20 new cybercrime police stations to be operational

Bhubaneswar, Oct 18: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Saturday announced that at least 20 new cybercrime police stations will soon become operational in the state. In addition, steps will be taken to modernise the existing 14 cyber police stations, he said.

The Chief Minister stated that 1,127 new police positions and 170 technical experts will be appointed shortly. A state-level Command Centre under the Crime Branch will also be established, serving as a Centre of Excellence for cybercrime prevention.

Lucknow, Oct 18: Every inch of Pakistan's territory lies within range of Brah-Mos and what happened during Operation Sindoor was just a trailer, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said here Saturday, in a stern warning to Pakistan.

The operation proved that victory has become a habit for India, he said. The Union Minister,

along with Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, flagged off the first batch of BrahMos missiles manufactured at the Brah-Mos Aerospace unit in Sarojini Nagar here.

Singh described BrahMos added as a symbol of India's rising strength.

"BrahMos is not just a missile, it is proof of India's strategic confidence. From the Army to the Navy and the Air Force, it has become a key pillar of our defence forces," he said. Singh ascapabilities now serve as a powerful deterrent.

Islamabad, Oct 18: In a sharp escalation of rhetoric, Pakistan Army chief Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir Saturday warned India of a "decisive response" to even a minor provocation, saying there is "no space for war in a nuclearised environment".

Munir was addressing a graduation ceremony of passing out army cadets at the premier Pakistan Military Academy (PMA) Kakul at Abbottabad in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

"I advise and firmly caution India's military leadership that there is no space for war in a nuclearised environment," he said.

"We will never be intimidated, not coerced by rhetoric and will respond decisively to even a minor provocation without any qualms," the Chief of Army Staff (COAS) said.

Referring to the recent military conflict between India and Pakistan, Munir claimed that his country's armed forces had demonstrated "remarkable professionalism" and far-reaching capabilities by neutralising all threats and emerged victorious against a numerically superior adversary.

India launched Operation Sindoor May 7, targeting ter-



ror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir in retaliation for the April 22 Pahalgam attack that killed 26 civilians.

India and Pakistan reached an understanding May 10 to end the conflict after four days of intense cross-border drone and missile strikes, following direct talks between the Directors General of Military Operations (DGMOs) of the two militaries.

Munir also accused India of using terrorism as a weapon to destabilise Pakistan, saying a handful of terrorists cannot harm Pakistan and warned that "all proxies using Afghan soil would be raised to dust", in an apparent reference to Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP).

The Army chief also urged India to settle core issues as per international norms, an apparent reference to the Kashmir dispute, while reiterating Pakistan's commitment to provide "moral and diplomatic support" to the people of Jammu and







Govt seeks experts' help over open-heart surgeries

Bhubaneswar, Oct 18: The Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) department has sought the assistance of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS)-New Delhi and Government Medical College in Kottayam to reduce high mortality rate among openheart surgery patients at SCB Medical College and Hospital

The step in this regard has been taken by the state government after the Orissa High Court expressed concern over the high mortality among patients undergoing open-heart surgery at Cardiothoracic and Vascular Surgery (CTVS) wing

of SCBMCH. "The matter has been taken

The affidavit also stated that steps would be taken to send the existing faculties in CTVS and critical care for exposure visit as well as advanced training. The already trained faculties posted in other medical colleges of the state shall be deployed during the major surgeries.

Further, steps were being taken to invite expert team from AIIMS-New Delhi for guidance, hands on training, developing the skill and confidence of the faculties, nursing and other paramedics for conducting the heart surgeries and suggesting in equipping the operation theatre and intensive care unit with appropriate modern equipment and instrument for the best outcome in patients who are undergoing cardiac surgeries

There is no dispute that open-heart surgery is a major surgery. It can be a life-saving operation for some. Open-heart surgery improves their health, making it easier for them to do everyday tasks. This can give them a better quality of life. Housing units to 44 families in Salia Sahi

Bhubaneswar, Oct 18: Under its Affordable Housing Project (AHP), Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) allotted housing units to 44 families through a transparent lottery system, selected from a total of 274 families currently residing along the left parallel road of Salia Sahi in Ward No. 21.

BMC has taken the necessary steps to relocate the 44 families to the Buddha Vihar Housing Project at Chandrasekharpur. Based on a preliminary survev. 274 beneficiaries were provisionally selected for allotment of AHP houses at Chandrasekharpur. The corporation clarified that the houses will be handed over only after verification of all relevant documents.

As per the eviction and resettlement policy, arrangements have been made to provide basic assistance to the affected families during relo-



cation — including transport facilities, food for three days. temporary electricity connections, and water supply in coordination with agencies such as TPCODL and WATCO.

Each allotted house is priced at ₹6 lakh, while the beneficiary will have to contribute only ₹1.5 lakh. Those unable to pay this amount can contribute ₹15,000 upfront and avail the remaining amount through bank loans. For

this purpose, BMC has facilitated coordination with selected banks to assist the beneficiaries.

To simplify the loan process, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between HDFC Bank and BMC recently.

At the special function, Housing and Urban Development Minister Krushna Chandra Mahapatra attended as chief guest. Other dignitaries including BMC Mayor Sulochana Das, deputy mayor Manjulata Kanhar, BMC commissioner Chanchal Rana, Slum Settlement Standing Committee chairperson Mahamaya Swain, corporator Pritinanda Rautray, and senior HDFC Bank officials Arjunananda Bag (zonal head) and Sushanta Kumar Panigrahi (cluster head), among others ioined the event.

Expressing his views, Mahapatra reiterated that every eligible person will be provided housing and no one will be left out. "The state government has launched several schemes to ensure housing for all. Besides the economically weaker sections, many middle-class and upper-middle-class families in Bhubaneswar also lack their own homes. Initiatives are already underway to provide affordable houses to them, ranging from ₹14 lakh to ₹50 lakh. The work is in progress, and houses will soon be allotted through the lottery system," he added.

