

CM lays stones for 471 GP offices

Disburses first instalment of Antyodaya Gruha Yojana to 48,693 beneficiaries across state

Bhubaneswar, Oct 19: In a bid to further strengthen the administrative outreach and service delivery in rural areas, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi performed on virtual mode the groundbreaking ceremonies for 471 gram panchayat (GP) offices in 28 districts, except for Nuapada and Kalahandi, and distributed the first installment under Antyodaya Gruha Yojana across the state.

The CM described these offices as "new temples of service", which would function as onestop service centres, ensuring respect, convenience, and timely solutions to citizens under one roof. "Service is our government's core principle," said Majhi, emphasising that under the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, GPs are being developed as centres

for public welfare and service. "Each gram panchayat office will be built with ₹35 lakh, funded through a partnership between the Union and state governments. These offices will have dedicated rooms for sarpanchs, panchayat executive officers, junior engineers, gram rozgar sevaks, and accountant-cum-data entry operators, ensuring all services are available under one roof," he said.

During the programme



held at the Chief Minister's Conference Hall in Lok Seva Bhawan, Majhi disbursed the first instalment of financial assistance to 48,693 beneficiaries under Antyodaya Gruha Yojana, providing secure and dignified housing for economically weaker and marginalised families not yet selected under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Gramin (PMAY-G).

Under this state scheme, the government will provide ₹1.20 lakh financial assistance to beneficiaries for building pucca houses. "A total of ₹7,550 crore has been allocated for the financial years from 2024-25 to 2027-28 for construction of five lakh houses. Excluding Nuapada and Kalahandi, 48,693 beneficiaries across 28 districts have received ₹40,000 each as the first instalment, totalling ₹194.77 crore. Beneficiaries will receive ₹65.000 in the second installment and ₹15,000 in the third, making a total of ₹1.2 lakh per beneficiary," Majhi said.

Anti-Trump protests sweep US cities

Washington, Oct 19: Large crowds of protesters marched and rallied in cities across the US Saturday for "No Kings" demonstrations decrying what participants see as the government's swift drift into authoritarianism under President Donald Trump.

People carrying signs with slogans such as "Nothing is more patriotic than protesting" or "Resist Fascism" packed into New York City's Times Square and rallied by the thousands in parks in Boston, Atlanta and Chicago. Demonstrators



marched through Washington and downtown Los Angeles and picketed outside capitols in several Republican-led states, a courthouse in Billings, Montana, and at hundreds of smaller public spaces.

Trump's Republican Party disparaged the demonstrations as "Hate America" rallies, but in many places the events looked more like a street party. There were marching bands, a huge banner with the US Constitution's "We The People" preamble that people could sign. It was the third mass mobilisation since Trump's return to the White House. Trump, meanwhile, was spending the weekend at his Mar-a-Lago home in Florida.

"They say they're referring to me as a king. I'm not a king," President Trump said in a Fox News interview that aired early Friday, before he departed for a \$1 million-per-plate MAGA Inc fundraiser at his club.

Man kills youth for molesting daughter

Parjang, Oct 19: A man allegedly murdered a youth after he reportedly found him molesting his minor daughter near a nullah at Mundasahi Mohanpasi village under Parjang police limits in Dhenkanal district

Saturday, police said. The incident came to the fore after accused Rupa Pingua surrendered before Dadraghati outpost police, and narrated about the happenings Sunday. The victim was identified as Karunakar Behera, a resident of Colony No-1 under

the police outpost. Based on his statements, Dadraghati OIC Bikash Chandra Behera detained Rupa and launched an investigation. Later, police launched a search operation at Gambharia nullah and recovered the body.

A scientific team rushed to the crime scene for investigation, as Parjang IIC Dhiren Kumar Behera, Dadraghati OIC and ASI Ajay Samal intensified the probe. The body was sent to Parjang community health centre (CHC) for postmortem even as a murder case was registered in this connection. The incident occurred when the deceased had gone near the nullah. Sources said Karunakar spotted Rupa's minor daughter there and tried to molest her when the latter screamed for help. Hearing the screams, the girl's father, along with some other villagers, rushed there to help her. Seeing Rupa fast approaching him, Karunakar jumped into the nullah and tried to save himself.

However, Rupa hurled a stone at Karunakar which struck his earlobe. Rupa also jumped into the nullah and allegedly crushed Karunakar in the muck.

SC: Non-implementation of 8.82L orders alarming

New Delhi, Oct 19: The Supreme Court has expressed serious concern over non-implementation of more than 8.82 lakh judgements passed by courts across the country in civil disputes, terming the situation as "highly disappointing" and "alarming".

A bench of Justices JB Pardiwala and Pankaj Mithal made the remarks while reviewing the compliance of its March 6 order that had directed all High Courts to instruct civil courts within their jurisdiction to decide "execution petitions" within six months.

"Execution petitions" are the pleas filed by decree holders, who have won the civil disputes, seeking enforcement of the verdicts.

The court had also made it clear that presiding officers would be



held liable for any delay in presiding with its directive.

"The statistics which we have received are highly disappointing. The figures of the pendency of the execution petitions across the country are alarming. As on date, 8,82,578 execution petitions are pending across the country," the bench said. The bench said in the last six months from March 6, a total of 3,38,685 such petitions have been decided and disposed of.

The bench, in its October 16 order, said, "As observed in our

main judgement, after the decree is passed, if it is going to take years and years to execute the decree, then it makes no sense and would be nothing short of travesty of justice.

The top court said it is once again requesting all the High Courts to evolve some procedure and guide their respective district judiciary for effective and expeditious disposal of the execution petitions which are pending as on date.

The apex court, however, observed that "unfortunately, the Karnataka High Court has failed to furnish us with the necessary data in this regard.'


"Asking the apex court registry to once again give a reminder to the Karnataka High Court to provide the data regarding the disposal of the execution petitions

in the last six months and the pendency of it as on date.

"The Registrar General of the High Court of Karnataka owes an explanation why he has failed to provide us with the necessary information. Two weeks' time is granted to the registrar general of the high court to offer his explanation in this regard," it said

Posting the matter for reporting further progress April 10 next year, the court said that it wanted complete figures from all the High Courts regarding the status of execution petitions the way they have forwarded.

"When this matter is notified once again April 10, 2026, we want all the HCs on their original side also to furnish the necessary information as regards the pending execution petitions as well as disposal of the same," it said.



Napoleonic jewels stolen from Louvre


Paris, Oct 19: Thieves broke into Paris' Louvre museum through a window Sunday, stealing "priceless' items of jewellery, including pieces from the jewellery collection of Napoleon and the Empress, before escaping on motorbikes, the French government said.

"A robbery took place this morning at the opening of the Louvre Museum.' Rachida Dati wrote on X. The Louvre said it would close "for exceptional reasons,' offering no further details on the heist. No injuries were reported.

Dati said she was on site and that an investigation was underway.

French daily 'Le Parisien' reported that the criminals entered the world's most visited museum and former palace via the Seine-facing facade, where construction is underway.

They reportedly stole "nine pieces from the jewellery collection of Napoleon and the Empress," the newspaper said.







Naveen may campaign for two days in Nov 1st week

Nuapada, Oct 19: A day after the ruling BJP held a rally here, the opposition BJD organised a padayatra and public gathering Sunday to display its strength ahead of candidate Snehangini Chhuria filing her nomination for the upcoming bypoll in the Nuapada Assembly segment. Party sources said Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik is likely to hit the campaign trail November 6 and 7 to canvass support for Chhuria.

Though the Congress has accused the BJD of having a deal' with the BJP, the rally demonstrated a full-scale campaign by the regional party to retain its stronghold. Nuapada constituency had long been held by the BJD headed by Naveen Patnaik since 2009, apart from a brief disruption in 2014 when the BJP's Basant Panda won.

