Eight arrested for **Cuttack violence**

Cuttack, Oct 6: Eight people were arrested Monday in connection with the violence in Cuttack, where a 12-hour bandh was held amid heavy security deployment with prohibitory orders in place, officials said.

Speaking to reporters, Commissioner of Police S Dev Datta Singh said three cases were registered and eight people were arrested in connection with Sunday's attack on police by VHP activists.

"The situation is under control," he said.

Senior police officer Amarenda Panda and Cuttack DCP Khilari Rishikesh Dnyandeo were among the 25 people injured in the attack. Panda was admitted to the ICU of the SCB Medical College and Hospital, officials said.

Police said raids were continuing in different parts of the city after some of the "mischief mongers" were identified through CCTV footage.

Clashes broke out in the early hours of Saturday near Haathi Pokhari in the Daraghabazar area as locals objected to loud music being played in immersion processions. What started as an argument soon escalated, leading to the hurling of stones and glass bottles. Six people, including Dnyandeo, were injured in the clashes.

Meanwhile, the suspension of internet services has been extended till 7pm October 7, according to a notification issued by the Home department Monday. The suspension will be effective in areas under the Cuttack Municipal Corporation, CDA area, and the 42 Mouza region.


Bengal BJP MP, MLA hurt in mob attack

French PM steps down

Paris: Just a day after naming his government and after less than a month in office, France's new Prime Minister Sebastien Lecornu resigned Monday, owing to widespread criticism regarding his choice of ministers in the new Cabinet. The French presidency said in a statement that President **Emmanuel Macron has accepted** his resignation. Lecornu's choice of ministers had been criticised across the political spectrum, particularly his decision to bring back former finance minister Bruno Le Maire to serve at the Defence ministry.

Nuapada bypoll Nov 11 CM unveils ₹1,100cr projects

Bhubaneswar, Oct 6: The **Election Commission Monday** announced that the bypoll to the Nuapada Assembly constituency will be held Novem-

Addressing a presser here, Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) RS Gopalan said that the results of the byelection will be announced November 14.

He said a formal gazette notification for the bypoll will be issued October 13.

Candidates can file their nominations on or before October 20, while the nomination papers will be scrutinised October 22. The entire election process will be completed by . November 16," the CĒO added. Gopalan said that the mod-

el code of conduct (MCC) will come into force with immediate effect in Nuapada district.

Candidates with criminal antecedents are required to publish information in this regard in newspapers and through television channels on three occasions during the campaign period, he said.

Similarly, political parties are also required to publish information about criminal background of its candidates thrice, the CEO said.

The CEO said that webcasting will be conducted in all booths across Nuapada during the bypoll. Adequate number of electronic voting machines (EVMs) and VVPATs have been made available in the constituency.

Electors will not be able to take their cellphones inside the polling booths while casting their votes. Dedicated facilities will be made to store the mobile phones of the voters outside the polling booths. Only the polling officer can take a mobile phone inside the booth, he added.

The byelection to the Nuapada Assembly constituency was necessitated by the death of MLA Rajendra Dholakia September 8 due to health-related issues

Dholakia was a four-time MLA from Nuapada seat, having been elected to the state Assembly in 2004, 2009, 2019 and 2024.

Wangchuk detention: SC notice to Centre

New Delhi, Oct 6: The Supreme Court Monday sought response from the Centre and Union Territory of Ladakh on a plea filed by Sonam Wangchuk's wife Gitanjali J Angmo challenging the climate activist's detention under National Security Act (NSA), and seeking his immediate release.

However, a bench of Justices Aravind Kumar and NV Aniaria refused to pass any order on providing grounds of deten-

tion to Wangchuk's wife and posted the matter for hearing October 14. Wangchuk is lodged in Jodhpur jail in Rajasthan.

Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for Angmo, sought directions from the apex court that the grounds of detention should be served on her.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta submitted that the grounds of detention have been served on the detenue. Mehta stated that there is no legal requirement for the grounds of detention to be given to the wife.


3 share Medicine Nobel for immune discoveries

Stockholm, Oct 6: American scientists Mary Brunkow, Fred Ramsdell and Shimon Sakaguchi from Japan won the 2025 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine Monday for their discoveries in peripheral immune tolerance, creating openings for possible new autoimmune disease and cancer treatments.

This year's prize "relates to how we keep our immune system under control so we can fight all imaginable microbes and still avoid autoimmune disease", said Marie Wahren-Herlenius, a rheumatology professor at the Karolinska Institute.

Speaking to reporters outside his university laboratory, Sakaguchi said, "I feel it is a

After announcing the winners, the institute's Thomas Perlmann said he had only been able to break the news to one of the three, reaching Sakaguchi by phone at his lab.

"He sounded incredibly grateful, expressed that it was a fantastic honour and he was quite taken by the news," added Perlmann.







CM FOR BALANCED DEVPT OF ALL REGIONS BJD demands CBI probe into SI recruitment scam

Bhubaneswar, Oct 6: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday reaffirmed his government's commitment to ensuring balanced development across all regions of the state. "The Odisha government is

equally focused on the progress of both remote and developed areas," Majhi said while addressing a public meeting in western Odisha's Nuapada, where he announced 957 projects worth over Rs 1,100 crore.

"For years, people in backward and remote areas have complained of regional disparity. Our government is ensuring that every region receives equal attention," he said.

Majhi said Western Odisha Development Council has been strengthened with enhanced funding and separate development councils for northern and southern Odisha will also be established soon.

The CM also said that industrial development in every district was being prioritised to ensure balanced growth across the state.

Responding to a longstanding local demand, Majhi announced that Khariar Road has been declared a municipality, while Komna block has been granted NAC (Notified Area Council) status.

Similarly, Sinapali NAC has been formed by merging Sinapali and Godal gram pan-



It was Majhi's third visit to Nuapada. Earlier, he had attended the Maraguda Mahotsay in April and inaugurated projects worth Rs 320 crore. With Monday's announcement, he has launched projects worth Rs 1,420 crore for the district.

Reiterating his government's concern for kendu leaf pluckers, the CM said he personally attended the recent GST Council meeting and proposed a reduction in GST on kendu leaves. "Acting on this. the Central government, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, reduced the GST rate from

18 per cent to 5 per cent, benefiting millions of kendu leaf workers across the country.' Majhi said.

The CM also announced that sub-registrar offices will be opened in all tehsils across the state. Of the 317 tehsils, 210 already have such offices, while the remaining 107 will soon be covered. In the first phase. new sub-registrar offices have been opened in seven tehsils three in Nuapada and four in Malkangiri.

Highlighting the district's performance in welfare programmes, the chief minister

said 1.55 lakh women have benefited from the Subhadra Yojana, and 2,548 families are receiving houses under the Antvodava scheme, Nuapada has also been declared a single-use plastic-free district, and under the 'plant a tree for a girl child' initiative, newborn girls and their parents are be-

He added that Nuapada ranks first in the state by employing over 60,000 workers daily under MGNREGA.

The public grievance redressal programme, Majhi said, has also been extended to the panchavat level.

Health and Family Welfare Minister Mukesh Mahaling, School and Mass Education and ST & SC Development Minister Nityananda Gond, and Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water Minister Rabi Narayan Naik also addressed

Opposition BJD, meanwhile, strongly criticised the chief minister's visit to Nuapada and announcement of development projects just a few hours before the implementation of the Model Code of Conduct.

'The CM is busy in the election campaign at Nuapada even as heavy rainfall has affected other parts of the state,' BJD vice president Sanjay Das Burma told reporters here.

BJD women wing president Snehangini Chhuria claimed that former CM Naveen Patnaik had earlier declared Sina-

"There is a smell of politics in deleting Sinapali's name in the first phase of the list of NACs and adding it now," she said, adding that Nuapada was made a district in 1993 by Biju Patnaik.

BJD leaders from Bhubaneswar have been camping in Nuapada and state Congress president Bhakta Charan Das also addressed a 'Nyay Samavesh' there Monday.

No political party, however, has so far announced the names of candidates for the upcoming bypoll.

Bhubaneswar, Oct 6: The Biju Janata Dal (BJD) Monday staged a protest in Bhubaneswar demanding a CBI probe into alleged irregularities in the recruitment of police sub-inspectors (SIs) in Odisha.

