## Iran blames US, Israel for unrest

**Tehran, Jan 12:** Iran’s foreign minister has accused the United States of deliberately inflaming unrest after days of nationwide protests and a sweeping internet shutdown left the country largely cut off from the outside world.

Speaking Monday, Abbas Araqchi said the situation remained “under total control” but blamed Washington for encouraging violence by threatening action against Tehran. He said US President Donald Trump’s public warnings had pushed armed groups to target both protesters and security forces in a bid to trigger foreign intervention.

Araqchi said Iranian authorities possessed footage showing weapons being distributed on the streets and would soon release confessions from detainees. He added that officials were “closely following” developments and insisted the demonstrations were “stoked and fuelled” by foreign elements. Those responsible, he warned, would be pursued.

More than 500 protests have taken place across all of Iran’s 31 provinces, the US-based Human Rights Activists News Agency reported early Monday. The death toll had reached at least 544, it said, with more than 10,600 arrests.

### Budget Feb 1, Sunday

**New Delhi:** In a first, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will present the Union Budget in Parliament Sunday, February 1, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla announced Monday. This will be Sitharaman’s ninth budget presentation, one short of the record 10 budgets presented by the former finance minister Morarji Desai. The Budget session of Parliament begins on January 28 Sitharaman is likely to present the Economic Survey in both the Houses of Parliament after the president’s address.

## Minor loses eye as snack toy explodes

**Titilagarh, Jan 12:** An eight-year-old boy lost an eye after a toy found inside a snack packet allegedly exploded in Bolangir district, police said Monday.

The incident occurred at Sagadghat village under Titilagarh police station limits. According to sources, a locally packaged snack similar to “Kurkure” is being manufactured in Bargarh and Sambalpur districts and sold in plastic packets priced at Rs 5. To attract children, small toys are put inside the packets.

Ankesh Harpal, son of Lab Harpal of Sagadghat village, bought one such packet from a local shop Sunday evening. After consuming the snack

at home, the child reportedly threw the toy into a fire, following which it suddenly exploded.

The explosion caused severe injury to the child’s eye. He was rushed to Titilagarh hospital, where doctors later confirmed that the eye was completely damaged.

Ankesh’s parents lodged a complaint at Titilagarh police station Monday, demanding strict action against those responsible. They also called for an immediate ban on the company involved and sought compensation for their son’s injury.

Police said an investigation has been initiated to ascertain the source of toy production and the circumstances leading to the explosion.

## US envoy praises Trump-Modi, nothing more

*Though Sergio Gor, the new US ambassador to India, struck an upbeat note about the future relations between both countries in his arrival speech, the optimism seems detached from on-the-ground realities. His effusive praise for Trump-Modi friendship signals continued subservience to personality-driven diplomacy rather than substantive policy. Gor’s ‘rhetoric’ about deepening ties masks America’s plan to counter China through India, reducing bilateral relations to strategic convenience. This hollow charm offensive, heavy on superlatives but light on specifics, suggests another four years of style over substance in US-India engagement*

**New Delhi, Jan 12:** Signalling intent to rebuild strained ties, President Donald Trump’s new ambassador to Delhi Monday said that both sides are actively engaged to firm up a trade deal.

“Many of you have asked me for an update on the ongoing trade deal negotiations. Both sides continue to actively en-



gaged. In fact, the next call on trade will occur tomorrow,” shared Sergio Gor.

The 38 year old, in his arrival speech, went on to add that no country is as essential as India to the United States.

He announced an invitation to New Delhi for a US-led strategic alliance, known as ‘Pax Silica’ on critical minerals and artificial intelligence.

The comments made just hours after he began work are seen as a welcome outreach by the Trump administration which has mounted pressure on India in recent months over

tariffs and H1B visas.

“You and I have an incredible once in a lifetime opportunity to redefine diplomacy. What it can accomplish could be the most consequential global partnership of this century,” Gor said addressing the US embassy employees.

“No partner is more essential than India. In the months and years ahead, it is my goal as ambassador to pursue a very ambitious agenda. We will do this as true strategic partners, each bringing strength, respect and leadership to the table,” he said.

He also emphasised that the

friendship between Trump and PM Narendra Modi is “real” and will help in resolving “differences”, which have resulted in the worst phase in the relations in the last two decades.

The downturn began after Trump slapped a 50 per cent tariff on India, including a 25 per cent additional duties for India’s purchase of Russian crude oil. Apart from the tariff issue, the relations witnessed a severe strain on a number of other issues that included Trump’s claim of ending the India-Pakistan conflict in May last year and Washington’s new immigration policy.

“The United States and India are bound not just by shared interests, but by a relationship anchored at the highest levels. Real friends can disagree, but always resolve their differences in the end,” he said.

While talking about trade, the US envoy also recalled Secretary of State Marco Rubio’s remarks that it will be a “year of reciprocity”.

## Assembly seats may increase to 200: CM

**Bhubaneswar, Jan 12:** Following delimitation, the seats in the state Assembly may increase, with the total strength possibly going up to around 200, said Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi during the foundation stone laying ceremony of the new Assembly building and Lok Seva Bhavan Monday.

“Today, we have 147 MLAs, which could increase after delimitation. I am not sure, but after delimitation, the number of members could be 200. Therefore, we have to construct a new assembly building keeping in view for the next 50/100 years,” Majhi said.

The chief minister also said that the state required a new Lok Seva Bhavan (secretariat) as the present building is 70 years old, where office space failed to meet the present-day requirements.

There is a need for a modern Lok Seva Bhavan due to expanded departments and staff numbers outgrowing the existing infrastructure, aligning with June 2025 government announcements for integrated new buildings.



The new Assembly and Lok Seva Bhavan premises will have underground parking facilities, ensuring better space management and convenience.

The project will be constructed at an estimated cost of Rs 3,623 crore and spread over 71.13 acres of land in the state capital. The CM said the proposed assembly building will feature a modern meeting hall with a seating capacity of 300 members.

Works Minister Pritiviraj Harichandan said that the campus, officially named Lok Seva Bhavan and Mantralaya building, is envisioned as a state-of-the-art hub for governance and public service delivery. He said a master plan for this ambitious project has already been approved. **MORE P 3**

## Man who built his own grave laid to rest

**Hyderabad, Jan 12:** An 80-year-old man in Telangana, who built his own grave while leading a healthy life, passed away January 11.

A resident of Laxmipuram village, Nakka Indrayya had gained national attention for constructing his own final resting place years in advance, as a peaceful gesture to ensure that his children would face no burden during their time of grief.

Indrayya, who built his grave beside his wife’s, has placed a plaque at the site inscribed with a message on the eternal truths of life and death.

He made it a routine to visit the spot, clean the surroundings, water the plants and sit in quiet reflection.

The man’s life was marked by a tireless spirit of giving. Sharing Indrayya’s contribu-

tions, his elder brother, Nakka Bhumayya told PTI videos: “He built his own grave... and also a church in the village. He did several good things for the village. He distributed his wealth during his lifetime to his four children. He built houses for them and organised nine weddings in the family...”

Srinivas, a villager, recalled Indrayya’s guiding principle: “Whatever you hoard will slip away, but what you give to others will stay with you forever.” Following his passing on Sunday, Indrayya’s final wish was fulfilled as he was laid to rest at the grave he had prepared with his own funds.

For many villagers gathered in large numbers for the last rites, Indrayya’s journey served as a reminder that in a world driven by material pursuit, preparing for the end with clarity and calm can itself be a profound life lesson.

“I have built four-five houses, a school and a church and now my own grave. I am very happy. The very mention of building a grave causes sadness to many but I am happy,” Indrayya had earlier told PTI Videos.

Born into a landless labourer family from a poor Dalit background, Indrayya lost his father at a tender age and began working as a child labourer under a local landlord. He later moved to Mumbai before finally settling in Dubai, where he spent the major part of his life and went on to become one of the wealthiest persons in his village.

## Two SIR deaths in West Bengal

**Kolkata, Jan 12:** Two persons died in different parts of West Bengal Monday, with the families of both claiming that anxiety related to the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls was the reason for their deaths.

A middle-aged man collapsed and died in a market in Uttar Dinajpur’s Kaliaganj in the northern part of the state, while an elderly woman breathed her last after suffering a stroke at Basirhat in North 24 Parganas district in the south. The man recently received a notice for the SIR hearing, and the woman attended the exercise last week.

In Kaliaganj, a 50-plus daily wage labourer, Lakshmikanta Ray, collapsed and died Monday afternoon at the crowded Dhankaili market, police said.

# Rani's definition of success

**Mumbai:** Bollywood veteran Rani Mukerji, who recently completed 30 years in Indian cinema, reflected on her journey by redefining what success truly means to her as an artist. Sharing a note through Yash Raj Films' official social media, the actress said her career, from *Raja Ki Aayegi Baaraat* to the upcoming *Mardaani 3*, has never been about chasing numbers, trophies or external validation.

