employee rushing a woman in distress on a wheelchair.

Delhi to cover Munak canal with solar panels

New Delhi, July 6: In an effort to reduce water loss and generate renewable energy, the Delhi government is planning to repair a 17-km section of Munak canal and cover it with solar panels, water minister Parvesh Verma said Sunday.

The Munak canal has two main branches -- the Delhi Sub-Branch (DSB) and the Carrier Lined Channel (CLC) -- that are suffering from significant leakage and inefficiency.

In a first-of-its-kind move, the DSB, a raw water stream starting from Haryana and merging with the Munak canal, will be



covered with solar panels. A feasibility study is being carried out by the Delhi Jal Board (DJB).

Water Minister Verma inspected the Munak canal last week and reviewed conditions on-site along with senior officials.

"The Munak canal is a lifeline for Delhi's water supply. But in its current form, it is also a major source of water loss, pollution and risk. Our plan to cover it with solar panels will help us

save water, produce clean power and make the canal safer and more secure for the people of Delhi," Verma said.

"In the DSB, nearly 30 per cent of the water is lost due to seepage and evaporation. Beyond water loss, the Munak canal also faces persistent issues of

garbage dumping and accidental drownings." "Open and unguarded stretches of the canal pose a danger to both residents and passersby," a government statement said.

The concept is inspired by a similar successful project in Gujarat, where solar panels have been installed over canal systems to efficiently utilise space, prevent evaporation and generate clean power, the minister said.

The Munak Canal system, which includes the CLC and the DSB, is 102 km long, out of which about 85 km lies in Haryana and approximately 17 km is within Delhi.

Guv expresses concern over college affairs

Kolkata, July 6: West Bengal Governor CV Ananda Bose Sunday expressed concern over the “disturbing reports” regarding the state of affairs at the South Calcutta Law College, where a first-year student was allegedly gangraped by an alumnus and two of her seniors recently.

Bose is also the chancellor of the Calcutta University to which the institute was affiliated.

“No one, however powerful or well-connected, can be allowed to hold an educational institution hostage or to exert totalitarian power with elements of violence,” Bose was quoted as saying in a statement released by the Raj Bhavan Sunday.

The prime accused in the case, Monojit Mishra, had been involved with the student wing of the state's ruling Trinamool Congress. A contractual employee of the college, Mishra was expelled from the institute after the June 25 incident.

The Governor urged students to continue with their studies without fear, confident that the college administration, university authorities, and law enforcement agencies are united in protecting their welfare.

Bose has also urged Vice Chancellor Prof Santa Datta (De) to take every necessary step to safeguard the interests of the students and to ensure that the administration of the colleges under the varsity functions strictly in accordance with established rules and regulations, the statement said.

Tension in Jattari over desecrated Sufi tomb

Aligarh (UP), July 6: Tension flared in Jattari town, about 40 km from Aligarh, Sunday morning following reports that unidentified persons desecrated the tomb of a revered Sufi saint located at a graveyard in the town's main market area.

As news of the incident spread, a crowd began to gather near the shrine of Hafiz Allah Mehar Shah, prompting senior police officials to rush to the scene and calm the situation.

Authorities assured the public that the damage to the tomb and the surrounding metal railing would be repaired immediately and that CCTV cameras would be installed at the shrine complex to prevent future incidents.

Circle Officer Varun Kumar Singh told reporters that a case was registered against unknown persons based on a complaint filed by the shrine's management committee.

“Strict action will be taken against those responsible for disturbing the peace,” Singh said, adding that some persons had entered the tomb premises through a section of the boundary wall that had been broken for some time.

Crackdown on illicit anti-TB drug sales in Pondy

New Delhi, July 6: The Pondicherry administration has launched raids against private drug retailers flouting the ban on sale of anti-tuberculosis drugs in contravention of norms.

The joint enforcement raids are being conducted by the State TB Cell in collaboration with the Department of Drugs Control.

The Pondicherry administration in alignment with the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme (NTEP) implemented the ban on the sale of anti-TB drugs by private chemists, Dr S Govindarajan, Mission Director of National Health Mission (NHM), Puducherry, told PTI.

The move, initiated in 2017, followed directives from the Central TB Division, Union Health Ministry advising that anti-TB drugs should only be dispensed through government sources to ensure strict treat-

ment adherence and minimise the risk of drug-resistant TB, he said.

