Iran blames US, Israel for unrest

Tehran, Jan 12: Iran's foreign minister has accused the United States of deliberately inflaming unrest after days of nationwide protests and a sweeping internet shutdown left the country largely cut off from the outside world.

Speaking Monday, Abbas Araghchi said the situation remained "under total control" but blamed Washington for encouraging violence by threatening action against Tehran. He said US President Donald Trump's public warnings had pushed armed groups to target both protesters and security forces in a bid to trigger foreign intervention.

Araghchi said Iranian authorities possessed footage showing weapons being distributed on the streets and would soon release confessions from detainees. He added that officials were "closely following" developments and insisted the demonstrations were "stoked and fuelled" by foreign elements. Those responsible, he warned, would be pursued.

More than 500 protests have taken place across all of Iran's 31 provinces, the US-based Human Rights Activists News Agency reported early Monday. The death toll had reached at least 544, it said, with more than 10,600 arrests.

Budget Feb 1, Sunday

New Delhi: In a first, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will present the Union Budget in Parliament Sunday, February 1, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla announced Monday. This will be Sitharaman's ninth budget presentation, one short of the record 10 budgets presented by the former finance minister Morarji Desai. The Budget session of Parliament begins on January 28. Sitharaman is likely to present the Economic Survey in both the Houses of Parliament after the president's address.

US envoy praises Trump-Modi, nothing more

gage. In fact, the next call on trade will occur tomorrow," shared Sergio Gor.

The 38 year old, in his arrival speech, went on to add that no country is as essential as India to the United States.

He announced an invitation to New Delhi for a US-led strategic alliance, known as 'Pax Silica' on critical minerals and artificial intelligence.

The comments made just hours after he began work are seen as a welcome outreach by the Trump administration which has mounted pressure on India in recent months over

tariffs and H1B visas.

"You and I have an incredible once in a lifetime opportunity to redefine diplomacy. What it can accomplish could be the most consequential global partnership of this century," Gor said addressing the US embassy employees.

"No partner is more essential than India. In the months and years ahead, it is my goal as ambassador to pursue a very ambitious agenda. We will do this as true strategic partners, each bringing strength, respect and leadership to the table," he said.

He also emphasised that the

friendship between Trump and PM Narendra Modi is "real" and will help in resolving "differences", which have resulted in the worst phase in the relations in the last two decades.

The downturn began after Trump slapped a 50 per cent tariff on India, including a 25 per cent additional duties for India's purchase of Russian crude oil. Apart from the tariff issue, the relations witnessed a severe strain on a number of other issues that included Trump's claim of ending the India-Pakistan conflict in May last year and Washington's new immigration policy.

"The United States and India are bound not just by shared interests, but by a relationship anchored at the highest levels. Real friends can disagree, but always resolve their differences in the end," he said.

While talking about trade, the US envoy also recalled Secretary of State Marco Rubio's remarks that it will be a "year of reciprocity".

Minor loses eye as snack toy explodes

Titilagarh, Jan 12: An eight-year-old boy lost an eye after a toy found inside a snack packet allegedly exploded in Bolangir district, police said Monday.

The incident occurred at Sagadghat village under Titilagarh police station limits. According to sources, a locally packaged snack similar to "Kurkure" is being manufactured in Bargarh and Sambalpur districts and sold in plastic packets priced at Rs 5. To attract children, small toys are put inside the packets.

Ankesh Harpal, son of Lab Harpal of Sagadghat village, bought one such packet from a local shop Sunday evening. After consuming the snack

at home, the child reportedly threw the toy into a fire, following which it suddenly exploded.

The explosion caused severe injury to the child's eye. He was rushed to Titilagarh hospital, where doctors later confirmed that the eye was completely damaged.

Ankesh's parents lodged a complaint at Titilagarh police station Monday, demanding strict action against those responsible. They also called for an immediate ban on the company involved and sought compensation for their son's injury.

Police said an investigation has been initiated to ascertain the source of toy production and the circumstances leading to the explosion.

Man who built his own grave laid to rest

Hyderabad, Jan 12: An 80-year-old man in Telangana, who built his own grave while leading a healthy life, passed away January 11.

A resident of Laxmipuram village, Nakka Indrayya had gained national attention for constructing his own final resting place years in advance, as a peaceful gesture to ensure that his children would face no burden during their time of grief.

Indrayya, who built his grave beside his wife's, has placed a plaque at the site inscribed with a message on the eternal truths of life and death.

He made it a routine to visit the spot, clean the surroundings, water the plants and sit in quiet reflection.

The man's life was marked by a tireless spirit of giving.

Sharing Indrayya's contribu-

tions, his elder brother, Nakka Bhumayya told PTI videos: "He built his own grave... and also a church in the village. He did several good things for the village. He distributed his wealth during his lifetime to his four children. He built houses for them and organised nine weddings in the family..."

Srinivas, a villager, recalled Indrayya's guiding principle: "Whatever you hoard will slip away, but what you give to others will stay with you forever."

Following his passing on Sunday, Indrayya's final wish was fulfilled as he was laid to rest at the grave he had prepared with his own funds.

For many villagers gathered in large numbers for the last rites, Indrayya's journey served as a reminder that in a world driven by material pursuit, preparing for the end with clarity and calm can itself be a profound life lesson.

