Odisha plants 1.5 crore saplings

Bhubaneswar, Sept 17: In a historic and unprecedented achievement, Odisha planted approximately 1.5 crore saplings within just 12 hours as a mark of gratitude towards Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who turned 75 Wednesday.

In a remarkable display of environmental commitment, a total of 1,49,11,339 seedlings have been planted across 30 districts by 4.30pm. This massive effort spans 71,924 plantation sites, highlighting a significant drive toward afforestation and ecological restoration in the state, a statement released by the Forest, Environment and Climate Change department read.

September 17, 2025, will be remembered not only in India's history but also as a global milestone - where a simple act of planting saplings blossomed into a magnificent movement of hope and harmony, the statement added.

Earlier in the day, Chief

Minister Mohan Charan Majhi announced through a social media post that more than one crore saplings were planted by 2.16pm, surpassing the target of 75 lakh plantations, which was achieved at 1.33pm.

"As of 2:16pm today, our collective efforts have successfully resulted in the plantation of 1,00,21,236 saplings. Sincere gratitude and congratulations to all involved," Majhi said in

a post on X. "The trees being planted today - each tree is a testament to our resolve for a green and beautiful Odisha,

each tree is to thank Modi ji's love for Odisha, his reverence, and his commitment to Odisha's development. Today's campaign has united our entire society for the environment," Majhi said, adding that in the days to come, this campaign will become even more widespread.

The Chief Minister said it will have a positive impact on the environment and will carry

the testament of Modi ji's leadership and resolve, as well as our responsibility, for the safety of our future generations.

To put Odisha's achievement into perspective, previous records were held by Madhya Pradesh with 11 lakh saplings planted in one day and Assam with 9.26 lakh saplings. Odisha's incredible accomplishment far surpasses these, setting a new humanitarian record that will inspire generations to come.

Sundargarh district led the plantation drive with an impressive 14,21,618 seedlings planted. Following closely, Koraput secured the second position with 11,01,624 seedlings, while Keonjhar stood third with 10,42,927 seedlings. Around 25 lakh people, including industries and the armed forces, made it possible, an official said.

The picture and video of plantations were uploaded on 'Meri LiFE' portal. The progress of plantation was being tracked easily through the portal. All participants were requested to upload photos of their plantation activities on the portal, a Forest department official said, adding that the plantation drive is being conducted under the 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' campaign-2.

Meanwhile, Majhi also participated in a cleanliness drive under the 'Swachhata Hi Seva' campaign in Master Canteen area of Bhubaneswar on the occasion of Modi's 75th birthday.

per. The candidate's face will occupy three-fourths of the photo space for better visibility, it said. Serial numbers of candidates and the None Of The Above

and the None Of The Above (NOTA) option will be printed in the international form of Indian numerals. The font size will be 30 and in bold for clarity. To ensure uniformity, the

names of all candidates and NOTA option will be printed in the same font type and font size large enough for easy readability, it explained.

CM nod to free bus rides for schoolkids

Bhubaneswar: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Wednesday approved a proposal to provide free bus rides to schoolchildren across the state, an official release said. The initiative will be implemented under the Mukhyamantri Bus Seva (MBS) scheme. According to a decision taken in a high-level meeting chaired by the CM August 21, all schoolchildren will be eligible for free bus rides upon showing a valid student ID card or wearing school uniforms. 50% voters may not have to show documents: EC

New Delhi, Sept 17: More than half the electorate in most of the states may not have to provide any document as they will be covered in the electoral roll of the last Special Intensive Revision (SIR) held in their states, Election Commission (EC) officials said Wednesday.

They pointed

out that most states had the last special in-

tensive revision of the voters' list between 2002 and 2004. That year will be considered their cutoff date for the next SIR.

The EC will soon decide on the date to roll out Special Intensive Revision pan-India, and the exercise to clean up the voter list across states may take place before the end of the year, officials had earlier said.

Chief Electoral Officers have been told to keep the electoral rolls of their states, published after the previous SIR, ready. Some state CEOs have already put up the voter list published after their last SIR on their

The website of the Delhi CEO has the 2008 voter list when the last intensive revision took place in the national capital. In Uttarakhand, the last SIR took place in 2006, and that year's electoral roll is now on the state CEO website.

The last SIR in states will serve as the cut-off date, just as the 2003 vot-

er list of Bihar is being used by the EC for intensive revision. According to the instructions issued by the poll authority to its Bihar poll machinery, the 4.96 crore voters -- 60 per cent of the total electors -- who were listed in the 2003 special intensive revision need not submit any supporting document to establish their date or place of

Cop 'hubby' killed missing constable POST NEWS NETWORK day. The recovery operation was

Bhubaneswar/Keonjhar/ Ghatagaon, Sept 17: The body of a 25-year-old traffic constable, who had been missing for over 10 days, was found buried in a forest in Keonjhar district, and the police arrested her husband, who is also a constable, for mur-

der, police said Wednesday.
The victim, Subhamitra Sahoo,
a native of Paradip in Jagatsinghpur district and posted in Bhubaneswar, had been missing since
September 6. Her mother, Sukanti
Sahoo, filed a missing person's report at the Capital police station
the next day after Subhamitra
failed to return home from duty.

Following the complaint, police launched an investigation. Police had issued posters and announced a ₹25,000 cash reward to anyone providing information about the missing woman traffic constable.

During the probe, police discovered that Subhamitra had secretly solemnised a court marriage with Deepak Rout, a clerk in the Twin City Police



Commissioner's office, in July 2024. She was last seen with Rout on the day she went missing, Commissioner S Dev Datta Singh said. Rout soon emerged as the prime suspect.

During interrogation, he confessed that he picked up Sahoo from her workplace in his car and strangulated her to death between 2 and 3pm in Bhubaneswar September 6. He later buried her body in a forest near Rajabandha Sahi under Uparadiha panchayat, around 3 km

from Ghatagaon police station in Keonjhar district, about 170 km from Bhubaneswar.

According to preliminary investigation, Rout murdered Subhamitra over a financial dispute. He had allegedly taken around ₹10 lakh from her, which she had been demanding back to fund a social ceremony to formally announce their marriage.

Based on Rout's confession, two special teams from Bhubaneswar and Keonjhar police reached the forest area Wednesdelayed due to rain. Under heavy security and in the presence of a magistrate and scientific team, police used an earthmover to exhume the body, which had been tied up in a sack.

Local residents gathered at

Local residents gathered at the site as the operation unfolded, prompting police to deploy additional forces to manage the crowd. The body was later sent to the Keonjhar District Headquarters Hospital for post-mortem examination.

Two others — Rout's cousin, Papu Bhuyan, and Papu's friend, Jatia Mohanta — have been detained for allegedly helping him commit and cover up the crime, police said. Further investigation is underway.

Meanwhile, Leader of Opposition and BJD president Naveen Patnaik Wednesday slammed the state government questioning the efficiency of the Home department. Highlighting the previous incidents of Gopalpur and Baliharchandi, Patnaik asked the department to wake up from its deep slumber.

Odisha tech startup bags ₹66-cr deal from Indian Navy

New Delhi, Sept 17: A deeptech startup based in Odisha has inked a ₹66-crore contract with the Indian Navy to manufacture indigenously developed Underwater Remotely Operated Vehicles (UWROVs).

