# Gandhi out, G RAM G in



After days of speculations, finally MGNREGA, the flagship rural employment generation scheme introduced by the Congress-led UPA government in 2005, is set to become a thing of past. The Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (Gramin) (VB-G RAM G) Bill, 2025, which seeks to repeal the programme named after Mahatma Gandhi, has been listed in the Lok Sabha in the supplementary list of business issued Monday. Most importantly, the name of Mahatma Gandhi has been dropped and RAM, even if in an abbreviated form has been added to the name of the scheme. Expectedly, Opposition, Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra in particular, questioned the proposed removal of name of a person who is considered the tallest leader not just in the country but in the world. It is worth noting that December 12, several news reports stated that the Union Cabinet had renamed the MGNREGA as the Pujya Babu Gramin Rozgar Yojana. However, the government had not issued any notification regarding this interim name. The initial budget provision for the scheme when it was introduced in 2005-

06 fiscal year was ₹11,000 crore while for the 2025-26 fiscal it has been set at ₹86,000 crore. Meanwhile, the TDP, an ally of Centre's ruling coalition, has indicated that the Bill would place an increased financial burden on the state governments

**New Delhi, Dec 15:** The Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (Gramin) (VB-G RAM G) Bill, 2025 that seeks to replace the existing rural employment law MGNREGA is set to be introduced in the Lok Sabha during the ongoing Winter session of Parliament.

According to a copy of the Bill, it will provide a statutory guarantee of 125 days of wage employment in every financial year to every rural household whose adult members volunteer to undertake unskilled manual work.

Within six months from the date of commencement of the VB-G RAM G Act, states will have to make a scheme consistent with the provisions of the new law.

Under this centrally sponsored scheme, the financial liability would be shared be-

tween the Centre and the state governments. It would be 90:10 for the North-eastern states and Himalayan states and 60:40 for all other states and Union territories with legislature. For the UTs without legislature, the whole cost would be borne by the Centre.

The MGNREGS was a 100 per cent centrally sponsored scheme.

While MGNREGS was a demand-driven scheme with the Union government bound to allocate more money if demand for work was there, under the proposed scheme, the Centre would determine state-wise normative allocation for each financial year. Any expenditure incurred by a state in excess would be borne by the state government.

The new Act focuses on four major types of works – water security (conservation, irrigation, rejuvenation of water bodies, afforestation, etc); core rural infrastructure (activities like construction and upgradation of rural roads, Panchayat Bhawans, Anganwadi, etc); livelihood-related infrastructure creation (creation of assets to enhance rural livelihood like training centres, rural haats, grain storage, etc); and climate adaptation (activities related to disaster risk reduction, climate adaptation).

Rural Development Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, said MGNREGA has provided guaranteed wage-employment to rural households over the past 20 years.

However, “further strengthening has become necessary in view of the significant socio-economic transformation witnessed in the rural landscape,” he said.

## AYURVEDIC, HOMOEOPATHIC STUDENTS GET STIPENDARY HIKE

**Bhubaneswar, Dec 15:** In a significant move to encourage higher education in traditional systems of medicine, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi has announced a substantial hike in stipends for postgraduate (PG) students studying in government Ayurvedic and Homeopathic medical colleges across the state.

The revised stipend structure will come into effect from January 1, 2026, benefiting around 120 PG students enrolled in these institutions.

As per the new decision, first-year PG students will now receive a monthly stipend of ₹48,000, up from the existing ₹31,000, marking a 55 per cent increase.

Second-year students will see their stipend rise from ₹32,000 to ₹52,000, an increase of 62 per cent, while third-year students will receive ₹55,000 per month, up from ₹33,000, reflecting a 67 per cent hike.

## SC miffed over ‘special pujas’ for affluent

**New Delhi, Dec 15:** The Supreme Court Monday expressed unhappiness over the practice of allowing people to do ‘special pujas’ in temples after paying money, disrupting the “resting time” of deity, as it sought a response from authorities on a plea challenging changes in ‘darshan’ timings and temple practices at the famous Bankey Bihari Ji Temple at Vrindavan.

It issued notice to the SC-appointed high-powered temple management committee and the Uttar Pradesh government and listed the matter for further consideration in the first week of January. A bench comprising Chief Justice Surya Kant and justices Joymalya Bagchi and Vipul M Pamcholi took note of the submissions of senior ad-

vocate Shyam Divan and lawyer Tanvi Dubey assailing the change in ‘darshan’ timing of the deity at Bankey Bihari Ji Temple and also stopping of certain essential religious practices.

“These darshan timings are part of tradition and rituals. The timings during which the temple is open to the public are a part of a long tradition,” Divan said.

“The change in temple timings has led to a change in the internal temple rituals, including the timings when the deity wakes up in the morning and sleeps at night,” he said. “What they do is, after closing the temple at 12 noon, they do not allow the deity to rest even for a second and they exploit the deity like anything. The so-called affluent people, those who can afford to pay hefty amounts, are allowed to do special pujas,” the CJI observed orally.

## VFS visa application centre in City soon

**Bhubaneswar, Dec 15:** In a major relief for international travellers from Odisha, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi has approved the establishment of a global visa application centre in Bhubaneswar.

According to a report, VFS Global, a private visa application outsourcing and technology services firm, got the permission to open a visa processing centre in the City.

The proposed centre will oper-

ate from the Baba Saheb Ambedkar Bus Terminal building at Baramunda, with the state government providing 3,000 square feet of space for the facility.

Until now, people from the state were required to travel to cities such as Kolkata, Delhi, and Hyderabad to complete visa-related formalities. The absence of a visa application centre in the state had long been a concern for students, professionals, tourists, and business travellers. Responding to this long-pending public demand,



the Chief Minister has taken the decision to set up the centre in the state capital.

“The people of the state have been demanding the establishment of a visa centre in Bhubaneswar for a long time. Keeping this in mind, the CM has taken this important decision,” a release said.

## Rupee closes at all time low of 90.78

**Mumbai, Dec 15:** The rupee Monday crashed to its lowest-ever level of 90.80 before settling at a fresh all-time low of 90.78 against the US dollar, registering a loss of 29 paise over its previous close, weighed down by uncertainty over an India-US trade deal and persistent foreign fund outflows.

Forex traders said prevailing risk-averse market sentiment, compounded by strong US dollar demand from importers, further dented investor sentiment.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 90.53 against the US dollar, then lost ground and fell to a record intra-day low of 90.80, registering a 31-paise decline from its previous close. At the end of trade on Monday, the rupee was quoted at a record low of 90.74 (provisional), down 25 paise over its previous close.

## Minor gangraped near Dhauli; 2 held

**Bhubaneswar, Dec 15:** A 17-year-old girl was allegedly gang-raped by five youths near Lingipur under Dhauli police limits here, officials said Monday.

The alleged incident, which took place December 10, came to light Monday, with the arrest of two of the accused by a special squad of the twin city Commissionerate Police.

According to the complaint lodged at Dhauli police station, the alleged incident occurred around 8pm when the girl, along with her male friend, was returning home after visiting Dhauli Shanti Stupa.

“The youths waylaid the girl and her friend and took turns

to rape her at a deserted location on Canal Road near Lingipur. Later, they fled the spot,” an official said, quoting the complaint. They also robbed a 20-gram gold chain and a five-gram silver ornament from the victim, added the official.

Upon reaching home, the girl narrated her ordeal before her parents following which they lodged a complaint with the police December 11 at around 4 am.

Police registered a case and launched a manhunt. Later, they managed to nab two of the accused. Efforts were on to arrest others involved in the crime, the official further said.

Meanwhile, a forensic team visited the spot and collected evidence for further investigation.

## Moquim expelled from Congress

**Bhubaneswar, Dec 15:** Senior Odisha Congress leader and former MLA Mohammed Moquim was expelled from the party after he challenged its state leadership, an OPCC leader said Monday.

Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) president Bhakta Charan Das said Moquim was removed for “anti-party activities.”

“This is for the information of all concerned that AICC (All India Congress Committee) has approved the proposal for the expulsion of Sri Md. Moquim from the primary membership of the party, due to anti-party activities,” he said in a statement.

Moquim, a former MLA from the Barabati-Cuttack assembly segment, had recently challenged the OPCC leadership and written a letter to Congress leader Sonia Gandhi.

Moquim said, “I have no regret about writing a letter to Sonia Gandhi and raising pertinent issues. They have expelled me from the party, but cannot distance me from the Congress ideology which I follow in letter and spirit.”

OPCC media cell chief Arabinda Das, in a statement, said that Moquim's communication was “not intended to reform the party, rather to create disturbance in the organisation.”

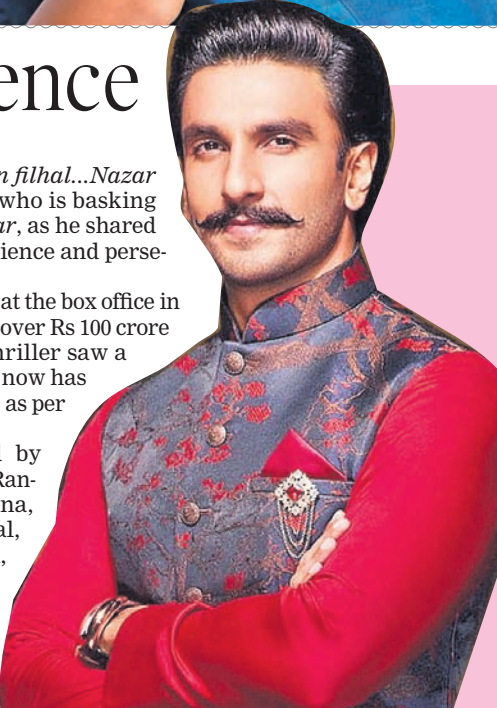
"Kismat ki ek bohot khoob- surat aadat hai, ki woh waqt

# Internet fully restored as Malkangiri sees normalcy

**Malkangiri, Dec 15:** Normalcy returned to Malkangiri district Monday, nearly a week after around 200 houses were damaged in violent clashes and arson in a village, with the district administration fully restoring internet services, a senior official said.

Additional District Magistrate Bedabar Pradhan said internet services, suspended across the district December 8 to curb the spread of rumours and misinformation following the clashes, were restored after the situation improved.

The suspension had been extended in phases till 12 noon, Monday. District Collector Somesh Kumar Upadhyay and Superintendent of Police Vinodh Patil visited Rakhelguda, Maribada, Niliguda and MV-18 villages and held discussions with local residents. Addressing villagers, the Collector said unity and brotherhood were essential to ensure a secure future for the next generation. He urged people to rebuild mutual trust through dialogue and resolve misunderstandings peacefully.