"I have built four-five houses, a school and a church and now my own grave. I am very happy. The very mention of building a grave causes sadness to many but I am happy," Indrayya had earlier told PTI Videos.

Born into a landless labourer family from a poor Dalit background, Indrayya lost his father at a tender age and began working as a child labourer under a local landlord. He later moved to Mumbai before finally settling in Dubai, where he spent the major part of his life and went on to become one of the wealthiest persons in his village.

Two SIR deaths in West Bengal

Kolkata, Jan 12: Two persons died in different parts of West Bengal Monday, with the families of both claiming that anxiety related to the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls was the reason for their deaths.

A middle-aged man collapsed and died in a market in Uttar Dinajpur's Kaliaganj in the northern part of the state, while an elderly woman breathed her last after suffering a stroke at Basirhat in North 24 Parganas district in the south. The man recently received a notice for the SIR hearing, and the woman attended the exercise last week.

In Kaliaganj, a 50-plus daily wage labourer, Lakshmkanta Ray, collapsed and died Monday afternoon at the crowded Dhankali market, police said.

Rani's definition of success

Mumbai: Bollywood veteran Rani Mukerji, who recently completed 30 years in Indian cinema, reflected on her journey by redefining what success truly means to her as an artist. Sharing a note through Yash Raj Films' official social media, the actress said her career, from *Raja Ki Aayegi Baaraat* to the upcoming *Mardaani 3*, has never been about chasing numbers, trophies or external validation.

Rani revealed that she measures success through moments rather than milestones. "I don't count box-office numbers or awards first. I count moments," she wrote, pointing to experiences such as standing under the rain for a shot, laughing between takes or being emotionally drained after a demanding scene. For her, these intimate, behind-the-scenes experiences define fulfilment far more than commercial outcomes.

She explained that cinema's ability to capture and preserve

emotion has shaped her relationship with the craft, keeping her grounded despite decades in the industry. This philosophy has guided her choice of roles, many of which centre on emotionally complex and socially driven characters, including *Black and Mrs Chatterjee vs Norway*.

Even her National Award win, she noted, felt like a quiet validation rather than a destination. As she steps into her fourth decade with *Mardaani 3*, Rani reaffirmed that as long as there are stories to tell, she will continue learning, growing and measuring success through the depth of her experiences rather than accolades. 

Anushka reflects on motherhood



CM's 6E road safety mantra

Bhubaneswar, Jan 12: Expressing concern over the rising road mishaps, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday emphasised adoption of a '6E' policy for road safety.

Addressing an event at Lok Seva Bhawan as part of the National Road Safety Month celebrations, Majhi expressed deep concern over the increasing number of road accidents in the state as well as in the country and called upon everyone to obey road safety rules.

He said the state government has given importance to the implementation of '4E' policy (Education, Enforcement, Engineering and Emergency) – for road safety. Along with the implementation of these 4Es, the CM personally suggested implementation of two more Es (Environment and Evaluation), saying they would go a long way to save precious lives.

The CM suggested strict implementation of vehicle pollution rules and proper assessment of the results of the existing road safety norms. He said that various road safety programmes can be changed or improved based on this assessment.

Stressing the importance of road safety, the CM announced road safety as a part of good governance. He expressed the hope that with this, government officials will be more vigilant about it. Based on this, the CM an-

Stone laid for new elevated corridor

Keeping in mind the transformation of Bhubaneswar, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday laid the foundation stone for a new elevated corridor from Jayadev Vihar to Nandankanan at an estimated cost of ₹950 crore. In this, flyovers will be constructed at Jayadev Vihar Square, Kalinga Hospital Square, Damna Square and KIIT Square. It is expected to improve the traffic system on a busy road in the state capital and the public will be able to travel comfortably in less time, the CM said.

On the occasion, the CM inaugurated a warning bell to alert motorists on Kalinga Ghati road in Kandhamal district. Under this system, the siren will sound to warn the vehicles coming from both sides of the pass. This has been started as a pilot project. Seeing its success, it will be installed at other passes.

Similarly, on this occasion, a memorandum of understanding

was signed with IIT-Kharagpur for better traffic management in Cuttack and Bhubaneswar. Based on this report from IIT, steps will be taken to improve the traffic system in the two cities.

The CM dedicated 15 EV charging stations in Bhubaneswar. It is worth noting that 85 more charging stations are under construction in the state, which will be dedicated to the public soon.

Majhi dedicated 14 new Atal Bus Stands built in 10 districts at a cost of ₹156.53 crore. Earlier, 55 such bus terminals have been dedicated to the public. The CM said that Atal Bus Stands will be established in all the districts, sub-districts, Panchayat Samiti and municipalities of the state in the coming days.

The Odisha State Road Transport Corporation (OSRTC) launched 100 new BS-VI standard modern buses worth ₹46 crore. On the occasion, Majhi launched the 'Closed Loop Smart Transit Card' or smart card system for the buses run by the OSRTC. Using this card, passengers can travel with convenience by purchasing cashless tickets.

On this occasion, 25 new e-buses were also launched from a state-of-the-art bus depot built by CRUT in Berhampur.

