VP Dhankhar resigns

New Delhi, July 21: In a sudden move, Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar Monday evening resigned from his post citing medical reasons. He has sent his resignation to

President Droupadi Murmu and said he is stepping down with immediate effect.

"To prioritise health care and abide by medical advice, I hereby resign as Vice President of India, effective immediately, in accordance with Article 67(a) of the Constitution," Dhankhar said in his letter to the President.

Dhankhar, 74, assumed office in August 2022 and his tenure was till 2027. He is also the Chairman of the Rajya Sabha and his resignation came on the first day of the Monsoon session of Parliament. He had recently underwent angioplasty at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi.

In his eventful tenure as Chairman of the Rajya Sabha, Dhankhar has had several run-

ins with the Opposition, which had also moved a motion to impeach him. The motion to remove him, the first time ever in independent India to remove a sitting Vice President, was later rejected by Rajya Sabha Deputy Chairman Harivansh.

Dhankhar's abrupt resignation follows a day of surprising development in Rajya Sabha for the government, as an Opposi tion-sponsored notice for a motion to remove Justice Yashwant Varma was submitted to him and he mentioned it in the House.

-7/11 train blasts: All 12 accused acquitted

Mumbai, July 21: Nineteen years after seven train blasts here killed more than 180 persons, the Bombay High Court Monday acquitted all the 12 accused, saying the prosecution "utterly failed" to prove the case and it was "hard to believe the accused committed the crime".

The judgement comes as a major embarrassment to the Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) which probed the case. The agency had claimed that the accused were memhers of the banned outfit Students' Islamic Movement of India (SIMI) and had hatched the conspiracy with Pakistani members of terror group Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT).

New Delhi, July 21: The Supreme Court Monday used "shame" and "unfortunate" to describe the incident wherein a 15-year-old girl of Balanga in Puri district was set on fire. while underscoring the need for providing safety net for women, especially those in rural areas.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and Joymalya Bagchi said. "We need suggestions from everyone on what concrete steps can be taken to empower the school girls, homemakers, children in rural areas, who are the most vulnerable



directions should have some impact and visible imprint."

Some short-term and longterm directions need to be issued for immediate and for future, so that women living in taluka level could be made aware and empowered, it added.

The bench said para legal volunteers, particularly women could be trained and appointed at taluka level and even help of Anganwadi workers could be taken to make the women aware of their rights.

Senior advocate Mahalakshmi Pavani, appearing for the petitioner Supreme Court Women Lawyers' Association, said a couple of days ago, the minor was burnt and similar incidents took place in Maha"How long will this go on?

This court needs to pass some directions for the safety of women." Pavani said.

The bench said, "We are in shame and it is unfortunate that these incidents are still taking place. This is not adversarial litigation. We need suggestions from the Centre and all the parties.'

Justice Kant said the registry has not put the affidavit of the Centre on record and posted the matter next week.

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, appearing for the Centre, said the Union government gave details of steps and said CCTV cameras and face scan systems would be installed in public places to identify sexual offenders and timely actions.

She said one-stop centres were now functioning in every district which would be helpful for the women in distress. The bench, however, said while onestop centre was good, it needed to go to the taluka level.

On December 16, last year, the SC agreed to examine a plea seeking directions to frame pan-India guidelines for a safe environment for women, children and transpersons.

Jajpur, July 21: Close on the heels of the self-immolation death of a female student of FM (Autonomous) College in Balasore over alleged inaction on her sexual harassment complaint and another girl set ablaze under Balanga police limits of Puri district, a 15-year-old hockey player was allegedly raped by three persons, including two of her coaches, in Jajpur district.

Though the incident occurred July 3 evening, it came to the fore after the victim filed a complaint at Jajpur town police station Monday.

Police registered a case under Section 70 (2), 351 (2), 74, and 3 (5) of BNS and Section 6 of POCSO Act-2012. Police also recorded the statement of the survivor before the magistrate at Jajpur Court Monday.

According to the complaint, the minor has been undergoing training at Jajpur hockey stadium in the district headquarters town for the past two years.

On July 3 evening, when the girl was going home, her coach and his two associates allegedly abducted her from the street took her to a lodge and sexualsaid. CCTVs at CBSE schools

New Delhi: The Central Board

of Secondary Education (CBSE) has amended affiliation norms to mandate schools to install CCTVs with real-time audiovisual recording at all places other than toilets, an official said Monday. The schools were asked to install high resolution CCTV cameras with audio visual facility at all the entry and exit points of the school, lobbies, corridors, staircases, all the classrooms. labs, library, canteen area, store room, playground and other common areas except toilets and washrooms with real time audiovisual recording.

20 killed, 171 injured in Bangladesh plane crash

Dhaka, July 21: A Bangladesh Air Force training fighter jet crashed into a school building in Dhaka shortly after takeoff Monday, killing at least 20 people, mostly children, and injuring 171, in one of the deadliest aviation accidents in the country's recent history

The F-7 BGI aircraft, a training fighter jet manufactured in China, crashed into the two-storey building of Milestone School and College at Diabari in Dhaka's Uttara area. The pilot, Flight Lieutenant

Mohammad Towkir Islam, was killed in the crash.

According to an updated statement from the Inter-Services Public Relations Directorate (ISPR), 20 people, including the pilot, have died and 171 oth-



The pilot attempted to steer the aircraft away from densely populated areas. However, despite his efforts, the aircraft tragically crashed into the two-storey building of the school, said the ISPR - the media wing of the military

The aircraft crashed due to a mechanical fault after taking off from Bangladesh Air Force Base AK Khandaker in Kurmitola at 01:06 pm as part of a regular training, sources said.

Sydney, July 21: Rasti Vaibhav and Rupali Rastogi, an Indian couple, who moved to Australia with modest means, are gaining widespread attention for their remarkable success. They adopted a bold strategy of investing in properties, instead of buying a house to live in.

According to a 'Daily Mail' report, the couple came to Aus-

tralia in 2006 and have since built an impressive property investment portfolio, now owning 18 properties at an estimated \$11.3 million. The couple, with experience in IT and banking, started their investment journey in 2011 with a 10 per cent mortgage deposit. They began by buying land and building a \$440,000, four-bedroom house in Fletcher, a suburb of New-Their properties are strate-

gically located in areas such as Sydney's outer west, Melbourne's north, Brisbane's fringes, and south of Perth. According to Vaibhay, one of the biggest mistakes Australians make is prioritising saving for a mortgage deposit to live in a desirable suburb as owner-occupiers, only to find prices have surged out of reach. They argue that buying a home to live in may not be the most strategic



decision for Australians, citing the potential benefits of investing in property instead.

'It's very emotional - I live in my own home and I can choose to change the décor as and when I like it" - but just be

aware that it's very costly. The traditional way of what people have learnt about debt... is that "I need to have my own home and then when I am paid off, then I'll be looking at investments," Vaibhav told 'Daily Mail Australia'.

The couple has flipped the traditional approach to homeownership. Instead of buying a \$3.5 million home in a desirable Sydney suburb, they're renting a place in Narraweena for \$100,000 a year. Meanwhile, they've built a substantial property portfolio that's likely to appreciate faster than wages. Mr. Vaibhav noted that paying \$230,000 annually in mortgage repayments for a similar home

nearby wasn't worth it. Sydney's median house price is around \$1.6 million, making it challenging for first-home buyers to save for a 20% deposit and afford stamp duty.