These inspections aimed both at preventing unauthorised sales and to sensitise chemists regarding the public health implications of selling anti-TB drugs without notifying the State TB Officer (STO), Dr C Venkatesh, STO, said.

As part of ongoing efforts, multiple awareness meetings were held with wholesalers, retailers, and pharmacists across Puducherry, Dr Govindarajan informed.

“They were instructed to stop dispensing anti-TB drugs to patients and instead report such cases using a standardised notification form,” he said.

These reports enabled the STO office to track patients and ensure treatment completion, Dr Govindarajan stated.

“The druggists were again and again educated in a series of meeting that the selling of anti-TB drugs outside to TB pa-

NMC relaxes medical faculty rules

New Delhi, July 6: Non-teaching specialists or consultants with 10 years of experience at government hospitals can now be appointed as associate professors, while those with two years can serve as assistant professors without the mandatory senior residency, in a move to widen the pool of eligible faculty.

The new regulations by the National Medical Council (NMC) also stipulate that non-teaching government hospitals with over 220 beds can now be designated as teaching institutions.

The previous 2022 regulations allowed non-teaching doctors to become assistant professors after two years in 330-bed non-teaching hospitals that were being converted into medical colleges.

“A non-teaching consultant or specialist or medical officer, possessing PG medical degree with at least two years of experience in a government hospital



having at least 220 beds shall be eligible to become an assistant professor of that broad specialty without the requirement of experience as senior resident and shall complete the basic course in biomedical research within two years of appointment,” the Medical Institutions (Qualifications of Faculty) Regulations, 2025 notified recently said.

These regulations, brought in by the Post Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB) under NMC, aim to widen the pool of eligible faculty and facilitate the expansion of undergraduate (MBBS) and post-graduate (MD/MS) seats in medical colleges across India, the Commission said.

Cloudbursts in Mandi, Chamba

Shimla, July 6: Amid a red alert for extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places in three out of 12 districts in Himachal Pradesh, cloudbursts were witnessed in Mandi and Chamba districts Sunday but no casualty was reported, said officials.

Since the onset of monsoon June 20, the state has reported 78 deaths, of which 50 were linked to rain-related incidents such as cloudbursts, flash floods and landslides.

The MeT office issued a red alert for very heavy to extremely heavy rainfall in Kangra, Sirmaur and Mandi districts Sunday. Besides, an orange warning was sounded for heavy to very heavy rainfall in seven other districts, excluding the tribal districts of Kinnaur and Lahaul and Spiti.

Pedestrian bridges were washed away in Kugdi and Kotarang drains and about 50 bigha of private land in Kotarang village adjacent to the drain was swept away in Mandi, the officials said.

While another cloudburst occurred in Churah of Chamba Sunday morning and flash floods in Kanghela drain washed away a newly constructed bridge, cutting off four panchayats from the main road. Meanwhile, a 29-year-old mi-

grant woman was swept away in Barsar area of Hamirpur district as the water level in Shukra Khad rose. The woman, identified as Kiran from Bihar, used to work at a crusher unit.

She was washing utensils outside her house when the floods swept her away, the officials said, adding that search and rescue operations are underway to trace her. Swan river overflowed after heavy rain in Una which received over 110 mm of rains since Saturday evening. There are reports of water damaging a petrol pump in Ghaluwal, and entering few houses in Dhalwal in Una district.

The district administrations of Kangra, Mandi and Sirmaur have been on alert following the red warning.

Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu Saturday said the state government was prepared to deal with the situation. “We are ready,” he said.

According to the State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC), the estimated losses due to the rains so far stand at around ₹572 crore, though the chief minister maintained the figure was close to ₹700 crore as data was still being compiled. Reports of damage to link roads and small bridges being washed away following a cloudburst in the Swad nallah (drain) in Shilbhadani village of the Padhar area in Mandi district have been received. However, no loss of life has been reported so far.

A total of 243 roads are closed in the state of which 183 are in Mandi district alone while 241 transformers and 278 water supply schemes have been affected across the state, the SEOC said.

NATGRID urges states to use database to curb crime

New Delhi, July 6: The NATGRID, which shares real-time information for intelligence services and investigations with law-enforcement agencies, has asked all state police forces to enhance their engagements with it and proactively use its database for crime control and checking criminal activities.