The CM handed over vehicle keys to five women drivers.

"Road accidents have become a major concern not only in our state or country but also in the entire human civilization. Therefore, we can prevent road accidents by changing the mindset from education to safety and from technology to innovation," said Commerce and Transport (C&T) Minister Bibhuti Bhusan Jena.

"Road widening is being done under the leadership of the CM through the New Road Policy. All the roads will be free from potholes and traffic will be cleared soon," said Works Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan.

On 150th anniversary, 'Vande Mataram' echoes across state

Bhubaneswar, Jan 12: Students, teachers and staffers of over 16,000 educational institutions across the state took part in a mass rendition of 'Vande Mataram' Monday, marking the 150th anniversary of the iconic national song by Bankim Chandra Chatterjee.

The event was jointly organised by Odia Language, Literature and Culture, Sports and Youth Services, School and Mass Education and Higher Education departments. Institutes under Skill Development and Technical Education (SD&TE) department also took part in the programme.

Earlier, the Assembly had unanimously adopted a resolution directing the state government to celebrate 150 years of 'Vande Mataram' across the state. While the Commerce and Transport Minister BB Jena claimed that more than 50 lakh people took part in the mass rendition, an official statement from Odia language, Literature



and Culture department put the number at over 21 lakh.

108 Ambulance service grapples with dense fog

Reduced visibility, slippery roads and severe cold have made driving hazardous, raising safety concerns and affecting response times

lighting infrastructure is limited, further increasing the risk during emergency movements.

Sharing his experience, a 108 ambulance driver said, "Driving an ambulance during winter amid dense fog is one of the toughest challenges we face. Visibility can suddenly drop, and narrow roads with sharp turns require extreme caution. Even if it takes more time to reach the hospital, the safety of the patient and our team remains our priority."

The impact is not limited to road ambulances alone. Boat ambulance services operating in districts such as Kendrapara, Koraput, Malkangiri, and Kalahandi are also facing serious operational difficulties. During early morning and nighttime hours, dense fog blankets rivers and water bodies, drastically reducing visibility and making navigation hazardous. In addition, extremely cold weather and fluctuating water currents

are posing added challenges for boat ambulance crews.

Commenting on the situation, Sabyasachi Biswal, the state head of EMRI Green Health Services, which manages the 108 Ambulance Service, said, "Fog and cold weather create unavoidable challenges for emergency operations on both roads and waterways. However, our teams are well-trained to handle adverse conditions. All personnel have been instructed to strictly follow safety protocols, maintain controlled speeds, and prioritize the safety of patients and staff, ensuring uninterrupted service delivery."

He further added that the central call centre is closely monitoring the movement of all ambulances and maintaining constant coordination with field teams to provide immediate support wherever required.

Despite the harsh winter conditions, the 108 Ambulance Service continues to provide emergency medical assistance across the state. Citizens have been urged to cooperate with ambulance personnel, give way to emergency vehicles, and remain patient, as dense fog and cold-weather safety precautions may occasionally affect response times.

The dedication, patience, and sense of duty displayed by 108 ambulance drivers, EMTs, helpers, and boat ambulance staff continue to reinforce the service's role as a vital lifeline in Odisha's emergency healthcare system.

Police bust cybercrime syndicate, arrest seven

Rourkela, Jan 12: Police Monday said they busted an organised cybercrime syndicate and arrested seven members of the gang allegedly involved in large-scale money laundering and fraud using mule bank accounts.

Acting on intelligence inputs, an operation was launched, leading to the arrest of the seven accused, Rourkela SP Nitesh Wadhwan said. "We have seized 80 passbooks, 50 debit cards, 25 mobile phones, four laptops, 10 Aadhaar cards and 20 PAN cards from the accused," he said.

A case has been registered under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and the Information Technology Act. Further investigation is underway to identify other members of the syndicate and possible interstate and international links, the SP said.

According to police, the gang was engaged in procuring and operating bank accounts opened

in the names of unsuspecting individuals, primarily from Rourkela and nearby areas.

These accounts were allegedly used to facilitate cybercrime and laundering of fraudulent proceeds across India and abroad, police said. The accused reportedly arranged bank accounts, activated SIM cards and identity documents using forged papers and impersonation.

Investigators revealed that the mule accounts were sold or rented to cybercriminals across the country and used as pass-through accounts to receive proceeds of cyber fraud.

Police said the accounts were sold or rented for amounts ranging between ₹5,000 and ₹10,000 per account, with the proceeds distributed among syndicate members. These accounts were allegedly linked to around 200 cybercrime complaints registered across India, as identified through the Samavaya portal of the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C), Ministry of Home Affairs.

Woman killed in elephant attack

Angul: Human-elephant conflict continues unabated in the Angul forest division, claiming yet another life and triggering fresh concern among residents of forest-adjacent villages over the forest department's preparedness and response. The latest incident occurred early Monday morning at Dhipipada Sahi under Sankhapatra panchayat, where a 75-year-old woman, Ichha Dehuri, was killed in an elephant attack. According to sources, Dehuri had stepped out of her house at dawn to attend nature's call when she unexpectedly came face to face with an elephant, which attacked her. Hearing her cries, local residents rushed to the spot and rescued her in a critical condition. She was immediately shifted to the Angul District Headquarters Hospital, where doctors declared her dead during treatment. This incident is the third fatal elephant attack reported from the same forest division within the past two weeks, highlighting the growing intensity of the human-elephant conflict in the region. Earlier, an unidentified youth, reportedly suffering from mental illness, was also killed in an elephant attack near Gurang Kharia Sahi under the same forest range January 1. Similarly, Jhili Behera, 35, of Sunabuhi village, was killed in a similar elephant attack December 31.