"They have to keep saving, keep earning and if you look at the average rate of saving, that will take a few years for them to get to that point, but by the time they get there, the price has already shot up further. It be comes unaffordable for a lot of people on average. We chose the path that's not so conventional It's much easier to think about rent-vesting. Live where you want to live for the lifestyle for the friends, for the school for the workplace," Vaibhav remarked. After living in Epping, they

moved to Sydney's northern beaches, renting in North Curl Curl and later Narraweena, to be close to a selective school and the ocean. Their daughter's de sire to live near the beach drove the decision, and they preferred renting to achieve this lifestyle rather than buying a house in a far-off suburb.



Bhubaneswar, July 21: The Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) Monday constituted a fact-finding committee to investigate the rape allegations against the party's student wing president Udit Pradhan who has been suspended by the NSUI.

OPCC president Bhakta Charan Das has directed the newly formed committee to thoroughly examine the incident, hold discussions with the complainant, and submit a detailed report to the state party headquarters at the

The committee comprises Barabati - Cuttack MLA Sofia Firdous, OPCC secretary Debasmita Sharma, former MLA candidate Sonali Sahoo, OPCC spokespersons Jayashree Patra and Manisha Das Pattnaik.

The vice president of OPCC, Sasmita Behera, has been apfact-finding committee.

In another significant development, Pradhan was suspended from the NSUI by its national president Varun Choudhury

"In view of recent developments, the NSUI Odisha state president has been suspended with immediate effect, pending inquiry. NSUI maintains a gender-based injustice and is unwavering in its commitment to accountability and justice. Our fight for justice for the Balasore victim will continue with full resolve,' read the order.

Pradhan was arrested by Mancheswar Police in Bhubaneswar for allegedly raping a 19-year-old female engineering student after spiking her soft drink with intoxicants.

According to police sources. Pradhan was arrested following a formal complaint lodged by the survivor Sunday. He was produced in a court for remand

spiked soft drink by Pradhan.

Senapati said the girl later stated that she felt unwell and asked to go home. When her friend left the place.

According to the complaint, when the girl regained consciousness, she discovered that she had been sexually assaulted. She was allegedly threatened and warned not to speak about the incident, which led her to remain silent for a while out of fear.

Police have also grilled others who were allegedly present during the incident. "So far, four people have been identified to be involved, and two have already been questioned. The role of others is being examined," the ACP added.

CCTV footage from the hotel is being analysed, and room booking details are under scrutiny to verify who booked the room and under whose name it was registered.

Further investigation is on to trace the hotel staff, other guests, and any digital evidence, police said.

"Within a short span, the policy has significantly enhanced Odisha's aviation footprint both globally and domestically. A total of 13 new international and domestic flight services have been operationalised under the New Destination Policy, opening new corridors for trade,

2,015 built heritage & sites in

ASI does not maintain any inventory of privately-owned heritage homes: **Ministry of Culture**

New Delhi/Bhubaneswar, July 21: As many as 2,015 built heritage and sites in Odisha which are 100 years old or more are among the 11,406 so far documented by the National Mission on Monuments and Antiquities (NMMA), according to data pre sented by the Ministry of Culture in the Lok Sabha Monday.

Responding to a question of Kakinada MP Tangella Uday Srinivas, Union Culture Min ister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat said, "The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) does not maintain any inventory of privately-owned heritage homes, specifically, however, the Government of India has established the NMMA in 2007 to prepare two national registers on monuments and antiquities from length and breadth across the country.'

The Union Minister, in his written response, shared the state-wise break-up of the 11,406 built heritage and sites, which has been published on the NM-MA website.

The built heritage and sites

Rare earth oxide in Odisha

Atomic Minerals Directorate for Exploration and Research (AMD), under the Department of Atomic Energy (DAE), has estimated presence of approximately 7.23 million tonnes (MT) of in-situ rare earth oxide (REO) in 13.15 MT of monazite to a question in Raiva Sabha, Union Coal and Mines Minister G Kishan Reddy said Atomic Minerals Directorate for Exploration and Research (AMD), a constituent unit of Department of Atomic Energy (DAE), is carrying out exploration and augmentation of rare earth group elements along coastal/inland/riverine placer sands, as well as in hard rock terrains in several potential geological domains in the country." The minister further said, "As on date, AMD has estimated approximately 7.23 million tonnes (MT) of in-situ Rare Farth Oxide (RFO) contained in 13.15 MT of monazite in coastal beach, teri/red sand and inland alluvium in parts of Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Guiarat and Maha rashtra." He further said that 1.29 MT of in-situ REO resources have been identified in hard rocks in Gujarat and Rajasthan, adding that, as per DAE, mining is feasible for these resources. Besides, GSI has augmented 482.6 MT resources of REE ore at various cut-off grades in 34 exploration projects. The National Critical Minerals Mis sion, launched in 2025 by the government, aims to establish a self-reliant domestic supply chain for critical minerals, including rare earths, he said.

According to its website, the NMMA's objectives include documentation and creation of a suitable database on built heritage and sites through published and unpublished secondary sources for information and dissemination to planners and researchers and for better management of such cultural resources. Besides, to promote awareness and sensitise people concerning the benefits of preserving the historical and cultural aspects of built heritage, sites and antiquities.

Shekhawat was also asked whether any financial assistance, tax incentives or special schemes exist to support the private owners in the conservation, restoration or adaptive reuse of such heritage properties, and if so, the details there of; and whether the government has 'any proposal to introduce a dedicated Central scheme' to provide financial or technical assistance for conservation of privately-owned heritage homes, and if so, the details and timeline thereof.

"This is outside the mandate of ASI," the Union Minister said in response to the two queries.

There are 3,698 centrally-protected monuments and sites and 52 museums under the ambit of the ASI.

The ASI was set up in 1861 and it comes under the purview of the Ministry of Culture.

AAP protests, seeks Guv's intervention


Paika Rebellion in Vol 2 of NCERT book

The second volume, currently in its final stages of development, is slated for release in September-October 2025 and will comprehensively cover regional resistance movements and armed uprisings, including Paika Rebellion of Odisha, Kuka Movement in Punjab, and others.

Paika Rebellion of 1817, led

by Bakshi Jagabandhu in Odisha, is often cited as one of the earliest organised revolts against British colonial rulepredating the 1857 uprising by four decades. The Paikas, a warrior class of Odisha, rose in protest against British economic policies, land revenue changes, and interference in traditional institutions.

1st merit list out for 3-yr LLB courses

Bhubaneswar, July 21: The Higher Education department Monday released the first selection merit list for admission into 3-year LLB courses for the 2025-26 academic session. A total of 360 students have been selected across three participating law colleges in Odisha.

The merit-based cut-off marks for the three participating institutions varied,

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with University Law College Bhubaneswar registering the highest at 82.23 per cent, followed by Madhusudan Law University, Cuttack at 79.42 per cent, and Lingaraj Law College, Berhampur at 75.13 per cent.

Selected students are given two options—Freeze or Slide. Students opting for the Freeze option must pay their admis sion fees online, download the intimation letter, and report to their respective HEIs between July 22 and July 24 (from 10am to 5am) to complete admission formalities.

Those choosing the Slide option are also required to pay the admission fees online but are not required to report or download the intimation letter. These students will be considered for possible upgradation in the next round of selection.

This announcement marks a significant step in the 2025-26 academic admission cycle.

Woman consumes poison inside PS alleging inaction

Nayagarh, July 21: A woman allegedly attempted suicide by consuming poison inside the Itamati police station in Nayagarh district Monday morning, protesting what she described as police inaction in a cheating case against her lover.