Rani revealed that she measures success through moments rather than milestones. "I don't count box-office numbers or awards first. I count moments," she wrote, pointing to experiences such as standing under the rain for a shot, laughing between takes or being emotionally drained after a demanding scene. For her, these intimate, behind-the-scenes experiences define fulfilment far more than commercial outcomes.

She explained that cinema's ability to capture and preserve

emotion has shaped her relationship with the craft, keeping her grounded despite decades in the industry. This philosophy has guided her choice of roles, many of which centre on emotionally complex and socially driven characters, including *Black* and *Mrs Chatterjee vs Norway*.

Even her National Award win, she noted, felt like a quiet validation rather than a destination. As she steps into her fourth decade with *Mardaani 3*, Rani reaffirmed that as long as there are stories to tell, she will continue learning, growing and measuring success through the depth of her experiences rather than accolades. 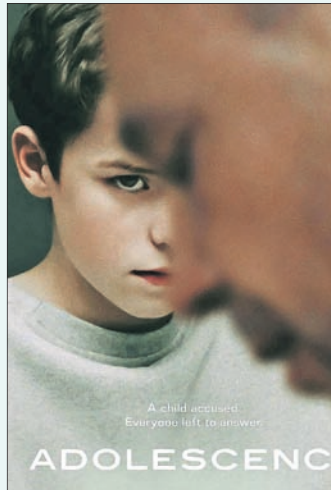
As she re-shared the post, Anushka added the caption: "And I wouldn't go back to any version of me that didn't know you, my child."

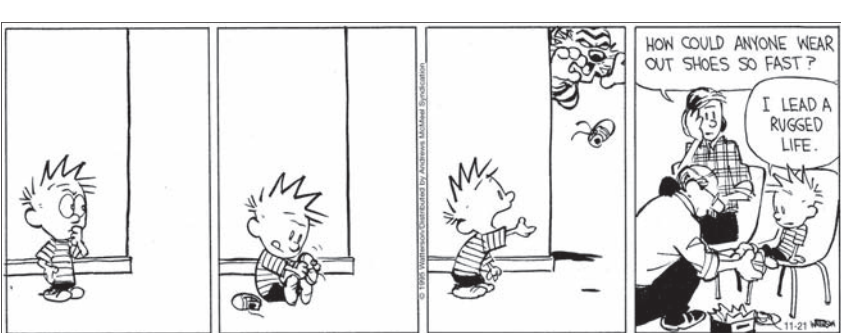
Rashami added that in the world of social media, everyone has an opinion, and everyone's opinion reaches various parts of the world.

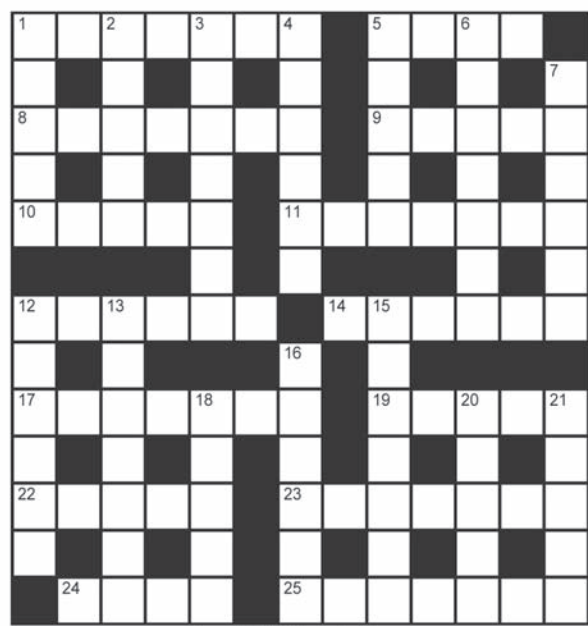

# INDIA NEEDS A MAMDANI



**Mamdani's ideas – plural, liberal and invaluable – resonate with the core of a new India and make him stand out as a leader worth cherishing**

Zohran Mamdani took the oath of office as the mayor of New York, the largest and most important city of USA, at a decommissioned subway of Manhattan to symbolise his affinity with the city's workers and marginalised people whose cause he said he would serve, thus wearing the badge of a democratic socialist on his sleeve. He was administered the oath by the Democratic senator Bernie Sanders, a monumental figure in American politics and a torchbearer of democratic socialism, with Congress woman Alezandria Cortez by his side.

There was hardly any coverage in the Indian media of his historic oath-taking, and the seminal impact Mamdani's election would have on American politics. The 34-year-old politician broke several taboos in taking charge of the Big Apple, right in the heart of the elite, fat-cats and billionaires, the bastion of American Jewry.

Mamdani, however, remains a taboo in India. The government through its media handlers had made it a point to invisibilise Mamdani despite his stupendous victory by ousting the two-time Democrat governor Andrew Cuomo, his nearest rival, by polling more than 50% of the vote. Over one million New Yorkers, cutting across race, religion, ethnicity and economic background and largely carrying the immigrant tag, had voted for him in a ground-breaking election creating waves across the world. It is only his home country India that did not salute its 34-year-old son on his unprecedented victory.

Mamdani has several firsts: the first American of Asian descent and African origin, the first Muslim and the youngest Mayor of New York. Scion of the celebrated power couple Mira Nair, globally acclaimed filmmaker, and Mahmood Mamdani, Professor Emeritus at Columbia University, Zohran has never idolised being born into an elite legacy. On the contrary, he has taken up the cause of the immigrants given that New York hosts more than 150 nationalities. Secular and liberal in

orientation, he has shown himself caring for the plight of every New Yorker. Outspoken about Netanyahu's role in the genocidal killings of Palestinians, he has distanced himself quickly from allegations of anti-Semitism, given that the American Israel Public Affairs Committee, America's largest pro-Israel lobbying group, and the New York Jewish Foundation had played an active role in canvassing support for Cuomo. However, the results saw an even split of the Jewish vote, the younger generation rooting for Mamdani while the older, Hasidic and wealthy Jews, voting en masse for Cuomo.

President Trump's fulminations and public denunciations of Mamdani, threatening to cut off federal funds and openly supporting his Democrat rival Cuomo, hardly made any dent in Mamdani's surging popularity. Calling Mamdani a Marxist and anti-national, Trump sought to nix Mamdani's political career even before it had started. However, the NYC Mayor turned the tables on Trump by appearing at the White House for a courtesy meeting, stressing his primary objective of securing affordability for all New Yorkers while providing free transport, and childcare, affordable housing and government-run grocery stores as he had promised in his election campaign. Surprisingly, and perhaps gauging the public mood, Trump

turned turtle and assured Mamdani of all support. The incident showed the contrarian portraits of both ideologically divided politicians of the right and left. One, mean-minded, vindictive, unpredictable, and the other, defiant, committed and fearless.

In the current turmoil in South America, with Trump defying all international norms and "capturing" the elected President and the first lady of Venezuela, the American system literally collapsed with the media largely and perniciously silent, and with Congress and Supreme Court voiceless against this flagrant abuse of power. Mamdani stood up to condemn the brazen act of aggression as a "declaration of war."

Known for his outspoken views, Mamdani has positioned himself securely on the side of a pro-people ideology. He cautioned the Israeli PM not to ever land in New York as he would have him arrested for committing "crimes against humanity" for massacring thousands of helpless Palestinian women, children, old and sick while calling for the Palestinians' right to a peaceful homeland on their own soil. Mamdani's father is a Kutchi Gujarati while his mother is a Hindu Punjabi. Zohran, who is married to a Syrian Muslim, radiates the kind of cosmopolitanism which resonates in his unequivocal liberal views, notwithstanding his taking the oath on the Quran to

reaffirm his Muslim ancestry.

In his ideological pronouncements, Mamdani veers closely towards a liberal socialist front, a much-needed panacea against the slide towards an autocratic majoritarian State which democratic India has morphed into over the last decade or so. With its secular and democratic credentials founded on the majesty of a nonviolent freedom struggle, India needs a Mamdani at its hour of reckoning in a world tossed between powerful and opposing ideological blocs. It is no wonder that Mamdani chose to quote from Nehru's iconic "Tryst with destiny" speech when he vanquished all his opponents.

In his seminal work 'The Idea of India,' eminent political scientist Sunil Khilnani writes: "Modern Indian politics continues to plunder the nationalist pantheon for its iconography while, at the same time, in its practical struggles, it moves further and further away from the nationalist world and its distinctive temperament. The old arguments and battles are replayed today with the current generation's new meanings and desires: Ambedkar is once again ranged against Gandhi, Patel is brought into battle against Nehru. Even as they divide, these struggles themselves testify to the presence of a common history, a shared Indian past... These struggles constitute the identity of India's history since 1947. And, in its ability constantly to encompass diverse ideas of what India is, this history is itself expressive of the Indian idea."

India's strength lies in its civilizational diversity, its age-old tradition of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' and no attempts to paint with a monochromatic brush can bring the real Indian canvas to life. Mamdani's ideas – plural, liberal and invaluable – resonate with the core of a new India and make him stand out as a leader worth cherishing.

