

### Assembly washout amid Opposition stir

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: The Odisha Assembly proceedings were washed out Saturday, the third day of the monsoon session, amid Opposition BJD's protest over the fertiliser crisis during the ongoing kharif season in the state. BJD MLAs created ruckus in the Assembly over alleged fertiliser scarcity across the state, prompting the Speaker to adjourn the proceedings till Monday morning.

The party MLAs, holding placards and banners highlighting the fertiliser crisis and farmers' distress in the state, trooped into the well of the House and demanded a fullfledged discussion on the issue.

Earlier, the House made an obituary reference to former MLA George Tirkey, who died Friday night. The Opposition members continued to raise their voices against the BJP government in the state and blamed it for the farmers' distress. Unable to run the House, Speaker Surama Padhy adjourned the proceedings till 4 pm.

at 4 pm, the BJD members started demanding a detailed discussion on the fertiliser crisis in the state. Proceedings lasted for about four minutes in the post-lunch session before the Speaker adjourned the House till 10.30 am Monday. The BJD members demanded

that the Speaker cancel all the business of the House, including Question Hour, and hold a de tailed discussion on the alleged fertiliser scarcity in the state. They claimed that the alleged fertiliser scarcity was due to black marketing and hoarding.

Outside the House, BJP MLA Irasish Acharya blamed the Opposition BJD and the Congress for the disruption in the proceedings

"When BJD MLAs were staging a protest in the well of the House, the Congress members were standing on their seats. The opposition parties do not want a discussion on important issues in the House. The Speaker has already accepted a notice of the Congress for a discussion on the fertiliser issue, but the BJD has rejected it," the BJP MLA claimed

# Trump's H1B shocker for Indians

cision to hike the fee for H1B visas, currently ranging from \$2000 to \$5000, to a whopping \$1,00,000 annually is going to significantly impact Indians, especially technology workers, who are hired by tech companies and others on these visas. Indians form the majority of H1B visa holders: about 70-71 per cent. Over the last five years (FY20-24), about 2.1 million H1B visas were approved. Of those, about 1.48 million were issued for Indians. Many Indians use the H1B pathway not just for working but as a stepping stone for longer-term stays, availing green cards and even citizenship

New York/Washington, Sept 20: In a development that could adversely affect Indian professionals in the US, President Donald Trump has signed a proclamation to raise the fee for H-1B visas to a staggering \$100,000 annually, a move described by American lawmakers and community leaders as

'reckless' and 'unfortunate.'

Trump signed the proclamation 'Restriction on entry of certain nonimmigrant workers', saving the abuse of the H-1B visa programme is a 'national security threat.'

Congressman Raja Krishnamoorthi described the decision to hike the H-1B visa fee as a reckless attempt to cut Amer ica off from high-skilled workers who have long strengthened our workforce, fuelled innovation, and helped build industries that employ millions of Americans.'

Ajay Bhutoria, a former advisor to President Joe Biden and Asian-American community leader on immigration policy, warned of a potential crisis for the US technology sector's competitive edge with Trump's decision on the H-1B visa fee.

"The H-1B programme, a lifeline for innovation that has attracted top talent from around the world, faces unprecedented barriers with this massive jump from the current \$2000-\$5000 total fee, which will crush small



businesses and startups reliant on diverse talent," he said.

Currently, the H-1B visa fee ranges from about \$2000 to \$5000, depending on employer size and other costs. The visas are valid for three years and can be renewed for another three years. The move is going to significantly impact Indian technology workers who are hired by tech companies and others on H-1B visas.

Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) is the second-highest beneficiary with 5,505 approved H-1B visas in 2025, after Ama-

visas), according to the US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS). Other top beneficiaries include Micro soft (5,189), Meta (5,123), Apple (4.202), Google (4.181), Deloitte (2,353), Infosys (2,004), Wipro (1,523) and Tech Mahindra Americas (951). In his proclamation, Trump said

the H-1B visa programme was created to bring temporary workers into the US to perform additive, high-skilled functions, but it has been deliberately exploited to replace, rather than supplement,

#### **\$100,000** FEE ONLY **FOR NEW APPLICANTS**

Washington: The H1B visa fee of \$100,000 would be applicable only to new applicants, a White House official clarified Saturday, a day after President Donald Trump signed a proclamation raising the fee on likely to face legal challenges, But if it survives, companies that hire skilled international workers would have to pay \$100,000 each year for any employee working on the visa. only to new applicants," a White report in the New York Times.

### Odisha to get new Luxury brands' big challenge: Figuring out Gen Z secretariat building

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: The state government has initiated steps for the construction of a new secretariat building in Bhubaneswar, Works Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan told the Assembly, Saturday.

He said the Odisha Bridge and Construction Corporation (OBCC) has been directed to prepare the master plan for the new building.

'Once the plan is approved, the budgetary requirement will be estimated and will be sent to the government for approval," he said, replying to a query from BJD MLA Subasini Jena.

The current Lok Seva Bhavan is 68 years old, and has inadequate parking provisions, he said. The existing state secretariat building was inaugurated by then Union Home Minister Govind Ballav Pant November 12, 1959, in the presence of then CM Harekrushna Mahatab.

It was renamed the Lok Seva Bhavan in 2019 by the previous Naveen Patnaik government.

The three-storey building houses the offices of the chief minister, deputy CMs, ministers and the chief secretary. Over 30 departments are also

functioning from there. Harichandan also said a second bridge will be constructed at Trisulia, connecting Bhu-

baneswar and Cuttack. "The project is in the tendering phase by OBCC. The Detailed Project Report (DPR) had already been furnished. and administrative approval had been accorded," he said.

### EXECUTIVES, CONSULTANTS, AND ANALYSTS SAY THIS GENERATION IS HARDER TO PIN DOWN THAN THEIR PREDECESSORS

New York, Sept 20: Fleur Arbel and Christophe Kairouz, both from France, were lured into Louis Vuitton's New York flagship recently by a colourful sculpture of a monogrammed giraffe and ostrich above the

store's entrance. But the two 24-year-olds are more likely to spend their shopping dollars elsewhere, as Louis Vuitton's heavy logos and styles strike them as passé.


"I think they failed to keep the luxury image in a way," said Kairouz. "I think they need to create something new, original."

Arbel and Kairouz are a tiny fraction of the Gen Z cohort born between 1998 and 2012: the luxury industry's new frontier. The group made up 4% of global luxury spending before the pandemic; by 2030, they will account for 25%, according to

Boston Consulting Group. Executives, consultants, and analysts say this generation is harder to pin down than their predecessors. They are influenced by a global social media landscape and tend to mix-andmatch goods from established names with trendier labels, shopping everywhere from TikTok to thrift stores. Legacy brands trying to attract Gen Z consumers have used influencers, pop-up shops, and affordable items like bag charms.

"There's a lot of similarity between Gen Z in Shanghai and Los Angeles and London," said Scott Roe, chief financial officer and chief operating officer of Coach-parent Tapestry.

More affordable luxury companies like Coach and Ralph Lauren - whose revenue rose



6.8% in the 12-month period ended in March - are capitalising on the generational shift. Coach has gained cache with Gen Z due to using influencers, personalisation services. and focusing on sustainability, experts said. Coach's total

revenue rose 9.9% to about \$5.6 billion for the 12-month period ended in June.

Tapestry's Roe said Gen Z is not less brand-loyal than other generations, but it is harder for brands to reach these consumers because shoppers have more choices. "To break through, you need to have a strong share of voice.3

That voice is pricey: Tapestry increased its marketing spend from 3% of sales pre-pandemic to 10% this year, according to its May earnings call, but did not disclose how much it target ed Gen Z specifically.

Not all fashion powerhouses are being left on the shelf. Lux ury labels from Kering-owned Bottega Veneta, Prada Group's Miu Miu, and LVMH-owned Loewe continue to do well with Gen Z, as Miu Miu currently ranks first on the Lyst Index followed by Loewe.

Miu Miu sales rose 49% in the first half of 2025 compared to the same period in 2024, capturing first-time luxury buyers with leather bag charms, which retail in the range of \$240 to \$1,250.







#### STATE UNVEILS 15 NEW CROP **VARIETIES**

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: Odisha has unveiled 15 new horticulture crop varieties based on the recommendation of the State Seed Sub-Committee, chaired by Agriculture and Farmers' Empowerment department Principal Secretary Arabinda Kumar Padhee, official sources said Saturday.

The screening committee recommended varieties from multiple institutions.

Eight (Chilli, brinjal, amaranthus, tomato, cashew, mango ginger, black turmeric, and potato) were from OUAT, two (sweet potato and yam bean) were from CTCRI, and five (rose apple, three types of amaranthus, and brinjal) were from CHES.