The woman was admitted to the district headquarters hospital in Nayagarh in critical condition. Doctors initially considered referring her to a Bhubaneswar facility but later said her condition had stabilised and was under control. Tehsildar Rakesh Swain also reached the hospital and recorded the woman's statement in the presence of a magistrate.

The incident drew significant public attention and sparked tension in Itamati area. It also raised questions over handling of sensitive cases involving survivors of abuse by the local police.

According to reports, the accused Alok Swain, son of a CRPF jawan from Saradhapur village, allegedly established a physical relationship with the woman under a false promise of marriage. When he later refused to marry her, the woman lodged a complaint at the Itamati police station.

Police arrested Swain and produced him in court, but he was granted bail after the case was registered under lenient sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), the woman's family claimed. They also alleged that Swain's family began harassing them after

Speaking from her hospital bed, the woman accused police of siding with the accused. "My lover cheated on me, and when I went to the police, they failed to act. Instead, they sympathised with him," she said tearfully. "Now he walks free while I face unbearable trauma. Who will marry me now?'

She further claimed that Swain's family assaulted her brother and then filed a counter-case, which led police to target her family instead of the accused. "If my brother is jailed, how will our family survive?' she asked.

The woman also said she had approached the Sub-Divisional Police Officer (SDPO), the Superintendent of Police, and the State Women's Commission, but no concrete action was taken. "They questioned my political affiliation instead of helping me. I was pushed to the edge."

Nayagarh SDPO Jyoti Samantaray and Itamati Inspector-in-Charge Priyabrata Rout denied any negligence. They said acting on the woman's complaint, they had arrested the accused from Raipur after registration of a case (42/25) and sent him to jail.

Police confirmed that Sunday's incident resulted in two additional cases — one filed by the accused's father (Case No. 264/25), in which the victim's brother was named as the prime accused. Simultaneously, the victim's family filed a counter-complaint, registered as Case No. 265/25.

Police clarified that no chargesheet on rape has been submitted yet in the court. "When the case is pending in court and the woman insists on becoming the man's wife, what kind of justice can the police deliver?" they said.

They also confirmed that the suicide attempt inside the police station was recorded on CCTV, and the incident has not been ignored.

Woman charred to death in Berhampur

Berhampur: In a tragic incident, a woman died after sustaining burn injuries from a kitchen fire Monday evening at Lane-5 of Nilanchal Nagar under Nimakhandi police limits in Berhampur. The deceased has been identified as Namita Rath, 55, wife of Harishankar Rath, According to reports, the incident took place when Namita was home alone. Fire department personnel rushed to the scene after receiving an alert and rescued her in a half-burnt state. She was immediately taken to MKCG Medical College and Hospital, where doctors declared her dead. Police said preliminary investigation suggested that Namita, who was mentally unstable, might have accidentally caught fire while cooking. She was reportedly preparing food using a gas stove when the mishap occurred. A case of unnatural death has been registered As the incident happened late in the evening, the body has been preserved for autopsy, which will be conducted later. Sources said Harishankar Namita, and their daughter were living in a rented house in Nilanchal Nagar. Harishankar and his daughter had locked the house from outside and left for some work Monday, while Namita remained inside. In the evening, the house owner noticed smoke coming out of the residence and immediately alerted the police and fire services. Police said an investigation is ongoing to ascertain the exact cause of the fire.

Voting At 16

t has long been held that when one is young, one tends to subscribe to pro poor and people oriented progressive politics which are now being labelled in a blanket manner as Left wing politics, while some argue that with age they cease to look at political reality with the prism of Left ideology. Such a tendency is ascribed to the belief that the youth react more with their heart – emotions – than their brain – reason- and maturity with the passage of time makes an individual more balanced and rely less on emotions. Political scientists and psychologists are yet to come to a definite conclusion on the issue, even as Far-Right politicians in the West are now swaying the youth with their extreme and intolerant political credo and agenda. It is interesting that against this backdrop the UK government run by the Labour Party has announced that it will lower the voting age from 18 to 16. The Labour Party administration says it is part of a package of changes to strengthen British democracy and help restore trust in politics. But, the Far-Right opposition party, persuaded by the belief that a young mind tilts towards the Left, has lambasted the government decision accusing the Labour Party of trying to consolidate their support base with the participation of school students in the country's general elections.

Experts say the phenomenon of young voters is complicated, with mixed evidence about how lowering the voting age affects democracy and election outcomes. Britain's voting age last fell in 1969, when the UK became one of the first major democracies to lower it from 21 to 18. Many other countries, including the United States, followed suit within a few years.

Now the government says it will lower the threshold to 16 by the time the next general election is held, likely in 2029. That will bring the whole country into line with Scotland and Wales, which have semi-autonomous governments and already let 16 and 17 year-olds vote in local and regional elections. A few other countries currently have a voting age of 16. These include Austria, Brazil and Ecuador. Some European Union countries, including Belgium, Germany and Malta, allow 16-year-olds to vote in elections to the European Parliament.

The advocates of lowering the voting age to 16 are correct in emphasizing that if 16-year-olds in Britain can work and pay taxes, there should not be any bar to making them eligible to vote. In fact, Prime Minister Keir Starmer argued on the same line and said, "If you pay in, you should have the opportunity to say what you want your money spent on," meaning the 16-year-olds, since they could be tax payers, should enjoy the voting right.

Quite rightly, pro-democracy organizations welcomed the lower age, and a move toward automatic voter registration, saying it would help increase voting rates. Turnout in the 2024 election was 59.7 per cent, the lowest level in more than two decades. The age change is part of a package of electoral reforms that includes tightening campaign financing rules and broadening the range of documents that can be used as identification at polling stations.

Certainly, the lowering of age will increase democratic participation by getting teenagers into the habit of voting at a time when most are still in school. The only thing, probably, that can be said against the decision is that school students being given the right to vote may not have the political maturity to choose the party that will rule the destiny of the nation. On the other hand, young citizens across the world today are perceived as being much more aware and alert in comparison to the same aged people even a decade or two ago.

One more argument against the measure is that in the age of social media when all sorts of good and pernicious ideas are peddled online, 16-year-olds may be manipulated for their credulity and gullibility. However, social scientists advance the theory that younger people, who are in full-time education and often still live at home, can make for better, more engaged first-time voters compared with 18- to 20-yearolds, who often experience their first election in a highly transitory phase of their lives.

The government's political opponents on the Right argue that Labour hopes to benefit from 1.5 million new potential young voters who generally lean to the Left. Nigel Farage, leader of the Far-Right party Reform UK, said Labour was trying to "rig the system."

The 16-year-olds in the UK account for a small percentage of British voters and their apologists say they are in no position to greatly influence the formation of a government. However, in cases of narrow victory margin, they may prove to be the decisive factor.

This move should be considered a good sign as very young minds must have a say in the process of democracy.

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If in our daily life we can smile, if we can be peaceful and happy, not only we, but everyone will profit from it. This is the most basic kind of peace work.

THIS DAY IN HISTORY

UNSAFE AT WORK

et's look at three recent events which symbolise workers' plight due to lack of safety at the workplace. On 30 June, in Telangana's worst industrial mishap. 46 people died, eight are still in hospital and another eight are still missing, some possibly charred beyond recognition. This human tragedy in an industrial area was caused by the explosion of a reactor in a chemical plant, heard several kilometres away. To call it an accident absolves the management of the neglect of proper maintenance, or not adhering to safety protocols. In the same Sangareddy district alone, 25 workers died within a four month period in 2024. The cases of injuries or near fatal cases, which have not been reported can only be guessed. But Sangareddy is just an illustrative case, not an isolated one, across the country.