The NATGRID, which comes under the direct control of the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), shares with 11 central agencies and all state police forces real-time information from its database on terror activities, organised criminal gangs, financial transactions, immigration, circulation of counterfeit currency and narcotics, besides other inputs.

In a letter to the police chiefs of all states, Piyush Goyal, Chief Executive Officer of the NATGRID, has requested them to enhance the usage in their respective forces to increase the number of active users and encourage them to effectively utilise the NATGRID solution.

The letter specifically emphasised on encouraging the district superintendents of police (SPs) for a wider use of the NATGRID database in their crime-control and law-enforcement initiatives.

“This may please be reviewed in your meetings periodically. NATGRID is continuing to augment more features/functionalities in the solution and conducting regular training/feedback sessions,” Goyal said in the letter.

The letter said with collabo-



rative efforts, many new users have started using the system proactively and there has been a significant increase in the usage of NATGRID solution.

“I would like to highlight and commend the consistent usage of NATGRID solution by Andhra Pradesh, Haryana,

Rajasthan, Maharashtra and Assam, which are the top performers for the period Jan-Jun 2025,” Goyal said in the letter.

Besides these states, he also appreciated the efforts made by Tamil Nadu, which enhanced “the number of active users who have fired at least one que-

ry in a month” by four times in June, with the resultant significant increase in their usage of the system as well.

Conceptualised after the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks, the NATGRID disseminates information to agencies like the IB, R&AW, CBI, Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT), Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) and Enforcement Directorate, besides others.

It has a database of more than 20 categories like railways, banks, airlines, credit-card companies and immigration.

The work on the National Intelligence Grid (NATGRID) was accelerated after Amit Shah became the Union home minister in 2019, officials said.

The necessity for the NATGRID came after the worst

terror attack in India's history in the country's commercial capital in 2008 exposed the deficiency that security agencies had no mechanism to look for vital information on real time.

The lack of real-time information was considered to be one of the major hurdles in detecting US terror suspect David Headley's movement across the country during his multiple visits between 2006 and 2009.

Headley provided key information and videos of terror targets to Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), which carried out the 26/11 Mumbai attacks that claimed 166 lives.

The Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) had given its approval to the ₹3,400 crore project April 8, 2010 but its work slowed down after 2012.

Israeli strikes kill 38 Palestinians in Gaza

Deir al-Balah: Israeli airstrikes killed at least 38 Palestinians in Gaza, hospital officials said Sunday, as Israel's military said it has struck over 100 targets in the embattled enclave in the past day. The fighting came as Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu was preparing to fly to Washington for talks at the White House aimed at pushing forward ceasefire efforts. President Donald Trump has floated a plan for an initial 60-day ceasefire that would include a partial release of hostages held by Hamas in exchange for an increase in humanitarian supplies allowed into Gaza. The proposed truce calls for talks on ending the 21-month war altogether.

Death toll from Texas floods reaches 43

Hunt: At least 43 people, including 15 children, have been confirmed dead following flash floods in central Texas, authorities said Saturday as rescuers continued a frantic search for dozens more campers, vacationers and residents who were still missing. The casualty toll will likely rise, authorities said, as localities beyond the main site of the disaster in Kerr County were affected by the flooding. A Travis County official said four people had died from the flooding there, with 13 unaccounted for, and officials reported another death in Kendall County. Officials said more than 850 people had been rescued, including some clinging to trees, after a sudden storm dumped up to 15 inches (38 cm) of rain in an area around the Guadalupe River, about 85 miles (140 km) northwest of San Antonio.

China retaliates against EU tariffs

Bangkok: China said Sunday that European medical device companies will be barred from selling to the Chinese government as a countermeasure for the European Union's restrictions on the sale of similar products from China. European companies will be excluded if the budget for procurement is above 45 million yuan (\$6.28 million), according to a notice from the Finance Ministry Sunday with the restrictions in place the same day. China Friday imposed anti-dumping duties on European brandy, most notably cognac produced in France.

China used embassies to undermine sales of Rafale fighter jets

Paris, July 6: China deployed its embassies to spread doubts about the performance of French-made Rafale jets after they saw combat in India and Pakistan's clashes in May, French military and intelligence officials have concluded, implicating Beijing in an effort to hammer the reputation and sales of France's flagship fighter.