The Collector and the SP asked villagers to immediately inform the administration or police about any law and order concerns. The SP cautioned against circulating fake news or rumours on social media, especially in the current sensitive situation, saying that such acts create fear and unrest. He said strict action would be taken against those found spreading misinformation.



The administration had earlier withdrawn prohibitory orders imposed under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita within a 10-km radius of MV-26 village, where arson incidents were reported December 7 and December 8. Though the violence was confined to two villages, tension had gripped the entire district, as the incident took the form of a clash between local tribals and Bengali settlers following the recovery of a headless body of a woman December 4, officials said.

The violence broke out after residents of Rakhelguda village allegedly set ablaze several houses belonging to Bengali residents, forcing hundreds to flee. The headless body of Lake Podiami (51), a woman from the Koya tribe, was recovered from the banks of the Poteru river December 4, while her head was found six days later at a location about 15 km away.

Officials said the district administration held several rounds of discussions with representatives of the tribal and Bengali communities, following which both sides agreed to maintain peace.

Relief and rehabilitation work has since been launched at MV-26 village, with preliminary assessment pegging property damage at around ₹3.8 crore. A two-member ministerial team headed by Deputy Chief Minister KV Singh Deo visited the affected village, interacted with officials and locals, and submitted a report to the Chief Minister.

So far, 18 people have been arrested in connection with the violence, the officials said, adding that despite the withdrawal of prohibitory orders and restoration of internet services, security forces, including BSF and CRPF personnel, continue to be deployed to prevent any untoward incident.

Nabarangpur MP Balabhadra Majhi Sunday visited MV-26 and neighbouring Rakhelguda villages, and held discussions with members of both communities as part of efforts to rebuild confidence and restore peace. More than two lakh Bengali-speaking Bangladeshis were rehabilitated by the Centre in Malkangiri and Nabarangpur districts in 1968, and they currently reside in 124 villages of Malkangiri.

## TUSKER FOUND DEAD IN ANGUL

**Bantala/Angul, Dec 15:** A tusker was found dead at Balliapashi in Manikjodi panchayat under the Pokunda forest section of Angul forest division Monday morning.

The matter came to the light when villagers spotted the animal dead while heading outside to attend to their daily chores Monday morning. They immediately alerted forest officials as they reached the spot and launched an investigation.

Locals alleged that the elephant may have died from gunshot injuries inflicted by poachers, allegedly due to negligence by forest authorities. However, forest officials said the exact cause of death, circumstances and motive will be determined after a postmortem examination of the carcass and a detailed investigation.

The incident has triggered strong reactions from environmentalists and wildlife lovers, who have demanded stricter protection measures and accountability to prevent further loss of wildlife.

Meanwhile, residents said that the presence of poachers has increased in the division. Locals alleged that the forest department has limited its action to seizing hooks, GI wires used for trapping, and related materials, without curbing poaching effectively. Earlier, a leopard was found dead after being caught in a snare at Dimiripal village under the Karatapata forest section of the Angul Forest Division December 9.

## 22 migrant workers rescued

**Lathor, Dec 15:** Police rescued 22 migrant workers from the Lathor bus stand in Bolangir district Monday and arrested a labour agent in connection with their illegal trafficking.

The accused, identified as Saroj Parabhue of Pipalbahal village under Lathor police limits, was produced in the Patnagarh court, police said.

According to police, the agent had brought together 22 workers - 10 women, nine men and three children- from Padhel village under Patnagarh police limits, Gerda village under Larambha police limits, and Khairpali village under Padampur police limits in neighbouring Bargarh



district. The agent had assembled them at Jogimunda with plans to traffic them to Siddipet in Telangana.

The agent brought the workers in a Nuapada bound private passenger bus Tarini from Bolangir to Lathor from where he planned to sent them onward by train. Acting on a tip-off, police conducted a raid at the bus stand and took the workers

to the police station for questioning. During interrogation, the workers named Saroj as the agent involved.

Police later raided Pipalbahal village and arrested the accused. The rescued workers have since been sent back to their respective homes, said Lathor police station officer-in-charge Ramakant Sahu. A case has been registered.

## Elephant injured after explosives go off in mouth

**Baripada:** A female elephant sustained serious injuries to its mouth after allegedly consuming explosives placed as bait in Mayurbhanj district, a forest official said Monday. The 5-year-old elephant was spotted in a forest area of the district December 12 morning and later tranquilised and shifted to a nursery in the Simlipal North Division, Divisional Forest Officer (Baripada) Gobinda Chandra Biswal said. The animal had entered the Baripada forest range from the Nilagiri area of neighbouring Balasore district, he said. With severe injuries to its tongue, the elephant was rescued December 13 and is currently undergoing treatment under the supervision of a dedicated team of veterinary doctors, the DFO added. The exact cause of the injury will be ascertained by the treating veterinary team, Biswal said.

## 4 arrested for political violence

**Jaipur/Jenapur:** Jenapur police Monday arrested four workers of BJP in connection with the political violence between workers of the saffron party and the BJD in Jaipur district's Dhamasala Assembly constituency. The confrontation between supporters of former MLA Pranab Balabantray (Jitu) of BJD and sitting MLA Himanshu Sekhar Sahu (Liku) of BJP began near the Jenapur police station and later spilled over to Bhubaneswar. Demanding the arrest of those allegedly involved in the attack, about 500 BJP workers staged a sit-in outside the Jenapur police station. The protest had not been withdrawn at the time of filing this report. Meanwhile, BJD leaders have been holding demonstrations outside the office of the Director General of Police in Bhubaneswar, demanding the arrest of the Dhamasala MLA and BJP workers allegedly linked to the violence. BJP workers have continued their protest since late Sunday night, raising slogans. Amid the tension, Jenapur police arrested four BJP workers, IIC Nirupama Jena said. Senior police officials, including the Jaipur Road SDPO Lakshmidhar Swain, the Jenapur police station officer Jena, Kakhia police station inspector Jyotiranjan Mohapatra and Ranjan Kumar Jena along with additional police forces, were deployed at the protest site outside the police station.

## Drone show to regale audience at Parab '25

**Koraput:** A drone show will be the centerpiece of this year's national-level 'Parab' festival, scheduled to be held from December 18 to 22 on Kechela Road in Koraput, district Collector Manoj Satyawan Mahajan said at a press conference, Monday. Cultural programmes will begin daily at 4pm. Singer Umakanta Barik and his team will perform, along with folk dance troupes from across the district December 18. The Humsu Band from Kolkata will perform December 19, alongside traditional performances like Lavani, Bonda, Mallakhamba and animal mask dance presentations. V Company, Asima Panda and her team will present musical performances, along with Ranapa dance, Paika Akhada and Kerala's Kalaripayattu December 20. The drone show, this year's main attraction will be held December 21, followed by a performance by popular pop singer Nakash Aziz and his team. On December 22, musical composer Sachet and Parampara will perform at the event. Artists and cultural teams from within the district, across the state and beyond will take part in this event. A total of 543 stalls will be set up at the festival, including 80 food stalls and 35 handicrafts and indigenous products (Swadeshi Mela) stalls. The Collector said the Chief Minister and several ministers are expected to attend. Seating facility has been arranged for about 50,000 people, while nearly 1 lakh visitors are expected to enjoy the cultural programmes. Parking facilities have been created at eight locations to ensure smooth traffic management. 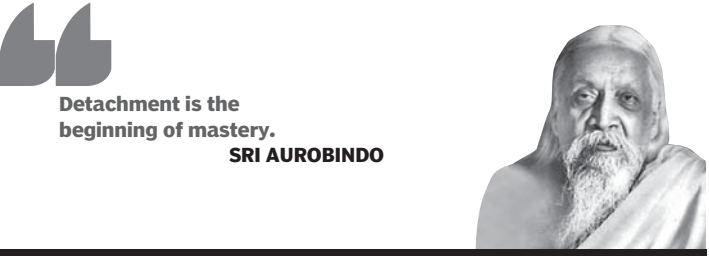

## Jail Diary

It is not a bad idea, it appears, if top notch politicians get incarcerated, at least for some days, so as to understand what prisons, or those that are now euphemistically called correctional homes, actually mean for an inmate. In fact, it is exactly this word that former French President Nicolas Sarkozy used to describe his recent 20-day stint in the prison of La Santé in Paris, in a new book he penned. Ironically, ‘La Sante’ in French means ‘health’ or ‘wellness’, the implication being that the mental health of the prison’s inmates would improve after staying there. Sarkozy called this prison a noisy, harsh “all-grey” world of “inhuman violence.” The book is notable not only for its vivid, graphic account of the appalling conditions of the prison, but also the former President’s surprising advocacy of a new political line for his conservative party to close ranks with France’s Far-Right political outfit. The shift in his political strategy runs counter to the aims of “republican front” or parties that have traditionally kept the Far-Right out of power.

In his “Diary of a Prisoner,” 70-year-old Sarkozy confesses his own tough stand on crime and punishment and has taken on a new perspective as he recounts his short experience in prison after being found guilty of criminal association in financing his winning 2007 campaign with dubious funds from Libya. Hundreds of his supporters queued up at a bookshop in a Paris upscale residential neighbourhood where Sarkozy staged his first book signing. The court sentenced him in September to five years in prison and he appealed against the ruling. He was granted release under judicial supervision after 20 days behind bars.

The book provides a rare look inside the La Santé prison, where Sarkozy was kept in solitary confinement, strictly away from other inmates for security reasons. His loneliness was broken only by regular visits from his wife, supermodel-turned-singer Carla Bruni-Sarkozy and his lawyers. Sarkozy wrote that his cell looked like a “cheap hotel, except for the armored door and the bars,” with a hard mattress, a plastic-like pillow and a shower that produced only a thin stream of water. He described the “deafening noise” of the prison, much of it at night. Opening the window on his first day behind bars, he heard an inmate who “was relentlessly striking the bars of his cell with a metal object.” “The atmosphere was threatening. Welcome to hell!,” he wrote in his book.

Sarkozy said he declined the meals served in small plastic trays along with a “mushy, soggy baguette (a long, narrow French bread)” – their smell, he wrote, made him nauseous. Instead, he ate dairy products and cereal bars. He was allowed one hour a day in a small gym room, where he mostly used a basic treadmill. Sarkozy says he was informed of several violent incidents that took place during his time behind bars, which he called “a nightmare.”

“The most inhumane violence was the daily reality of this place,” he wrote, raising questions about the prison system’s ability to reform and reintegrate people into the mainstream once their sentences are served. Sarkozy was known for his tough rhetoric on punishing criminals. He promised that “upon my release, my comments would be more elaborate and nuanced than what I had previously expressed on all these topics.”