All these varieties were officially released Saturday.

Notably, the rose apple variety developed by the Central Horticultural Experiment Station (CHES) is being released for the first time in India.

Similarly, the black turmeric, also called OUAT Kalinga Black Turmeric-1, is valued for its medicinal properties.

The potato variety developed by OUAT, known as Kalinga Baby Potato (Phulbani Aloo), is celebrated for its unique taste.

#### STF arrests drug peddler with 121 gram brown sugar

# EOW nabs BJD leader for ₹12.42cr fraud

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of Odisha Police Saturday arrested a Biju Janata Dal (BJD) leader on charges of duping a person of ₹12.42 crore on the pretext of investing in the real estate business and purchasing land in Bhubaneswar and Cuttack.

The accused – Dillip Kumar Nayak of Jhanjiri Mangala under Badambadi police limits in Cuttack – had contested the 2024 Assembly elections from Nimapara constituency as a BJD candidate.

The incident came to the fore after

Bijay Kumar Rout of Ranihat Malisahi area in the Silver City approached the Badambadi police alleging that Dillip had cheated him to a tune of ₹12.42 crore on the pretext of investing in the real estate business. The case was later taken over by the EOW, which registered a formal case in this regard September 19.

During investigation, the EOW found that the accused had taken ₹3 crore from Bijay on multiple occasions between 2015 and 2017 to invest in real estate business.

"This apart, the accused took ₹4 crore from Bijay to provide a landed plot at Bajrakabati in Cuttack city in

2018. However, Dillip failed to give the complainant the plot. Promising Bijay a better land at Patia, Dillip again took ₹3.42 crore from him as the additional cost of the land," the investigating agency said, adding that the accused took ₹3 crore from Bijay, including ₹1 crore from his wife, to form a company

"Of the ₹13.42 crore, the accused has so far returned only ₹1 crore to the complainant," the EOW said.

The accused has been taken into custody. Documents like sale deeds, power of attorney and bank account details were recovered from his house," said the agency.

# Row over 'Gita in schools'

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: After the School and Mass Education Minister Nityananda Gond informed the ongoing Monsoon session that the government is considering a proposal to introduce Bhagavad Gita sessions in schools to strengthen and promote students' intellectual development, the opposition parties strongly objected to the idea, arguing that such a move could undermine democratic principles

principles. State Congress spokesperson Prashant Satpathy criticised the move, saying, "The BJP is using religion for political gain. Simply reading the Bhagavad Gita in schools will not enhance students' intellect; proper guidance through their regular syllabus will. Schools have students from diverse religious backgrounds—if this proposal is approved, will the government also allow sessions on the Quran, Bible, and other religious texts? School is not a place to play the religion card, and the ruling party must understand this.

Similarly, CPI(M) state secretary Suresh Chandra Panigrahy alleged, "The state government appears to be pushing for saffronisation of the education

system, replacing history with mythology. At a time when our students need exposure to AI and advanced education to compete globally, the government is steering the system back to a medieval mindset. This must stop, and if implemented, we will vehemently oppose it.

The All India Students' Federation (AISF) state unit has strongly opposed the proposal, calling it highly objectionable and unacceptable. AISF state president Sanghamitra Jena

try, and government schools serve children from diverse communities. Our education system must remain universal, secular, scientific, and democratic. Promoting any particular religion or ideology through schools goes against the spirit of the Constitution. Scriptures like the Gita, Quran, or Bible belong to religious institutions not state-run schools. Turning schools into religious laboratories will endanger both democracy and social justice,' she warned.

However, the BJD backed the proposal while emphasising that similar provision should be made for other religions. Party spokesperson Lenin Mohanty said, "Making children read and listen to the Bhagavad Gita can be enriching, teaching important life lessons. At the same time, students should also have the opportunity to learn from the sacred scriptures of Sikh, Christian, and Muslim communities, as we live in a multi-religious country with a secular outlook. The state government should also consider making moral science classes compulsory." When approached for comment on the matter, the BJP did not re-

### HSHPETA members stage protest in City

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: Members of the High School Health & Physical Education Teachers' Association (HSHPETA) of Odisha staged a protest at Lower PMG Saturday, pressing the state government to fulfill their four-point charter of demands.

Their key demands include upgrading the minimum qualification for Physical Education Teachers (PETs) from +2 to Graduation (+3), introducing Health and Physical Education as a 100-mark subject (theory and practical) in the high school syllabus, granting PETs the Trained Graduate Teacher (TGT) pay scale, and ensuring their inclusion in the state cadre file.

HSHPETA leaders stressed that physical education is essential for holistic student development, promoting health, discipline, and a foundation for sports excellence at the grassroots level. They lamented that

PETs are often asked to teach subjects like English and Mathematics while being denied the chance to teach their own discipline. Citing the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and practices in other states, the association demanded the immediate introduction of physical education as a full-fledged 100-mark subject in Odisha's high schools

Protesters also highlighted disparities in qualifications and pay. While teachers of other subjects must hold a graduation degree, the minimum qualification for PETs remains +2, creating inequality despite PETs clearing OSSTET, completing professional training, and qualifying in Regular High School Teacher (RHT) recruitment exams. HSHPETA called on the government to address these long-pending issues to ensure fair recognition, pay parity, and the promotion of physical education in the state's education system.

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: With Durga Puja slated from September 28 to October 2, the City is gearing up for grand celebrations. Artisans are busy constructing elaborate pandals, installing idols, and setting up cultural stages. The ten-day festival, honouring the goddess as a symbol of femininity and power, remains a major socio-cultural event, showcasing art, music, dance, food, and traditional rituals such as Sindoor Khela and Dhunuchi Naach.

In recent years, one celebration has expanded beyond its traditional roots—Dandiya Nights. Originally a hallmark of Gujarat's Navratri, the vibrant dance festival has evolved into a cultural bridge, attracting participants from diverse communities across Bhubaneswar.

"Many think Navratri in Gujarat is just about wearing ghagra choli and dancing, but it's much more," says Arpita Rathod, Project Staff at Ravenshaw University and a Gujarati herself. "Traditionally, Garba features a decorated clay pot lit with a diya, symbolising devotion, around which people dance while singing folk songs. Dandiya with sticks became part of the celebration over time. Today, even outside Gu-



jarat, it is celebrated on a grand scale. In big cities, celebrities perform, passes can be expensive, and some folk elements get lost—but it still brings people

together in joy."

The festival's inclusivity adds to its charm. Simpu Agrawal Sahoo, a Marwari entrepreneur, notes, "Dandiya isn't originally part of our culture. In Marwari households.

we observe Kanya Bhojan on the 8th or 9th day of Navratri, worshipping nine girls as forms of Durga. Yet, I've been playing Dandiya since I was 12 because it celebrates womanhood and togetherness. Every year, my group participates at Pardarshini Padia, making it a cherished

For many Gujaratis living away from their home state, the

Dandiya Nights in Bhubaneswar sees growing popularity, with daily attendance rising from 2,000 to around 6,000

festival evokes nostalgia. Renuka Joshi, who works from home in Bhubaneswar, describes it as "the most magical time of the year." She adds, "In Gujarat, grounds are booked months in advance, and the celebrations are massive. Now, in Odisha too, it has gained widespread acceptance. From restaurants adjusting menus to shops thriving with festive sales, the entire city feels transformed."

Organisers confirm its growing popularity. Umakanta Tandi, Media In-charge of Prayas, which has hosted Dandiya Nights in Bhubaneswar for 12 vears, says, "Earlier, we had around 2,000 attendees; now we see 5,000-6,000 daily. This year, our event at Pardarshini Padia runs from September 26 to October 2, with tickets priced at ₹200. We prioritise safety, with women-led security, vegetarian stalls, and participant facilities. The event is no longer limited to Gujaratis—people from all communities join in.'

#### BJD to gherao Assembly Sept 23



# Bargarh cancer hospital lies 4-time MLA George defunct; CM assures remedy

Bargarh, Sept 20: With the Bargarh Cancer Hospital remaining non-functional for over a week amid absence of doctors. resentment has grown among the residents of the western Odisha town. The issue has drawn greater attention as State Health and Family Welfare Minister Dr Mukesh Mahaling also holds charge of the district.

A delegation from the United Forum for Cancer Hospital at Bargarh met Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Friday and urged immediate steps to make the hospital fully operational. After receiving their memorandum and holding discussions, the Chief Minister assured that the facility would start functioning soon.

Former Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik had approved the hospital following demands from the Fighters Group of Bargarh, various organisations, and the United Forum. By January 2024, the hospital was inaugurated with equipment installed and three doctors and paramedical staff appointed. The hospital. however, has remained idle for over a week after the appointed doctors left to pursue higher studies. fuelling public discontent.