Findings from a French intelligence service seen by The Associated Press say defence attaches in China's foreign embassies led a charge to undermine Rafale sales, seeking to persuade countries that have already ordered the French-made fighter — notably Indonesia — not to buy more and to encourage other potential buyers to choose Chinese-made planes.

The findings were shared with AP by a French military official on condition that the official and the intelligence service not be named.

Four days of India-Pakistan clashes in May were the most serious confrontation in years between the two nuclear-armed neighbours, and included air combat that involved dozens of aircraft from both sides.

Military officials and researchers have since been digging for details of how Pakistan's Chinese-made military hardware — particularly warplanes and air-combat missiles — fared against weaponry that India used in airstrikes on Pakistani targets, notably French-made Rafale fighters.

Sales of Rafales and other armaments are big business for France's defence industry and help efforts by the government in Paris to strengthen ties with other nations, including in Asia where China is becoming the dominant regional power.

Khamenei makes first public appearance since Iran-Israel conflict

Tehran: Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei on Saturday made his first public appearance since the 12-day war between Israel and Iran began, attending a mourning ceremony on the eve of Ashoura. The absence of Khamenei during the war had suggested heavy security for the Iranian leader, who has final say on all state matters. State TV in Iran showed Khamenei waving and nodding to the chanting crowd as he entered and sat. Iran has acknowledged the deaths of more than 900 people in the war, as well as thousands of injured. It also has confirmed serious damage to its nuclear facilities, and has denied access to the sites for inspectors with the UN nuclear watchdog. Khamenei hosted a remembrance of the 7th century martyrdom of the Prophet Muhammad's grandson, Hussein, at a mosque next to his office and residence in the capital, Tehran.

UAE's Golden Visa for Indians made easy

Indians can now get without trade license, property purchase

Dubai, July 6: The United Arab Emirates government has started a new type of Golden Visa, which will be based on nomination, albeit with some conditions, unlike the current practice of investing large amounts in either property or business here.

Until now, one of the ways to get Dubai's Golden Visa from

India was to invest in property whose value should be at least AED Two Million (Rs 4.66 crore), or invest a large amount in business in the country.

Under the "new nomination-based visa policy," Indians can now enjoy the UAE's Golden Visa for life by paying a fee of AED 1,00,000 (around Rs 23.30 lakh), beneficiaries and people involved in the process have told PTI.

Over 5,000 Indians will apply for this nomination-based visa in three months, they said.

India and Bangladesh have been selected for the first phase of testing this visa, and



a consultancy named Rayad Group has been chosen to test the initial form of the nomination-based golden visa in India. Rayad Kamal Ayub, Managing Director of Rayad Group, said this is a golden opportunity for Indians to get the UAE's Golden Visa.

Leaders of growing BRICS group gather

Rio De Janeiro, July 6: Leaders of the growing BRICS group of developing nations were set to gather in Rio de Janeiro Sunday, calling for reform of traditional Western institutions while presenting the bloc as a defender of multilateralism in an increasingly fractured world.

With forums such as the G7 and G20 groups of major economies hamstrung by divisions and the disruptive "America First" approach of US President Donald Trump, expansion of the BRICS has opened new space for diplomatic coordination.

"In the face of the resurgence of protectionism, it is up to emerging nations to defend the multilateral trade regime and reform the international financial architecture," Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva told a BRICS business forum Saturday. BRICS nations now represent over half the world's population and 40% of its economic output, Lula noted.

The BRICS group gathered leaders from Brazil, Russia, India and China at its first summit in 2009. The bloc later added South Africa and last year included Egypt, Ethiopia, Indonesia, Iran, Saudi Arabia and the United

Arab Emirates as full members. This is the first leaders' summit to include Indonesia.

"The vacuum left by others ends up being filled almost instantly by the BRICS," said a Brazilian diplomat who asked not to be named. Although the G7 still concentrates vast power, the source added, "it doesn't have the predominance it once did."

However, there are questions about the shared goals of an increasingly heterogenous BRICS group, which has grown to include regional rivals along with major emerging economies.

Stealing some thunder from this year's summit, Chinese President Xi Jinping chose to send his prime minister in his place. Russian President Vladimir Putin is attending online due to an arrest warrant from the ICC.