The Nuapada bypoll was triggered by the death of four-time local MLA and ex-minister Raiendra Dholakia on September 8. His son's switch to the BJP prompted the BJD to nominate Chhuria, a former Baragarh legislator, to contest the seat. She

will file her papers Monday. Accompanied by hundreds of party workers and leaders, Chhuria held the rally from the Shiv temple of Nuapada. "What you see today is not BJD's show of strength. Bhubaneswar, Oct 19: Thousands of State Selection Board (SSB) lecturers serving in aided colleges across the state held a peaceful protest at Lower PMG here Sunday, demanding parity in pay with government colleges.

Organised under the banner of the Odisha State Lecturers Association (OSLA), over 1,000 lecturers from various aided colleges across the state participated in the agitation.

The lecturers alleged that de spite possessing higher qualifications, their salaries were lower than those of school teachers and sought "equal pay for equal work" along with official government recognition on par with lecturers in government

Their primary demand is revision of grade pay from ₹4,600 to ₹6.000 with retrospective effect from 2016.

According to OSLA, this is not their first protest — the association has earlier held peaceful demonstrations for grade pay revision.

SSB lecturers protest pay disparity in City

The association expressed hope that the BJP government, which had promised "equal pay for equal work" during the elections, would now fulfill that commitment.

"We were selected through a fair, transparent, and merit-based recruitment process conducted by the SSB," said OSLA representatives.

They added, "We serve as lecturers in various aided degree colleges across the state, performing the same duties and responsibilities as our counterparts in government colleges. Many of us hold PhD and MPhil degrees and have cleared NET and JRF examinations, yet we continue to be denied official recognition and correspond

The lecturers pointed out that prior to 1989, the pay scale for college lecturers ranged between ₹700-1,600 and ₹1,350-2,975. In 1989, the scale was revised to ₹2,200-4,000, ensuring parity between aided and government college lecturers.

Subsequent revisions in 1996 and 2006 upgraded the pay scale to ₹15,600-39,100 with a grade pay of ₹5,400, which was later raised to ₹6,000.

However, the lecturers said that during the 2016 SSB recruitment, the newly appointed lecturers were given a lower grade pay of ₹4,600, a disparity that continues to this day.

OSLA described the issue as a governmental anomaly and an open violation of Rule 9, Chapter 3 of the Odisha Education (Recruitment and Conditions of Service of Teachers and Employees of Aided Educa tional Institutions) Rules, 1974, which guarantees equal pay for equal work.

The association's key de mands inclusion of House Rent Allowance (HRA) and official government recognition, en hancement of retirement benefits and gratuity, amendment of Section 7C of the Odisha Education Act, 1974, independent leave entitlement for women lecturers, time-bound promotions, and recognition as Assistant Professors.

The protest was led and coordinated by OSLA vice-president Manas Ranjan Sahoo, general secretary Gaurav Sharma, joint secretary Tulasi Raut, treasurer Gayadhar Mallick, and joint treasurer Tathagata Raut.





Trumpian Dilemma

fter showing admirable and decisive toughness in defusing the crisis in the Middle East, US President Donald Trump has been going back and forth when it comes to dealing with the Russia-Ukraine conflict. For some time, he has been saying that he wants to see the war Russia imposed on Ukraine to come to an end. But to achieve it, the US President needs to show firm resolve, the way he did in reining in Israel and browbeating Hamas into abjuring violence. However, his tough resolve dissolves when it comes to dealing with Russian President Vladimir Putin.

This is disappointing since Trump had acknowledged the futility of the Anchorage Summit held in August in Alaska where he virtually rolled out the red carpet to the Kremlin leader without obtaining anything in return. Again, Trump threatened October 13 to supply Tomahawk cruise missiles to Kyiv if Putin did not end his aggression. The message sent was that the US president was determined to confront a leader who understands tough language. But all his resolve to take on Putin seemed to wilt following a lengthy phone call with him on October 16. Reports indicate Putin managed to regain the upper hand during that conversation. He dangled the prospect of another meeting at a different place. The venue – Hungary - does not cause any surprise since this is a country ruled by his friend and follower Prime Minister Viktor Orban on whom he can count for support.

What happened the following day is even worse. For, while receiving the Ukrainian President at the White House October 17, Trump simply reneged on his promise to supply the cruise missiles to Ukraine citing insufficient US stockpiles and a desire to avoid "escalation." Such behaviour appears shocking when one considers the fact that Putin showed no such hesitation in the weeks following the Anchorage Summit and unleashed unprecedented bombardments on Ukraine's cities and civilian infrastructure.

At that time Trump resorted to equivocation and declared on his social media platform that "it is time to stop the killing and make a DEAL." He thus tried to adopt a position of maintaining equidistance between the two warring countries which effectively put the aggressor and the victim on the same level. The fallout has been a policy paralysis for more than eight months and Russia has continually exploited the situation. Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy visited White House last time in a less hostile atmosphere than during his February visit and urged friendly countries to put pressure on Putin as the only way to bring peace to Ukraine. The promise of providing the Tomahawk missiles was hailed by Ukraine and its European allies as an attempt to mount pressure on Russia. These weapons are much needed for Ukraine's arsenal. Adding to this military pressure, Trump used the threats of sanctions since returning to the White House. But he has not followed through with these threats. He had heaped insults on Zelenskyy during their tense February meeting in the Oval Office when he had admonished his Ukrainian counterpart, saying among other things, that he did not "hold the cards."

Trump uses the metaphor of cards too often in keeping with his image of being a transactional President for whom the presidency appears to be nothing more than deal making. He is now expected to play his own cards well and get tangible results for the Russia-Ukraine conflict the way he has opened the doors for peace in the Arab world.

GUJARAT PARADOX

ujarat supposedly the most prosperous state and a dynamic economic model for the country sprung a surprise with a fast reshuffle through resignations of 16 ministers and swift induction of 25, 12 first-time MLAs, days before Diwali.

It may be indicator of the developments below the surface. The quick fix solution is necessitated also by a Gujarati belief that the fortnight following the Diwali considered inauspicious. In a Congress-ruled system such reshuffles were not unknown. That's the BJP rarely do. Is it an indicator of a tempest?

The sudden resignation on October 16 of the entire Gujarat cabinet, except for Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel, is stated to be a strategic move to address administrative inefficiencies, counter anti-incumbency sentiment, and strengthen its position before upcoming local elections.

No strange is the phenomenal rise of Harsha Sanghavi, a Jain, as deputy CM, to hold the home ministry, so far, a domain of the CM. He is the sixth deputy CM since the times of Chimanbhai Patel.

industrial Gujarat's strength, fiscal prudence, and infrastructure prowess routinely earn top ranks in national indices. Yet, beneath the veneer of prosperity, NITI Aayog's data and other official reports reveal a troubling paradox: Gujarat's economic progress has not translated into commensurate gains in human development. Recent data compiled by RBI reveals that MP and Gujarat have the lowest daily wages in India.

Talking about the positives, Gujarat boasts one of India's most diversified industrial bases, leading in chemicals, pet-



On one hand, the state showcases India's most successful economic management and industrial expansion; on the other, it reveals stubborn deficits in human well-being

rochemicals, pharmaceuticals, textiles, and gems and jewellery. It contributes over one-third of India's chemical output and 62 per cent of petrochemical production, supported by major ports like Kandla, Mundra, and Dahej. With over 33 lakh MSMEs, the state sustains strong job creation and exports.

In 2023–24, Gujarat emerged as India's top destination for bank-funded projects, reflecting investor confidence and policy stability. Handling 40 per cent of India's cargo and 30 per cent of exports, Gujarat remains among NITI Aayog's top performers.

But NITI Aayog's National Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) and human development studies tell a different story. The same data that praise Gujarat's fiscal prudence also expose the fault lines of social inequality and poor human outcomes.