Cousins killed as bike rams into utility pole

Gunupur: Two cousins were killed after their motorcycle rammed into an electric pole late Sunday night on the main road of Limaduwa village on the outskirts of this town in Rayagada district. The deceased were identified as Muna Kimba, 24, and Krishna Kimba, 21, residents of Nilaguda village in Gudari block. According to police, the cousins had come to Gunupur on some personal work. While returning home on a motorcycle late at night, they lost control of the vehicle and crashed into an utility pole along the main road near Limaduwa village. Both were thrown onto the road and sustained critical injuries. Police rushed to the spot and, with the help of local residents, rescued the two and took them to the sub-divisional hospital. Doctors there declared both of them dead.

Outsiders rampage at Ganjam school; 2 students critical

Gopalpur, Jan 12: Two students were seriously injured after a group of outsiders allegedly entered a high school in Ganjam district and carried out a violent attack during school hours Monday.

The incident occurred at Maa Narayani High School in Phulata village under the Rangeilunda block. According to sources, four youths who were not students of the school allegedly forced their way into the campus around 1.30pm, during the midday break, despite the main gate being locked.

The attackers reportedly assaulted Omm Mandal, a Class X student, with iron rods, stones and punches, leaving him unconscious. Another student, Ramakrushna Pradhan of Class VII, who was playing nearby, also sustained serious head injuries in the attack.

Teachers and staff rushed to intervene and managed to rescue the students. Some teachers sustained minor injuries while trying to stop the assailants. Both injured students were immediately shifted to MKCG Medical College and Hospital in Berhampur, where they are undergoing treatment.

DEO Ajay Kumar Patra and Rangeilunda BEO Debendra Behera visited the hospital in the evening and enquired about the students' condition. They also held discussions with hospital authorities and the parents.

Dr Mohapatra added that as per information received from the school principal, a student from Nityanandapur area in Jajpur district has been diagnosed with jaundice. The exact number of affected students is

They claimed school toilets are not cleaned regularly and questioned the quality of drinking water and the midday meal, saying both are unfit for consumption. The allegations are subject to verification by officials.

Following reports, Gondia BEO Manoranjan Dalai visited the school and launched an inquiry.

Malay Kumar Singh, former Gondia block chairman said his son, a Class VIII student at the school, has been undergoing treatment for jaundice for the past five to six days. He alleged that several students missed examinations due to the illness and accused the school author-

ities of concealing information about the number of cases. He also reiterated complaints about nonfunctional bathrooms and poor-quality midday meals.

Ashok Kumar Sahu informed the mediapersons that his son, who studies at the same school, has also been diagnosed with jaundice.

Despite these reports, the school principal, district administration and health department have officially acknowledged only one case, a claim that remains under scrutiny.

Former MLA Nabin Nanda has demanded a thorough probe into the outbreak, citing the school's deteriorating environment and sanitation. He said he has emailed details of the issue to the state Adarsha Vidyalaya Sangathan project director, the CDMO and the DEO, seeking immediate intervention.

Elderly woman raped, bludgeoned to death

Udala: An elderly woman was raped by her neighbour and later bludgeoned to death in a bid to erase evidence under Udal police limits in Mayurbhanj district Monday. Man awarded life term for murder

Berhampur, Jan 12: A local court here in Ganjam district Monday sentenced a man to life imprisonment in a murder case linked to an unpaid loan.

District and Sessions Judge Ashanta Kumar Das convicted Prashant Kumar Swain alias Dungei, 25, of Patapur, Balipenta Sahi under Patapur police station limits and awarded him the punishment. The court also imposed a fine of ₹10,000. In default, the convict will undergo an additional six months of rigorous imprisonment (RI).

According to the prosecution, the crime took place on the night of December 28, 2023, when Surya Kumar Sahu, 33, was murdered.

Sahu worked as a cook at a hotel in Digapahandi and was a friend of the accused. He had borrowed ₹10,000 from Swain for personal needs.

Frequent quarrels reportedly broke out between the two after Sahu failed to repay the amount on time.

Driven by vengeance, Swain invited Sahu and another friend, Shiba Nayak, to drink.

Swain asked Nayak to bring liquor and later sent him away.

Swain and Sahu continued drinking together. Sahu did not return home that night.

Sahu's body was found lying near a bus stand December 29 morning. Police reached the spot and seized the body.

Based on a complaint filed by the victim's brother, Nityananda Sahu, a murder case (832/23) was registered. During investigation, police arrested Swain, who later confessed to killing Sahu during interrogation.

On receiving information,

local police and Sub-Divisional Medical Officer (SDMO) Saroj Ranjan Swain reached the spot and attempted to persuade the protesters to withdraw the blockade.