Now consider another "accident." On 7 June, in the Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation (MIDC) area near Pirangut on the outskirts of Pune, 18 workers were charred to death, 15 being women, in a deadly fire in a chemical factorv. As per the investigation by some intrepid labour activists, it was revealed that the workers were not even aware they were handling hazardous chemicals. They were marked by codes masking the true name of the chemicals. It was revealed that the women workers were paid less than minimum wage. The vulnerable are exploited, have job insecurity and face the most unsafe and risky conditions. This company was in operation since 2012, but got registered only in 2020. It also managed to obtain an ISO 9001 certification for quality management. No inspector ever visited the factory till this "accident" happened. This cannot be attributed to ease of doing business. While EODB has shifted the onus to self-certification on the owners and managers of factories, it surely does not mean complete

abdication of inspection, especially of worker safety in hazardous industries. It is made worse by the management's greed and corner-cutting, like disabling safety sensors, or running the presses at higher speeds to achieve sales targets.

The third event is the launch of a report called "Crushed." This is India's only long running evidence based report published by Safe in India (SII), an NGO dedicated to improving worker safety in India's manufacturing sector, particularly the automotive and auto-component industry, which accounts for one-third of the manufacturing sector GDP. SII, founded in 2016 by Sandeep Sachdeva and his colleagues, works for workers' rights, putting pressure on auto brands to improve safety for over 10 million workers in that industry. SII's work has increased worker awareness about the Employees State Insurance Scheme and the ESIC role. Their work is data driven, painstaking and based on authentic testimonies of workers. Over the past seven years SII has helped 10,000 workers access ESIC benefits, but this still represents only 40 per cent of the victims. In the last few years the vendors to top ten auto brands accounted for the crushed fingers of 2.333 workers. This work breaks the silence around injuries showing its true scale with official statistics. It also throws up laughable anomalies. For instance, the source of data could be from two arms of the government, the labour ministry and the insurance corporation. In Haryana, routinely the ministry reports the number of injuries around 40 to 50 per year for several years. But the ESIC claims benefits are going to nearly a thousand workers. And this is with only 40% awareness among workers. It is clear that thousands of workers are getting killed or maimed across the automotive sector, and the

official silence must be broken. Thankfully, the Economic Survey of this year has highlighted the issue of workplace safety. It says that Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) regulations are not to be seen as burdensome expenses but as strategic investment. The SII estimates that the country loses up to 4 per cent of GDP due to neglect of safety. India ranks a low 133 in global labour productivity, and this rank is directly correlated with inadequate OSH standards and poor working conditions. India's rank is significantly below China, Vietnam and Mexico. Investment in safety and OSH protocols not only improve the life of the worker and her family, but raise productivity, morale and improve the trust between workers and management. For the factories it reduces absenteeism, medical expenses and penalties for

non-compliance. Frequent shutdowns due to crushed fingers can disrupt supply schedules and reduce competitiveness.

The lesson from neighbouring Bangladesh is telling. In 2013, an eight story building housing garment factories collapsed in the Rana Plaza, and 1,134 people died. This shocking incident led to drastic changes, including the putting in place the Accord on Fire and Building Safety, which led to the training of 1.4 million workers. It was certainly a factor which increased Bangladesh's garment sector competitiveness and its exports outpaced even India and Vietnam. Even Chile and Costa Rica experienced strong labour productivity growth due to improved OSH standards and reduced occupational injuries. The Employee State Insurance Scheme was established by the ESI Act of 1948, the same year as the setting up of the National Health Scheme of the United Kingdom. Both aim to provide universal social security and healthcare (in case of India to workers, and in UK to all citizens). The present reality is that almost all citizens have access and get benefits from the NHS whereas for the ESI, many workers are not even aware of their rights and benefits.

The way forward is clear. There should be complete transparency in data reporting on accidents and fatalities, making it consistent across ESIC and labour department. Compliance of safety and OSH protocols must be incentive based. There should be public private partnership (through NGO's if necessary) to increase worker awareness about rights and safety. The top brands must be made accountable for practices in their vendors, across the supply chain. Finally, let us note that worker safety does not merely have an instrumental value but is ultimately a moral and ethical commitment too.

round the world, governments are racing to build world-class universities. From Germany's Exzellenzinitiative to India's Institutes of Eminence. the goal is the same: to cultivate institutions that attract and nurture top global talent, conduct cutting-edge research, and drive innovation and growth. But the stakes are particularly high in the US and China, given the escalating competition between the world's two largest economies.

The struggle to lead in higher education is about more than prestige. Elite universities affect economic performance in myriad ways, including by fostering innovation, boosting productivity, and increasing individual earnings. Graduates from top-tier institutions are more likely to become scientists, inventors, and entrepreneurs. At the national level, countries with higher average university quality tend to enjoy faster technological development and stronger productivity.

A few years ago, any comparison of US and Chinese higher education would have been no contest. For decades, US universities have dominated global rankings, with institutions like MIT, Stanford, and Harvard forming the core of the innovation hubs that have been integral to the country's global scientific leadership and entrepreneurial dynamism. Many of the world's most valuable companies - including Google, Meta, Nvidia, and Tesla – were built by graduates of elite US universities.

As often as not, those graduates were not American. Over half of America's billion-dollar startups have at least one immigrant founder, and a quarter were launched by individuals who first arrived in the US as international students. This points to a key strength of America's university system: its ability to attract the world's top talent. International students account for 14% of enrollment at America's top research universities, and 28% at elite institutions, such as the Ivy League universities, Stanford, and MIT. In the 2023-24 academic year, international students contributed nearly \$44 billion to the US economy and supported more than 378,000 jobs.

While US (and European) institutions still lead in global rankings, Chinese universities have been rapidly gaining on them in recent years. In the 2025 Nature Index, eight of the top ten global research institutions are based in China, with Harvard and Germany's Max Planck Society being the only Western institutions that made the cut. Chinese universities are particularly strong in the so-called STEM fields (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics). China now produces some two million science and engineering graduates annually, more than double the number in the US. Today, nearly half of the world's top AI researchers are of Chinese origin - and a growing number of them are choosing to work in China.

To be sure, China's push to lead in higher education will face considerable headwinds. Cutting-edge research and breakthrough innovation demand intellectual and academic freedom - the freedom to question prevailing ideas, explore new concepts, and update modes of thinking. As critics have warned, the Communist Party of China's tight control over universities and the media is not conducive to any of this.

Nonetheless, China's commitment to strengthening higher education is clear. The same cannot be said for the US, where President Donald Trump's administration has effectively declared war on leading universities in the name of combating alleged ideological bias. Meanwhile, the Trump administration has sought to revoke and restrict visas for international students.

One can only hope that the Trump administration's assaults on higher education will prove to be short-lived, and the US will recommit to promoting academic freedom, welcoming international students, and supporting universities as incubators of groundbreaking ideas. In 2019, there were 539 reported bird hits while the number stood at 1123 by the end of 2023. According to a report, more than 4000 aircraft were affected by bird hits across 80 airports in India in the last five years. Structural damage, loss of control and, at the worst, engine failures are the consequences. Rules are unambiguous: 10 km radius around the airport should be clear of garbage that contain food waste and animal slaughter houses. In short, no bird should be venture into the area in search of food, water and cover. However, plenty of funnel zones of airports -- areas where flights takeoff and land -- bear the risk of being hit by birds due to the callous approach of the authorities thereby endangering hundreds of lives..