Still, many heads of state will

gather for discussions at Rio's Museum of Modern Art on Sunday and Monday, including Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and South African President Cyril Ramaphosa. Over 30 nations have expressed interest in participating in the BRICS, either as full members or partners.

GROWING CLOUD, COMPLEXITY

Brazil, which also hosts the United Nations climate summit in November, has seized on both gatherings to highlight how seriously developing nations are tackling climate change, while Trump has slammed the brakes on US climate initiatives.

Both China and the UAE signaled in meetings with Brazilian Finance Minister Fernando Haddad in Rio that they plan to invest in a proposed Tropical Forests Forever Facility, according to two sources with knowledge of the discussions about funding conservation of endangered forests around the world.

Expansion of the BRICS has added diplomatic weight to the gathering, which aspires to speak for developing nations across the Global South, strengthening calls for reforming global institutions such as the United Nations Security Council and the International Monetary Fund.

POWER SHARING

Xi fuels speculation about political future

All of Chinese president Xi's predecessors retired after two five-year terms, while he continued in power with no term limits, earning him the label of president for life

Beijing, July 6: Chinese President Xi Jinping, widely regarded as a leader for life, is beginning to delegate authority to key organs of the ruling Communist Party, a first in his over 12-year rule.

Xi's move sparked speculation that he may be laying the groundwork for an orderly power transition or scaling back his role in preparation for possible retirement.

Speculation about Xi's power transition was rife after state-run Xinhua news agency recently reported that the powerful 24-member Political Bureau of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) in its meeting June 30 reviewed a set of new regulations on the work of the party's institutions.

The meeting presided over by Xi himself stressed that the regulations will further standardise the establishment, responsibilities, and operations of the CPC Central Committee's decision-making, deliberative, and coordinating institutions.

Such institutions should exercise more effective leadership

and coordination over major tasks and focus on planning, discussing, and overseeing major tasks, the Xinhua report said.


While the overseas Chinese dissident community in recent months was abuzz with speculation of a power struggle within the secretive and tightly controlled CPC, a China-based political analyst who spoke on condition of anonymity said the regulations on these party bodies could hint at preparations for Xi's retirement.

"The rules may be set up to regulate the bodies because it's a key time for power transition," the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post Sunday quoted the analyst as saying.

Other experts, however, averred that Xi, regarded as the most powerful leader after CPC founder Mao Zedong, may be delegating some powers to focus on larger issues.

Xi's move of delegating power comes amid US President Donald Trump's tariff war disrupting China's \$440 billion exports to America, besides major headwinds faced by the Chinese economy, with growth falling due to continued slowdown, and the collapse of the housing market, the mainstay of the economic growth.

Analysts say his plan to remain in power or share power was expected to unravel before or during the next five-year congress of the CPC to be held in 2027, by which time his third term will end.



Dalai Lama turns 90, gets global support in challenge for China

Political leaders from India and abroad shared the stage with the Dalai Lama, throwing their support behind the Buddhist leader, who has been living in exile in India and has been fighting for the rights of the Tibetan people since the region came under Chinese occupation in the 1960s

Dharamshala, July 6: The spiritual leader of Tibetan Buddhists, the Dalai Lama, turned 90 Sunday after a week of celebrations by followers during which he riled China again and spoke about his hope to live beyond 130 and reincarnate after dying.

The Nobel laureate is regarded as one of the world's most influential religious leaders, with a following that extends well beyond Buddhism, but not by Beijing, which calls him a separatist and has sought to bring the faith under its control.

Fleeing his native Tibet in 1959 in the wake of a failed uprising against Chinese rule, the 14th Dalai Lama, along with hundreds of thousands of Tibetans, took shelter in India and has since advocated for a peaceful "Middle Way" to seek autonomy and religious freedom for the Tibetan people.

Dressed in his traditional yellow and burgundy robe, the Dalai Lama arrived at a temple to smiles and claps from thousands of monks and followers who had gathered on a rainy morning in the small Indian hill town of Dharamshala, where he lives. He waved and



greeted them as he walked slowly to the stage with support from monks.