The startup, Coratia Technologies, signed the contract last week to supply home-built underwater robots specialising in cleaning ship hulls, conducting minor salvage activities and performing surveys and inspections of submerged infrastructures.

"This is not only a recognition of our capability to design and manufacture mission-critical underwater systems but also symbolises the Navy's relentless efforts to strengthen India's research and innovation ecosystem through well-structured initiatives like the iDEX," said Debendra Pradhan, Co-Founder and CEO of Coratia Technologies.

In January 2023, the company won the Innovation for Defence Excellence (iDEX) challenge which is aimed at creating an ecosystem to foster innovation and technology development in the defence and aerospace sectors.

aerospace sectors. Currently, the Indian Navy



has commissioned the flagship product of Coratia Technologies called Jalasimha, which underwent rigorous testing and certifications to pass Technology Readiness Level-9, enabling its induction into Indian Naval operations, Pradhan said. The deep-tech robotics startup, incubated at the National Institute of Technology (NIT), Rourkela, will supply and maintain its indigenously developed UWROVs.

The frugal design delivers advanced capabilities at significantly lower cost, marking India's first cost-efficient underwater robotics breakthrough, a statement from Coratia Technologies said.

"Induction of indigenous UWROVs not only reduces costs and reliance on foreign suppliers but also combats trade restrictions and tariff uncertainties. We're here to unlock new possibilities for defence preparedness and supporting India's blue economy," Biswajit Swain, Co-Founder & CTO of Coratia Technologies, said.

In July, Coratia Technologies raised ₹17.4 crore in a pre-Series A round led by MGF Kavachh, supported by Pontaq Ventures India. It plans to deploy the funds to scale up R&D initiatives, IPR and increase exports to tap rising global demand.

The underwater robotics market size stands at USD 5.08 billion in 2025, and is pegged to reach USD 9.53 billion by 2030, according to Mordor Intelligence.

SJTA: Ratna Bhandar valuables to be shifted back September 23

Puri, Sept 17: The Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) Wednesday said that the valuables of the Lord, now at a temporary strong room on Srimandir premises, will be shifted back to the Ratna Bhandar September 23.

Jewellery and other precious items stored in iron chests and almirahs at Ratna Bhandar had been shifted to the temporary facility on the temple premises in July 2024 when the temple treasury was reopened after four decades for repair.

It was announced in July this year that the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) has completed repair of the Ratna

"As the repair work is complete, the valuables will be stored back in their original places," SJTA chief adminis trator Arabinda Padhee told reporters. "It has been decided to shift the Lord's valuables to the original Ratna Bhandar during the auspicious time - between 7.17am and 11.17am September 23," Padhee said.

"If the shifting is not completed September 23, it will continue September 24," he said, adding that a magistrate will remain present during the shifting to ensure a smooth process.

Meanwhile, Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan in Bhubaneswar said that Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi has approved a proposal to shift the 'hundi' (donation box) from the temple's Natamandap.

He said that due to the presence of the 'hundi', 'dhadi darshan' was not possible.

"The people across Odisha have lost their trust in the BJP government. The state government has failed on all fronts, and we've decided to move a non-confidence motion during this session," Congress Legislature Party (CLP) leader Rama Chandra Kadam told reporters.

The CLP meeting attended by Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) president Bhakta Charan Das resolved that the state government has 'betrayed' the people, though it completed barely 15 months in

office, Kadam said. Das alleged that there is no break on the rapes, gangrapes, atrocities on women, Dalits and tribals, while farmers are denied fertiliser.

"There is a systematic failure on all fronts for which our party has decided to raise the people's issues in the Assembly," he said.

The OPCC president said the CLP has expressed concern over the brutal murder of a female constable by a police-

man in Bhubaneswar and the recent gangrape of a college student in Puri district.

'We condemn all these incidents and hold the government responsible for the crimes against the women. Though the CM himself is in charge of the Home department, still the women are being assaulted, killed and raped," he said.

In its legislature party meeting chaired by BJD president Naveen Patnaik, the regional party came down heavily on the BJP government for its 'all-out failure'

Addressing the meeting, Patnaik said that the Monsoon Session, although short, is of special political importance.

"In the last three and a half months, the inefficiency and apathy of the so-called double engine government in various areas such as women's safety, fertiliser supply and protection of farmers' interests are becoming increasingly appar-

ent," the former CM said. Alleging that the law and order has completely collapsed, Patnaik said it is unfortunate that the atrocities on women are increasing with each passing day.

'No one is safe in this state now," he said, adding that farmers are being harassed due to a 'man-made crisis' created in the fertiliser supply sector.

The BJD president alleged that the state government is trying to destroy the democratic values in the Panchayati Raj system for political gains.

"The decision taken by the state government to increase the financial power of the officials to make the elected panchayat representatives irrelevant will be strongly opposed in the Assembly," he said. Apart from this, Patnaik

said, the government will also be held accountable for the chaos and violence like the stampede that took place during the Rath Yatra of Lord Jagannath, the symbol of Odia identity

"The BJP government has failed in every field except for spreading lies. Therefore, the Biju Janata Dal will work with a strict approach in the Assembly to protect farmers, women. the Panchayati Raj system and the Odia identity," he said.

Meanwhile, Odisha Police tightened security arrangements across Bhubaneswar in view of the Assembly session. and arrangement was reviewed by DGP YB Khurania.

A three-tier security system is being put in place for the Monsoon Session. Around 30 platoons (900 personnel) are being deployed across strategic locations around the Assembly building, an official said.

The police have deployed striking forces, special tactical units (STU), bomb disposal squads, dog squads, and fire service teams.

Bhubaneswar, Sept 17: Amid recent road mishaps involving vehicles with unauthorised structural modifications, the State Transport Authority (STA) has directed the regional $transport \, of ficers \, (RTOs) \, \bar{to} \, take$ stringent action against such vehicles, especially DJ vehicles. official sources said Wednesday.

In a letter to RTOs, the STA said it has come to notice that a growing number of different types of vehicles, particularly those popularly re-

ferred to as DJ vehicles, are being extensively modified and operated in public places across Odisha. "These modifica-

tions are being carried out in blatant violation of the pro-

visions of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, and the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, and pose a serious and increasing threat to road safety," it said.

Such vehicles are frequently found to be in violation of the dimensional and safety standards prescribed under the relevant automotive industry standards and provisions of MV law, which pertains to the installation requirements of lighting and light signalling devices for motor vehicles, it said.

Structural alterations exceed the permissible length, width, height and rear overhang, which severely compromise the vehicle's manoeuvrability and safe road usage. Replacement of prescribed lighting and signalling systems with high intensity aftermarket multi-coloured LED, laser, and neon lights, including flashing DJ lights are visually disruptive to other drivers, it said, adding, "Use of high-power DJ audio systems (several thousand watts PMPO) amplifiers, and mixers emit excessive sound and light, distracting both the vehicle driver

and other road users.' Obstructions to driver visibility are caused by tinted films. sliding curtains, banners, interior lighting, and other unauthorised fittings on the windshield and windows. These vehicles not only endanger the lives of passengers travelling in such vehicles but also pose significant risks to other road

users, including pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists, it said.

The matter warrants urgent and stringent enforcement action in accordance with the statutory provisions, with a view

to curbing such unsafe practices and ensuring the safety of all road users, the STA told the RTOs.