Despite its prosperity, Gujarat has one of the highest rates of malnutrition among major Indian states. The National MPI 2015–16 to 2019–21 found that 38 per cent of the popula-

tion is undernourished. In rural areas, nearly half of all residents face nutritional deprivation, pointing at weaknesses in food distribution, health access, and household income.

August 2025 reports indicate that 7,269 Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) had shut down in Gujarat over the previous five years, resulting in over 33,000 job losses.

The report also noted that 23.3 per cent of the state's population lives in inadequate housing. In rural Gujarat, substandard housing conditions prevail in districts like Dahod, Narmada, and Chhota Udepur—regions that have not shared the same growth momentum as the industrial hubs of Ahmedabad, Surat, and Vadodara.

The contrast is striking: while cities such as Surat boast some of India's highest per capita incomes, Dahod remains among the most impoverished districts in the country.

While Gujarat's poverty intensity has declined over time, its headcount ratio remains higher than those of Telangana, Maharashtra, and Tamil Nadu. The state's rapid industrialisation has not generated inclusive employment or social mobility at the scale required to lift all regions equally.

The labour market, though vibrant in manufacturing and ports, still lacks balance in quality jobs, social protection, and wage parity.

The word "convoluted" captures the Gujarat paradox. On one hand, the state showcases India's most successful economic management and industrial expansion; on the other, it reveals stubborn deficits in human well-being.

The NITI Aayog indices collectively paint a picture of dual realities. High economic growth has not automatically improved nutrition, housing, or social equality. The social sectors and welfare remain underfunded.

The so-called "Gujarat Model" has long been hailed as a template for other states. Yet, the model's focus on industrial output and ease of business has come at the cost of welfare investments and equitable distribution hurting human development.

NITI Aayog's SDG India Index further highlights Gujarat's uneven performance. While it scores high on "Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure," it lags on "Zero Hunger" and "Good Health and Well-being." These contrasts suggest that economic growth alone is insufficient without strong social policies to ensure that benefits reach all segments of the population. The data expose a critical policy challenge. Gujarat must channel its fiscal surplus and industrial strength toward improving health, education, housing, and nutrition.

AI is hollowing out higher education

odern AI technologies severely impede humans' ability to learn and retain skills, while also making it nearly impossible for academics and other experts to cultivate and disseminate knowledge. Many scholars, including us, have highlighted the threat posed by techno-solutionism in education: Rather than expanding our intellectual horizons, these technologies undermine the very conditions that allow us to think for ourselves. The corporations profiting

The corporations profiting from AI – including Microsoft, OpenAI, Nvidia, and ASML – have a vested interest in maintaining the current hype. Their oligopolistic control over both hardware and software depends on the exaggerated claim that cognitive labor can be fully outsourced to their models.

In reality, the apparent achievements of these systems rest on the wholesale theft of humans' intellectual labor. Most notably, large language models (LLMs) have been trained by scraping books and scholarly works without the authors' or publishers' consent, fragmenting and remixing them into patchwork plagiarism packaged as human-like responses.

According to the AI industry's narrative, all human creativity, innovation, and

knowledge are essentially automatable, rendering people obsolete. Even advocates of "human-centered AI" assume this to be true.

Yet studies in automation and cognitive science, together with the long history of AI boom-and-bust cycles, demonstrate that sweeping claims of near-total automation are exaggerated, self-defeating, and toxic. Automation – even when it works – must operate at a much lower level than these companies suggest to succeed without eroding the skills and agency of human operators.

Ultimately, the collective strategy of AI companies threatens to deskill precisely those people who are essential for society to function. What value, after all, is there in automating art, thinking, or reading – especially in educational and academic settings? None. On the contrary, automation of knowledge and culture by private companies is a worrying prospect – conjuring dystopian and outright fascistic scenarios.

The deskilling, denigration, and displacement of teachers and scholars have historically been central to fascist takeovers, since educators serve as bulwarks against propaganda, anti-intellectualism, and illiteracy. Today, AI advocates do not merely assume automation is necessary; they

aggressively proselytize their faith, thereby paving the way for techno-fascism.

Academics exist, in part, to speak truth to power, which requires their independence from government and corporate influence. The United States today demonstrates the consequences of hollowing out academic freedom. critical thinking, and impartiality, as President Donald Trump's administration and Big Tech companies collaborate to undermine academic institutions' ability to sustain the kind of scientific work that exposes AI's false promises.

Worse still, the techno-fascist assault on universities increasingly comes from within. In recent years, the AI industry has captured university administrations, co-opted faculty unions, and even enlisted individual teachers and researchers to promote its tools to colleagues and students. Far from offering genuine solutions, these technologies exacerbate social injustices and corrode the ecosystem of human knowledge.

To sustain the latest iteration of the AI con, the industry relies on anthropomorphic sleight of hand – claiming that models "think," "reason," and "learn" to suggest cognitive abilities they demonstrably lack and may never develop. This rhetorical trick not only

exaggerates the products' capabilities but also dehumanizes people by falsely humanizing machines, which is why many educators and students have begun to reject AI.

In response, the AI industry has lobbied government agencies to mandate the use of its products, claiming that without them, students will be unprepared for the job market. What is actually needed is the opposite: scholars with expertise in AI-related fields must have the freedom to critique these technologies, while those in other fields must be able to teach without interference by companies seeking to cash in.

Industry agendas – whether the industry is tobacco, petroleum, pharmaceuticals, or tech – rarely align with human welfare or disinterested research, especially when left unchecked and unregulated. Instead, their interests are maximizing profit and market power. The AI industry is no different, and educators should repudiate its false promises.

Strategic recalibration

Sir, Apropos, "India, Pak in war of words", Orissa POST, October 19. The escalating war of words between India and Pakistan has once again stirred regional tension, hinting at deeper strategic undercurrents. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh's strong assertion that "every inch of Pakistan's territory lies within the range of India's BrahMos missiles" drew a sharp reaction from Pakistan's Army Chief, Field Marshal Asim Munir, who warned that Pakistan would deliver a "decisive response" to any provocation. The exchange, though rhetorical, reflects rising friction between the two nuclear-armed neighbours amid heightened border vigilance and shifting geopolitical alignments. Analysts view these statements not merely as verbal posturing but as signals of strategic recalibration on both sides. India's emphasis on military self-reliance and advanced deterrence capabilities through indigenous weapon systems like BrahMos has clearly unsettled Islamabad. Pakistan's counterstatement seeks to reassure its domestic audience and project parity. Yet, beneath these public exchanges may lie renewed military preparedness and policy assertiveness. The sharp rhetoric underscores that the uneasy peace across the Line of Control remains fragile, and the verbal sparring could be a precursor to more intense diplomatic or military maneuvering in the subcontinent.

Banke Bihari temple's treasury room opens after 49 years

Mathura (UP), Oct 19: The "Toshkhana' (treasury) of the Banke Bihari temple in Mathura, which had been locked since 1971, was opened Saturday on the orders of a high-powered committee constituted by the

The 'Toshkhana' is the room located adjacent to the temple's sanctum sanctorum.

The Supreme Court, in its August 2025 order, had constituted a 12-member high-powered interim committee headed by retired Allahabad High Court judge Ashok Kumar to look after the day-to-day affairs of the temple.

"The room was opened under the supervision of a civil judge junior division with other members, including four Goswami members. There was some difficulty in opening the room. The process started at 1 pm and was finished at 5 pm, when the room was sealed again. Some brass utensils and wooden items were found, and no precious metal was found. Some boxes and wooden boxes were also found," ADM (Finance and Revenue) Dr Pankaj Kumar Verma said.