Following the two-day Green Hydrogen Summit held in Amaravati last week, Andhra Pradesh has now focused its attention on green hydrogen production, storage, distribution, and its applications in industry, transport, and power generation.

The state is also working on policy formulation, setting standards, and strengthening capacity building for a sustainable hydrogen ecosystem, it added.

As part of its push into this futuristic technology, Andhra Pradesh has set ambitious targets: to establish an electrolyser manufacturing capacity of 2 GW by 2027 and 5 GW by 2029, and to produce 1.5 million metric tonnes per annum (MMT-PA) of green hydrogen by 2029.

Other goals include creating transmission infrastructure (green energy corridors) to evacuate 25 GW of renewable energy by 2029 and achieving cost reduction in production and deployment.

Further, she suggested adopting the polluter pays principle (PPP) and establishing a floating laboratory on Godavari River as part of conservation efforts, among other much-needed initiatives.

According to Angeli, Pulasa fish enter the Godavari River during the flood season, swim upstream against the strong

current for thousands of kilometres of marine sea water to

'This migration and spawning process occurs between June and August. After laying eggs, they (hilsa or pulasa fish) return to the sea around October. Pulasa fish undergoes a transformation in taste and color when they enter the freshwaters of the Godavari,' Angeli told PTI.

She noted that the Pulasa fish found in the delta are also particularly flavourful, especially in areas where the fresh Godavari River water mixes with seawater near Narsapuram in West Godavari district.

The blending of freshwater and saltwater (estuarine conditions) gives Pulasa its unique taste, she said, and added that the fisherfolk classify female pulasa as 'chenal' and male as

"The female fish is especially prized for its richer taste and commands a high er price. Though the fish has many bones, its preparation is key—traditionally cooked in clay pots over firewood. Pulasa tastes better after sitting for several hours," said the additional director.

Angeli explained that Pulasa fish caught near Yanam and Kotipalli are cheaper as they have just entered the river from the sea and those caught from Kapileswarapuram and Alamuru are a bit pricy. But, the most expensive are the ones caught near Dowleswaram and Pottilanka, owing to their rich flavour.

"The cost of an authentic Pulasa fish will range up to Rs 10,000 and it will be around 1 kg at maximum. The Pulasa caught between Bobbarlanka and Dowleswaram is the best,"

said Gopal Rao. Gopal Rao said the renowned curry is prepared with a blend of ingredients, which include 'avakaya' (mango) pickle oil, ladies finger, and savoured the

day after its preparation.

"We used to cook it Saturday night, keep it aside and savour it Sunday afternoon," he said In 2018, Elsevier paper 'Bi ology and fisheries of Hilsa shad in Bay of Bengal' observed that hilsa is widely distributed in the North Indian Ocean and majorly in



Al plane veers off runway at Mumbai

New Delhi/Mumbai: Three different aircraft incidents occurred Monday, including a Kochi-bound Air India plane veering off the runway while landing in heavy rain at the Mumbai airport, and an IndiGo plane from Goa making an emergency landing at the Indore airport due to a technical snag. Bullying can cause victimized students to suffer from lower self-esteem and daily stress about their well-being," Gupta said.

Mamata declares war on **BJP's 'linguistic terrorism'**

Kolkata, July 21: Pitching 'Bengali asmita' as her battle cry for the 2026 polls, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee Monday tore into the BJP for unleashing "linguistic terrorism" on migrant Bengalis, vowing an unrelenting battle to defend identity and mother tongue till the saffron party is defeated.

Addressing a massive Mar tyrs' Day rally in the heart of Kolkata, Banerjee declared, "If this linguistic profiling doesn't stop, our resistance movement will reach New Delhi.'

She gave a clarion call to party workers to launch a fresh agitation from July 27, styled as a second 'Language Move ment', to resist what she called systematic attacks on Bengali identity and attempts to erase the Bengali language from the national landscape.

"If needed, there will be a second language movement against the BJP's terrorism on the Bengali language... From July 27, a movement will start in Bengal in protest against the attack on Bengalis, Bengal language and 'Bhasha santras (linguistic terrorism). This language movement will continue till the Assembly polls," she announced.

The first Language Movement took place in 1952 in erstwhile East Bengal (now Bangladesh), when protesters demanded that Bengali be recognised as one of the official languages of Pakistan.

Banerjee hinted the "real battle" for 2026 would not be fought just at the ballot box but over the voter list, alleging a "silent purge" of legitimate voters through a conspiracy between the BJP and the Elec-

ED crossing all limits: SC

New Delhi, July 21: The Enforcement Directorate is "crossing all limits", the Supreme Court said Monday as it expressed serious concern over the agency summoning advocates for offering legal advice or representing clients during investigations.

It also called for guidelines on the matter.

A bench of Chief Justice BR Gavai and Justice K Vinod Chandran was hearing a suo motu case to address the implications of such actions on the independence of the legal profession.

This comes in the wake of the ED summoning senior lawyers Arvind Datar and Pratap Venugopal.

"Even if it is wrong, the communication between a lawyer and the clients is privileged communication. How can notices be issued against them? There should be some guidelines," the CJI said.

The CJI continued, "They

(ED) are crossing all limits." While responding to submis-

sions that recent ED notices to legal professionals like senior advocate Datar could have a chilling effect on law practice, the CJI said, "Guidelines should be framed. Attorney General R Ven-

kataramani and Solicitor General Tushar Mehta said the issue was taken up at the highest level and the probe agency had been asked to not issue notices to the lawyers for rendering legal advice. Venkataramani early on in the hearing said he had a word with the ED officials and the summons to lawvers were wrong.

"Lawyers cannot be summoned for rendering legal opinions," Mehta agreed with Venkataramani. Mehta, however, said there

Thiruvananthapuram, July 21: V S Achuthanandan, a staunch Marxist known for his sharp rhetoric, anti-corruption stance, and unwavering commitment to social justice, was India's first communist leader from a working-class background to rise to the office of Chief Minister.

A founding figure in the Communist Party of India (Marxist) after the 1964 split in the undivided Communist Party, Achuthanandan's life in Kerala was defined by unrelenting struggle -- against the entrenched injustices of a caste and class-bound society, and against the creeping revisionism he saw within his own party. He died at

privileged, upper-caste families and were drawn to communism by its intellectual promise, Achuthanandan lived the inequality they fought.

Achuthanandan, affectionately known as Comrade 'VS' by party colleagues and even political opponents, led a life so eventful that he was once presumed dead and prepared for burial after being assaulted by police during a pre-Independence struggle for workers' rights -- only to survive, defy his attackers, and rise to become one of Kerala's most towering political figures. Achuthanandan died at a

HC says 'hard to believe' they committed the crime

Mumbai, July 21: Nineteen years after seven train blasts here killed more than 180 persons, the Bombay High Court Monday acquitted all the 12 accused, saying the prosecution utterly failed to prove the case and it was hard to believe the accused committed the crime". The court allowed the ap-

peals filed by the accused challenging their conviction and sentences imposed on them by a special court in 2015. Of the 12, five had been sen-

tenced to death and seven to life imprisonment by the special court. One of the death row convicts died in 2021

Maharashtra revenue minister and senior BJP leader Chandrashekhar Bawankule said the state government will assess the merits of the HC order, before deciding on whether to challenge it in the Supreme Court. Former BJP MP Kirit Somaiva said CM Devendra Fadnavis has spoken of approaching the Supreme Court at the earliest.