No less important is Sarkozy’s strategic political advice offered in his book for his conservative Republicans party. He sprang a surprise by revealing that he spoke over phone from the prison to the Far-Right National Rally’s leader Marine Le Pen, once his fierce rival. He no longer finds Le Pen’s party “a danger for the Republic,” he wrote. Despite his party’s differences with the outfit on many issues, including economic, he argued in the book that the reconstruction of his weakened Republicans party can only be achieved through “the broadest possible spirit of unity.”

Sarkozy is of course free to hold his political opinion and spell out new strategies. But his prescription this time around reads like a desperate attempt to safeguard personal interests.

This is nothing new since some tall leaders across the globe, including the Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, have for some time been courting Far-Right groups for their own personal and political survival engendering, in the process, the politics of hatred, religious divide and racism but all of that assure long term survival for such men in office.

# WAR ON UNIVERSITIES

We have become so accustomed to aspiring autocrats attacking universities that we hardly ever stop to ask why. But pushing back against authoritarians requires understanding their motivations and strategies. University leaders, in particular, ought to be better prepared to coordinate resistance across institutions of higher education, and to ensure internal cohesion among faculty. Otherwise, autocrats may succeed in playing different parts of academia off against one another.

One type of attack on universities has become depressingly familiar partly because it is so easy for far-right populists to copy: a culture war targeting specific academic subjects and programs like “diversity, equity, and inclusion.” One can criticize DEI’s implementation without endorsing the far right’s claim that it amounts to discrimination against white men, and without accepting the demonstrably false notion that left-wing professors comprehensively indoctrinate their innocent charges.

Such claims are the building blocks for a bridge that the far right hopes to extend to citizens who see themselves as centrist. When in power, the far right has appropriated the language of “freedom” but actually makes academic life unfree. In the United States, for example, laws devised by Republicans restrict which subjects can be taught and how; similarly, the Hungarian government has prohibited gender studies altogether.

But it is a mistake to think other parts of the university are safe if concessions are made to the culture-war agenda, because aspiring autocrats – which is what far-right politicians will always become if they have enough power, time, and resources – cannot tolerate independent institutions. Universities potentially provide safe spaces for open political discussion and coordination of the opposition. They serve as what Harvard Law School’s Vicki C. Jackson calls “knowledge institutions,” producing expertise

that could serve as a basis for criticising governments. And they generally advance what Robert C. Post of Yale Law School calls “democratic competence” among citizens.

Thus, it is no accident that aspiring autocrats target higher education, both to prevent such institutions from becoming sites of resistance and to ensure their own long-term influence over educational content and public culture. Their preferred strategy nowadays is “autocratic legalism”: substituting laws that are passed in formally correct ways for violent assaults likely to generate pushback and loss of reputation among domestic and international observers.

Hungary is once again a prime example. By turning many universities into foundations, Prime Minister Viktor Orbán supposedly rendered them less dependent on the state. In reality, they have all ended up being controlled by his cronies. The same is true for lavishly funded new institutions created in parallel to the existing higher education system. These “castles of illiberal thought” are ultimately in the service of the regime.

Autocrats can also gain an advantage by sowing uncertainty within institutions, so that professors are never quite sure where normal teaching and research end and where areas the state might suddenly target begin.

This notion of a “dual state” – initially suggested by the legal theorist Ernst Fraenkel to make sense of 1930s Nazi Germany – describes the Chinese government’s strategy via-à-vis Hong Kong through its “National Security Law.” When people can never be sure about what is permissible, self-censorship often becomes the default.

But repression need not be confined to one territory. Critics abroad can also be targeted with online and physical harassment by fellow students when they cross the line. Autocracies not only copy each other but also reach across borders with increasing acts of transnational repression.

So, what is the best way to fight back? For starters, universities should be more proactive. Even in countries that remain stable democracies, such as Germany, the far right is already targeting higher education with official requests for information about gender and postcolonial studies. Academia should not allow itself always to be on the defensive. Instead, academic leaders should anticipate different scenarios in advance of attacks.

University presidents must also have a plan ready to coordinate with peers. One of the most disheartening lessons of the MAGA assault on higher education has been universities’ inability to form a united

front in defense of academic freedom. Resistance is a coordination game, and many have failed to play it well. As a result, Trumpists can divide and rule through individual “deals” that leave those who accept them at the mercy of the federal government.

Internal cohesion is also crucial. This does not mean that faculty must agree on everything; but it does mean that universities should figure out how to prevent fatal fractures. The Trump administration has clearly sought to set natural scientists against the humanities and some social sciences, incentivising the former to put pressure on the latter to make concessions so that funding for critical lab work can be restored. Fortunately, internal solidarity has largely prevailed in these cases – so far.

University presidents also must speak to the public and make the case for what their institutions contribute to society. True, this is more difficult in countries where aspiring autocrats have already captured independent media, and it does run the risk of turning important but esoteric academic subjects into the playthings of public opinion. But the university is not only in the useful business of producing and disseminating knowledge. It is also in the seemingly useless business of preserving knowledge that otherwise might be lost forever. In doing so, it is providing a public good.

Finally, the law itself can offer a defense, rather than becoming a weapon of autocratic legalism. Where academic freedom is not constitutionalised explicitly – such as in France – protections should be codified and solidified. And where supranational institutions might gain leverage – think of the European Research Area Act currently being debated in the European Union – the law should not only aim at increasing investment and researcher mobility, but include robust safeguards for academic freedom.

## Delhi’s alarming air pollution

AT THIS MARK OF AIR QUALITY, THE QUANTUM OF POLLUTION HAS REACHED A CRITICAL LEVEL AND THE AIR IS HIGHLY UNHEALTHY

The national capital on Sunday woke up to a thick layer of smog, with air quality lingering in the ‘severe’ category.’ The Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) recorded the Air Quality Index (AQI) at 462 in the morning. All 40 monitoring stations in Delhi showed ‘red’, meaning AQI in the ‘severe’ category. Several areas also reported low visibility conditions due to smog as people were found driving with headlights on. In the light of this worst air quality of the season, the Centre invoked the toughest emergency measures under GRAP-4 in Delhi-NCR on 13 December.

Delhi battles chronic winter smog every year due to

the accumulation of deadly pollutants in the air mostly from coal-fired power plants outside the city, fumes from vehicles, construction activities, and open burning of rubbish. Low wind speed also plays a part as it traps the pollutants in the lower atmosphere making them difficult to disperse. One of the key contributors to the air pollution in winter is the smoke due to stubble burning by farmers in neighbouring states. Also, heavy fireworks during the festival of Diwali add to the woes and worsen the air quality.

At this mark of air quality, the quantum of pollution has reached a critical level and the air is highly unhealthy.

Elderly individuals, in particular, can feel its immediate effects and are at risk in falling sick to various respiratory tract diseases like pneumonia, asthma and even lungs cancer. Even healthy people may show symptoms for short exposures. As per a study carried out by the World Health Organization (WHO), among 1600 cities of the world, Delhi is one of the worst in terms of air pollution.

Delhi’s population continues to grow unabated as thousands of migrants arrive in the city each year in search of better opportunities. Dust-generating construction sites, industrial emissions as well as proliferation of coal-fired power

plants contribute to the deterioration of air quality. Car sales have also been soaring as nearly 10 million vehicles jostle for space on the roads of Delhi everyday. Thousands of diesel guzzling trucks rumble across the capital every night bringing in essential commodities from neighboring states.

As a long term goal, Delhi must find ways to curb all the pollutant sources, point or non-point origins, so as to reverse the trend and allow its citizens to breathe clean air.

### Sydney lessons

Sir, The Hanukkah terrorist attack at Sydney’s Bondi Beach, where gunmen killed 16 people and injured dozens, reflects the lethal spillover of global conflicts into open, multicultural societies. Australia’s experience shows how targeted communities become vulnerable when ideological violence travels across borders. For India, the lesson is stark. A diverse nation cannot afford complacency against imported hatred. Strong intelligence coordination, early monitoring of online radicalisation, and swift action against hate speech are critical. Places of worship and public religious events need proactive security, not reactive responses. Equally vital is political and social messaging that isolates extremists without stigmatising communities. Cross-faith engagement, strict enforcement of anti-terror laws and zero tolerance for glorifying violence are essential to prevent such tragedies on the Indian soil.

### Centralisation bid

# Women take to night patrol in HP's Bilaspur

Himachal Pradesh is grappling with the spread of dangerous drugs such as chitta, which has claimed many young lives

**Bilaspur (HP), Dec 15:** In the dead of winter nights, groups of women step out of their cosy homes in Leghat village of Bilaspur district here, holding torches and wielding sticks, to patrol the silent streets. In their crosshairs are gangs trafficking adulterated heroin, known locally as chitta.

Laghat village, which falls under the Bilaspur Sadar Assembly segment, connects the Bairi Rajadian panchayat with the Barmana industrial area. The area sees heavy vehicular movement round-the-clock, making it an easy transit route for drug peddlers, the women said.

Braving the biting cold, the women patrol village streets in small groups, keeping a close watch on movement during night hours. Suspected persons are questioned, close vigil is kept on passersby, and any unusual activity is reported to the police.

The patrol groups comprise women aged between 25 and 50, all members of the Laghat Mahila Mandal. They are on the roads every night, determined to protect their children from the growing menace of drugs.

“Our aim is to apprehend drug traffickers and ensure the village remains safe,” said Mahila Mandal head Pinky Sharma Monday. “Drug addiction destroys not just individuals

but families and society as a whole. Community participation, along with the police and administration, is essential.”

She said, “If we find anyone suspicious, we will stop them and inform the police”. The women asserted that there is no place in the village for drug dealers or those who shelter them, and warned that stricter measures would be taken if required.

Mahila Mandal member Anju Sharma said a newly built link road has increased the movement of outsiders at night, which traffickers exploit to lure young people. She added that the campaign has received full support from villagers.

Another member, Kusum, said their efforts will determine the future of their children and that such initiatives would also strengthen the state government’s campaign against Chitta.

Several residents have joined the women on these night patrols, while others keep watch over people entering and leaving the village and report suspicious activity to the Mahila Mandal or the police. Villagers said failure to act firmly now could lead to serious consequences in the future.

Bilaspur SP Sandeep Dhalwal praised the initiative and assured full police support. “The women are doing excellent work. They will receive full cooperation from the police. Those involved in selling or consuming drugs will not be spared,” he said.

Himachal Pradesh is grappling with the spread of dangerous drugs such as chitta, which has claimed many young lives. The government, police, panchayats and local communities are working together combat the menace.

Chitta, or diacetylmorphine, is a semi-synthetic opioid derived from heroin and is highly addictive and lethal. An overdose can be fatal, said Arun Sharma, former director of the State Forensic Science Laboratory.