During Friday's meeting, forum members pointed out that chemo-



services been completely halted. They said hematinic tablets used alongside chemotherapy were being supplied to Bargarh through the Acharya Harihar Regional Cancer Centre in Cuttack by the Odisha State Medical Corporation Ltd. (OSM-CL), but the quantity was inadequate. The forum demanded that OSMCL supply the medicines di-

rectly to Bargarh. Majhi instructed the health minister to take steps to address the issue. The government, he said, had already reviewed options for hospital management and would act swiftly to make the facility fully operational.

The meeting was attended by Health and Family Welfare Minister Dr Mukesh Mahaling, Revenue and Disaster Management Minister

Suresh Pujari, Chief Whip and Boudh MLA Saroj Kumar Pradhan, Sambalpur MLA Javanarayan Mishra, Bargarh MLA Ashwini Kumar Sarangi, Attabira MLA Nihar Ranjan Mahanand, Bijepur MLA Sanat Kumar Gartia, and Bhatli MLA Irasis Acharya, among

Later, the delegation met Mahaling separately, pressing him to expedite the hospital's activation and ensure direct supply of hematinic tablets in adequate quantities. Mahaling assured that immediate instructions would be issued.

The delegation included forum convener Pradeep Debata, chief coordinator Krushnachandra Panda, coordinators Rabi Panda, Pratap Nayak, Deepak Rath, Bharat Sahu, Gopal Sharma, and Dipesh Joshi.

His son Rohit Joseph Tirkey was elected to Biramitrapur Assembly segment in 2024 on a BJD ticket.

Condoling his death, Deputy Chief Minister KV Singh Deo said, "Deeply saddened by the passing of George Tirkey ji, former MLA from Biramitrapur and a respected voice from



Sundargarh. His decades of public service -- across four terms in the Odisha Assembly -- reflected a deep commitment to tribal rights, grassroots leadership, and principled politics. Odisha has lost a dedicated son of the soil. May Mahaprabhu Shri Jagannath bless his soul and give strength to his family and admirers in this hour of grief."

### Minor rape victim consumes poison; accused arrested

Kendrapara, Sept 20: A 17-year-old college girl consumed poisonous substance after she was allegedly raped by a youth in Kendrapara district, police said Saturday, adding that they arrested a 21-year-old youth for his alleged in-

volvement in the crime.

The crime was committed September 10. However, it came to light after the traumatised victim, who had allegedly attempted to commit suicide, mustered the courage to lodge a complaint against the accused Friday, the police said.

After consuming toxic substances to end her life September 10, the victim was hospitalised. She was discharged Friday. Acting on the complaint of the victim,

police arrested the accused Saturday.

The survivor had named Chintu Jena of Damodarpur village as the perpetrator of the crime and alleged that the accused befriended her on a social media platform recently and invited her to his house September 10, a police officer said.

However, the mother of the accused told him to drop her off at her house immediately, as she had come alone to their house in the evening. But on the way, the accused forcefully took her to a deserted cashew field and allegedly raped her, the officer said.

further said that the accused also assaulted the girl when she unsuccessfully tried to resist his heinous crime. The accused also threatened to kill her if she told anyone about the incident.





### **Bunch of Thoughts**

he Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh is celebrating its centenary and its epic successes in the cultural, and, especially, political field. Readers who are familiar with the organisation, the font of Hindutva ideology, but unclear about what it specifically stands for might benefit from this column. The RSS's longest-serving (33 years from 1940 to 1973) chief was MS Golwalkar. Two books are attributed to him, of which one is disowned. The other one, Bunch of Thoughts, is the subject here and we will look at what it says. It must be noted that it is not a book in the sense that it is a written work, but a compilation of Golwalkar's speeches and interviews and excerpts thereof. This gives it a jumpy and sporadic feel, but it is worth going through nonetheless. What follows is your columnist's representation of Golwalkar's views, in as unbiased a fashion as is possible.

Golwalkar says the RSS called itself the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh and not the Hindu Swayamsevak Sangh. This was because 'Rashtriya' naturally means Hindu and therefore the word 'Hindu' need not be used. The first RSS head Keshav Hedgewar had said: 'If we use the word Hindu it will only mean that we consider ourselves only as one of the innumerable communities in this land and that we do not realise our natural status as the

nationals of this country. Savarkar's Hindu Mahasabha was wrong in once having passed a resolution that the Congress should not give up its nationalist position by holding talks with the Muslim League but instead asking the Hindu Mahasabha to do so. This ceded equal position to the Muslims and was a perversion of the

reality that India was wholly and only a Hindu Rashtra.

Federalism was a problem and the only way out was to be courageous enough to declare a unitary type of government by amending the Constitution. The country was one, the people were one, and therefore India ought to have only a single government and a single legislature. Executive authority could be distributed, but legislative authority should be one and not devolved to the states. One central legislature for the whole of the country should satisfy the demands of democracy

India was special in the world because it offered something nobody else could and that was Hindu thought. The excellence of Hindu thought was that it alone knew something about the nature of the soul. This could be proved because it was only in India that from ancient times individuals rose to unravel the mystery of human nature, the 'science of spirit'. Golwalkar says Jesus saw Satan and the prophet met Gabriel. It was only in India that sages actually saw god. Westerners, no matter how much they understood the science of matter, would remain ignorant of the science of spirit. This unique offering was under threat because Hindus were abandoning their ancient wisdoms and it was the RSS which must revive them within India and organise Hindu society. It would do this

by reversing the things that were damaging Hindus. Progressive societies were permissive. This lead to licentious behaviour with respect to sex, food, drinks, family life and free social intercourse. These things did not produce real happiness. The individual must subsume himself into the larger nation, else the social fabric would be destroyed. This was what Hindu philosophy promoted and that was what would make Hindus happy.

All Hindus did not have this special Hindu knowledge; only some did. The common mass of people needed to be properly educated and enlightened. Making them merely literate would not serve the purpose because this special knowledge would still be absent. People were unequal in other ways also. Democracy was flawed because it excluded experts and preferred politicians. Panchavats functioned best when run along caste lines, to represent the interests of society as a whole. Elections should not be competitive but unanimous. (Again, if this sounds disjointed and rambling, it is because that is how Bunch of Thoughts is put together).

India was the nation from the oceans to the Himalayas. Not just the edge of the mountains but beyond them, which is why the ancients had places of pilgrimage (Kailash Mansarovar) on the northern side. making these regions 'our live boundary'. Tibet was the abode of the gods and the Hindu epics also give Hindus possession of Afghanistan, Burma, Iran and Lanka. Bharat Mata, for thousands of years, had dipped her arms in the two seas, from Iran to Singapore, with Sri Lanka as a lotus petal offered at her sacred feet. Bhoomi poojan was done because the entire earth was sacred, but Bharat Mata was the most sacred. She needed total devotion, and not engagement through the intellect.

Partition was unacceptable because it was not a division of property between brothers: one does not cut up one's mother as settlement. The concept of Hindu Rashtra was not a mere bundle of political and economic rights. It was essentially cultural and not political or legal. It revealed itself through the urge for realisation of God: a 'living' god and not an idol or immaterial form. 'Our People Are Our God' is what the ancients had said. But they had not meant all our people. Ramakrishna Paramhans and Vivekanand said, 'Serve man.' But man in the sense of humanity was too wide and cannot be grasped. It should be an Almighty with certain limitations. Man here meant only the Hindu people. The ancients did not use the word 'Hindu' but they did say in the Rig Veda that the sun and moon are his eyes, the stars and skies created from his navel and that Brahmin is the head, King the hands, Vaishya the thighs and Shudra the feet. The people who had this fourfold arrangement were the God. Service to and worship of this caste-defined society was then service to God. There is more, and we will take it up another day.

# **DEREGULATED INNOVATION**

as radical- or as misleadingly packaged - as "freedom cities." Championed by Silicon Valley's techno-libertarian elite and recently embraced by right-wing politicians like Donald Trump, the idea is to create digitally powered, master-planned enclaves of deregulated innovation.

It sounds promising. Freedom-city advocates want to cut through bureaucratic red tape, revive innovation, and solve America's housing crisis. In practice, however, such projects risk becoming redoubts for the wealthy - managerial fiefdoms where inequality is built into the foundations. While promoters speak the language of liberty, their model outsources governance to corporate boards

rather than the ballot box. Still, the core idea of using purpose-built settlements as platforms for experimentation should not be dismissed. Throughout history, cities have served as crucibles for political and economic reform. From Periclean Athens to modern-day Barcelona, urban communities have pioneered innovations in governance, planning, and participation. The challenge lies not in building new cities, but in ensuring that they serve democracy, rather than undermine it.