"Any vehicles found flouting the provisions of AIS-008 and AIS-052 or Section 52 of the MV Act, 1988 shall be immediately proceeded against. Action shall also be taken for use of altered vehicles in public places. The fitness certifi cate of such vehicles shall be cancelled under Section 56(4) of the MV Act," it said.

It said, "Strict prohibition is imposed on the use of after market multi-coloured LED/ laser/neon lights, rotating DJ lights. The use of DJ systems, amplifiers, mixers, laser light controllers, and any similar set ups that modify the passenger cabin/cargo bed/trailer etc. into an entertainment zone shall be strictly banned. Vehicles found with such installations shall be treated as unsafe and unfit for operation and actions will be taken as per law," STA said.

Bhubaneswar, Sept 17: With an initiative, aims to provide traffic and road safety violators an opportunity to settle outstanding fines at reduced rates and encourage safer driving behaviour, State Commerce and Transport department has announced a 'One-Time Settlement Scheme' for pending e-challans as of July 31, 2025.

Road safety remains a key concern in Odisha and across India, with the number of motor vehicle law violations continuing to challenge authorities despite multiple enforcement measures. E-challans, including those generated through the Intelligent Enforcement Management System (IEMS), have been issued to address violations, but a significant number of pending challans remain unresolved.

Under the new scheme, violators can clear their pending fines at a reduced amount, as per the schedule provided by the Transport department. However, challans for which

prosecution reports have already been submitted to designated courts are excluded from the scheme. The one-time benefit will be available for a period of six months from the date of the official notification.

"This initiative is designed to recover outstanding fines efficiently while promoting road safety by encouraging violators to adopt responsible driving habits," the department said in an official statement.

Some of the key reductions under the scheme include Driving regulation violations (General Offence) - Fine reduced from up to Rs 500 to Rs 250. Oversized vehicles - fine reduced from Rs 5,000 - 10,000 to Rs 5,000. Jumping red lights or violating stop signs – fine reduced from Rs 1,000-5,000 to Rs 1,000. Using a mobile phone while driving, overtaking in no-overtaking zones, or driving against traffic flow fine reduced to Rs 1,000 each. Violating air and noise pollution norms - Fine reduced



Nabarangpur, Sept 17: Child marriage and teenage pregnancies have emerged as grave conawareness as a key factor.

Figures from the District Social Welfare department show that between 2020 and August 2025, authorities prevented 1,638 child marriages. Yet the same period recorded 7,559 pregnancies among minors, despite repeated government campaigns and awareness drives. The statistics have heightened worries

The law prescribes punishment for intermediaries, priests, and parents who facilitate child marriages. However, many families continue to defy the rules, marrying off their daughters at a young age. Officials intervene whenever they receive reports, and awareness campaigns are carried measures will have limited effect unless families themselves understand the consequences of early marriage.

The Health department's figures, however, do not fully align with those of the Social Welfare department. Health officials reported 1,557 cases of underage pregnancies between 2022-23 and August 2025, with 473 recorded in 2022-23, 599 in 2023-24, and 485 in 2024-25.

Poverty drives many families to marry off their daughters early to ease financial pressure, but this practice places minors at risk of health complications, unsafe motherhood, and threats to survival of both mother and child.

Traditional practices and social pressures continue to reinforce child marriage in some communities. Lack of awareness means parents fail to grasp its harmful effects. Once married, girls are forced to drop out of school, contributing to the district's growing dropout rate. They are also more vulnerable to domestic violence and social neglect.

Experts emphasise that stricter enforcement of laws prohibiting child marriage, coupled with sustained awareness drives, is essential. They warn that child marriage not only darkens the future of individual girls but also obstructs the development of society as a whole.

Aryapalli fishing jetty dredging work begins

Chhatrapur, Sept 17: Dredging work at the Aryapalli fishing jetty mouth has started Wednesday in the presence of Chhatrapur MLA Krushna Chandra Nayak and Ganjam Collector V Keerthi Vasan.

The mouth of the jetty had silted up, causing difficulties for fishing boats in entering the jetty and leaving for the sea. Fishermen said venturing into the sea for fishing had become increasingly difficult. Following intervention by the district administration and the MLA, Adani Gopalpur Port deployed a modern dredging machine to carry out the work.

The Netherland-made dredger, brought from Dhamra Port, will deepen and widen the jetty mouth. Officials said the work is expected to be completed within a period of two months. The dredged sand will be deposited near Aryapalli Marine Police Station to help protect the coastline from tidal ingression.

Thousands of fishermen from 27 villages had been facing hardships in entering the jetty and in venturing into the sea due to the blockage, officials said. Collector Vasan noted that the administration had requested the port authorities to take up the project. MLA Nayak said this will stop fishermen from migrating to other states in search of livelihood.

The inauguration at Aryapalli jetty was attended by Prashant Kumar Patra, business head of Gopalpur Port, Bhaktabandhu Satapathy, and several local leaders of fishermen and residents.

Term loan/WCDL sanctioned by lenders was transferred to different CC account (held with lending banks) of GPIL and from these different accounts funds diverted to related party (non-business) in a period of time.

 From the cash credit account statement of Bank of Baroda bearing account No 06880500000217, it was found that payments amounting to Rs.1,28,35,000/- has been made to Flexo Contra Private Limited which is shareholder and related party of Gupta Power Infrastructure Limited from the period 27.09.2019 to 31.03.2023. This is a case of diversion of fund as it is neither debtor nor creditor as per annual Balance Sheet of Gupta Power

 GPIL has not made necessary disclosures regarding any Related Parties in their audited BS for F.Y.2018-19 to F.Y.2021-22. Further the company has submitted CA certificate to the Banks dated 31.10.2021 and 21.09.2022 confirming about the same. However, during the scrutiny the forensic auditor observed that Tirupati Conductors Pvt. Ltd. is a related party to GPIL and also GPIL had many transactions with this company, Abhishek Gupta (Director of the company) is a 3.94% shareholder of GPIL and he is 9.92% shareholder in Tirupati Conductors Pvt. Ltd. till 31.03.2021. The audited Balance Sheet as on 31.03.2021 shows that the Trade Receivables from Tirupati Conductors Pvt. Ltd stands at Rs. 18.95 crores and the Trade Payable from Tirupati Conductors Pvt. Ltd stands at Rs.12.02 crores. The stock statement as on 31.03.2021 shows the debtors from Tirupati Conductors Pvt. Self-Righteous All

t feels increasingly difficult nowadays to avoid righteousness; or, worse, self-righteousness. We are constantly being told what to do by those who supposedly have seen the light. For example, I was recently scolded by a colleague for suggesting that my own employer should aim to hire the best people, regardless of their sex or race. I was struck by the confidence that this person felt in instructing me on what I should value; it felt high-handed and uninformed.

Of course, there is a difference between righteousness and self-righteousness (though the slippery slope between them is short and steep). The advantage of righteousness is that it is justified, as in the case of a zealot who opens people's minds to the possibility that they are prejudiced. By contrast, lecturing a stranger on how to weigh the trade-off between merit and equity strikes me as self-righteous.

Why is there so much of this behaviour today? To address that question, we need to understand what makes people so sure of themselves. The answer may be a little surprising: Self-righteousness comes from judging the world by the perceived correctness of actions rather than by the quality of outcomes.