"As far as I am concerned, I have a human life and as humans it is quite natural for us to love and help one another," the Dalai Lama said, speaking after a Tibetan cultural performance that included songs for his long life. "I live my life in the service of other sentient

beings," he said, flanked on the stage with long-time supporters including western diplomats, Indian federal ministers, Hollywood star Richard Gere and a monk who is expected to lead the search for his successor.

In a sign of solidarity, Taiwan's president Lai Ching-te, leaders of Indian states bordering Tibet, and three former US presidents sent greetings to the

Dalai Lama, including Barack Obama, George W. Bush, and Bill Clinton, whose video messages were played during the event.

In the preceding week of celebrations, the Dalai Lama had said he would reincarnate as the leader of the faith upon his death and that his non-profit institution, the Gaden Phodrang Trust, had sole authority to recognise his successor.

China has said that the succession will have to be approved by its leaders, and the United States has called on Beijing to cease what it describes as interference in the succession of the Dalai Lama and other Tibetan Buddhist Lamas.

SHOW OF SOLIDARITY

Guests gathered at the ceremony took turns to speak, including Indian Parliamentary and Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju, a practising Buddhist, who had earlier made a

rare statement contradicting China by backing the Dalai Lama's position on his successor.

He later clarified that the statement was made in his personal capacity as China warned New Delhi against interfering in its domestic affairs at the expense of bilateral relations.

On Sunday, Rijiju said the Dalai Lama was India's "most honoured guest... We feel blessed for his presence here in our country". He said he has always held the view that there was a need to contribute significantly towards the cause of the Tibetan people, and added that, as a devotee, "We will follow the directions and the guidelines to be issued from the institution of the Dalai Lama."

Cultural performances were held throughout the morning, including from Bollywood playback singers, while messages from global leaders were read out.

Mcap of six top valued firms erodes by ₹70,325.5cr

New Delhi: The combined market valuation of six of the top-10 valued firms eroded by Rs 70,325.5 crore last week, with HDFC Bank and ICICI Bank emerging as the worst-hit in line with a bearish trend in equities. Last week, the BSE benchmark Sensex dropped 626.01 points or 0.74 per cent. In the top-10 pack, Reliance Industries, State Bank of India, Infosys and Hindustan Unilever Ltd were the gainers, while HDFC Bank, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), Bharti Airtel, ICICI Bank, Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) and Bajaj Finance faced erosion from their market valuation. HDFC Bank's valuation declined by Rs 19,284.8 crore to Rs 15,25,339.72 crore. ICICI Bank lost Rs 13,566.92 crore in its market valuation which stood at Rs 10,29,470.57 crore. The valuation of Bajaj Finance dropped by Rs 13,236.44 crore to Rs 5,74,977.11 crore and that of LIC diminished by Rs 10,246.49 crore to Rs 5,95,277.16 crore. In the ranking of top-10 firms, Reliance Industries retained the title of the most valued firm, followed by HDFC Bank, TCS, Bharti Airtel, ICICI Bank, State Bank of India, Infosys, LIC, Bajaj Finance and Hindustan Unilever Ltd.

Gold may see volatile moves

New Delhi: Gold prices may see heightened volatility in the coming week as investors track a crucial July 9 tariff deadline, policy signals from major central banks, including the US Federal Reserve, and key global macroeconomic data, analysts said. Traders are expected to remain cautious ahead of any major policy cues or geopolitical developments. The 90-day suspension of Trump tariffs on imports from several countries, including India, ends on July 9, reviving the risk of a 26 per cent additional duty on Indian goods entering US. 

NCLAT: Insolvency law cannot override PMLA

New Delhi, July 6: Insolvency & Bankruptcy Code cannot override the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), said appellate tribunal NCLAT, adding assets of a debt-ridden firm once attached by the Directorate of Enforcement (ED) and confirmed by competent authority cannot be released for its resolution.

Under section 14 of IBC, a moratorium is applied on those assets for the purpose of resolution. However, if the property is alleged to be "proceeds of crime" and is already under adjudication by competent authority under a penal statute, such property cannot be deemed to be part of the freely available resolution estate, the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) said.

The appellate tribunal held that if there is any attachment by ED under the PMLA, which is "validly made and confirmed, it cannot be undone under IBC (Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code). Citing section 238 of IBC, which has an overriding effect over other laws, a three-member NCLAT bench said it "cannot override the PMLA in respect of proceedings involving proceeds of crime."