Animal Aid Centre shortage hits livestock farmers hard

Bhadrak, Oct 18: Odisha's livestock sector, a key source of livelihood for many rural and landless families, is reeling under a severe shortage of animal aid centres and livestock inspectors. With more than 40% of posts lying vacant, many centres are either nonfunctional or overstretched, leaving farmers without timely veterinary care.

The state has 3,239 animal aid centres across 6,798 panchayats, in addition to 91 centres in government farms and other facilities. In total, 3,330 centres are operating, but only 1,928 livestock inspectors are currently in service. Another 91 inspectors are posted in farms and related facilities. This leaves 1,402 positions vacant, meaning around 42% of centres do not have inspectors, according to Lalitendu Dalei, state secretary of the All-India Livestock Inspectors' Professional Employees' Association.

In Bhadrak district, 114 centres are functioning with only 66 inspectors. Besides treatment, inspectors are engaged in implementing various government schemes such as the Chief Minister's Kamadhenu Yojana, the Chief Minister's Agriculture Enterprise Scheme, the National Livelihood Mission, livestock census, fodder cultivation, goat rearing, vaccination, artificial



coverage. As frontline workers, they provide immediate medical services at farmers' doorsteps

In 2006, the state Directorate of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services had announced plans to open one animal aid centre in every panchayat. However, the plan remains on paper. With a change in government, expectations have risen that this long-delayed notification may finally be implemented.

Meanwhile, out of 667 posts in the veterinary technician (VT) cadre, 135 remain vacant, adding to the workload of inspectors. Many inspectors said they are under pressure, handling multiple responsibilities without adequate support. Despite raising long-pending demands, they claim their concerns are often ignored as they are considered lower-level employees. The Odisha Non-Gazetted Veterinary

Association has written several letters to the department, but inspectors said they rarely get a chance to discuss their issues directly with the director.

"At the grassroots, inspectors not only provide veterinary services but also implement government schemes. We are expected to meet departmental targets, handle fieldwork, and manage online reporting. Unfortunately, the first six years of service are not counted in career progression. Our demands have been pending for years without resolution. We hope the new government will take steps to fulfill them." said Dalei.

"After the recent interviews for inspector posts, some candidates are undergoing training. Once they complete it, they will be appointed, which will help fill a portion of the vacancies." Said Dr. Hrushikesh Behera, chief district veterinary officer, Bhadrak

Hatadihi, Oct 18: Residents of Karagola in Ambho panchayat ended their two-day protest outside the Anandapur sub-collector's office in Keonjhar Saturday after authorities launched crackdown against illegal sand mining from the Baitarani riverbed

A team comprising district mining officer, tehsildar, SD-PO, police IIC, enforcement unit and other officials arrived at the riverbed to begin enforcement. Trenches were dug on the access road to block the movement of sand-laden vehicles

Officials also found a newly constructed road to the sandbed, felled trees, and an embankment purportedly built on the riverbed by the sand mafia to divert the natural flow of water.

Notably, an earlier attempt by the tehsildar and mining officials to dig a similar trench was failed after receiving alleged death threats from the sand mafia. However, no suspects have yet been identified

in that incident, nor any action have been taken against those believed to have built the road felled trees or altered the river's

Sub-Collector Nila Madhab Suna said, "The sit-in by the residents was withdrawn around 2 pm." He said the diverted stream would be restored to its natural course and raids would continue regularly.

"Illegal sand transport will not be tolerated under any circumstances," Suna said.

Two get life term for 2002 murder Anandapur: A court here in Anandpur Saturday sentenced two men to life imprisonment for the brutal

murder of four brothers in Panchugochhia village under Anandapur police limits in Keonjhar district in 2002. According to case records, in July 2002, villagers Dhaneswar Ojha and Damodar Ojha attacked and killed four brothers — Jaldhar Dalai, Budhia Dalai, Sadhu Dalai and Uddhab Dalai — over past enmity, The victims were allegedly chased down and assaulted with lethal weapons on the village road, leading to their deaths. Initially, seven persons were named in the case, but four were later acquitted for lack of evidence, while one of the accused has since died. After examining 25 witnesses and 80 documents, the Anandapur Additional District and Sessions Judge found Dhaneswar and Damodar guilty under sections 302 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code. Both convicts were sentenced to life imprisonment and fined ₹1 lakh each. Failure to pay the fine will result in an additional two years of rigorous imprisonment, the court ordered.

Survey finds alternative for Kalinga Ghat road

Bhanjanagar, Oct 18: A high-level committee led by Bhanjanagar MLA Pradyumna Kumar Nayak conducted a survey to identify an alternative route for Kalinga Ghat, which has remained blocked for over a month following landslides. The move comes as the existing road is yet to



be restored and National Highway authorities have been criticised for the slow pace of work, affecting local commuters.

The National Highway Division informed during a review meeting in Bhanjanagar that work is underway, aiming to allow four-wheeler and two-wheeler vehicles

on the road on a trial basis by October 25. However, local residents demanded that another existing temporary route be upgraded and opened for daily use to ensure longterm connectivity.

During the survey, the committee found no major landslides along the approximately five-kilometre stretch. Officials discussed how the route could function as a permanent alternative in the future. Government approval for the alternative road is expected in the coming days.

Officials present during the survey included Bhan-Sub-Collector janagar Uma Shankar Behera, DFO Himanshu Shekhar Jagannath-Mohanty, prasad Block Vice Chairman Neelachal Khilar. senior officers from the Public Works, Rural Development, Minor Irrigation, and other departments.

Three killed, one critically injured in head-on bike collision in Malkangiri

Malkangiri, Oct 18: Three persons were killed and another sustained critical injuries after two motorcycles collided headon near Tekaguda village under Korukonda police limits in Malkangiri district Saturday morning.