Consider tariffs. To evaluate the issue objectively, one must understand the causes of trade, trade imbalances, and their effects. In other words, one must frame the issue "consequentially." Presumably, the goal of a tariff policy is to produce beneficial outcomes. But that can be accomplished only by understanding why people trade and how to create conditions for the kind of trade you want. You must think about how the world works and how to tweak

it to produce the outcomes you desire. This may seem obvious, but successful execution requires a deep understanding of difficult economic questions. Once you begin trying to understand how trade works, you discover how complicated it is. Everyone is always looking for the best deal by guessing what everyone else is willing to buy and sell. Will imposing a 25% tariff on Canada cause Canadians to meet your demands, or will it drive them into a corner? This isn't a question about what you value. It's a question about how the world works. A good consequentialist analysis will try to deliver an objec-

tive answer. Owing to this complexity, consequentialist perspectives are shockingly rare among politicians and the public. People tend to adopt a much simpler one. seeing issues in terms of sacred values with which a given action either does or does not accord. Thus, instead of looking at the causes and consequences of trade, the Trump administration focuses on a particular action, as if tariffs are, by virtue of their righteousness, some kind of

cure-all. The framing of the issue plays the same role as a religious dictate. It is a core belief, in this case based on little more than the

If one's position on trade can be determined by sacred values, imagine the role such values play on issues like concealed-carry permits for firearms, abortion, assisted suicide, or religion in education. Framing issues in terms of sacred values makes them seem simple, but only because it avoids all the hard analytical work needed to link conse-

Psychologists have shown that this perspective makes people more intransigent and less likely to compromise. Violations of sacred values cause outrage to the point that people will take actions to purify themselves (as with self-flagellation) and to right the perceived wrong. Sacred-value frames are thus a recipe for hostility, polarisation, and conflict. Because sacred values are inherently personal, they force the conversation to be about individual faith-based commitments that can brook no dissent, deepening the sense of opposition and corralling people into distinct identity groups.

By contrast, it is quite hard to be self-righteous when adopting a consequentialist frame. Discussions of causes and consequences are not only difficult; they require attention to detail, recognition of real-world complexities, and humility about what you don't know. It is less about vourself and more about the issue, because such conversations leave no cognitive or emotional space for indignation. Yankees and Red Sox fans can have a conversation about strategy and statistics. But as soon as one side starts cheering for its team, there's little that the other side can do but cheer for its own.

The problem with certainty is that it is rarely justified. Issues that elicit strong disagreement tend to be complicated. Offering an informed argument about trade policy requires an enormous amount of expertise, and even experts disagree (at least about the details; even advocates of tariffs agree that Trump's implementation of the policy has been suboptimal).

People simply do not know how little they know. We live under the illusion that we have a better understanding of how things work than we actually do. Strong opinions demand justification. The conviction that America should impose tariffs just because you like tariffs, or because they are good for you personally, doesn't cut it. Strong preferences give people strong convictions, but they will not persuade those who do not share them - nor should they.

So, before asserting self-righteous claims about someone else's opinions or actions, think about their end goal. What consequences are they trying to achieve? In small matters, like how to interact with the people around us, and large ones, like how to strengthen the economy, thinking in these terms can open persuasive lines of argument. Perhaps more importantly, it would force us to stop talking past one another.

A RIGHT, NOT CHARITY

1,000 and less! Some 37 lakh senior citizens and their dependents survive on this monthly pittance called pension from the Employees' Pension Scheme 1995 of the EPF Act 1952. They have to manage their food, clothing, medicine, and all other geriatric care needs within this provision. They deserve a higher minimum pension, not simply because the amount is so paltry and they are senior citizens. No. They are entitled to it because they have toiled all their productive lives for the creation of wealth and have sacrificed a part of the employer's share of PF contribution to build a robust pension fund.

Without any of these - contribution or work - many of the poor in the country get much bigger support during their old age. For instance, the AP and Telangana governments give a welfare pension of ₹4,000; still more in certain cases in these states. Similarly, the state and Central government employees get a good amount of pension. The MPs and MLAs, too, get a pension; some of them who functioned in both roles at different times get two pensions. All their pension schemes have much bigger minimum provisions than the EPF minimum.

So, it is the EPF pensioners' right to get an adequate pension, not some charity demand out of anybody's compassion. No argument against the claim is tenable and just. Funds' shortage and nonviability of the scheme and similar claims for not raising EPF minimum pension, concerning 5.39 crore members under EPF Pension Scheme and more than 81 lakh pensioners at present, therefore, are absolutely wrong and untenable. The government takes shelter under its inability, usually based on three impediments.

The EPF pension scheme is based on defined contribution and defined benefit. In other words, it is predetermined as to how much contribution is to be

pooled in the fund and how much pension is to be paid out of it. So, no scope for an increase; it is the first and foremost objection.

The second ground is based on an actuarial evaluation. The fund is periodically evaluated to determine if the present corpus and future accumulation are sufficient to meet the continued pension payment obligation. The claim is that there was an actuarial deficit as of 31.03.2019.

The third observation: the pension scheme, though not declared as such, appears to be of the Pay-As-You-Go (PAYG) type. Under PAYG, the current employees contribute to the pension fund while retired persons receive the pension; the cycle goes on without needing any additional help. But the government fears that it may not work without external support.

Looking from these very three premises, objectively, and adding to it the governmental responsibility in a welfare state to provide for old age social security, the payment of an adequate sum like half the salary as a pension to all the EPF members, and raising their minimum pension to a decent level is not only not impossible but not an escapable obligation.

Look at these hard facts. The total investment corpus in the employees' pension scheme by 31 March 2025, as Shobha Karandlaje, MoS in Labour Ministry, revealed in Parliament, was ₹9,92,689.56 crore. The pension outflow every year is minimal compared to the corpus. For instance, in 2023-24, the pension paid was ₹23,027.93 crore, equal to 2.59% of the corpus that year of ₹8,88,269.01 crore. Let alone the corpus comparison, the interest earned on it in one year, 2023-24, was ₹58,668.73 crore, more than double the pension.

The number of present pensioners (81 lakh) in the total number of members in the scheme (5.39 crore) constitutes about just 15%. True, more pensioners are added every year, increasing the pension payment burden, so will be the increased volume of funds, with more and more persons joining the labour force in an expanding economy.

The contribution in a given year will be more than the pension outgo. The pension accumulation last year was ₹71,780.41 crore against pension payment of ₹23.410.17 crore, which means ₹48,370.24 crore additional accretion to the pension fund. Then, where is the actuarial deficit? Why can't PAYG work? Where are the non-viability signs?

Even if these things happen at any time, a hypothetical sitshould come forward to meet its social responsibility to protect the interests of senior citizens. Is it not undemocratic and arbitrary to single out EPF pensioners in fixing such a small amount as ₹1,000 minimum on baseless fears, while providing a higher amount to government employees and legislators?

Also, the financial burden as a result of increasing the minimum is not going to be too big, as is being made out by the government. At present, more than 78 lakh of the total 81 lakh pensioners get less than ₹5,000 a month, while 58 lakh get less than ₹2,000. To raise the minimum to₹ 5,000 from the present ₹1,000, it would require ₹46,918 crore; net of the present payment of total pension of ₹14,329 crore, it would need still a lesser sum, ₹32,589 crore. Around double this money is needed to raise the minimum to a very reasonable ₹10,000 a month. These are not unsustainably big sums given the fund's position and of

course, the government's will. If the government doesn't agree with these facts, it may appoint a commission under the chairpersonship of a judge who can examine the pension systems under EPS of EPF and decide its overall restructuring to guarantee post-retirement income security for retired employees covered and required to be covered under this scheme.