The written examination for recruitment of SIs was postponed by the Odisha Police Recruitment Board (OPRB) after Berhampur police arrested several people, including 114 aspirants, from Odisha-Andhra Pradesh border September 30.

Police said the candidates were allegedly on their way to an undisclosed location in the neighbouring state for 'special coaching' ahead of the exam scheduled for October 5-6.

According to police sources, each candidate had allegedly agreed to pay Rs 25 lakh for one SI post, with Rs 10 lakh paid in advance and the remaining Rs 15 lakh to be paid after appointment.

Holding banners, posters and placards and raising slogans against the BJP government in the state, hundreds of BJD members took out a protest march from Master Canteen to Lower PMG demanding a CBI probe into the alleged recruitment scam.

When the BJD members tried to break barricades, police prevented them from moving forward leading to a scuffle among the protestors and the security personnel.

Several BJD leaders and workers have been detained, a

Alleging that the state government was playing with the future of youths, BJD leader Pritiranjan Gharai demanded that the government hand over the case to the Central agency to give justice to students and youths.

"The BJP government has asked the Crime Branch (CB) to investigate the case so as to protect the big names involved in the scam," he alleged.

Alleging that many senior government officials are involved in the scam, BJD women wing president Snehangini Chhuria claimed that each SI post was 'sold for Rs 25 lakh'.


"Not just SI posts, all job recruitments during the BJP re gime were sold. It has now be come a 'cash-for-job' situation in Odisha, which is unfortunate and condemnable," she alleged

BJD youth wing president Chinmaya Sahu said, "It was an organised recruitment scam Even the police department is involved in it. Only a CBI probe can expose the whole scam."

Cuttack, Oct 6: Eight people were arrested Monday in connection with the violence in Cuttack, where a 12-hour bandh was underway amid heavy security deployment with prohibitory orders in place, officials said.

Speaking to reporters, Commissioner of Police S Dev Datta Singh said three cases were registered and eight people were arrested in connection with Sunday's attack on police by Vishva Hindu Parishad (VHP) activists.

"The situation is under control," he said.

Senior police officer Amarenda Panda and Cuttack DCP Khilari Rishikesh Dnyandeo were among the 25 people injured in the attack. Panda was admitted to the ICU of the SCB Medical College and Hospital (SCBMCH), officials said.

Police said raids were continuing in different parts of the Millennium City after some of the 'mischief mongers' were identified through CCTV footage

Clashes broke out in the early hours of Saturday near Haathi Pokhari in Dargha Bazar area as locals objected to loud music being played in immersion processions. What started as an argument soon escalated, leading to the hurling of stones and glass bottles.

On Sunday, a motorcycle rally by VHP activists in support of the bandh was stopped by the police when they reached the trouble-torn area, leading to a fresh bout of violence. The VHP activists hurled stones at the police, who used lathi charge, tear gas shells and rubber bullets to bring the situation under control.

Several shops in the Gourishankar Park area were allegedly set on fire during the violence.

The bandh, which began at 6am, evoked a mixed response but remained incident-free.

Government offices and educational institutions were functioning with thin attendance. Markets and petrol pumps remained open, and public trans-

port was available on the road, but less than usual due to the slew of restrictions imposed by the police.

ACP Narasingha Bhol said 1,800 personnel of Odisha Police have been deployed along with around 800 personnel of the Central Armed Police Forces, and Odisha Swift Action Force in the Silver City.

The prohibitory orders were imposed for 36 hours till 10am Tuesday in 13 of the 20 police station areas of the city, officials said. Internet services were initially suspended for 24 hours from 7pm Sunday and later till 7pm Tuesday to prevent any flare-up, they said.

In a statement, the Odisha Police urged the people to verify information before sharing it on social media and to refrain from posting false and inflammatory content.

"Some individuals are creating an atmosphere of unrest in society by spreading fake news. Strict action will be taken against those who are spreading and circulating false or misleading information," it said.

Bhubaneswar, Oct 6: As Cuttack remained tense due to two consecutive clashes during and after goddess Durga idol immersion procession, senior BJP leader and local MP Bhartruhari Mahtab Monday said he had earlier cautioned the administration about potential trouble in the city.

Mahtab, a seven-time MP who was re-elected on a BJP ticket, said he had flagged concerns about the release of certain people from jail with a record of 'disturbance-creating habits'

"Some people have a habit of creating disturbances. They should have been identified. I had cautioned the administration earlier that such persons had been released from jail. and some others were provoking them. I shared the information with the administration I received," Mahtab told a local television channel.

Two incidents of violence were reported in Cuttack's Dargha Bazar area between Friday and Sunday, leaving at least 31 people injured, including 10 police personnel. The first clash occurred on the intervening night of Friday and Saturday during the idol immersion procession, leaving six injured.

The second incident took place Sunday evening when police stopped a VHP bike rally from passing through the sensitive area, resulting in stone-pelting. At least 25 people, including eight policemen, were injured in the second incident.

Cuttack DCP Khilari Rishikesh Dnyandeo was injured on both occasions while trying to control the situation.

Mahtab said he believed the Odisha government was taking steps to restore peace.

The government is taking utmost care to maintain peace, and most enlightened citizens have also appealed to both communities," he said.

Meanwhile, Odisha Pradesh

Congress Committee (OPCC) president Bhakta Charan Das, in a post on X, accused the VHP of organising a rally without police permission and inciting

"Cuttack Police Commissioner S Deb Dutta Singh has shared crucial details: Rumours were deliberately spread claiming a death during the violence, which was completely untrue,"

He added, "The VHP organised a bike rally without police permission and when stopped, its members pelted stones at the police. Several officers were seriously injured. Around 25 people were hurt. @DGPOdisha must investigate those planning to create communal tensions in our peaceful state."

"Why were our brave police officers and innocent people attacked by RSS and VHP goons in Cuttack? Why do they want to create unrest in our peaceful state? We will not let Odisha become Gujarat or Uttar Pradesh," he alleged. Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan said prohibitory orders, including a 36-hour-long curfew, were imposed to bring the situation under control.

"We will not let Cuttack's natural lifestyle be disturbed. Such incidents will not be repeated. The situation will return to

normal soon," he told reporters. Cuttack Mayor Subhash Singh said the law-and-order situation was under control and urged people to cooperate with the administration.

"False propaganda is being spread on social media. I appeal to all residents to help maintain peace," he said. Congress MLA from Barabati-Cuttack, Sofia Firdous, condemned the violence and demanded strict action.

"The administration must identify the troublemakers and ensure justice. Cuttack's tradition of 'Bhaichara' (brotherhood) must be preserved, she said.

Bhubaneswar, Oct 6: The Centre of Indian Trade Unions (CITU) Khurda district committee Monday staged a protest rally and demonstration at Master Canteen Square, opposing the state government's recent move to extend labourers' daily working hours from eight to ten.

Leaders including Suresh Panigrahi, Pradeepta Nayak, Pushpa Das, Ramesh Jena, Satyananda Behera, and Shailesh Baliyarsingh took part in the protest.

The state government's decision to amend the Factories Act, 1948, and the Odisha Shops & Commercial Establishments Act, 1956, permitting women to work night shifts, has faced strong criticism from trade unions, which called it a violation of labour rights and international conventions.

Hundreds of workers from different sectors joined the protest, alongside representa-

government's anti-worker, pro-corporate policies. They alleged that the move prioritised industrialists and corporate interests over workers' welfare.

"The government has taken this undemocratic step to appease corporate houses and boost their profits. If the decision is not reversed, a massive state-wide agitation will follow," the leaders warned.

They also criticised the government for bypassing discussion in the recently concluded state Assembly session, noting that the decision was approved in a Cabinet meeting held shortly after the Prime Minister's visit to Odisha.

CITU leaders pointed out that the ILO Convention of 1919 sets the global standard of an eight-hour workday and a 48-hour workweek, designed to safeguard workers from exploitation and overwork. They emphasised that extending daily working hours undermines these internationally recognised protections and threatens the health, safety, and well-being of labourers.

The union announced plans to intensify the agitation across all districts and industrial hubs in the state, mobilising workers from both organised and unorganised sectors, including women, construction labourers, and MSME employees. Protesters also warned of continuous strikes and larger state-wide demonstrations if their demands were not addressed.

