IIM-Calcutta student 'raped'; one held

Kolkata: A woman studying at the Indian Institute of Management-Calcutta was allegedly raped by a student inside a hostel of the business school, police said Saturday. The accused has been arrested on the basis of an FIR lodged by the woman at Haridevpur Police Station, they said. He was later remanded to police custody till July 19. The alleged incident inside the boys' hostel of IIM-Calcutta took place Friday, a police officer said. "The woman stated in the FIR that she was called to the hostel for a counselling session. She then became unconscious after consuming a drink laced with drugs at the hostel. The woman realised she had been raped after regaining consciousness," he said.

Bird flu in Puri: Mass culling begins

Puri: The Puri district administration has initiated culling of poultry in Muninda Gram Panchayat under Delang block in Puri district after bird flu was confirmed in two broiler farms.Authorities have imposed a ban on the transportation of birds from the affected area and instructed all check gates to strictly monitor and prevent the movement of poultry. According to official sources, around 6,000 to 8,000 birds across three poultry farms have been affected by the outbreak, as confirmed by sample tests conducted by the state Veterinary department.

Female cheetah dies of injuries in Kuno

Sheopur (MP): An eight-yearold cheetah named Nabha, translocated to Kuno National Park (KNP) from Namibia, succumbed to injuries Saturday, an official stated. "Nabha was badly injured a week back, probably during a hunting attempt inside her soft release enclosure. She had fractures in both ulna and fibula on the left side along with other injuries," Cheetah Project Field Director Uttam Sharma said in a statement. She was under treatment for a week but succumbed to her injuries.

A 15-page preliminary investigation report into the disaster revealed fuel-control switches of the two engines moved from the 'run' to the 'cutoff' position within the space of one second leading to immediate loss of altitude. In the cockpit voice recording, one pilot is heard asking the other why he cut off the fuel. The other denied hav ing done so. The report by Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AIIB), released early Saturday, neither concluded any reason for the switches moving nor ap portioned explicit blame for the crash. It also did not identify the pilots in the voice recording. But it also said no fault was found in the aircraft, leaving only the pos sibility of pilot error as the cause

Further details will be known after the postmortem, he added. After Nabha's death, KNP is now left with 26 cheetahs, including nine adults (six females and three males) and 17 cubs born in KNP.

inquiry into the incident.

Sources said the victim had earlier lodged a complaint July 1, alleging that Sahu had demanded sexual favours from her six months back. Sahu allegedly threatened to fail her on the pretext of her absence from class when she rejected his advances.

Sources said the victim had to often skip of her classes as she is martial arts trainer, and attends government training camps, as well as for some personal reasons.

Taking advantage of the situation, Sahu would humiliate and mentally torture her. She also tried to commit suicide earlier. College authorities had assured to conduct a probe and

Officials said the victim had also staged a protest in the college campus for one week demanding action against the teacher. Principal Dilip Ghose said the student had met him and sought action against the teacher. "I counselled her as she looked tense. She had lodged a complaint and an internal complaint committee (ICC) inquiry was going on." he said.

Meanwhile, Balasore MLA Manas Dutta, who visited the hospital, said the condition of the victim was critical.

The victim's friends said she was under severe mental stress for the past several days over the alleged harassment by Sahu.

Inspired by movie, Kerala schools remove backbenchers

Kollam(Kerala), July 12: At Ramavilasom Vocational Higher Secondary School (RVHSS) in Valakom in this South Kerala district, a proud tribute to former student GP Nandana greets visitors at the gate, celebrating her remarkable feat of securing the 2nd rank in Kerala and 47th nationally in the Civil Services Examinations.

But the school's acclaim doesn't end there, as it has also become a model for innovation in education, thanks to a unique classroom setup that eliminates the idea of backbenchers entirely.

By rearranging seating to ensure every primary student gets equal attention, RVHSS has drawn admiration and imitation.

Influenced by the recently released Malayalam movie, 'Sthanarthi Sreekuttan', the school has brought in an innovative seating arrangement where single row seats are aligned with the four walls of the classroom, so everyone sits in front benches.

Eight schools in Kerala have already adopted this seating arrangement, and even a school in Punjab has adopted it.

"I got a message that a school in Punjab has also adopted it after the principal saw the movie on the OTT platform. He also screened the movie for the students. I am happy that it got national attention, Vinesh Viswanathan, director



of the movie 'Sthanarthi Sree kuttan', said.

He said the movie had just one scene showing this arrangement, as an idea implemented by a 7th standard student in the film.

"It was his experience of being insulted sitting on the backbench that gave him such an idea. I never thought it would get such attention.

"It is not an idea created by us, but we did have such a seating arrangement earlier in classrooms, as part of District Primary Education Programme (DPEP) and we had lost it somewhere in between, Vinesh said. In fact, it was the farsightedness of Minister KB Ganesh Kumar, whose family runs RMVHSS, that paved the way to introducing this system in this school.

Ganesh Kumar had watched the preview of 'Sthanarthi Sreekuttan', a year before its release and discussed the possibility of introducing it in primary classes in RMVHSS with the teachers.

'Ganesh Kumar discussed this with us and his wife, who manages the school. We also agreed to start it in one class. The results we got were very

positive and we introduced them to all lower primary classes," Sunil P Sekhar, Headmaster of RMVHSS, said.

He said this system enabled teachers to give equal attention to all students in the classroom and helped them monitor the students better. Moreover, it eliminated the concept of backbenchers and put all students at the forefront.

He said many more schools have now shown interest in adopting this model.

"Lower primary classes are where students learn a lot of new things and they naturally get rid of the concept or taboo of sitting on the backbenches. It also helps students to have a more direct interaction with the teachers," he added.

New lease of life for lymphoma patient

Bhubaneswar: The KIMS Cancer Centre has successfully treated a patient suffering from Cutaneous T-cell Lymphoma using Electron Beam Therapy (EBT), a specialised radiation technique designed to precisely target cancers on or near the skin, official sources said Saturday. The patient, a resident of central Odisha, had been struggling with painful and oozing growths across the body caused by Cutaneous T-cell Lymphoma - a rare form of cancer that primarily affects

the skin. Prior to visiting KIMS, the patient had undergone surgery to remove some of the lesions and had also received multiple rounds of chemotherapy. Upon arrival at the KIMS Cancer Centre, the patient was received with numerous nodular skin lesions, accompanied by severe pain and fluid discharge. Under the leadership of Dr Sthiti Das, senior consultant, the medical team

devised a treatment plan using EBT.

Oppn condemns Balasore incident A student of a college

Bhubaneswar, July 12: Opposition Biju Janata Dal (BJD) and Congress Saturday strongly condemned the incident in Balasore district wherein a college student, who had lodged a sexual harassment complaint against a teacher, allegedly set herself on fire on the institute premises and sustained 90 per cent burn injuries

BJD spokesperson Lenin Mohanty said, "We are shocked not only for what has happened in Balasore today, but also for what has been happening in Odisha in the past one month."

"One college girl was gangraped at Gopalpur beach and a couple is forced to plough land. Odisha is a peaceful place, and we have never seen such things happening in the state," he added.