Trump's 2023 proposal to launch ten freedom cities on federal land was not conjured from thin air. The concept has intellectual roots in Nobel laureate economist Paul Romer's "charter city" model, originally designed as a lever for economic renewal in developing countries. Venture capitalists later reinterpreted the idea, envisioning privately managed start-up cities insulated from oversight. Investors like Sam Altman, Marc Andreessen, Brian Armstrong, and Peter Thielpromote such enclaves as testing grounds for AI, biotech, and fintech; think tanks like the American Enterprise Institute have proposed dozens

of new cities on federal land; and a newly created Freedom Cities Coalition is pushing to build "as many as the market can handle.'

Experiments of this kind are already underway. In Honduras, the short-lived "Próspera" project was backed by US investors and briefly operated under its own regulatory regime before succumbing to democratic backlash and litigation. In California, Andreessen and partners have launched "California Forever," a plan for a 400,000-person settlement in Solano County designed to bypass zoning restrictions. Thiel's seasteading movement goes further, envisioning autonomous city-states in international waters. And in 2025, investors unveiled plans for a high-tech enclave in Greenland. Marketed as a hub for AI, advanced energy, and geoengineering, it has been criticized as a form of neo-colonialism that threatens protected ecosystems and Indigenous lands.

At their core, these ventures are less about improving cities than about reimagining sovereignty. Angel investor Balaji Srinivasan envisions "network states" governed through blockchain by online communities that crowdsource land. Far-right blogger Curtis Yarvin promotes "corporate monarchies" run by unelectedCEOs.What unites their visions is nota passion forurbanism, but hostilitytoward democracy. Citizenship becomes a subscription, governance a service, and rights an afterthought.

Hoarycriticism of government inefficiency provides these projects with political cover. Freedom-city advocates rail against zoning rules, permitting delays, and oversight, tapping into widespread frustrations about housing and infrastructure. They see labor rights, environmental protections, and civic participation as inefficiencies to be "optimized away." The result is less Athens than Amazon: efficient, centralized, profit-driven, and lacking any democratic accountability.

History offers warnings. Top-down planned capitals like Brasília and Chandigarh may have offered dazzling architecture, but they have struggled to create resilient. inclusive communities. The company towns of the twentieth century showed how corporate control of housing and services further entrenches inequality and erodes rights. Without safeguards, freedom cities risk repeating these mistakes under a new digital gloss.

But cities have been engines of democratic renewal, and they could be again. Athens institutionalized civic participation through the boule and dikasteria (citizen-run councils and courts, respectively). Though flawed by modern standards, these institutions

were revolutionary in treating governance as a collective endeavor.

Later, in the nineteenth century, Charles Fourier's phalanstères inspired experiments in cooperative housing. In the twentieth century, Copenhagen's Freetown Christiania and Arizona's Arcosanti modeled alternative self-governance and sustainability. And more recently, Barcelona pioneered participatory digital platforms, Vienna and Zurich expanded cooperative housing, and Helsinki and Taipei developed civic tech commons. These imperfect but instructive examples show that urban reinvention can expand democracy rather than diminish it.

Progressives should reclaim the freedom-city debate, not cede it to techno-authoritarians. New cities could serve as sandboxes for democratic innovation. They could have participatory assemblies instead of corporate charters. Housing could be seen as a right, rather than as an investment. Digital sovereignty would prevail over digital colonialism. The toolsexist: cooperative governance, climate-adaptivedesign, universal basic services, and public digital goods are already being tested worldwide.

The battle over freedom cities is about more than zoning, taxes, or land use. It is about the future of political governance itself. The choice is stark, and it is one we cannot afford to ignore. One path leads to privatized archipelagos of privilege, optimized for efficiency and enforced by algorithms and surveillance. The other leads to civic platforms that can renew democracy and harness technology to drive social and economic inclusion.

# A relook at India's Eurasian strategy



**EUROPE OFFERS INDIA SOMETHING INCREASINGLY RARE: A PARTNER THAT COMBINES CAPABILITY WITH PREDICTABILITY** 

The 2025 Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit in Tianiin offered India both visibility and a reminder of the structural limits of its Eurasian engagement. Since joining the SCO in 2017. New Delhi has sought to navigate between Moscow and Beijing, strengthen its foothold in Central Asia, and hedge against encirclement through alternative partnerships. The Tianjin gathering confirmed that the SCO is a useful platform for dialogue, but hardly one where India can decisively shape outcomes. China and Russia continue to dominate, Pakistan remains disruptive. and Central Asian states defer to the larger powers. For India, the SCO is therefore less about influence and more about presence: being at the table without expecting to rewrite the rules.

This reality forces New Delhi to think beyond Eurasia's immediate geography. Russia remains a valuable partner—discounted energy, legacy defence cooperation, and strategic corridors like the Chennai-Vladivostok route is significant. Yet the risks are evident: exposure

to Western sanctions, Moscow's deepening dependence on Beijing, and limited scope for India to expand in Central Asia under Russia's shadow. Overreliance on this axis narrows rather than broadens India's strategic autonomy.

At the same time, the volatility of US politics under Donald Trump's presidency serves as another reminder that partnerships in today's world must be judged not only by capability but also by predictability. India cannot afford to tie its long-term Eurasian and Indo-Pacific strategies to actors whose reliability is subject to domestic swings or geopolitical entanglements.

Here is where Europe, often overlooked in Indian debates on Eurasia, enters the picture. Unlike Russia's transactional dependence or America's political oscillations, the European Union offers India what it increasingly needs: stability, institutional reliability, and long-term partnership. For New Delhi. Europe is less a matter of crisis diplomacy and more a source of durable alignment. The EU has already signalled nectivity Partnership laid the groundwork for cooperation in digital, transport, energy, and people-to-people exchanges. For India, plugging into these European-led initiatives means access to financing, technology, and political backing that can translate strategic rhetoric into tangible infrastructure.

For Indian strategists, the lesson is clear: Eurasian engagement should not be framed as a binary choice between Russia and China, or even between Eurasia and the Indo-Pacific. Rather, it should be approached as a spectrum, where Europe, anchored in stability and values, can balance the uncertainties of other partnerships.

This does not mean abandoning Moscow or diluting ties with Washington. It means broadening the toolkit. Russia will remain indispensable in defence and energy; the US continues to be India's partner in high-tech and Indo-Pacific security. But neither provides the kind of structural stability that Europe can offer. In this sense, engaging Europe is not

simply diversification—it is investment in resilience

As India reflects on Tianiin and the SCO, the message is that presence alone does not guarantee influence. The real challenge lies in transforming visibility into strategic autonomy. Here, Europe—stable, predictable, and aligned with India's democratic ethos-can serve as the partner that New Delhi needs to navigate an increasingly volatile world. By investing in European partnerships through Global Gateway, advancing joint clean energy projects, and working with Poland and other CEE states to connect Indo-Pacific and European strategies, India can secure not only short-term diversification but also longterm resilience. In a century marked by shifting alliances and intensifying rivalries. Europe offers India something increasingly rare: a partner that combines capability with predictability.

# Delhi slashes shoot fees to woo filmmakers

New Delhi, Sept 20: The Municipal Corporation of Delhi has brought down its filming fee from Rs 75,000 to Rs 25,000 for a day, while shooting inside the Delhi Metro can cost up to Rs 3 lakh depending on the location and timing, according to

The Public Works Department (PWD) has kept its base charges at Rs 10,000, while locations such as Dilli Haat (INA) and the Garden of Five Senses can now be hired for Rs 80,000 plus GST a day.

The Delhi Metro, almost synonymous with the city's identity, remains among the costlier options, with charges ranging between Rs 2 lakh and Rs 3 lakh depending on the line, station and timings of the shoot, an official from the tourism department said.

The MCD has slashed its filming fee from Rs 75,000 a day to Rs 15,000 for eight hours and Rs 25 000 plus GST for 24 hours

But despite the revised rates and subsidies promised under the Delhi Film Policy 2022, only 39 shoots have taken place under the scheme in the last three years, government records show.

Launched with the aim of making Delhi a filmmaking hub, the policy had announced

a single-window 'e-Film Clearance' portal, linking 25 agencies and assuring approvals within 15 days — or faster for a fee.

"If authorities don't respond in time, permission is automatically granted. Otherwise, reasons for the delay must be conveyed to the applicant and Delhi Tourism," he explained.

Connaught Place and Chandni Chowk continue to be the most sought-after backdrops, but officials say newer venues like Bharat Mandapam, Ban-

sera Park, Asita Bio-Diversity Park and parts of Mehrauli

Archaeological Park have po-

tential to emerge as cinematic

landmarks He further said that an annual Delhi Film Card priced at Rs 1 lakh is also being offered, giving production houses discounts on hotels, travel and logistics.