Police earlier said the drug costs between ₹4,000 and ₹6,000 per gram. Its high profit margins have led many drug peddlers to switch to chitta, with network increasingly involved students.

Officials said the situation has become alarming as Chitta spread to rural areas.

The expensive and habit-forming drug, unaffordable for the students, is forcing addicts to “consume as well as sell it” to sustain their habit, drawing more youth into the network and forming chains to survive, they added.

# Wildlife census commences in Jharkhand

The census is being conducted in 31 territorial forest areas (general forest divisions) and five protected forest areas (wildlife divisions) of the state, including the Palamu Tiger Reserve (PTR) and Dalma Wildlife Sanctuary

**Medininagar (Jharkhand), Dec 15:** Wildlife census in Jharkhand began Monday, with officials using a mobile application for data collection, forest department officials said.

“This census is being conducted in 31 territorial forest areas (general forest divisions) and five protected forest areas (wildlife divisions) of the state, including the Palamu Tiger Reserve (PTR) and Dalma Wildlife Sanctuary,” state nodal officer for the exercise and PTR field director SR Natesh said.

This census is conducted every four years using a completely scientific method to obtain accurate information regarding the presence of wildlife, the official added. “The counting of wild animals has started simultaneously in more than half of the forests in the country. Soon,



the counting will begin in the remaining reserves and territorial forest areas too,” Natesh, who is also the chief conservator of forests, said.

The census is being held under the guidance of the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) and the Wildlife Institute of India (WII).

“It involves field data col-

lection and the use of camera traps. Additionally, an ecological app is being used in this process,” the forest official said.

Giving detailed information about the census, PTR deputy director Kumar Ashish said, “Currently, there are 58 reserves (sanctuaries) in India, including the Madhav Tiger Reserve in Madhya Pradesh,

which was declared in March.”

“According to the 2022 census, there are 3,167 tigers in the country, which is 70 per cent of the total world population. The numbers are likely to go up this time,” Ashish said. Ashish said a special feature of this census is that, in addition to technology and satellite-based surveys, a manual counting system is also being used, which involves collecting animal droppings, and noting footprints and scratch marks. The app-based census will continue till December 22. Thereafter, wildlife counting in both protected and non-protected forest divisions will be conducted with human assistance and is expected to conclude by April 2026.

Around 1,600 forest personnel have been deployed for the exercise, and volunteers will also be engaged to support the operation, officials said.

## Organisation seeks demolition of Shimla mosque’s illegal floors

**Shimla:** Members of Dev Bhoomi Sangarsh Samiti Monday submitted a memorandum to the commissioner of the Shimla Municipal Corporation seeking demolition of the top three illegal floors of the disputed Sanjauli mosque here after the Himachal Pradesh High Court’s order to the effect. After hearing the arguments of the parties involved in the case, a single judge bench of Justice Ajay Mohan Goel December 3 ordered status quo on the lower two floors of the mosque, while maintaining that the top three floors must be demolished according to the Shimla Municipal Commissioner Court’s directions. In a memorandum submitted to Municipal Commissioner Bhupinder Attri here, the Samiti members demanded immediate demolition of the illegal floors and offered to raise them free of cost in case the municipal commission was facing any difficulty, Samiti convener Madan Thakur told PTI here. He said three storeys have been declared illegal, out of which the top floor has been demolished and the Dev Bhoomi Samiti is willing to demolish the third and fourth floors of the five-storey mosque free of cost.

## J'khand launches paddy procurement exercise

**Ranchi, Dec 15:** Jharkhand minister Irfan Ansari Monday virtually launched the state’s paddy procurement exercise during a programme in Jamtara district.

Addressing farmers at the inaugural function, Ansari said the government would procure paddy at ₹2,450 per quintal and has set a target of purchasing 7 lakh metric tonnes during the current season. “This is not merely a scheme but an initiative to restore the trust of farmers,” the food, public distribution and consumer affairs minister said. Ansari said Jharkhand has become the first state in the country to ensure one-time direct payment to farmers immediately after procurement.



“Jharkhand is the first state in the country where farmers will receive one-time payment directly into their accounts after paddy procurement. Earlier, farmers faced difficulties in selling paddy, as payments were made in 2-3 installments, causing them significant hardship. Now, as soon as a farmer sells the paddy, the amount will reach directly into their account.” He directed officials to regularly visit the procurement centres and interact with farmers, and ensure that they

are not mistreated.

“If any kind of misbehaviour with farmers is reported, strict action will be taken against those responsible,” he warned.

He also cautioned against black marketing of paddy, illegal sale to other states and the involvement of middlemen, saying stern action would be taken against violators.

Altogether 783 procurement centres have been set up across the state to carry out the exercise, he said. The state cabinet on December 8 decided that farmers will get a bonus of ₹81 per quintal of paddy in addition to the Centre’s minimum support price (MSP) for the crop in the 2025-26 fiscal. In 2024-25, the government procured the highest 40.08 lakh quintals of paddy against a target of 60 lakh quintals.

## Himachal to ban mobile phones in schools: CM Sukhu

**Shimla, Dec 15:** Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu Saturday announced that there would be a complete ban on students carrying mobile phones in school premises from pre-nursery to Class XII from the upcoming academic session.

“Teachers, however, will be permitted to keep their mobile phones in staff rooms or in their bags” he added. The CM inaugurated state-of-the-art facilities at the Directorate of Samagra Shiksha, including the Vidya Samiksha Kendra (VSK), Education Gallery, Programme Management Studio Conference Area, New Conference Hall and a modern central heating system. Speaking on the occasion, he said these advanced facilities would not only enhance administrative and academic efficiency but would also mark the beginning of a new era of digital education governance in Himachal Pradesh.

Three killed in fog triggered accidents

**Chandigarh:** Three persons, including a woman police officer and a CISF Inspector, were killed and several others injured in two separate road accidents involving multiple vehicles, in Haryana's Sonipat and Nuh districts, police said. The visibility levels dropped due to dense fog early morning at many places in Haryana, including Nuh, Sonipat and Hisar, police said. In the Nuh pileup, involving multiple vehicles, two persons, including a CISF Inspector, were killed on the Delhi-Mumbai expressway, police said, adding that some injuries were also reported in the incident.

Nagaland's forest fire contained: Officials

**Kohima:** The forest fire in the Western Dzukou area in Nagaland's Kohima district has been contained, officials said Monday. There were concerns that the blaze, which broke out Friday in the western range of the valley, would spread further due to windy conditions and the difficult terrain, which was affecting the firefighting operations, they said. The fire was first spotted by a tourist guide, who alerted the Khonoma village and the district administration, they added.

Encounter breaks out in Udhampur

**Jammu:** An encounter broke out between security forces and terrorists in a village in Udhampur district of Jammu and Kashmir Monday evening, officials said. The gunfight started at village Soan in Majalta area of the hilly district when security forces launched a search operation following information about presence of terrorists believed to be affiliated with Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) outfit, the officials said.

Tiger found dead in forest

**Surajpur:** A tiger died due to suspected electrocution in a forest in Chhattisgarh's Surajpur district, officials said Monday. The carcass of the male tiger, aged 6-7 years, was found in Bhainsamunda under Ghui forest range this morning, a senior forest official said. A team has been constituted for conducting autopsy as per guidelines, the official said. In November last year, a tiger was found dead in a forest in neighbouring Korea district.

Two Punjab men shot dead in Canada over mistaken identity

**Bathinda, Dec 15:** Two Punjab men were allegedly shot dead while they were sitting inside a car in Canada's Edmonton.

The incident took place early Friday, local time, a family member said Monday. The victims were identified as 27-year-old Gurdeep Singh from Barre village and 19-year-old Ranvir Singh from Uddat Saidewala village. Gurdeep had gone to Canada over two years ago and was awaiting a work permit approval. Ranvir had left India one and a half years ago to pursue studies. They were shot moments after they got into a car after leaving a birthday party. Ranvir Singh was sitting in the driver's seat, with Gurdeep

Singh beside him. A few others sat in the back.

A bullet struck Ranvir while Gurdeep appeared to have been hit by shrapnel. Mandeep Singh who lives in his village in Mansa, said the family suspects that the two were victims of mistaken identity, as the car belonged to someone else. Ranvir, the son of a farmer, was the only child of his parents, and has many of his family members settled in Canada.

"He was intelligent and good at studies. We told him that he could prepare for competitive exams in India and secure a good job here. Even many of our relatives in Canada told him to pursue studies here. But he was keen to go abroad," Mandeep Singh said.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said this is not just about changing the name of the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), but is a "conspiracy by the BJP-RSS to dismantle MGNREGA".

"Erasing Gandhi's name on the centenary of the RSS shows how hollow and hypocritical Modi's gestures of paying homage to Bapu on foreign soil truly are," Kharge said in a post in Hindi on X. "Only a government that resents the rights of the poor would attack MGNREGA. The Congress party will strongly oppose any decision by this arrogant government that is anti-poor and anti-labour, both in Parliament and on the streets," he said. Tharoor, whose stand

NIA charges 6, two terror groups in Pahalgam attack

**Jammu, Dec 15:** The NIA Monday filed a comprehensive chargesheet against six people and two terrorist organisations, Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba and its shadow outfit TRF, in connection with the Pahalgam terror attack, which claimed the lives of 25 tourists and a local pony operator.

The 1,597-page chargesheet, filed by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) before a special court, details the deep conspiracy traced back to Pakistan, which the probe agency said has been "unabatedly sponsoring terrorism against India". The NIA has named



Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) headed by Hafeez Saeed, who has been designated as a global terrorist by the US as well as India, along with The Resistance Front (TRF) headed by Habibullah Malik alias Sajid Jatt, in the chargesheet for their role in planning, facilitating, and executing the Pahalgam attack that took place in the Baisaran meadows on April 22 this year.

"Pakistani handler terrorist Sajid Jatt is also named as an accused in the chargesheet, filed before the NIA special court, Jammu," a statement issued by the anti-terror agency said. The chargesheet also names the three Pakistani terrorists, who carried out the killings on religious lines on April 22 at Baisaran meadows in Pahalgam in Jammu and Kashmir. All the three were killed by the Army during the Operation Mahadev at Dachigam located in the outskirts of Srinagar on July 29, almost 100 days after the deadly terror attack.

The three were identified as Faisal Jatt alias Suleman Shah, Habeeb Tahir alias Jibran, and

Hamza Afghani, the NIA statement said. In its chargesheet, the NIA has also invoked the penal section against the accused for waging war against India. The agency's eight-month long "meticulous scientific probe" led to the chargesheet.