PMLA and IBC operate in distinct spheres and there is no



"irreconcilable inconsistency" exists between the two, said NCLAT adding ED does not act as a creditor, but as a public enforcement agency.

"The attached assets are not to satisfy creditors, but to uphold penal objectives and international obligations under FATF and UN Conventions," said the appellate tribunal, while upholding an order of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT).

NCLAT also cited a directive issued by the Supreme Court in the Embassy Property matter, saying it "lacks jurisdiction to interfere with the PAO, which has been subsequently confirmed by the Adjudicating Authority under the PMLA".

The appellate tribunal's 36-page-order came over a plea filed by the resolution professional of Dunar Foods, challenging an NCLT ruling, which had refused to direct the ED to release provisionally attached assets of the debt-ridden company.

December 22, 2027, the Mumbai bench of NCLT had ordered insolvency proceedings against Dunar Foods, which was engaged in processing and exporting basmati rice. The insolvency petition was filed by a consortium of banks led by public sector lender SBI for a loan repayment default of Rs 758.73 crore.

FPIs see withdrawal

New Delhi, July 6: Foreign investors put in Rs 14,590 crore in the country's equity market in June, marking the third straight month of investment, supported by improving global liquidity conditions, easing geopolitical tensions, and a rate cut by the Reserve Bank of India.

However, FPIs turned net sellers in July and pulled out Rs 1,421 crore in the first week of the month, data with the depositories showed.

Going forward, in the near term, FPI flows are expected to remain choppy on account of tariff deadline developments and US data volatility, Vaqar-javed Khan, Senior Fundamental Analyst, Angel One, said.

Though, In May, FPIs saw a net investment of Rs 19,860 crore, and Rs 4,223 crore in April. Prior to this, FPIs had pulled out Rs 3,973 crore in March, Rs 34,574 crore in February, and a substantial Rs 78,027 crore in January.

With this, FPIs' outflow stood at Rs 79,322 crore in 2025 so far.

"FPIs exhibited a cautious yet improving stance in June 2025, beginning the month with notable outflows from the equity markets driven by elevated US bond yields, trade tensions, overvalued Indian stocks and deteriorating geopolitical environment," Himanshu Srivastava, Associate Director, Manager Research, Morningstar Investment, said.

However, sentiment shifted towards the later part of the month as global liquidity conditions improved, geopolitical tensions eased, the RBI cut rates, the rupee strengthened, and oil prices stabilised, he added.

US-INDIA TRADE TALKS, TCS EARNINGS TO DRIVE STOCK MARKET THIS WEEK

New Delhi, July 6: Equity investors are up for an eventful trading week ahead as the 90-day suspension period of the reciprocal tariffs announced by US President Donald Trump ends July 9, analysts said, adding that a positive outcome from the trade negotiations could further lift market sentiment, particularly benefiting trade-sensitive sectors.

Besides, Q1 earnings from TCS and foreign fund movement would also dictate sentiment at the Dalal Street, experts said.

"This week holds significant importance not only for Indian markets but for global equities

as well. The most anticipated event is the outcome of the US trade (tariff) deadline on July 9, which could shape global trade dynamics. Investors will also closely monitor the release of the US FOMC (Federal Open Market Committee) minutes on the same day," Ajit Mishra – SVP, Research, Religare Broking Ltd, said.

Domestically, the spotlight will shift to corporate earnings, with IT major TCS and retail giant Avenue Supermarts among the prominent companies scheduled to report their quarterly results, setting the tone for the Q1 earnings season, he added.

Movement in global oil benchmark Brent crude and

the rupee-dollar trend would also be monitored by investors this week.

"A positive outcome from the US-India trade negotiations could further lift market sentiment, particularly benefiting trade-sensitive sectors like IT, pharma, and auto. Considering the broader indices currently trading at elevated levels, the market participants will closely watch for signs of earnings catch-up from upcoming Q1—starting this week," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Investments Limited, said.

Last week, BSE benchmark Sensex dropped 626.01 points or 0.74 per cent, and the NSE Nifty declined 176.8 points or 0.68 per cent.

India expands treaty talks with over 15 nations to boost FDI

New Delhi, July 6: India is actively negotiating bilateral investment treaties (BITs) with over a dozen countries, including Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Israel, Oman, European Union, Switzerland, Russia, and Australia, a government official said.