Yet, the official system has not found many takers. "Instead of using our channel, most filmmakers prefer to take

permission privately because it involves less paperwork," a Delhi Tourism senior official said.

Since the scheme began, at least 209 applications have been filed, of which 97 have been cleared. The government had set up a Rs 30 crore Delhi Film Fund to back the policy, offering up to Rs 3 crore per film in subsidies.

The first category, performance-based funding, is for films that prominently feature Delhi, while the second supports emerging filmmakers and low-budget projects. But so far, only one film, 12th Fail, has been approved for subsidy. Rani Mukerii-starrer Mardaani 3 is expected to be the next. Ad films and TV commercials do not qualify, he added.

As per official guidelines, the subsidy is points-based. Films must score at least 20 out of 40 points (44 for foreign films), depending on factors such as the number of shoot days in Delhi, screen time of its landmarks, use of local crew and overall spending in the city.

The official stressed that the policy is not only about subsidies but also about nurturing talent and positioning Delhi as a global destination.

Scholarships are being planned for students at the Film and Television Institute of India and the National School of for start-ups in animation and VFX. New film schools are also on the drawing board.

Delhi tourism's budget has been increased by 77 per cent to Rs 117 crore for 2025-26, with plans to showcase the city at international festivals. A Delhi International Film Festival and annual Film Excellence Awards are also being lined up to honour talent.

The policy has also extended its scope to digital content by including OTT projects in its incentive structure — though only those complying with central regulations. It also carries provisions against piracy and illegal screenings, he said.

Going forward, officials said the target is to triple the number of application clearances within 30 days, "In 2024, five applications were cleared within the stipulated time. For 2025-26, we are aiming at 15, and the number of applications received under e-film clearance is expected to double from 10 to 20." he said.

"Delhi hopes to shed its stooge status and compete with Mumbai and Hyderabad as a filmmaking hotspot. We understand the challenges but are hopeful the numbers will rise once the system stabilises," the Delhi tourism official added

New Delhi, Sept 20: In an attempt to encourage people to document family genealogies, community narratives, and local histories. Delhi University's Miranda House College Saturday launched an academic initiative titled "Recrafting history through the Indic lens."

The project, part of a larger effort to decolonise Indian history, aims to revive the age-old practice of Vanshavalis (family genealogies) and connect citizens with their ancestral and cultural roots, an official statement said.

The programme will include an annual national-level competition that invites participants to submit research-based essays of at least 5,000 words.

Two broad themes have been identified: "family and community history," focusing on larger kinship groups, and "the history of my village, town, or city," including villages that were absorbed into urban areas. Entries will be accepted

over a nine-month period and evaluated by a panel of distinguished scholars rooted in Indic knowledge traditions.

Miranda House alumna and academic Madhu Kishwar, who established the Kishwar

Memorial Trust (KMT) in memory of her parents and is funding the initiative, said the project would help bridge the gap between people and their

"A society ignorant of its own roots cannot produce an authentic national history. To chart a clear future, we must first reclaim our past through our millennia-old Gyan Param-

para," she said. At the launch event, attended by around 200 students and faculty members, Kishwar shared anecdotes from her family history, underscoring how knowledge is often lost when genealogies are not preserved

In today's era, many are unable to recall the names of their ancestors beyond their grandparents, which highlights the urgency of such an endeavour Kishwar said. Miranda House Principal Professor Bijayalaxmi Nanda welcomed the collaboration, describing it as "a valuable opportunity for scholars and citizens everywhere to engage in meaningful historical research and contribute to the process of nation-building.

Organisers stressed that the initiative is open to all, not just academics, making it a grassroots effort to promote authentic historical scholarship and community engagement.

### Punjab launches awareness camps in hotspots of paddy straw burning

Chandigarh, Sept 20: Punjab has seen 27 stubble burning cases in the last five days, even as authorities have launched an intensive campaign in hotspots of paddy straw burning in various districts to create awareness among farmers against this practice, officials said Saturday.

Stubble burning in Punjab and Haryana is often blamed for the rise in air pollution in Delhi after the harvesting of the paddy crop in October and November. As the window for the Rabi crop -- wheat -- is very short after paddy harvest, some farmers set afire the crop residue in the fields to quickly clear them for sowing the next crop.

According to Punjab Pollution Control Board (PPCB) data, a total of 27 crop residue burning incidents took place in four districts from September 15.

A maximum of 18 stubble burning incidents have been reported in Amritsar, followed by five in Tarn Taran, three in Patiala and one in Ferozepur. it said. A fine of Rs one lakh in the shape of environmental compensation has been imposed on farmers who set their crop residue on fire, according to the PPCB.

Recording of farm fire incidents, which started from September 15, will continue till

The Supreme Court on September 17 had asked the Punjab government why some errant farmers should not be arrested



for indulging in stubble burning to send across a stern message. The bench was hearing a suo-motu (on its own) plea relating to filling up vacancies in the state pollution control boards of Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Rajasthan and Punjab.

Meanwhile, several villages in Sangrur, Tarn Taran, Ferozepur, Moga, Bathinda and Barnala have been identified as hot spots of stubble burning incidents based on the number of farm fires.

Farmers in the hot spot villages will be asked not to burn crop residue, said a PPCB official on Saturday, adding that they will be sensitised about the ill effects of stubble burning.

Farmers will be encouraged about managing the paddy straw both in-situ (mixing crop residue in fields) and ex-situ (using stubble as fuel) methods, said the official.

In Sangrur district, the district administration started a special awareness campaign on stubble burning in which five mobile vans will be visiting 397 villages for 18 days to appeal to farmers not to burn stubble. said officials.

Sangrur Deputy Commissioner Rahul Chaba said after harvesting paddy, no farmer should set fire to the crop residue and should prove himself to be a nature lover by plowing it in his fields.

He said a number of agricultural machines have been made available to farmers in Sangrur district.

Meanwhile, the state government has sanctioned 15,613 crop residue management machines so far out of 16,837 total applications received from farmers across the state, said the officials.

Crop residue management machinery includes super seeder, smart seeder, happy seeder, paddy straw chopper, shredder, mulcher, hydraulic reversible mould board plough and zero till drill.

#### Sewa', 'Chardi Kala' spirit of Punjab youth INDO-ASIAN NEWS SERVICE

Chandigarh, Sept 20: As Punjab is grappling with unprecedented riverine flooding leading to the loss of 56 precious lives, inundation of 2,300 plus villages, loss of property, livelihoods and infrastructure worth a whopping Rs 13,800 crore, it's the indomitable attitude of the young people that keeps alive the spirit of 'sewa' and 'Chardi Kala (resilience)', to fight it out despite the most challenging times in four decades and to

rebuild the state together. A notable trend has come to the fore that the youth of Punjab, who has been branded as "idle" and "druggy" in the past, is now turning out to be the sav-

iour of the people. Young men and women are fulfilling their humanitarian duties by reaching out to marooned villagers with daily utilities and strengthening river embankments to prevent further flooding of fields and human habitations.

As water levels are finally starting to recede after weeks, displaced families have begun returning home to find their houses, crops and livelihoods almost wiped out, even as the Punjab government promised to compensate all victims.

Now rural communities, led by celebrities, influencers, and community and faith leaders, are seen in transformative roles with focus on reconstruction of homes, schools, and health facilities, besides strengthening embankments and drainage to prevent a deluge.

Flooding triggered by heavy monsoon rains and water from swollen rivers since August has inundated large parts of Pun-

jab, the country's food basket, where over 2 million people have been impacted and five lakh acres of crops destroyed after the release of water from upstream dams, leading to riv-

ers bursting their banks. Octogenarian Vijay Khanna, a doctor based in Zira, a rural town in Ferozepur, one of the worst ravaged districts said that youngsters in almost every village have been assigned duties to carry out rehabilitation work in flood-prone areas.

The work ranges from strengthening the river embankments, to setting up flood-preparedness committees to mobilise resources and to clearing silt and muck left behind by the floodwater from houses, streets and fields.

Set against the backdrop of rampant drug abuse among the youth in Punjab, the crime drama 'Udta Punjab' highlighted the state's drug crisis and its dark realities.

In a role reversal from 'Udta

Punjab', these floods, the worst in living memory, showcased the 'survival-to-revival' spirit of the youth that is based on the Sikh belief of 'Sarbat da Bhala',

#### 32 drug samples fail quality test

New Delhi: The central drugs laboratories have found 32 samples manufactured by various firms in August to be "not of standard quality". health ministry officials said Friday. Additionally, the state drugs testing laboratories identified 62 samples as "not of standard quality" (NSQ) in the month under review, they said. As part of routine regulatory surveillance activity, the list of NSQ and spurious drugs are displayed on the Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) portal on a monthly basis. For August, the central drugs laboratories identified 32 samples to be NSO, while the state drugs testing laboratories identified 62 samples under the same category, an official said.