However, when the agitators refused to disperse, police detained them and shifted them to the police station in a van.

According to sources, the old Sub-Divisional Hospital, located in the heart of Patnagarh town, had been providing treatment to patients for several years.

Political Rot

In politics, especially in India, an axiomatic truth is that there is no permanent enemy or permanent friend. Hence, it is only natural to expect strange bed-fellows when it comes to forming political alliances and more so when stakes are high where spoils of offices are to be shared by hook or by crook. In such situations so-called political ideologies are thrown to the wind and sworn enemies embrace one another as friends for benefit. India has experienced the phenomenon at such nauseating regularity that it has ceased to cause any surprise. But what happened recently in two municipal areas of Ambernath and Arkot in Maharashtra can be termed as political opportunism of the worst variety as sworn enemies – BJP, Congress and AIMIM – buried the hatchet, threw away all scruples and joined hands to form the two municipalities and share power.

It was the height of opportunism when BJP units tied up with the Congress at Ambernath in Thane and the AIMIM at Akot in Akola to gain majority control in the two local bodies following the municipal elections last month. One may view the development as a small aberration in some far-away local bodies and may even discard the event as too insignificant, but the die has been cast. The claim of an “ideological battle” as Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi has been saying or “Congress Mukt Bharat” as Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been personally repeating for over a decade now, not only ring hollow but represent a naked alliance of opportunism that is obviously accepted and blessed by both these top leaders.

It would be hypocrisy on the part of leaders of any of the three parties to claim they are unaware about the greed and lack of principles of their party functionaries. The fact that the brazenness with which political opportunism has been displayed must not be considered as isolated instances. It rather reflects the moral and ideological bankruptcy of the country’s top political class. The apparent ideological battles that are fought are only smokescreen to fool the average voter. The message that emanates from the actions of the elected representatives of the three parties appears to be that they should not lag behind when political opportunism at any cost is the norm at their respective parties’ top levels. Had it not been so, they would not have dared take the reprehensible course.

Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis directed his party to break both alliances while saying they were “not acceptable.” At the same time, the Congress dissolved the party’s city unit in Ambernath and suspended its chief Pradip Patil while the AIMIM warned its corporators in Akot, which falls in the Vidarbha region, of legal action if they did not pull out from the BJP alliance. Fadnavis has said “alliance with Congress and AIMIM is not acceptable and disciplinary action will be taken if anybody has violated orders.”

Maharashtra BJP chief Ravindra Chavan also issued a show cause notice to party MLA Prakash Bharsakle, who represents Akot, for the “suo motu” AIMIM alliance. Meanwhile, Maharashtra Congress vice-president Ganesh Patil said in a letter to its Ambernath unit chief that the municipal election was fought on the party’s symbol. He warned disciplinary action would be taken against the unit for “allying with the BJP in the Ambernath municipal council without informing the state office.” It said that the block Congress committee was dissolved and all corporators suspended from the party.

Pradip Patil, however, accused the state leadership of not giving him a hearing before announcing the disciplinary action and threatened to join the BJP. The conclusion he has reached is not only the height of political dishonesty, but takes rank opportunism to another level. He said he and his pack of party leaders “respect the Congress and will continue to do so in future,” but if they are insulted by the party they would have “no option but to join the BJP.” And as is well known, the BJP would certainly take them in.

This is a familiar political trajectory that the BJP top leadership has advocated and followed during the past few years in different states and at the national level when they broke Congress and other Opposition parties, poached their MLAs and MPs to form new governments toppling those run by the Opposition. They even used Central investigating machinery to go after Opposition leaders and coerce them to join their party. Some Social Media users compare this tactic of the BJP with the work of a “washing machine” in which the taint of corruption in Opposition leaders is washed clean once they enter the BJP fold.

Congress too cannot walk a moral high ground just as any other party. The Maharashtra civic body scandals have shown Indian politics in its true colours. When top leaders are always seen to have engineered defections, get the defectors absolved of any past crime or corruption and grab power at any cost, why should the lower rungs of the party be denied the same immorality is the moot point. Thus, it is only the people who become the losers but never the ruling political class.

Rejecting claims of financial mismanagement, he said the state had continued to invest in welfare, development and jobs despite financial pressure.

Taking on Amit Shah's claim that Kerala received more funds under the Modi government, Vijayan said tax devolution was not a gift, but a constitutional right. He accused the Centre of interfering with the Finance Commission and quoted NITI Aayog CEO B V R Subrahmanyam.

The chief minister said the Finance Commission had recommended 42 per cent for states and that there was an attempt to cut it to 33 per cent. He added that the Prime Minister had not denied this claim.

Calling for wider protests, Vijayan said Kerala would fight legally and politically to protect federalism and ensure its rightful share. He also criticised the Congress-led UDF for not standing with the state at this crucial time.

But the BJP hit back almost immediately. State BJP president Rajeef Chandrasekhar said the Left government was trying to fool the public.

He said a government that had ruled for nearly 10 years had no excuse to shift blame.