The BJD, in a statement, held the state's BJP government 'responsible' for the Balasore student suicide attempt and said that the students are even unsafe in colleges. "We demand the arrest of the college principal. The Balasore MP fails to provide justice to the student even as he was approached prior to the incident," the BJD statement added.

Condemning the Balasore incident, OPCC president Bhakta Charan Das demanded the resignation of the Higher Education minister and alleged that meeting here, expressed concern over safety of women in Odisha, Das said there is no permanent principal in any of the government colleges across the state.

"We pray for the recovery of the young woman who is struggling for survival after trying to die by suicide due to lack of justice," Das said.

BJD targets govt over delay in Ratna Bhandar inventory

Bhubaneswar, July 12: Opposition Biju Janata Dal (BJD) Saturday accused the BJP government in the state of misleading people on the much-awaited inventory of Srimandir Ratna Bhandar in Puri.

BJD spokesperson Lenin Mohanty made the allegation after Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan said that the inventory of the Lord's treasury would begin after the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) allocates two of its experts for the process.

The minister, on the other hand, stated that the process of inventorying the Lord's treasury has already commenced, with the state government having written a letter to the RBI authorities to engage two experts with relevant experience.

"The Lord's valuables, now stored in a temporary strong room on the temple premises, would be shifted to the Ratna Bhadar after completion of its



repair and conservation works. As soon as the RBI provides its experts, we will go for the inventory," the minister said.

The BJD leader, however, termed it 'a delay tactic' adopted by the state government, stating there is uncertainty regarding the Ratna Bhandar inventory for the past year.

"Unfortunately, the Law minister says that the inventory

will take more time even after repair of the Ratna Bhanadr," Mohanty said.

The BJD leader rejected the state government's move to involve the RBI in the Ratna Bhandar inventory process.

"Has the help of the RBI ever been taken during the previous inventories? Is there a provision in the Shri Jagannath Temple Act, 1955 to take the help of the RBI during inventory? If not, for what reason is it being delayed in the name of the Reserve Bank?" Mohanty asked.

The Lord's valuables are stored in a temporary strong room for one year, he said.

"Now, we have seen how some people trespassed into the temple premises in Puri by scaling the main boundary wall. The devotees of Lord Jagannath are worried over the safety of the valuables," he said.

The senior BJD leader said that the government should start an inventory of valuables as soon as possible.

The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) has recently completed repair work in the Ratna Bhandar.

The previous inventory of the Lord's valuables was made in 1978. The state government reopened the inner chamber of Ratna Bhandar in July 2024, after 46 years, for repair and inventory.

Heatwaves to worsen in India, warns IMD expert

Bhubaneswar, July 12: Heatwaves in India are expected to intensify in the coming years, leading to a rise in heat stress, said Akhil Srivastava from the National Weather Forecasting Centre (NWFC) of the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

He noted that 2024 has been recorded as the warmest year since 1901, highlighting the growing impact of global climate change.

According to Srivastava, ten of the fifteen warmest years have occurred between 2010 and

2024. The five warmest years, in descending order, are: 2024 (+0.65°C), 2016 (+0.54°C), 2009



(+0.40°C), 2010 (+0.39°C) and 2017 (+0.38°C).

Speaking at the two-day international conclave on 'Climate Change and Global Warming—Issues

and Prospects' at SOA Deemed to be University recently, Srivastava emphasised that it is not only high temperatures that contribute to the severity of heat waves.

Several other meteorological factors also play a significant role in amplifying their impact.

"A combination of meteorological parameters—such as maximum and minimum temperatures, relative humidity, wind speed, heat wave duration, and intensity—worsens the effects of heat

stress," he explained. Srivastava also pointed out that the number of heat wave events increased by about 24 per cent during 2010 to 2019 compared to 2000 to 2009. Meanwhile, the associated mortality rate rose by approximately 27 per cent during the same pe-

riod. He further stated that although the mortality rate due to tropical cyclones has dropped by 94 per cent over the past two decades, deaths related to heatwaves have surged by more than 62 per cent.

"Heatwaves are emerging as the second deadliest form of extreme weather in terms of human casualties and losses, he said.

Archana Nag alleges BJD conspiracy behind arrest

Bhubaneswar, July 12: Archana Nag, arrested in a high-profile honeytrap case, has alleged a political conspiracy involving senior BJD leaders and police officers behind her arrest. Nag claimed that complainant Shradhanjali Behera confessed to being bribed by the BJD, and said she had proof. No official response from the BJD or police has been received yet.

School projects on forest land draw NGT scrutiny

Jajpur, July 12: Development projects worth ₹61.60 crore reportedly undertaken on forest land in Jajpur district without prior approval and environmental clearance from the Forest and Environment department has drawn legal scrutiny.

Taking cognisance of the issue, National Green Tribunal (NGT) has registered a case (109/2025/EZ) alleging unauthorised construction activity in Sukinda and Danagadi blocks under the Forest Protection and Expansion Mission-2023 of the Union government. The complaint was filed by a local resident Kailash Chandra Nayak before the NGT.

A two-member bench of the NGT comprising Justice B Amit Sthalekar and expert member Arun Kumar Verma has directed the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Jajpur Collector, Tehsildars of Danagadi and

Agricultural Science at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kharagpur, Mohanty will be recognised for her study on disease control in groundnut cultivation using artificial intelligence (AI) technology. Her work has received high acclaim from the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers (ASABE), a prestigious organisation based in Toronto, which extended the formal invitation for her visit and recognition.

Sukinda blocks, Cuttack DFO and BDOs of both blocks to file detailed responses within four weeks as per the provisions of the law July 7.

As per the complaint, over 140 school infrastructure units like additional classrooms, new classrooms, toilets and 73 library rooms are being constructed in forest-classified areas in mineral and industrial-rich regions of Danagadi and Sukinda blocks. The work, reportedly sanctioned and funded through the District Mineral Foundation (DMF), has already begun without the necessary

environmental clearances. The DMF has sanctioned ₹13.20 crore for new classrooms in Sukinda block and ₹14 crore in Danagadi block. Additionally, library room construction in Danagadi has received ₹7.30 crore, while ₹14 crore has been sanctioned for additional classrooms in the same block.

Another ₹13.10 crore has been approved for similar

classroom construction in Sukinda. The total sanctioned amount stands at ₹61.60 crore.

These projects are being implemented on "Sabak Jungle" (recorded forest) and "Hal Jungle" (current forest) land, raising serious environmental concerns. The Jajpur Collector, acting as the Managing Trustee of the DMF, reportedly approved these projects and released funds despite the absence of mandatory forest clearance.

The NGT's directive marks the beginning of legal scrutiny into the alleged violations, potentially stalling or halting ongoing construction activities if found to be non-compliant with forest protection laws

In a petition dated March 30, 2025, complainant Kailash Chandra Nayak drew the attention of the state government to the illegal construction activity being taken up without mandatory environmental clearance.

Following the complaint, the Undersecretary of the Forest, Environment and Climate Change department of the Odisha government issued a letter April 9, 2025, to the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, directing an inquiry into the matter and necessary action. However, no action has re-

portedly been taken so far to stop the illegal construction work on forest land. The next hearing in the mat-

ter has been scheduled for August 25, 2025.