Gambusia fish in IG Park for mosquito control

These fish, which feed on mosquito larvae, are being used as a natural measure to curb mosquito breeding in stagnant water.

"Earlier, Gambusia fish were released in the drains of Laxmi Sagar Chintamanishwar, behind Ramadevi Women's University, Saheed Nagar,

This initiative is part of a larger anti-dengue drive launched by the BMC amid growing concerns over rising infections. Since January 2025. Bhubaneswar has reported more than 200 dengue cases, with areas like Patia, Prasanti Vihar, Salia Sahi, Sikharchandi, and Nayapalli declared as dengue hotspots.

Anu Garg reviews progress of 3 key irrigation projects

Bhubaneswar, Oct 6: Development Commissioner-cum-Additional Chief Secretary Anu Garg reviewed the progress of Kanupur, Subarnarekha, and Anandpur irrigation projects at a meeting held in the conference hall of Water Resources department Monday.

During the review, it was revealed that the head works of the Kanupur irrigation project are nearing completion, with only the depletion sluice and erection of certain gates pending due to the early onset of monsoon. The main canal has achieved 94 per cent completion, while the distribution system has reached 75 per cent progress. The project is expect-

ed to provide Rabi irrigation for 12,000 hectares in the upcoming season. The Subarnarekha irrigation project has also shown substantial advancement, with Phase-I fully completed and Phase-II progressing steadily.

Similarly, the Anandpur irrigation project is advancing well. The link canal has been completed, while the Baitarani right bank canal and Salandi left main canal are on the verge of completion. An ayacut of 12,000 hectares has already been developed, with the remaining distribution systems under active execution.

Senior officials from Water Resources department attended the meeting and presented detailed progress reports on each project.

Irrigation boost for 33,968 ha in Tatiguda area of Malkangiri

Bhubaneswar, Oct 6: In a major stride towards improving rural infrastructure and agricultural sustainability, the Odisha Water Resources department has successfully provided irrigation facilities to 33,968 hectares of land in the Tatiguda area of Malkangiri block under the Rural Infrastructure Development Fund (RIDF).

This achievement was made possible through the construction of field canals under the Sevanchal (Command Area) Division-7 for the 2-R-outlet of the left bank canal. The development includes 15 hydraulic structures and a 600-meter RCC lined field canal system, significantly reducing water losses and ensuring efficient

Nila Gagan Pani Panchayat, has not only enabled timely irrigation for paddy in the Kharif season but also facilitated multiple cropping. 

Birds share a common call against brood parasites

anguage enables humans to connect, share ideas, and coordinate complex tasks. The ability to communicate abstract concepts through learned sounds is often seen as a defining human trait. While most animal calls are instinctive, recent studies have revealed that species such as birds, chimpanzees, dolphins, and elephants can also associate specific sounds with particular meanings.

A new study published in Nature Ecology and Evolution offers fresh insight into how such communication systems may have evolved. Researchers describe the first known animal vocalisation that combines both instinctive and learned features — something Charles Darwin predicted over 150 years ago as a possible step



toward the development of language-like communication.

A unique call to a unique threat
Among birds, brood parasites
such as cuckoos pose a special
kind of danger. These birds lay
their eggs in the nests of other
species, leaving the unsuspecting hosts to incubate and raise
their young. The cost is high, as

the newly-hatched cuckoo often ejects the host's chicks from the nest to monopolise care.

In Australia, researchers studying the superb fairy-wren discovered that the species has evolved a distinctive alarm call whenever it spots a cuckoo. Other fairy-wrens, upon hearing the call, rush to mob and drive away the intruder.

Surprisingly, scientists also noticed that several unrelated bird species — and even those in faraway countries like China, India, and Sweden — were making a remarkably similar call aimed only at cuckoos.

A global pattern of communication

To test whether this phenomenon was widespread, scientists examined online wildlife recordings and identified 21 bird species that produce this same type of call towards their brood parasites. Some were closely related, while others had diverged from a common ancestor more than 50 million years ago and now live on different continents.

The findings suggest this call doesn't just alert members of a single species but helps coordi-

Interestingly, birds that have
never encountered a cuckoo do
not produce the call, but they

This rare mix of innate reaction and learned behaviour may represent an evolutionary bridge between simple animal communication and the complex language systems humans use today.

15 arrested as interstate gun, drug smuggling gang busted

5 pistols, 20 rounds of ammunition and 1,500 bottles of cough syrup were seized



Bargarh, Oct 6: In a major success, Bargarh district police busted an interstate criminal gang involved in gun running and drug trafficking and arrested 15 accused, including three from Chhattisgarh.

Chinese H-1B

hen US President Donald Trump's administration in a new fiat made the coveted H-1B visa available to foreigners at a prohibitive cost, it virtually spelt doom for hi-tech professionals and scientists from India as also a few other countries who desired it most for high paying jobs in America. In fact, 70 per cent of the visas were obtained by Indian professionals. There was speculation then that Europe could be the alternative destination, even though the rising intolerance towards migrants in many of these countries may dampen job-seekers' enthusiasm. Japan and China looked like probable destinations. But what appeared to be a possibility China seems determined to make it a certainty by officially launching its K Visas for work in the STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) fields. When the new visa was first announced in August, it hardly attracted global attention. Days after Trump's mad rush to stop Indian professionals from getting jobs in the US, the K Visa has shot into limelight.

Much of the scope of that visa is still unclear as it remains hazy whether it will actually allow foreigners to work in China or whether it just allows them easier access into the country. But it has already generated interest in India and also adverse reactions from tens of thousands of users on Chinese social media who have openly criticised the programme. Students in China who aspire after careers in STEM fields fear whether benefits extended to foreigners would trigger tough competition in a sluggish job market. It may be because China has traditionally not been a major immigration destination for foreign professionals. Netizens in China have started crying foul against the new visa with pleas that China has innumerable bachelor's degree holders, apart from a sizable number of master's and doctoral degree holders for which there is already a surplus of domestic talent. In such a situation, they angrily ask why the authorities are now trying to bring in foreign college graduates and professionals with work experience in the US and Europe. They have also questioned whether the authorities would be able to bring in higher standard of talent by issuing this new visa. At the same time to put off foreign jobseekers, they are wondering whether foreigners would be able to adapt to life on the mainland, citing language barriers and China's tightly controlled political system. What is even worse is that many of the comments had xenophobic and racist implications targeted specifically at Indian

The backlash has been so intense that state media outlets have come out to assuage the fears. The Global Times in a recent article supported the new scheme terming it as an opportunity "for the world to see a more open and confident China in its new era." The People's Daily went even further and issued a veiled warning to the Chinese public stating "misrepresenting the K Visa will only mislead the public." Sounding optimistic, it said as China steps onto the global stage, it is hungrier for talent than ever before.

However, there are many unanswered questions for foreign professionals themselves. For example, there is no clarity as yet on whether they will find that space for creativity and innovation in China as was offered in the US. Creativity and innovation flourish in an open and liberal climate as is seen in the West, especially the US and European nations. Given China's track record, this is unlikely to be experienced

Language would certainly be a stumbling block. Many researchers and academics who have left the US for China in recent years are ethnic Chinese and fluent in Mandarin. Hence, they did not have to face the language or racism problem. However for foreign talent, especially Indians, communication with Chinese colleagues may prove to be a great hurdle. The Chinese are a cold and non cooperative bunch of people who may just refuse to talk to foreign immigrants that do not speak their language. This is a concern that both employers and employees will need to address.

The bigger issue is whether foreign science and tech professionals $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right)$ can adjust themselves to China's tightly controlled political environment. Casual behaviour and talk may not seem that casually acceptable

Whatever the future may show, China seems to be enjoying its position as a new global messiah taking advantage of Trump's insular doctrine. Whether China would truly be a benefactor or whether it is having a sadistic pleasure at India's plight at the hands of Trump is a million dollar question.

