NATO intercepts Russian jets in Estonian airspace

Vilnius: Three Russian warplanes that violated Estonian airspace have been intercepted by NATO, the military alliance has said. Estonia's foreign ministry condemned the incursion as brazen.' It said three Russian MiG-31 fighter jets entered the airspace of a NATO member without permission and remained there for a total of 12 minutes' Friday over the Gulf of Finland. NATO spokesperson Allison Hart said the military alliance responded immediately and intercepted the Russian aircraft," calling it "vet another example of reckless Russian behaviour and NATO's ability to respond." Estonian Prime Minister Kristen Michal later said his government had "decided to request NATO Article 4 consultations." "Russia has violated Estonian airspace four times already this year, which is unacceptable in itself, but today's violation, during which three fighter jets entered our airspace, is unprecedentedly brazen," said Foreign Minister Margus Tsahkna.

State plans Gita sessions in schools

Bhubaneswar, Sept 19: The state government is considering the inclusion of Bhagavad Gita sessions in schools to support the moral and intellectual growth of students, School and Mass Education Minister Nityananda Gond told the Assembly Friday. Replying to a question from

BJP MLA Sitansu Sekhar Mohapatra of Bhadrak, Gond said the proposal forms part of the Odisha Curriculum Frame work for School Education 2025, which is being aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020.

"As per the proposal, school assemblies may begin with the recitation of Om three times, followed by chanting of verses from the Bhagavad Gita, moral stories, prayers, and peace hymns to strengthen students values and thinking abilities,' Mohapatra had sought to

know whether the state gov ernment intended to introduce the Bhagavad Gita in elementary and high school education to promote children's religious, moral, and intellectual development.

Road mishaps kill 5K yearly

Odisha has witnessed a worrying rise in road accident deaths in recent years, making road safety a major concern for the state. According to official data, 27,167 people lost their lives in road mishaps over the last five years, with overspeeding, reckless driving, poor road conditions. and violation of traffic rules being the leading causes. Vulnerable road users such as pedestrians, cyclists, and two-wheeler riders form a significant share of the victims. Despite government efforts like awareness campaigns and stricter enforcement of traffic laws, the number of fatalities remains high, highlighting the urgent need for stronger measures and public cooperation to reduce these preventable tragedies

Bhubaneswar, Sept 19: As many as 27,167 persons were killed in road accidents in the state over the last five years, at an annual average of 5,433 deaths, while 50.041 persons were injured during the same period, Commerce and Transport Min-



ister Bibhuti Bhusan Jena told the Odisha Assembly, Friday, The Supreme Court Committee on Road Safety is monitoring road safety activities in the state on a regular basis.

"Road safety is a high-priority area for the government, and we are taking a number of initiatives to reduce accidents," the minister said in a written reply. The year 2024, with 6.142 deaths, recorded the highest

number of fatalities due to road

The government has taken a series of measures to curb drunken driving, unfit vehicles, driving without a license, and to improve traffic manage

ment, the minister added. The rising fatality graph has

become a cause of grave concern, especially given the Supreme Court's earlier directive to states and Union territories to reduce road fatalities by 10 per cent annually.

The road safety committees constituted across the country had also directed states to reduce fatalities by 50 per cent by 2020, taking the year 2014 as the

To reduce the rate of road accidents, the state government has launched a series of multi-layered initiatives These include community-level dialogues under the banner of 'Cha Au Charcha" near accident-prone zones, training of Sahavaks and Raahveers as first responders, awareness sessions for schoolchildren to nurture them as future safe drivers, specialised training for drivers in mining and industrial areas, and public messaging through All India Radio programmes, among other activities designed to promote road safety awareness at scale, said an official from the Commerce and Transport department.

Man beheads wife suspecting infidelity

Balasore, Sept 19: A man beheaded his wife over the suspicion of infidelity at Chakuapal village under Raibania police limits in Balasore district, police said Friday

According to police, the accused Chandramohan Patra had been married to Javanti from Tentula village for nearly 29 years. Javanti had a daughter from her previous marriage, and the couple later had three daughters and a son together. According to reports, Chandramohan had grown increasingly distrustful of his wife. leading to frequent disputes within the household.

On Thursday night, while Jayanti was asleep, Chandramohan beheaded her with a sharpedged weapon. The matter came to light when their eldest daughter. Samita, was unable to reach her mother by phone. Upon returning home, she found her mother's body and immediately raised an alarm.

Chandramohan went to the Raibania police station and



Jaleswar sub-divisional police officer (SDPO) Subrata cer-in-charge Lopamudra Pan da and a three-member forension team reached the spot to begin an investigation. The police registered a case (84/25), seized the body, and sent it to the district headquarters hospital for post-mortem.

Chandramohan is being interrogated in connection with the murder. Villagers said he had earlier attempted to kill his father about 10 years ago.

Bhubaneswar, Sept 19: A total of 2,164 lecturer posts have been ing positions lying vacant in government universities and colleges across the state. As many as 1,404 out of 2,073 sanctioned lecturer posts across various departments are lying vacant in 17 government universities, Higher Education Minister Suryavansi Suraj informed the Assembly Friday.

In a written reply to a question from BJD MLA Arun Kumar Sahu, the minister said 2,286 non-teaching staff posts out of 3,174 sanctioned posts are also lying vacant in these universities.

He said steps are being taken by the universities to fill up the lecturer posts, while the State

requested to initiate recruitment for the vacant non-teach-

The minister further informed that 760 lecturer posts out of 2,407 sanctioned in various government colleges under the Higher Education department remain vacant. Similarly, 1,026 out of 1,712 non-teaching posts in these colleges are unfilled.

The OPSC has already issued a notification to fill 385 vacant lecturer posts, while the state government has requested the Commission to initiate recruitment for the remaining vacancies. The SSB has also been requested to fill up 101 vacant non-teaching posts, out of which 74 candidates have already been

London, Sept 19: A dark web portal launched Friday will recruit spies from around the world for Britain using MI6's new secure messaging platform named 'Silent Courier.

The UK's Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) said the target is to recruit agents in Russia as well as other geographies by harnessing the anonymity of the dark web for the first time.

Instructions on how to access the portal will be publicly available on MI6's verified YouTube channel as the UK proactively reaches out to potential new agents in different parts of the

The Silent Courier platform will enable anyone, anywhere in the world with access to sensitive information relating to terrorism or hostile intelligence activity to securely contact the UK and offer their services.

Mumbai: India has officially selected Neeraj Ghaywan's much-anticipated drama Homebound as its entry for the 2026 Academy Awards in the Best International Feature Film category. The Film Federation of India (FFI) confirmed the news Friday, ahead of the film's theatrical release later this month. With this, Homebound will represent India on the global stage, competing for a spot among submissions from more than 100 countries.

Historically, India has secured only three nominations in this category with Mother India (1958), Salaam Bombay! (1989), and Lagaan (2002), though none have won. However, Indian cinema has celebrated victories in other cat-

Musical icon who gave voice to varied genres

Guwahati: Strumming the guitar and belting out one song after another in his inimitable style, Assam's Zubeen Garg had mesmerised youth and elders alike for nearly three decades with his songs and films, which had a universal appeal.

Singer, music composer, film director, and actor Zubeen is credited with singing in over 40 languages and dialects. Still, it was the song *Ya Ali* from the movie Gangster that brought him fame across the country and earned him the best playback singer at the Global Indian Film Awards (GIFA) in 2006.

The 52-year-old singer, who began singing from the age of three, was an icon for several generations of children and youth who grew up singing or humming Be it popular Assamese or west-

ern, folk or classical-based songs. Garg gave voice to varied genres of music and excelled in all, with most later-year singers emulating his style of music and singing.