According to reports, around 8:30am. Mohan Majhi (26), and his relative Madhu Jani of Suliya Colony in Korukonda block were travelling towards Malkangiri on a motorcycle when another two-wheeler coming from the opposite direction, en route Balimela, rammed into their bike near Tekaguda Square. The second bike was reportedly carrying Jamuna Sardar and his relative Ram Kumar, both resi-

dents of MV-36 village. The impact of the collision was so severe that Majhi died on the spot. Locals immediately called

for an ambulance and rushed the other three victims — Sardar, Ram Kumar, and Jani — to the Malkangiri district headquarters hospital (DHH). However, Sardar and Ram Kumar succumbed to their injuries while undergoing treatment. Jani remains in critical condi-

tion, hospital sources said. Upon being informed, Korukonda police reached the accident site, recovered the body, and sent them for post-mortem examination. The body of Majhi was handed over to his family members after the autopsy. Meanwhile, the identities of Sardar's and Ram Kumar's family members were not immediately established. The two bodies have been kept at the hospital morgue until their families are identified, said Korukonda police station officer-in-charge Himanshu Sekhar Barik.

Empty Ambition

hen was the last time you read or saw something about India and the G20? And what do you recall from that memory? Like me, for many readers, the answers are most likely to be: When India was in the presidency a couple of years ago, and the posters and hoardings about India's presidency.

If asked what outcomes were achieved in that presidency or what plans exist to follow up with what we initiated, I do not have an answer because, like you, I do not know. The G20 thing was an opportunity for an event, and that event is over.

A few days ago, again, India went to the United Nations and asked that the institution reform itself. Formed in 1945 just after World War 2 ended and two years before Indian independence, the UN Security Council retains the same five permanent members. When India uses the words UN reform, what we mean is that we also want a permanent seat in the Security Council, with a veto.

In the words of our foreign minister, 'The historical injustice done to Africa should be redressed. Both permanent and non-permanent membership of the Council must be expanded. A reformed Council must be truly representative. And India stands ready to assume greater

These greater responsibilities that we are ready to assume is the subject of this piece. It is fine to have ambition;

the question is what we want to do with it. The BJP's 2024 manifesto, like the one in 2019, has a line about this. It reads: 'We

are committed to seeking permanent membership in the UN Security Council to elevate Bharat's position in global decision making. How would this be secured? This was

not elaborated on. What would India say to convince all five permanent members and two-thirds of the general assembly that it should be given more power? What was the pathway to becoming more popular with the world? No mention of that.

Other than the idea that India was entitled to more than it had and should be given it by the world, there appears to be no direct and specific aim of this aspect of foreign policy.

Let us suppose we got this seat. What would we do with it that we cannot do today? No clarity on that either. On Gaza and Ukraine, the two most pressing global issues of our time, India's contribution has been to abstain from crucial votes in the UN. Having or not having the veto would have made no difference when there is nothing one has to say to the world.

China's rise since 1990 to superpower has come on the back of industrial policy and economic growth, not on the basis of its UNSC seat. In the 2014 manifesto, the BJP said

that in the foreign policy of its predecessor the UPA, 'instead of clarity, we have seen confusion' and because of 'absence of statecraft', India 'is seen to be floundering, whereas it should have been engaging with the world with confidence'.

Under Manmohan Singh India had 'failed to establish enduring friendly and cooperative relations with India's neighbours' and 'India and its neighbours have drifted apart'. The party would correct this and 'strengthen SAARC'. The fact is that SAARC has not met since November 2014, because we do not have any interest in it. The leaders of Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka have all changed since that summit meeting. India has the same person at the helm.

We cannot even bring our neighbourhood together but believe that if given more power at the UN we can reform the world. The BJP's manifestos tell us the party will do more to link with ASEAN, but we chose in 2019 not to join the free trade agreement spearheaded by ASEAN, the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership.

The words 'vasudhaiva kutumbakam' appear in the manifestos but try telling Rohingva fleeing genocide that India sees humanity as a joint family. Try telling the Bangladeshi refugee that, or those excluded from the Citizenship Amendment Act. There is no value residing in those two words and they offer nothing other than platitudes.

The question we must then come to is this: If we do not have a pathway of getting there and if we do not know what we will do with our veto, why are we clamouring for a bigger role? The answer takes us back to where we started in this column. It gives us a forum to strut about and pretend we are the leader of the world and the leading light of the global community.

It is another place where we can pretend we are relevant, and can display our personalised and very physical diplomacy.

The world knows this. It has observed us and has heard our words and our silences and abstentions. It does not for a moment buy the idea that any one nation 'deserves' a thing more than the rest of them.

It is for this reason that it is a good thing that the government has not laid out a pathway to getting to a UNSC permanent seat. If it did, there would be questions for which it has no answers.

the Supreme Court of India has rejected the petition filed by the International Pharmaceutical Giant, Roche, against the Delhi High Court's order allowing the domestic pharma company, Natco, to market the generic version of Risdiplam, the only available remedy in India. The Delhi High Court has refused on 9th October to provide injunction against the selling of generic version of only drug available for treating spinal muscular atrophy (SMA) bringing huge relief to the SMA patients and care giver. At present very expensive unaffordable treatment is available in our country as the medicine is under patent protection. The SC's decision once again proved India's philosophy of peoples' interest is above profits.