AIMIM president Asaduddin Owaisi sought to know whether Maharashtra government would take action against ATS officers who investigated the train blasts case.

The HC judgement comes as a major embarrassment to the Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) which probed the case. The agency had claimed that the accused were members of the banned outfit Stu-

The bench refused to confirm the death penalties imposed on five of the 12 accused and dismissed the confirmation appeals filed by the Maharashtra

Punishing the actual perpetrator of a crime is a concrete and essential step toward curbing criminal activities, upholding the rule of law, and ensuring the safety and securitv of citizens, the HC said in its 671-page judgment.

But creating a false appearance of having solved a case by presenting that the accused have been brought to justice gives a misleading sense of resolution, it added.

This deceptive closure undermines public trust and falsely reassures society, while in reality, the true threat remains at large. Essentially, this is what the case at hand conveys, the bench said.

The death row convicts were Kamal Ansari (now dead), Mohammad Faisal Ataur Rahman Shaikh, Ehtesham Qutubuddin Siddiqui, Naveed Hussain Khan and Asif Khan. It had imposed life impris-

Tax relief for anonymous **NPO** donations

New Delhi, July 21: A Parlia mentary panel, headed by BJP leader Baijayant Panda, has favoured continuing tax exemption on anonymous donations made to religious-cum-charitable trusts in the new Income Tax Bill, saying any removal would have an adverse impact on not-for-profit organisations

The 31-member Select Committee of the Lok Sabha that examined the new Income Tax Bill, 2025, also suggested allow ing taxpayers to claim TDS re fund even after the ITR filing due date without paving any penal charges. The Committee has recommended changes in the Income Tax Bill, 2025, which will replace the six-decade-old Income Tax Act, 1961.

The 4,575 page report, which was tabled in the Lok Sabha Monday, also made suggestions for sweeping changes in the way the new Income Tax bill, 2025 was to treat income of non-prof it organisations (NPOs), while commending tax department's move of replacing the dual concepts of "previous year" and "assessment year" with a single, unified term: "tax vear".

"The adoption of a single, consistent 'tax year' streamlines tax period references throughout the legislation, making the law more accessible and easier to understand," the report said.

With regard to NPOs, the government in the new bill has exempted from tax anonymous donations received by purely religious trusts. However, such donations received by a reli gious trust that may also have other charitable functions, like running hospitals, and educational institutions, will be taxed

Landslide hits Vaishno Devi track; pilgrim dead

Jammu, July 21: A 70-year-old pilgrim was killed while nine others were injured when a massive landslide struck the old track to the Vaishno Devi shrine in Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir Monday, officials said.

They said a booking office and an overhead iron structure caved in under the weight of the landslide, triggered by heavy rains which lashed Katra town, the base camp for the pilgrims visiting the shrine atop Trikuta hills.

The yatra remained suspended for several hours as a precautionary measure following the landslide.

Lt Governor Manoj Sinha and Chief Minister Omar Abdullah expressed grief over the death of the pilgrim and wished speedy recovery to the injured.

The incident occurred around 8.30 am at Gulshan Ka Langar near Banganga, the starting point for the vatra where mostly pony riders gather along the old track and register before taking the pilgrims to the cave shrine, 12 km from the town.



The landslide resulted in criti cal injuries to three persons and minor injuries to seven others. All the injured were taken to a hospital, officiating Chief Executive Officer of Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board, Sachin Kumar Vaishya told reporters.

Vaishya, who is also the district magistrate Jammu, said a full fledged rescue and debris clearance operation is underway.

An earth-mover was also rushed to speed up the rescue

Delhi recorded a drop of 15 per cent in PM10 levels and Chennai 12 per cent, according to data tabled in a written reply to a question in the Lok Sabha by Union Minister of State for Environment Kirti Vardhan

He presented the data in reply to a joint query from MPs Anil Desai and Babu Singh Kushwaha regarding worsen-

ing air pollution, health im-

pacts and funding utilisation for air quality improvement across Indian cities.

He said 103 out of 130 cities covered under the NCAP showed improvement in PM10 levels in 2024-25 as compared to 2017-18. According to the government

data, 64 cities have shown a reduction in PM10 levels by more than 20 per cent and 25 of them achieved a reduction of over 40 per cent. The NCAP, launched in 2019,

aims to reduce particulate pollution by 40 per cent by 2026 in 130 highly polluted cities, using

2019-20 as the base year. However, in practice, only PM10 concentration is being considered for performance assessment. PM10, or particulate matter

of diameter 10 micrometres or

less, is a major pollutant con-



tributing to poor air quality and respiratory diseases.

The average PM10 concentration in Mumbai fell from 161 micrograms per cubic metre (μ g/m3) in 2017-18 to 90 μ g/ m3 in 2024-25. Kolkata's levels dropped from 147 to 92 μ g/m3, Delhi's from 241 to 203 $\mu g/m3$

and Chennai's from 66 to 58 µg/ m3 during the same period.

The data showed efforts have yielded positive results, with 22 cities now achieving the National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for PM10 concentration, i.e., annual levels below $60 \,\mu\text{g/m}3$.

PM10, or particulate matter of diameter 10 micrometres or less. is a major pollutant contributing to poor air quality and respiratory diseases

Among the most improved cities, Bareilly saw a 77 per cent drop in PM10 levels, from 207 μg/m3 to 48 μg/m3, followed by Varanasi (230 to 59 μg/m3), Firozabad (247 to 100 μ g/m³), Dehradun (250 to 107 μg/m3) and Moradabad (222 to 96 µg/ m3). These cities were among 25 that achieved reductions exceeding 40 per cent.

The government, however, said air quality comparisons between cities in different countries are not straightforward due to differences in ge ography, climate and national standards.

Responding to questions on health impacts, the ministry said there is no conclusive national data that directly correlates air pollution with mortality. "Health is influenced by a

range of factors beyond environment, including nutrition, socio-economic status, heredi ty, occupation and immunity,' Singh said. The minister said a total of

Sri Lanka opts for US crude

Colombo: Sri Lanka is considering the purchase of crude oil from the US as part of its efforts to correct the trade imbalance with Washington, an official said Monday. The development comes ahead of the August 1 deadline for negotiations on tariffs imposed by the Donald Trump-led administration. Head of the state fuel entity Ceylon Petroleum Corporation (CPC) Janaka Rajakaruna told reporters that the West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude oil would be invited to participate in Sri Lanka's competitive tender bids to buy crude oil. Sri Lanka currently buys its entire crude oil requirements from Middle Eastern sources. "We are open for competitive bids to supply crude by WTI, Rajakaruna said. He added that before an invitation is extended for the competitive bidding process, steps would be taken to obtain samples from WTI to test whether the crude could be refined in the CPC refinery. Since April, with the imposition of 44 per cent tariffs by the US, Sri Lanka has been negotiating with the US Trade Representative's Office. The US brought the tariff down to 30 per cent in a letter sent by the Trump administration. However, the island nation's export industry maintains that the move falls short, especially

The video showed a group of men leading a couple out of vehicles and into a desert before gunning them down with pistols and shooting the bodies. Political figures and activists said it was an 'honour' killing incident. The incident sparked outrage in the country, with civil society, religious scholars, and political leaders all calling for the arrest and exemplary punishment for the perpetrators of the gruesome crime. Balochistan **Chief Minister Sarfaraz Bugti Monday confirmed** that 11 people have been arrested. They are suspected of being behind the "honour killing" of the couple. A first information report (FIR) was registered by the Station House Officer Naveed Akhtar at Quetta's Hanna-Urak police station, the Dawn newspaper reported. Akhtar said he lodged the complaint after receiving the video clip that had gone viral on social media. "The victims seen in the viral video have been identified as Bano Bibi and Ihsanullah," the FIR said, naming eight suspects who allegedly shot the couple

Israel sends tanks into Gaza's Deir al-Balah

Cairo, July 21: Israeli tanks pushed into southern and eastern districts of the Gazan city of Deir al-Balah for the first time Monday, an area where Israeli sources said the military believes hostages may be held.