Two accused persons, Parvaiz Ahmad and Bashir Ahmad Jothar, who were arrested June 22 for harbouring the terrorists, have also been named in the chargesheet by the NIA. During interrogation, the two men had disclosed the identities of the three armed terrorists involved in the attack, and had also confirmed that they were Pakistani nationals affiliated to proscribed LeT terror outfit.

Bomb hoax hits 11 schools in Jalandhar

**Jalandhar, Dec 15:** A bomb threat sent into panic several schools here Monday, with authorities evacuating the students and launching anti-sabotage actions.

It turned out to be a hoax, an officer said. Police teams were sent scurrying across the city after 11 schools received a bomb threat via email.

"We were told that there had been some fault in the electricity and we were asked to pick up our children from the school," a parent told reporters. ACP (North) Sanjay Kumar, who was at KMV School, said, "A threat was received on the

school principal's email that the building would be blown up." He said the police searched the school premises immediately after the information was received.

"Anti-sabotage team also carried out a check in the premises, but nothing suspicious was found," Kumar said. A student said that he was giving an exam when a teacher said there was a power cut and ordered all students to assemble in the ground.

Another parent, who came to pick up his child, said the school did not reveal the real reason behind the evacuation and just asked them to take their wards from the school.

Anti-dowry laws suffer from ineffectiveness, misuse: SC

**New Delhi, Dec 15:** The eradication of dowry is an urgent constitutional and social necessity, the Supreme Court said Monday, while flagging that existing laws suffer from both "ineffectiveness" and "misuse", and that the evil practice remains rampant.

Stressing that "concentrated effort" of all was needed to deal with the issue, a bench of Justices Sanjay Karol and N Kotiswar Singh passed several

directions, including asking the high courts to ascertain the number of pending cases dealing with sections 304-B and 498-A of IPC -- from the earliest to the latest -- for expeditious disposal.

While Section 304-B of the erstwhile Indian Penal Code deals with dowry death, Section 498-A pertains to the offence of husband or his relatives subjecting a married woman to cruelty.

The bench, which was delivering its verdict in a 24-year-old



case of dowry death, directed the Centre and states to consider changes as are necessary to educational curricula across levels, reinforcing the constitutional position that parties to a marriage are equal to one another and one is not subservient to the other.

It said this case represents that dowry is not a feature on-

ly amongst Hindus, but it can also be found in other communities professing different faiths and religions.

"While on the one hand, the law suffers from ineffectiveness and so, the malpractice of dowry remains rampant, on the other hand, the provisions of this Act (Dowry Prohibition Act) have also been used to ventilate

ulterior motives along with Section 498-A, IPC," it said.

It further said, "This oscillation between ineffectiveness and misuse creates a judicial tension which needs urgent resolution".

The apex court's order came on appeals filed by the Uttar Pradesh government challenging the Allahabad High Court's verdict, which acquitted two persons, including a woman, in a 2001 dowry death case. The top court allowed the appeals and restored their conviction in the case.

However, it refrained from incarcerating the woman convict, considering that she was 94 years old. The bench directed the man to surrender within four weeks to serve the life sentence awarded to him by the trial court.

It said that while in this case, the accused have finally

been brought to book, there are many instances where it does not happen.

"Many, who openly seek and give dowry, go scot-free. It has been noted time and again, in various judicial pronouncements, that DPA (Dowry Prohibition Act), 1961 suffers from various difficulties in its implementation," it said.

Passing a slew of directions, the bench said it has to be ensured that the future generations are informed and made aware of the evil practice of dowry and the necessity to eschew it.


The bench said the law provides for the appointment of dowry prohibition officers in states. It is to be ensured that these officers are duly deputed and given the necessary wherewithal to carry out the duties entrusted to them, the bench said.

**Chandigarh:** A 30-year-old kabaddi player-cum-promoter died after unidentified gunmen opened fire on him after he arrived with his team to take part in a tournament in Mohali Monday, police said. Kanwar Digvijay Singh alias Rana Balachauria was critically injured in the attack and was rushed to the Fortis Hospital in Mohali where he was declared dead, police said. The incident took place at Sohana in Mohali where a private kabaddi tournament had been going on for the past few days, SSP Harmandeep Singh Hans said.

BLO dies due to 'work pressure'

**Bareilly:** A 58-year-old booth-level officer (BLO) died here allegedly after a heart attack he suffered due to SIR-related work pressure, according to his family. The administration, however, termed the death of Vinod Kumar Sharma, the headmaster of the Upper Primary Girls Composite School in the Bisharatganj area, as natural. Sharma had been co-opted to work on the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral rolls, a behemoth exercise underway in the state to weed out fake voters and identify genuine ones. According to a family member, Sharma fell ill late Sunday night after dinner and died shortly after due to a heart attack. He was cremated Monday.

**Panaji/Bangkok, Dec 15:** The Bombay High Court Monday converted a civil suit against Birch by Romeo Lane nightclub into a Public Interest Litigation (PIL), saying "someone has to be held accountable" for the tragedy in which 25 people were killed.

In a related development, Thai authorities are set to take up the case involving Gaurav Luthra and Saurabh Luthra, the co-owners of the nightclub, with a Bangkok court likely to decide the next course of action, according to sources.

The Luthras left for Phuket, Thailand, shortly after the fire incident. An Interpol Blue Corner Notice has been issued against them.

They were detained by Thai authorities in Phuket December 11 following an intervention by the Indian mission, which is in close touch with the Thai government in the case.

The Goa police have arrested six persons, including managers and staff members of the club, so far in connection with the December 6 fire tragedy.

In a stern observation, the Goa bench of Justices Sarang Kotwal and Ashish Chavan said the local panchayat had "failed to take suo motu cognisance" of the club and had taken "no action despite complaints."

The bench pointed out that commercial operations were continuing in the structure despite it having been served a demolition order and directed the Goa government to file a detailed reply on the permissions granted to the facility.

The High Court had fixed January 8 as the next date of hearing. The original petition was filed after the December 6 tragedy by Pradeep Ghadi Amonkar and Sunil Divkar, the owners of the land on which the nightclub was operating.

Advocate Rohit Bras de Sa, the lawyer representing the petitioner, was made amicus curiae in the matter and has been asked to file a detailed affidavit in the matter. In their petition, Amonkar and Divkar highlighted "the alarming pattern of statutory violations that have remained inadequately addressed despite multiple complaints, inspections, show-cause notices, and even a demolition order".

They contended that these violations posed "immediate threats to public safety, ecological integrity, and the rule of law in the state of Goa."

Investigations by multiple agencies into the nightclub fire have revealed various irregularities, including the lack of permission to operate the nightclub. According to the sources in the Indian Embassy in Bangkok, all relevant documents related to the two brothers have been transferred through official legal channels.

Legal developments suggest the case is likely to be argued before a Bangkok court, they said. "The matter is expected to move forward once a local court in Bangkok begins hearing the case. However, there is no clarity yet on the timeline, as proceedings will depend on when the judge takes up the matter," sources in the embassy told PTI. Senior advocate Javed

Mir is leading a team of lawyers representing the Luthra brothers, while advocate Vaibhav Suri has also reached Bangkok.

Various legal options under Thai law are being explored to contest the case, sources said. The Indian government, after cancelling the passports of the two brothers, has submitted a dossier to Thai authorities alleging their involvement in the deaths of 25 people. The allegations, sources said, take the case beyond the scope of culpable homicide. India has also formally requested Thai authorities to deport the brothers. Thai authorities, meanwhile, are examining the legal complexities involved. The brothers are stated to have entered Thailand on valid travel documents, which were later revoked by Indian authorities, leaving them without valid papers. This has prompted Thai officials to examine the issue from multiple legal perspectives, including aspects related to basic human rights, sources said.

Indian government sources on Friday have reportedly said that authorities in Thailand are initiating the process to deport the Luthra brothers.

However, with legal and diplomatic considerations at play, the embassy sources indicated that the duo is unlikely to return to India in the immediate future.

SC issues slew of directions to streamline criminal trials

**New Delhi, Dec 15:** In a bid to streamline criminal trials, the Supreme Court issued a slew of directions to trial courts Monday to enhance the legibility of verdicts in criminal matters.

A bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta said all trial courts dealing with criminal matters shall, at the conclusion of the judgment, incorporate tabulated charts summarising the details of the witnesses examined, documents exhibited and material objects produced and exhibited. The court said these charts shall form an appendix or the concluding segment of the judgment and shall be prepared in a clear, structured and easily-comprehensible format.

"We are of the considered view that a more structured and uniform practice must be adopted to enhance the legibility of criminal judgments. Accordingly, to ensure a systematic presentation of evidence that enables efficient appreciation of the record, we issue the following directions to all trial courts across the country.

"These directions aim to institutionalise a standardised format for cataloguing witnesses, documentary evidence and material objects. This will serve to facilitate better comprehension and immediate reference for all stakeholders, including the appellate courts," the bench said.

The apex court said each criminal judgment shall contain a witness chart with serial numbers, names of the witnesses, a brief description of the informant, eyewitnesses, the doctor etc.

"The description should be succinct but sufficient to indicate the evidentiary character of the witness. This structured presentation will allow quick



reference to the nature of testimony, assist in locating the witness in the record and minimise ambiguity," the court said.

It added that a separate chart shall be prepared for all documents exhibited during the trial and it shall include the exhibit numbers, a description of the documents and the witnesses who proved or attested the documents.

"In complex cases, such as conspiracies, economic offences or trials involving voluminous oral or documentary evidence, the list of witnesses and exhibits may be substantially long.

"Where the number of witnesses or documents is unusually large, the trial court may prepare charts only for the material, relevant and relied-upon witnesses and documents, clearly indicating that the chart is confined to such items. This ensures that the charts remain functional reference tools rather than unwieldy compilations," the bench said.

The directions came while setting aside the conviction of a man for sexually assaulting a four-year-old girl.

The court said the FIR, despite the informant's professed complete knowledge of the incident, is bereft of even the most rudimentary details, such as the names of the accused and the purported witnesses.

Bill for single education regulator introduced in LS

**New Delhi, Dec 15:** A Bill to set up a 13-member body to regulate institutions of higher education was introduced in the Lok Sabha Monday with the government expressing willingness to refer it to a joint committee.

The Viksit Bharat Shiksha Adhishtan Bill seeks to establish an overarching higher education commission along with three councils for regulation, accreditation and ensuring academic standards for universities and higher education institutions in India.

Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan introduced the Bill amid din over

the issue of alleged threatening slogans raised at a Congress rally on Sunday against Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

As soon as Pradhan introduced the Bill, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijju rose to say that since it is a comprehensive Bill, the government would like to send it to the joint committee of both Houses for a threadbare examination. According to the Bill, the present challenges faced by higher educational institutions due to multiplicity of regulators having non-harmonised regulatory approval protocols will be done away with. The higher education commission, which will be headed by a chairperson appointed by the President of India, will cover all central universities and colleges under it, institutes of national importance functioning under the administrative purview of the Ministry of Education including IITs, NITs, IISc, IISERs, IIMs, and IIITs.

Delhi govt directs schools to shift from hybrid to online

**New Delhi, Dec 15:** The Delhi government Monday directed schools to shift from hybrid to online mode for students up to Class-5 in view of the severe air pollution levels in the national capital.

According to a circular issued by the Directorate of Education, physical classes for students of nursery to Class-5 in all government, government-aided and unaided recognised private schools in Delhi have been discontinued until further orders.

The decision has been taken due to the prevailing high Air Quality Index (AQI) in the city, it said.

Schools have been directed to conduct classes for these students only in online mode.

However, classes for the remaining grades will be conducted in hybrid mode, according to the directions issued by the education department on December 13.

Delhi's AQI stood in the 'severe' category on Monday with a reading of 427, after touching the second highest AQI on record for December on Sunday at 461. According to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), the air quality was 'severe' at 27 monitoring stations across the city on Monday, with 12 stations in the 'very poor' range. Wazirpur recorded the worst air quality at 475.

According to the CBCP, an AQI between 0 and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very

poor', and 401 and 500 'severe'. According to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), 27 monitoring stations across the

city recorded "severe" air quality, while 12 stations reported "very poor" levels. Wazirpur recorded the worst air quality

Dense fog disrupts ops at Delhi airport

**New Delhi:** Dense fog disrupted flight operations at Delhi Airport Monday, with various airlines cancelling 228 flights and diverting five to nearby airports due to low visibility, an official said. However, except for Air India, which had in an X post in the morning announced the cancellation of some 40 flights, no other airlines, including crisis-hit IndiGo, shared the numbers of their cancelled or delayed flights. "As many as 228 flights -- 131 departures and 97 arrivals -- have been cancelled due to low visibility, so far," the airport official said. Ex-bureaucrat Raj Kumar Goyal sworn in as CIC

**New Delhi, Dec 15:** After a gap of nine years, transparency watchdog Central Information Commission attained its full strength with the appointment of former IAS officer Raj Kumar Goyal and eight other information commissioners, who took the oath of office Monday.

A three-member panel headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi last week recommended their names for the appointment. President Droupadi Murmu administered the oath of office to Goyal as the chief information commissioner (CIC) at a ceremony held at the Rashtrapati Bhavan, her office said in a communique.

The event was attended by Vice President C P Radhakrishnan and Union Minister of State for Personnel Jitendra Singh, among others. Goyal is a 1990-batch (retired) IAS officer of the Arunachal Pradesh-Goa-Mizoram-Union Territories (AGMUT) cadre. He superannuated as secretary, Department of Justice under the Ministry of Law and Justice, August 31. He has also served as secretary (border management) in the Home Ministry and held key posts both at the Centre and in the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir. The post of CIC fell vacant after Heeralal Samariya completed his term September 13. The Commission is headed by a CIC and can have a maximum of 10 information commissioners.

In the presence of two incumbent Information Commissioners, Anandi Ramalingam and Vinod Kumar Tiwari, Goyal administered the oath of office to eight new appointees at the swearing-in ceremony.

They included former Railway Board chief Jaya Verma Sinha, former IPS officer Swagat Das - who held key posts in the Intelligence Bureau, Home Ministry and Cabinet Secretariat, among others - Central Secretariat Service (CSS) officer Sanjeev Kumar Jindal, former IAS officer Surendra Singh Meena and ex-Indian Forest Service officer Khushwant Singh Sethi.

Nitish Kumar pulls down woman's hijab at event

**Patna, Dec 15:** A newly recruited AYUSH doctor in Bihar was taken aback Monday when Chief Minister Nitish Kumar pulled the hijab (veil) off her face, while she was receiving her letter of appointment.

The incident, a video clip of which has gone viral on social media, took place at 'Samvad', the CM's secretariat, where appointment letters were given away to more than 1,000 AYUSH doctors. PTI could not independently verify the authenticity of the video.

According to the CMO, the appointees included 685 Ayurveda doctors, while 393 were Homeopaths and 205 practised the Unani system of medicine.

Out of them, 10 appointees were handed over job letters by Kumar, while the rest got those online. When it was the turn of Nusrat Parveen, who had turned up wearing a hijab across her face, the 75-year-old CM frowned and exclaimed "what is this?".



The chief minister, who stood atop a raised platform, then bent down and pulled the hijab down. The flustered appointee was, thereafter, hastily pulled aside by an official present on the occasion, while Deputy CM Samrat Choudhary, who stood beside Kumar, was seen tugging at the latter's sleeve, in an apparent bid to restrain him. Meanwhile, opposition parties like the RJD and Congress shared the video clip on their social media accounts, and claimed that the incident was the latest proof of the JD(U) supremo's "unstable mental health".

### Flash floods kill 37 in Morocco

**Rabat:** At least 37 people have been killed in flash floods triggered by torrential rains in Morocco's Atlantic coastal province of Safi, Moroccan authorities said Monday. Fourteen people were still receiving medical care, including two who were in intensive care, they said in a statement. Schools were suspended in the city Monday as residents assessed damage and cleaned flooded homes. Videos shared by local media showed flooded streets and swamped cars in the old town, as well as authorities using boats in rescue operations. Authorities said at least 70 homes and shops had been flooded. Morocco is experiencing heavy rain and snowfall on the Atlas mountains after seven years of drought that emptied some of its main reservoirs.

### Kast wins Chile polls, shifts right

**Santiago:** Jose Antonio Kast won Chile's presidential election Sunday, leveraging voter fears over rising crime and migration to steer the country in its sharpest rightward shift since the end of the military dictatorship in 1990. Kast secured a commanding 58% of the vote in a runoff with the government-backed leftist candidate Jeannette Jara, who won 42% and swiftly conceded. Throughout his decades-long political career, Kast has been a consistent right-wing hardliner. He has proposed building border walls, deploying the military to high-crime areas, and deporting all migrants who are in the country illegally. In a victory speech to a raucous crowd who waved Chilean flags at the headquarters of his Republican Party in the upscale neighborhood of Las Condes in Santiago Sunday evening, Kast pledged "real change."

### Romanians rally against judicial reforms

**Bucharest:** A sixth day of protests calling for a clean-up of the Romanian judiciary was expected Monday, after thousands took to the streets of the capital Bucharest and other cities Sunday to support judges and prosecutors denouncing systemic abuses. Roughly 700 Romanian judges and prosecutors have signed an open letter on social media complaining of "profound and systemic dysfunction" in the justice system. President Nicusor Dan responded by announcing he would hold consultations with members of the judiciary December 22, saying that when so many magistrates complained of "an integrity problem in the justice system, things are very serious".

## Delhi backs lasting ties with Dhaka

**Dhaka, Dec 15:** Indian High Commissioner Pranay Verma Sunday said New Delhi's relations with Dhaka are "no transient" but "everlasting" hours after Bangladesh's foreign office summoned him to express its "serious concern" over "incendiary statements" made by deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina, who is currently in India.

Hasina, 78, fled to India in August last year after her Awami League government was toppled in a violent student-led street protest and continues to stay there.

She was sentenced to death by a special tribunal last month after being convicted on charges of crimes against humanity. Bangladesh has been demanding her extradition.

"The bonds we share with Bangladesh are not transient; they are everlasting. A relationship forged in blood and sacrifice cannot be weakened," the envoy said, joining an event hosted by academic and cultural group Iti-hash O Oitijjo Parishad.

Verma said India stood with the people of Bangladesh during its 1971 Liberation War and would continue to support them in realising the vision for a "democratic, stable, peaceful, progressive and inclusive nation".

The discussion was staged to mark the 54th anniversary of Victory Day on December 16, which marks the country's liberation from Pakistan in 1971.

The high commissioner said Bangladesh and India have come a long way since 1971, and both nations are now fast-growing economies. "Our societies and economies are closely linked, so closely that we are interdependent on each other," he said. Verma said that during the Liberation War, India stood with its "brothers and sisters in Bangladesh, with immense pride, supporting them at every step in their cause for truth, justice, dignity and freedom of Bangladesh".

# Oz strengthens gun laws

A mass shooting at Bondi Beach in Sydney killed at least 15 people and wounded 40

**Sydney, Dec 15:** Australia vowed stricter gun laws Monday as it began mourning victims of its worst mass shooting in almost 30 years, in which police accused a father and son of killing 15 people at a Jewish celebration at Sydney's famed Bondi Beach.

The older gunman, aged 50, was killed at the scene, taking the tally of dead to 16, while his 24-year-old son was in a critical condition in hospital, police told a press conference.

Police have not released the suspects' names but national broadcaster ABC and other media have identified them as Sajid Akram and his son Naveed Akram. Two flags of militant group Islamic State were found in the gunmen's vehicle, ABC News reported, without citing a source.

The incident has raised questions about whether Australia's gun laws, among the toughest in the world, need an overhaul, with police saying the older suspect had held a firearms licence since 2015, along with six registered weapons.

For between 10 and 20 minutes Sunday evening, the gunmen had fired on attendees at the Hanukkah event, gunning down men, women and children as terrified beachgoers fled.

The victims were aged between 10 and 87. Among them were a rabbi who was a father of five, a Holocaust survivor, a Slovak woman, and a 10-year-old girl, according to interviews, officials and local media reports. The 40 people taken to hospital after the attack included two police officers who were in a serious but stable condition, police said.

### CABINET AGREES TOUGHER GUN LAWS

"What we saw yesterday was an act of pure evil, an act of antisemitism, an act of terrorism," Prime Minister Anthony Albanese told reporters after laying flowers at Bondi Beach.

"The Jewish community are hurting today," he added. "Today, all Australians wrap our arms around them and say, we stand with you. We will do whatever is necessary to stamp out antisemitism. It is a scourge, and we will eradicate it together."

Mourners paid respects and laid flowers at a makeshift memorial at the Bondi pavilion draped in Israeli and Australian flags as police and private Jewish security guards patrolled.

Albanese said his cabinet had agreed to strengthen gun laws and work on a national firearms register to tackle aspects such as the number of weapons permitted by gun licences, and how long the latter are valid.

"People's circumstances can change," he told reporters be-

fore the cabinet met. "People can be radicalised over a period of time. Licences should not be in perpetuity."

Security officials said one of the gunmen was known to authorities but had not been deemed an immediate threat.

"We are very much working through the background of both persons. At this stage, we know very little about them," New South Wales Police Commissioner Mal Lanyon told reporters.