The Swiss company, F Hoffmann-La Roche Limited, holds Indian patent for this drug in 2015 and is valid till 2035. The company claims that it is a new chemical entity and does not cover the company's earlier patents. The Natco argued that Roche is trying to get the patent protection without much advancement of science, something called evergreening. Roche had earlier filed petition against the Indian Pharma Natco's plan to market the generic version of Risdiplam at Delhi High Court. Delhi High Court bench in its verdict says there is no reason to intervene the single judge verdict allowing Natco Pharma to market generic version. The generic version of the medicine is expected to bring the treatment cost down from Rs 600,000 to Rs 15,900 per bottle. SMA is a rare genetic disorder for

Spinal muscular atrophy is a very severe genetic disorder mostly affecting newborns, toddlers, and young adults. It affects the muscles in the limbs, face, chest, throat and tongue. Thus, the disease causes movement loss (adversely affecting walking) and, in some cases, death from respiratory failure. There would be progressive weakness and muscle wasting. The weakness tends to be more severe in the muscles that are close to the centre of the body (proximal) compared to muscles away from the body's centre (distal). The muscle weakness usually worsens with age. There are many types of spinal muscular atrophy that are caused by changes in the same genes. The new treatments are the hope for the parents and children. There are three drugs available globally: Zolgensma, Risdiplamand Nusinersane. Risdiplam (brand name Evrysdi) is marketed by Roche is only available in our country. The novel therapies provide a much needed relieve: the children with SMA type 1 who could not even hold the head are now walking if the treatment is started early. The novel treatment is available but access to the treatmentis a big question mark. The treatment is essential for successful outcomes and well-being of these unfortunate individuals.

The question-and-answer session in the parliament (11 February 2022) confirms that National registry has 295 Spinal Muscular Atrophy cases. Of them, 188 (63.70%) are male and 107 (37.30 %) are female. Preliminary analysis of age distribution of the cases (N=295) are as follows: <1 year-140 (47.5%); 1 to <5 years- 91 (30.8%); 5 to <10 years-9(3.1%) and Not Known-46(15.6%). The government cannot do much as

tected under the Patent Act. Government's initiative is restricted to support individuals. Crowd funding approach is also made available through government portal. The government has established a rare disease fund to support treatment cost but is not sustainable. During 2022-23, the fund has supported 203 patients to the tune of Rs 35 crore. The government has also provided full waiver of Basic Customs Duty (BCD) and IGST to drugs imported (personal use only) for treatment of SMA, thereby making the medicines for SMA more affordable. The current price of available drug, Risdiplam in India is reported to be Rs 6,00,000. The Natco Pharma proposed to sell the generic version at Rs 15,900 for a 60 mg/80 ml bottle. The annual cost of Roche's patented product is Rs 72 lakh and the cost of generic version for the same period is Rs 5 lakh. Just think of what a huge relief to the patients mostly children and their care givers. India has one-sixth of global burden of SMA cases.

While the SC's refusal to grant relief to Roche is hailed publicly as another landmark decision but this is not the end. This is just the provision of providing interim relief to Natco to launch the generic version of Risdiplam in Indian market. The patent infringement case would continue in Delhi High Court till final disposal. Public interest logic should prevail over patent ex-

De-risking and repositioning

OVER THE PAST YEAR, RELATIONS **BETWEEN THE EUROPEAN UNION** AND INDIA HAVE **ACCELERATED** - AND NOT BY COINCIDENCE

n the past three years, both the European Union and India have been forced to redefine what "strategic autonomy" actually means. For Europe, the shock came from the pandemic, Russia's war against Ukraine, and the deep realization that its prosperity had been quietly built on external dependencies — on Russian gas, American technology, and Chinese supply chains.

For India, the shock was geopolitical as well as civilizational: the limits of China's power had become visible, but so had the limits of disengagement.

Today, both Delhi and Brussels are experimenting with new grammars of dependence — not decoupling, but de-risking: not confrontation. but repositioning.

In October 2025, Beijing introduced a fresh round of export controls on technologies linked to the processing of rare earth metals and the production of high-performance magnets. It was a political gesture with measurable economic weight. Once again, China reminded the world that it can govern the time of global supply chains. It doesn't need to raise tariffs or ban exports; a simple delay in licensing or a pause in shipment is enough to make the entire system tremble.

This subtle mastery of tim-

ing — of making the world wait — has become the new dimension of resource geopolitics. Both India and Europe have learned this lesson. The question is: how to respond without turning protectionism into dogma?

Europe's answer has been to regulate. The Critical Raw Materials Act (CRMA), now in force, sets measurable targets for mining, processing, and recycling by 2030. The European Union has also launched anti-subsidy measures against Chinese electric vehicles with temporary tariffs reaching up to 37 percent — and introduced new instruments for screening foreign investments and state aid transparency.

A Polish example, the electric car project Izera (based on Chinese Geely's platform). shows how fragile this balancing act can be: a European ambition wrapped in an Asian supply chain.

For Brussels, the goal is not to exclude China entirely, but to turn interdependence into a calculated risk, not an existential one.

India, by contrast, builds networks rather than regulations. Its Atmanirbhar Bharat and Production Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes have created an ecosystem for domestic manufacturing, while partnerships with Africa and

the Quad members help secure access to critical minerals. Delhi's diversification drive has already reshaped global expectations: autonomy is no longer defined by separation, but by multiplicity.

Over the past year, relations between the European Union and India have accelerated — and not by coincidence. The joint Trade and Technology Council (TTC) is already operational, focusing on supply-chain security, semiconductors, and artificial intelligence. In parallel, the 14th round of negotiations on the EU–India Free Trade Agreement is underway, with a political goal of conclusion before the end of 2025. These developments mark a shift in perception: Brussels increasingly sees Delhi not merely as a market, but as a strategic partner in re-balancing Chinese influence across Eurasia.

In this sense, India and Europe meet not in rhetoric but in practice — in their shared understanding that diversification is no longer a slogan, but a language of survival.

India's own policy toward Chinese investment has never been doctrinaire. While the 2020 Press Note 3 restrictions still limit direct investment from China, New Delhi is now considering selective relaxation in low-risk, non-strategic sectors — particularly consumer goods and low-tech manufacturing. This signals a form of conscious balancing: neither isolation nor full openness, but managed interdependence. It is perhaps the emerging model of the post-global era — not cutting ties, but calibrating connection.