Most of the work is complete, the room may be opened on the next date decided by the civil judge junior division for completion of the remaining work,



the ADM said. The auditor's team has made an inventory of the items found in the room, he added. The Goswami community was opposing the move. A

member of the high-powered committee, Shailendra Goswami, said the room shouldn't have been opened in the first place. "I have opposed the move

Honourable Supreme Court constituted it to ensure facilitation of 'darshans' to devotees only. The committee should not interfere elsewhere. They are taking undue advantage and usurping authority. Why are they opening the room, and what do they want to prove?" Shailendra Goswami said.

Echoing their concern, Supreme Court lawyer and temple sewayat (servitor) Sumit Goswami said this interim committee was not given the powers to open the 'Toshkhana'; they were supposed to look after the devotees' concerns, and ensure the ease of 'darshan' of

Shree Bankey Bihari Thakur. Moreover, live streaming of the process was not done, he claimed. However, Shailendra Goswami said that videography was done. One Goswami member of the high-powered committee, Srivardhan Goswami, was not present due to health reasons, he added.

Gyanendra Goswami, a functionary at the Banke Bihari temple, raised concerns about the opening of the room, and said the process should have been undertaken in a more transparent way. Ayodhya (UP), Oct 19: Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath Sunday hit out at the opposition parties over their stance on the Ram Janmabhoomi movement, and said now "lamps are being lit where bullets were once fired"

After inaugurating the ninth Deepotsav in Ayodhya Sunday, where he performed 'Rajyabhishek' (coronation) of Ram and Sita, including 'pujan', 'vandana', and 'aarti', Adityanath also slammed the Opposition for "rejecting" the invitation for the consecration ceremony of Ram temple in January 2024.

"During the Ram Janmabhoomi movement in this very Ayodhya, Congress said Ram is a myth, while the Samajwadi Party fired bullets at Ram devotees," he alleged.

"Today, Uttar Pradesh does not have to face an identity crisis. We are now lighting lamps where bullets were once fired,' Adityanath said.

The chief minister was referring to the police firing on 'Kar Sevaks' in Ayodhya during the Ram temple agitation in 1990, when the Samajwadi Party (SP) was in power with Mulayam Singh Yadav at the helm.

The firing became a hot political issue with the BJP accusing the SP government of appeasement politics - a charge that Adityanath reiterated subtly by recalling the incident.

Criticising the opposition for turning down the invitation for the consecration ceremony, the chief minister said, "These are the same people who prostrate at Babar's grave, but when

'Today, lakhs of lamps are lit in Ayodhya, which has become a symbol of the resolve of every Indian. These are not just lamps, they also symbolise the victory of faith over 500 years of darkness," Adityanath said, according to a press statement.

'Marvada Purushottam Shri Ram was seated in a tent then. but now as the ninth edition of Deepotsav takes place, Shri Ram is seated in his magnificent temple. Adityanath also said that Deepotsav is proof that no politics can imprison faith.

students failed in last 4 yrs

New Delhi, Oct 19: Under the 'NIOS Project,' an average of 70 per cent of students who took the 10th grade examination have failed in the last four years — this was revealed by the Delhi's Directorate of Education (DoE) in response to a Right to Information (RTI) application filed by PTI.

The project was launched by the Delhi government to reduce the rate of students failing in the 9th and 10th grades and the number of students dropping out of school.

Under this project, students who fail in the 9th and 10th grades and those who are weak in academics are registered with the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) and separate classes are held for them.

According to information received from the DoE, in 2024. 7,794 students were registered for the 10th grade under the 'NIOS Project', of whom only 37 per cent, i.e., 2,842, passed the examination.

The Directorate informed that 8,563 children were registered in 2017, 18,344 in 2018, 18,624 in 2019, 15,061 in 2020, 11,322 in 2021, 10,598 in 2022 and 29,436 in 2023 under the project. As per the information received through RTI, only 3,748 students could pass the examination in 2017, 12,096 in 2018, 17,737 in 2019, 14,995 in 2020, 2,760 in 2021, 3,480 in 2022 and 7,658 in 2023. This shows that in the last four years, only 30% of NIOS students passed

Under this project, students who fail in the 9th and 10th grades and those who are weak in academics are registered with the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) and separate classes are held for them

The principals of the respective schools are responsible for registering students under this scheme. For students registering under the NIOS Project, an examination fee of Rs 500 per subject has been set. If a subject includes practicals, such as painting, home science or computer science, an additional Rs 120 is required for each practical subject.

In addition, the registration fee for five subjects is Rs 500, with an additional Rs 200 per subject, and a separate Rs 230 per subject is charged for Transfer of Credit (TOC).

A teacher from a govern ment school in Delhi, speaking on condition of anonymity said. "There are two main rea sons behind children's failure The first is no coordination."

He explained that teachers associated with the project do not inform the parents of registered children whether their children are attend ing school or not. Another reason, he said, is that students involved in the project do not experience the same school environment as other children, as teachers do not hold classes for academically weaker students.

Besides this, a major factor is that the principals, to improve their school's 10th-grade results, enrol students in NIOS who are weak in their studies This separates these children from other students, the teacher pointed out.

GRAP Stage 2 curbs kick in as Delhi's air turns 'very poor'

New Delhi, Oct 19: The Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) has invoked Stage II of the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) across Delhi-NCR as the city's air quality slipped into the "very poor" category, with the AQI crossing 300 mark.

The move came after the Sub-Committee on GRAP Saturday reviewed the worsening pollution levels and forecasts by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) and the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM), which warned of further deterioration in the coming days.

"The AQI of Delhi has shown an increasing trend since morning and has been recorded as 296 at 4 pm and 302 at 7 pm," the CAQM said, directing authorities to implement all Stage II measures with immediate effect, in addition to Stage I actions already in force since October 14. The Centre's air quality panel also asked all implementing agencies to keep strict vigil, particularly on dust mitigation and to ensure compliance with targeted timelines laid down under the comprehensive policy to curb air pollution in NCR.

Under Stage II of GRAP, several curbs and intensified actions include daily mechanical or vacuum sweeping and water sprinkling on identified roads, preferably before peak traffic hours, to control dust. Construction and demolition sites face intensified inspections to ensure strict enforcement of dust control measures To promote cleaner mobili-

ty, the GRAP Stage II mandates augmentation of public transport services through additional CNG and electric buses and increased frequency of metro services, along with differential fare rates to encourage off-peak travel.

Resident welfare associations (RWAs) are required to provide electric heaters to staff such as guards, gardeners and sanitation workers to prevent open burning of biomass and solid waste during winters.


Guwahati, Oct 19: Even a month after Zubeen Garg's death, people in Assam continue to mourn his loss and seek answers on the final moments of the singer.

"We are all waiting peacefully to know what happened. People of Assam are waiting to know what happened in his last moments," Garima added.

Italian opera singer Gioconda Vessichelli, with whom Garg had collaborated for his vet-to-be released movie, also reached Guwahati to pay tributes to the cultural icon.

"Zubeen da used to say that she (Garima) is his tigress, who stood by him in good and

bad times. And he was right," Vessichelli said, standing alongside Garima. She recalled her earlier visit to Guwahati to shoot with Garg, when she came into contact with his

"There is so much love in the family. I feel Zubeen da is here. I already feel the gods have done justice to Zubeen Garg, Vessichelli added, referring to lakhs of people coming out to pay their last respects to the singer's mortal remains and participating in his funeral procession.

Fans came in cars and buses to be at the final resting site of Garg, which has been drawing visitors for the last one month.

'We are a group of over 100 people and booked two buses. We wanted to be here with Zubeen da and pay our homage," said a woman who had come from Boko in Kamrup district. Another group of women from West Karbi Anglong district arrived with a framed photograph of Garg as a mark of respect. People brought 'gamosas' (Assamese scarf) with lyrics of his songs written, his photographs and other items, besides lighting earthen lamps and incense sticks, in front of his cremation site

NMC okays 10,650 MBBS seats, 41 new colleges

New Delhi, Oct 19: In a significant move aligned with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's pledge on Independence Day 2024 to create 75,000 new medical seats over five years, the National Medical Commission (NMC) has approved 10,650 new MBBS seats for the academic year 2024-25

This increase is part of a broader strategy to enhance the availability of medical education in India.