The area is packed with Palestinians displaced during more than 21 months of war in Gaza, hundreds of whom fled west or south after Israel issued an evacuation order, saying it sought to destroy infrastructure and capabilities of the militant group Hamas.

Tank shelling in the area hit houses and mosques, killing at least three Palestinians and wounding several others, local medics said.

To the south in Khan Younis, an Israeli airstrike killed at least five people, including a husband and wife and their two children in a tent, medics

In its daily update, Gaza's health ministry said at least 130 Palestinians had been killed and more than 1,000 wounded by Israeli gunfire and military strikes across the territory in the past 24 hours, one of the highest such totals in recent weeks.

There was no immediate Israeli comment on the Deir al-Balah and Khan Younis incidents.

Israeli sources have said the reason the army had stayed out of the Deir al-Balah districts was because they suspected Hamas might be holding hostages there. At least 20 of the remaining 50 hostages in captivity in Gaza are believed to be

still alive.

Families of the hostages have expressed concern for their relatives and demanded an explanation from Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, Defence Minister Israel Katz and the army chief of how they will protect them.

'The people of Israel will not forgive anyone who knowingly endangered the hostages - both the living and the deceased.

No one will be able to claim they didn't know what was at stake," the Hostage Families Forum Headquarters said in a statement.

Gaza health officials have warned of potential "mass deaths" in coming days from hunger, which has killed at least 19 people since Saturday, the Hamas-run territory's health ministry said.

The incursion into Deir

al-Balah and growing number of deaths appeared to be complicating efforts to secure a ceasefire between Hamas and Israel in talks mediated by Qatar and Egypt, with U.S. backing.

A Hamas official told Reuters Sunday that the militant group was angered by the mounting death toll and hunger crisis, and that this could affect the talks on a 60-day truce and The war began when Hamas-

led militants stormed into Israel on October 7, 2023, killing 1,200 people and taking 251 hostages back to Gaza, according to Israeli tallies

The Israeli military campaign against Hamas in Gaza has since killed over 59,000 Palestinians, according to health officials, displaced almost the entire population and caused a humanitarian crisis.

Iran to hold nuclear

Tehran, July 21: Iran said Monday it would hold renewed talks this week with European nations over the country's nuclear programme, with discussions to be hosted by Turkey.

The talks, to be held in Is tanbul Friday, will be the first since a ceasefire was reached after a 12-day war waged by Israel against Iran in June, which also saw the United States strike nuclear-related facilities in the Islamic Republic. A similar meeting had been held in the Turkish city in May.

The discussions will bring Iranian officials together with officials from Britain, France and Germany - known as the E3 nations — and will include the European Union's foreign policy chief, Kaja Kallas.

"The topic of the talks is clear, lifting sanctions and issues related to the peaceful nuclear programme of Iran,' Iranian Foreign Ministry spokesman Esmail Baghaei said in his weekly briefing. He said the meeting will be held at the deputy ministerial level.

Under a 2015 deal designed to cap Iran's nuclear activities, Iran agreed to tough restrictions on its international programme in exchange for an easing of sanctions.

The deal began to unravel in 2018, when the United States pulled out of it and began to reimpose certain sanctions.

Delta pilot made sharp turn to avoid B-52 bomber

Bismarck, July 21: The pilot of a regional airliner flying over North Dakota carried out an unexpected sharp turn and later apologised to passengers, explaining that he made the move after spotting a military plane in his flight path.

The Friday incident is detailed in a video taken by a passenger and posted to social media as Delta Flight 3788 approached the Minot Interna tional Airport for landing. In the video, the SkyWest pilot can be heard over the plane's intercom system explaining that he made the sharp turn after spotting a B-52 bomber in his flight path.

"Sorry about the aggressive maneuver. It caught me by surprise," the pilot can be heard saving on the video. "This is not normal at all. I don't know why

they didn't give us a heads up.' SkyWest, a regional carrier for Delta and other large airlines, said the flight had departed from the Minneapolis-St Paul International Airport and landed safely in Minot after performing a "go-around" maneuver when another aircraft became visible in the SkyWest

The crackdown on Moscow's shadow fleet operations targets 135 oil tankers which form part of the fleet responsible for illicitly carrying USD 24 billion worth of cargo since the start of 2024.

Ishiba's coalition loses majority in upper house



Tokyo, July 21: Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba's ruling coalition failed Monday to secure a majority in the 248-seat upper house in a crucial parliamentary election, further shaking the stability of his government as Japan faces challenges such as rising prices and high US tariffs.

Ishiba's Liberal Democratic Party and its junior coalition partner Komeito, which needed to win 50 seats on top of the 75 seats they already have to retain their majority, won 47 seats. It was three seats short of a majority and a retreat of 19 seats from before the vote.

The loss is another blow to

Ishiba's coalition, making it a minority in both houses following its October defeat in the lower house election, and worsening Japan's political instability. It was the first time the LDP has lost a majority in both houses of parliament since the party's formation in 1955.

Despite the loss, Ishiba expressed determination to stay on and not create a political vacuum to tackle challenges such as U.S. tariff threats, but he could face calls from within his party to step down or find another coalition partner

"I will fulfil my responsibility as head of the No. 1 party and work for the country," he said.

Ishiba had set the bar low, wanting a simple majority of 125 seats, which means his LDP and its Buddhist-backed junior coalition partner Komeito needed to win 50 seats. Exit poll results released seconds after the ballots closed Sunday night mostly showed a major setback for Ishiba's coalition.

The LDP alone won 39 seats, better than most exit poll projections of 32, and still the No. 1 party in the parliament, known 'Japanese First' party emerges strong



TOKYO: The fringe far-right Sanseito party emerged as one of the biggest winners in Japan's upper house election Sunday, gaining support with warnings of a "silent invasion" of immigrants, and pledges for tax cuts and welfare spending. Birthed on YouTube during the COVID-19 pandemic spreading conspiracy theories about vaccinations and a cabal of global elites, the party broke into mainstream politics with its "Japanese First" campaign. The party won 14 seats adding to the single lawmaker it secured in the 248-seat chamber three years ago. It has only three seats in the more powerful lower house. "The phrase Japanese First was meant to express rebuilding Japanese people's livelihoods by resisting globalism. WARMING EARTH TAKES ITS TOLL ON BEES

THE CONVERSATION

Williamsport (US), July 21: Sweat covers Isaac Barnes's face under his beekeeper's veil as he hauls boxes of honevcomb from his hives to his truck. It's a workout in what feels like a sauna as the late-morning June temperatures rise.

Though Barnes was hot, his bees were even hotter. Their body temperatures can be up to 27 degrees Fahrenheit (about 15 Celsius) higher than the air around them. As global temperatures rise under climate change, scientists are trying to better understand the effects on managed and wild bees as they pollinate crops, gather nectar, make honey and reproduce.