The EU protects the logic of the market: India redraws the geometry of the chain. Europe builds defensive walls of rules; India lays adaptive bridges of cooperation. Yet both face the same paradox: how to remain open in a world that increasingly rewards closure.

For Europe, the universality of its solutions — the CRMA's quantifiable targets, the principle of conditional market access, the rhetoric of "de-risking" — may serve as templates, not as transferable laws. India, on the other hand, turns these templates into practice, guided less by regulation than by intuition.

If there is a common denominator, it lies here: Both sides know that China no longer controls the space of globalization — it controls its tempo. And that, for the first time in decades, makes time itself a strategic resource.

Kargil, Oct 18: A Kargil-based agricultural institute has devised a new method to extract honey from buckwheat crops, opening new pathways towards sustainable agriculture and rural livelihood development

According to an official, buckwheat honey extraction at School of Agriculture Science and Technology, Kargil Campus, University of Ladakh, was part of efforts to promote apiculture in the region.

In 2019, honey was extracted from alfalfa crop at the institute which was earlier named as Mountain Agriculture Research and Extension Station,

"This year, the School of



Agriculture Science and Technology, Kargil formulated a floral calendar and accordingly introduced bee colonies in synchronisation with floral period of alfalfa and buckwheat and thus able to extract honey from both the crops resulting in a significance development in apiculture as honey was extracted for the first time from buckwheat crop," an official of the institute said

He said the buckwheat crop was sown July 22 and later in synchronisation with the flowering of buckwheat crop bee colonies were introduced from Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology, Kashmir August 24.

After a gap of one-and-a-half month, honey was extracted from these colonies marking a historic step, the official said, adding that the extraction of buckwheat honey has opened new pathways towards sustainable agriculture, rural livelihood development, and biodiversity conservation.

He said the unique altitude and climate of Kargil have given this honey a distinctive aroma and taste, setting it apart from other regional varieties and making a way for the untapped potential for high quality honey production from Kargil region.

The official said the institute is planning to expand more bee colonies in desirable villages. honey branding, and marketing and to promote buckwheat honey of Kargil as a unique GItagged product in the future.

Six-lane highway in Kerala soon

Kozhikode, Oct 18: Kerala's long-awaited six-lane national highway, stretching 45 metres wide from Kasaragod to Thiruvananthapuram, will be opened to the public as a New Year gift in 2026, state Public Works and Tourism Minister P A Mohammed Riyas said Saturday.

He described the project as the realisation of a long-cherished dream of Malayalis, made possible through the strong resolve and determined efforts of the Left Democratic Front (LDF) government.

Riyas was speaking at the inauguration of the 'Vision 2031' Public Works Department (PWD) seminar, according to a

"When the government assumed office, there were only two options before us regarding the national highway project, either abandon it or find the required funds. For the first time in India's history, a state decided to raise its own funds for national highway development," he said.

The state spent ₹5,580 crore to make the project a reality, Riyas said, adding that the highway's development would open new avenues for Kerala's comprehensive growth.

Outlining the PWD's initiatives, he said the department's primary goal is to transform



development hub by 2031, coinciding with the 75th anniversary of the state's formation.

"In the past nine and a half years, we have made remarkable progress in the development sector. Kerala has become one of the few places where BM-BC (Bituminous Macadam-Bituminous Concrete) roads are available even in rural areas," he said.

Meanwhile, four shutters at the Kallar dam were raised by 60 cm, releasing 1063 cusecs of water. Authorities have alerted people living along the banks of the Kallar and Chinnar rivers about possible flooding

Four shutters of the Malankara diversion dam also remain open. The inflow to the dam depends on water released after power generation at the Kerala State Electricity Board's Moolamattom plant.

The water level at the Idukki reservoir, the largest dam in the state, was recorded 2,381.92 ft, and live storage was 75.80 per cent at 7 am. All the gates of the dam are currently closed, offi-





Srinagar, Oct 18: Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah Saturday strongly asserted that his party National Conference would never ioin hands with the Bharatiya Janata Party to hasten the return of statehood to the Union territory, indicating a refusal to repeat the "mistakes" of the past made by others.

The NC leader claimed that a deal with the BJP for the return of statehood is "out of the question", making reference to the negative consequences of the 2015 PDP-BJP alliance.

"We have already seen how much that (alliance) ruined J&K. It was a useless coalition between the BJP and the PDP

in 2015, and we are still reeling from its effects. I have no desire to make the same mistakes that others did," the chief minister

Abdullah also dared the BJP to be open if the restoration of statehood depended on a BJPled government in J&K.

"If so, I believe the BJP should be transparent, and let us know that as long as J&K has a non-BJP government, vou will never attain statehood. Then we will see what we can do about it," he said, pointing out that the BJP did not make such a condition in its manifestos or promises to Parliament and the Supreme Court.

The chief minister also said he is in active consultation with legal experts regarding the possibility of his office becoming a party to the current batch of pleas placed before the Supreme Court for the re-establishment of statehood.

The Supreme Court is hearing a batch of petitions seeking the restoration of statehood to the UT of Jammu and Kashmir, and October 10, it directed the Centre to respond

Emphasising his unique status, Abdullah said, "I am the only person in the whole country with the experience of being the chief minister of a state and the chief minister of a UT."

Abdullah believes this perspective is crucial to detail the disadvantages of UT status to the apex court.

Abdullah also dared the BJP to be open if the restoration of statehood depended on a BJP-led government in J&K

"That said, it is for my lawyers to advise whether it would actually be beneficial to the people of J&K. If so, I have no hesitation in becoming a party to this case in the SC. So, this is something that is actively being discussed with a legal team and based on their opinion, there is a possibility that as chief minister, I will make myself a party to this case,'

Asked if he has any hopes with the Supreme Court on the restoration of statehood. Abdullah said, "We should have hopes. But it is also true that somewhere Pahalgam is being linked to the restoration of statehood. The people of J&K do not support it. No one involved in the attack was from J&K."