AI CAMERAS HELP NAB 3 POACHERS IN SIMILIPAL

Baripada, July 12: Three suspected poachers were arrested and a cache of weapons and hunting gear was seized from the Similipal Tiger Reserve in Mayurbhanj district after they were captured on artificial intelligence (AI)-enabled camera traps.

The arrested individuals have been identified as Jagannath Nayak of Manabhanga village, Budhiram Singh of Pagadadiha, and Kuanr Murmu of Gandadhar village, all under the jurisdiction of Kaptipada police station. Forest officials seized three country-made guns and a large quantity of explosives from the suspects.

One more accused, Budhiram Navak of Pagadadiha, managed to escape. Efforts are underway to apprehend him, according to



Similipal South Division Deputy Director Samrat Gouda.

The suspects were charged under the Wildlife Protection Act and produced in court Saturday. An additional case will be registered under the Arms Act by the police. Gouda confirmed.

According to forest officials, all four suspects had illegally entered the buffer area of the Notto Forest Range under the Similipal South Division Friday. Their movements were captured by AI-powered Trail-Guard cameras.

70K monsoon birds arrive at Bhitarkanika

Kendrapara, July 12: With monsoon active in Odisha, thousands of residential birds have arrived at the Matha Dia, Durgaprasad Dia, and Laxmiprasad Dia heronries within Bhitarkanika National Park for the annual monsoon breeding and nesting season.

According to Manas Kumar Das, Assistant Conservator of Forests (ACF), Kanika Forest Division, around 70,000 residential birds have recently been spotted at these heronries. Prominent species among the arrivals include Openbilled Storks, Black-headed

White Ibises, Purple Herons, Grey Herons, Pond Herons, and Little Cormorants. The birds are drawn to the region's dense mangrove forests and its



serene, pollution-free environment, which continue to serve as an ideal habitat for nesting. Each year, 11 species of residential birds flock to Bhitarkanika National Park during

the monsoon for breeding These include Open-billed Stork, Little Cormorant, Intermediate Egret, Large Egret, Little Egret, Purple Heron, Grey Heron, Night Heron, Darter, White Ibis and Cattle Egret

These birds typically construct their nests on specific mangrove trees, including Guan, Sundari, Sinduka, Bani, Jagula, Keruan, and Oruan. The Matha Dia, Durgaprasad Dia, and Laxmiprasad Dia heronries have become long-estab-

lished and favoured nesting grounds for these birds. However, ACF Das noted that, once again, the birds have avoided the Bagagahan Heronry, which was once a prime location for monsoon species.

During the 2024 annual residential bird census, enumerators recorded 1,30,123 birds across ten species. Last year, 27,282 nests were identified on 1,300 mangrove trees, with the highest concentration found in Laxmiprasad Dia during the current monsoon season.

Socialist Democrat

ne of the most remarkable democratic developments of recent times came from New York City this month. A 33-year-old man of Indian origin won the Democratic Party nomination to run for the mayor of the city. The nomination is a sort of semi-final match, but because New York is a very Democratic Party-leaning city, he is the frontrunner and the likely winner of the election, which is later this year.

Zohran Mamdani is from a Gujarati Muslim family, and his father is a university academic who wrote a famous text after 11 September, 2001, titled 'Good Muslim Bad Muslim'. Zohran's mother is Mira Nair, the director of such movies as 'Monsoon Wedding' and 'Salaam Bombay'. But his background is not the important part of Zohran's story: it is the way in which he competed against and defeated a stalwart of his party, Andrew Cuomo, who was governor of New York state.

The development is important because New York's mayor has serious powers. He oversees a budget of over \$100 billion which is more than that of most countries. He appoints judges, the police commissioner, and heads of more than 40 city agencies and members of boards and commissions. The reason figures like Rudy Giuliani are famous is that they were in this position.

Zohran's platform was socialism and he refers to himself as a dem-

ocratic socialist. This, as many readers will know, is a term that is almost derogatory in the United States because of its history against communism. But Zohran owns the term socialist proudly and says he is there to represent the working class, blue collar and immigrant New Yorkers and not the wealthy. He said he would as mayor freeze rent on 20 lakh homes; he would make city buses free; he would make child care free (a sort of anganwa-

di programme); and he would experiment with state-run grocery shops, starting with one in each of New York's five boroughs. This would be like our ration shops, aimed at subsidising food. He says he will pay for this by marginally raising income taxes, but only on those New Yorkers who have an income of more than \$1 million (over `8 crore) per year.

The second important thing was the quality of Zohran's campaign, which was conducted mostly on social media outlets TikTok and Instagram. Short videos of Zohran, who is a most attractive individual, himself going around the city and talking to New Yorkers about their concerns. These videos are also available on YouTube and they are worth watching for what a low-cost, effective and fresh campaign looks like.

Zohran speaks excellent Hindi, Spanish and Bengali in some of these videos to directly address those from South Asian and Latino backgrounds. He has no problem being comfortable with his identity as a South Asian, compared to other political figures in the US who are of Indian origin. The campaign has a very Bollywood touch to it, including the typefaces used and the editing of the videos.

The third striking thing about Zohran is that he speaks out for the rights of Palestinians and criticises the actions of the Israeli state. This is a most unusual position, because it opens him

up to attack from what scholars like John Mearsheimer have called the Israel Lobby. Zohran's courage shows from his refusal to back down or soften his stand even when running for an election with such high stakes. This is not how politicians behave. The US is the only nation whose democratic candidates are expected to show enthusiastic loyalty to another country.

The fact that he achieved a thumping victory despite having the media including the New York Times attack him viciously and unfairly shows that this courage was respected and admired and rewarded by New York's residents. His own Democratic Party offered him little support and few endorsements even after he won the nomination. There is no Clinton, Biden or Obama today by his side, because of their fear of association with Zohran and what he says and does. In the past, Democrats who have promoted socialist policies, such as Bernie Sanders, have been seen as likeable but marginal figures. Zohran is different. His victory means that his party will have to learn from him, because after the rise of Donald Trump, the Democrats have been in disarray. Currently the Republicans control all three branches of government, the White House, the House of Representatives and the Senate. Democrats have had no real answer to the Trump phenomenon and Zohran, with his emphatic and clear policies aimed at working class Americans offers them a national path for a return. It is a fact, among other things, that the position of most Americans on the issue of Palestine has shifted because of the ongoing genocide in Gaza. It is Zohran who represents this majority which is voiceless in his party. If he is able to win the general election later this year and is then able to deliver on the substance of his policies over the short term, his party will come to him. The US goes into its crucial mid-term elections late next year and the Democrats now have a desi hero to teach them how to contest and on which issues.



he resignation of University of Virginia President James E. Ryan under political pressure from US President Donald Trump's minions and the Virginia state government is the latest shocking turn in the administration's all-out attack on American higher education. Officials from Trump's Justice Department and members of the University's Board of Visitors - several of whom were appointed by Republican Virginia Governor Glenn Youngkin - accused Ryan of moving too slowly to dismantle the university's diversity, equity, and inclusion programs. By the end of June, Ryan had announced his departure.