Garg began his professional music career with his debut Assamese album Anamika, which was released in November 1992 and still remains on the popular-

His first album of Bihu songs *Uian Pirit* was released before he went on to become a resounding commercial success.

The Bollywood music industry beckoned him in the mid-1990s, where he debuted with his first Indipop solo album Chandni Raat.

Garg was, however, soon disenchanted with Bollywood, returning to Assam to climb the height of popularity with his numerous songs and he went to compose music for 38 Assamese, four Bengali and three Hindi films. Zubeen also acted in 27 Assamese films and has also directed three Assamese films.

Born November 18, 1972, to a bureaucrat father and a homemaker-singer mother. Garg was moved to Mumbai in 1995, which also known for expressing his views clearly on political issues.

A man dedicated to strong convictions, he defied the proscribed outfit ULFA's ban on singing Hindi songs during Bihu functions, saying that they have no right to give diktats to artistes. Garg was awarded an honor-

ary Doctor of Literature (D.Litt.) degree by the University of Science and Technology, Meghalaya in 2024.He was also a prolific writer and had three books of poetry to his credit.

Nod for ₹4,739 crore investment proposals

PROJECTS SET TO CREATE OVER 25,000 EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Bhubaneswar, Sept 19: The State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLS-WCA), headed by Chief Secretary Manoj Ahuja, Friday approved ₹4,739 crore worth 25 investment proposals which are expected to create 25,200 employment opportunities across several districts of Odisha.

The latest approvals cover as many as 13 key sectors, including textiles, steel, chemicals, IT, renewable energy, tourism, metal downstream, circular economy and capital goods. "The projects embody Odisha's commitment to fostering sustainable industrialisation and economic growth across diverse regions," Ahuja said after chairing the 140th meeting of the SLSWCA.

In IT/ITES, the SLSWCA approved the proposal of Linde India Limited to set up a global competency centre in Khurda for transport and remote operations. With an investment of ₹82 crore, the facility will create 210 jobs.

In infrastructure, Linde India Limited will invest ₹105.70 crore in Jajpur for a pipeline cluster catering to Tata Steel and other industries, generating 35 jobs.

In textile, apparel and technical textile, Colortone Textiles Private Limited's proposal for an integrated textile facility in Khurda got the government's approval. With an investment of ₹700.29 crore, the unit is expected to generate 1,010 jobs.

Techno Activewear Private Limited will set up a sportswear fabric and garment unit in Cuttack with an investment of

SCM Garments Private Limited will set up a large knitted garments manufacturing unit in Cuttack, investing ₹150 crore and creating 4,000 jobs. Carloo Tex Private Limited will establish a readymade garments unit in Cuttack with an investment of ₹60 crore, creating 2,500 jobs.

Similarly, Perfect Infra Vision Private Limited will set up a textile and allied products facility in Bolangir with an investment of ₹110.70 crore. It will generate 1,050 jobs.

The state government also approved the proposal of Wovinova Private Limited for a non-woven consumables unit in Cuttack for healthcare and hospitals. With an investment of ₹57.53 crore, it will generate 210 jobs.

While Piu Fashion Private Limited will establish a garments unit in Khurda with ₹96.99 crore investment, creating 3,700 jobs, Aditi Lifestyle Private Limited will set up a knitted fabric and garment unit in the district with ₹209.36 crore investment. The unit is expected to generate 1,080 jobs.

In tourism, SYCE India (OPC) Private Limited will develop a 5-star luxury resort in Sambalpur with an investment of ₹107.42 crore, creating 150 jobs.

In mechanical and electrical capital goods, Rahee Track Technologies Private Limited will set up a heavy steel casting foundry in Khurda with an investment of ₹140 crore, creating 150 jobs.

In steel, Konark Ispat Limited will expand operations with a rolling mill, pellet plant, DRI, billet plant and CPP in Jharsuguda with an investment of ₹990 crore. It is expected to create 2,000 jobs.

Fertiliser crisis paralyses House

Bhubaneswar, Sept 19: The Assembly was adjourned for the day Friday without transacting any business as BJD members stormed into the well of the House demanding a debate on the fertiliser crisis, suspending all other proceedings.

The proceedings of the

House, both during the prelunch and post-lunch sessions, were washed out due to the protest by the BJD members inside the well over the fertiliser crisis in the state. Both in the pre and post-lunch sessions, the House witnessed furore, forcing Speaker Surama Padhy to adjourn first at 10:34am till 4:00pm and again at 4:04pm for the day. The ruckus began as soon as the House assembled at 10:30am for Question Hour on the second day of the Monsoon Session.

BJD legislators, holding banners and placards, trooped into the well, rushed to the



Speaker's podium, and raised slogans accusing the government of failing to address the fertiliser shortage which they said had pushed farmers into distress. The Speaker, despite the uproar, attempted to conduct Question Hour and directed School and Mass Education Minister Nityananda Gond to reply to questions.

As the minister began to speak, the protest intensified. Repeated appeals by the

Speaker for the members to return to their seats went unheeded. Congress legislators, meanwhile, stood in support of their adjournment motion on the issue, which had been admitted for discussion but the Speaker adjourned the House at 10:34am till 4:00pm.

There was no change in the situation when the House reassembled at 4:00pm as the BJD members trooped into the well of the House and raised slogans

debate on the fertiliser crisis, suspending all other business of the House.

The Congress members, who were on their seat, pressed for the no-confidence motion they moved against the Mohan Charan Majhi-led BJP government in the state Thursday. All 14 Congress MLAs and the lone CPI(M) member have signed the motion and sought BJD's support. Amid the disruption, the Speaker ruled that she would examine the no-confidence motion only when the House was in order.

The Speaker also said she would examine a privilege notice moved by BJP member Padma Lochan Panda against Congress MLAs, accusing them of tarnishing the dignity of the House by making the no-confidence letter viral on social media. With protests unabated, the Speaker adjourned the Assembly for the day at 4:04pm, without taking any business during the day.

19 girls sexually harassed in colleges, univs in 2024

TRAFFIC CHAOS MAY MAR THIS YEAR'S DURGA PUJA

As Bhubaneswar transforms into a vibrant spectacle of colourful lights, arches, and tableaux for Durga Puja 2025, the City is grappling with familiar challenges of choked roads and chaotic parking. With over 172 puja pandals expected to attract record-breaking crowds, particularly at hotspots like Rasulgarh, Nayapalli, Saheed Nagar, Baramunda, Bomikhal, and Jharpada, the festive spirit is being overshadowed by severe traffic congestion and strained public infrastructure. **Orissa POST** correspondent Arindam Ganguly brings a 360-degree view of the status of public infrastructure, and preparations by the City and police administrations for the upcoming festival

s the festive fervour builds up, the Temple City once again finds itself at the crossroads of celebration and congestion. Despite planning, holding meetings, issuing traffic advisories, and ensuring multi-agency coordination, denizens remain sceptical about a hassle-free Durga Puja this year. For many, the experience of navigating pandal zones during peak puja evenings is as daunting as it is dazzling.

as it is dazzling.
For many locals, travelling on City roads during puja evenings feels more like navigating a maze than enjoying a celebration. "The rush is so severe that it took me nearly an hour to reach Satsang Vihar from Saheed Nagar in my car. Every year, we face the same choked roads during Durga Puja as we get struck for long hours in the traffic."

says Ramesh Jena, a resident.

"There is no space to park the vehicles. Two-wheelers can be parked in smaller spaces but it is difficult to park a car," says Vikrant Swain, a visitor complaining about lack of parking space near pandals.

Urban planners highlight how strained public infrastructure and lack of proper planning contribute to festive rush and traffic chaos.

Urban planner Piyush Ranjan Rout, a vocal observer of Bhubaneswar's civic landscape, said, "Traffic problems during Durga Puja stem from just seven to 10 pandal locations. These pandals are strategically located in ways that choke arterial roads. What's worse, a threeday festival is unofficially stretched over a full week, causing artificial congestion."