WHITHER LABOUR RIGHTS

ndia's IT services sector has been a star performer. It has turned raw engineers into seasoned professionals and seized contracts and opportunities across the globe. On the other hand, India's small and medium enterprises (SME) sector is the silent backbone of the economy. If IT is about a fewer number of firms with millions of employees, the SME sector is all about millions of firms each with a smaller number of workers. Together, they offer two lenses on India's growth story. Both contribute to making India the fourth largest economy in the world -- a point of fact that has been fashioned into a matter of pride.

But this happy story has a twist to it. Seen through the lens of layoffs that are now in the news. the big and the small both offer a picture that is less pretty, and in part maybe downright ugly.

In the IT services sector, where the workforce is being trimmed, regulators can no longer ignore the allegations of forced resignations, downright threats and abuse of due process. Not all that is being alleged is true, but equally the complaints are not without substance. Protests and social turmoil have come faster than expected.

If this is one side of an India story that takes a stand against layoffs, there is a lesser-known story of workers who want to be laid off and freed of their horrible work burdens but are not allowed to go home.

Last week, 13 migrant work ers from Jharkhand's East Singhbhum district, harassed by their employers, were allowed to leave for home only after an intervention from the state government. PTI reported that a company in Morbi district of Gujarat denied them food and other facilities and refused salaries when they wanted to leave. The 13 had to be "rescued" after the Jharkhand

government's labour department intervened, not only to let them return home but also to get their dues - a total of Rs 68,000 for the 13 workers. The company is now reported to be under investigation in Gujarat.

Yet, this is not the first time that migrant workers, notably tribals seeking employment away from home, are forced to work virtually as bonded labour. News reports abound of how companies in small units have brought in labour and exploited them for work at low wages and with little regard for their health, working conditions or even the willingness to serve.

Forced exits in the IT sector and forced work in smaller shops and factories are two worlds that make one story of India's growth trajectory. Both contribute to growth but also raise questions on work standards and serve to reinforce the traditional Indian suspicion of the private sector. This is what the Economic Survey of India of 2017 cited as "distinctly antimarket beliefs" in India, even when compared to other countries with similar low per capita GDP.

This antimarket sentiment limits trust in the private sector and sets political limits to the agenda of privatisation and liber-

alisation. Crony capitalism and the rise of a favoured few place further burdens on the trust capital, eroding the faith of the large mass of people in the capacity of the private sector to do good for people and society while doing well for shareholders.

When companies see they can get away with violation of labour laws or erode the dignity of workers or do worse with regard to their workforce, more violations of the kind will follow. The only antidote is to put down illegality with an iron hand, to impose exemplary costs on businesses that have little regard for people and to send the message that violations will be met with firm and swift action. This can be the most pro-market reform that India needs. Such a resolve will help the citizenry see that while the private sector is all powerful given its resources, it will be held to the same standards of law as ordinary workers.

If a sacking is masked as a resignation, as is being alleged in the case of IT layoffs, then this is a serious violation of the laws of the land. If people are brought from remote areas through brokers and worked as slave labour, as alleged in the case of a manufacturing unit in Gujarat, the hirers ought

life and sent to jail. Yet, the slide to today has come from a slippery slope where labour rights have been eroded bit by bit in the name of liberalisation, and worker contractisation has reached a new level. A paper in the Indian Council for Research on International Economic Relations noted: "Firms appear to be using contract workers to their strategic advantage against unionized directly hired workers to keep their bargaining power and wage demand in check.'

In the IT services sector for example, it is not uncommon to make software engineers work for more than eight hours a day while paying them only for eight. This is brutal and illegal but has been normalised. Just as working time less than the required is recorded and accounted, time more than usual needs to be recorded and paid for. But such is the state of affairs that this simple point of morality has been ignored by companies that file their accounts in compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards, or IFRS.

The trouble is not with removing people - it is with a work culture that in India has led to a top-down approach of a commander-in-chief in the role of a CEO and a rigid hierarchy at a time worker unions have been robbed of their clout. Managements work without meaningful oversight that comes from the shop floor.

Unions were seen as stumbling blocks to growth and vibrancy. Regulation is seen as limiting business. But without active and vibrant unions, and with a pliant officialdom ready to please business, business may be less vibrant and secure than ever.

lament their waning influence across the Sahel – France handed over its last base in Chad in January, effectively ending its military presence in the region – they cling to an outdated narrative. The Sahel is no longer a chessboard on which the struggles between the West and Russia play out. More importantly, it is now the site of a contest between Algeria and Morocco, two North African powers vying for strategic dominance.

While the world watches Russia's Africa Corps, the Wagner Group's successor, expand its footprint in the Sahel, it overlooks the more permanent and transformative presence of Algeria and Morocco. For these economies, with a combined GDP of over \$418 billion, the region is not a distant frontier for proxy battles; rather, it is an important trade corridor and key source of minerals, making it critical to their national and economic security.

For decades, the Sahel's orientation was a foregone conclusion. shaped by its postcolonial ties to France and the security architecture of the US-led global war on terror. But that era is over. The widespread frustration with Western intervention has resulted in eight military coups across

West and Central Africa since 2020. Algeria and Morocco have stepped into the resulting power vacuum, each with a distinct vision for bringing the region into its economic orbit.

The most visible battle concerns trade. In 2023, Morocco launched its Atlantic Initiative. which will offer landlocked Sahel countries a secure and efficient gateway to global markets through the planned deep-water port of Dakhla in the disputed Western Sahara. Algeria, for its part, has al-

most completed the Trans-Saharan Highway, which will stretch nearly 5,000 km from Algiers to Lagos, Nigeria, passing through Niger. The road has been decades in the making, as part of a larger strategy to connect Algeria with West Africa, boost its non-oil exports, and make it the region's preeminent power broker. It will also establish Algeria as the main gateway between Europe and the massive West African market and give landlocked African countries a direct route to the sea.

The rivalry between Algeria and Morocco is not just about asphalt and shipping lanes. It is also a race to secure the Sahel's vast mineral wealth, which will be critical for both economic diversification and decarbon-

ization. For example, Niger is the world's seventh-largest producer of uranium, Mali is Africa's third-largest producer of gold, and Burkina Faso has large deposits of manganese. For Morocco, which has a large mining sector and holds 70% of the world's phosphate reserves securing access to these minerals is a top strategic priority.

Both countries are also hoping to play a central role in the emerging clean-energy economy by developing green hydrogen. By 2030, Morocco aims to generate 52% of its electricity from renewables, supporting its green-hydrogen plans. Algeria, with vast solar potential estimated at 180 terawatt-hours per year, is pursuing a strategy to meet up to 10% of Europe's green-hydrogen demand by 2040. The country plans to export it through the "SoutH2 Corridor" pipeline project, which will connect Algeria and Tunisia to Italy, Austria, and Germany. Whoever controls the Sahel - which also holds huge untapped solar potential - could gain significant leverage over Europe's green transition.

To be sure, Algeria and Morocco are not the only countries competing for economic and security influence in the Sahel. The UAE, Saudi Arabia, and other Gulf

countries are also investing in ports, agriculture, and telecommunications across the region Their involvement may be driven more by a desire to project global power than by the immediate strategic interests that motivate their North African counterparts, but it will nonetheless shape the region's future.

Where does that leave Europe and the US? For too long, both have viewed the Sahel as a region beset by terrorism and at risk of capture by other great powers, leading to major policy blunders that have alienat ed local populations and created the very instability that their interventions were meant to prevent. To remain relevant, Western governments must shift their focus: The Sahel's future stability and alignment will be determined not by the number of foreign troops on the ground, but by the success of the economic visions offered by its North African neighbours. Only by engaging with the complexities of this new reality can the West forge a sustainable and effective policy for one of the world's most critical regions.

Fatal prescription

Sir, This refers to the editorial "Toxic Syrup," Orissa Post, October 6. The death of 12 children in Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan from a deadly toxin in cough syrups has exposed the alarming gaps in India's drug regulation. In Madhya Pradesh, the syrup Coldrif contained 48% diethylene glycol (DEG) — 480 times the permissible limit. This comes after WHO alerts in 2023 linked Indian-made syrups to child deaths in Gambia and Uzbekistan. Instead of acknowledging systemic lapses, authorities then blamed foreign storage conditions. The current tragedy proves the rot lies within. Regulatory and communication failures worsened the crisis. Even as biopsies pointed to DEG poisoning, officials prematurely claimed no toxins were found in samples — based on incomplete tests — misleading parents and delaying action. Only after Tamil Nadu's testing confirmed DEG did states act to ban the syrup. The fact that Sresan Pharma, Coldrif's maker, operated for two decades without detection raises grave questions about inspection frequency and accountability. A toxin level this high isn't accidental contamination — it's industrial negligence.