#### Researcher found dead at IIT-Kharagpur

Kolkata: The body of a researcher was found hanging from the ceiling of his hostel room in IIT-Kharagpur Saturday, in the fifth suspected case of suicide at the premier institute this year, officials said. Harsh Kumar Pandey (27), a resident of Ranchi, was found dead in his room at the BR Ambedkar Hall around 2 pm, they said. Pandey was pursuing a PhD in Mechanical Engineering, they added. "His parents could not reach him on the phone, and the door of his room was locked from the inside. Subsequently, police were informed, and they broke into the room to find his body hanging from the ceiling," an IIT-Kharagpur spokesperson said. In a statement, the institute said it has constituted a fact-finding committee to examine the matter.

#### Protests erupt over **Assam Rifles ambush**

Imphal: Locals of Nambol in Manipur's Bishnupur district Saturday morning staged protests against the killing of two Assam Rifles personnel in an ambush in the area the previous day. Search operations are being conducted in the area for the attackers and the vehicle used by them, police said. # CIK conducts searches at 8 locations across valley

Srinagar, Sept 20: The counter-intelligence wing of the Jammu and Kashmir Police detained seven suspects for questioning Saturday during raids conducted at multiple locations in the valley in a terror-related case, an official said.

The searches were conducted by the Counter Intelligence Kashmir (CIK) at eight locations, an official said.

He said the eight locations across Srinagar, Baramulla, Anantnag, Pulwama, Kupwara and Shopian were identified and subsequently, searched in connection with FIR No. 03/2023 registered under various sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA).

Seven suspects were detained for questioning and incriminating digital evidence that has bearing on the investigation was seized, the CIK official added.

The case was lodged on a credible input received by the CIK, wherein it had emerged that certain individuals in Jammu and Kashmir, under the cloak of social activism, were "misusing" platforms connected to mass media, social media, human rights, environment and women empowerment for activities detrimental to the sovereignty and security of the State, he said.

#### **HUNT FOR TERRORISTS** INTENSIFIED IN UDHAMPUR

A soldier, who was critically injured in a gunfight, succumbed to his injuries as security forces Saturday extended a search operation to neutralise terrorists hiding in the higher reaches of Jammu and Kashmir's Udhampur district, officials said. The soldier, Lance Dafadar Baldev Chand, was injured late Friday evening, when the terrorists opened fire on a joint patrolling party of the Army and the Special Operations Group (SOG) of the Jammu and Kashmir Police at Kanji in the Seoj Dhar forest, between the Dudu-Basantgarh area of Udhampur and Bhad-erwah in Doda district, the officials said. They said the soldier was shifted to a hospital where he succumbed to his injuries. The area around the scene of the encounter was kept under tight cordon during the night and a combing operation was resumed on Saturday morning and extended to new areas during the day to track down the terrorists. The officials said reinforcements were mobilised from both Doda and Udhampur and drones and sniffer dogs were also deployed to speed up the search operation. However, there was no fresh contact with the terrorists during the day, they added. The Army paid rich tributes to the fallen soldier and said "we stand with the bereaved family in this hour of grief".

"There can be no bigger indictment of the CEC than this. The police is asking for information, and he is not providing it. This is not my statement. It is a fact. It is there in black and white,' he said.

Rahul further said that the Congress will show evidence of the alleged 'vote chori' "in such a manner that no one will have any doubt that PM Narendra Modi did it and won the election"

"We are going to reveal a hydrogen bomb, like I have said in my two press conferences, that will completely devastate the reality of the situation. We have open and shut proof of what we are saying. We are not saying anything without proof. I will do my job and I will deliver on my job," he added.

Rahul had Friday too reiterated his "vote chori" allegations and took a swipe at the EC, calling it an "election watchman" who "staved awake, watched the theft, and protected the thieves".

Ranchi, Sept 20: More than 100 passenger trains were cancelled, diverted or short-terminated Saturday as a rail blockade by Kurmis is underway at various stations within the jurisdiction of the Ranchi division of South Eastern Railway (SER) and Dhanbad division of East Central Railway, an official said. Defying prohibitory orders,

protestors squatted on tracks at various stations in Muri, Rai, Tatisilwai stations in Ranchi district, Barkakana in Ramgarh, Parasnath in Giridih, Charhi in Hazaribag, Pradhankhanta in Dhanbad, Galudih in East Singhbhum and Chandrpura in Bokaro district under the banner of Adivasi Kurmi Samaj (AKS) to press their demand for a Scheduled Tribe (ST) status for the community and inclusion of the Kurmali language in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

AKS leader OP Mahto said they will spend the night on tracks and they will not withdraw the agitation until their demands are met.

At least 25 passenger trains were cancelled and 24 diverted in Dhanbad division of ECR, while 12 trains, including Vande Bharat and Rajdhani Express were cancelled and 11 trains diverted in Ranchi division of SER due to the agitation.

Many trains were short-termi nated in two divisions, according to statements issued by the railways. Thousands of passengers were stranded across Jharkhand after trains were halted by the agitators. Maloti Ghosh, a passenger of Howrah-Pune Duron to Express who was stranded at Ghatshila station in East Singhbhum district till in the evening said, "My daughter, who works in Pune, is unwell. I have to be there anyhow as her two children are suffering. Railway officials are just giving assurances about train movements, but there is no information when it will start running."

Security personnel tried to pacify the protestors and made efforts to clear the tracks, railway officials said. Hundreds of passengers of Tata-Patna Vande Bharat Express were also stranded at Ranchi's Muri station. The train was later cancelled, leading to ruckus by passengers.

#### **GOYAL TO VISIT US FOR** TRADE TALKS SEPT 22

Industry body Nasscom Saturday said the US' move will impact India's technology services companies as business continuity will be disrupted for onshore projects that may require "adjustments".

Further, the visit comes in the backdrop of recently concluded daylong discussions here between US Chief Negotiator Brendan Lynch and his Indian counterpart Rajesh Agrawal on the proposed bilateral trade agreement.

# No polygamy for Muslim men lacking means: Kerala HC

According to the court, a majority of Muslims follow monogamy, which reflects the true spirit of the Quran, while only a small minority

Kochi, Sept 20: The Kerala High Court has observed that it cannot accept multiple marriages of a Muslim man when he has no capacity to maintain his wives, and one of them approaches the court claiming maintenance.

The observation was made by Justice PV Kunhikrishnan when a 39-year-old Perinthalmanna native approached the court seeking a monthly mainte-

nance of Rs 10,000 from her hushand, who survives by begging. Earlier, the petitioner had

approached a Family Court,

which dismissed her plea, stating that her 46-year-old husband from Kumbadi, Palakkad, who was surviving on begging, cannot be directed to pay maintenance.

The court, in a satirical manner, referred to a Malayalam phrase implying, "Don't put your hand into a begging bowl". The judge noted that the

husband was also not a saint. "Even though he is blind and a beggar, as stated by the petitioner, who is his second wife, he has been threatening her that he will soon enter into a third marriage with another woman," the court observed. The court perused the peti-

tion and found that the respondent was receiving an income of Rs 25.000 from various sources. including begging, and that the petitioner had sought Rs 10,000 per month as maintenance. The respondent currently lives with his first wife.

The court also noted that it could not digest the contention



of the wife that her blind husband regularly assaulted her.

However, while highlighting the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case, the court said that judges are not robots.

"Admittedly, the respondent belongs to the Muslim community, and he is taking the benefits of his customary law, which, according to him, allows him to marry twice or thrice.

A person who has no capacity to maintain a second or third wife cannot marry again, even as per the customary law of Muslims," the court observed.

The court further said that successive marriages of the man, when he was only a beggar, cannot be accepted even under Muslim customary law. "These types of marriages happen in the Muslim community because of the lack of education, lack of knowledge of the customary law of Muslims. A court of law cannot simply recognise the first, second or third marriage of a Muslim man when he has no capacity to maintain his wives and one of the wives approached the court with a petition claiming maintenance," it noted.

Referring to verses of the Quran, it said the holy text propagates monogamy and treats polygamy as only an exception. "If a Muslim man can give justice to his first wife, second wife, third wife and fourth wife, then

is permissible," the court said According to the court, a majority of Muslims follow monogamy, which reflects the true spirit of the Quran, while only a small minority practise polyga my, forgetting its verses. They

Taking up the respondent's situation, the court said begging cannot be recognised as a livelihood and that it is the duty of the state, society, and judicia ry to ensure that no one resorts to it. It stressed that the state must provide food and clothing to such persons.