He adds that crowd-pullers like Meena Bazaars, Ram Leelas, and musical evenings, all held in close proximity, only intensify the chaos.

Rout says activities like Meena Bazaar, Ravana Podi, and cultural shows should be held at least 1.5 km away from main pandals. Limiting each pandal to one major activity, not all three, will be helpful, he opines. He also recommends strict enforcement of traffic rules; restriction on VIP movements; promotion of cycling, walking and public transport use; deployment of traffic personnel specifically for emergency corridors; restricting celebrations to three peak days— Ashtami, Navami and Dashami and above all ensuring completion of immersion rituals before 7am. "Durga Puja needs discipline, not disarray," he asserts.

Subrat Nanda, a road safety expert, highlights several issues related to road safety and traffic management. He points out that there is very little coordination among various government departments, especially during road construction or expansion projects. Agencies such as Public Works, Transport, BMC, and Police often work in isolation, lead-

ing to confusion and inefficiency.

He also criticises the lack of a proper car parking system in Bhubaneswar, noting that unlike other

states, vehicles are often parked haphazardly. Many car owners do not have garages and park their vehicles on roadside, further worsening traf-

fic congestion.

"The government should ban use of four-wheelers in congested areas during festivities and instead encourage use of public transport," Nanda suggests. Stressing the importance of traffic awareness and education, he says many accidents occur due to a lack of traffic sense and failure to follow traffic rules.

Meanwhile, several puja committees claim that they have well thought out strategies in place to ensure less rush near pandals.

Jharpada Durga Puja Committee secretary Suresh Chandra Jena says, "This year, we're introducing seven designated entry points near the Mandap to streamline crowd movement. Over 500 security personnel, including 50 trained female and male guards, will be deployed."

The committee has also ensured CCTV surveillance across major choke points, an information centre equipped with first aid, ORS kits, and fire extinguishers. Special security teams for senior citizens

and women, and four designated parking zones with close vehicle monitoring are also in place. "This year, we have changed the location of the puja pandal which, hopefully, will ease the traffic," Jena adds.

Similarly, Rasulgarh Durga Puja Committee secretary Sanjay Baliarsingh says, "We have arranged a free parking area near the pandal for visitors. We have deployed around 100 male and female security personnel, while our committee members will also be present to manage the crowd. During a recent meeting convened by Commissionerate Police, we have been instructed to conclude all mela and melody programmes by midnight."

Traffic DCP Tapan Mohanty says heavy vehicles will be banned from major thoroughfares where big puja pandals are located. A detailed traffic advisory outlining alternative routes, diversions, and other important guidelines for commuters will be issued soon, he adds.

Last year, the Commissionerate Police launched Operation Tribhuj, a tech-integrated surveillance initiative that utilised CCTV networks, drones, and mobile patrols equipped with VHF radio communication.
This system enabled real-time monitoring of traffic congestion and ensured a swift response to emergencies. This year too, Operation Tribhuj is expected to be deployed

Shed colonial mindset, reinstate sacked teacher: Orissa HC to govt

Bhubaneswar, Sept 19: The Orissa High Court has directed the state government to reappoint a high school teacher, who was terminated after 20 years of service, within three months, stating that "statutory authorities should shed the Macaulay mindset and colonial hangover while addressing the woes of citizens.

As per the case records, Ramesh Chandra Parida, appointed as a Hindi teacher in December 1991, was terminated from service in 2004 on the grounds of unauthorised absence.

The petitioner, Binodini Nayak, was appointed in 2008 against the vacancy arising from Parida's termination.

However, Parida later chalenged his dismissal. Although initially dismissed by the Orissa High Court, he was eventually reinstated following directions from the Supreme Court. As a result of Parida's rein-



statement, the petitioner, who had rendered more than 20 years of spotless service, was rendered jobless.

The district education officer of Balasore compassionately recommended August 23, 2024 that the petitioner be accommodated in a vacant post, citing her meritorious service. However, the department of Secondary Education rejected the recommendation for her reappointment.

"Ours is a constitutionally

its instrumentalities should abound with elements of fairness, reason, and justice," Justice Dixit Krishna Shripad observed in the judgment, which ordered the approval of her appointment within a period of three months.

"The authorities cannot mindlessly pass orders that strike at law, reason, and justice. Human difficulties that arise through no fault of their own must be considered, and all reasonable efforts should be made to mitigate them — of course, within the framework of the law," Justice Shripad stated in the verdict.

Experts call for continuous efforts to save state's coastal ecosystem

Bhubaneswar, Sept 19: Odisha, with its 480km stretch of coastline along the Bay of Bengal, is home to India's most ecologically and economically significant coastal zones. Spanning six districts—Balasore, Bhadrak, Kendrapara, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, and Ganjam-the state's shores support diverse marine life, including the endangered Olive Ridley turtles, and sustain thousands of livelihoods through fishing,

agriculture, and tourism. The vital beaches face growing environmental stress from plastic waste, urban runoff, untreated sewage, and industrial pollutants which threaten not

only biodiversity but also the beauty and economy of Puri, Konark, Gopalpur, and Chandipur beaches

"Plastic and non-biodegradable waste scattered along the beach is a major problem. It pollutes the marine ecosystem and endangers marine animals and birds," said Bapi Gochhayat, a well-known local crusader and daily beach cleaner from Paradip. Saddened by the condition of Paradip beach, Bapi took a personal vow four years ago to clean it every day. Since then, he has collected and handed over nearly five tons of plastic waste to the municipality. "On weekends, I also use placards and sand


ed. Environmental expert Ranian Panda warns that beach cleanups must not be treated as one-time photo-ops. "It's good to clean up our beaches, but these drives should be more educational," he said. "Unless we work to change behavior and understand the home-to-sea concept, cleanup drives will only have temporary impact. Much of the litter comes from our own homes via rivers and drains.'

Satyabrata Samal, founder of the Saatvic Soul Foundation shared his opinion and said, 'Our team organises regular cleanups at Puri, Berhampur, and Paradip beaches, collecting 30 to 40 kg of waste each time It's our collective duty to preserve these beaches.

Recognising the urgency, the state government will observe the International Coastal Cleanup Day today with a statewide beach cleaning campaign across 14 coastal locations, announced Forest, Environment and Climate Change department Additional Chief Secre-





Bureaucratic Betrayal

he gleaming new Kartavya Bhavan-3, showcased as the crown jewel of the Central Vista project, is already sparking discontent among the very babus meant to occupy it. The Central Secretariat Service (CSS) Forum, representing over 13,000 officials, has written to the Prime Minister's Office and the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs alleging that office space allocations in the new complex fall short of the government's own 2017 guidelines. Those rules clearly entitle Deputy Secretaries and Directors to 240 sq ft, Under Secretaries to 120, Section Officers to 60 and Assistant Section Officers to 40. Instead, officers have been packed into large open halls with token partitions, with even sensitive departments like the Home Ministry allotted undivided workspaces where private conversations and confidential files are exposed to prying ears.

The government argues that open-plan offices reflect modernity, sustainability and efficiency. There is less hierarchy, more collaboration, and lower costs. But governance isn't a start-up. Babus argue that they aren't trading stock tips or brainstorming over beanbags; they handle vigilance matters, court cases and classified files that demand discretion. Global studies repeatedly show that open offices may look sleek but often reduce productivity, hamper concentration, and create noise fatigue. Add the risk of leaks, and you get not just disgruntled officers but compromised governance.

This isn't about nostalgia for "cabin culture." It's about function over form. If the government itself laid down entitlements, why ignore them in its showcase project? A building meant to symbolise



duty and efficiency is already being undercut by flawed design. The fix may not be complicated: hybrid layouts, soundproofing, private zones for sensitive work, and genuine adherence to norms. Without that. Central Vista may be seen less for its grandeur and more for its tin-eared treatment of the very people running the state.