## Are MLA salary & ex-MLA pension hikes unjustified?

**PUBLIC REPRESENTATIVES MUST REMAIN ACCOUNTABLE TO THE PEOPLE. AT THE SAME TIME, DIGNITY IN PUBLIC LIFE AND REASONABLE FINANCIAL SECURITY ARE ESSENTIAL FOR THE HEALTHY FUNCTIONING OF DEMOCRACY**

The recent unanimous passage of a financial bill in the Odisha Assembly to increase salaries and allowances of sitting MLAs, along with the pension of former MLAs, has generated widespread debate and criticism across the state. Much of the outrage, particularly on social media, portrayed legislators as self-interested and insensitive to public hardship. While public scrutiny is a vital part of democracy, this issue deserves a more reasoned and factual discussion.

Members from both the ruling and Opposition parties supported the bill, though CPI(M) MLA Laxman Munda opposed it in keeping with his party's ideology. The controversy escalated when former CM and Leader of the Opposition, Naveen Patnaik, stated that he would donate his increased salary to the poor. While this was a personal decision, it raises an important question: if the bill was objectionable, why was it not opposed during the Assembly proceedings or through party legislators at the time of voting?

It is true that many MLAs and ministers, particularly those from affluent or industrial backgrounds, may not depend on their salaries. However, a

significant number of MLAs come from poor, tribal, and remote regions, where the salary is a genuine necessity rather than a privilege. Some MLAs struggle to meet basic expenses through their official remuneration alone. In such circumstances, financial pressure can create vulnerability, though this does not imply that all MLAs resort to unethical practices. Ignoring this reality would be unfair.

It is also important to note that this bill was not passed hastily. A Standing Committee comprising members from all political parties examined the matter in detail and recommended that MLA salaries and allowances be limited to Rs 2.75 lakh. This recommendation was approved by the State Cabinet and then unanimously passed by the Assembly. However, during the final stage, the amount was amended to Rs 3.5 lakh. This increase later became the main focus of public anger.

The Opposition had sufficient opportunity to object during the legislative process. When criticism erupted later, especially on social media, the government acknowledged that a mistake may have been made. Respecting public sentiment, the ruling party requested the CM to reconsider

the decision. If the bill is revised or withdrawn, it would be an unprecedented development in the history of the Odisha Assembly.

Criticism of certain allowances such as those for newspapers, books, electricity, and similar expenses is not entirely unjustified. MLAs are already provided official accommodation, and communication costs have reduced significantly in recent years. However, other unavoidable expenses remain substantial. These include constituency visits, maintaining a personal assistant, a driver, and continuous engagement with the public. Any reconsideration should therefore distinguish between excessive claims and genuine operational needs.

The issue of pension for former MLAs requires special sensitivity. The pension has been increased from Rs 30,000 to Rs 80,000, while the medical allowance remains only Rs 2,000. In today's economic reality, even basic medical expenses often exceed this amount.

Former MLAs, even after leaving office, continue to live among the people. They are expected to attend social events, religious functions, and community programmes, often at personal expense. In many con-

stituencies, former MLAs are still regarded as public representatives and are approached regularly for assistance.

Not all former MLAs are wealthy. Many come from lower or middle-class backgrounds and have no independent source of income. Over the years, while affluent individuals have increasingly entered politics, nearly 500 former MLAs from modest backgrounds still depend on pension to meet basic needs.

Our committee has repeatedly met the CM seeking a reasonable revision of former MLAs' pensions, and assurances were given that the matter would be considered. If the government revisits this decision in upcoming Assembly session, whatever outcome is reached in the broader interest of the state should be accepted collectively.

Public representatives must remain accountable to people. At the same time, dignity in public life and reasonable financial security are essential for healthy functioning of democracy. The debate should move beyond outrage and focus on fairness, realism, and long-term institutional integrity.

## Political Rot

In politics, especially in India, an axiomatic truth is that there is no permanent enemy or permanent friend. Hence, it is only natural to expect strange bed-fellows when it comes to forming political alliances and more so when stakes are high where spoils of offices are to be shared by hook or by crook. In such situations so-called political ideologies are thrown to the wind and sworn enemies embrace one another as friends for benefit. India has experienced the phenomenon at such nauseating regularity that it has ceased to cause any surprise. But what happened recently in two municipal areas of Ambernath and Arkot in Maharashtra can be termed as political opportunism of the worst variety as sworn enemies – BJP, Congress and AIMIM – buried the hatchet, threw away all scruples and joined hands to form the two municipalities and share power.

It was the height of opportunism when BJP units tied up with the Congress at Ambernath in Thane and the AIMIM at Akot in Akola to gain majority control in the two local bodies following the municipal elections last month. One may view the development as a small aberration in some far-away local bodies and may even discard the event as too insignificant, but the die has been cast. The claim of an "ideological battle" as Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi has been saying or "Congress Mukht Bharat" as Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been personally repeating for over a decade now, not only ring hollow but represent a naked alliance of opportunism that is obviously accepted and blessed by both these two top leaders.

It would be hypocrisy on the part of leaders of any of the three parties to claim they are unaware about the greed and lack of principles of their party functionaries. The fact that the brazenness with which political opportunism has been displayed must not be considered as isolated instances. It rather reflects the moral and ideological bankruptcy of the country's top political class. The apparent ideological battles that are fought are only smokescreen to fool the average voter. The message that emanates from the actions of the elected representatives of the three parties appears to be that they should not lag behind when political opportunism at any cost is the norm at their respective parties' top levels. Had it not been so, they would not have dared take the reprehensible course.

Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis directed his party to break both alliances while saying they were "not acceptable." At the same time, the Congress dissolved the party's city unit in Ambernath and suspended its chief Pradip Patil while the AIMIM warned its corporators in Akot, which falls in the Vidarbha region, of legal action if they did not pull out from the BJP alliance. Fadnavis has said "alliance with Congress and AIMIM is not acceptable and disciplinary action will be taken if anybody has violated orders."

Maharashtra BJP chief Ravindra Chavan also issued a show cause notice to party MLA Prakash Bharsakhle, who represents Akot, for the "suo motu" AIMIM alliance. Meanwhile, Maharashtra Congress vice-president Ganesh Patil said in a letter to its Ambernath unit chief that the municipal election was fought on the party's symbol. He warned disciplinary action would be taken against the unit for "allying with the BJP in the Ambernath municipal council without informing the state office." It said that the block Congress committee was dissolved and all corporators suspended from the party.

Pradip Patil, however, accused the state leadership of not giving him a hearing before announcing the disciplinary action and threatened to join the BJP. The conclusion he has reached is not only the height of political dishonesty, but takes rank opportunism to another level. He said he and his pack of party leaders "respect the Congress and will continue to do so in future," but if they are insulted by the party they would have "no option but to join the BJP." And as is well known, the BJP would certainly take them in.

This is a familiar political trajectory that the BJP top leadership has advocated and followed during the past few years in different states and at the national level when they broke Congress and other Opposition parties, poached their MLAs and MPs to form new governments toppling those run by the Opposition. They even used Central investigating machinery to go after Opposition leaders and coerce them to join their party. Some Social Media users compare this tactic of the BJP with the work of a "washing machine" in which the taint of corruption in Opposition leaders is washed clean once they enter the BJP fold.

Congress too cannot walk a moral high ground just as any other party. The Maharashtra civic body scandals have shown Indian politics in its true colours. When top leaders are always seen to have engineered defections, get the defectors absolved of any past crime or corruption and grab power at any cost, why should the lower rungs of the party be denied the same immorality is the moot point. Thus, it is only the people who become the losers but never the ruling political class.

# Cyber fraud costs Delhi ₹1,250cr

New Delhi, Jan 12: A few lakh rupees here, a few crores there, and once as much as ₹23 crore. With relentless regularity, cyber fraudsters have stolen a cumulative ₹1,250 crore from unsuspecting victims in Delhi region alone in the last one year, officials said Monday.

The nationwide figure is believed to be around ₹20,000 crore or as much as the budget of a small state.

The new-age dacoity once again came to the forefront of public consciousness last week with a ₹14.85 crore fraud perpetrated on a senior citizen couple in Greater Kailash colony of New Delhi, leaving them nearly penniless and the community in shock at how easily the cyber thieves are able to manipulate their victims.

Repeated public service messaging by authorities has not deterred or reduced the crime. In 2024, police said the criminals – almost always based in Cambodia, Vietnam and Laos and working mostly on the behest of Chinese



handlers – collectively stole ₹1,100 crore in Delhi.

The figure for 2025 jumped to about ₹1,250 crore, a senior police officer said. The only silver lining is that the recovery rate too jumped from 10 per cent in 2024 to 24 per cent in 2025.

That is of little consolation for 81-year-old Om Taneja and his wife Indira, 77, who were conned over a 16-day period through the now-familiar stratagem – digital arrest, a non-existent tool in the law that the criminals have used with impunity over the last three to four years when the fraud was first started being observed.