Besides these nations, talks are underway with Tajikistan, Cambodia, Uruguay, Maldives, Switzerland, and Kuwait.

These investment treaties help in protecting and promoting investments in each other's countries.

With India approaching to become the third-largest economy and a hub for global manufacturing, the government is taking a series of measures to



further improve its investment regime that encourages investors.

"It is expected that in the next 3-6 months, BIT with some of these countries will be finalised and announced," the official added.

The government in the last Budget has announced revamping the current model of BITs to make it more investor-friendly

and attract foreign players.

The country signed BITs with two countries in 2024. Last year, the Centre announced implementation of these treaties with UAE and Uzbekistan.

Bilateral trade basket for India and Argentina

Buenos Aires, July 6: India and Argentina Saturday agreed to diversify two-way trade and ramp up cooperation in defence, critical minerals, pharmaceutical, energy and mining sectors.

Prime Minister Modi held wide-ranging talks with Argentine President Javier Milei, a day after landing at the South American nation in the third leg of his five-nation tour.

"We are marking 75 years of India-Argentina diplomatic relations and 5 years since we elevated our relationship to a Strategic Partnership. We have covered significant ground in our bilateral relations, but we agree that the journey ahead is even more promising," Modi posted on X after the talks.

The prime minister said that there is immense scope to enhance India-Argentina cooperation in areas like pharmaceuticals and sports as well. The resolve by the two sides to expand cooperation in the critical minerals sector assumes significance as India has been looking at steady supply of rare earth minerals to minimise dependence on China.

Argentina's rich reserves of critical minerals, including lithium, copper and rare earth elements align with India's need for secure and sustainable resources to drive its clean energy transition and industrial growth, Secretary (East) in the Ministry of External Affairs Periasamy Kumaran said.

Modi and Milei also deliberated on boosting bilateral cooperation in the energy sector.

"The prime minister underlined India's growing energy and industrial needs and em-

phasised that Argentina could serve as a reliable partner in supporting India's developmental journey," Kumaran said.

With the world's second-largest shale gas and fourth-largest shale oil reserves, along with substantial conventional oil and gas deposits, Argentina holds strong potential to become an important energy partner for India.

Kumaran said the two leaders focused on expanding cooperation in areas of defence and security, infrastructure, mining and mineral resources, agriculture, green energy, communication technologies, digital innovation, education and people to people linkages.

Modi and Milei also emphasised the need to enhance market access for each other's agricultural and dairy products. The Indian side also offered support for maintenance of Argentina's military helicopter fleet. It also offered Argentina a number of military platforms.

Prime Minister Modi sought Argentina's support in expanding the India-MERCOSUR trade agreement, noting that it could deepen trade ties between the two nations as well, he said.

The preferential trade agreement (PTA) is aimed at expanding economic ties between India and the MERCOSUR trade bloc that includes Argentina, Brazil, Paraguay, and Uruguay. The talks also included India and Argentina in the pharmaceutical sector, particularly its capacity to produce high-quality, affordable medicines.

On the contrary, The Argentine side updated the Indian delegation on the fast-track approval process available for import of Indian medicines.

Uncertainties loom over India-US trade negotiations

New Delhi, July 6: With India setting its red lines on key issues in sectors such as agriculture and dairy for the proposed interim trade agreement with the US, the ball is now in Washington's court to finalise the deal, sources said.

They said if issues are settled, an interim trade pact could be announced before July 9, which marks the end of the 90-day suspension period of the Trump tariffs announced April 2 on dozens of countries, including India.

"India has drawn its red lines... now the ball is in the US court," they said.

April 2, US imposed an additional 26 per cent reciprocal tariff on Indian goods but suspended it for 90 days. However, the 10 per cent baseline tariff imposed by America remains in place. India is seeking full exemption from this 26 per cent tariff. "If the proposed trade talks fail, the 26 per cent tariffs will come into force again," one of the sources said.

Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal last week stated that India does not enter into any trade agreement based on deadlines and will accept the proposed trade deal with US only when it is fully finalised, properly concluded and in the national interest.

FTAs are possible only when both sides get benefitted and it should be a win-win agreement, he has said. "National interest should always be supreme. Keeping that in mind, if a deal is made then India is always ready to deal with developed countries," Goyal had said earlier.