The commission may take into account all the factors, including fund viability, and the government's increasing social responsibility in the context of demographic changes. Equally important fact: all the private sector employees are under the EPF fold, and the government has the responsibility to protect their interest on equal footing with its own employees.

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mong several tangible outcomes, symbolic or strategic, from the 25th Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit in Tianjin, China, the agreement to set up a new multilateral development bank (MDB) is a calculative political decision. While the Summit has successfully invoked world attention for its timing, attendance, and outcomes, it is the striving for reallocation and realignment of power, characterised by multipolarity or polycentrism that attracts the most scrutiny. Is the SCO Development Bank (hereafter SDB) an attempt to amplify such multipolarity in the global financial structure?

Arguably, the approval of establishing the SDB is the most symbolic, startling, and strategic move under Chinese Chairmanship of the SCO. During the Summit, President Xi projected himself as the counterweight to the US leadership by presenting salient features of the global governance initiatives. The SDB is the outcome of one of Xi's pathways of transforming global governance. What is the rationale behind establishing another MDB initiated by China? The world's second-largest economy has already established the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB), having the single biggest shareholding, and the New Development Bank (NDB), having equal shareholding with BRICS countries. In general, MDBs are public financial institutions that extend loans, grants, technical assistance, and policy advice to member countries. They have tremendous political and economic clout over recipient countries, especially the poorer economies.

Undisputedly, the oldest and largest MDB, the US-led World Bank Group (WBG) established with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) in 1944 as the Bretton Woods twins, is the mainstay of the world financial structure since World War II. Whereas the US, being the largest shareholder, with other Western countries, controls the governance of the WBG and IMF, both sides of the North Atlantic call the shots in the global economic affairs. Despite several concerted efforts for democratisation of developmental decision-making process in such global and regional MDBs, including the UNSC, WTO, the response has been insufferably limited.

Meanwhile, the developing member countries require an estimated \$4.3 trillion of development finance per year, including \$1.3 trillion for climate actions, to meet the ambiDevelopment Goals (SDGs) by 2030. It is estimated by the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNF-CCC) that developing countries require at least 6 trillion dollars by 2030 to meet less than half of their existing Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs).

tious targets of the Sustainable

At present, the 12 existing MDBs and their 44-odd batteries of bilateral development agencies, with private finances, are insufficient in fulfilling the developmental needs of developing countries and indifferent to reform in the governance of global financial edifices. Last year, 10 prominent MDBs, including AIIB and NDB, estimated that they could collectively expand their lending by an additional \$300 billion to \$400 billion in the next 10 years. Still, it's a peanut to the huge shortfall. One of the major arguments behind setting up the SDB is fuelling the financial needs in the Eurasian region and beyond. Subsequently, the SDB, when it functions, technically will be accompanying the AIIB in expanding Chinese economic influence in the heart of Asia.

At the outset, the SDB will focus its operations in the Eurasian member countries of the SCO. The idea of the SDB can

be traced back to the Ufa Summit in 2015 of both BRICS and SCO, when the establishment of the NDB was formalised. The SDB will be, subsequently, supplementing and complementing the Eurasian Development Bank (EDB), an MDB established in 2006 with Russian clout, which lends \$ 2.5 billion annually in Eurasia.

While the world's elite industrialised democracies (G7) were unperturbed in maintaining the status quo in Alberta, Canada, in June, the BRICS Summit in Rio in July and the SCO in Tianiin both have exposed the fallacies of fractured multilateralism that grappled with global governance. On the other hand, nearly five decades of permutations and combinations on multipolarity by ambitious regional power centres have achieved a zero-sum game against the mighty but cunning traditional powers. Yet, the SDB, being the 13th MDB. may justify its establishment in diversifying opportunities for accessing development finances for the Global South.

Despite being fully preventable, low awareness, delayed medical care, and incomplete vaccination lead to many avoidable deaths. Dog bites are rising sharply, from 2.1 million in 2022 to 3.7 million in 2024, highlighting the urgent need for action. The disease attacks the nervous system and is almost always fatal once symptoms appear. Immediate steps after a dog bite - wound washing, vaccination, and rabies immunoglobulin (RIG) if needed — can prevent infection. Yet, many people do not complete the full vaccine course or follow unverified remedies, increasing risks. India aims to eliminate rabies deaths by 2030 through stray dog vaccination, continuous vaccine supply, awareness campaigns, and the 15400 helpline. Experts emphasize that with timely and proper treatment, rabies is entirely preventable.

New Delhi, Sept 17: The Supreme Court Wednesday directed the CAQM, CPCB and state pollution control boards to come out with measures to prevent air pollution within three weeks, ahead of winter when pollution levels spike.

A bench comprising Chief Justice of India (CJI) B R Gavai and Justice K Vinod Chandran asked Uttar Pradesh. Harvana. Rajasthan and Punjab, CAQM and CPCB to fill the vacancies in three months.

It, however, granted six months for filling promotional posts in CAQM, CPCB and state pollution control boards.

In the meantime, the bench directed the states and the authorities to appoint persons either on deputation or contractual basis, keeping in mind the approaching winter season. when pollution level is expected to spike. The court came down heavily on the states for failing to fill the long-pending vacancies in their pollution control

boards, observing that inadequate manpower during peak pollution seasons aggravates the environmen-

Presently, pollution control boards in Haryana. Puniab. Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan have 44, 43, 166 and 259 vacancies. respectively.

HC orders Cong to take down AI video of PM, his mother

Patna, Sept 17: The Patna High Court Wednesday directed the Congress to take off from its social media handles an AI-generated video depicting Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his late mother.

Acting Chief Justice P B Bajanthri passed the order on a petition filed by advocate Vivekanand Singh and others, who had called the video a "defamatory publication" and violative of restraints placed on political parties under the Representation of the People Act.

Additional Solicitor General of India K N Singh, who appeared for the Union government, told PTI "the court has made it clear that the video shall remain withdrawn till the next date of hearing".

In the petition, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, the Union government and the Election Commission were also named

as respondents. EC's counsel Siddharth Prasad said "the court has also issued notices to Facebook, Twitter and Google, directing them to file their reply by the next date of hearing". The high court is likely to

mention the next date in the order sheet, which would be uploaded on its website. Seeking to target the prime

minister, the Bihar Congress had last week posted the video on its X handle, with a prompt in Hindi, "Sahab ke sapno mein aayi maa. Dekhiye rochak samvaad. (Mother came in sahab's dream. Watch an interesting interaction between them.)

The video portrayed Modi's mother criticising him for his politics. The BJP and its allies had lashed out at the Congress over the video, while protests erupted across the country. The Congress maintained that no disrespect was shown to the PM or his mother.

AI may predict heart disease from mammogram, age

New Delhi, Sept 17: Researchers have developed an artificial intelligence tool that could predict the risk of heart disease in women by analysing their mammogram and age, without depending on an extensive medical history. Described in a paper in the

journal 'Heart', the AI tool was trained and validated using routine mammograms from over 49,000 women in the state of Victoria, Australia, obtained from hospital and death re-One of the authors of the pa-

per, Clare Arnott, an associate professor and the global director of the Cardiovascular Program at The George Institute. emphasised the need for new methods to identify women at risk for cardiovascular disease to improve screening.