Refusing to go into the politics of it, Abdullah said, "It was repeatedly said in Parliament that there are three steps -- delimitation, election and statehood. Two steps have been taken, now we hope the third will also be done.

Nirav Modi hints at 'sensational developments' in UK extradition

London, Oct 18: Nirav Modi, in prison for over six years, has told a UK court there are "sensational developments" to come when his Indian extradition case on fraud and money laundering charges reopens for a hearing in London next month.

The 54-year-old fugitive diamantaire appeared in the dock before High Court Judge Simon Tinkler at the Royal Courts of Justice here Friday to present his defence in an unrelated case, involving an over \$8 million unpaid Bank of India debt.

The judge turned down Nirav's application for a stay on the proceedings on the grounds of technical and medical constraints in prison, which is set to proceed to a trial scheduled in January 2026

"They (Bank of India) refer to my extradition... I'm still here. There will be some sensational developments, and I have never used these words before," said Nirav, during a pre-trial review

The fugitive diamond merchant, wanted in India in the estimated \$2 billion Puniab National Bank (PNB) loan scam case, told the court he was "extremely hopeful" of either being discharged or granted bail after the court agreed to accept new evidence despite a "high bar" in such matters.

The UK's Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) has confirmed that Niray "has lodged an application to reopen his (extradition) appeal", with the Indian authorities submitting their response ahead of a hearing expected towards the end of November.

Defending himself as a "Litigant in Person", Nirav read from copious handwritten notes as he addressed the judge. Officers sat guard as their prisoner, dressed in a worn-out white t-shirt and pink track pants, spoke in mumbled tones about struggles with his eyesight and lengthy delays over access to a computer behind bars, which he stressed made any trial unfair and imbalanced.

Needless to state that any such step should not be taken in haste and must be proceeded by appropriate legal opinion and with a pragmatic approach," the bench said.

The apex court said such ill-advised actions tend to bring the reputation of the country to disrepute in the international fora, in addition to bringing the conduct of the concerned officers into breach of the human rights guarantees.

"Consequently, we hereby declare the arrest of the petitioner and so also the FIR and all proceedings sought to be taken thereunder against the petitioner to be unlawful. The same are hereby quashed.

"The writ petition pending before the High Court and the proceedings, if any, pending before the jurisdictional trial Court shall also stand closed The petitioner is given liber ty to avail a suitable remedy seeking damages before the appropriate forum," it said.



The affidavit read that the proposed changes focus on improving the process for registration and termination of cohabiting relationships, lending greater clarity in sharing information with the police, and extending the appeal period for rejected applications.

The amended provisions seek to limit the scope of data sharing between the registrar and the local police, making it clear that this is being done solely for "record-keeping purposes.

The proposed amendments

also include changes related to the mandatory use of Aadhaar as proof of identity in various registration and declaration

These changes primarily aim to provide "flexibility" by allowing alternative identification documents in cases where applicants cannot provide Aadhaar, especially in cases where they are not the primary applicant.

The affidavit also said that an amendment proposes to increase the time period for applicants to challenge the registrar's decision rejecting a declaration of cohabitation from 30 days to 45 days from the date of receipt of the rejection order.

Mamata urges Modi to revoke Gorkha interlocutor appointment

Kolkata, Oct 18: Expressing 'surprise and shock" over the appointment of an interlocutor to hold discussions on the issues relating to Gorkhas, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee Saturday wrote to Prime Minis ter Narendra Modi and demanded revocation of the decision.

Banerjee claimed her gov ernment was not consulted before retired IPS officer Pankaj Kumar Singh was appointed as an interlocutor to hold discussions on the issues relating to Gorkhas in Darjeeling Hills, Terai and Dooars regions of West Bengal, which she said was "inconsistent with the spirit of cooperative federalism". "This appointment has been made without any consultation with the Government of West Bengal, even though the issues under reference directly relate to the governance, peace, and administrative stability of the area under the Gorkhaland Ter ritorial Administration (GTA), an autonomous body under the Government of West Bengal,' she said in the two-page letter.

"Such unilateral action is inconsistent with the spirit of cooperative federalism that forms one of the foundational principles of our Constitution.'

Constable stabbed to death by accused

A Sub-Inspector, who was following the constable, sustained injuries on his fingers when the accused also attacked him and fled the scene.

"He is a regular offender. What prompted him to do this (attack on constable), can be known only after he is taken into custody," a police official said.

Expressing grief over the death of the constable. Telangana Director General of Police (DGP) B Shivadhar Reddy di rected Nizamabad Police Commissioner to form special teams to arrest the accused.

The DGP further instructed Inspector General of Police (IGP) Multi Zone-I, S Chandrashekhar Reddy to visit Nizamabad and monitor the situation, an official release said. The DGP has taken a serious view of the incident.

LAB seeks inclusion of Ladakh representative

Leh, Oct 18: Leh Apex Body (LAB) Saturday welcomed the centre's decision to conduct a judicial probe into the September 14 violence but demanded inclusion of a representative from Ladakh in the team.

According to a notification issued by the Union Home Ministry, the judicial probe, to be headed by Justice BS Chauhan, a former judge of the Supreme Court, is mandated to investigate the circumstances leading to the serious law and order situation, the police action and the resultant unfortunate deaths of four people

Retired district and sessions judge Mohan Singh Parihar will function as judicial secretary, while IAS officer Tushar Anand will be the administrative secretary of the inquiry commission.