Kerala introduces Digital University Amendment Bill

Thiruvananthapuram, Oct 6: The Kerala government on Monday introduced a Bill in the Assembly to amend the 2021 State Digital Sciences, Innovation and Technology Act.

The proposed amendments relate to the composition of the search committee for appointing vice-chancellors and the age limit for the post.

Law Minister P Rajeev presented the 'Kerala University of Digital Sciences, Innovation and Technology (Amendment) Bill, 2025', in the House on behalf of Chief Minister Pinaravi Vijayan.

"The amendment is intended to carry out the appointment of vice-chancellors in accordance with the regulations of the University Grants Commission (UGC)," Rajeev said.

He noted that state law clearly specifies how a search and selection committee must be constituted, in line with UGC

In its most recent verdict, the Supreme Court had affirmed the state government's authority regarding the appointment of university vice-chancellors.

"The apex court has specifically entrusted the Higher Ed-

selection of vice-chancellors for technical and digital universities," Rajeev added.

He also stated that the Supreme Court had empowered the state government to decide the priority order of the list provided by the search committee, 'which in itself demonstrates the power of the state.

The minister said the amendment specifies the members of the search committee and provides that the chancellor shall appoint the vice-chancellor on the recommendation of the search-cum-selection committee constituted by the government through notification.

Citing further provisions, Rajeev said the committee should be constituted at least three months before the anticipated vacancy of the vice-chancellor's

"The committee shall, within two months of its constitution. prepare a panel of three names for the appointment of the vice-chancellor, either unanimously or by a simple majority, and submit it to the chancellor. The chancellor shall appoint a person from the panel so submitted," he said.

The minister added, "The term of office of the vice-chancellor shall be four years from the date of appointment or until attaining the age of seventy years, whichever is earlier."

The Bill was referred to the subject committee amid uproar from the opposition in

Lucknow, Oct 6: In a major step towards humane and effective street dog population management, the Lucknow Municipal Corporation and Humane World for Animals India (formerly called Humane Society International India) have signed a Memorandum of Understand ing to run a dedicated training center for Animal Birth Control programs in Jarhara, Lucknow,

This first-of-its-kind center in Lucknow will serve as a training hub for veterinarians, para-veterinarians, animal handlers and animal welfare organizations across India, engaged in or preparing to begin street dog work.

While there are existing programs that offer training focused on surgical aspects of ABC, this will be the first in the country to comprehensively cover all aspects of ABC.

The 15-day training modules will integrate both theoretical and hands-on modules, covering key areas such as humane dog catching, pre-operative assessments, anesthesia protocols, sterilization techniques, post-operative care, kennel management, data recording and reporting, supervision, legal compliance and community

engagement strategies. In light of the Supreme Court's August 2025 ruling that reinforced the importance of ABC programs as part of a holistic approach, the new

center represents a timely and much-needed contribution. It will directly strengthen efforts to build capacity, promote humane practices and ensure that ABC programs across India are conducted in a lawful, ethical, effective and standardized manner in line with India's Animal Birth Control Rules, 2023 and global standards.

Under the terms of the threeyear MoU, Humane World for Animals India will design and deliver the training programs through expert-led modules while LMC will provide infrastructure, vehicles and utilities.

Piyush Patel, director of Humane World for Animals India's companion animals and engagement team, said: "Animal Birth Control is at the heart of safely and sustainably managing street dog populations across India, for the benefit of people and the dogs they live alongside. The Lucknow center will provide the hands-on, practical training needed not just in performing the sterilization surgeries but in doing this work humanely and to a high standard. We hope this becomes a space where teams from across the country can learn, share and take new skills back to their towns and cities to promote high quality ABC and foster harmonious coexistence

Abhinav Verma, animal welfare officer, LMC, said"This training center reflects our commitment to humane, effective and well-coordinated street dog management in Lucknow. It will help build skilled professionals and ensure ABC programs are carried out to the

Nitish inaugurates Patna Metro corridor

Deputy CMs Samrat Choudhary and Vijay Kumar Singh, along with cabinet colleagues and senior bureaucrats, took a ride on the metro after the inauguration.

Police seize 1,200 kg of banned firecrackers

New Delhi: Ahead of the festive season, the Delhi Police has seized more than 1,200 kilograms of banned firecrackers in multiple operations conducted across the city and arrested six people in the case, an official said Monday. According to the police, separate raids carried out by the Shahdara district led to the seizure of 746 kg of firecrackers, over 124 kgs were recovered in a raid in Ashok Nagar while 394 kg were recovered by the crime branch. "A total of six persons have been apprehended in connection with the seizures," the officer said. The Delhi Police has intensified the enforcement drive against the illegal sale, storage and transportation of banned firecrackers, which pose serious risks to public safety and violate pollution control measures.

6 killed as fire ravages ICU of Jaipur's hospital

Anguished relatives held a brief protest and alleged that authorities were negligent, ignoring warnings and fleeing instead of rescuing the ailing and sick

Jaipur, Oct 6: A massive fire blazed through the neuro ICU of Jaipur's state-run Sawai Man Singh (SMS) Hospital in the dead of the night, killing six patients on critical care support, officials said Mon-

Eleven patients were being treated in the ICU at the time. The fire, which erupted in the storage area around midnight, is suspected to have been caused by a short circuit. The flames spread fast and rescuers could pull out only five patients. According to a hospital of-

ficial, six people, two women and four men, died, and five are undergoing treatment. Fourteen other patients were admitted to a different ICU. They all were rescued in time.

The government announced ₹10 lakh in compensation to the next of the kin of the de-

It also removed SMS hospital superintendent Dr Sushil Bhati and Trauma Centre incharge Dr Anurag Dhakad from their posts. The two were replaced by Dr Mrinal Joshi and Dr BL Yadav.

The tender of the fire safety agency was cancelled, and legal proceedings were underway against the company, an official said.

Walls blackened with smoke and soot, equipment twisted out of shape in the heat, and shattered glass told the tale of the horrors that unfolded



when the fire broke out

Expressing grief over the tragedy, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said in an X post in Hindi, "The loss of lives due to a fire tragedy at a hospital in Jaipur, Rajasthan, is deeply saddening. Condolences to those who have lost their loved ones. May the injured recover soon.'

Union Home Minister Amit Shah termed the incident tragic. "The local administration is taking every possible step for the safety of patients, their treatment, and the care of those affected," he said on X.

The state government has formed a high-level committee to probe the incident.

SMS Hospital is Rajasthan's biggest government health facility, treating patients from across the state and elsewhere.

Anguished relatives held a brief protest and alleged that authorities were negligent, ignoring warnings and fleeing instead of rescuing the ailing and sick.

Among them was Rukmini's

son Joginder. "My mother was recovering and was supposed to be fine. But this disaster happened. When the smoke started, there were 15 to 16 people in the

ward. People were trying to evacuate their own patients, he said.

"No one helped my mother. My elder brother grabbed a torch from the hospital staff, found our mother, and brought her out. No one went to help her. I could not save her and could not do anything," he told reporters.

The trauma centre building is in front of the main hospital building on busy Tonk Road.

Hospital staff and attendants evacuated patients with some wheeling beds outside the building. Firefighters brought the fire under control in around two hours, an official said.

Chief Minister Bhajanlal Sharma, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Jogaram Patel, and Minister of State for Home Jawahar Singh Bedham were among those who visited the trauma centre to take stock of the situation.

When Patel and Bedham reached the spot, relatives of some patients told them that the staff had ignored early warning and fled when the fire erupted.

They also claimed that the hospital staff could not provide updates on the patients condition.

Bhopal/Thiruvananthapuram, Oct 6: Several states ramped up actions Monday to halt the consumption and supply of Coldrif cough syrup following 14 fatalities of children linked to the medicine in Madhya Pradesh, where the government suspended three officials and transferred the drug controller.