Child among 3 killed in Solan fire; 6 Nepalese nationals feared trapped

Shimla: An eight-year-old child was among three Nepalese individuals killed in a massive fire that engulfed a four-storey building in Solan, primarily occupied by migrant families from Bihar and Nepal, officials said Monday. The fire broke out near UCO Bank in the Arki market Sunday night, and six people are still feared to be trapped under the debris, police said. Arki MLA Sanjay Awasthi, who was at the spot, said that 10 to 15 houses suffered significant damage in the fire. Some locals from Nepal are missing and a search is underway to locate them, he said. The building, made of mud and wood and owned by Rajiv Gupta, was completely gutted in the blaze. The ground and first floors housed shops, while families lived on the third and fourth floors. Visuals showing fire tenders battling the enormous flames in the cold night, along with residents of nearby buildings crying out for help to save their homes, have gone viral on the internet. All three deceased individuals and the six people trapped are Nepalese nationals from Salyan in the Karnali province of Nepal. Among these nine individuals, five are minors. The child was rescued in an injured condition, but later succumbed to injuries in the hospital. The bodies of two others were recovered during the rescue operation, found charred and fragmented, and post-mortem and forensic examinations are currently underway, police added.

SC asks gangster Abu Salem to justify claim of having spent 25 years in jail

New Delhi: The Supreme Court Monday asked gangster Abu Salem to justify his claim that he has spent 25 years in jail, a contention if proven will allow him to walk free from jail. Salem, a convict in the 1993 Mumbai serial blasts, was extradited from Portugal November 11, 2005, after a prolonged legal battle. According to the extradition terms agreed upon by India and Portugal, Salem cannot be given death penalty and his prison term cannot exceed 25 years. Taking note of his plea, a bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta questioned his counsel over the claim of having completed 25 years jail term in India and asked him to substantiate the contention. "First of all, how do you calculate 25 years from 2005?" the bench asked the counsel appearing for Salem. His counsel said as per the calculation, Salem has completed 25-year jail term. "You were taken in actual custody on which date?" the bench asked. The counsel said Salem was taken into custody November 11, 2005. Salem's counsel said he would place the relevant prison rules on record. "Let the relevant prison rules be filed within a period of two weeks by the petitioner," the bench said, and posted the matter for hearing February 9.

'Tobacco glamorisation could fuel cancer, lung disease'


New Delhi, Jan 12: Health and education experts have warned that the growing glamorisation of tobacco through surrogate advertising and its normalisation, by selling it alongside toffees and candies, pose a serious threat to the health of children and adolescents.

They cautioned that if this trend is not checked urgently, it could lead to a new epidemic of cancer and lung diseases in the coming years.

The warning came during a National Youth Day webinar titled 'The Silent Push: Tobacco and Young India', organised by Tobacco Free India, a citizen initiative, on the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekanand.

Speakers noted that while India has taken several commendable steps in recent years to strengthen tobacco control, children and young people between 10 and 20 years of age are increasingly being targeted through subtle and indirect practices.

They stressed that addressing this challenge would require tighter controls on surrogate promotions, strict limits on point-of-sale visibility, and en-



suring that tobacco is not sold alongside products meant for children.

They also underlined the need to delay initiation by raising the legal age for purchase, ending single-stick sales, and strengthening enforcement around educational institutions to better protect children's everyday environment.

Dr Shalini Singh, director of

the ICMR-National Institute of Cancer Prevention and Research, highlighted how children are exposed to tobacco through everyday influences, starting at retail points and extending to surrogate promotion. Other experts noted that these layered exposures together make tobacco products appear harmless, easily accessible, and socially acceptable to

young minds.

From a child health perspective, Dr Naveen Thacker, executive director of the International Pediatric Association, warned that the problem begins far earlier than commonly assumed. Referring to a cross-sectional study conducted under his leadership in Gandhinagar, Gujarat, he said nearly one in six children around the age of

Experts noted that while direct tobacco advertising is prohibited under Indian law, promotion today works largely through everyday visibility and proximity

Tobacco products continue to be displayed at neighbourhood shops and kiosks frequented by children, often alongside items meant for young consumers

10 had already experimented with tobacco.

Echoing these concerns, Dr M C Misra, public health expert and former director of AIIMS, Delhi, cautioned that the consequences of inaction could be severe and long-lasting.

Professor JS Rajput, former director of NCERT, said celebrity-linked surrogate promotions add another troubling layer to the problem and called for collective responsibility.

Drawing on child health evidence, Dr Thacker said the growing signs of early exposure call for a much sharper focus on protecting children's everyday environment from tobacco influence. Several speakers, including Prof Ra-

input, stressed the importance of curbing surrogate branding and celebrity-linked promotions, observing that aspirational cues play a disproportionate role in shaping youth behaviour. When admired public figures are indirectly associated with tobacco brands, it undermines both health messaging and value-based education, they said.

To delay initiation and reduce lifetime dependence, experts also highlighted the potential public health benefit of raising the legal age for purchase of tobacco products, similar to alcohol. Global evidence shows that even modest delays in initiation significantly reduce long-term addiction and disease burden.

The continued practice of single-stick sales, which lowers cost barriers and facilitates experimentation, was flagged as another area requiring urgent attention.

In addition, speakers called for consistent enforcement of the ban on the sale of tobacco products within 100 yards of educational institutions.

Several speakers said that reducing tobacco consumption would be a meaningful tribute to Swami Vivekananda on National Youth Day.