"By integrating (cardiovascular) risk screening with breast screening through the use of mammograms -- some-



engage with at a stage in life when their cardiovascular risk increases -- we can identify and potentially prevent two major causes of illness and death at the same time," Arnott said.

"A deep learning algorithm based on only mammograph-

ic features and age predicted cardiovascular risk with performance comparable to traditional cardiovascular risk equations," the authors wrote. The researchers added that

previous studies have looked at

features of a mammogram, such

associated with cardiovascular risk in certain populations. However, relying on the fea-

ture alone has limitations, including being less accurate in predicting heart disease risk in older women, they said. Arnott said, "Our model is the

first to use a range of features from mammographic images combined simply with age -- a key advantage of this approach being that it doesn't require additional history taking or medical record data, making it less resource intensive to

Al crash: Pilot's father rejects suicide, mental health claims

Mumbai, Sept 17: Perturbed with the preliminary findings of the AAIB inquiry into the Ahmedabad plane crash, Pushkaraj Sabharwal, father of Captain Sumeet Sabharwal who was one of the pilots of the ill-fated Air India Dreamliner, has demanded a 'formal investigation' by the central government.

In one of the worst aircraft accidents in India, a total of 260 people, including 241 passengers, died after Air India's Boeing 787-8 aircraft operating flight AI171 to London Gatwick crashed soon after take off from Ahmedabad June 12.


In a letter to the civil aviation secretary and AAIB Director General, 91-year-old Pushkaraj said that selective leaks about the accident have led to speculation that Sumeet (56) was under tremendous psychological pressure and therefore was con-

templating committing suicide. "These innuendos have very



adversely affected my health and mental setup and the rep utation of Captain Sumeet Sabharwal. They tarnish Cap tain Sabharwal's reputation which is a fundamental right guaranteed to a citizen of India under Article 21 of the Constitu tion of India," the letter, dated August 29, said. Pushkaraj has demanded that the central gov ernment order a formal enquiry into the accident under Rule 12 of the Aircraft (Investigation of Accidents and Incidents) Rules, 2017. Under Rule 12, the central government can institute a formal investigation into circumstances of any accident of an Indian registered aircraft if it appears that it is expedient to hold such a probe.

Gandhi had visited the floodhit areas in Amritsar and Gurdaspur districts of Punjab Monday and interacted with those affected by nature's fury. He also visited the houses which were damaged by the recent floods and sat among some flood-affected people. He was accompanied by Punjab Congress leaders. The former Congress chief claimed that over 4 lakh acres of paddy crop have destroyed, and over 10 lakh animals have perished. Lakhs of people, mostly from marginalised communities, have lost their homes, he said.

"The flood has also rendered vast tracts of land uncultivable in the near future. Even today, thousands of acres are submerged and villages remain cut off," he said.

"Despite the gravity of this

crisis, I witnessed the very best of humanity. Communities rallied behind those who lost everything," he noted.

Gandhi said people opened their homes to strangers and shared whatever little they had. Their generosity, and commitment to help, often at great personal risk was admirable, he said. "Puniab will rise again. In their hour of need, we must reassure every farmer, every soldier, and every family in Punjab that India stands with them. We must come together and extend all possible support to help rebuild their future," he said in the letter

The Punjab government has claimed that the floods resulted in damage to 3,200 schools, the loss of 56 lives, and the destruction of about 8,500 kilometres of roads and 2,500 bridges. Additionally, 1,400 clinics, government buildings, and 19 colleges were also severely damaged,

2,500 tourists stuck in U'khand

Dehradun, Sept 17: Around 2,500 tourists were stranded in Uttarakhand's Mussoorie Wednesday as the road from Dehradun to the popular hill station remained closed for the second consecutive day following cloudbursts and heavy rain in the capital. Meanwhile, Delhi witnessed

a cloudy sky Wednesday, with parts of the city receiving showers. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a yellow alert, advising that the situation be monitored and updated in line with its colour-coded guidelines.

Heavy showers ravaged the Himalayan states of Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh, already bruised by a string of deadly natural calamities over the past couple of months, Tuesday.

The cloudbursts and heavy rains left 15 people dead, 16 missing, and more than 900 stranded in Uttarakhand, while in Himachal Pradesh, three members of a family were

killed as rains triggered mas sive landslides and flash floods.

rehabilitation work picked up pace on Wednesday, Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami said that focus was on the swift restoration of essential services while his Himachal Pradesh counterpart Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said people still residing in unsafe buildings would be relocated to secure places to ensure their safety

The cloudbursts and heavy rains in Dehradun Tuesday severely damaged the route to Mussoorie. It was breached at several points, prompting police to appeal to tourists and visitors to stay wherever they were -- whether in hotels, homes or homestays -- till the road was restored.

According to officials, the number of stranded tourists was much higher Tuesday, but sev eral of them have left Mussoorie via Vikasnagar, a longer route blocked by landslides that was opened for traffic Wednesday.

Meanwhile, an alternative Bailey bridge is being erected at Kolhukhet, and it is likely to become operational for light vehicles by Wednesday night, a senior official said.

"Debris has been partially cleared from two points along the route, but installation of an alternative bridge at Kolhukhet may take a little more time," a police officer in Mussoorie said.

Apex court refuses to stay global Ayyappa

New Delhi, Sept 17: The Supreme Court Wednesday refused to entertain the pleas against the Kerala High Court order which dismissed petitions challenging the decision of the Travancore Devaswom Board to conduct a global conclave of Ayyappa devotees

September 20. The pleas came up for hearing before a bench of Justices P S Narasimha and A S Chandurkar which refused to interfere

with the high court's order.

In its September 11 order a division bench of the high court had passed a slew of directions in the larger interest of maintaining the sanctity of Sabarimala and the ecological balance of river Pampa.

"In view of the foregoing discussion, we find no reason to interdict the conduct of the Global Ayyappa Sangamam scheduled to be held on the banks of the river Pampa September 20, 2025," it had said.

The high court had said the Board shall exercise strict dis cretion to ensure that no event was conducted on the banks of Pampa river in any manner that compromises its sanctity, whether by erecting permanent or temporary structures.

Besides other directions it had said during the days of conclave and throughout the preparatory works, the Board shall ensure that none of the rituals, ceremonies or related functions were disturbed or diminished to the detriment of

Disha Patani home firing: 2 shooters killed in encounter

New Delhi, Sept 17: Two active members of the Rohit Godara-Goldy Brar gang, allegedly involved in firing outside Bollywood actress Disha Patani's residence in Bareilly, were shot dead in an encounter near Tronica City in Ghaziabad Wednesday, officials said.

The encounter was carried out in a joint operation by Delhi Police Special Cell and Special Task Forces of Uttar Pradesh and Haryana, they said, adding that four officials of the joint party were injured during the shootout. UP Police's Additional Director General (ADG) Law and Order Amitabh Yash said Ravinder, resident of Haryana's Rohtak and Arun from Haryana's Sonipat were shot dead during an encounter by the

joint party. According to officials, four personnel from the joint party were injured during the shootout. Among them were two Delhi Police Crime Branch personnel --Sub-inspector Rohit and Head Constable Kailash -- and two others were UP STF officials, Ankur and Jai.