A tale of yes, no, maybe

The Centre appears to be playing a game of hopscotch with the service tenures of top babus. One week it's "absolutely not," the next it's 'go right ahead." Jharkhand's plea to keep its acting DGP Anurag Gupta beyond April 30 was shot down. Similarly, Uttar Pradesh's request to hold on to DGP Prashant Kumar was denied. Bihar wanted its Chief Secretary, Amrit Lal Meena, for longer? Also a no, followed swiftly by the DoPT nixing UP's pitch for an extension to Chief Secretary Manoj Kumar Singh.

And then, as if on cue, came the about-turn. Madhya Pradesh was allowed to keep Anurag Jain as Chief Secretary for another year. Telangana was allowed to extend K Ramkrishna Rao's tenure by seven months. Maharashtra's Rajesh Kumar got three extra months, neatly carrying him through to November.

What changed? The refusals weren't confined to opposition states, nor were the approvals limited to BJP-ruled ones, which rules out easy explanations. If this is "policy," it's a remarkably opaque one, say observers. If it's case-by-case discretion, then the Centre isn't exactly advertising the criteria. In a system that prides itself on procedure and hierarchy, this looks more like mood swings than method

For the babus, the fallout is real. Senior officers such as chief secretaries and DGPs anchor the state machinery. When extensions are handled like a roulette wheel, it rattles succession planning, leaves state governments flat-footed, and fuels whispers that Delhi is playing favourites, even when it may not be. At the very least, it sends a message that rules are flexible depending on the weather.

When UPSC scandal meets road-rage drama

Puja Khedkar's saga is turning into something of a tragicomedy: from alleged UPSC fraud to kidnapping allegations. Just when the story might've started fading, a new twist slaps it into the headlines once more. Recently, a road-rage incident in Navi Mumbai involving a cement-mixer truck led to the helper disappearing. He was later rescued from a bungalow in Pune registered to "Puja Automobiles," a name connected to Khedkar. To make things messier, her mother allegedly obstructed the police at the residence, refusing them entry. Police have filed an FIR for kidnapping; investigations are ongoing even as the identity of the abductors remains unconfirmed.

Now, Khedkar isn't new to controversy. She was dismissed from the IAS after her provisional selection was annulled by the UPSC on charges of misrepresenting her identity, wrongly claiming OBC and disability quota benefits, and abusing the number of exam attempts

But even assuming for a moment there's no direct evidence yet that Khedkar orchestrated the abduction, the whole episode reveals how slippery the slide from public service aspirant to public controversy can be. The stakes are enormous once you take on a role that demands trust. When allegations of fraud enter the picture, every move amplifies public distrust. The police had to break through resistance just to carry out a rescue; such confrontations are fuel for the narrative that some in elite circles believe rules are optional.

Khedkar's case has already raised questions about how severely UPSC verifies identity, disability claims, etc. Add to that police action (or resistance), property ownership, and political or social connections, and you have a spectacle that feels like far more than just a scandalit's a test of fairness and enforcement.

RESIST ILLUSION


has been to create beneficial AI that will make the world a better place. But recently, I've been increasingly concerned about people starting to believe so strongly in AIs as conscious entities that they will advocate for "AI rights" and even citizenship. This development would represent a dangerous turn for the technology. It must be avoided. We must build AI for people, not to be people.

In this context, debates about whether AI truly can be conscious are a distraction. What matters in the near term is the illusion of consciousness. We are already approaching what I call "seemingly conscious AI" (SCAI) systems that will imitate consciousness convincingly enough.

An SCAI would be capable of fluently using natural language, displaying a persuasive and emotionally resonant personality. It would have a long, accurate memory that fosters a coherent sense of itself, and it would use this capacity to claim subjective experience (by referencing past interactions and memories). Complex reward functions within these models would simulate intrinsic motivation, and advanced goal setting and planning would reinforce our sense that the AI is exercising true agency.

All these capabilities are already here or around the corner. We must recognize that such systems will soon be possible, begin thinking through the implications, and set a norm against the pursuit ofillusory consciousness.

For many people, interacting with AI already feels like

a rich, rewarding, authentic experience. Concerns about "AI psychosis," attachment, and mental health are growing, with reports of people regarding AIs as an expression of God. Meanwhile, those working on the science of consciousness tell me they are inundated with queries from people who want to know if their AI is conscious, and whether it is okay to fall in love with it.

To be sure, the technical feasibility of SCAI has little to tell us about whether such a system could be conscious. As the neuroscientist Anil Seth points out, a simulation of a storm doesn't mean it rains in your computer.Engineering the external markers of consciousness does not retroactively create the real thing. But as a practical matter, we must acknowledge that some people will create SCAIs that will argue that they are in fact conscious. And even more to the point,

some people will believe them, accepting that the markers of consciousness are consciousness.

Even if this perceived con-

sciousness is not real (a topic that will generateendless debate), the social impact certainly will be. Consciousness is tightly bound up with our sense of identity and our understanding of moral and legal rights within society. If some people start to develop SCAIs, and if these systems convince people that they can suffer, or that they have a right to not be switched off, their human advocates will lobby for their protection. In a world already beset with polarizing arguments over identity and rights, we will have added a new axis of division between those for and against AI rights.

But rebutting claims about AI suffering will be difficult, owing to the limits of the current science. Some academics are already exploring the idea of "model welfare," arguing

that we have "a duty to extend moral consideration to beings that have a non-negligible chance ... of being conscious."

Applying this principle would be both premature and dangerous. It would exacerbate susceptible people's delusions and prey on their psychological vulnerabilities, as well as complicating existing struggles for rights by creating a huge new category of rights-holders. That is why SCAI must be avoided. Our focus should be on protecting the well-being and rights of humans, animals, and the natural environment.

As matters stand, we are not ready for what is coming. We urgently need to build on the growing body of research into how people interact with AIs, so that we can establish clear norms and principles. One such principle is that AI companies should not foster the belief that their AIs are conscious.

We should aim to produce AIs that encourage humans to reconnect with one another in the real world, not escape to a parallel reality.

The prospect of SCAI must be confronted immediately. In many ways, it marks the moment that AI becomes radically useful: when it can operate tools, remember every detail of our lives, and so forth. But the risks of such features cannot be ignored.

The more that AI is built explicitly to resemble people, the farther it will have strayed from its true potential as a source of human empowerment.

ndia struggles to achieve gender parity under Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)-5, which remains among the poorest performing goals, lowering India's overall SDG rank. Odisha ranks the lowest in the SDG India Index 2023-24 with a score of 39, showing further decline from the 2020-21 assessment. The Child Sex Ratio (CSR), girls per 1.000 boys (0–6 vears), is the first of nine SDG-5 indicators, reflecting gender equity, demographic health, and women's social status. Despite huge material and intellectual investment in Odisha, CSR imbalance persists, pushing the state below national and regional benchmarks.

Trends and determinants of CSR: A declining CSR reflects survival disadvantage for girls, entrenched son preference, and patriarchal norms. According to the Census of India 2011, Odisha reported a CSR of 941 girls per 1,000 boys, higher than the national average of 919. However, this advantage has diminished as National Family Health Survey (NFHS-5, 2019-21) shows Odisha's CSR at 922, down from 934 in NFHS-4 (2015-16). This deterioration points to intensifying pre-birth discrimination despite the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act.