Gyanvapi mosque: HC adjourns hearing

PRAYAGRAJ: The Allahabad High Court Monday adjourned the hearing in the Gyanvapi mosque dispute case in Varanasi to February 3, saying the matter is pending before the Supreme Court. Justice Rohit Ranjan Agarwal was hearing the petition, which seeks a scientific survey of the ablution area (wazu khana) of the Gyanvapi complex, excluding a structure which the Hindu side claims to be a Shivaling and the Muslim side a fountain, by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI). The civil revision plea has challenged a Varanasi district judge's order dated October 21, 2023, refusing to direct the ASI to survey the 'wazu khana' area of the Gyanvapi mosque.

VENEZUELA CRISIS: Oppn criticise Govt's stance

NEW DELHI: Opposition parties, including the Left parties, DMK, SP, RJD, AAP and VCK, adopted a resolution Monday condemning the US aggression on Venezuela and the "kidnapping" of President Nicolas Maduro and his wife, Cilia Flores. At a public meeting held here, leaders from these parties also came down heavily on the BJP-led Centre, accusing it of having a muted response to these events.

ED RAID ON I-PAC

Abhishek alleges 'information theft'

KOLKATA, Jan 12: Senior TMC leader Abhishek Banerjee Monday escalated the party's confrontation with the Centre over the ED raid on I-PAC, alleging that the central agency's objective was not investigation but "stealing political information" to settle scores on behalf of the BJP ahead of the 2026 Assembly polls.

Addressing a conclave of the party's digital volunteers, 'Ami Banglar Digital Joddha', Banerjee questioned both the intent and the selectivity of the ED action, claiming that the raid was designed to create a political narrative against the ruling party rather than pursue a legitimate probe.

Banerjee alleged that the January 8 searches at premises linked to I-PAC, which provides political consultancy to the TMC and manages its IT operations, were aimed at accessing the party's internal strategy.

"The ED says it came to investigate the coal scam. That case is more than three years old and they have not summoned anyone all this time. They can come, but their purpose was information theft," Banerjee alleged, marking the first time he directly accused the agency of attempting to appropriate Trinamool's internal data.

The ED conducted searches at the Salt Lake office of I-PAC and

assisting the party during the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, reiterating a charge he had first made at a rally in Nadia's Taherpur Friday. I-PAC, he said, had helped the party develop digital tools such as the 'Didir Doot' app to assist voters during the revision process.

"Because they helped people and worked for the TMC during SIR, the ED was sent to raid them. On one hand, the Election Commission is being used to snatch people's rights, and on the other, ED is being used to throttle democracy," Banerjee alleged.

The ED has accused Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee of obstructing its officers and removing incriminating documents during the raid at Jain's residence, a charge strongly denied by the TMC. The agency has moved the Calcutta High

Court seeking a CBI probe.

Without directly referring to the removal of files, Banerjee defended the chief minister, saying, "She responded in the language they used. In other states, leaders are threatened into switching sides. That does not work here."

Banerjee also widened the political attack, accusing the BJP of disrespecting the Bengali language and icons. He cited BJP IT Cell chief Amit Malviya's alleged remark branding Bengalis as "Bangladeshis" and recalled the vandalism of polymath and social reformer Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar's statue during a BJP rally in 2019.

Banerjee, however, did not elaborate on the connection between the two Gujaratis and the Bengali language.

Framing the party's organisational strength in militaristic terms, Banerjee likened the TMC to the three wings of the armed forces: grassroots workers as the "Army", MPs and lawyers as the "Navy", and social media volunteers as the "Air Force".

KOLKATA, Jan 12: Two nurses working at a private hospital in West Bengal's North 24 Parganas district are showing symptoms of being infected with Nipah virus, a senior official of the state health department said Monday.

The condition of the two nurses, one male and another female, are stated to be "very critical", he said.

Both nurses work in the same hospital in Barasat. They are suspected of being infected with Nipah virus. Samples of both nurses were sent to Kalyani AIIMS for testing, and preliminary reports indicate a possible Nipah infection," the official told PTI.

While one nurse is a resident of Nadia district, the other lives at Katwa in Purba Bardhaman district, he said.

"Both are currently admitted to the Barasat hospital where they work, and have been placed in the isolation ward with ventilator support," he elaborated.

According to health department sources, one of the nurses had recently returned from her hometown in Katwa, where she fell ill and was initially admitted to a local hospital December 31.

"Her condition worsened, leading to her transfer to Bardhaman Medical College, and then by special ambulance to Barasat hospital. The male nurse exhibited similar symptoms and was also placed on ventilator support," he stated.

Trump told reporters Sunday that the US was "talking to Cuba." He did not specify what had been discussed but said "You'll find out pretty soon."


Diaz-Canel denied any ongoing conversations except for technical contacts on the issue of migration.

New Delhi, Jan 12: Retail inflation rose to a three-month high of 1.33 per cent in December, mainly due to higher prices of food items, but remained below the Reserve Bank of India's lower tolerance level.

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) based headline inflation was 0.71 per cent in November and 5.22 per cent in December 2024. The inflation stood at 1.44 per cent in September.