The addition of 41 new medical colleges has also brought the total number of medical institutions in the country to 816. According to NMC Chief Dr Abhijat Sheth, out of the 170 applications received for expanding undergraduate (UG) seats, comprising 41 from government colleges and 129 from private institutions, a total of 10,650 MBBS seats have been approved.

This will raise the overall MBBS seat count to 1,37,600 for the 2024-25 academic year, including seats in Institutes of National Importance (INI). For postgraduate (PG) courses, the NMC has received over 3.500 applications for new and renewed seats.

Dr Sheth stated that the commission expects an increase of around 5,000 PG seats, taking the total to 67,000 PG seats nationwide. The overall increase in both UG and PG seats this year will be approximately 15,000.

While the final approval process and counselling have experienced some delays, offi cials have assured that these procedures will be completed within the prescribed timelines

A blueprint detailing the schedule for accreditation, examinations, and seat matrix approvals for the upcoming academic year will be pub-

lished soon. Additionally, the portal for 2025-26 applications is set to open in early November. Notably, Dr Sheth high-

In an effort to enhance the quality of medical education, Dr Sheth also announced that the NMC is exploring the integration of clinical research into the mainstream medical curriculum. Plans are underway for a

Thiruvananthapuram, Oct 19: Four years ago, at just 24, Remya P's life seemed to be falling apart. She was a widow, a cancer patient, and a mother of two small children with no job and no safe place to call home.

Living in Chavara village in Kerala's southern Kollam district, she faced daily struggles. Her fight was not just against the disease, but also against joblessness, the constant worry of how to pay for treatment and keep a roof over her familv's head.

Her fortunes changed when local panchayat authorities came to know about her plight. They identified her as a beneficiary of the state government's Extreme Poverty Eradication Project (EPEP), a scheme designed to help those in the most

dire circumstances.

Today, she is a cancer survivor. She has a steady job working at a panchayat helpdesk and, crucially, her family now lives securely in a house provided by the government's LIFE housing programme.

Spearheaded by the Local Self Government Department, the flagship programme envisions achieving the goal by addressing food, income, health, education and shelter as critical distress factors of vulnerable people.

After uplifting over 64,006 families living under extremely poor conditions in the state by ensuring them uninterrupted supply of food, healthcare, a source of livelihood and safe housing, Kerala is now all set to be declared as the first "extreme poverty-free state" in the country November 1, the state

LSGD Minister M B Rajesh said it is a proud moment for the state as Kerala stands first in the country and second in the world after China in terms of successful eradication of extreme poverty

The 64,006 families, comprising 1,03,099 individuals, identi-

fied as extremely poor through a statewide survey, have now been uplifted by addressing the parameters of food, health, education, livelihood income and housing, the minister explained.

Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan, who conceptualised the project, coordinated various departments in this regard and reviewed its progress at

The integration of various social security schemes of the government and convergence of the activities of various departments at one point through the chief minister was the reason for the success of EPEP, Rajesh said.

The minister said the most marginalised and vulnerable sections of the society, including nomads, who did not even know about the existing government programmes or have no idea how to apply for them, have been identified and covered under the initiative.

A grassroots-level survey carried out to identify the beneficiaries showed that 35 per cent of such households faced income deprivation, 24 per cent experienced health-re-

lated issues, 21 per cent encountered food deprivation, and 15 per cent were deprived of shelter.

Das Raj, a 67-year-old native of Mamkukam village in Idukki, heaved a sigh of relief as he got a newly-built house





Ladakh leaders to hold talks with Centre Oct 22

Leh. Oct 19: Ladakh representatives have accepted the invitation from the Ministry of Home Affairs for a meeting with its sub-committee in Delhi October 22, Leh Apex Body co-chairman Chering Dorje Lakruk said Sunday.

This has ended the monthslong deadlock over talks with the Centre. Three representatives, each of Leh Apex Body (LAB) and Kargil Democratic Alliance (KDA), along with Ladakh MP Mohd Haneefa Jan and their lawyer, will take part in the talks with a focus on their primary demand of statehood and safeguards for the Union Territory under the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution, Lakruk told reporters

On September 29, the LAB announced that it would stay away from talks with the high-powered committee of the MHA, scheduled for October 6, following the killing of four protesters and injuries to many during widespread violence in Leh September 24.

After nearly four months of delay, the Centre September 20 extended an invitation to the LAB and KDA, which have been spearheading the agitation in support of their demands and holding talks with the Centre. The last round of talks between the two sides was held in Mav.

"We were informed by the Home Ministry that a meeting of the sub-committee is scheduled for October 22, and both LAB and KDA are invited to it. We welcome the decision of the government of India to invite us and look forward to the positive outcome of the dialogue,' Lakruk said. Widespread violent protests occurred in Leh on September 24 during a shutdown called by LAB to advance

Woman stabbed to death by ex-partner; husband kills attacker

New Delhi, Oct 19: A pregnant woman was allegedly stabbed to death by her former live-in partner in Delhi's Nabi Karim area before her husband overpowered and killed the attacker, police said

The deceased were identified as Shalini, 22, wife of Aakash and a mother of two, and Aashu alias Shailendra, 34, a "bad character" of Nabi Karim police station, they said.

Aakash, 23, who sustained multiple stab injuries while saving his wife, is undergoing treatment at a hospital, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Central), Nidhin Valsan said, in a statement.

"The incident occurred around 10.15 pm Saturday when Aakash and Shalini were on their way to meet her mother, Sheila, on Qutub Road. Aashu suddenly arrived there and attacked Aakash with a knife," he said.

Aakash managed to dodge the first blow, but Aashu then turned towards Shalini, who was seated in an e-rickshaw, and stabbed her multiple times, police said. Aakash rushed to her rescue but was also stabbed.

He, however, managed to overpower Aashu, snatched his knife and stabbed him during the scuffle, the DCP said. Shalini's brother Rohit and some locals took all three to a hospital. where doctors declared Shalini and Aashu dead, the officer said. "During inquiry, it was found that Shalini was pregnant at the time of her death. Valsan added. The attack took place in full public view on a busy stretch near Qutub Road, triggering panic. Several locals described it as a "gruesome' and "shocking" incident.

"It was horrifying. The man stabbed her multiple times, and everyone was terrified. But no one came to help rescue. It was only her husband who tried to save her," a shopkeeper who witnessed the attack said.

Maha Oppn claims 1cr voters bogus, declares joint rally November 1

"An attempt is being made to finish regional parties. I have learnt that 96 lakh fake voters have been enrolled in the voters' lists in Maharashtra for the upcoming polls. They had also done this during the state polls as well," the MNS chief said.

Prasad's residence in Patna, a government bungalow allotted to his wife Rabri Devi in her capacity as a former chief minister, kept teeming with aspirants and hordes of their supporters, and while those who were lucky erupted in cheers and those whose claims were overlooked chose to vent spleen.

Chandrayaan-2 records 1st proof of Sun's impact on Moon

Chennai, Oct 19: The Chandrayaan-2 mission, launched in 2019, has made the first-ever observation of the effects of the Sun's Coronal Mass Ejection (CME) on the Moon using its onboard scientific instruments, ISRO said Saturday.

This observation help understand the lunar exosphere, very thin atmosphere of the Moon, and the impact of space weather on its surface, the Bengaluru-headquartered space agency said.

Launched July 22, 2019, from Sriharikota using the GSLV-MkIII-M1 rocket, Chandrayaan-2 carried eight experiment payloads. On August 20, 2019, Chandrayaan-2 was successfully inserted into the elliptical orbit around the Moon.