"If a blind man who is begging in front of the mosque and marrying one after another without even knowledge of the fundamental principles of Mus lim customary law, he should be counselled appropriately. It is the duty of the state to protect the destitute wives who are victims of polygamy in the Muslim community," the judge said.

#### India signs deep sea deal with ISA

New Delhi: India has signed a 15-year contract with the International Seabed Authority (ISA) for exclusive rights to explore polymetallic sulphides in the Indian Ocean, Earth Sciences Minister Jitendra Singh said Saturday. Singh said, according to the contract, the ISA has granted exclusive rights to India to explore polymetallic sulphides (PMS) in the allotted 10,000 sq km area of the Carlsberg Ridge in the Indian Ocean. PMS contain valuable metals such as iron, copper, zinc, silver, gold, and platinum, and are precipitates formed by hot hydrothermal fluids from oceanic crust.

#### Social media post triggers violence in Vadodara

Vadodara, Sept 20: Police detained around 50 people in Vadodara city of Gujarat Saturday following late-night rioting over a social media post in Junigadhi area, officials said.

A few people including police personnel were injured in stone-pelting but the situation was swiftly brought under control, they said. Members of the Muslim com-

munity gathered outside the city police station Friday night claiming that a social media post hurt their religious sentiments, and demanded action against the person who uploaded it, said an official.

Another group of around 500 to 600 members of the minority community started stone-pelting and vandalized vehicles in Junigadhi area of Old City, said Deputy Commissioner of Police (zone IV) Andrew Macwan.

A few people including police personnel were injured, he said. Two separate FIRs were registered, one against the person who posted the content and another against the people who indulged in violence, the DCP said.

"We have detained around 50 people," he added.

The person who allegedly posted objectionable content was also detained, police sources said. "The whole situation was

promptly brought under control. We have deployed police force in large number in the affected areas. We appeal to the people of the city to maintain peace. Action is being taken in the matter," said DCP (zone 3) Leena Patil.

### Modi's foreign policy 'failed': Oppn India's reaction came hours after US President Donald Trump signed a proclamation to impose a \$100,000 annual

fee for H-1B visas, a move that is set to adversely impact Indian professionals in the US

New Delhi, Sept 20: The Opposition parties Saturday alleged that the Modi government's foreign policy has "failed" after the US imposed a \$100,000 annual fee for H1B visas for highly skilled workers which, they said, is "meant to target Indians", and asked the Centre to take steps to resolve the "crisis".

The Congress hit out at Prime Minister Narendra Modi, accusing him of being a "weak PM" whose preference for "strategic silence" and "loud optics" has become a liability for India. Its president Mallikarjun Kharge said that foreign policy is about safeguarding India's national interests and keeping "India First" and not holding "events"

Highlighting reports that H1B visa hike would hit Indians hardest, Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi said in a post on X, "I repeat, India has a weak PM.

Noting that Indian national interests are supreme, Congress chief Kharge took a swipe at the PM, saying, "Bear hugs, hollow slogans, concerts and getting people to chant 'Modi, Modi' is not foreign policy!".

"Foreign policy is about safeguarding our national interests; keeping India First, and steering friendships with wisdom and balance. It cannot be reduced to superficial bravado that risks undermining our long-term standing," Kharge said in a post on X.

#### India hopes H1B fee hike disruptions addressed

India Saturday said the Trump administration's decision to raise the annual fee for H1B visas to a whopping \$1,00,000 is likely to have "humanitarian consequences" and hoped that the "disruptions" will be addressed "suitably" by Washington. As a proclamation signed by US President Donald Trump on the new visa rules comes into effect Sunday, New Delhi asked all its missions and posts to extend all possible help to Indian nationals who are travelling back to the US in the next 24 hours. The move came after various companies advised H1B visa holders or their family members currently outside America to return or risk being stranded and denied entry into the US. The Trump administration's abrupt roll out of the new visa norms are set to significantly impact Indian technology companies as well as skilled Indian professionals as India was the largest beneficiary of the H1B visa programme in the last few years. "This measure is likely to have humanitarian consequences by way of the disruption caused for families," External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said. "The government hopes that these disruptions can be addressed suitably by the US authorities," he said, adding the full implications of the move is being studied by all concerned stakeholders.

### **Panic grips Indian H1B holders**

NewYork/Washington: Widespread panic, confusion and concern gripped Indians in the US on H-1B visas Saturday hours after US President Donald Trump's order to impose a staggering \$1,00,000 fee on the work visas, with many cancelling their plans to travel to India. While many cancelled plans to travel at the last minute while waiting to board flights to India, several others already in India are scrambling to return amid lack of clarity after Trump Friday signed a proclamation to raise the H-1B visa fees, weeks before Indian professionals and their families travel to India for Diwali and other year-end holidays. Individuals on H-1B visas as well as those in the US tracking the news spoke to PTI on condition of anonymity and stressed that the underlying emotion among H-1B visa holders and their families right now is that of "a crazy sense of panic" and "worry." There are instances where people have cancelled their travel plans as they were waiting in line to board their flights to India across US airports Friday, the moment news came. An individual told PTI about a person who was to travel to India for their own wedding and who has now cancelled plans amid the uncertainty this proclamation has triggered. "This is a travel ban! Even if a person has a valid H-1B visa stamped on their passport, if they are travelling, or are on vacation, you cannot enter the US unless they have proof of the \$1,00,000 payment. No one knows what the process is, what the fine print is. There's absolute panic," one of the individuals said.

"I have received several requests from tribal landowners in Palghar and Nandurbar districts. If a private company wants to set up solar panels under a government scheme, it can enter into an agreement with the tribal landowner, who will continue to receive a fixed annual pay ment. Such income would not be possible from barren land, Bawankule said.

He said that the proposed legislation would also safeguard tribal ownership, as even if land is leased for a longer period, the owner would continue to receive payments annually from the entity with whom the agreement is made.

Mumbai, Sept 20: The Mumbai-Ahmedabad bullet train project will act as a "multiplier" for India's economy the way it did when the high speed service was first introduced more than six decades ago in Japan, Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said Saturday. He was speaking to report-

ers after a breakthrough was achieved for a 4.88 km-long tunnel between Shilphata and Ghansoli for the project this morning.

Calling it a "landmark achievement", Vaishnaw, who initiated the breakthrough of the tunnel, said that the first phase of the high-speed corridor on the Surat-Bilimora section will start in December

"The world's first bullet train, connecting major centres like Tokyo, Nagoya, and Osaka, created a multiplier effect on Japan's entire economy. Similarly, this project will unite Anand, Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Surat, Vapi, and Mumbai into a single economic corridor," he said at the Ghansoli shaft of the tunnel

It will create unified markets and accelerate economic growth along the entire route, while also facilitating knowledge transfer and economic integration, Vaishnaw said.

"The economic gains will far exceed the initial investment through higher productivity and business expansion," he pointed out.

The tunnel excavation was carried out simultaneously from the Ghansoli and Shilpha-



ta sides, with teams advancing toward each other through challenging underwater terrain.

"It is a remarkable feat. The project showcases cutting-edge engineering innovations that have earned international

recognition. The use of single tunnel technology to accommodate two bullet trains and deployment of 40-meter girders in viaduct construction represent significant technical achievements," he said.

The Japanese partners in the project have praised this technological innovation for its efficiency and design excellence, he said, adding that India has gained substantial knowhow in this regard. Vaishnaw said he met the Japanese delegation led by the Vice Minister a day before to review the project, during which both sides expressed satisfaction at the progress. Discussions were also held

on introducing the latest E10 Shinkansen (Japan's next-generation bullet train) in India, he said. Japan has agreed to provide India with this advanced

train system, Vaishnaw said. The minister said the bullet train will be the "transport for the middle class", and the fares

will be "reasonable". He said that the Google Maps app shows the journey time between Mumbai and Ahmedabad as nine hours, but people will be able to cover the distance in two hours and seven minutes on the bullet train.

The first phase of the bullet train project will be launched on the Surat-Bilimora section in 2027, covering Thane in 2028 and the Bandra Kurla Complex in 2029, Vaishnaw said.

The Union minister said 320 kilometres of viaduct have been completed, while station construction is advancing swiftly across all sites. River bridges are being systematically built and the Sabarmati tunnel is nearing completion, he added.

There will be no need for ticket reservations for travel between Mumbai and Ahmedabad, and passengers can arrive at the station and board. the minister said.