“We have lost all of our life’s savings now. The cyber fraudsters repeatedly threatened us with arrest and serious consequences,”

Om Taneja told PTI.

He said his wife was approached on WhatsApp by a caller who claimed to be from the telecom department. Using a tried-and-tested spiel that her phone was being used for illegal activities, the caller and his associates sucked the couple into a deepening web of deceit built on fear and their willingness to abide by the law.

While placed under “digital arrest” from December 24 to January 9, they gave away their entire life savings in several chunks of about ₹2 crore, drawn from their savings accounts and by liquidating their mutual funds.

In the wake of the case, another senior police officer, explaining the modus

operandi of such scammers, told PTI that digital arrest cases, along with investment frauds, have emerged as two of the most common ways in which people are losing their hard-earned money.

Investigators said most of these fraudsters operate out of Southeast Asian countries such as Cambodia, Laos and Vietnam, where large-scale “scam compounds” run by Chinese handlers target victims across the world.

From these locations, the accused use illegal SIM box installations that allow international calls to be masked as local Indian numbers by bypassing telecom networks.

“The calls are actually routed from abroad but are made to appear as domestic calls using illegal SIM box devices, which helps the accused evade detection while creating fear and urgency among victims,” the officer said.

The police said mule bank accounts continue to pose a major challenge, as they create multilayered money trails that are difficult to trace. Fraudsters based in India often assist overseas syndicates by providing mule accounts and SIM cards to launder stolen funds.

These accounts are typically opened by people

from economically weaker sections, who hand them over to fraudsters in return for a commission.

To tackle the rising menace of cybercrime, the police said they have been regularly conducting cyber awareness programmes across multiple platforms, with a special focus on vulnerable sections such as senior citizens. Recently, they launched a two-phase awareness drive titled ‘Santaki Seekh’, under which citizens were educated about the risks of scanning unknown links after being prompted through QR codes. Officials said coordination meetings are also being held regularly with bank officials to ensure greater due diligence and sensitisation of frontline staff.

In this connection, two bank employees were recently arrested for allegedly facilitating a cyber fraud by helping a gang open a fake current account using forged documents, which was used to divert and siphon off the proceeds of the crime.

Officials reiterated their appeal to citizens to immediately report cyber fraud on the national helpline number 1930, noting that early reporting significantly improves the chances of putting fraudulent transactions on hold and recovering the money.

# Goa records highest tourist footfall at 1.08cr in 2025

Panaji, Jan 12: Nearly 1.08 crore tourists, including five lakh foreigners, arrived in Goa in 2025, surpassing the numbers of previous years, as per official data.

The Goa government’s focus remains on promoting quality tourism, diversifying markets, and advancing the coastal state’s vision of Regenerative Tourism, ensuring that its growth translates into long-term benefits for local communities, the environment, and the economy, Tourism Minister Rohan Khaunte said Sunday.

In 2025, Goa recorded 1,02,84,608 domestic tourists and 5,17,802 foreign tourists, aggregating to 1,08,02,410 total arrivals, the state Tourism Department said in its data released Sunday.

Foreign tourist arrivals through charter flights have played an important role in Goa’s inbound tourism, particularly from traditional source markets, it said. The data indicated that tourist arrivals in Goa, known for its picturesque beaches, have shown distinct phases of growth, disruption, and recovery over the years.

In 2017, the state received 68,95,234 domestic tourists and 8,90,459 foreign tourists, taking the

total to 77,85,693.

Moderate growth continued (before COVID-19) in 2018 and 2019, with total arrivals reaching 80,15,400 and 80,64,400, respectively, as per the data.

This upward trend continued (post-COVID-19) in 2023 and 2024, with total arrivals at 86,28,162 and 1,04,09,196, respectively, it said.

On the international arrival front (foreign tourist), in 2017, Goa received 1,024 charter flights carrying 2,49,374 foreign tourists, which gradually declined to 799 flights and 2,16,738 tourists in 2019.

The department said the operationalisation of Manohar International Airport (at Mopa in North Goa) reflected in the data from 2023, when charter operations were recorded at both Mopa and Dabolim airports, with a total of 356 flights and 72,795 tourists.

“In 2024, charter arrivals stood at 266 flights and 58,680 tourists. As of 2025, Goa received 189 charter flights, bringing in 40,336 foreign tourists, with operations split between Dabolim and Mopa airports,” it said.

Khaunte said that Goa’s tourism performance, as reflected in the year-wise statistics, clearly demonstrates the resilience of the sector and the effectiveness of the government’s sustained efforts towards structured and balanced tourism growth.

“The steady rise in domestic tourist arrivals, the gradual revival of foreign tourism across charter, scheduled international flights, and cruise segments, along with the enhanced role of Manohar International Airport, underline the state’s improved connectivity and destination readiness,” he said.

Khaunte said that foreign tourist arrivals through international scheduled flights have consistently contributed to Goa’s inbound tourism.

“In 2017, 2,460 international flights operated through Dabolim Airport carrying 3,35,573 foreign tourists. This number gradually declined until 2021, when only 265 flights and 11,971 tourists were recorded due to travel restrictions,” he noted.

A steady recovery began in 2022, with 1,135 flights and 1,34,922 tourists. “The operationalisation of Mopa Airport became evident from 2023, when international flights were handled by both airports, together accounting for 1,416 flights and 1,95,067 tourists,” he said.

In 2024, these figures increased to 1,546 flights carrying 1,95,990 tourists, the minister said.

## FROM ‘UNMAPPED’ TO VERIFIED

# EC resolves voter identity notice to 1971 war veteran

Panaji, Jan 12: The Election Commission (EC) Monday clarified that a “system-driven procedure” led to the controversial notice issued to former Navy chief Admiral Arun Prakash (retd) as part of Goa’s ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls.

The commission said the incomplete details in his previous enumeration form triggered the notice.

The notice to Admiral Prakash, an 81-year-old Vir Chakra awardee and hero of the 1971 India-Pakistan War, had sparked a social media storm, with veterans and citizens questioning why such a decorated officer was required to “prove his identity” in person.

Officials said the form had now been duly completed and that the former Naval chief was not required to appear now.

In a clarification issued Monday, Electoral Registration Officer Dr Medora Ermomilla D’Costa said the Booth Level Officer (BLO) for the Cortalim constituency collected the Admiral’s form but found it lacked mandatory particulars from previous revisions.

“It was observed that the said enumeration form did



not contain the mandatory particulars relating to the previous SIR, including the name of the elector, EPIC number, name of the relative, name and number of the Assembly Constituency, Part number, and serial number in the electoral roll,” D’Costa added.

In the absence of these essential identification details, the BLO Application was unable to establish an automatic linkage between the submitted enumeration form and the existing electoral roll database, the official pointed out. As all the fields pertaining to the last SIR were left blank, the system categorised the enumeration form under the ‘unmapped’ category,” the clarification mentioned.

D’Costa said, as per the standard, system-driven procedure, a hearing notice was automatically gener-

ated and issued to enable verification of the elector’s details and ensure due opportunity for confirmation of eligibility.

Admiral Prakash, who has lived in Goa since his 2006 retirement, took to social media to highlight the logistical hurdles for elderly citizens and said that he and his wife were asked to appear on two separate dates at a location 18 km away from their residence.

“Neither need, nor have ever asked for any special privileges... but if the SIR forms are not evoking required info, they should be revised,” Prakash, who was Naval chief from 2004 till 2006, posted on X.

He added that the BLO had visited his home three times and could have easily requested the missing documents then.

## Delhi to add 7,000 EV charging stations, 2,000 buses this year

New Delhi, Jan 12: The Delhi government is planning to install around 7,000 new electric vehicle charging stations by the end of the year to promote clean mobility and boost EV adoption, officials said Monday.

According to the officials, the initiative is part of a broader strategy to mitigate vehicular emissions, a primary driver of air pollution in the national capital. Alongside the charging infrastructure, the government is planning to strengthen public transport by expanding the bus fleet. The existing EV policy will expire at the end of March. Officials said a revised policy is expected to be finalised and notified by that deadline.

Under the proposed transport plan, the government has plans to add over 2000 buses by the end of 2026, the officials said. In a recent high-level review meeting on air pollution control measures, authorities established a total requirement of 11,000 buses for the city. Delhi, currently operates 5,245 buses, including 3,377 electric buses.

“A month-wise action plan was shared with the officials. The target is to add 2,468 new buses this year. However, some old CNG buses may get

phased out over the year, which the government has to factor in yet,” a senior official said.

To support the transition to electric vehicles, the government’s pollution control plan includes the addition of 7,000 charging stations across the city.

Official data shows that as of December, Delhi has 8,849 charging stations against a projected requirement of 36,150. This leaves a current deficit of 27,301 stations.

With the addition of 7,000 new charging stations, the total is expected to reach 15,849. These charging stations are situated at Rapid Rail and Delhi Metro stations and are installed by power distribution companies, the officials said.

The government is also working with the Delhi Traffic Police to address road congestion.