Although communication with the Vikram lander was

lost during its September 7 landing attempt, the Orbiter remains fully operational and continues to function in a 100 km x 100 km orbit around the

According to an ISRO release, one of the payloads (on-

board Chandravan-2). Chan-

dra's Atmospheric Composi-

tional Explorer 2 (CHACE 2)

has recorded the effects of the Coronal Mass ejections from the Sun on the lunar exosphere. The primary objective of the

CHACE-2 payload is to study the composition and distribution of the lunar neutral exosphere and its variability. Coronal Mass Ejections oc-

cur when the Sun ejects significant quantities of its building

material, comprising mostly Helium and Hydrogen ions.

These effects are significant on the Moon, as Moon is an airless body that too deprived of any global magnetic field, the presence of which would have shielded the solar effects on its surface.

"Observations from CHACE-2 showed an increase in the total pressure of the dayside lunar exosphere (very thin atmosphere) when the Coronal Mass Ejection (of the Sun) impacted the Moon. The total number density (number of neutral atoms or molecules present in an environment per unit volume) derived from these observations showed an increase by more than an order of magnitude," the release said.

ISRO further said the rare opportunity to directly observe the effects of a Coronal Mass Ejection (CME) impacting the

Moon occurred May 10, 2024, when a series of CMEs were hurled from the Sun toward the lunar surface.

This increased quantity of the solar coronal mass that impacted on the Moon enhanced the process of knocking off the atoms from the lunar surface, thereby liberating them to the lunar exosphere, which manifested as the enhancement of the total pressure in the sun lit lunar exosphere.

Apart from pushing the edge of scientific understanding about the Moon and the lunar space weather, this observation also indicates the challenges of building scientific bases on the

Lunar base architects need to account for such extreme events, which would temporarily alter the lunar environment. before the effects subside, the release added.

Development Board. "The name of Delhi should be changed back to Indraprastha so that the name of the capital can be associated with its an cient history and culture," VHF Delhi prant secretary Suredra Kumar Gupta said in the letter.

"Names aren't mere chang es; they mirror a nation's consciousness. When we say Delhi, we only see a period of 2,000 years. But when we say Indraprastha, we connect with a glorious history spanning 5,000 years," he said.

The VHP functionary demanded that Delhi's heritage walk should include forts, tem ples, and monuments of Hindu kings to ensure a "balanced presentation" of the city's over all history.

"Wherever there are memorials to Muslim invaders Hindu heroes, sages, and sites from the Pandava period should also be introduced and memorials should be built near them," he said.

A "grand memorial" in the name of King Hemchandra Vikramaditya and a King Hemchandra Vikramaditva Military School should be es tablished in Delhi, Gupta said

The history of Hemchandra Vikramaditya and Indraprastha during the Pandava period should be included in Delhi's education curriculum, he added.

China launches Pak's remote sensing satellite

Beijing: China Sunday launched a Pakistani remote sensing satellite along with two of its own onboard a single rocket, further deepening space cooperation between the two all-weather allies. A Liiian-1 Y8 carrier rocket carrying three satellites -- Pakistan remote-sensing satellite (PRSS-2), AIRSAT 03 and 04 satellites -- was launched from a commercial aerospace innovation pilot zone in northwest China. state-run Xinhua news agency reported. The satellites were successfully placed in the planned orbit, it said. This is the third Pakistani satellite launched by China this year.

Germany to recall ambassador to Georgia

Frankfurt: Germany said Sunday that it would recall its ambassador to Georgia European Union officials on Monday as relations between the bloc and the South Caucasus country fray. "For many months, the Georgian leadership has been agitating against" the EU, Germany and personally against the German ambassador, Ernst Peter Fischer, Germany's foreign ministry said in a post on X. The recall is "for consultations on how to proceed," the German ministry said.

China accuses US of cyber breaches

Beijing: China has accused the US of stealing secrets and infiltrating the country's national time centre, warning that serious breaches could have disrupted communication networks, financial systems, the power supply and the international standard time. The US National Security Agency has been carrying out a cyber attack operation on the National Time Service Center over an extended period of time, China's State Security Ministry said. The ministry said it found evidence tracing stolen data and credentials as far back as 2022, which were used to spy on the staff's mobile devices and network systems

Jerusalem, Oct 19: The Israeli military launched an attack on Gaza Sunday, Israeli media and residents reported, dimming hopes that a US-mediated ceasefire would lead to lasting peace in the enclave as Israel traded blame with Palestinian militant group Hamas.

Israel's attacks Sunday were the most serious test of an already fragile ceasefire, which took effect October 11.

Palestinians in Gaza told Reuters they heard explosions and gunfire in Rafah in the south of the strip and witnesses separately reported heavy gunfire from Israeli tanks in the eastern town of Abassan near Khan Younis, also in southern Gaza.

Witnesses in Khan Younis heard a wave of airstrikes launched into Rafah early Sunday afternoon.

An Israeli government spokesperson, when asked for confirmation of the attacks, deferred to the military. The military had no immediate comment.

Pak, Afghan to form peace mechanism

The situation further deteriorated following repeated terrorist attacks by TTP including one in the restive Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Orakzai district recently, which claimed the lives of 11 military personnel, including a Lt Colonel and a Major.

Japan's LDP, Ishin agree to form coalition government

Deal paves way for Japan's first female PM, Sanae Takaichi

Tokyo, Oct 19: Japan's Liberal Democratic Party and the Japan Innovation Party have broadly agreed to form a coalition government, setting the stage for the country's first female prime minister, Kvodo news agency reported Sunday.

Sanae Takaichi, leader of the conservative LDP, and Hirofumi Yoshimura, head of the smaller right-leaning group known as Ishin, are set to sign an agreement sealing their alliance Monday, Kyodo said. Calls to the LDP and Ishin headquarters to seek comment went unanswered outside busi-

Ishin's co-head, Fumitake Fujita, raised expectations for a deal Friday, saying the two parties had made "big progress" in coalition talks.

Ishin lawmakers will vote for Takaichi in an election to choose the prime minister in parliament on Tuesday, but the party does not plan to send ministers to Takaichi's cabinet, at least initially, Kyodo said.

That would fall short of the full-fledged alliance the LDP maintained with the Komeito party until the junior partner quit the coalition this month, raising concern over the stability of the forthcoming government.

Ishin's Fujita told reporters Sunday evening negotiations were in the final stages and his fellow lawmakers entrusted Yoshimura and himself to make a final decision on the matter for the party.

Palm Beach, Oct 19: President Donald Trump said Sunday he would slash US funding to Colombia because the country's leader "does nothing to stop" drug production, in what is the latest sign of friction between Washington and one of its closest allies in Latin America.

In a social media post, Trump referred to Colombian Presi dent Gustavo Petro as "an illegal drug dealer" who is "low rated and very unpopular." He warned that Petro "better close up" drug operations "or the United States will close them up for him, and it won't be done nicely.'

Trump, while at his Mar-a-Lago resort in Florida, wrote on his Truth Social platform that Petro is "strongly encouraging the massive production of drugs, in big and small fields" across Colombia, which the Republican president spelled as Columbia. "Petro does nothing to stop it, despite large scale payments and subsidies from the USA that are nothing more than a long term rip off of America," Trump said.

Madagascar's Gen Z demand a voice in shaping what comes next

Antananarivo, Oct 19: When an elite army colonel joined Madagascar's Gen Z protests earlier this month, forcing the president to flee the country, youth-movement leader Olivia Rafetison was happy to have the protection of men with guns, after weeks of state repression.

"He said: 'we're for the people, we'll help you, we are by your side'. Malagasy were coming together for the same cause," she said, describing the protests against electricity and water shortages that morphed into an uprising against President Andry Rajeolina.