The food inflation in December was (-) 2.71 per cent, and remained negative for the seventh consecutive month.

"The increase in headline inflation and food inflation during the month of December 2025 is mainly attributed to an increase in inflation of personal care and effects, vegetables, meat and fish, egg, spices and pulses and products," the National Statistics Office (NSO) said while releasing the CPI data.


The headline inflation in urban areas was higher at 2.03 per cent compared to 0.76 per cent in rural India.

The retail inflation remained below the Reserve Bank of India's lower tolerance limit for the fourth consecutive month in December. The government has mandated the central bank to ensure inflation remains at 4 per cent, with a margin of 2 per cent on either side.

According to the NSO data, the top five major states with high inflation during December were Kerala (9.49 per cent), Karnataka (2.99 per cent), Andhra Pradesh (2.71 per cent), Tamil Nadu (2.67 per cent), and Jammu and Kashmir (2.26 per cent).

On the other hand, retail inflation was negative in Assam, Bihar, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, and Uttar Pradesh.

ICC unlikely to shift Bangladesh T20 matches

The BCB's apprehensions followed the release of Mustafizur from IPL franchise Kolkata Knight Riders amid attacks on Hindus in Bangladesh

New Delhi, Jan 12: The International Cricket Council (ICC) Monday indicated that it is unlikely to accept Bangladesh's demand for a change of venue for its T20 World Cup matches in India after an assessment report of the country's security concerns placed the threat perception at "low".

As per ICC sources, the world

body's risk assessment report does not flag any specific or direct threat to the Bangladesh team if it participates in the tournament starting February 7.

It also contradicts claims made by Bangladesh sports ministry advisor Asif Nazrul that Mustafizur Rahman's inclusion in the team would contribute to the overall threat. Bangladesh are due to play four league stage matches in India.

"It is important to clarify that the ICC's independent risk assessments, carried out by internationally recognised security experts, do not conclude that Bangladesh cannot play its scheduled matches in India," an ICC source told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

"The overall security risk

for the tournament in India has been assessed as low to moderate, which is consistent with the profile of many major global sporting events," the source said.

According to the source, the assessment did not identify any direct threat even to the Bangladesh officials at any venue in India.

"Based on the professional advice received, the risk associated with Bangladesh's scheduled fixtures in Kolkata and Mumbai is assessed as low to moderate, with no indication of risks that cannot be effectively managed through established security planning and mitigation measures," the source added.

ICC report had flagged a threat to Mustafizur, whose omission from the IPL on BCCI's directions owing to unspecified "developments all around" prompted the pullout threat from the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB).

The BCB later issued a clarification, effectively backpedaling on the assertions made by Nazrul Monday.

"The correspondence cited today by the Advisor for the Ministry of Youth & Sports was in reference to an internal communication between the BCB and the ICC's Security Department related to threat assessments for the Bangladesh team ahead of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup.

"This does not constitute a

formal response from the ICC to the BCB's request for the relocation of Bangladesh's matches outside India," the BCB said in a statement.

The BCB, however, reiterated that it has requested relocation of Bangladesh's matches outside India "in the interest of the team's security" and that it is still awaiting an official response from the ICC on this matter.

However, the ICC source maintained that the existing schedule is unlikely to be tinkered with.

Following Mustafizur's removal from the Kolkata Knight Riders franchise, an irate Bangladesh government had banned the broadcast of the IPL in the country.

All ISL clubs confirm to play

New Delhi, Jan 12: All the 14 Indian Super League (ISL) clubs have written to the All India Football Federation (AIFF), formally confirming participation in the delayed 2025-26 season, clearing the decks for the start of the top-tier domestic competition February 14.

Sports Minister Mansukh Mandaviya had announced January 6 that the ISL, which was on hold due to the absence of a commercial partner, would start February 14, with all the 14 clubs taking part in it.

Despite the minister's announcement, a few clubs were yet to confirm participation in writing as they had agreed to take part in the ISL "in principle" only.

But now, all the clubs have formally confirmed participation in the truncated league, a source in the AIFF told PTI Monday.

Many of the clubs have also shared details of the venues where they plan to play their home matches.

The top-tier ISL will feature 91 matches on a home-and-away basis.

AIFF President Kalyan Chaubey had earlier said that a Governing Council Board would be formed to manage the league and it would be "empowered to take all commercial decisions."

It is learnt that the AIFF and the clubs are expected to have an online meeting on Tuesday and jointly discuss the formation of the Governing Council Board.

The AIFF has asked the clubs to send the details of the venues where they plan to play their home matches by Monday noon to start working on the fixture and finalise broadcast and commercial rights partners.

Regarding the financial part of the league, the AIFF said, "The 2025-26 season of the ISL is proposed to be held on a total budget of INR 24 Crores Twenty Six Lakhs Seventy Four Thousand (INR 24,26,74,000/-) with an initial contribution of INR Nine Crores Seventy Seven Lakhs Forty Thousand (INR 9,77,40,000/-) from the AIFF and a contribution of INR One Crore (INR 1,00,00,000/-) each from the participating clubs."

The AIFF had earlier said that it's willing to accept the participation fee of Rs 1 crore per club in instalments up to June 2026, if the clubs are not able to pay immediately.