Traffic Police has identified 62 congestion hotspots and 215 specific remedial tasks. Of these, 83 tasks have been completed, while 46 have been deemed unfeasible due to ongoing infrastructure projects, redevelopment works, or lack of feasibility, the officials said.

Of the 86 pending tasks, 50 are scheduled to be completed within the next one to six months.

Chadha posted a video on X with a caption, “Away from boardrooms, at the grassroots. I lived their day”.

The AAP leader said he wanted to step away



from policy debates and see life at the grassroots.

In the video, the Pun-

jab Rajya Sabha MP is seen wearing Blinkit’s yellow uniform and a

helmet, riding pillion on a delivery partner’s motorcycle as they complete multiple orders across the city.

The footage follows the pair through what appears to be a regular work shift, offering a glimpse into the pace and pressure of last-mile deliveries. Chadha has been a vocal critic of 10-minute delivery promises made by quick commerce platforms. He has argued that such deadlines push workers to take risks on the road to meet unrealistic targets.

Earlier, while raising the issue during Zero

Hour in the Rajya Sabha, he urged the House to look beyond convenience and consider the human cost of ultra-fast deliveries.

“I want to tell you that these people are not robots. They are also someone’s father, husband, brother, or son. The House should think about them. And the cruelty of this 10-minute delivery should end,” he had said earlier. Through his latest post, Chadha sought to underline that debate with lived experience, placing the spotlight firmly on delivery workers and their safety.

Modi, Merz engage in 'kite diplomacy'

**Ahmedabad, Jan 12:** German Chancellor Friedrich Merz Monday visited the Sabarmati Ashram in Ahmedabad and paid rich tributes to Mahatma Gandhi, saying the teachings of India's independence movement hero are more needed today than ever.

On his maiden India tour, Merz, who later flew kites with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who accompanied the visiting leader to the historic ashram on the banks of the Sabarmati river, noted that Mahatma Gandhi's legacy unites Indians and Germans as friends.

Modi and Merz visited the Sabarmati Ashram in the morning and paid homage to Mahatma Gandhi, later inaugurated Gujarat's famous kite festival. The German Chancellor also made a trip to Adalaj Ni Vav, an iconic stepwell near Gandhinagar city.

The Prime Minister, who reached the ashram a few minutes before Merz's arrival, welcomed the German Chancellor upon his arrival.

After paying floral tributes at a statue of the Father of the Nation, both leaders visited 'Hriday Kunj', a room inside the ashram where Mahatma Gandhi and his wife Kasturba lived during the freedom struggle.

At the sprawling ashram, Merz also witnessed how khadi yarn is woven using the 'charkha', or spinning wheel.

Mahatma Gandhi spun yarn on the charkha as part of his campaign to promote khadi and self-reliance during the independence movement.

In a note in the ashram visitors' book, Merz stated, "Mahatma Gandhi's unshakeable belief in the power of freedom and dignity of each and every individual inspires us to this day. This legacy unites Indians and Germans as friends in a world that may more than ever be in need of Gandhi's teachings."

A pennant with Operation Sindoor, a giant Hanuman and his mace, the tricolour and myriad other kites floated against a cloudless blue sky. Politics, diplomacy and festivity blended in the Ahmedabad airspace as Modi and Merz inaugurated the Kite Festival.

The pull and the tug, kites of various shapes and sizes fluttering in the breeze and the vivid blue providing the perfect canvas for the art fest in the skies. It all made for a picture book setting at the Sabarmati Riverfront. As many as 135 kite flyers from 50 countries and nearly 1,000 enthusiasts from India are participating in the festival this year in Ahmedabad, according to a Gujarat government release.

As part of the festival organised by the state government, the kite flyers have already visited places like Rajkot, Surat, Dholavira (in Kutch) and Statue of Unity (Narmada district) during the last two days and enthralled the visitors, it said.

The festival in Ahmedabad will continue till January 14.

The festival is held annually ahead of 'Uttarayan', also known as Makar Sankranti, which falls January 14 and marks the Sun's northward journey and the transition towards summer.

Raj: Class XII girl student gangraped inside moving car

**Jaipur, Jan 12:** A Class XII girl student was allegedly kidnapped and gangraped inside a moving car in Rajasthan's Bikaner district, police said Monday.

The incident occurred January 6 in the Napasar area, but a case was registered only January 11 following a complaint by the girl's family, they said.

According to the complaint, the girl had left home for school on the morning of January 6. Two youngsters intercepted her and abducted in a car and drove away.

The accused allegedly drove around for several hours, threatening and raping the girl turn by turn inside the moving vehicle, they said in the complaint. Later, when the car entered a neighbouring village, locals grew suspicious and stopped the vehicle.

After forcing the girl out of the car, the accused fled from the spot. Villagers informed the girl's family, who reached the spot and took her home, police said.

A case has been registered at Napasar police station under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Circle Officer Gangashahar Himanshu Sharma told PTI.

He said that the girl is aged above 18 years while the age of the accused is not clear.

"No arrests have been made so far," he said, adding that the matter was under investigation.

ED RAID ON I-PAC

**Kolkata, Jan 12:** Senior TMC leader Abhishek Banerjee Monday escalated the party's confrontation with the Centre over the ED raid on I-PAC, alleging that the central agency's objective was not investigation but "stealing political information" to settle scores on behalf of the BJP ahead of the 2026 Assembly polls.

Addressing a conclave of the party's digital volunteers, "Ami Banglar Digital Joddha", Banerjee questioned both the intent and the selectivity of the ED action, claiming that the raid was designed to create a political narrative against the ruling party rather than pursue a legitimate probe.

Banerjee alleged that the January 8 searches at premises linked to I-PAC, which provides political consultancy to the TMC and manages its IT operations, were aimed at accessing the party's internal strategy.

"The ED says it came to investigate the coal scam. That case is more than three years old and they have not summoned anyone all this time. They can come, but their purpose was information theft," Banerjee alleged, marking the first time he directly accused the agency of attempting to appropriate Trinamool's internal data.

The ED conducted searches at the Salt Lake office of I-PAC and



at the south Kolkata residence of its director Pratik Jain as part of a money laundering probe linked to the alleged coal scam. Searches were also carried out at a few locations in Delhi.

Banerjee questioned why the agency chose to target only the Kolkata-based director when I-PAC has three directors operating from Kolkata, Hyderabad and Delhi.

"If the investigation is genuine, why were offices and residences in other states not searched? And if a director's house is being searched, why go to the Bengal office at all?" he asked.

"And, if the case is against one director, why target the office? This is meant to create an impression that the organisation itself is guilty," alleged Banerjee, considered number two in the TMC hierarchy.

The TMC leader linked the ED action to I-PAC's role in

assisting the party during the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, reiterating a charge he had first made at a rally in Nadia's Taherpur Friday. I-PAC, he said, had helped the party develop digital tools such as the 'Didir Doot' app to assist voters during the revision process.

"Because they helped people and worked for the TMC during SIR, the ED was sent to raid them. On one hand, the Election Commission is being used to snatch people's rights, and on the other, ED is being used to throttle democracy," Banerjee alleged.

The ED has accused Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee of obstructing its officers and removing incriminating documents during the raid at Jain's residence, a charge strongly denied by the TMC. The agency has moved the Calcutta High

PIO astronomer wins UK's RAS Gold Medal

**London:** US-based astronomer Professor Shrinivas Kulkarni has been awarded the prestigious Gold Medal by the Royal Astronomical Society (RAS) in London for his "field-defining" discoveries in time-domain astronomy. Maharashtra-born Kulkarni is the George Ellery Hale Professor of Astronomy and Planetary Science at the California Institute of Technology (Caltech), where he has discovered a wide range of astronomical objects, including brown dwarfs and remote bursts of gamma rays. His RAS Gold Medal citation from last week recognises his "sustained, innovative and ground-breaking contributions to multi-wavelength transient astrophysics". In receiving the highest honour from the historic organisation, awarded annually since 1824, he joins great scientific minds such as Stephen Hawking, Jocelyn Bell Burnell, Albert Einstein and Edwin Hubble.

UK in talks with NATO to counter Russia, China

**London:** Britain is discussing with NATO allies how it can help beef up security in the Arctic to counter threats from Russia and China, a government minister said Sunday. Transport Secretary Heidi Alexander said the talks are "business as usual" rather than a response to recent threats by US President Donald Trump to take over Greenland. Trump said Friday that he would like to make a deal to acquire Greenland, a semiautonomous region of NATO ally Denmark, to prevent Russia or China from taking it over. "We are going to do something on Greenland whether they like it or not," Trump said Friday. Greenland, with a population of around 57,000, is defended by Denmark, whose military is dwarfed by that of the US, which has a military base on the island. Denmark's prime minister has warned that a takeover would threaten NATO.