Days later, Colonel Michael Randrianirina said the army was in charge

"It went from 'protecting



the people' to taking power," Rafetison, 28, told Reuters in downtown Antananarivo. "I'm not saying I'm against it ... But I am a little conflicted.

Randrianirina was sworn in as president on Friday, just three days after taking control of the island nation in the wake of the demonstrations that forced out his predecessor.

He has said the military will rule alongside a civilian government for up to two years be-

fore organising new elections. Rafetison, leader of Movement Gen Z Collective, a coalition of several of the protest groups, is not the only participant in the uprising to feel ambivalent about a man in uniform filling the power vacuum left by Rajeolina's hasty exit. Many wonder if their concerns will be

heeded or, as in the past, ignored. On the night of the coup, Randrianirina received Rafetison and other prominent Gen Z figures. "He said 'we're listening to you," she said, but the soldiers were all tired and soon ended the conversation, suggesting they talk more at a later date.

"I hope they follow up," she said. "Because this isn't the end of the struggle: we're really fighting for system change,

New Delhi: As India revels in the spirit of the festive season, food delivery platforms Swiggy and magicpin have reported a massive surge in orders, highlighting how culinary cravings are now central to the country's celebrations. Magicpin reported a 2.5x spike in bulk and party food delivery orders after Navratri. The momentum continued into the second week of October, with a 30 per cent jump in food delivery orders October 10 compared to regular days.

Glenmark, Dr Reddy's recall products in US

New Delhi: Drugmakers Glenmark and Dr Reddy's Laboratories are recalling products in the US due to manufacturing issues, according to the US Food and Drug Administration (USFDA). As per its latest Enforcement Report, the US health regulator noted that a US-based unit of Glenmark Pharmaceuticals is recalling 26,928 packs of oral contraceptive medication in the US. Mahwah, New Jersey-based Glenmark Pharmaceuticals Inc, USA is recalling the affected lot of Viorele, Desogestrel and Ethinyl Estradiol (USP, 0.15 mg/ 0.02 mg) and Ethinyl Estradiol tablets due to "failed impurities/degradation specifications."

New Delhi, Oct 19: Reflecting a clear trend of market diversification, Indian exporters registered positive growth in 24 countries during the first half of the current fiscal year, even as shipments to the US declined due to high tariffs in September, official data showed.

These 24 countries include Korea, UAE, Germany, Togo, Egypt, Vietnam, Iraq, Mexico, Russia, Kenya, Nigeria, Canada, Poland, Sri Lanka, Oman,



Belgium, Italy and Tanzania.

"24 countries with a total export of \$129.3 billion recorded positive growth in export in April-September 2025-26 as against the same period last fiscal, amounting to a share of 59 per cent of India's exports,' an official said.

During April-September this year, exports increased lion, and imports rose 4.53 per cent to \$375.11 billion, leaving a trade deficit of \$154.99 bil-

However, according to the Commerce Ministry data, India's exports to 16 countries have registered negative growth during the first six months of the current fiscal. These nations account for about 27 per cent (\$60.3 billion) of the country's exports. An exporter said the sweep ing 50 per cent tariff by the US on Indian goods is hurting exports to America, but the exporting community is pushing exports to other geographies. including Africa, Latin Amer ica and the Middle East.

The trend will continue in the coming months as well,' the exporter said.

India's merchandise exports to the US declined by 11.93 per cent to \$5.46 billion in September due to the high tariffs imposed by Washington, according to the data.

During the April-September period of this fiscal, the country's exports to the US increased by 13.37 per cent to \$45.82 billion, while imports rose 9 per cent to \$25.6 billion, the data showed.

The US has imposed a sweeping 50 per cent tariff on Indian goods entering American markets from August 27. The two countries are negotiating a bilateral trade agreement to boost two-way commerce.

The US was the largest trading partner of India in 2024-25.

New Delhi, Oct 19: Gold prices are expected to witness some consolidation and mild correction next week as the recent record-breaking rally looks overstretched and physical demand eases after the festive rush, an-

After hitting fresh highs in global and domestic markets, bullion may trade in a narrow range, with investors eyeing the US funding bill, key global data releases, and remarks from Federal Reserve officials ahead of the October 28-29 policy meeting, they added. "Gold prices are likely to see

some corrections/ consolidation as ongoing fundamentals are already priced in and physical demand wanes post mid-week," Pranay Mer. Vice President. EBG - Commodity & Currency Research, JM Financial Services Ltd, said. He added that traders will monitor key global indicators, including Chinese data, UK inflation, provisional data on PMI from across regions, US consumer confidence and the Fed's commentary ahead of the October 28-29 meeting. Mer

added that gold ended last week on a positive note, supported by festive demand in India and strong ETF buying. "However, a sharp corrective move was seen on Friday, amid profit-booking as the rally looks overstretched now," he said. Last week, gold futures rose by ₹5,644, or 4.65 per cent on the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCX). Prathamesh Mallya, DVP - Research, Non-Agri Commodities and Currencies, Angel One, said the shine in gold prices just does not stop as the momentum has been on the rising side throughout 2025, supported by policy uncertainty, US tariffs, and a slowdown in the American economy.

On the MCX, gold futures for December delivery hit a record of ₹1,32,294 per 10 grams on Friday before closing at ₹1,27,008 ending a five-day record streak

Echoing similar views Karthick Jongadla, investment manager on smallcase and Founder at Quantace Research said, the rally was underpinned by a softer dollar, and easing bond yields, while lingering US-China trade noise and a US data/shutdown fog kept the safe-haven bid supported.

FPIs pump ₹6,480cr into Indian equities

New Delhi, Oct 19: After withdrawing money on a net basis for the past three months, foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) have turned buyers with a ₹6,480 crore investment in October so far, driven by strong macroeconomic

The development comes after persistent outflows in recent times, with FPIs pulling out ₹23,885 crore in September, ₹34,990 crore in August, and ₹17,700 crore in July, data from depositories showed.


The renewed inflow in October marks a significant shift in sentiment and reflects fresh confidence among global investors towards Indian markets. Several key drivers underpin this reversal. According

to Himanshu Srivastava, Principal Manager Research, Morningstar Investment Research India, India's macro backdrop remains relatively strong among emerging markets, with stable growth, manageable inflation, and resilient domestic demand helping the country stand out.

He further noted that global liquidity conditions are gradually easing. with expectations of rate cuts or at least a pause in the US.

As risk appetite returns, funds are flowing back into higher-return emerging markets. Echoing a similar view, Geojit In-

vestments Chief Investment Strategist VK Vijavakumar said the principal reason for this shift in FPIs' strategy is the reduced valuation differential between India and other markets

AUTO EXPORTS RISE IN SECOND QUARTER

New Delhi, Oct 19: Automobile exports from India rose 26 per cent year-onvear in September quarter driven by highest-ever shipments of passenger vehicles, two-wheelers and three-wheelers during the period, as per the latest data released by industry body SIAM (Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers or Service Integration and Management).

Passenger vehicle exports grew 23 per cent to 2,41,554 units in September quarter as against 1,96,196 units in the same period of last fiscal. Passenger car exports

grew 20.5 per cent to 1,25,513 units in the second quarter as against 1,04,196 units in the September quarter of last fiscal. Similarly, utility vehicle shipments rose 26 per cent annually to 1,13,374 units in the July-September period.

Van exports also grew 39 per cent year on year to 2,667 units in the year-ago period. Maruti Suzuki India led the space with shipments of 2,05,763 units followed by Hyundai Motor India with 99,540 units in the period under review. Two-wheeler exports saw an increase of 25 per cent to 12,95,468 units in July-September period as against 10,35,997 units in the yearago period.

 $Scooter\ shipments\ rose$ 12 per cent to 1,77,957 units while motorcycles witnessed a growth of 27 per cent to 11,08,109 units in September quarter.