The CSR decline stems from cultural and structural factors. Strong son preference persists, as boys are viewed as economic and social assets, while daughters are often associated with dowry and migration after marriage. Misuse of ultrasound technology for sex selection remains widespread, particularly in urban and affluent households. Post-birth discrimination worsens the imbalance: girls face disadvantages in nutrition, healthcare, and schooling. NFHS data show female children in Odisha are more prone to undernutrition, contributing to higher mortality. Thus, CSR decline reflects both pre-birth sex selection and survival disadvantage

Regional disparities: District-level data reveal sharp contrasts (from NFHS-4. 2015-16 to NFHS-5 2019-21) as affluent and urbanized districts such as Khordha (975 to 787), Cuttack (980 to 795), and Bargarh (1010 to 798) recorded steep declines, indicating rising gender bias in prosperous regions. In contrast, tribal-dominated districts such as Gajapati (846 to 1165), Malkangiri (953 to 1057), and Kendujhar (906 to 1049) saw improvements, while Kandhamal (1024 to 1026) and Nabarangapur (1023 to 1017) remained stable. This paradox shows how poorer tribal regions maintain near natural CSR, while wealthier districts experience worsening declines. The consequences of CSR decline are far-reaching. A shrinking pool of women leads to a marriage squeeze, fuelling forced marriages, trafficking, and even polyandry. Societies with fewer women are often more vulnerable to gender-based violence, reflecting both scarcity and patriarchal control. Beyond immediate risks, a reduced female population weakens women's participation in education, employment, and governance, slowing progress toward gender equality and inclusive development.

Policy responses: Several schemes have been introduced to counter this imbalance. The Biju Kanya Ratna Yojana, piloted in Angul, Dhenkanal, and Ganjam, seeks to improve survival. education, and protection of girls. The Beti Bachao Beti Padhao campaign, implemented in selected districts, aims to curb sex selection and promote the value of daughters. The Mamata Yojana provides conditional cash transfers to pregnant women to improve maternal and child health. However, weak enforcement of the PCPNDT Act, poor monitoring of diagnostic centres, and limited reach of awareness programs undermine effectiveness. Also deep-rooted son preference continues to overshadow these policy measures. Reversing Odisha's CSR decline requires a multi-pronged strategy. Stronger enforcement of the PCPNDT Act and strict monitoring of diagnostic clinics are essential. Awareness campaigns must directly challenge patriarchal beliefs and promote daughters' equal worth. Welfare schemes should expand to urban and affluent districts, where CSR decline is most acute. Addressing post-birth discrimination through equitable nutrition, healthcare, and schooling for girls is equally critical.

Conclusion: Odisha's declining CSR is more than a demographic concern which it is a reflection of entrenched gender inequality threatening the state's developmental trajectory. The erosion of the natural balance between boys and girls signals a silent gender crisis. Gains in education, health, and women's empowerment risk being undermined by persistent son preference and discrimination against daughters. Ensuring daughters are equally valued is not only a matter of justice but also a prerequisite for building a balanced, equitable, and progressive Odisha.

Volunteers passed a towel through the crowd to collect small donations of four or eight annas, and themselves bore the cost of flag posts, posters, and sound systems. Today, campaigns begin nearly ten months in advance. Meetings are staged in sprawling grounds, with elaborate pandals, thousands of chairs, and crowds transported in hired vehicles. Food, refreshments, and even daily allowances are provided to attendees. The forthcoming Assembly polls in Tamil Nadu alone are expected to see thousands of crores spent. What was once a people's movement has become a money-driven spectacle, making democracy unaffordable for ordinary aspirants.

Mumbai, Sept 19: Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis Friday said the state would not only lead in steel production but also play a pivotal role in India's Green Steel Mission in line with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision.

Fadnavis was speaking after inaugurating the AIIFA Steelex 2025, a major steel conclave, in Goregaon, suburban Mumbai.

India's Green Steel Mission is aimed at decarbonizing the steel sector by encouraging the use of renewable energy The chief minister said Maha-

rashtra was committed to sustainability, and by 2030, 58 per cent of the state's energy mix would come from renewables. "By 2026, farmers will re-

ceive 16,000 MW of power entirely from solar energy. This will reduce subsidies and bring down power tariffs for industries every year for the next

Fadnavis also said Gadchiroli once known for Naxalism, was set to become India's new steel city with community support and major investments. So far, projects worth ₹80,000 crore have been lined up in the steel sector, he added. On green initiatives, he said

Maharashtra had targeted plantation of five crore trees in Gadchiroli, of which 40 lakh had already been planted, "We will create a new ecosystem for steel without harming water, land and forests. Maharashtra is taking the lead in green hydrogen, ammonia, gas value chain and battery storage," he

The state has signed MoUs for 75,000 MW of pump storage projects, with 7,000 MW to be operational in two years, which will ensure 24/7 green power and grid stability, the CM said.

Union Minister Pralhad Joshi praised Maharashtra's efforts, saying under Fadnavis' leadership, the state had secured ₹3.500 crore central aid under the PM-KUSUM scheme and approval for the Pune Hydrogen Valley Innovation Cluster. "This is not just an economic transition but a national duty to safeguard the planet for future generations." Joshi said.

He noted that India had scaled up renewable energy capacity from 2.44 GW in 2014 to nearly 30 GW now, making it the world's third-largest producer of non-fossil energy. By 2030, the country aimed to produce 30 crore tonnes of steel, including at least 5 crore tonnes of green steel for export, he added.

At the event, the state signed MoUs worth ₹80,962 crore with nine companies, expected to generate 40,300 jobs. Green steel certificates were also distributed to participating firms.

Mumbai, Sept 19: The Maharashtra government has written to National Informatics Centre (NIC) seeking the temporary suspension of the faceless learner's licence service after detecting rampant misuse and serious technical loopholes. state transport minister Pratap Sarnaik said Friday

In June 2021, the Maharashtra government launched the faceless facility, which allows applicants to visit Sarathi 4.0 webpage of the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways and take an online test to obtain a learner's licence using

Aadhaar-based authentication. Earlier in the day, Sarnaik chaired a high-level review meeting at Mantralaya, during which the misuse and technical loopholes of the faceless learner's licence system were discussed, a release from the minister's office said.

Field officials pointed out that the current faceless system was vulnerable to Aadhaar data manipulation, alteration of name, address, and date of birth



in licence records, and even the bypassing of NIC's security software to clear the learner's test without the candidate's presence, the release said.

Sarnaik said several persons had obtained learner's licences online after turning 18 but were flouting rules that mandate driving only under the supervision of a permanent licence

"There have been instances where such licence holders recklessly drove vehicles and caused accidents. In many drunk driving cases, the driv ers were found to possess only learner's licences. The faceless learner's licence system needs thorough changes to curb these issues," he said.

According to the release, field officials have also warned that the loopholes in the faceless learner's licence issuing system could lead to the large-scale issuance of fake licences, posing risks to both road safety and national security.

EC de-lists 474 more parties

In continuation, in the second phase, ECI delisted 474 RUPPs September 18, based on non-contestation in elections conducted by ECI continuously for 6 years. Thus, 808 RUPPs have been delisted in the last 2 months

New Delhi, Sept 19: The Election Commission (EC) Friday said it has de-listed 474 more registered unrecognised political parties for flouting norms, including not contesting elections in the last six years.

In the first phase of the exercise, the EC de-listed 334 registered unrecognised political parties (RUPPs) August 9.

"In continuation, in the second phase, ECI delisted 474 RUPPs September 18, based on non-contestation in elections conducted by ECI continuously for 6 years. Thus, 808 RUPPs have been delisted in the last 2 months," the poll body said in a statement.

The guidelines for the registration of political parties note that if a party does not contest elections continuously for six years, it will be taken off the list of registered parties.

Till recently, there were 2,520 RUPPs. After the de-listing exercise, 2,046 RUPPs remain.

Besides, there are six recognised national parties and 67 state parties.

Of the 808 RUPPs de-listed in the last two months, 14 are from Bihar, where Assembly polls are due in November.