It is highly unusual for politicians to call the shots at major universities in the US. But such interference is common in failing democracies. Power-hungry presidents and prime ministers replace university leaders with partisan loyalists. They defund or dismantle universities - often the most elite ones. Trump's assault on the University of Virginia - as well as on Harvard, Columbia, and many others - is following this playbook and should be understood as a measure of America's slide into autocracy. Trump's rationale for the crackdown is that many of the top US universities are bastions of "woke" culture and have become dominated, as he put it in 2023, by "Marxist maniacs and lunatics." The universities can't be trusted, the argument goes, to protect students from biased treatment and harassment. The

Other right-wing autocrats around the world have made the same argument – that universities are too progressive – when attacking higher education. But that is far from the only justification. Leftist autocrats have complained that universities are too conservative.

Some politicians might deem universities too secular or too religious. Universities' real threat to autocrats, though, lies in their independence as sites of critical inquiry, which implies an institutional check on these regimes' authority.

Consider Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, who, despite initially coming to power through fair and free elections, has censored the press, crushed legitimate protests, and overseen the country's slide toward autocracy. Most recently, Erdogan ordered the imprisonment of his top political rival, Istanbul Mayor Ekrem Imamoglu.

As part of his efforts to solidify his rule, Erdogan has engaged in a years-long attack on Bogaziçi University, a prestigious public institution known for its academic rigor and diverse and engaged student body. After a failed coup attempt in 2016, Erdogan issued a decree that gave the president the authority to appoint university rectors - atask that normally fell to professors. Soon after, he installed Mehmed Özkan, a biomedical engineering professor at Bogaziçi, as the university's head, instead of the faculty's choice. In 2021, Erdogan further restricted Bogaziçi's academic autonomy by appointing as rector Melih Bulu, an outsider and a loyalist to the president's Justice and Development Party (AKP). This set off student demonstrations and a series of silent protests by faculty members. Erdogan accused protesters of being "communists, terrorists, and traitors," and his government prosecuted many of them, while also imposing other controls that have triggered an exodus of top talent. While Erdogan's AKP rep-

resents a nationalist-conservative alliance, autocratic-minded leaders from the political left have framed their attacks on universities in their own terms. During his tenure as Mexico's president between 2018 and 2024, Andrés Manuel López Obrador (widely known as AMLO), a populist who raised the minimum wage and increased pension payments as he consolidated his power. disparaged top Mexican universities' "neoliberalism." The hostility went beyond rhetoric: Mexico's attorney general made repeated attempts to arrest a group of 31 top scientists on corruption charges, spawning enormous controversy.

AMLO's attacks roiled Centro de Investigación y Docencia Económicas, one of Mexico's top public-research centers and universities. CIDE students protested the government's appointment of a new director, who demoted several administrators. Over the course of its conflict with López Obrador, many CIDE faculty members departed for other schools.

Some autocrats are not satisfied with merely changing the leadership of annoyingly independent universities. Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orbán forced the Central Europe an University out of Budapest; it moved to Vienna, where its faculty continues to engage in excellent research and teaching. At the opposite end of the ideological spectrum, Nicaraguan President Daniel Ortega assumed control of the Jesuit-run Central American University, fired the university's leadership and staff, hired party loyalists, and changed its name. Only the buildings remain the same.

When politicians try to muzzle universities by ousting their leaders, interfering with their research and teaching, and cutting off their funds, the writing is on the wall – and not only for once-great academic institutions. As the US careens toward autocracy, Trump has set his sights on other independent institutions as well. From media outlets to law firms and judges, the president is trying to demolish the pillars of democracy.

Many are resisting, but many are capitulating, normalizing Trump's anti-democratic behaviour in the process. In the case of the University of Virginia, founded by Thomas Jefferson, the principal author of America's Declaration of Independence, the submission to despotism is particularly poignant.

A BRICS threat for dollar

he "King Dollar" is feel-ing threatened—not by a rival superpower, but by a non-currency from BRICS. In response, President Donald Trump has proposed a 10% additional tariff on imports from the bloc. The threat may seem minor, but Trump's reaction tells a different story. Much like the mythical tale of a dwarf almost defeating Arjun, the Mahabharata's warrior-hero, BRICS-despite lacking a common currency—has rattled Washington. Why else would Trump warn that losing the US dollar as the global standard would be akin to losing a "major world war"? This is not just bluster. It signals a grave threat in the making. Trump's brand of America First nationalism is again squaring off against an emboldened. expanded BRICS. This isn't an ideological standoff of capitalism versus socialism; it's a structural battle-unilateralism versus multipolarity, petrodollar dominance versus de-dollarisation. US-led hegemony versus a Global South resurgence. At the heart of this confrontation lies an entire worldview. BRICS-now expanded to include Iran, Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Ethiopia, and the UAE—rep-

resents over 40% of the world's population and more than 30% of GDP (PPP). Over the past decade, BRICS has swelled from five to ten members, with Indonesia joining this year. Saudi

common currency, dubbed the "Unit," have stalled. India, wary of China's yuan hegemony, has rejected the plan. Brazil, the 2025 summit host, also prefers local currency trade over a single BRICS currency. Trump, who previously slashed US funding to WHO and sparred with WTO and NATO, is unlikely to support any multilateral setup that doesn't obey his directives. In contrast, BRICS is building institutional alternatives-creating a vacuum that many neutral or non-aligned countries may now gravitate toward. Though not a military bloc. BRICS shows signs of developing a strategic security understanding—especially between Russia and China. Meanwhile, Trump is expected to ramp up Indo-Pacific militarisation. provoke Taiwan confrontations, and push for NATO expansion. His erratic past-pulling out of Syria, threatening to exit NATO, abandoning Afghanistan-has already diminished US credibility. If BRICS maintains a steady hand in promoting regional security dialogues, it could further shift the global balance. India walks a tightrope. As a founding BRICS member

and a key US strategic partner through the QUAD and bilateral deals, it is under pressure to pick sides. Trump may again press India to align against China, Iran, or Russia, Yet New Delhi appears to be hedging buying discounted Russian oil, testing rupee-based trade with Africa, investing in Iran's Chabahar port, and simultaneously deepening defence ties with Washington. A heavy-handed Trump approach could push India further into the BRICS fold. BRICS apparently is no longer a talking shop. It is a growing counterweight with economic muscle, political ambition, and strategic unity. This is not just about Trump versus BRICS. It's a battle between legacy dominance and emergent pluralism. The unipolar world is fading, and Trump's familiar tactics may see a tough challenge against an unfamiliar, more coordinated resistance. The new Cold War won't be fought over ideology-it will be fought over systems, influence, and who gets to write the rules. And this time, the Global South isn't just a bystander. It's a player. And it's choosing sides. INFA

New Delhi/Paris, July 12: In a win for India, 'Maratha Military Landscapes', representing extraordinary fortification and military system envisioned by the Maratha rulers, has been inscribed on the coveted UNE-SCO World Heritage List. This is India's 44th property to receive the recognition.

This global accolade celebrates India's enduring cultural legacy, showcasing its diverse traditions of architectural brilliance, regional identity and historical continuity, the Culture Ministry said.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Culture Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat along with Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis lauded the historic milestone and congratulated the people of India for this achievement, it said in a statement.