They are all undergoing treatment and out of danger.

"The duo had a direct role in the Bareilly firing case, which had sparked security concerns around high-profile personalities. The incident was suspected to be an intimidation tactic linked to extortion," an officer of Delhi Police Special Cell said.

Unidentified assailants had fired multiple rounds outside Patani's Bareilly residence around 3.45 am September 12, creating panic in the locality. A case was registered at the

Bareilly Kotwali police station, and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath directed immediate action in the matter, reiterating the state government's zero-tolerance policy towards crime. ADG Yash said that police examined CCTV footage, gathered intelligence inputs, and matched records from neighbouring states, leading to the identification of the shooters as Ravinder, son of Kallu, resident of Kahni in Rohtak, and Arun, son of Rajendra, resident of Indian Colony, Gohana Road

A joint team of the STF's Noida unit and Delhi Police intercepted the duo in Tronica City, Ghaziabad. In the ensuing exchange of fire, both accused sustained serious injuries and were rushed to the hospital, where they were declared dead, the ADG said, He confirmed that both Rayinder and Arun are active members of the Rohit Godara-Goldy Brar gang. Ravindra has a criminal history and has been involved in several previous cases.

Judicial system in India, UK taken for ride by mother: SC

New Delhi, Sept 17: The judicial system in India and the UK was "taken for a ride" by a woman for reasons best known to her, the Supreme Court has observed, while directing that the custody of her minor son be handed over to his father.

Deprecating the woman's conduct, a bench of Justices J K Maheshwari and Vijay Bishnoi said the case reflected a deep-rooted conflict between the woman and her husband, arising from their divergent intentions regarding staying together and raising their children in India.

It said this discord had not only strained their marital relationship but also adversely impacted their two children, one of whom is staying with the

mother in the United Kingdom. The top court said the prolonged discord of ties between the couple, who got married in November 2010, led to a further dispute on visitation over their two children.

The bench said the circumstances compel it to focus on how best the welfare and interests of the children can be safeguarded.

Referring to the woman's conduct, the bench said while leaving her son in India, it was her primary duty to inform the father, which she did not dis-



disclose to the high court of the UK, where the man had moved an application, that the boy was not with her there.

It said it appeared that the woman never intended her son to meet his father and to say the least, to honour the

The man told the apex court that his wife left India for the UK in May 2021 with both the children, without informing him or taking his consent.

Later, he found out that his minor son was in India with his parents-in-law.

He then approached the Punjab and Haryana High Court, raising the issue of alleged illegal custody of his children.

In its verdict delivered on September 16, the apex court noted that the woman had obtained a divorce from a family court in London, while the man secured a divorce from a family court in Jind.

Windsor, England, Sept 17: US President Donald Trump kicked off his historic second state visit to Britain Wednesday amid unprecedented pomp, intense security, technology investments and protests as King Charles and other royals welcomed their nation's closest

Trump and his wife Melania are being hosted by the king at Windsor Castle, the oldest and largest inhabited castle in the world and family home to British monarchs for almost 1,000 years, where he is being treated to the full array of British pageantry from a carriage procession to a lavish banquet.

Britainlaid on what it said was the largest military ceremonial welcome for a state visit in living memory, and Trump, an overt royal fan, has made little secret of his delight at being not just the first US leader, but the first elected politician to be invited for two state visits.

Navalny's wife says foreign tests show her

husband was poisoned

London, Sept 17: Yulia Navalnaya, the wife of late Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny, said two foreign laboratories had carried out tests on biological samples obtained from her husband that showed he was poisoned.

Navalny died suddenly at the age of 47 February 16, 2024, in a Russian prison in the Arctic Circle, depriving the Russian opposition of its most popular

Navalnaya has repeatedly accused Russia of killing him, an allegation the Kremlin dismisses as nonsense. President Vladimir Putin has said that before Navalny died there had been plans to swap Navalny in a prisoner exchange with the West. Navalnaya posted a video on X in which she said that biological material from Navalny was smuggled abroad in 2024 and that two laboratories examined the material.

"These labs in two different countries reached the same conclusion: Alexei was killed. More specifically, he was poisoned," Navalnaya said.

She demanded that the laboratories release their findings about what she called the "inconvenient truth". She did not specify what poison the laboratories had found. "These results are of public importance and must be published. We all deserve to know the truth," Navalnaya said.

When asked about Navalnaya's remarks, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said, "I don't know anything about these statements of hers, and I can't say anything.'

The Kremlin casts Navalny's political allies as dangerous extremists out to destabilise Russia on behalf of the West. It says Putin enjoys overwhelming support among ordinary Russians.

Navalny described Putin's Russia as a brittle criminal state run by thieves, sycophants and spies who care only about money. He had long forecast Russia could face seismic political turmoil, including revolution.

of growth, as shipments to the US rose 4.8 per cent over April to \$8.8 billion. In April, exports to the US stood at \$8.4 billion. "The slide in exports closely

Centre notifies CGST rates for goods effective Sep 22 changes to consumers and align

New Delhi, Sept 17: The Union Finance Ministry has notified Central GST (CGST) tax rates for goods, which will be effective from September 22.

States will now have to follow suit and notify the State GST (SGST) rates to be levied on goods and services beginning Monday. Under GST, the revenues are shared equally between the Centre and the states.

Effective Monday, GST will be a two-tier structure, wherein the majority of goods and services will attract tax of 5 and 18 per cent. A 40 per cent tax will be lev-

ied on ultra luxury items, while tobacco and related products will continue to be in the 28 per cent plus Cess category.

Currently, Goods and Services Tax (GST) is levied in 4 slabs of 5, 12, 18 and 28 per cent. Besides, a compensation cess is levied on luxury items and demerit or sin goods.

With the reduction in rates on most goods, the onus is now on trade and industry to pass on the benefit of these tax rate

Partner Rajat Mohan said by issuing clear schedules in the notification, the government has provided the much-needed clarity on applicable rates across a wide spectrum of goods. 'With this clarity in place,

the ball is now in the industry's court. Businesses must promptly update their systems, revise pricing, and ensure smooth implementation of the new rates across supply chains," Mohan said. The success of this reform will depend on how effectively and transparently the industry adopts these revised tax rates, he added.

EY Tax Partner Saurabh Agarwal said that as rate notifications are now being released, it is imperative for industries to align their ERP systems, pricing decisions and supply chain.

"This strategic alignment is critical to ensure a smooth implementation and, crucially, to guarantee that the benefits of this rate rationalisation are effectively passed on to the end consumer," Agarwal said.

The decision to lower tax rates to benefit the common man was taken by the GST council, comprising the Centre and states, at its meeting September 3.

SEBI to allow FPIs in commodities

Mumbai, Sept 17: Security Exchange Board of India (SE BI) is seeking government nod to allow banks, insurance companies, pension funds, and FPIs to invest in non-agriculture commodity derivative markets, its chairman Tuhin Kanta Pandey said Wednesday.