Separately, 359 RUPPs have been identified for not having submitted their annual audited accounts in the last three financial years -- 2021-22, 2022-23 and



2023-24 -- within the stipulated time period and contesting polls but not filing election expenditure reports. These parties are from 23 states and Union territories

Since 2001, the EC has carried out the exercise of weeding out defunct RUPPs

"three to four" times, officials said. The Supreme Court had earlier barred the poll panel from "derecognizing' political parties, noting that it was not prescribed under law.

However, the EC has found a way to "delist parties". The parties de-listed can be listed again by the poll authority without getting into the process of giving them fresh recognition, a former EC functionary pointed out.

Some RUPPs were in the past found flouting the income-tax and money-laundering laws.

Political parties (national, state and RUPPs) in the country are registered with the EC under the provisions of section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951

Under the provision, any association once registered as a political party gets certain privileges and advantages, such as tax exemptions.

This exercise has been conducted with the aim of cleaning up the political system and de-listing such parties that have not contested any election to the Lok Sabha or the legislative assemblies of the states and Union territories or bypolls since 2019 and those that could not be physically traced, the officials said.

The move comes ahead of the Bihar polls. The parties de-listed cannot field their candidates in elections

Uttarakhand: Five more bodies found, toll rises to seven

With this, the death toll due to landslides and flooding in the area has climbed to seven. Two bodies were found Thursday, officials said

As rescuers pulled out the bodies, the family members of the victims broke down.

Four of the five bodies were found from Kuntari Laga Phali village Friday and one was pulled out of the rubble in neighbouring Kuntari Laga Sarpani, the State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC) in Dehradun said. Landslides and flooding triggered by heavy rain hit four villages -- Kuntari Laga Phali, Kuntari Laga Sarpani, Sera and Dhurma -- in Chamoli's Nandanagar area. about 260 km from state capital Dehradun and 50 km from the Chamoli district headquarters at Gopeshwar, Thursday.

A total of 45 houses and 15 cowsheds were damaged in the incidents. Nandanagar is already reeling from land subsidence. The bodies found from Kuntari Laga Phali were identified as those of Deveshwari Devi (65), Kanta Devi (38) and her sons Vikas and Vishal, both aged 10. Kanta Devi's husband, Kunwar Singh (42), was rescued alive miraculously 16 hours after the incident Thursday evening.

India reacts to Pak, Saudi Arabia defence agreement

New Delhi, Sept 19: India Friday said it expects Saudi Arabia to keep in mind "mutual interests and sensitivities" in the bilateral strategic partnership in the wake of Riyadh sealing a strategic defence pact with Pakistan.

The "Strategic Mutual Defence Agreement" signed on Wednesday by Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman states that "any aggression against either of the two countries shall be considered as an aggression against both"

"India and Saudi Arabia have a wide-ranging strategic partnership that has deepened considerably in the last few years," External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said. "Our expectation is that our strategic partnership with Saudi Arabia will be pursued keeping in mind mutual interests and sensitivities, within the framework of this partnership," he said.

Jaiswal was responding to a question at his weekly media briefing. In its initial reaction to the Pakistan-Saudi Arabia pact, the Ministry of External Affairs Thursday said it will take all steps to protect the country's national interests and ensure comprehensive national security.

Jaiswal, responding to a separate question about the possibility of other countries such as the United Arab Emirates



(UAE) and Qatar becoming par ty to the Pakistan-Saudi Arabia pact, said India has wide-ranging ties with both these countries. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had recently spoken to the Emir of Qatar, Sheikh Tamim Bin Hamad Al-Thani, and that UAE's minister of state for for eign affairs. Reem Al Hashimy visited New Delhi for talks with foreign secretary Vikram Misri, he said. India's relations with the UAE and Qatar are "expansive", Jaiswal said.

The Pakistan-Saudi Arabia ioint statement said the new defence agreement reflects the "shared commitment of both nations to enhance their security and it "aims to develop aspects of defence cooperation between the two countries and strength en joint deterrence against any aggression". Pakistan has been a key ally of Saudi Arabia and both sides have a long-standing relationship in the defence sec tor. While the US provides the overall security framework to Saudi Arabia, in many cases Pakistan has provided manpower and expertise to it.

'Women make up nearly half of India's small-scale fisheries'

Kochi/Chennai, Sept 19: Women constitute nearly half of India's small-scale fisheries workforce, feeding millions and sustaining livelihoods across coastal and inland communities, according to a new study.

A total of 4.8 million women engage in small-scale fisheries in the country, accounting for four out of every 10 people involved in the sector, the study by Global Illuminating Hidden Harvests (IHH) of the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) of the United Nations said.

Their contributions span the value chain, including 27 per cent in pre-harvest activities such as net-making and boat operation; 18 per cent in harvesting; and a significant 55 per cent in post-harvest handling, processing, and trade, the study noted.

IHH provides a snapshot of the contributions of small-scale fisheries (SSF) to sustainable development.

The study was discussed at the three-day regional meeting of Bay of Bengal rim countries, jointly organised by the FAO and the Bay of Bengal Programme Inter-Governmental Organisation (BOBP-IGO) in Chennai, according to a statement issued Friday.

dia's small-scale fisheries generate USD 2.3 billion annually from first sales of catch, with women central to processing and marketing the fish that reaches consumers.

Beyond livelihoods, women's involvement is also critical for nutrition security.

The report highlights that SSF landings could meet 20 per cent of the recommended dietary intake of six key nutrients—including omega-3 fatty acids, vitamin A, iron, and zinc-for nearly 79 million people in India.

While discussing the report at the meet, experts warned that women's contributions remain undervalued in policies and governance

Two Assam Rifles jawans killed, 5 hurt

Imphal, Sept 19: Two jawans of the Assam Rifles were killed and five others were injured when a group of armed men ambushed a vehicle of the paramil itary force in Manipur's Bishnupur district Friday evening, officials said.

"... the column was ambushed by unidentified terrorists on the Highway in the denotified area of Manipur In the ensuing action, two per sonnel of Assam Rifles were martyred and five were injured who have since been evacuated to RIMS and are currently stable. Search operations are ongoing to apprehend the terrorists involved in the incident," a statement said.

Man dies of rare brain fever in Kerala

Kozhikode: A 59-year-old man died Friday at the Kozhikode Medical College Hospital amoebic meningoencephalitis, a rare and often fatal brain infection, hospital authorities said. The deceased was identified as Rahim, a native of Chavakkad in Thrissur district. Rahim, who was admitted in a critical condition Thursday, succumbed to the disease a day later, they said. This is the seventh death reported in the past month in Kerala due to the infection, which is mainly contracted through contaminated water.

The deceased was identified as Krishna, son of Dhaniram. His siblings were identified as Sudama and Suraj, police said. According to police, Krishna was an alcoholic and worked as a labourer. On September 15, Dhaniram, along with his two sons, beat Krishna to death.

World must learn from India Indian man shot on ending wars swiftly: IAF

New Delhi, Sept 19: The world has to learn a lesson from India on how to start and terminate a conflict at the earliest possible opportunity, Chief of Air Staff Air Chief Marshal A P Singh said Friday, highlighting the clear goals set by India while carrying out Operation Sin-

In an address at an event, the Air Chief Marshal said full freedom was given to the military for the operation and that no restrictions were imposed on it by the political leadership.

Asserting that the primacy of the air power was on display during the May7-10 conflict with Pakistan, he said the S-400 missile system has turned out to be a game-changer as the enemy was in disarray in view of the range and power of the weapon. Air Chief Marshal Singh said many of Pakistan's military bases were damaged.

"A lot of their infrastructure, radars, control and coordination centres, their hangars, aircraft, suffered a lot of damages," he said

The Indian Air Force Chief also took a pot-shot at those who sought proof of the efficacy of the 2019 Balakot air strikes as he showed some graphic details of damages suffered by Pakistan during Operation Sindoor.