The decision was taken Friday during the ongoing 47th session of the World Heritage Committee (WHC) being held in Paris.

"New inscription on the @ UNESCO #WorldHeritage List Maratha Military Landscapes of India, #India," UNESCO said in a post on X. The nomination for UNESCO tag was for the 2024-25 cvcle.

Its 12 components are - Salher Fort, Shivneri Fort, Lohgad, Khanderi Fort, Raigad, Rajgad, Pratapgad, Suvarnadurg, Panhala Fort, Vijay Durg, Sindhudurg in Maharashtra and Gingee Fort in Tamil Nadu.

These components, distrib uted across diverse geographical and physiographic regions, showcase the strategic military powers of the Maratha rule, the Indian officials had earlier said.

The 'Maratha Military Landscapes' was developed between the 17th and 19th centuries.

There are more than 390 forts in Maharashtra out of which only 12 forts were selected under the Maratha Military Landscapes of India, of these eight forts are protected by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI), the ministry earlier said.

The inception of the Maratha military ideology dates back to the 17th century during the reign of Maratha King Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj by 1670 and continued through subsequent rules until Peshwa rule till 1818, it said.

After viral photos from a Milan fashion show drew criticism from Indian artisans who make the sandals - named after

Lotus beds reappear in Wular Lake after 3 decades

Bandipora (J&K), July 12: After nearly three decades, the lotus has bloomed once again in the Wular Lake in north Kashmir - the second largest freshwater lake in Asia - thanks to conservation efforts after the devastating floods in 1992 had wreaked havoc with its rich ecosystem.

A sea of pink lotuses -- not just crucial for ecology but for the livelihoods of locals -- can be seen in a part of the lake, which is spread in a total area of 200 sq km, covering almost 24 km in length. stretching from the foothills of the Haramukh mountain range in the Bandipora district to Sopore town in the neighbouring Baramulla district.

"This is nothing short of a miracle," Abdul Hameed, a resident, said.

He said that earlier, the locals used to disperse the lotus seeds into the lake, but they achieved nothing. "It did not work. They could not grow because of silt," Hameed said

Kashmir Valley witnessed a devastating flood in 1992 that caused damage to the rich ecosystem of Wular Lake, situated about 70 km from Jammu and Kashmir's summer capital Srinagar.

The flood deposited a large quantity of silt in the lake that buried the lotus vegetation over the years

He said WUCMA embarked on the major project by utilising Cutter Suction Dredgers.

Rasool said the project aimed to restore the critically silted-up area by undertaking dredging. "As of July 2025, around 80 lakh cubic metres of silt has been cleared by WUCMA from Wular Lake. By removing vast quantities of silt, the project has successfully restored nearly

5 sq km of the lake's area, significantly increasing its water holding capacity," he added.

The desilting initiative has been instrumental in restoring the lake's original depth and improving water flow, the official said.

Rasool said it restored sunlight penetration to the lake bed and revitalised conditions, allowing the dormant root structures of the lotus plant to regrow.

The return of lotuses has renewed hopes among the locals of harvesting their edible stems, known as 'nadru' in local parlance.

The water body was once a major source of income for hundreds of families. 'Nadru'

is one of the popular delicacies in Kashmir, and its harvesting provided seasonal employment to many.

The harvesting involves diving neck deep into the water to retrieve the stem. "Nadru was non-existent in the lake for all these years," Ahmad said, adding that it can now be grown and harvested.

The economy of the local population would get a boost now, he said.

Hameed expressed gratitude to the WUCMA for the dredging undertaken in the lake, saying it contributed to the revival of the aquatic plant.

"It is all because of dredging and desilting that we are seeing lotuses blooming once again. This is a blessing from God,' Hameed said.

He implored the people to safeguard the biodiversity of the lake and stop polluting it.

'We have to mend our ways now. It was taken away from us once, and if we do not change, it may be taken away again,' he added.

And it is not just the comeback of lotuses. The increased water depth and improved water quality in the lake have also created a more hospitable environment for diverse aquatic flora and fauna, Rasool said.

"This ecological revival has thus contributed to attracting a greater variety of migratory birds, enhancing the lake's biodiversity," the chief conservator of forests said.

The party, in an application sent to the district magistrate, stated that NC president Farooq Abdullah and other senior functionaries intend to visit the graveyard of martyrs at Naqshband Sahib near Nowhatta Sunday. "The District Administration Srinagar has denied permission to all applicants intending to proceed towards Khawaja Bazar, Nowhatta on 13th July 2025 (Sunday)," Srinagar Police said in a public advisory posted on its handle on X.

The police said that the public is advised to comply with these instructions and refrain from violating the orders issued by the district administration.

Any violation of these orders shall invite strict legal action under relevant provisions of law, the police warned.

Meanwhile, the NC termed the denial of permission deeply unfortunate.

July 13 used to be a public holiday in Jammu and Kashmir before the reorganisation of the erstwhile state into two Union territories in August 2019. How ever, the administration dropped the day from the list of gazetted holidays in 2020.

On the day, mainstream polit ical leaders used to visit the martvrs' gravevard to pay homage to the Kashmiris who fell to the bullets of the Dogra army while protesting against the rule of the Maharaja.

Last year, several leaders were put under house arrest to prevent them from visiting the graveyard.

Kolkata, July 12: A woman was allegedly raped by a student inside a hostel of the Indian Institute of Management Calcutta, police said Saturday.

The accused has been arrest ed on the basis of an FIR lodged by the woman at Haridevpur police station, they said. The alleged incident took place inside the boys' hostel of IIM Calcutta

Friday, a police officer said. "The woman stated in the FIR that she was called to the hostel for a counselling session. She then became unconscious after consuming a drink laced with drugs at the hostel. The woman realised she had been raped after regaining consciousness," he said.

She also alleged that the accused had threatened her with dire consequences if she disclosed the matter to anyone,

the officer said. "The accused student was detained on Friday night before being formally arrested," he said.

Further investigation was underway. The development



came almost a fortnight after a student was allegedly gangraped inside a law college in Kolkata.

A tight security cordon was thrown around the campus and at the main gate with every visitor being stopped and his identity verified.

IIM Calcutta, on the other hand, said that the institute has zero tolerance for such incidents and remains steadfast in upholding a safe and respectful campus environment.

The institute said that the matter is being treated with utmost seriousness and the authorities are fully cooperating with the law enforcement agencies.

Asked if the situation arises would he be ready to defend Varma in Parliament during impeachment proceedings Sibal, who is also a senior ad vocate, said, "This is just an academic issue, first the judge has to ask me.

Sibal's remarks come amid the government beginning the exercise of collecting signatures of MPs to move a motion in Parliament to remove Justice Varma.

Sources said signatures of many MPs from the Lok Sabha have been collected for the impeachment exercise, an indication that the motion may be moved in the Lower House.

Parliamentary Affairs Min ister Kiren Rijiju has said that a motion to remove Varma will be brought in Parliament's next session, beginning from July 21

Slamming the government for moving ahead with collecting signatures, Sibal said, "First of all, what has the government got to do with this? Under the Constitution, either 100 members of the Lok Sabha or 50 members of the Rajya Sabha can move a motion for impeachment. The Constitution process dehors the government."