6 policemen killed in IED blast in Pakistan

At least six policemen including a senior officer were killed and three others injured Monday in a blast targeting a police vehicle in northwest Pakistan, officials said. The vehicle was on patrol duty in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province's Tank district when unidentified miscreants targeted it with an improvised explosive device (IED). Those killed in the blast include a Station House Officer, a Sub-Inspector, three Elite Force personnel, and a driver, police said. The three injured officers were immediately shifted to a nearby hospital, where some of them are reported to be critical.

Myanmar made Rohingya lives a nightmare: Gambia

**The Hague, Jan 12:** Gambia Monday told judges at the United Nations' top court that Myanmar targeted minority Muslim Rohingya for destruction and made their lives a nightmare in a landmark case accusing Myanmar of genocide.

It is the first genocide case the International Court of Justice is hearing in full in more than a decade. The outcome will have repercussions beyond Myanmar, likely affecting South Africa's genocide case at the ICJ against Israel over the war in Gaza. Myanmar has denied genocide. Gambia's Minister of Justice Dawda Jallow told ICJ judges the Rohingya were simple people with dreams of living in peace and dignity.

"They have been targeted for destruction," he said.

"Myanmar has denied them their dream, in fact it turned their lives into a nightmare subjecting them to the most horrific violence and destruction one could imagine," according to Jallow.

The predominantly Muslim West African country of Gambia filed the case at the ICJ - also known as the World Court - in 2019, accusing Myanmar of committing genocide against the Rohingya, a mainly

Muslim minority in the remote western Rakhine state.

Myanmar's armed forces launched an offensive in 2017 that forced at least 730,000 Rohingya from their homes and into neighbouring Bangladesh, where they recounted killings, mass rape and arson.

A UN fact-finding mission concluded the 2017 military offensive had included "genocidal acts". Speaking in The Hague before the hearings, Rohingya victims said they want the long-awaited court case to deliver justice.

"We are hoping for a positive result that will tell the world that Myanmar committed genocide, and we are the victims of that and we deserve justice," Yousuf Ali, a 52-year-old Rohingya refugee who says he was tortured by the Myanmar military, told Reuters.

Cuba's Prez says no current talks with US

**Havana, Jan 12:** Cuban President Miguel Diaz-Canel said Monday there are no talks with the US government, in an apparent response to comments by President Donald Trump suggesting the two long-time foes were in conversations.

Trump told reporters Sunday that the US was "talking to Cuba." He did not specify what had been discussed but said "You'll find out pretty soon."

Diaz-Canel denied any ongoing conversations except for technical contacts on the issue of migration.

"As history demonstrates, in order for the relations between the United States and Cuba to advance, they must be based in international law instead of hostility, threats and economic coercion," Diaz-Canel said on X.

Tensions are rapidly escalating between the two neighboring nations, just 90 miles apart across the Straits of Florida.

Trump said Sunday that no more Venezuelan oil or money would go to Cuba following the capture of Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro and suggested the Communist-run island should strike a deal with Washington.

The comments prompted Diaz-Canel Sunday to respond that Cuba would defend its homeland "to the last drop of blood."

Communication open with US: Tehran

**Dubai, Jan 12:** Iran said Monday it is keeping communications open with the US as President Donald Trump weighed responses to a deadly crackdown on nationwide protests, which pose one of the stiffest challenges to clerical rule since the 1979 Islamic Revolution.

Trump said Sunday the US may meet Iranian officials and he was in contact with Iran's opposition, while piling pressure on its leaders, including threatening possible military action over lethal violence against protesters.

US-based rights group HRANA said it had verified the deaths of 544 people - 496 protesters and 48 security personnel, with 10,681 people arrested since the protests began December 28 and spread around the country.

Iran's leaders are facing fierce demonstrations that evolved from complaints about dire economic hardships to defiant calls for the fall of the deeply entrenched clerical establishment, and with the country's regional clout much reduced.

But despite the massive scale of the protests, there are no signs of splits in the Shi'ite clerical leadership, military or security forces, and demonstrators have no clear central leadership. The opposition is fragmented.



'COMMUNICATION CHANNEL' WITH US OPEN, ARAQCHI SAYS

"The communication channel between our Foreign Minister Abbas Araqchi and the US special envoy (Steve Witkoff) is open and messages are exchanged whenever necessary," Foreign Ministry spokesperson Esmaeil Baghaei said Monday. Contacts also remain open through traditional intermediary Switzerland, he said.

"They (the US) touched upon some cases, ideas were brought up and in general the Islamic Republic is a country that never left the negotiating table", Baghaei said. But he added that "contradictory messages" from the US showed a lack of seriousness and were not convincing.

Araqchi reiterated in a briefing to foreign ambassadors in Tehran that the Islamic Republic

**Beijing, Jan 12:** China Monday reaffirmed its territorial claims over the Shaksgam Valley in the backdrop of India's objections, stressing that the Chinese infrastructure projects in the area are "beyond reproach".

India last Friday criticised China's infrastructure development projects in the Shaksgam Valley, saying it reserves the right to take necessary measures to safeguard its interests as it is an Indian territory.

Pakistan illegally ceded 5,180 sq km of Indian territory in the Shaksgam Valley to China in 1963 from areas illegally occupied by it.

"Shaksgam Valley is Indian territory. We have never recognised the so-called China-Pakistan 'boundary agreement' signed

in 1963. We have consistently maintained that the agreement is illegal and invalid," External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said.

"We also do not recognise the so-called China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, which passes through Indian territory that is under forcible and illegal occupation of Pakistan," he said.

Jaiswal said that the entire Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh are an integral and inalienable part of India. "This has been clearly conveyed to Pakistani and Chinese authorities several times," he added. Reacting to Jaiswal's comments, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning told a media briefing here that "the territory you mentioned belongs to China".

"It's fully justified for China to conduct infrastructure construction on its own territory. China and Pakistan in the 1960s signed a boundary agreement and de-

limited the boundary between the two countries, which is the right of China and Pakistan as sovereign countries," she said.

On India's criticism of the CPEC, Mao repeated Beijing's narrative that it is an economic cooperation initiative, aimed at promoting local socioeconomic development and improving people's livelihood.

"The China-Pakistan boundary agreement and CPEC do not affect China's position on the Kashmir issue and the position remains unchanged," she said.

China's official stand on the Kashmir issue, as often reiterated by Beijing, is that "Jammu and Kashmir dispute is left over from history, and should be properly and peacefully resolved in accordance with the UN Charter, relevant UN Security Council resolutions and bilateral agreements".

The 1963 agreement ceding the territory of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (POK) was crucial for Pakistan and China as it provided a common boundary for them, which otherwise would have had no borders.

The agreement also has a clause that stipulates that after the settlement of Kashmir dispute between Pakistan and India, the sovereign authority will reopen negotiations with the government of China to sign a formal boundary treaty.

UK investigates Musk's X over Grok deepfake concerns

**London, Jan 12:** Britain's media regulator launched an investigation into Elon Musk's X Monday to determine whether sexually intimate deepfakes produced by its Grok AI chatbot violated its duty to protect people in the UK from content that could be illegal.

"There have been deeply concerning reports of the Grok AI chatbot account on X being used to create and share undressed images of people – which may amount to intimate image abuse or pornography – and sexualised images of children that may amount to child sexual abuse material," Ofcom said in a statement.

When asked for comment Monday on the launch of the formal investigation, X pointed to a previous statement in which it said it takes action against illegal content on the

platform, including child sexual abuse material, by removing it, permanently suspending accounts, and working with local governments and law enforcement as necessary.

"Anyone using or prompting Grok to make illegal content will suffer the same consequences as if they upload illegal content," it said.

STARMER: GROK IMAGES ARE 'DISGUSTING'

The regulator is under pressure to act after Prime Minister Keir Starmer said Thursday the images produced by Grok were "disgusting" and "unlawful".

Musk's X had to "get a grip" on Grok, Starmer said.

Asked Monday whether X could be banned, Business Secretary Peter Kyle said, "Yes, of course," but he noted that the power to do so lay with Ofcom.

Fellow minister Liz Kendall welcomed Ofcom's formal investigation, adding that it must



be completed swiftly.