They noticed flying bees gathering nectar avoided overheating on the hottest days by using fewer but harder wingbeats to keep their body temperature below dangerous levels, according to a study published last year. Scientists

also say that bees — like people

may also cope by retreating to a cooler environment such as the shade or their nest.

"Just like we go into the shade, or we sweat or we might work less hard, bees actually do the exact same thing so they can avoid the heat," said Jon Harrison, an environmental physiologist at Arizona State University and one of the study's authors.

But that means the bees aren't able to do what they normally do, said Kevin Mc-Cluney, a biology professor at Bowling Green State Univer-"They're not going out and

getting more nectar. They're not mating. They're not doing the things that bees would otherwise do," McCluney said. Generally, most bees are heat-tolerant, but as the climate warms, some experts think their ability to fend off

honeybee colonies in the US are used to pollinate agricultural crops such as almonds, apples, cherries and blueberries. Fewer pollinators can lead to less pollination and potentially lower yields. "It's a very fragile system

if you think about it," López-

Uribe said. "Because if something goes wrong, you have these super high-value crops that won't get enough bees for

pollination.' Back at Barnes' hives in Ohio, thousands of honeybees fly around as he gathers boxes to take back to his farm for honey production. Nearby, a couple of his bees land on milkweed flowers, a rare bit of plant diversity in an area dominated

by corn and soybean fields. For Barnes, who operates Honeyrun Farm with his wife, Jayne, one of the challenges heat can pose to his 500 honeybee hives is fending off parasitic mites that threaten the bees. If temperatures get too hot, he can't apply formic acid, an organic chemical that kills the mites. If it's applied when it's too hot, the bees could die.

Last year they lost almost a third of the 400 hives they sent to California to help pollinate commercial almond groves. Barnes thinks those hives may have been in poor health ahead of pollination because

they were unable to ward off mites when it was hot months earlier.

"Dead hives aren't pollinating the almonds," he said. "It's a real ripple effect that stems back from the heat in the summertime.

Sometimes the heat helps. Here in Ohio, Barnes' hives last summer produced a bumper crop of honey as they feasted on nearby soybean nectar as the plants bloomed in the heat. Still, the lack of diverse plants for bees to forage in an area dominated by corn and sovbean fields isn't ideal.

And even the native blooms are appearing erratically, Barnes said. In autumn, his bees search for food on goldenrod, but those blooms are appearing later. And even then he has supplemented his hive with additional food to keep them healthy into the winter.

"Every single plant that blooms is something that the bee can use," Barnes said. "And every single plant is affected by climate change."

Crypto thefts top \$2.17bn in 2025

New Delhi, July 21: Crypto thefts in 2025 had already crossed \$2.17 billion before last week's \$44 million CoinD-CX hack, underlining relentless cyber threat escalation in the digital currency world, according to the latest data.

Blockchain analytics platform Chainalysis' 2025 crypto crime mid-year update says that over \$2.17 billion was stolen from cryptocurrency services so far in 2025, and "this year is more devastating than the entirety of 2024". By the end of June 2025, 17

per cent more value had been stolen year-to-date (YTD) than in 2022, previously the worst year on record. The \$1.5 billion hack of By-

Bit, the largest single hack in crypto history, accounts for the majority of service losses.

So far in 2025, significant concentrations of stolen fund victims have emerged in the US, Germany, Russia, Canada, Japan, Indonesia, and South Korea, it said.


"Regionally, Eastern Europe, MENA, and CSAO (Central and Southern Asia and Oceania) saw the most rapid H1 2024 to H1 2025 growth in victim totals," it said.

The report revealed that threat actors who have compromised services tend to exhibit higher levels of sophistication than those targeting personal wallets.

At \$1.5 billion, the ByBit hack not only represents the largest crypto theft in history, but also accounts for approximately 69 per cent of all funds stolen from services this year, Chainalysis said.

"The sophistication and scale of this attack underscore

New Delhi, July 21: Retirement fund body EPFO added all-time high 20.06 lakh net members in May 2025, which includes 9.42 lakh new employees, as per the payroll data released

This is 4.79 per cent higher as compared to April 2025 and 2.84 per cent more on year-on-year basis. The May figure marks the highest recorded addition since payroll data tracking began in April 2018, a labour ministry statement said.

Union Minister of Labour & Employment Mansukh Mandaviva said the EPFO's all-time high net member addition in May 2025 is a testament to the growing strength of India's formal employment landscape.

'This historic achievement is the direct result of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visionary leadership and the government's unwavering commitment to pro-youth, pro-worker reforms," he added.

The EPFO enrolled around 9.42 lakh new subscribers in May 2025, representing 11.04 per cent increase over April 2025. This increase in new subscribers can be attributed to growing employment opportunities, increased awareness of employee benefits, and EPFO's successful outreach programs.

New Delhi, July 21: Markets regulator Sebi Monday announced that it has allowed Jane Street, the US-based proprietary trading firm accused of market manipulation, to resume trading after the company deposited the mandated Rs 4,843.57 crore in an escrow account.

The move comes after Jane Street complied with Sebi's directive, issued in the interim order dated July 3, to deposit

the amount in an escrow account. Following the compliance, the restriction on accessing the securities market no longer applies.

"In terms of para 62.11 of interim order in the matter of index manipulation by Jane Street group dated July 3, 2025, (interim order), upon compliance with the directions in clause 62.1 (creation of escrow account with a lien marked in favour of Sebi), for an amount of Rs 4,843.57 crore, the direc-

tions stipulated in clauses ... of the interim order shall cease to apply," Sebi said in a statement.

While lifting the trading restriction, Sebi said the entities involved have been directed to "cease and desist from directly or indirectly engaging in any fraudulent, manipulative or un fair trade practice", or any activity that might breach existing regulations. This includes trading in securities using any of the patterns identified or mentioned in the interim order

SBI labels RCom, promoter Anil Ambani as 'fraud'

New Delhi, July 21: State Bank of India has classified Reliance Communications along with promoter director Anil D Ambani as 'fraud' and is also in the process of lodging complaint with CBI, Parliament was informed Monday.

The entities were classified as fraud June 13, 2025 in accordance with the RBI's Master Directions on Fraud Risk Management and Bank's Board-approved Policy on Classification, Reporting & Management of Frauds, Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary said in a written reply in the Lok Sabha. "On June 24, 2025, the bank reported classification of fraud to RBI, and is also in the process of lodging complaint with CBI," he said. Further, July 1, 2025, as part

of disclosure compliance, Resolution Professional of RCom informed the Bombay Stock Exchange regarding fraud classification by the bank. The credit exposure of SBI in

RCom includes, fund-based principal outstanding amount of Rs 2.227.64 crore along with the accrued interest and expenses with effect from August 26, 2016 and non-fund based Bank Guarantee of Rs 786.52 crore, he said.

RCom is undergoing Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016.



ICC TO EXPLORE TWO-TIER TEST SYSTEM



London: An eight-member working group, headed by ICC's new chief executive officer Sanjog Gupta, has been formed by the game's global governing body to explore the possibility of restructuring Test cricket into a two-tier system. The committee was set up during ICC's annual

general meeting in Singapore under the all-Indian leadership of the chair, Jay Shah and Gupta. Currently, nine teams compete in the World Test Championship, but if the proposed two-tier systen is implemented, the structure would shift to two divisions of six teams each, featuring a promotion and relegation mechanism.

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