6 dead, 8 injured in **Delhi building collapse**

New Delhi, July 12: Six people, including a two-year-old girl, died and eight sustained injuries when a four-storev building collapsed in the Welcome area of northeast Delhi on Saturday morning, an official said.

The bodies of the owner of the building, his wife, two sons and two others were retrieved from the debris and sent to GTB Hospital, he said. Eight people have been hospitalised, while attempts are underway to rescue those still trapped under the rubble. Mul tiple agencies, including the NDRF, have been deployed for rescue operations, the official said. A senior police officer said "Around 7.04 am on Satur day, we received information regarding the collapse of a four-storey building near Idgah, Welcome. When the police team reached the spot, they found that three storeys of the building had collapsed.' "So far, eight injured persons have been rescued -- seven have been shifted to JPC Hospital and one to GTB Hospital for treatment. All the listed miss ing persons have been rescued however, the rescue operation is still ongoing," he added. Additional Deputy Commis sioner of Police (Northeast) Sandeep Lamba said, "The owner of the building, Matloob, lived in the building with his family members. The ground floor and first floor were unoccupied. The building opposite also sustained damage The building collapsed when locals were out on their morning walks, many of whom acted as first responders and began trying to rescue those trapped before fire officials arrived at the spot.

Indian legal system facing unique challenges, says CJI Gavai

Hyderabad, July 12: The Indian legal system has been facing unique challenges and delays in trials can sometimes go on for decades, Chief Justice of India BR Gavai said Saturday.

Delivering the convocation address at Nalsar University of Law, Hyderabad near here, Justice Gavai advised students to go abroad for studies on scholarships and not put pressure on family finances

"Our country and legal system are facing unique challenges. Delays in trials can sometimes go for decades. We have seen cases where someone has been found innocent after spending years in jail as an undertrial. Our best talent can help us resolve the problems that we are facing," he said.

The Chief Justice quoted Jed S Rakoff, a senior federal district judge in the United States in this connection. The American judge in his book, "Why the Innocent Plead Guilty and the Guilty Go Free: And Other Paradoxes of Our Broken Legal System," had made the following remark. "Even though I conclude that our legal system is in bad need of fixing, I remain cautiously optimistic that

my fellow (citizens) will rise to the challenge." This comment of the American judge was quoted by CJI Gavai.

Further, the Chief Justice advised the passing out graduates to seek mentors for the sake of integrity and not for their power. On the "pressure to pursue a master's degree abroad", Justice Gavai said, "A foreign degree alone is not a stamp of your worth. Don't take this decision in the reflex of thought or under your peer pressure. What happens next? Years of debt, anxiety, career decisions made under financial burden.'

He cited examples of some young graduates or lawyers taking loans of as much as Rs 50-70 lakh for foreign education. In fact, a small portion of a big amount like Rs 50-Rs 70 lakh can be used as an investment to start independent practice or build an office chamber. The young lawyers can go abroad for studies at a later stage in life when they are stable, he said.

The growing trend of going abroad also reflects a struc tural issue, signalling a lack of confidence in the state of postgraduate legal education and research in our country, Justice Gavai said.

Many who study abroad come back with renewed passion and fresh perspectives, but when they return, they often find institutions unwelcoming, under-resourced or close to new ideas. There are few structured pathways for postdoctoral research, limited funding for early career scholars and opaque hiring processes that discourage even the most committed.

'This must change if we want to keep our best minds or bring them back. We must build nurturing academic environments, offer transparent and merit-based opportunities, and most importantly, restore dignity and purpose to legal research and training in India, he said

The Aircraft Accident Invesigation Bureau (AAIB) has released its preliminary report into the fatal Boeing 787-8 plane crash June 12 that killed 260 people. The report has found that the fuel supply to both engines of Air India flight AI171 was cut off within a second of each other, causing confusion in the cockpit and the airplane plummeting back to the ground almost immediately after taking off. Ahmedabad, July 12: Gajanand Pandya sat on a bench for three hours outside the airport till AI 159 to London took off Saturday. His daughter, son-in-law and granddaughter were on it, and he couldn't bring himself to leave earlier - AI 171 had crashed exactly a month ago, and it was something he just couldn't shake off.

Once news came in that the plane had taken off, Pandya got into a taxi and headed back home to Bhavnagar, about 150 km away. Dates don't always matter but this one-month anniversary of the horrific air disaster that killed 241 onboard and 19 on the ground did.

The crash site is located just 0.9 nautical miles from the departure end of the airport runway.

Four hostel buildings-Atulyam 1 to 4-and the mess building were severely damaged. BJ Medical College Dean Dr. Minakshi Parikh stated that approximately 150 students were displaced and promptly relocated to vacant rooms in other hostels or private apartments rented by the college.

"Within a week, we had made alternative arrangements for accommodation. The damaged mess building is no longer in use, and students are now being served at canteens operating in other hostel buildings,' she said.

The AAIB stated, "As the aircraft was losing altitude, it initially made contact with a series of trees and an incineration chimney inside the Army Medical Corps compound before impacting the northeast wall of Building A (hostel mess)".

The distance between the tree on which the aircraft made its initial contact and the point on Building A where the aircraft impacted is 293 ft.

As the aircraft moved forward, it continued fragmenting and colliding with other structures and vegetation, it said.

The report stated that the vertical stabiliser of the plane separated and came to rest about 200 feet south of the initial point of contact with the first building. The tail section and the main

landing gear (MLG) of the air craft were found embedded in the northeast wall of the same building while the rest of the aeroplane continued its forward movement, it said. The damaged terrace of the mess building is leaning, with a gaping hole cre ated by the tail which was re moved ten days after the crash

Further describing the impact of the crash, the AAIB report stated that the right engine of the aircraft struck the concrete water tank structure and rested underneath it after separating from the aeroplane

Different parts of the air craft separated after its initial contact with the first building and struck four other build ings. The parts of the right wing were found in two affected buildings and the surrounding areas, while the left engine hit the north corner of the fourth building at ground level.

"The engine, remaining portions of the attached cowling, and the surrounding area were heavily damaged by fire,' it said.

Russian attacks kill 6 in Ukraine

Kviv: At least six people were killed overnight and Saturday as Russia continued to pound Ukraine with hundreds of drones and missiles as part of a stepped-up bombing campaign that has further dampened hopes for a breakthrough in efforts to end the more than three-yearold war. Two people died and 14 were wounded when Russian forces overnight attacked the Bukovina area in the Chernivtsi region of southwestern Ukraine with four drones and a missile, regional Gov Ruslan Zaparaniuk said Saturday. He said that the two people died due to falling debris from a drone. A drone attack in Ukraine's western Lviv region wounded 12 people, regional Gov Maksym Kozytskyi said. Russia fired 597 drones and decoys, along with 26 cruise missiles, into Ukraine

Bridgewater, July 12: President Donald Trump Saturday announced he's levying tariffs of 30 per cent against the European Union and Mexico starting August 1.

Trump announced the planned tariffs on two of the United States' biggest trade partners in letters posted to his social media account. They are part of an announcement blitz by Trump of new tariffs with allies and foes alike, a bedrock of his 2024 campaign that he said would set the foundation for reviving a US economy that he claims has been ripped off by other nations for decades.