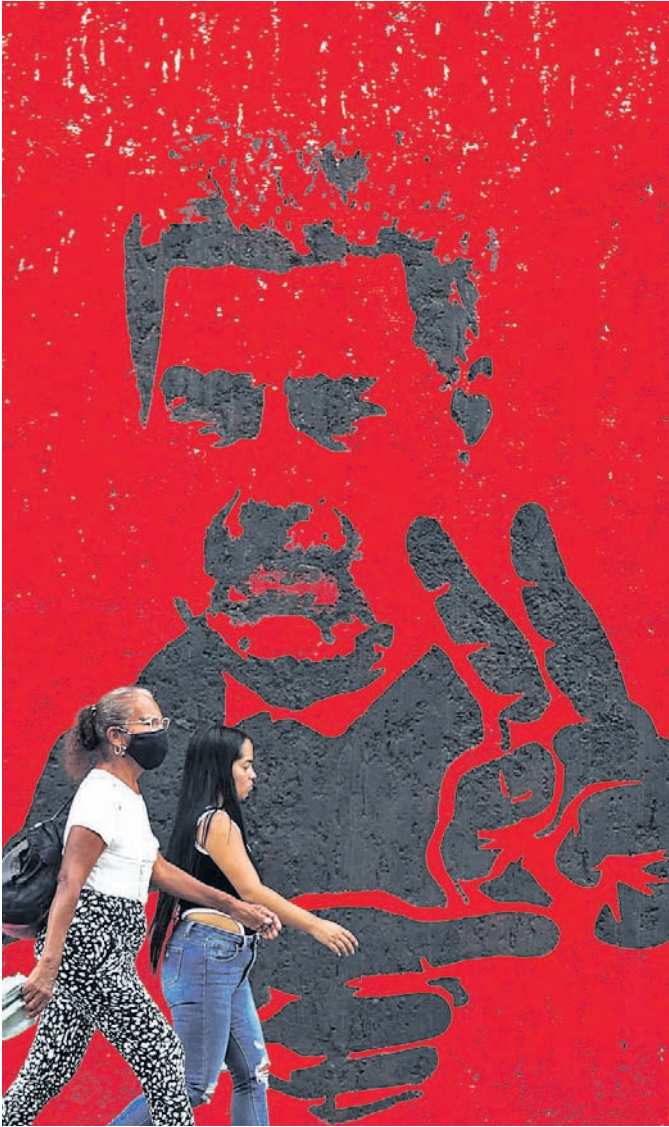

Regulators in the two Southeast Asian nations said existing controls were not preventing the creation and spread of fake pornographic content, particularly involving women and minors. Indonesia's government temporarily blocked access to Grok Saturday, followed by Malaysia Sunday.

The ministry said the measure was intended to protect women, children and the broader community from fake pornographic content generated using AI.

"It has come to the notice of BSE Ltd that a fraudulent deepfake video is being circulated on social media and messaging platforms, falsely featuring Sundararaman Ramamurthy, Managing Director & CEO, BSE, and claiming to provide stock recommendations and investment advice," the exchange said in a statement.

TCS Q3 profit drops 14% to ₹10,657cr

**Mumbai:** The country's largest IT services company TCS Monday reported 13.91 per cent decline in December quarter net profit at Rs 10,657 crore. The Tata Group company had posted a net profit of Rs 12,380 crore in the October-December period of FY25 and Rs 12,075 crore in the preceding September quarter. Revenue from operations in the quarter under review increased 4.86 per cent to Rs 67,087 crore from Rs 63,973 crore.

HCLTech profit falls 11.2% to ₹4,076cr

Global chaos boosts gold, silver prices

**New Delhi, Jan 12:** Silver prices rallied sharply by Rs 15,000 to hit a lifetime high of Rs 2,65,000 per kg in the national capital Monday, and gold advanced to a fresh record of Rs 1,44,600 per 10 grams, mirroring strong gains in the global markets.

According to the All India Sarafa Association, silver soared by Rs 15,000, or 6 per cent, to touch a new peak of Rs 2,65,000 per kilogram (inclusive of all taxes) from the previous close of Rs 2,50,000 per kg. In addition, gold of 99.9 per cent purity appreciated by Rs 2,900, or 2.05 per cent, to hit a lifetime high of Rs 1,44,600 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes). It had ended at Rs 1,41,700 per 10 grams on Friday.

In the international market, spot gold surged past the \$4,600 per ounce level for the first time. The yellow metal gained \$90.72, or 2 per cent, to touch a record \$4,601.69 per ounce.

"Gold has responded positively, and jumped to the \$4,600 per ounce level, while silver has seen an even sharper surge to

\$84 per ounce, highlighting its higher beta in risk-sensitive environments," Gaurav Garg, Research Analyst at Lemonn Markets Desk, said.

Spot silver in the international trade rose by \$4.3, or nearly 6 per cent, to touch a record of \$84.61 per ounce.

Silver has surged to fresh record highs, breaching the \$84 per ounce, driven by a mix of rising geopolitical tensions and growing expectations that the US Federal Reserve will be forced to cut interest rates further, Renisha Chainani, Head - Research at Augmont, said.

Adding to the uncertainty, investor sentiment was rattled by an intensifying feud between Trump and Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell after the US Attorney's Office reportedly opened a criminal investigation into Powell, reviving broader worries about the Federal Reserve's independence.

The probe weighed on the US dollar, lending further support to bullion prices, Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst - Commodities at HDFC Securities, said.

₹ pares early losses, ends at 90.17 vs \$

**Mumbai, Jan 12:** The rupee recovered from low levels and settled 1 paisa higher at 90.16 against the US dollar Monday on weak American currency and sliding crude oil prices.

**New Delhi, Jan 12:** Retail inflation rose to a three-month high of 1.33 per cent in December, mainly due to higher prices of food items, but remained below the Reserve Bank of India's lower tolerance level.

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) based headline inflation was 0.71 per cent in November and 5.22 per cent in December 2024. The inflation stood at 1.44 per cent in September.

The food inflation in December was (-) 2.71 per cent, and remained negative for the seventh consecutive month.

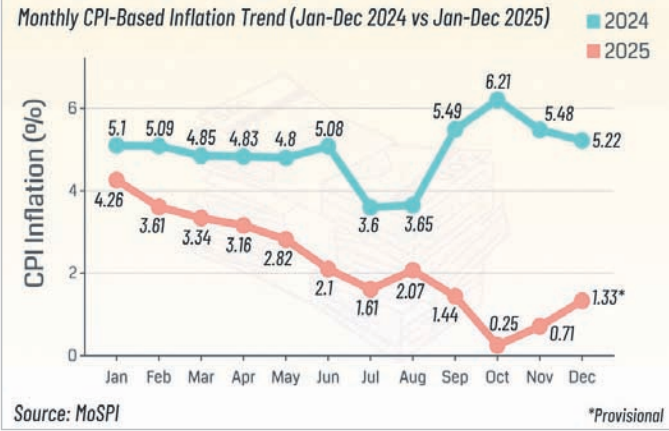
"The increase in headline inflation and food inflation during the month of December 2025 is mainly attributed to an increase in inflation of personal care and effects, vegetables, meat and fish, egg, spices and pulses and products," the National Statistics Office (NSO) said while releasing the CPI data.

The headline inflation in urban areas was higher at 2.03 per cent compared to 0.76 per cent in rural India.

The retail inflation remained below the Reserve Bank of India's lower tolerance limit for the fourth consecutive month in December. The government has mandated the central bank to ensure inflation remains at 4 per cent, with a margin of 2 per cent on either side.

According to the NSO data, the top five major states with high inflation during December were Kerala (9.49 per cent), Karnataka (2.99 per cent), Andhra Pradesh (2.71 per cent), Tamil Nadu (2.67 per cent), and Jammu and Kashmir (2.26 per cent).

On the other hand, retail inflation was negative in Assam, Bihar, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, and Uttar Pradesh.

Inequality top economic concern for youth globally

**New Delhi, Jan 12:** Growing inequality between the rich and poor is the top-most economic concern for the youth across the world, while a large number of them want to run for political office rather than just critique, a new survey showed Monday.

The World Economic Forum's Youth Pulse 2026: Insights from the Next Generation for a Changing World 2026 report sought to know how the next generation is interpreting, and responding to, rapid economic, political, technological and environmental change.

The survey, drawing insights from nearly 4,600 young people aged 18-30 in 144 countries and territories, found that 48.2 per cent identify 'growing inequality between the rich and poor' as

the top economic trend shaping the future.

Yet in regions such as Sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia, entrepreneurship emerged as the most powerful economic force -- reflecting growing confidence in innovation and self-determination as key drivers of opportunity.

More than 57 per cent cited financial concerns among their biggest sources of stress or anxiety. The study also found that youth priorities are practical and policy-ready. The most-cited empowering measures were creating employment opportunities for youth (57.2 per cent), equal access to affordable, quality education (46.1 per cent), and affordable housing and financial independence (32.2 per cent).

Showing that trust is earned close to home, young people rat-



ed community leaders as most effective in driving positive change (60 per cent), reinforcing demand for leadership that is proximate, accountable and delivers tangible results.

Despite concern over geopolitical tensions and democratic erosion, nearly half of respondents highlighted positive po-

litical shifts -- from innovative governance models and greater civic participation to stronger international cooperation and the inclusion of under-represented groups in policy-making.

It also found that it was a generation ready to govern, not just critique, as 36 per cent said they are likely to run for

political office, challenging assumptions of political apathy.

Climate remained the defining global concern, even under economic strain, in the survey.

More than 56 per cent identified climate change and environmental degradation as the greatest threat to the world; personally, 51 per cent cited inflation and instability as their greatest worry, while 41 per cent identified climate change as the second most significant threat to their lives.

The report also documented more than 800 youth-led solutions advanced over the past year directly reaching over 2.2 million people worldwide.

A vast majority of 95 per cent said that intentionally designed youth communities provide a critical space for learning, growth, and dialogue.