#### 'Midway Blitz': ICE nabs 550 in Chicago

Park Ridge(US): Immigration enforcement officials have arrested almost 550 people as part of an operation in the Chicago area that launched a little less than two weeks ago, the Department of Homeland Security said Friday. ### rap group Kneecap

Toronto: The Canadian government banned the Irish-language rap group Kneecap from the country Friday, saying the group has endorsed political violence and terrorism. The group has faced criticism for political statements seeming to glorify militant groups like Hamas and Hezbollah. Hungary previously banned the group. Liberal lawmaker Vince Gasparro, parliamentary secretary for combating crime, said Kneecap has "publicly displayed support for terrorist organisations such as Hezbollah and Hamas" that goes beyond artistic expression."Canada stands firmly against hate speech, incitement to violence and the glorification of terrorism." Gasparro said in a video on social media. "Political debate and free speech are vital to our democracy, but open endorsements of terrorist groups are not free speech."

#### 19 killed as migrant boat capsizes

Cairo: The bodies of 19 people were recovered after the rubber migrant boat they were in sank off the eastern Libyan coast, the International Organization for Migration said. The boat, which was carrying more than 70 Sudanese and South Sudanese nationals, sailed on September 9 from a beach near the town of Kambout and sank the same day, an IOM spokesperson told The Associated Press Friday. A total of 14 people were rescued five days later, while 42 others remain missing, the IOM said.

# Trump's silence speaks volumes

**European diplomats,** once heartened by **Trump's engagement** with NATO, now worried

Washington, Sept 20: Pentagon officials sat down with a group of European diplomats in late August and delivered a stern message: The US planned to cut off some security assistance to Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia, all NATO members bordering Russia. More broadly, Pentagon

official David Baker told the group, according to an official with direct knowledge of the comments, Europe needed to be less dependent on the US Under President Donald Trump, the US military would be shifting its attention to other priorities, like defense of the homeland.

Some European diplomats fretted that the move could embolden Russian President Vladimir Putin.

Russian MiG-31 jets entered Estonian airspace for roughly 10 minutes, Estonia said, before being chased away by Italian F-35s. Russia denied violating Estonian airspace, saying its jets flew over neutral waters. Hours later. Russian jets

The US response to those incidents has so far been muted.

But some diplomats sense a trap. Such measures would be hard to get through the EU's bureaucracy promptly, particularly as the bloc prefers sanctions to tariffs. Two senior European diplomats in Washington also noted that Trump has recently spoken of lowering trade barri ers with India

It is unclear if Friday's Estonia incursion will alter Trump's calculus toward Russia.

"Many of our European allies are among the world's wealthiest countries," a White House official said. "They are fully capable of funding these programs if they choose.'

#### **China widens social** media crackdown

Beijing, Sept 20: China's internet regulator said Saturday it would take "disciplinary and punitive measures" against popular apps Weibo and Kuaishou for highlighting celebrity news and "undesirable' content, extending a crackdown on social media platforms.

The Cyberspace Administration of China (CAC) said the measures would include "summonses for interviews injunctions to correct breaches within a specified period, warnings and strict sanctions against those responsible".

The announcement fol lowed similar action taken by the CAC last week against the Instagram-like Xiaohongshu, known as Rednote in English.

Chinese authorities require social media platforms to use moderation, with content strictly controlled to avoid anything deemed to be too subversive, vulgar, pornographic or gen erally harmful.

The CAC criticised Weibo and Kuaishou for "failing to fulfil their primary responsibility in separate but almost identical statements Saturday.

It singled out rankings for the most popular searches on the two apps and "particularly content that over-hypes the activities of celebrities, as well as trivial posts". The CAC accused Weibo of

"damaging the online ecosystem" and Kuaishou of contributing to the excessive spread of celebrity content deemed

### Cyberattack disrupts European airports

Brussels, Sept 20: A cyberattack on a provider of check-in and boarding systems has disrupted operations at several major European airports including London's Heathrow. the continent's busiest, causing flight delays and cancellations Saturday.

Collins Aerospace, which provides systems for several airlines at airports globally, is experiencing a technical issue that may cause delays for departing passengers, Heathrow Airport said, having warned of delays.

Brussels Airport and Berlin Airport were also affected by the attack, they said in separate statements.

RTX, Collins Aerospace's parent company, said it had become aware of a "cyber-related disruption" to its software at selected airports, without naming in Berlin, Brussels affected

"The impact is limited to electronic customer check-in and baggage drop and can be mitigated with manual checkin operations," RTX said in an e-mailed statement, adding that it was working to fix the issue as quickly as possible.

The attack has rendered automated systems inoperable. allowing only manual checkin and boarding procedures, Brussels Airport said on its website, adding the incident had occurred on Friday night.

"This has a large impact on the flight schedule and will unfortunately cause delays and cancellations," it said.



# Nations ratify world's first treaty to protect int'l waters

The high seas are home to an array of marine life and are crucial in regulating Earth's climate - they absorb heat and carbon dioxide and generate half the oxygen we breathe

Seattle(US), Sept 20: A major agreement to protect marine diversity in the high seas was struck Friday when Morocco became the 60th nation to sign on, paving the way for the treaty to take effect next year.

The High Seas Treaty is the first legal framework aimed at protecting biodiversity in international waters, those that lie beyond the jurisdiction of any single country. International waters account for nearly twothirds of the ocean and nearly half of Earth's surface and are vulnerable to threats including overfishing, climate change and deep-sea mining. The high seas are the

world's largest crime scene they're unmanaged, unenforced, and a regulatory legal structure is absolutely necessary," said Johan Bergenas, senior vice president of oceans at the World Wildlife Fund.

Still, the pact's strength is uncertain as some of the world's



biggest players — the US, China, Russia and Japan — have yet to ratify. The US and China have signed, signaling intent to align with the treaty's objectives without creating legal obligations, while Japan and Russia have been active in preparatory talks.

Ratification triggers a 120day countdown for the treaty to take effect. But much more work remains to flesh out how it will be implemented,

The treaty is also essential to achieving what's known as the "30x30" target — an international pledge to protect 30 per cent of the planet's land and sea by 2030.

The treaty creates a legal

process for countries to estab lish marine protected areas in those waters, including rules for potentially destructive activities like deep-sea mining and geoengineering schemes It also establishes a framework for technology-sharing, funding mechanisms and scientific col laboration among countries. Crucially, decisions under

the treaty will be made multilaterally through what are known as conferences of parties, rather than by individual countries acting alone. Within one year of the trea-

ty taking effect, countries will meet to make decisions about implementation, financing and oversight, and only countries that ratify before then will have voting rights.

The top 20 list includes Infosys (2,004), LTIMindtree (1,807). and HCL America (1,728).

The visa fee blow comes at a time when the \$283-billion Indian IT sector is already rattled by a turbulent business environment in the world's largest outsourcing market. The sector faces delays in client decision-making amid macroeconomic uncertainties, tariffs and trade wars, geopolitical tensions, and the change ing landscape driven by AI.

Adding to the concerns is the legislative threat of the proposed Halting International Relocation of Employ ment (HIRE) Act, introduced by Senator Bernie Moreno, which if passed, will curb outsourcing and promote domestic employment by imposing a 25 per cent levy on payments made by American companies to foreign workers for services benefiting US consumers.

The 24th edition of the India International Seafood Show, Asia's premier seafood trade fair, will be held from September 25 to 28, at Bharat Mandapam here.





# EBI eases securities transfer process

New Delhi, Sept 20: In a move aimed at reducing confusion and easing compliance, capital markets regulator Security Exchange Board of India (SEBI) Friday simplified the process of transferring securities from nominees to legal heirs.

In a circular issued, the regulator said that from January 1, 2026, all reporting entities, including depositories, listed companies, RTAs and depository participants, will be required to use a new code "TLH" (Transmission to Legal Heirs) while reporting such transfers to the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT).

Currently, when securities are passed on from a nominee to a legal heir, the transaction is sometimes treated as a taxable "transfer" and assessed under capital gains provisions.

Although Section 47(iii) of the Income Tax Act exempts such transmissions, the error



often forces investors to seek refunds later, causing unnec-

To address this issue, SEBI had set up a working group that consulted with CBDT and recommended the adoption of a standard reporting code.

"It has been decided that a standard reason code viz. 'TLH' shall be used by the reporting entities while reporting the transmission of securities from nominee to legal heir, to the CBDT so as to enable proper application of the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961," SEBI said in its circular.

The regulator has in recent months taken several steps to streamline processes related to nomination and transmission

Earlier, SEBI had simplified the appointment of nominees to ensure smooth transfer of securities after the death of an investor.



Ale, a former Indian Army personnel, sustained spinal cord injuries in 2009. He made his international debut in 2014 and has partnered with Abu Hubaida to form India's most successful wheelchair doubles combination.