In his letter to Mexico's leader, Trump acknowledged that the country has been helpful in stemming the flow of undocumented migrants and fentanyl into the United States. But he said the country has not done enough to stop North America from turning into a "Narco-Trafficking Playground."

"Mexico has been helping me secure the border, BUT, what Mexico has done, is not enough," Trump added.

The Mexico tariff, if it goes into effect, could replace the 25 per cent tariffs on Mexican goods that do not comply with the existing US-Mexico-Canada free trade agreement.

Trump's letter did not ad dress if USMCA-compliant goods would still be exempt from the Mexico tariffs after Aug. 1, as the White House said would be the case with Canada. Trump sent a letter to Canada earlier this week threatening a 35 per cent tariff hike.

With Saturday's letters, Trump has now issued tariff conditions on 24 countries and the 27-member European Union.

The European Union's chief trade negotiator said earlier this week that a trade deal to avert higher tariffs on European goods imported to the US could be reached "even in the coming days.

Maroš Šefcovic told EU lawmakers in Strasbourg, France Wednesday that the EU had been spared the increased tariffs contained in the letters Trump sent Monday, and that an extension of talks would provide "additional space to reach a satisfactory conclusion.'

The bloc collectively sells more to the US than any other country. US goods imports from the EU topped USD 553 billion in 2022, according to the Office of the US Trade Representative.

Cairo/Jerusalem/Gaza, July 12: Talks aimed at securing a ceasefire in Gaza are stalling over the extent of Israeli forces' withdrawal from the Palestinian enclave, Palestinian and Israeli sources familiar with the negotiations in Doha said Saturday.

The indirect talks over a US proposal for a 60-day ceasefire are nonetheless expected to continue, the sources said.

In Gaza, medics said 17 people trying to get food aid were killed Saturday when Israeli troops opened fire, the latest mass shooting around a US-backed aid distribution system that the UN says has resulted in 800 people killed in

six weeks. Witnesses who spoke to Reuters described people being shot in the head and torso. Reuters saw several bodies of victims wrapped in white shrouds as family members wept at Nasser Hospital.

The Israeli military said its troops had fired warning shots, but that its review of the incident had found no evidence of anyone hurt by its soldiers' fire.

Delegations from Israel and Hamas have been in Qatar for a week in a renewed push for an agreement which envisages a phased release of hostages, Israeli troop withdrawals and discussions on ending the war. US President Donald Trump,

ister Benjamin Netanyahu over the past week, had said he hoped for a deal soon. But the Israeli and Palestinian sources described longstanding issues that remain unresolved. A Palestinian source said that Hamas had rejected with-

drawal maps which Israel had proposed that would leave around 40% of Gaza under Is raeli control, including all of the southern area of Rafah and further territories in northern and eastern Gaza.

Two Israeli sources said Hamas wanted Israel to retreat to lines it held in a previous ceasefire before it renewed its offensive in March.

The Palestinian source said matters regarding aid and guarantees on an end to the war were also presenting a challenge. The crisis could be resolved with more U.S. intervention, the source said.

Hamas has long demanded an agreement to end the war before it would free remaining hostages; Israel has insisted it would end the fighting only when all hostages are released and Hamas is dismantled as a fighting force and administra tion in Gaza.

Saturday's reported mass shooting near an aid distribution point in Rafah was the latest in a series of such incidents that the United Nations rights office said Friday had seen at least 798 people killed trying to get food in six weeks.

N-talks with US to resume if no further attacks: Iran

Tehran, July 12: Iran's foreign minister said Saturday that his country would accept a resumption of nuclear talks with the US if there were assurances of no more attacks against it, state media reported.

Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said in a speech to Tehran-based foreign diplomats that Iran has always been ready and will be ready in the future for talks about its nuclear programme, but, "assurance should be provided that in case of a resumption of talks, the trend will not lead to war.' Referring to the 12-day Israeli bombardment of Iran's nuclear and military sites, and the US strike on June 22, Araghchi said that if the US and others wish to resume talks with Iran, "first of all, there should be a firm guarantee that such actions will not be repeated. The attack

has made it more difficult and complicated to achieve a solution based on negotiations.'

Following the strikes, Iran suspended cooperation with the UN nuclear watchdog, which led to the departure of inspectors.

Araghchi said that under Iranian law, the country will answer the agency's request for cooperation "case by case," based on Iran's interests.

He also said any inspection by the agency should be done based on Iran's "security" concerns as well as the safety of the inspectors.

San Francisco, July 12: Boeing reached a settlement with a Canadian man whose family died in the March 2019 crash of an Ethiopian Airlines Boeing 737 MAX, the man's lawyer said on Friday.

The terms of the settlement with Paul Njoroge of Toronto were not released. The 41-yearold man's wife Carolyne and three young children - Ryan, 6, Kellie, 4, and nine-month-old Rubi - died in the crash. His motherin-law was traveling with them and also died in the crash.

The trial was scheduled to start Monday in US District Court in Chicago and would have been the first against the US planemaker stemming from two fatal 737 MAX crashes in 2018 and 2019 that together killed 346 people. Boeing also averted a trial in April, when it settled with the families of two other victims in the Ethiopian Airlines crash. The planemaker declined to comment on the latest settlement. The two accidents led to a 20-month grounding of the company's best-selling jet and cost

Blast in Yemen kills 5 children

Aden: Five children in southwestern Yemen died after an explosive device detonated in a residential area where they were playing soccer, rights groups and eye witnesses said Saturday. The circumstances surrounding their deaths Friday night in the Al-Hashmah subdistrict of Taiz province remain unclear. However, the Yemen Centre for Human Rights and another rights group called Eye of Humanity along with Houthicontrolled Al-Masirah TV said an artillery shell was fired by militias backed by the Islah party, which is allied to the internationally recognised government in south Yemen. A spokesperson for the United Nations children's agency UNICEF told The Associated Press that they are aware of reports about the incident but can't verify the facts at the moment. Two local residents who were eyewitnesses, Ahmed al-Sharee and Khaled al-Areki, told the AP that the children were playing soccer when the explosion happened. At least three people with minor to moderate injuries were also taken to the hospital, according to the eyewitnesses. Meanwhile, Mahmoud al-Mansi, another eyewitness, said the explosive was directed from an area where forces allied with the Islah party were present.

UNESCO heritage tag for sites of Khmer Rouge brutality

Phnom Penh, July 12: Three locations used by Cambodia's brutal Khmer Rouge regime as torture and execution sites 50 years ago have been added by UNESCO to its World Heritage List.

on Iran's nuclear facilities

The three locations were inscribed to the list by the United Nations cultural agency Friday during the 47th Session of the World Heritage Committee in Paris.

The inscription coincided with the 50th anniversary of the rise to power by the communist Khmer Rouge government, which caused the deaths of an estimated 1.7 million Cambodians through starvation, torture and mass executions during a four-year reign from 1975 to 1979.

UNESCO's World Heritage List lists sites considered important to humanity and includes the Great Wall of China, the Pyramids of Giza in Egypt, the Taj Mahal in India and Cambodia's Angkor archaeological complex.