On technology, two-thirds of respondents believed AI would reduce entry-level job opportunities, underscoring awareness of disruption and the need for adaptive skills and forward-looking policies and systems.

Nearly 60 per cent of young people reported using AI regularly to enhance their skills, with another third experimenting occasionally. Only a small minority was not yet engaged with AI tools.

Regular AI use among young people was found to be high across regions, challenging assumptions that digital innovation is concentrated in a few markets.

The results of the survey are likely to be discussed widely during the WEF Annual Meeting next week in Davos, Switzerland, from January 19-23.



# ICC unlikely to shift Bangladesh T20 matches

**New Delhi, Jan 12:** The International Cricket Council (ICC) Monday indicated that it is unlikely to accept Bangladesh's demand for a change of venue for its T20 World Cup matches in India after an assessment report of the country's security concerns placed the threat perception at "low".

As per ICC sources, the world

body's risk assessment report does not flag any specific or direct threat to the Bangladesh team if it participates in the tournament starting February 7.

It also contradicts claims made by Bangladesh sports ministry advisor Asif Nazrul that Mustafizur Rahman's inclusion in the team would contribute to the overall threat. Bangladesh are due to play four league stage matches in India.

"It is important to clarify that the ICC's independent risk assessments, carried out by internationally recognised security experts, do not conclude that Bangladesh cannot play its scheduled matches in India," an ICC source told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

"The overall security risk

for the tournament in India has been assessed as low to moderate, which is consistent with the profile of many major global sporting events," the source said.

According to the source, the assessment did not identify any direct threat even to the Bangladesh officials at any venue in India.

"Based on the professional advice received, the risk associated with Bangladesh's scheduled fixtures in Kolkata and Mumbai is assessed as low to moderate, with no indication of risks that cannot be effectively managed through established security planning and mitigation measures," the source added.

ments by Nazrul in Dhaka in which he suggested that the

ICC report had flagged a threat to Mustafizur, whose omission from the IPL on BCCI's directions owing to unspecified "developments all around" prompted the pullout threat from the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB).

The BCB later issued a clarification, effectively backpedaling on the assertions made by Nazrul Monday.

"The correspondence cited today by the Advisor for the Ministry of Youth & Sports was in reference to an internal communication between the BCB and the ICC's Security Department related to threat assessments for the Bangladesh team ahead of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup.

"This does not constitute a

formal response from the ICC to the BCB's request for the relocation of Bangladesh's matches outside India," the BCB said in a statement.

The BCB, however, reiterated that it has requested relocation of Bangladesh's matches outside India "in the interest of the team's security" and that it is still awaiting an official response from the ICC on this matter.

However, the ICC source maintained that the existing schedule is unlikely to be tinkered with.

Following Mustafizur's removal from the Kolkata Knight Riders franchise, an irate Bangladesh government had banned the broadcast of the IPL in the country.

## All ISL clubs confirm to play

**New Delhi, Jan 12:** All the 14 Indian Super League (ISL) clubs have written to the All India Football Federation (AIFF), formally confirming participation in the delayed 2025-26 season, clearing the decks for the start of the top-tier domestic competition February 14.

Sports Minister Mansukh Mandaviya had announced January 6 that the ISL, which was on hold due to the absence of a commercial partner, would start February 14, with all the 14 clubs taking part in it.

Despite the minister's announcement, a few clubs were yet to confirm participation in writing as they had agreed to take part in the ISL "in principle" only.

But now, all the clubs have formally confirmed participation in the truncated league, a source in the AIFF told PTI Monday.

Many of the clubs have also shared details of the venues where they plan to play their home matches.

The top-tier ISL will feature 91 matches on a home-and-away basis.

AIFF President Kalyan Chaubey had earlier said that a Governing Council Board would be formed to manage the league and it would be "empowered to take all commercial decisions."

It is learnt that the AIFF and the clubs are expected to have an online meeting on Tuesday and jointly discuss the formation of the Governing Council Board.

The AIFF has asked the clubs to send the details of the venues where they plan to play their home matches by Monday noon to start working on the fixture and finalise broadcast and commercial rights partners.

Regarding the financial part of the league, the AIFF said, "The 2025-26 season of the ISL is proposed to be held on a total budget of INR 24 Crores Twenty Six Lakhs Seventy Four Thousand (INR 24,26,74,000/-) with an initial contribution of INR Nine Crores Seventy Seven Lakh Forty Thousand (INR 9,77,40,000/-) from the AIFF and a contribution of INR One Crore (INR 1,00,00,000/-) each from the participating clubs."

The AIFF had earlier said that it's willing to accept the participation fee of Rs 1 crore per club in instalments up to June 2026, if the clubs are not able to pay immediately.

## High hopes, tricky draws await home shuttlers

# India Open 2026 kicks off

**New Delhi, Jan 12:** India's top shuttlers, including P V Sindhu and Lakshay Sen, will look to convert recent form into results on home courts when the USD 950,000 India Open Super 750 begins here Tuesday.

Indian players, however, have struggled to fully capitalise on home advantage, with only a handful of them lifting the title in the last 15 years.

The draw will once again throw up early challenges for the home contingent, including a marquee all-Indian men's singles opener between Sen and Ayush Shetty, while Sindhu begins against Vietnam's Nguyen Thuy Linh.

Sindhu, a 2017 champion, comes into the Delhi leg on the back of a confidence-boosting run at the Malaysia Open Super 1000, where she reached the semifinals before losing to China's Wang Zhiyi.

The tournament, to be held at the Indira Gandhi Indoor Stadium, marked a timely lift for the two-time Olympic medallist after an injury-interrupted phase.

"It's always nice to be playing the Indian Open in Delhi every time at the start of the year. I'm really happy to be playing at the home ground, we will put our best effort and give our 100% and hope we get some



good results here," Sindhu said.

Sen, a 2022 India Open champion, has also had a volatile start to the season. He ended 2025 by winning the Australian Open Super 500 and then suffered a setback at the Malaysia Open.

Ayush, on the other hand, announced himself last year by winning the US Open Super 300 and has beaten the likes of Kodai Naraoka, Loh Kean Yew, Chou Tien Chen and Brian Yang.

India's best podium hopes again hinge significantly on the men's doubles pairing of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty. They have reached two finals in the last four editions, winning the crown in 2022.

The Indian duo finished runners-up at Hong Kong Open and China Masters, won a second world championships bronze, and also reached the knockout stage of World Tour Finals last year. However,

### PWL fixtures out

**New Delhi:** Punjab Royals take on UP Dominators in the season opener of Pro Wrestling League (PWL) January 15, setting the tone for a competitive league phase as the PWL officially announced the schedule for its much-anticipated fifth season, with the league set to run from January 15 to February 1 at the Noida Indoor Stadium. A total of 15 league-stage matches will be played across 13 matchdays, with teams battling in a round-robin format before the top four advance to the semi-finals, scheduled for January 30 and 31, culminating in the PWL 2026 Final February 1.

### Man United crash out

**Manchester, Jan 12:** Managerless Manchester United crashed out of the FA Cup with a 2-1 defeat to Brighton.

At the end of a week that saw the storied Premier League team and 13-time FA Cup winner fire head coach Ruben Amorim, the loss at Old Trafford has likely consigned United to another trophyless season and was greeted with loud jeers from the home crowd.

Interim coach Darren Fletcher admitted the 20-time English champion was "not in a good moment," but said it was too soon to write the season off with Champions League qualification still achievable.

Former United striker Danny Welbeck scored what proved to be the decisive goal in the



64th minute, and Benjamin Sesko's late header was only a consolation for the hosts in the third-round match. United has exited both domestic knockout competitions at the earliest possible stage this season, following the humbling loss to fourth-tier Grimsby in the English League Cup. The latest defeat means United will play the bare minimum of 40 competitive games for a top division team this season.

A trophyless campaign would be back-to-back seasons in which United has ended up empty-handed.

**Jeddah, Jan 12:** Raphinha scored twice as Barcelona won the Spanish Super Cup after an intense 3-2 victory over Real Madrid in Sunday's final in Jeddah.

The match at King Abdullah Sports City Stadium turned into a thriller, with four goals packed into a breathless phase

at the end of the first half.

After an even opening spell, Barcelona gradually asserted control before the interval, and were rewarded in the 36th minute when Raphinha burst into the box and drilled a low shot into the far corner to give his side the lead.

Real struck back in the second minute of first-half stoppage time when Vinicius Jr collected the ball near the halfway line, surged down the flank, skipped past two Barcelona defenders and finished in to the far corner in a stunning solo effort.

The first-half drama was far from over and two minutes later Robert Lewandowski was given space in the penalty ar-



ea and finished with a delicate chip to restore Barcelona's lead, only for the chaos to continue moments before the interval.

From a Real corner, Ra-

phinha made a goal-line clearance, but Gonzalo Garcia pounced on the rebound, with the ball striking both the bar and the post before crossing

the line, bringing the sides level once more as the teams went into the break.