"We welcome the MHA's notification for a judicial inquiry. But we saw some shortcomings like the reference which is FIR No:144. It looks that the inquiry is against our boys and secondly, none of the threeis from Ladakh. We want this inquiry to be completely transparent and no attempt should be made to hide anything. We want someone from Ladakh to be made part of the team," LAB Co-chairman and Ladakh Buddhist Association chief Chering Dorje Lakruk told reporters here.

It said the mission was in contact with the families of those who lost their lives in the mishap and is extending all possible assistance to them. In another post, the High Commission said a Consular Officer from the mission visited an Indian national who survived the accident and was receiving medical attention in a hospital

Strike ignites ship off Yemen coast

Dubai: A ship caught fire Saturday in the Gulf of Aden off Yemen after being struck by a projectile, the British military said, with one report suggesting its crew was preparing to abandon the vessel. The incident comes as Yemen's Houthi rebels have been attacking ships through the Red Sea corridor. However. the rebels did not immediately claim the attack, though it can take them hours or even days to do so. The British military's United Kingdom Maritime **Trade Operations centre** issued an alert about the vessel, describing the incident as taking place some 210 kilometres (130 miles) east of Aden. The maritime security firm Ambrey described the ship as a Cameroon-flagged tanker that was "en route from Sohar, Oman, to Djibouti."

Pak, Afghan talk after fierce fight

The peace negotiations come against the backdrop of escalating cross-border attacks blamed by Pakistan on militants operating from Afghan soil, straining relations between the two neighbours

Islamabad, Oct 18: Afghanistan and Pakistan were holding peace talks in Doha Saturday. both sides said, after the South Asia neighbours extended a ceasefire following a week of fierce border clashes.

They are seeking to find a way forward after the clashes killed dozens and wounded hundreds in the worst violence between the two countries since the Taliban seized power in Kabul in 2021.

"As promised, negotiations with the Pakistani side will take place today in Doha," Afghan government spokesperson Zabihullah Mujahid said, adding that the Kabul team led by Defence Minister Mullah Muhammad Yaqoob had arrived

Pakistan's foreign office said Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif would lead discussions with representatives of the Afghan Taliban.

"The talks will focus on immediate measures to end cross-border terrorism against Pakistan emanating from Afghanistan and restore peace and stability along the Pak-Afghan border," it said.

It was not immediately clear how long the talks would last. Officials on both sides have said they could be extended

Chinese physicist Chen-Ning dies at 103

Nobel Prize-winning

Beijing, Oct 18: Noted Chinese physicist and Nobel Laureate Chen Ning Yang, died in Beijing on Saturday. He was 103 years old. Yang was born in Hefei, east

China's Anhui Province, in 1922. In the 1940s, he went to the United States to pursue ac ademic studies and subsequent ly held teaching positions. He was awarded the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1957, official media here reported.

In 1954, he co-authored a set of equations with the American physicist Robert Mills that turned out to be as important to physics as Einstein's theory of relativity.

The resulting Yang-Mills theory described how three of nature's four fundamental forces - the electromagnetic, weak and strong interactions – oper ate in the subatomic world, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported.

Their theory laid the mathe matical foundation for what later became known as the Stan dard Model, the cornerstone of modern physics that unifies these forces and explains the behaviour of all known elemen tary particles.

"Yang was one of the greatest theoretical physicists of the 20th century," Shi Yu, professor of physics and associate direc tor of the Wilczek Quantum Centre at the Shanghai Insti tute for Advanced Studies said

Yang's most profound contribution was changing the mindset of Chinese people who once believed they were not as good as others in science and inspiring future generations to believe they could stand shoul der to shoulder with the world's best scientists, she said.

Nepal's Gen Z group to form political party; puts conditions to contest polls

Kathmandu, Oct 18: Nepal's Gen Z group Saturday announced that it will establish a political party, but said its participation in next year's general election depends on the fulfilment of certain "bottom-line" conditions

The youth-led group led protests against corruption and a government ban on social media sites last month, resulting in the ouster of the KP Sharma Oli-led government.

Led by Miraj Dhungana, one of the leaders of the recent Gen Z movement, the group unveiled its agenda in a press conference here.

They asserted that although they are considering forming a political party to bring together the Gen-Z youths, they will not contest the election until their

"bottom line" demands are ad-

The group has been primarily advocating for two key agendas: a directly elected executive system and voting rights for Nepali citizens residing abroad.

According to Dhungana, his group has decided that the formation of a political party is essential to unite the youths associated with the Gen-Z

While disclosing their agenda. Dhungana underscored the formation of a citizen-led investigation committee for corruption control and the adoption of a clear policy on economic transformation.

"We will continue to fight for issues like promoting good governance, transparency and checking corruption. We will not let the sacrifices of Gen-Z youths go in vain," he said, calling for collective commitment and cooperation from all sides in the nation-building task.

He added that they are currently collecting suggestions for an 'appropriate' name for the new party.

In talks with Zelenskyy, Trump appears to press pause on fresh arms' support

Washington, Oct Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy came to the White House Friday looking for weapons to keep fighting his country's war with Russia, but met an American president who appears more intent on brokering a peace deal than upgrading Ukraine's arsenal.

While US President Donald Trump did not rule out providing the long-range Tomahawk missiles Zelenskyy seeks, Trump appeared cool to the prospect as he looked ahead to a meeting with Russian President Vladimir Putin in Hungary in the coming weeks.

After speaking with Zelenskyy for more than two hours, Trump implored both Ukraine and Russia to "stop the war immediately," even if it means Ukraine conceding territory.

"You stop at the battle line, and both sides should go home, go to their families," Trump told reporters on his way to his home in West Palm Beach, Florida. "Stop the killing. And



that should be it. Stop right now at the battle line. I told that to President Zelenskyy. I told it to President Putin.'