The three sites listed Friday



include two notorious prisons and an execution site immortalised in a Hollywood film.

Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum, located in the capital Phnom Penh, is the site of a former high school used by the Khmer Rouge as a notorious prison. Better known as

S-21, about 15,000 people were imprisoned and tortured there.

The M-13 prison, located in rural Kampong Chhnang province in central Cambodia, also was regarded as one of the main prisons of the early Khmer Rouge.

Choeung Ek, located about 15

kilometresouth of the capital, was used as an execution site and mass grave. The story of the atrocities committed there are the focus of the 1984 film "The Killing Fields," based on the experiences of New York Times photojournalist Dith Pran and correspondent Sydney Schanberg.

The Khmer Rouge captured Phnom Penh on April 17, 1975, and immediately herded almost all the city's residents into the countryside, where they were forced to toil in harsh conditions until 1979, when the regime was driven from power by an invasion from neighbouring Vietnam.

In September 2022, the UNbacked Extraordinary Chambers in the Courts of Cambodia, better known as the Khmer Rouge tribunal, concluded its work compiling cases against Khmer Rouge leaders. The tribunal cost USD 337 million over 16 years but convicted just three men.

Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet issued a message Friday directing people to beat drums simultaneously across the country Sunday morning to mark the UNESCO listing.

"May this inscription serve as a lasting reminder that peace must always be defended," Hun Manet said in a video message posted online. "From the darkest chapters of history, we can draw strength to build a better

future for humanity." Youk Chhang, executive director of the Documentation Center of Cambodia in Phnom Penh, said the country is "still grappling with the painful legacies of genocide, torture, and mass atrocity." But naming the three sites to the UNESCO list

will play a role in educating younger generations of Cam bodians and others worldwide "Though they were the land scape of violence, they too will and can contribute to heal the wounds inflicted during that era

that have yet to heal," he said. The UNESCO inscription was Cambodia's first nomination for a modern and non-classical archaeological site and is among the first in the world to be submitted as a site associate

ed with recent conflict, Cambo dia's Ministry of Culture and Fine Arts said in a statement Friday. Four Cambodian archaeo-

logical sites were previously inscribed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites including Angkor, Preah Vihear, Sambo Prei Kuk and Koh Ker, the ministry said.

Air passenger traffic touches 1.38cr in June

New Delhi: Domestic air passenger traffic rose 5.1 per cent to over 1.38 crore in June on an annual basis but declined marginally compared to May, a report said. Rating agency ICRA also said the country's aviation industry is projected to report a net loss of ₹2,000 to 3,000 crore in FY2026, amid rising ATF prices and geopolitical risks. While maintaining a stable outlook for the industry, ICRA said that supply chain disruptions, including Pratt & Whitney engine issues, continue to impact capacity and costs. In the first quarter of 2025-26, domestic air passenger traffic stood at over 4.22 crore. According to the report, the industry witnessed steady pricing power in FY2025, with stable yields and domestic air passenger traffic growth tapered to 7.6 per cent.

New Delhi, July 12: Household credit extended heavily to 42.1 per cent of the gross domestic product (GDP) in FY24, which was steady in the range of 32 to 35 per cent during FY13 to FY20, a report revealed Friday, showing growing optimism in the resilient economy. This comes after a sharp in-

crease in household financial liabilities post-pandemic period, according to the National Stock Exchange (NSE) market

pulse report. This growing credit footprint highlights increased financial access and confidence among households in the post-pandemic phase, "Household credit has expanded meaningfully,

from remaining stable at 32-35 per cent of GDP during FY13 to FY20 to witness a marked increase to 39.9 per cent in FY21 and further to 42.1 per cent in FY24," the report stated

The report also observed that net household financial savings, which saw an exception-



al rise to 11.7 per cent of GDP in FY21 due to pandemic-induced caution and reduced In FY24, savings stood at 5.2% of GDP

stood at 5.2 per cent of GDP, according to the report. This decline can partly be

attributed to the decline in household financial liabilities, rising from 3.7 per cent of GDP in FY21 to 6.2 per cent in FY24.

"Post Covid, household financial liabilities have nearly tripled from ₹7.4 lakh crore in FY21 to ₹18.8 lakh crore in FY24," according to the report.

The increase in the liabil ities has compressed net financial savings from a peak of ₹23.3 lakh crore in FY21 to just ₹15.5 lakh crore in FY24.

The post-Covid developments in net financial savings and financial liabilities contributed to a substantial recovery in pri vate consumption, with an average growth of 6.7 per cent during FY23-FY25. The consumption growth is partly driven by a surge in household credit, according to the NSE market pulse report.

Govt eases sulphur emission rules for coal power plants

Federal environment ministry issued a gazette notification that exempted 79% of the coal-fired power plants, outside a 10-km (6 mile) radius of populated and polluted cities, from the 2015 mandate

New Delhi, July 12: India has reversed a decade-old mandate to install \$30 billion worth of clean-air equipment, easing sulphur emission rules for most coal-fired power plants, a government order said.

Reuters in December reported the government was reviewing 2015 norms that required nearly 540 coal-based power units to install flue-gas desulphurisation (FGD) systems that remove sulphur from the

plants' exhaust gases in phases

starting in 2027.

The federal environment ministry late Friday issued a gazette notification that exempted 79% of the coal-fired power plants, outside a 10-km (6 mile) radius of populated and polluted cities, from the 2015 mandate.

The mandate to install FGD for another 11% of the plants near populated cities would be taken on a "case-to-case basis," the notification said.

The balance of 10% of the coal-fired power plants closer to New Delhi and other cities with a million-plus population will be required to install the



desulphurisation equipment by December 2027, according to the new mandate.

The chess great dismantled **ChatGPT in 53** flawless moves

Washington, July 12: Magnus Carlsen, the reigning titan of chess, has claimed yet another victory—this time against an AI opponent.

In a casual online game played during travel downtime, Carlsen dismantled ChatGPT in just 53 moves without sacrificing a single piece. The game ended with the chatbot conceding defeat and praising the Norwegian grandmaster's clinical strategy and execution.

Carlsen shared screenshots of the match on social media with a tonguein-cheek remark: "I sometimes get bored while travelling." What followed was a masterclass in control, patience, and calculation. ChatGPT, despite starting strong, quickly found itself outplayed in the middle game and failed to mount any real counterattack. The result? A textbook win that further cements Carlsen's standing as one

of the greatest chess players in history. All my pawns are gone ... I resign

ChatGPT's post-game analysis gave credit where it was due. It highlighted how comfortably Carlsen handled the Philidor Defence, controlled the board with accurate piece placement like ... Bf8 and ... Re8, and executed a sharp tactical shift with ... Nf3+. The AI also commended his

endgame finesse, describing how a small positional edge was transformed into a decisive win with "discipline and precision."

Interestingly, Carlsen also caught an illegal move during the match—a sign of his over-the-board instincts and deep pattern recognition that even AI couldn't override.

While it was far from a competitive showdown, the game served as a reminder of the enduring gap between elite human intuition and artificial pattern matching in chess. It also showcased Carlsen's relaxed brilliance and how, even during a casual match, his standards never slip.