Moped exports surged to 9,402 units in the second quarter as compared with 2,028 units in the same period last year.

Mcap of seven most valued firms surges

New Delhi: The combined market valuation of seven of the top-10 most valued firms surged by ₹2,16,544.29 crore last week, with Reliance Industries and Bharti Airtel stealing the limelight, in tandem with an optimistic trend in equities. Last week, the BSE benchmark jumped 1,451.37 points or 1.75 per cent. From the top-10 pack, Reliance Industries, HDFC Bank, Bharti Airtel, ICICI Bank, State Bank of India, Bajaj Finance and Hindustan Unilever were the gainers, while Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), Infosys and Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) faced erosion from their valuation. The market valuation of Reliance Industries jumped ₹47,363.65 crore to ₹19,17,483.71 crore, the most among the top-10 firms. Bharti Airtel added ₹41,254.73 crore taking its valuation to ₹11,47,235.08 crore. The market capitalisation (mcap) of ICICI Bank surged by ₹40,123.88 crore to ₹10,26,491.35 crore and that of HDFC Bank rallied ₹33,185.59 crore to ₹15,40,210.78 crore. The valuation of Bajaj Finance climbed ₹28,903.45 crore to ₹6,65,899.19 crore. The mcap of Hindustan Unilever edged higher by ₹17,774.65 crore to ₹6,12,009.78 crore and that of State Bank of India went up by ₹7,938.34 crore to ₹8,20,924.98 crore. However, the valuation of Infosys dropped by ₹30,306.35 crore to ₹5,98,773.87 crore. The mcap of TCS declined by ₹23,807.01 crore to ₹10,71,894.61 crore and that of LIC dipped by

India suffer first ODI defeat of 2025 as Australia take a 1-0 lead in the three-match series

Perth, Oct 19: The grand comeback party of Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma endured a quick 22-ball ending, and their lowkey outing reflected in India's seven-wicket defeat against Australia in the rain-affected first ODI here Sunday

Asked to bat first, India laboured to a sub-par 136 for 9, after the match was revised to 26 overs for a side courtesy several rain interruptions, leaving the hosts to chase a DLS target of 131, which they duly reached in 21.1 overs.

Travis Head fell to Arshdeep Singh early, slashing the leftarm pacer to Harshit Rana at deep third man, and Matthew Short too walked back without any significant contribution.

But skipper and local man Mitchell Marsh (46 not out, 52 balls) used his brute power to keep Australia ahead of the curve with a crucial 55-run partnership with Josh Philippe (37, 29b). The Indian pacers — Arshdeep, Mohammad Siraj and Harshit Rana — could not replicate the control of their Australian counterparts, offering plenty of freebies to the hosts' batters.

Marsh fed on them with glee, crunching a six each of all three. An inside-out smash off Siraj over covers was the highlight. Philippe gave his captain ample support with a busy knock, and his dismissal was a minor irritant in Australia's march, which culminated in them taking 1-0 lead in the three-match series.

MEN IN BLUE DISAPPOINT Earlier, India were robbed of

the momentum by the constant weather interventions and relentless Australian new ball bowlers, except when KL Rahul

(38, 30 balls) was in the middle. But before the skies opened up on several occasions, Aus-

tralian bowlers used the extra bounce on the Optus Stadium pitch to get rid of two old foes. Rohit (8), who was also playing his 500th match for India, walked in alongside new captain Shubman Gill to loud cheers from the Perth crowd, but his stay was snapped after just 14 balls.

Rohit played a sumptuous straight drive off Mitchell Starc, which offered a heady time ride back to the glory days.

Kohli walked in amid even louder cheer, but the familiar ODI greatness was nowhere to be seen. In a pre-match chat, Kohli had detailed how Australia had often brought the best out of him as a batter.

But on this instance, Starc elicited the worst out of Kohli

New Delhi, Oct 19: Olympian Balraj Panwar spearheaded India's impressive show at the 2025 Asian Rowing Championships in Hai Phong, Vietnam, as the country bagged 10 medals including three gold and five silver, marking one of their strongest performances in recent years

Paris Olympian Panwar produced a commanding show to win the gold in the men's single scull (M1X) event.

India's other gold medals came through the lightweight men's double scull (LM2X) pair of Lakshav and Ajav Tvagi. who combined superb rhythm and endurance to dominate their final, and in the men's quadruple scull (M4X), where the quartet of Kulwinder Singh, Navdeep Singh, Satnam Singh and Jakar Khan rowed with perfect coordination to clinch the top spot.

Another highlight of the campaign was Gurbani Kaur and Diliot Kaur ending a 15-year medal drought for Indian women at the Asian Championships by finishing second in the lightweight women's pair (LW2-) event.

Their silver-winning effort, marked by technical precision and sheer grit, was hailed as a breakthrough moment for women's rowing in India and an inspiration for the next generation. India also pocketed silver medals in the men's eight (M8+), where Nitin Deol, Parvinder Singh, Lakhveer Singh, Ravi, Gurpratap Singh, Bheem Singh, Jaswinder Singh, Kulbir and Kiran Singh Maiom powered through a strong field to finish second.

In the men's double scull (M2X), Jaspinder Singh and Salman Khan produced a determined effort to secure silver, while the lightweight men's quadruple scull (LM4X) crew of Rohit, Ujiwal Kumar Singh. Lakshay and Ajay Tyagi added another silver to the tally.

The lightweight men's four (LM4-) team of Sannee Kumar, Iqbal Singh, Babu Lal Yadav and Yogesh Kumar also finished second after a closely fought final.

The bronze medals came in the lightweight men's pair (LM2-), where Nitin Deol and Parvinder Singh displayed great composure to claim third place, and in the women's eight (W8+), where the crew of Gurbani Kaur, Diljot Kaur, Suman Devi, Alenna Anto, Kiran, Poonam and Haobijam Tendenthoi Devi combined effectively to secure a podium finish, rounding off a remarkable campaign.

Messi bags MLS Golden Boot

The legend becomes Miami's first-ever Golden Boot winner and the first Argentine to claim the award since Valentín "Taty" Castellanos did so with New York City FC in 2021

Nashville, Oct 19: Inter Miami CF superstar Lionel Messi has won the 2025 MLS Golden Boot, netting 29 goals to become the league's leading scorer in his second full season with the Herons.

Messi contributed 19 assists as he outperformed LAFC's Denis Bouanga (24 goals) and Nashville SC's Sam Surridge (24 goals).

The Argentine great tallied three goals and provided an assist during Saturday's 5-2 Decision Day victory in Nashville, reaching 48 goal contributions (29 goals, 19 assists) this season - just short of Carlos Vela's MLS record 49 for LAFC in 2019.

Now, Messi appears set to become the league's first-ever player to win consecutive MVP awards, following a historic 2024 campaign that saw Miami claim that year's Supporters' Shield in re-



cord-breaking fashion.

Messi and Miami are the Eastern Conference No 3 seed in the MLS Cup Playoffs, where they'll face No 6 Nashville in a Round One Best-of-3 Series. This year's MLS Cup champion will be crowned December 6

Messi, the most decorated footballer of all time, now adds the MLS Golden Boot to his unparalleled CV. He is the latest in an exclusive list of players to secure the honour since the league's inaugural season in 1996

From 1996 to 2004, the MLS Golden Boot was awarded based on a points system that gave two points for a goal and one for an assist, before switching to solely counting goals.

Earlier this week, Messi became the player with the most assists in men's international football after setting up two goals in Argentina's 6-0 thrashing of Puerto Rico in an international friendly at Chase Stadium. His pair of assists took his international tally to 60, surpassing Neymar and Landon Donovan, who each have 58. With this achievement, Messi is now just three assists short of 400 across his professional career.