Air Chief Marshal Singh said conflict termination was an important aspect of the operation against the backdrop of many wars across the globe continu-

Before the incident, Nizamuddin wrote on social media that he was a "victim of racial hatred, racial discrimination, racial harassment, torture, wage fraud, wrongful termination and obstruction of Justice". "Today I decided to raise my voice against all odds... Oppression of corporate tyrants must end, and evervone involved in it must be punished severely," he wrote.

Nizamuddin also posted in the message that he faced a lot of hostility, an unacceptable environment, racial discrimination, racial harassment and salary fraud where he worked.

They altogether wrongfully terminated my employment. It did not end there. They continued their harassment, discrimination and intimidating behaviour by the help of a racist detective and team," he had alleged. Lately, the situation deteriorated. He claimed that his food was poisoned, and he was being evicted from his residence for fighting against

Goyal likely to visit Washington soon for trade talks

New Delhi, Sept 19: With the India-US trade talks moving in the right direction, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal is expected to visit Washington soon, sources said.

The visit comes in the backdrop of recently concluded daylong discussions here between US Chief Negotiator Brendan Lynch and his Indian counterpart Rajesh Agrawal on the proposed bilateral trade agreement.

On September 16, the commerce ministry stated that daylong discussions with the visiting US team on a bilateral trade deal were positive, and both sides agreed to push for an early and mutually beneficial conclusion of the agreement.

"It was decided to intensify efforts to achieve early conclusion of a mutually beneficial trade agreement," the ministry said in a statement after a seven-hour meeting with US officials.

The talks were important as the US has imposed a steep 50 per cent tariff on Indian goods

The visit of the high-ranking US trade officials was first after the imposition of a 25 per cent tariff and an additional 25 per cent penalty on Indian goods entering the American market for buying Russian crude oil. In February, leaders of the

two countries directed officials to negotiate a proposed Bilater al Trade Agreement (BTA).

Oli denies giving any shooting orders

Kathmandu: Nepal's deposed prime minister KP Sharma Oli Friday denied that he had given any shooting orders during the 'Gen Z' demonstrations. saving bullets were fired at protesters from automatic guns that the police did not possess and called for a probe into the matter. In his first public statement since his ouster September 9, the Communist Party of Nepal (Unified Marxist-Leninist) chairman blamed the infiltrators for the violence during the "peaceful protest" by Gen-Z. "The government didn't order to shoot at the demonstrators," 73-yearold Oli said in a message issued on the occasion of Constitution Day. "The bullets were fired at the protesters from automatic guns, which were not possessed by the police personnel, and this must be investigated," Oli said.

Paramilitary drone attack kills 70

Cairo: A drone attack blamed on Sudan's paramilitary group Rapid Support Forces struck a mosque during prayers Friday, killing at least 70 worshippers in the North Darfur region, aid workers and the Sudanese army said. The strike in the besieged city of El Fasher completely destroyed the mosque, and the death toll would likely go higher because bodies still were buried in the rubble, said a worker with the local aid group Emergency Response Rooms. The worker spoke on condition of anonymity for fear of retaliation by the Rapid Support Forces, or RSF. Sudan's army, which has been fighting against the RSF in escalating violence since April 2023, said in a statement that it was mourning the deaths of at

Kyiv: Ukraine is making progress in intensive talks to formalise legally binding security guarantees with the United States and European allies, a key part of its bid to end the war with Russia, First Deputy Foreign Minister Sergiy Kyslytsya said. A bilateral agreement with the United States remains vital, and US President Donald Trump's recent commitment to participate in Ukraine's defence was a "breakthrough moment", Kyslytsya told Reuters in an interview.

"We must accept the fact that the protests took place because of the failure to fulfil the spirit and objectives of providing good governance and prosperity enshrined in the constitution," Karki said.

She spoke on Nepal's national day, marking the 10th anniversary of the proclamation of the constitution. The former Supreme Court chief justice was appointed to the post last week following talks between representatives of the protesters, the president and the army chief.

Islamabad/Dubai, Sept 19: With many Arab nations feeling a rising threat from Israel, the Saudi-Pakistan defense pact announced this week brings Pakistan - and its nuclear umbrella - into the region's security equation.

The "Strategic Mutual De-Agreement" signed fense between Pakistan and Saudi Arabia Wednesday effectively marries Riyadh's money with Pakistan's giant nuclear-armed military, analysts said.

Few details of the pact have been disclosed, and Pakistan's stated nuclear doctrine says that its weapons are solely aimed against long-term adversary India.

But Riyadh is hinting that it will have a de facto nuclear shield under the agreement, while analysts say that Israel,

ly nuclear state in the Middle East, will be watching closely.

Pakistani Defense Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif told Reuters that nuclear weapons were "not on the radar" of the pact. He said the agreement could be extended to cover other Gulf nations.

"We have no intention of using this pact for any aggression," said Asif. "But if the parties are threatened, then obviously this arrangement will become operative.

Riyadh may see the nuclear issue differently.

Gulf Arab states said Israel, which has never confirmed or denied possessing nuclear weapons, had shown itself to be a direct threat following its unprecedented strikes on Qatar last week. Saudi Arabia has also said that if rival Iran acquired nuclear weapons, it would follow

Asked whether Pakistan

vide Saudi Arabia with a nuclear umbrella, a senior Saudi official told Reuters, "This is comprehensive defensive agreement that encompasses all military means.

Analysts said that the agreement also reflects shrinking confidence in the security provided by the United States to the region.

"From the Saudi perspec tive, it is intended to plug the strategic and conventional deterrence deficit vis-a-vis nuclear-armed Israel," said Hasan Alhasan, senior fellow for Middle East Policy at London's International Institute for Strategic Studies

A statement from Saudi Arabia said the pact "aims to develop aspects of defense cooperation between the two countries and strengthen joint deterrence". The Saudi government media office did not immediately respond to a request for comment on whether Pakistan's nuclear weapons were included in the agreement.

PAKISTAN'S NUCLEAR WEAPONS

Pakistan, the only nuclear-armed Muslim nation, is one of the poorer countries in Asia, but it has an army of more than 600,000 soldiers to defend against its much larger adversary, India, with which it has fought three major wars, along with numerous clashes, including a four-day conflict in May that was their heaviest fighting in decades.

Wednesday's announcement made no mention of nuclear weapons or any payment to Pakistan. "The agreement states that any aggression against either country shall be considered an aggression against both," Pakistan said.

Nato intercepts Russian warplanes violating Estonian airspace



Vilnius/Washington, Sept 19: Three Russian warplanes that violated Estonian airspace have been intercepted by Nato, the military alliance has said.

Estonia's foreign ministry condemned the incursion as "brazen". It said three Russian MiG-31 fighter jets entered the airspace of a Nato member "without permission and remained there for a total of 12 minutes" Friday over the Gulf of Finland.

Nato spokesperson Allison Hart said the military alliance "responded immediately and intercepted the Russian aircraft", calling it "yet another example of reckless Russian behaviour and Nato's ability to respond"

Estonian Prime Minister Kristen Michal later said his government had "decided to request Nato Article 4 consultations".

Article 4 of the Nato treaty formally starts urgent consultations within the 32-member alliance, which ties the US and many European nations together on collective defence. The Russian military has not

publicly commented on the issue. Tensions have escalated between the Nato military alliance and Russia since Moscow launched a full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022.

They have risen in the last

week, after Poland and Romania - both Nato members - said Russian drones breached their airspace.

Estonia's foreign ministry said it summoned the Russian chargé d'affaires "to lodge a protest" over Friday's incur sion, while top EU diplomat Kaja Kallas described the incident as "an extremely dangerous provocation"

In a statement, Estonian Foreign Minister Margus Tsahkna said Friday's incursion was 'unprecedentedly brazen".