These deaths due to suspected renal failure were reported from Chhindwara in Madhya Pradesh in a month.

The cough syrup, manufactured in Tamil Nadu, was found to be dangerously adulterated with the highly poisonous substance Diethylene Glycol (DEG).

The tragic deaths triggered a national health alert, leading to suspensions of officials in Madhya Pradesh, arrests, nationwide stock confiscations, and immediate, stringent changes to drug prescription guidelines in states like Kerala and Kar-

The Kerala Health Department, under Minister Veena George, ordered that no medicines should be given to children under 12 without a doctor's

The Karnataka Health Department issued an advisory to healthcare institutions not to prescribe or dispense cough and cold syrups to children be-



low the age of two.

According to medical experts, DEG is a highly toxic industrial chemical and is used as a cheaper, yet highly toxic, substitute for legitimate pharmaceutical solvents like propylene glycol (PG) or glycerin (also called glycerol). Manufacturers fraudulently or accidentally substitute the safe ingredient for the toxic one to cut costs, especially in cough syrups.

Officials confirmed that samples of the medicine, manufactured by Sresan Pharmaceutical, Kancheepuram (Tamil Nadu), contained over 48 per cent of DEG. Following the tragedy, Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav ordered a major overhaul of the state's drug administration and suspended two drug inspectors, Gaurav Sharma and Sharad Kumar Jain. and Deputy Director, Shobhit Costa, of the food and drug administration. The state Drug Controller, Dinesh Maurya, was transferred after police registered an FIR and arrested Dr Praveen Soni of Chhindwara for alleged negligence. A case was also registered against the Tamil Nadu-based Coldrif syrup manufacturing company.

The sale of the syrup has been banned statewide, with the chief minister directing a massive campaign to confiscate all remaining stocks from shops and recover the medicine from families in Chhindwara and surrounding districts.

Yadav also stressed that combination drugs must not be prescribed to children under four years of age, citing a legal provision, and ordered prosecution for doctors who violate this.

The Congress, CPI, CPI(M), NCP-SP, Shiv Sena (UBT), DMK and other parties were unanimous in condemning the attack on the CJI.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke to Justice Gavai and said the attack on him has angered every Indian. "There is no place for such reprehensible acts in our society. It is utterly condemnable," Modi said, appreciating the calm displayed

slammed the prime minister earlier, questioning his silence hours after the incident, which it said was shameful. The Opposition party also termed the incident a shocking breach of decorum and a dangerous new low in India's democratic history, claiming it to be an assault on the judiciary and the Constitution.

Terming it an open assault on the very foundation of justice and the rule of law, the party said this is not merely an attack on one individual.

"It is the outcome of a sus-

Showers drench north India, fresh snowfall in J&K Bhunter, Kangra, Palampur,

New Delhi, Oct 6: Rain lashed parts of Delhi, Haryana, Punjab, and Rajasthan, while fresh snowfall was reported in the higher reaches of Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir, causing the mercury to drop in several northern states Monday.

In West Bengal, the death toll in Darjeeling landslides rose to 28 Monday with six people still missing, as rescue teams battled rising waters across the hills. The disaster has also ignited a fierce political confrontation between the ruling TMC and the Opposition BJP.

With over 300 mm of rain in 12 hours, the landslides ravaged Darjeeling, Jalpaiguri and Kalimpong districts, leaving thousands of tourists stranded and hundreds homeless as several hill slopes caved in.

A vellow alert was issued for parts of Maharashtra's Vidarbha region, signalling light to moderate showers with thunderstorms and lightning.

In Jammu and Kashmir, light to moderate rainfall was witnessed in the plains of Kashmir and snowfall was reported from Sinthan Top in Anantnag district, Affarwat in Gulmarg, Zojila Pass, Bangus in Kupwara, Razdan Pass in Gurez valley, and other higher-altitude areas, officials said. The day temperature in the

valley dipped by nearly 10 degrees Celsius, with Srinagar recording a maximum of around 11 degrees Celsius Monday, compared to 22.6 degrees recorded a day earlier. The meteorological office has forecast continued wet weather for the next 24 hours in the valley.

Similarly, in Himachal Pradesh, the minimum and



maximum temperatures witnessed a significant drop as the state received snowfall for the second day in a row. Keylong in tribal Lahaul and Spiti recorded a low of 0.1 degree Celsius.

Intermittent showers lashed parts of the state, with Guler receiving 42 mm of rain since Sunday evening, according to officials. Thunderstorms were witnessed in Jot, Sundernagar,

and Shimla, while gusty winds with speeds ranging between 41 and 57 kmph swept Hamirpur, Narkanda, Kufri, Bajaura, Reckong Peo, Tabo, and Kotkhai. Shimla MeT Office Director

Kuldeep Srivastav said a strong active western disturbance would impact the state for the next two days, with the possibility of heavy rains in Kangra and Chamba districts and snow in Lahaul and Spiti districts.

Meanwhile, rainfall provided relief to Delhi-NCR from the hot and humid conditions that had persisted over the last several days in the region. The city recorded a minimum temperature of 20.6 degrees Celsius, two notches below the season's average.

In Punjab, places like Mohali, Amritsar, Hoshiarpur, Pathankot, Ferozepur, Phagwara, Kapurthala, Jalandhar, Bathinda,

Rupnagar, and Ludhiana re-



4 Indians killed in **Italy road accident**

London: Four Indian nationals were killed in a road accident in southern Italy's Matera city, according to the Indian Embassy in Rome. The victims were in a seven-seater Renault Scenic with six other people. which collided with a truck in the municipality of Scanzano Jonico in Matera city on the Agri Valley on Saturday, Italian news agency ANSA reported on Sunday, It identified the victims as Kumar Manoi, 34, Singh Surjit, 33, Singh Harwinder, 31, and Singh Jaskaran, 20, "The Embassy of India deeply condoles the tragic death of four Indian nationals in a road accident in Matera in southern Italy," the Indian embassy posted on social media.

Incumbent to remain ISI DG

"Lt Gen Asim Malik is continuing his services in his present appointment," security sources told The Express Tribune newspaper. Lt Gen Malik, who also serves as the national security advisor (NSA), was earlier due to retire later this year, reported the paper. However, the exact date of his retirement was not given. It also did not specify if his army service would be extended, which the government can do, or he would continue in the present role after formal retirement. He was appointed the head of the ISI in September 2024, replacing Lt Gen Nadeem Anjum.

Egypt: Pharaonic painting vanishes

Cairo: Egyptian antiquities officials on Sunday said a Pharaonic painting has disappeared from the famed Saggara necropolis just outside of Cairo, becoming the latest artifact to disappear in a country known for its rich history. Mohamed Ismail, secretary-general of the Supreme Council of Antiquities. said the limestone painting was in the tomb of Khentika in the Saggara necropolis. The mastaba tomb, which housed the painting, was found in the 1950s, and hasn't opened since 2019, he said in a statement. It dates back to the sixth dynasty of the ancient Old Kingdom - a period spanning roughly from around 2700 BC to 2200 BC.

French govt collapses in 14 hrs 1 killed, 137 rescued after blizzard in Everest

Prime Minister Sebastien Lecornu's administration becomes the shortest-lived in modern French history

Paris, Oct 6: France's new Prime Minister Sebastien Lecornu and his government resigned Monday, hours after Lecornu announced his cabinet line-up, making it the shortest-lived administration in modern French history and deepening the country's political crisis.

The unexpected resignation came after allies and foes alike threatened to topple the new government, with Lecornu saving that meant he could not do his job. The announcement drove stocks and the euro

Opposition parties immediately urged President Emmanuel Macron to resign, or call a snap parliamentary election. saying there was no other way out of the crisis.

Lecornu, who was Macron's fifth prime minister in two years, stayed in the job for only 27 days. His government lasted just 14 hours, highlighting divisions in the French parliament as the euro zone's second-largest economy struggles to put its finances in order.

French politics has been increasingly unstable since Ma-



cron's re-election in 2022 for want of any party or grouping holding a parliamentary majority. Macron's decision to call a snap parliamentary election last year deepened the crisis by producing an even more fragmented parliament.