Home Minister Tony Burke said the father arrived in Australia in 1998 on a student visa, while his son is an Australian-born citizen.

Police gave no details of their firearms, but videos from the scene showed the men firing weapons that appeared to be a bolt-action rifle and a shotgun.

Albanese said measures being considered ranged from curbs on open-ended licences to limits on weapons held by a single individual and the types that are legal, including modifications, with permits restricted to Australian citizens.

**Hong Kong, Dec 15:** Hong Kong's High Court found tycoon and pro-democracy campaigner Jimmy Lai guilty Monday of conspiracy to collude with foreign forces in the city's highest-profile trial under a China-imposed national security law that could see him jailed for life.

The landmark case has drawn international scrutiny of Hong Kong's judicial independence amid a years-long crackdown on rights and freedoms in the global financial hub after 2019 pro-democracy protests that Beijing saw as a challenge to its rule.

While 78-year-old Lai's supporters see him as a freedom fighter, Beijing regards him as a mastermind of the protests and a conspirator advocating for U.S. sanctions against Hong Kong and the mainland. Chinese authorities have rejected accusations of eroding the city's rule of law.



### SENTENCING EXPECTED NEXT YEAR

"There is no doubt" that Lai" had harboured his resentment and hatred of "China for many of his adult years, Judge Esther Toh told a packed courtroom as the tycoon, wearing a pale green jumper and a grey jacket, sat with his arms folded.

The two other judges in his case were Alex Lee and Susana D'Almada Remedios.Lai, the founder of the now-shuttered Apple Daily newspaper and one of the most prominent critics of China's Communist Party leadership, has already spent five years in jail, facing a slew of litigation under the sweeping security legislation that Beijing enacted in response to the 2019 protests.

# Iran hosts regional talks on Afghan

**Tehran, Dec 15:** Afghanistan's neighbours met in Iran and agreed to deepen regional coordination to address political, economic and security challenges, as well as calling for sanctions on Afghanistan to be lifted. The only absent party Afghanistan itself.

China, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan and Turkmenistan all joined the talks organized by Iran, as did Russia, according to a statement released after the meeting Sunday.

Afghanistan was invited but decided not to attend. Its Taliban-led government was tightlipped on the reasons, with the foreign ministry saying only that it would not participate because Afghanistan "currently maintains active engagement with regional countries through existing regional organizations and formats, and has made good progress in this regard."



The statement from the talks in Iran stressed the importance of maintaining economic and trade ties with Afghanistan to improve living conditions and called for the country's integration into regional political and economic processes.

The Taliban were isolated after they retook power in Afghanistan in August 2021, but in the past year, they have developed diplomatic ties. They now raise several billion dollars every year in tax revenues to keep the lights on.

However, Afghanistan is still struggling economically. Millions rely on aid for survival, and the struggling economy

has been further impacted by the international community not recognizing the Taliban government's seizure of power in the wake of the chaotic withdrawal of US-led troops in 2021. Natural disasters and the flow of Afghans fleeing Pakistan under pressure to return home have underlined Afghanistan's reliance on foreign aid to meet essential needs.

The countries at the talks also voiced security concerns and pledged cooperation in combating terrorism, drug trafficking and human smuggling, while opposing any foreign military presence in Afghanistan.

# Indians boost Singaporean luxury goods sales

**Singapore, Dec 15:** Tourists from India are among the biggest spenders on luxury goods in Singapore, helping the city-state's high-end product retailers defy a global downtrend in spending on premium products, a top business association here said Monday.

Indian tourists spent SGD 812.17 million in Singapore in the first half of 2025, a rise of 4.40 per cent over the same period last year, according to Singapore Tourism Board (STB) statistics.

"Indian travellers continue to be one of the island's most com-

mercially significant markets, and they are among the tourists helping to lift luxury spending in Singapore," Orchard Road Business Association (ORBA) Chairman Mark Shaw said.

ORBA is Singapore's key body managing and promoting Orchard Road, a premier shopping belt.

Experts say, besides India, tourists from China and Indonesia are also helping the city-state defy a global downtrend in luxury spending.

"Indian travellers have high spending and longer-than-average lengths of stay at 6.3 days. These longer trips translate to higher discretionary spending across retail, dining, entertainment, attractions and accommodation," Shaw said.

He was commenting on increased footfalls at Orchard Road's Christmas Market and Village during the annual year-



end festive season.

The Mastercard Economics Institute's 2024 Travel Trends report noted that India's expanding affluent base is increasingly seeking luxury experiences, jewellery and high-end fashion, reflecting rising disposable

incomes and aspirational life styles.

## Experts say, besides India, tourists from China and Indonesia are also helping the city-state defy a global downtrend in luxury spending

during Jan-Oct 2025, up 2.5 per cent.

According to Euromonitor International, Singapore is among the few major tourism hubs expected to see an uptick in luxury sales this year.

The London-based market research firm projects luxury spending in Singapore to grow 7-9 per cent to about SGD 13.9 billion in 2025, outperforming other regional shopping hubs such as China and Japan.

The growth is being driven

by affluent consumers seeking premium products, experiences and so-called "quiet luxury". Singapore is also home to a rising number of high-net-worth individuals, including 55 billionaires, according to a UBS wealth report released on December 4.

Global luxury brands such as Prada and Van Cleef & Arpels have increased their visibility along Orchard Road's hotel-shopping belt through outdoor installations, capitalising on heightened visitor activity during the festive season.

Sugar output rises

New Delhi: India's sugar production has surged 28.33 per cent so far this season to 77.90 lakh tonnes, but the cooperative mills federation is urging the government to raise the minimum selling price, warning that falling market rates and rising costs are threatening farmers' payments. The National Federation of Cooperative Sugar Factories Ltd (NFCSF), which represents farmer-owned mills, said ex-mill sugar prices have dropped by nearly Rs 2,300 per tonne since the season began, now hovering around Rs 37,700 per tonne, despite the strong output. As of December 15, the country's 479 operating sugar mills have produced 77.90 lakh tonnes compared with 60.70 lakh tonnes by 473 mills a year earlier, according to NFCSF data.

Vegoil imports drop

New Delhi: India's vegetable oil imports fell 28 per cent year-on-year to 11.83 lakh tonne in November, the first month of the 2025-26 oil year, driven by a sharp decline in refined, bleached and deodorised (RBD) palmolein shipments, industry body SEA said Monday. The world's biggest vegetable oil importer had brought in 16.50 lakh tonne of vegetable oils, including edible and non-edible oils, in November 2024. Overall palm oil imports declined 25 per cent to 6.32 lakh tonne in November from 8.42 lakh tonne a year earlier, the Solvent Extractors Association of India (SEA) said in a statement.

Outbound shipments in Nov offset Oct losses as lower gold, oil, coal imports drive deficit fall

New Delhi, Dec 15: India's exports rebounded by 19.37 per cent to a six-month high of \$38.13 billion in November after contracting in October, driven by higher shipments of engineering and electronics goods that helped bring down the trade deficit to a five-month low of \$24.53 billion.

According to government data released Monday, the country's imports dipped by 1.88 per cent to \$62.66 billion due to a fall in the inbound shipments of gold, crude oil, coal, and coke during the month under review. The value of merchandise exports in November is the highest since May (\$38.73 billion), while outbound shipments have logged the sharpest monthly growth in the past three-and-a-half years, since June 2022.

Gold imports dipped by 59.15 per cent to \$4 billion. Crude oil imports also declined by 11.27 per cent to \$14.11 billion during the month.

The dip in imports also helped narrow the country's trade deficit (difference between imports and exports) in November. The previous low was \$18.78 billion in June this year. The trade deficit stood at a record \$41.68 billion in October. Cumulatively, exports during April-November were up 2.62 per cent to \$292.07 billion, while imports during the eight months rose by 5.59 per cent to \$515.21 billion. The deficit stood at \$223.14 billion.

India proposes PTA with Mexico

New Delhi, Dec 15: India has proposed a preferential trade agreement (PTA) with Mexico to help domestic exporters deal with the steep tariffs announced by the South American country, a top government official said Monday.

Mexico has decided to impose steep import tariffs - ranging from about 5 per cent to as high as 50 per cent on a wide range of goods (about 1,463 tariff lines) from countries that do not have free trade agreements with Mexico, including India, China, South Korea, Thailand and Indonesia. Commerce Secretary Rajesh Agrawal said that India has engaged with the country on the issue.

"Technical level talks are on... The only fast way forward is to try to get a preferential trade agreement (PTA) because an FTA (free trade agreement) will take a lot of time. So we are trying to see what can be a good way forward," he said.

Agrawal said that outbound shipments in November offset the losses in October this year. "November has been a good month for exports," he said.

Exports recorded growth despite the USA's hefty 50 per cent tariffs on Indian goods. He added that sectors like electronics, engineering, chemicals, gems and jewellery helped in pushing the country's merchandise shipments.

Exports of petroleum products too rose by 11.65 per cent to \$3.93 billion in November. The other commodities which recorded positive growth included tea, coffee, iron ore, ca-

shew, oil meals, dairy, handicrafts, marine products and leather goods.

However, shipments of rice, oil seeds, carpet and plastics recorded negative growth. He also said that the ministry is finalising the detailed guidelines of the Rs 25,060-crore export promotion mission, and a few components of it will be rolled out this week itself.

New Delhi, Dec 15: Gold prices surged by Rs 4,000 to touch an all-time high of Rs 1,37,600 per 10 grams in the national capital Monday, tracking firm global cues, according to the All India Sarafa Association.

The precious metal of 99.9 per cent purity had closed at Rs 1,33,600 per 10 grams Friday.

"Gold prices scaled even higher as international spot gold surged towards the \$4,350 zone, triggering a strong rally in the domestic market," Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst, Commodity and Currency, LKP Securities, said.

Gold prices had earlier appreciated by Rs 3,200 to touch an all-time high of Rs 1,34,800 per 10 grams October 17.

"The move was driven by renewed safe-haven demand and expectations around upcoming US economic data, including non-farm payrolls and the Core PCE Price Index scheduled this week, focus has firmly shifted to US macro cues, which are expected to keep volatility elevated," Trivedi added.

On the other hand, silver prices remained flat at Rs

Robotaxi testing sends Tesla stocks on fast lane

Tesla shares near record high as Musk confirms robotaxi testing with safety monitors

Washington, Dec 15: Tesla shares hit their highest in nearly a year Monday after CEO Elon Musk said the electric-vehicle maker was testing its robotaxis without safety monitors in the front passenger seat.