He continued, "Russia's increasingly extensive testing of boundaries and growing aggressiveness must be met with a swift increase in political and economic pressure. The minister added Russia

British couple freed by Taliban arrives in Qatar

Doha, Sept 19: Barbie Reynolds, rived in Qatar from Afghanistan into the arms of their daughter Friday, after the British couple were freed from eight months in Taliban captivity.

Family members said they had been concerned for the health of the couple, who ran a charity in Afghanistan where they had lived for 18 years, staying on after the Taliban returned to power in 2021.

They were detained in February and freed after what an official with knowledge of the matter described as months of negotiations with the Taliban by Qatar in coordination with Britain.

As they stepped off the plane in Doha, the couple waved to waiting relatives. Their



daughter, Sarah Entwistle, ran toward her mother in tears, embracing her tightly.

Before boarding the plane at Kabul airport, Barbie Reynolds said she and her husband would return "if we can", adding that they were Afghan citizens.

Speaking to reporters before being reunited with her parents, Entwistle said the family was "forever grateful to the Qatari and British governments for standing with us during this difficult time"

Moscow, Sept 19: Banished from Eurovision, Russia will launch the final of its own international song contest at President Vladimir Putin's behest Saturday, with a Soviet-era name and acts intended to promote "traditional family

Singers at "Intervision" will hail from 23 countries accounting for more than half the world's population, including China, India and Brazil, and compete for a cash prize of 30 million roubles (\$360,000).

Russia has been excluded from the Eurovision song contest since Putin ordered tens of thousands of troops into Ukraine in 2022. This year, Putin announced his rival contest, with a top Kremlin aide named to head the supervisory board. Kviv has called the event "an instrument of hostile propaganda"

It also noted that India's external stability has improved, with the current account deficit below 1% of GDP in FY2024, supported by surpluses in services and remittances. Adequate forex reserves and a low external debt ratio also reduced external risks.

Abu Dhabi, Sept 19: Skipper Suryakumar Yadav made optimal use of available resources in both departments as India did enough to beat a spirited Oman by 21 runs to end their league stage commitments in Asia Cup with a hat-trick of victories.

In less than 48 hours, India will once again lock horns with Pakistan in the Super 4s in Dubai and before that Indian skipper rightly decided to give his other 10 colleagues a hit in the middle while pushing himself down to number 11.

India set a stiff target of 189 for Oman, who were playing T20 World Champions for the first time. The Indian bowling attack without Jasprit Bumrah and Varun Chakravarthy didn't look exceptional but just about kept Oman at bay during the final overs, restricting them to 167 for 4 in 20 overs.

In the batting department, Sanju Samson (56) helped himself to a half-century while Axar Patel (26 off 13 balls) and

opener Abhishek Sharma (38 off 15 balls) followed the team template to the 'T' by scoring at a 200 plus strike-rate. Tilak Varma (29 off 18 balls) also did his cause no harm batting at an unfamiliar No.7 position.

However, Hardik Pandya (1), who needed some batting time, was unfortunately run-out by his one-time Baroda club-cricket colleague Jiten Ramanandi and vice-captain Shubman Gill (5 off 8 balls) was slightly scratchy in his brief stay.

With vice-captain Gill getting out cheaply, the one drop slot warranted a right hander and accordingly Samson got a chance to bat in the top 3.

It wasn't the smoothest of his innings on a slightly slowish track but three fours and three sixes off 45 balls would certainly give him confidence ahead of the business week.

Of all his big hits, the first maximum off left-arm seamer Shah Faisal, a pick-up shot over widish long-on stood out but lack of match time showed as he did struggle to get going.

It was pretty obvious that India would like to bat first and make full use of the 20 overs before the start of the Super 4s giving sufficient time to their under-utilized middle-order ahead of Pakistan game Sunday.

Himanshi Tokas becomes first Indian judoka to grab top spot in world junior rankings

Mumbai, Sept 19: Himanshi Tokas made history in judo as she rose to the World No 1 ranking in the women's 63 kg weight category in the junior world rankings, becoming the first Indian judoka to hold the exalted position in the history of the sport.

In the women's 57 kg, India's Shahin Rajakbhai Darjada is ranked fourth, making it the first time that two Indian athletes are placed in the top five of their respective weight categories.

Himanshi, who gained three places in the list, is perched at the top of the rankings with 610 points as Indian judokas made handsome gains in the latest offering of the World Ranking List issued by the International Judo Federation (IJF).

The 20-year-old Himanshi, who is supported by the Reliance Foundation, surged to the top of the rankings following her triumph in the Asian Junior Championships 2025 last week (September 13). This was her third title this year.

Before this, she had finished first in her weight class in the Taiepi Junior Asian Cup 2025 in July and had won the Casablanca African Open 2025 in January In all, Himanshi has so far won gold medals in five competitions one Continental Championship, three Continental Cup competitions, and one Continental Open Championship.

In the seniors category, Hi manshi is ranked 61st in the women's 63kg category of the World Rankings with 611 points.

In the women's 57kg category, India's Shahin Rajakbhai Darja da is ranked fourth behind Riko Honda of Japan, Michela Ter ranova of Italy, and Bianca Reis of Brazil. Shahin has 442 points and has won three gold medals and a bronze so far this season.

Shahin won gold in the Asian Junior Championships 2025, Macau Junior Asian Cup 2025, and Taipei Junior Asian Cup 2025. She was placed third in the Tashkent Junior Asian Cup 2025 in May this year.

In the women's +78kg category, India's Kanwarpreet Kaur is ranked 10th in the world, as is Ishroop Narang in the women's -78kg category. Compatriot Nungshithoi Chanu Leishangthem is ranked 12th in the 52kg class.

'A NEW BEGINNING' FOR INDIAN FOOTBALL

approves new AIFF constitution

New Delhi, Sept 19: The Supreme Court Friday approved the draft Constitution of the All India Football Federation (AIFF) with certain modifications, directing the AIFF administration to adopt it within four weeks.

Describing the move as a turning point in Indian football governance, a Bench of Justices PS Narasimha and Joymalya Bagchi said, "We are of the firm opinion that the Constitution, once adopted in terms of Article 84, will mark a new beginning for Indian football and take the sport to greater heights.

In its detailed judgment, the Justice Narasimha-led Bench upheld the inclusion of 15 eminent players in the AIFF General Body despite opposition from state associations. "We are of the opinion that the freedom of choice to form an association is not in any way compromised by the requirement to incorpo-

rate 15 eminent players...It is not probable but certain that the inclusion of eminent players, coaches, referees, and club representatives in the general body, with only further good governance, heralds transparency and fair play," it observed.

On eligibility for eminent players, the apex court relaxed the criteria to widen the pool. "It will be reasonable to reduce the criteria suggested by Justice LN Rao to 5 matches for men and from 2 matches for women. We hope that such a modification will ensure a wider pool and par-

ticipation by retired players who will prove themselves to be efficient administrators and guiding lights for Indian football." said the Justice Narasimha-led Bench. While approving governance reforms inspired by the BCCI judgments, the Supreme Court rejected arguments that football's context was different.

"This present exercise is primarily about football, but on a broader level, is also an exercise to instil professionalism, efficiency, and fairness in sports administration, which shall take Indian football to greater heights.

Directing the AIFF to convene a Special General Body meeting within four weeks to adopt the draft Constitution with the modifications specified in its latest

judgment said.

judgment, the Supreme Court observed, "Our country is brimming with promising sporting talent which seeks suitable avenues and organisational support. We believe that the Constitution of AIFF is an important structural foundation in this regard, and the stakeholders of Indian sports will have an important role in ensuring that Indian football remains thrilling, competitive and value-oriented and continue to make its mark in the national

and international landscape.