The centrist president could now call new snap elections, resign or try to appoint yet another prime minister - who could be a politician or a technocrat. In past months, Macron, whose mandate runs until May 2027, has repeatedly ruled out stepping down or calling elections. He is yet to react publicly to Lecornu's resignation.

BFM TV showed footage of Macron walking by the Seine, cutting a lonely figure.

In the opposition, many rushed to ask for Macron to call new snap parliamentary

cron must go. David Lisnard, of the conservative Republicans, was also among those who called on Macron to leave.

Lecornu's choice of ministers has been criticised across the political spectrum, particularly his decision to bring back former Finance Minister Bruno Le Maire to serve at the defence ministry, with critics saying that under his watch, France's public deficit soared

Lecornu's main task would have been to pass a budget as France is faced with a massive debt crisis. At the end of the first quarter of 2025, France's

public debt stood at 3.346 tril lion euros (USD 3.9 trillion), or 114 per cent of GDP. Debt servicing remains a major budget item, accounting for around 7 per cent of state spending.

Other key positions remained largely unchanged from the previous cabinet, with conservative Bruno Retailleau staying on as interior minister in charge of policing and internal security, Jean-Noel Barrot remaining as foreign minister and Gérald Darmanin keeping the justice ministry.

Retailleau, the head of the conservative Republicans party, said he did not feel responsible for Lecornu's fall despite lashing out at the composition of the new government. Retailleau blamed Lecornu for not letting him know Le Maire would be part of the government. "It's a matter of trust," he told TF1 broadcaster. "You promise a break and end up with returning horses. This government embodied all the conditions to be censured.

Seeking consensus at the National Assembly, Lecornu consulted with all political forces and trade unions before forming his Cabinet. He also vowed that he would not employ a special constitutional power his predecessors had used to force budgets through Parliament without a vote and would instead seek compromise with lawmakers from the left

Beijing, Oct 6: One hiker was killed while 137 others, stranded after a blizzard on the Tibetan slopes of Mt Everest, were rescued, local Chinese officials said Monday. They said the search is on for missing climbers

A 41-year-old male hiker died from hypothermia and acute altitude sickness, state-run Xinhua news agency reported, quoting local officials.

So far, 137 hikers, stranded due to continuous snowfall in northwest Qinghai Province, had been relocated and were in stable condition, the report said. Over 100 hiking enthusiasts headed toward the Laohugou region of Menyuan Hui Autonomous County in Haibei Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture during the current eightday national holidays, which started on October 1.

The Laohugou region, in the Qilian Mountains, featuring an average altitude exceeding 4.000 meters and complex terrain, experienced continuous snowfall during the holiday period.

Over 300 search personnel more than 10 teams employing horses and two medium-sized drones, have been mobilised to conduct thorough searches in seeking to ensure the safety of stranded hikers. Search and rescue efforts continue as some hikers remain missing.

Earlier, the state-run CCTV reported that 350 were rescued while 200 remained missing.

A BBC report Sunday said that over 1,000 hikers were stuck in the slopes of Mt Everest, the world's highest peak, in the Karma Valley on the Chi nese side of the mountain.

A woman in the southern Chinese city of Shenzhen whose husband went for a trek in the Tibetan mountains, said she got a satellite call from him asking for help. His group was stranded in heavy snow at Oga Campsite in the Karma Valley

The woman, who preferred to be anonymous, immediately called local county police, who told her that some hikers had already contacted them and that they were sending

Negotiators gather for Gaza peace talks freeing hostages, part of the U.S.

Sharm El-Sheikh, Oct 6: Officials from Israel and Hamas were in an Egyptian resort Monday to launch talks that the US hopes will bring a halt to the war in Gaza and a release of hostages, despite contentious issues such as disarmament of the Palestinian militant group.

The negotiations on President Donald Trump's plan were set to begin on the eve of the second anniversary of the Hamas attack on Israel that triggered the war, when fighters killed 1,200 people and took 251 hostages, the deadliest day for Jews since the Holocaust. Israel's retaliatory military campaign has killed more than 67,000 Palestinians and left the majority of 2.2 million Gazans homeless and hungry in the rubble of the enclave destroyed by relentless bombardment.

Two Israeli sources said the Israeli negotiators had arrived in Egypt's Red Sea resort of Sharm el-Sheikh for the talks, focused on

president's 20-point blueprint for ending the conflict. Hamas officials had already arrived earlier in the day. "If there is a deal, then we survive. If there isn't, it is like we have been sentenced to death," said Gharam Mohammad, 20, displaced along with her family in central Gaza.

An official briefed on the nego tiations, speaking on condition of anonymity, said he expected the round of talks kicking off on Monday would not be quick, lasting at least a few days. Prompt agreement is unlikely as the goal is to clinch a comprehensive deal with all details worked out before the ceasefire can begin to be implemented, the official said.

A Palestinian official close to the talks was sceptical about prospects of a breakthrough given deep mutual mistrust, saying Hamas and other Palestinian factions were worried that Israel - led by the most far-right government in its history - might ditch negotiations once it recovered the hostages.

Warsaw, Oct 6: Every five years in the autumnal month of October, people here have a jauntier spring in their step. It's when the strains of the piano are little louder, a little more evocative and carry that extra whiff of romance - left here to exist in melodic perpetuity by Warsaw's favourite son, Romantic pianist Frederic Chopin.

The 19th edition of the International Frederic Chopin Piano Competition, often considered the Olympics of piano music. began October 2. Divided by nationality and united by Chopin, piano lovers from all over the world are queuing up to imbibe the music and breathe the same air that must have evoked the many moods and tunes in the 19th century legend.

The competition this year is hosting young pianists from China, Japan, Korea, Canada, the US, and Poland among 17 countries. To support them are visitors from as many countries and more for the same reason to listen to the best of the best Chopin players.

The next three weeks will decide the next master pianist on the global stage. The compe-

tition comprises three rounds of five days each - running till October 20. The winners will perform their solo concerts from October 21-23.

The ticket counters for the competition opened on October 1 last year for on ground sale. Australia-based Shoji Mat-

suura's quest to attend the competition began exactly then when he came all the way to Warsaw and lined up outside the ticket counter at 2 am. He had missed out on the previous edition in 2021 due to Covid-19 and the 62-year-old Japanese teacher of languages was tak-

The first Asian participants came for the third edition in 1937, from Japan. And they were quite a sensation, especially since at the time they were wearing traditional Japanese kimonos, which was not something very usual in the streets of Warsaw, he said.



New Delhi: Union Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari Monday said the prices of electric vehicles (EVs) in India are expected to be on par with those of petrol-powered vehicles within the next four to six months. Dark patterns include practices like false urgency alerts, hidden costs added at checkout, subscription traps, and disguised advertisements that manipulate consumer choices.

GOLD SHINES BRIGHT

New Delhi, Oct 6: Gold prices skyrocketed by ₹9,700 to scale a fresh peak of ₹1,30,300 per 10 grams in the national capital Monday, lifted by safe-haven buying in the overseas markets and depreciation in the Indian rupee

According to the All India Sarafa Association, the yellow metal of 99.9 per cent purity had closed at ₹1,20,600 per 10 grams

In the local bullion market, gold of 99.5 per cent purity jumped by ₹2,700 to hit a record high of ₹1,22,700 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes) Monday. It had settled at ₹1,20,000 per 10 grams in the previous market

Traders said the fall in the rupee against the US dollar added to the rally of the precious metal.

"Gold reached a new record high on Monday as investors still prefer bullion despite this record high price. They are anticipating further gains in bullion backed by favourable fundamentals and strong bullish momentum," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst - Commodities at HDFC Securities, said. Gandhi noted that concerns

about a prolonged US government shutdown potentially impacting economic performance are supporting the demand for safe-haven metal.

So far in this year, gold prices have added ₹51,350 or 65.04 per cent, rallying from ₹78,950 per 10 grams December 31, 2024.

Silver prices also witnessed robust gains. The white metal bounced by ₹7,400 to hit a new peak of ₹1,57,400 per kilogram (inclusive of all taxes). It had ended at ₹1,50,000 per kg on GOLD & SILVER



Friday, as per the association. Silver prices have soared by ₹67,700 or 75.47 per cent in the current calendar year,

December 31, 2024. In the international markets. spot gold rose nearly 2 per cent to touch an all-time high of \$3,949.58 per ounce, while silver went up over 1 per cent to hit a high of \$48.75 per ounce.