The two leaders then went behind closed doors where they also discussed a call the previous day between the Russian president and Trump, who has portrayed himself as a mediator between the warring forces despite the fact that Russia invaded Ukraine in 2022

Palestinians have been killed in the Israel-Hamas war, Gaza's Health Ministry said Saturday. Meanwhile Israel received the remains of another hostage from Gaza Friday, the prime minister's office said, a handover from Hamas as the militant group worked to shore up a ceasefire by using bulldozers in a search for bodies under the rubble in the warscarred enclave. The handover came after Hamas' military wing, known as the Qassam Brigades, said the remains were that of an "occupation prisoner", suggesting that they belonged to an Israeli rather than one of the hostages of several other nationalities also taken in Gaza.



During a two-day interaction with exporters, MPEDA chairman DV Swamy urged them to adopt strategies focused on value addition and workforce upskilling to fully leverage the

The CETA pact, inked in July this year, grants zero-duty

access to 99 per cent of tariff lines, enhancing the competitiveness of Indian seafood in the UK market

Key categories such as Vannamei shrimp, frozen squid, lobsters, frozen pomfret, and black tiger shrimp are expected to benefit directly from the duty-free access.

The meetings provided a platform for industry stakeholders to explore the implications of the agreement. Presentations by Anil Ku-

mar P, Joint Director, MPEDA, outlined the salient features of CETA, while Alex Paul Menon, Development Commissioner

of the MPEZ-SEZ, highlighted the potential for Marine Aquapark SEZ development in Tamil Nadu.

Stakeholders, including officials from the Department of Commerce, Export Inspection Agency (EIA), and the Seafood Exporters Association of India (SEAI), alongside over 90 exporters from Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, and Odisha,

shared insights on market opportunities and operational strategies.

India exported marine products worth \$7.45 billion in 2024-25, with shrimp, fish, and cuttlefish forming the bulk of shipments. Exports to the UK reached 16.082 MT valued at \$104.43 million, driven largely by demand for frozen shrimp, which accounted for 77 per cent of the total UK shipments, followed by frozen fish at eight per cent.

Industry experts anticipate that the India-UK CETA could double Indian seafood exports to the UK in the near term.

High gold prices drive 40% surge in silver sales FIEO backs Indian

Mumbai/New Delhi, Oct 18: Despite high prices, consumer demand for silver outpaced gold on the auspicious occasion of Dhanteras, with silver coin sales surging 35-40 per cent year-on-year and overall value more than doubling, even as the jewellery body expects a 15 per cent volume drop for gold.

Dhanteras, the most auspicious day in the Hindu calendar for buying precious metals, is being celebrated over two days until 1:45 pm on Sunday. Jewellery stores remain open through midnight and Sunday. While gold prices surged

63 per cent to ₹1,32,000 per 10 grams of 24-carat (inclusive of taxes) in the national capital -up from ₹81.400 last Dhanteras October 29, 2024 -- silver prices gone up by 40 per cent, yet demand held firm. In major markets, gold and

silver prices saw a modest correction on Dhanteras. In Mumbai, 24-carat gold eased to ₹1,28,000 per 10 grams Saturday from ₹1,30,000 Friday, while silver fell to ₹1,70,000 per kg from ₹1,77,000. In Delhi, gold dropped to

₹1,32,000 per 10 grams (from ₹1,34,800) and silver to ₹1,70,000 per kg (from ₹1,77,000).

The overnight ₹2,000 dip in gold further fuelled purchases. Buying momentum picked

up post-lunch, with consumers shifting to coins and bullion in 1-50 gram denominations for investment, early weddings, and lightweight jewellery.

According to All India Gem and Jewellery Domestic Council (GJC) Chairman Rajesh Rokde, "Dhanteras 2025 has seen a 10-15 per cent dip in overall volume compared to last year, but value is up sharply... we expect festive sales to cross ₹50,000 crore.

"Despite high prices, sentiment remains upbeat, driven by strategic purchases. Silver coins and puja items surged 40 per cent year-on-year, marking silver's rise as a smart, value-focused investment," he told PTI.

GJC Vice Chairman Avinash Gupta highlighted consumer maturity: "Average transaction

value rose 20-25 per cent despite volume dips from high prices. Most encouraging is the 35-40 per cent surge in silver coin sales, especially in Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities, where buyers opted for budget-friendly investments and ceremonial gifting.'

He noted a 15 per cent increase in self-purchase trends. with younger consumers choosing lightweight, responsibly sourced silver jewellery.

"Digital campaigns expanded reach, with jewellers in smaller towns reporting stronger growth than metros. This year isn't just tradition -- it's thoughtful, value-driven celebration.'

Senco Gold and Diamonds Managing Director and CEO Suvankar Sen said high prices boosted demand for lightweight gold jewellery, but silver bars

Gold drops ₹2.400

New Delhi: Gold prices retreated from record levels and dropped by ₹2,400 to ₹1,32,400 per 10 grams in the national capital Saturday, even as buyers flocked to jewellery stores across the country on Dhanteras, marking the start of the Diwali festival. According to the All India Sarafa Association, the precious metal of 99.9 per cent purity had surged by ₹3,200 to touch an all-time high of ₹1,34,800 per 10 grams Friday. In the local bullion market, gold of 99.5 per cent purity also saw a sharp pullback, depreciating by ₹2,400 to ₹1,31,800 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes). It had touched a lifetime high of ₹1,34,200 per 10 grams in the previous session.

Pre-bookings, now 15 per cent of business (up from negligible last year), were led by silver.

"Gold sales volume will de cline 12 per cent year-on-year due to 40 per cent higher prices but value rises 20-25 per cent. In silver, volume is similar to last year, but with prices up over 100 per cent, we expect more than double the business. he noted. India is the world's second-largest gold consumer and one of the largest importers globally, after China.

"We are inviting other large

players to come and set up the computer facility in India. Once we have the computer, then the ability to do good research and the ability to develop Al applications will significantly increase. So Google has come with a \$15 billion investment. I think Meta is also working on another investment," Vaish naw said.