He said the capital markets regulator is also looking at a proposal to allow foreign port folio investors to trade in noncash settled non-agricultural commodity derivative contracts

By December-end, SEBI will include commodity-specific brokers in a common reporting mechanism for compliance re-

ports, Pandey pointed out. Stating that commodity de rivative markets play a very important role for the economy, Pandey said, India aspires to be the "price-setter" instead of being a "price taker" at a

global level. There is a need to look at how to broaden the acceptance of Indian benchmarks at home and abroad, he said, stressing that in volatile times like the current one, the exchanges can act as a

good tool of price insurance and help protect profit margins. career crat-turned-securities regulator specifically pointed out that the recent doubling of tariffs on alu minium and copper imports by the US "directly affects" India's

export landscape. "In such a volatile environment, a robust derivatives market provides a powerful shield. allowing Indian producers and consumers to hedge against glob-

al price shocks," Pandey said. He said the market becomes very essential in the case of critical minerals like lithium cobalt, nickel and rare earth elements, which are building blocks of green energy and posed a challenge.

"What can our markets do as India pursues its goal of self-reliance in critical minerals? Can we develop financial instruments that help finance and de risk the exploration and mining of these vital resources?

Affirming that SEBI will continue to strengthen the integrity and safety of commodity markets, Pandey underlined that real-time margin collection and continuous monitoring are "non-negotiables" for the regulator. Strengthening India's commodity markets is "high' on SEBI's regulatory agenda, he said, listing out some measures in this regard. It has already constituted a

committee to recommend mea sures for deepening the agriculture commodity segment, Pandey said, adding that the watchdog will also constitute a working group for developing the non-agricultural commodity space, including metals.

Govt to rebid 40 GW of RE projects

New Delhi, Sept 17: The government is expected to go for rebidding of around 40 GW of renewable energy projects that have been stalled in the absence of power purchase agreements (PPAs), official sources said Wednesday.

40 gigawatt (GW) includes

both solar and wind capacity projects, one of the sources said.

At present the winners of these tenders are engaged with distribution companies (discoms) because they are the potential buyers, they said, adding that no one is going to face any loss as no investment has happened yet in these projects. It is only the price discovery

Stage set for Neeraj-Nadeem duel India's Neeraj qualifies for World C'ships finals with first throw, sets up clash against Pakistan's Nadeem Barabati Stadium lights up for historic OPTL opener

Tokyo, Sept 17: Defending champion Neeraj Chopra will face Pakistan's Olympic gold medallist Arshad Nadeem in the World Championships finals in a much-anticipated clash between the two cross-border rivals as the duo made the cut in contrasting styles in the qualification round here Wednesday.

While Chopra stormed into the finals after clearing the automatic qualification mark of 84.50m in his very first throw in Group A, Nadeem (85.28m) spent some anxious time before making the grade in his third and final attempt later in

According to rules, those who touch the automatic qualifying mark of 84.50m or the best 12 finishers compete in the final round to be held Thursday.

The Pakistani has come into the showpiece after competing in just one event in the whole of 2025, winning gold in the Asian Championships in Korea in May. He then underwent a knee surgery in July.

Sachin Yadav also joined Chopra in the finals as second Indian after his 83.67m effort placed him at sixth in Group A and 10th overall. Two other Indians, Rohit Yaday and Yashvir Singh missed out after finishing 28th and 30th respectively out of 37 competitors in Group A and Group B together.

In the last edition in 2023, India had three javelin throwers in the finals with Kishore Jena and DP Manu finishing fifth and sixth respectively while Chopra won the gold.

The 27-year-old Chopra was the first thrower in the qualification round and he sent his spear to 84.85m without much exertion. Having achieved the objective of making it to the final with minimum effort, the two-time Olympic medallist packed up and left the arena.

He was third in Group A and sixth in the overall standings but that did not matter on the day.

Nadeem, on the other hand. began with a horrendous 76.99m and followed it up with a 74.17m. It seemed for a while that Nadeem, who had also won a silver in the last edition in 2023 behind Chopra, would not make it to the finals.

But the 28-year-old pulled off a 85.28m throw in his third and final attempt to be the fourth automatic qualifier for the finals from Group B. He qualified for the finals at fifth place, just above Chopra.

PARIS HEARTBREAK

Chopra is set to face Nadeem for the first time after the 2024 Paris Olympics, giving him a chance to avenge his second-place finish in the

Nadeem had won gold in Paris with a monster throw of 92.97m, while Chopra had a best of 89.45m that night

Chopra has been clubbed with German star Julian Weber, who topped Group A and was second overall with a throw of 87.21m. 2012 Olympic champion Keshorn Walcott of Trinidad and Tobago, last edition bronze winner Jakub Vadlejch of Czech Republic and Sachin in the 19-man Group A qualification round Wednesday.

The 18-strong Group B featured Nadeem, two-time world champion Anderson Peters, Kenya's 2015 world champion Julius Yego, Brazillian 90m-plus thrower Luiz Da Silva, and Indians Rohit Yadav and Yashvir Singh, and rising Sri Lankan Rumesh Tharanga Pathirage among others.

Peters topped the qualification round with a season best second round throw of 89.53m.

Chopra breached the coveted 90m mark with a 90.23m throw at Doha DL in May but the year has also seen the Indian superstar logging some mediocre

Nadeem may be short on competitive outings ahead of the World Championships but he is capable of producing a winning throw as he had done in Paris Games last year. Before Olympics too, he had participated in just one event in whole of 2024.



Bolt, once fastest man alive, now breathless climbing stairs

TIME TAKES ITS TOLL

Washington, Sept 17: Time really flies, or what? Usain Bolt, the legendary sprinter, famously known as the fastest man on the planet, looks in great shape physically, but internally, he isn't quite the same. An eighttime Olympic gold medallist, Bolt retired from active competition in 2017, having held the world record in 100 meters, 200 meters and 4x100 meters relay.

Bolt admits that father time has caught up with him. An 11-time world champion revealed that he no longer engages in running or sprinting, and that the majority of his time is

spent at home.

'Well normally, I wake up just in time to see the kids off to school, and then it depends on what I have to do. If I have nothing to do, I just chill out. I might work out sometimes if I'm in a good mood. I just watch some series and chill until the kids come home. I spend some time with them, hang out, until they start annoying me. Then I leave. And then afterwards, I just stay at home and watch movies, or I'm into Lego now, so I do Lego," Bolt said.

Bolt attended the World Championships, and as the world's greatest sprinter sat high above the stadium in a skybox, his presence was still looming over a sport that hasn't been

the same since he left. Oblique ter world champion, but Usain Seville may now be the 100-me-Bolt remains the only track star of this century whose fame extends far beyond the sport. Eight years after his retirement, no one has come close to matching his times, or his aura.

He is now a father to fiveyear-old daughter Olympia Lightning and four-year-old twin boys, Saint Leo and Thunder. They have no clue just how big a star his dad was back in the day. If there was ever a word 'unbeatable' in sport, Bolt came the closest.

However, the greatest sprinter of all time believes their perspective may change at the next World Championships, two years from now in Beijing the city where his career first took flight. Bolt plans to take them there himself, to show them the stage where it all began and tell them about their father's legacy

Outside track and field, time away from the sport has taken its toll. Even for someone as fast as Bolt, the rust has set in, the point where, at 39, even climbing a flight of stairs can feel like a challenge.

"I mostly do gym workouts I'm not a fan, but I think now that I've been out for a while. I have to actually start running. Because when I walk up the stairs I get out of breath. I think when I start working on it fully again, I will probably have to do some laps just to get my breathing right," added Bolt.

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