"Spot gold extended gains and surged above \$3,940 per ounce for the first time ever as the US government shutdown enters its sixth day, following the Senate's failure to pass funding bills on Friday," Kaynat Chainwala, AVP Commodity Research at Kotak Securities, said.

"Gold traded positively with sharp gains to hit a record ₹1.20.000 per 10 grams-mark. as Comex gold extended its rally above USD 3,900 per ounce. The ongoing festive demand and global sentiment-driven rally continue to support prices, while rupee weakness adds domestic strength," Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst - Commodity and Currency at LKP Securities, said.

Silver, too, witnessed gains on the MCX. The white metal futures for December deliv-

Renisha Chainani, Head of Research at Augmont, said gold prices have surged 50 per cent this year, while silver has surged 65 per cent this year in the international markets.

"2025 has been the year of uncertainties - it started with political uncertainty, then tariff uncertainty, geopolitical uncertainty, rate cut uncertainty and now US shutdown uncertainty. All these factors have supported bullion prices to rise phenomenally this year on safe-haven demand," Chainani said

SC agrees to hear Vi plea

New Delhi, Oct 6: The Supreme Court Monday said it will hear Vodafone Idea's (Vi) plea seeking waiver of interest. penalty, and interest on penalty on its adjusted gross revenue (AGR) dues demanded by the Department of Telecommuni cations October 13. Vi, in its application, has

sought to amend its previous petition, which sought the quashing of the Department of Telecommunications' additional AGR demand of ₹9,450 crore for FY19. The amended application now seeks a waiver of interest on the principal amount of AGR dues, penalty, and penalty interest. The telecom company said it had objected to the imposition of a penalty because the non-payment of AGR dues was genuine.

Earlier, September 26, the apex court had transferred the hearing of the Vodafone Idea AGR case to October 6 due to the government's request for more time. During the previous proceedings, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the DoT, had requested additional time to respond to Vodafone Idea's petition, and Vodafone Idea did not oppose the request.

September 19, the Centre had informed the Supreme Court that it did not oppose Vodafone Idea's petition, but insisted that a resolution was necessary because the government itself held a significant stake in the company.

After converting Vodafone Idea's interest liabilities into equity, the government became the largest shareholder with a 49 per cent stake. However, it is not classified as a promoter.

India's passive MF AUM grows six-fold

New Delhi, Oct 6: Assets under management of passive mutual funds in India reached ₹12.2 lakh crore in 2025, marking a 6.4-fold increase since 2019 and a compound annual growth rate of approximately 36 per cent, a report said Monday.

Around 76 per cent of retail mutual fund investors are aware of index funds or ETFs, with 68 per cent holding at least one passive product in 2025, an increase from approximately 61 per cent in 2023, the report from Motilal Oswal Mutual Fund said.

The broking house said that despite this improvement in reception, about one-third of investors remain outside the passive mutual fund universe, citing higher confidence in active funds or unfamiliarity with passive products.

Approximately 54 per cent of investors cited low costs, 46 per cent mentioned diversification, 46 per cent mentioned simplicity and

transparency, and 29 per cent chose performance as a deciding factor when choosing passive funds.

Distributors demonstrated strong traction, with 93 per cent indicating an understanding of passive funds. Approximately 70 per cent incorporate them into client portfolios, and most intend to increase passive allocations by at least 5 per cent in fiscal 2026

Distributors reported that they primarily selected passive funds based on tracking error and expense ratio. "Awareness is no longer limited to

broad-based index solutions. as investors are increasingly accepting factor-based funds and innovative passive strategies," said Pratik Oswal, Chief of Passive Business at Motilal Oswal AMC.

Among passive investors, more than half (57 per cent) currently hold one to three passive funds, and about 17 per cent own more than five funds. In terms of product preferences, 49 per cent invest in both index funds and ETFs, 34 per cent only in index funds, and 16 per cent only in ETFs, the report noted.

India explores nationwide climate-linked insurance scheme

Mumbai, Oct 6: India's government has begun early-stage talks with local insurers about designing a nationwide climate-linked insurance programme aimed at simplifying the payout process after extreme weather events such as heatwaves and floods.

The scheme would adopt a parametric insurance model, where policyholders receive a pre-determined payout when specific weather thresholds such as rainfall, temperature or windspeed are breached.

Should the discussions bear fruit, India - among the nations most prone to extreme weather events - could become one of the first major economies to roll out such a programme.

Zverev suffers shock first-round exit

Shanghai, Oct 6: Third-seeded Alexander Zverev lost to 54th ranked Arthur Rinderknech 4-6 6-3, 6-2 in his opening match at the Shanghai Masters Monday

Zverev, the highest-ranked player left in the draw, looked in control after taking the first set but struggled the rest of the match and couldn't break serve again. Rinderknech got a break in the second set and two in the third to seal the victory in more than two hours.

Rinderknech Zverev in five sets in the first round at Wimbledon this year.

Marylebone Cricket Club backs third umpire's decision to adjudge Muneeba run-out

New Delhi, Oct 6: The Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC) has issued a clarification on the unusual run-out of Pakistan opener Muneeba Ali during the 2025 Women's World Cup clash against India, saying that the third umpire was 'entirely correct' in adjudging her as run-out.

The incident happened on the last ball of the fourth over of Pakistan's chase at the R Premadasa Stadium when Muneeba initially survived an lbw appeal off Kranti Gaud, as India chose not to review despite replays later showing three reds.

But Muneeba had wandered

out of her crease, and a throw from Deepti Sharma hit the stumps. Though Muneeba did ground her bat, it was in the air when the throw from Deepti hit the stumps.

The decision sparked animated scenes, with Pakistan skipper Fatima Sana Khan saying to the fourth umpire Kim Cotton that Muneeba had grounded her bat and, with no intention of taking a run, the dismissal should be changed.

Premier League: Man City star Haaland at top of his game

London, Oct 6: Manchester City striker Erling Haaland believes he is in the best form of his career — and the statistics show he might be right.

The scoring phenom from Norway made it 18 goals from his opening 11 games of the season by netting City's winner against Brentford in the Premier League.

That prompted a question: Is he in the form of his life? "You can say so," Haaland said. "I've never felt better than I do now."

Here's a deeper look at his scoring run — and how it currently compares to other top

Is this Haaland's best goal streak? In a senior career spent at Molde in Norway, Salzburg in Austria, Borussia Dortmund in Germany and now City, Haa-


land has never scored more than 18 goals in an 11-game stretch in a single season.

He has achieved that exact same tally, though, on three previous occasions. And they came in the same season.

In the 2022-23 campaign his first at City — Haaland had 11-game stretches from August 21-October 5 and August 27-October 8 where he scored 18 goals for club and country. Those runs included hat tricks in three consecutive home league games.

Later that season, he again netted 18 goals in an 11-game run from March 11-May 3 — a streak that included five goals in a Champions League match against Leipzig.

In his current run, Haaland also has a five-goal match - for Norway against Moldova — as well as four doubles. He has



nine Premier League goals so far, which is more than nine teams in the division.

What about Haaland's run of consecutive scoring games? This is where Haaland has broken his personal record.

His goal against Brentford meant he has now scored in nine straight matches for club and country, and he's never done that before.

His previous best streak was eight games in a row — from August to October in 2021 when he played for Dortmund, and from August to September in 2022 soon after joining City.

What's the Premier League record for scoring in consecutive games? The only game in which Haaland failed to score this season was at home to Tottenham in the Premier League August 23, when City lost 2-0.

He has netted in all five of

City's league games since, but has a way to go to break the record for scoring in consecutive games. That is held by Jamie Vardy, who scored in 11 straight matches in the Premier League from August to November en route to Leicester winning the title in fairytale fashion.

How does Haaland compare to the world's other top strikers this season? It hasn't just been a strong start to the season for Haaland.

Harry Kane has begun even better, scoring 19 goals in his first 11 games for Bayern Munich and England combined starting with one in the German Super Cup. The England captain has failed to score in just one of those matches.

As for Kylian Mbappé, he has 16 goals in his opening 12 games for Real Madrid and France combined.