While much of Tesla's \$1.53 trillion valuation — the highest of any automaker globally — is tied to investor optimism around its self-driving technology and humanoid robot ambitions, the bulk of its revenue and profit still comes from selling electric vehicles. Shares of the company

rose as much as 4.9%, hitting \$481.37, their highest in nearly a year.

The stock had hit a record high of \$488.54 December 18 last year on hopes that the Trump administration would ease regulatory hurdles for self-driving cars. Tesla launched a limited robotaxi service in Austin, Texas, in June using modified Model Y vehicles equipped with Full Self-Driving. Early operations were geo-fenced and included a human "safety monitor" in the passenger seat.

"Testing is underway with no occupants in the car," Musk said in an X post Sunday. Investors and analysts are

betting that Tesla will intensify testing and rapidly deploy driverless taxis as it prepares to launch its Cybercab model next year.

"The news Tesla is testing robotaxis without the safety monitors is in line with our expectations that the company is making progress in its testing, in line with management's statements during the third quarter earnings call," said Seth Goldstein, senior equity analyst at Morningstar.

"The market is cheering the progress, sending shares higher today."

Tesla has long touted its robotaxi and self-driving taxi plans, though regulatory obstacles and technical setbacks have repeatedly slowed their progress.

Alphabet unit Waymo leads with more than 2,500 commercial robotaxis across major US cities, as of November.

D-St ends flat on weak ₹, outflows

Mumbai, Dec 15: India's equity benchmarks ended little changed Monday, in line with the muted moves over the last two weeks, as foreign outflows and ongoing uncertainty surrounding a potential trade deal with the US dampened sentiment.

The Nifty 50 fell 0.08% to 26,027.30 points and the BSE Sensex lost 0.06% to 85,213.36. The rupee hit another record low at 90.785 per dollar.

Foreign outflows from Indian equities have totalled \$2 billion so far in December, marking the worst sell-off in three months.

Nine of the 16 major sectors rose. Small-caps gained 0.2%, while mid-caps lost 0.1%.

India's blue-chip indexes have eased about 0.5% over last two weeks as investors booked profits near record-high levels amid uncertainty over the India-US trade deal.

"US tariffs are finally starting



to compound into stress across asset classes... The best way to ride this out is to stick with large caps, with private lenders, pharma, and IT," Emkay Global Financial Services said.

The US imposed steep tariffs on Indian goods earlier this year, partly in response to In-

dia's Russian oil purchases.

India's trade secretary said Monday that the two countries were close to a "framework deal", without giving any timeline. Last week, India's chief economic advisor said that a trade deal is likely only by March.

AUTOS FALL, INDIGO RISES

Automobile stocks fell 0.9% and were the biggest losers among major sectors. JM Financial said auto and auto components, and aluminium goods could be among the worst affected from tariff hike by Mexico.

India's largest airline IndiGo rose 2.2%, marking the third session of gains, as its operations stabilised after poor pilot roster planning led to thousands of flight cancellations earlier this month.

Foreign institutional investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth Rs 1,114.22 crore Friday, while domestic institutional investors (DIIs) bought stocks worth Rs 3,868.94 crore, according to exchange data.

In Asian markets, South Korea's Kospi, Japan's Nikkei 225 index, Shanghai's SSE Composite index and Hong Kong's Hang Seng index ended lower. European markets were trading higher. US markets ended lower Friday.



# Messi winds up GOAT India Tour

The football icon's three-day, four-city tour expectedly triggered fan frenzy everywhere he went

**New Delhi, Dec 15:** The Lionel Messi GOAT India Tour that began in shambolic fashion ended in a blaze of glory as devotional fans joyously gathered to catch a glimpse of a man that does things on the field that are often beyond human comprehension.

Upon arrival, Messi took a lap of the ground smiling, and watched the 7x7 celebrity match coming to an end, even as the spectators, many of whom were dressed in the famous blue and white Argentine jersey bearing No 10, chanted his name continuously.

He was then standing there waving to the stands smiling, something he tried to do in Kolkata too but could not as, unlike the Arun Jaitley Stadium, he was crowded by too many people, including politicians and their aides, at the Salt Lake Stadium Saturday.

He was seen kicking the ball

at the stands along with his Inter Miami teammates Luis Suarez and Rodrigo De Paul while taking a round of the venue that registered an attendance of around 25000.

Messi also felicitated the Minerva Academy football team. The script was specifically written for Messi, and, as is his wont, he played the role to perfection.

Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, ICC Chairman Jay Shah, DDCA President Rohan Jaitley and former Indian football team captain Bhaichung Bhutia had the privilege to be with Messi towards the end of the 30-minute event.

Earlier in the day, Messi arrived here for the final leg of his GOAT India Tour after his flight from Mumbai was delayed considerably due to inclement weather.

Messi, who was in Mumbai for the second day of his three-day whirlwind trip to India, was to land in the national capital around 10:45am but his charter flight was held up due to foggy conditions here.

# Not just Ro-Ko, compulsory for all India players to play 2 Hazare games

**New Delhi, Dec 15:** The BCCI has made it mandatory for all current national team players to turn up in at least two one-day matches of the upcoming Vijay Hazare Trophy starting December 24.

It is understood that with a gap of three weeks between the last T20I against South Africa in Ahmedabad (December 19) and the first ODI against New Zealand (January 11, 2026), the Board wants all its senior players to play domestic cricket.

The dikat has been communicated to the players by the Ajit Agarkar-led national se-

lection committee.

While veterans Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma have already intimated their availability for the tournament, other senior stars like Shubman Gill, Jasprit Bumrah, KL Rahul, Hardik Pandya and Suryakumar Yadav have also been asked to play at least two games for their respective teams.

Save Shreyas Iyer, who will take a lot more time to get fit, others are expected to represent their state teams.

"There are six rounds of Vijay Hazare Trophy scheduled between December 24 and start of the New Zealand ODIs. It is up to the players and their state associations to decide which two rounds they would like to play. But after the second T20I in Mullanpur, the players have been categorically told that playing Hazare isn't optional," a senior BCCI official told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

Exceptions would be made only if a player is declared unfit by the Centre of Excellence, but

officials believe there is enough time to recuperate after the South Africa series.

The dikat would also help counter the narrative that the selection committee and head coach Gautam Gambhir only want to make an example out of Kohli and Rohit, who have nothing to prove.

The decision to make Vijay Hazare Trophy mandatory for all is indicative that rules will be same for everyone.

## T20 WC, NZ series squad on same day

With the ICC setting a deadline for the T20 World Cup squad announcement, India's line-up for the global event and the preceding series against New Zealand will be announced on the same day, which could be some time in the first week of January.

"The squad that will be selected for the New Zealand T20Is will be the same that will be named for the T20 World Cup," the source added.

"...as his recent visit to India unfolded parts of it felt chaotic and left me quietly uneasy. It compelled me to pause and reflect not in judgment but in genuine concern about what we were really trying to achieve," he wondered aloud in an elaborate post on X. "Millions were spent for moments of proximity photographs and fleeting access to a legend. And yes it is people's money earned honestly and theirs to spend as they choose. Still I can't help but feel a quiet sadness wondering what might have been possible if even a fraction of that energy and investment had been directed toward the foundations of sport in our country," he observed. Bindra, however, made it clear that he has immense respect for the World Cup-winning Argentina captain, who is one of the most recognisable and admired sportspersons on the planet right now. "Lionel Messi is one of those rare athletes whose story transcends sport. His journey from a child fighting physical odds to a footballer who redefined excellence has moved millions across the world...I hold profound respect and admiration for what he represents - perseverance, humility and an uncompromising pursuit of greatness," said the 2008 Beijing Olympics gold-winner. Messi's GOAT tour has had no real football connection with his itinerary restricted to meet-and-greet sessions and little or no direct engagement with fans.

# City, Villa close lead gap with Gunners

match with an 89th-minute penalty. The Norwegian has 36 goals in 27 appearances for club and country in another remarkable scoring season. He is the league's leading scorer with 17 goals. Phil Foden got City's other goal in between Haaland's double.

## IPL MINI-AUCTION

### KKR, CSK ready to loosen purse strings

**Abu Dhabi, Dec 15:** Cameron Green could well be the biggest beneficiary of IPL's skewed demand-supply market dynamic surrounding seam-bowling all-rounders during the mini-auction here Tuesday with Kolkata Knight Riders and Chennai Super Kings seemingly ready to break the bank for the Australian.

The 10 teams need to fill up 77 slots with a cumulative purse of Rs 237.55 crore and among them, Mumbai Indians (Rs 2.75 crore) will hardly have any role to play save picking a few uncapped players at their base price.

Green, along with out-of-favour India all-rounder Venkatesh Iyer and English dasher



Liam Livingstone, is likely to enjoy a handsome payday.

Kolkata Knight Riders, with a purse of 64.30 crore and an eye on rebuilding the outfit with 13 slots to fill, can only be challenged by Chennai Super Kings, who enter the mini-auction with a purse of Rs 43.40 crore.



The mini-auction is always more intriguing than the mega auction as franchises come with specific choices and are always ready to go the distance to procure the services of players with distinct skill-sets.

Pace bowling all-rounders always come at a premium and



therefore, the troika of Green, Venkatesh Iyer and West Indies' Jason Holder, all coming at the highest base price of Rs 2 crore (\$220,000), are set to headline the bidding war.

If one looks at their IPL stats, Green, especially, has middling numbers -- 704 runs and

16 wickets in the 29 matches -- but the mini-auction is more demand-driven activity and an Australian all-format regular is certain to get traction.

When it comes to Venkatesh, everyone save KKR CEO Venky Mysore, believed that an auction bid of Rs 23.75 crore was way too high and the player had his worst season trying to justify the price.

Having also released Andre Russell, who is the team's new "Power Coach", KKR are in need of at least two good top order batters and one all-rounder.

The third of three pace-bowling all-rounders, Holder, may be a low key name but he is equally adept at using the long handle and bowl those heavy balls, making him useful in a smaller auction with lesser options.

There is buzz that Green might surpass countryman Mitchell Starc (Rs 24.75 crore)

to become the overseas player with the highest price tag at an IPL auction but there would still remain a catch.

Even if Green's bid goes northwards of Rs 25 crore, his salary for the season would still be Rs 18 crore (\$1.9 million).

The bid amount and players' salary would be mutually exclusive with the former being deducted from team's annual player purse.

The reason being IPL's "maximum-fee" rule which states that a foreign player's maximum fee at a mini auction will be the lower value between the highest retention slab (Rs 18 crore) and the highest price at the previous mega auction (Rs 27 crore for Rishabh Pant in 2025).

In case of Venkatesh, it will be interesting if his bid value goes over and above Rs 10 crore (\$1.1 million), which is a fair deal given his skill-set and capabilities.
