## Mahayuti's big win in Maha civic elections

**Mumbai, Jan 16:** Breaking the nearly three-decade-old dominance of the undivided Shiv Sena, the BJP Friday emerged as the single largest party in the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) elections, and also triumphed in Pune, where it made mince-meat of the alliance of NCP factions led by Sharad Pawar and Ajit Pawar.

The BJP-led Mahayuti alliance is set to come to power in 25 of the 29 municipal corporations, including Mumbai, where elections were held January 15, Maharashtra Chief Minister Fadnavis said, addressing jubilant party workers in south Mumbai in the evening.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi thanked the voters over the emphatic victory of BJP and allies in the civic polls.

"Thank you Maharashtra! The dynamic people of the state bless the NDA's agenda of pro-people good governance," Modi posted on X.

The BJP-led alliance was set to surpass the 114-seat majority mark in the 227-member BMC, which is India's richest civic body, whose budget for 2025-26 is a whopping ₹74,427 crore.

Counting of votes was held Friday, a day after the polling saw a 54.77 per cent turnout.

The State Election Commission is yet to release an official statement on all the results. An official said the final results may be announced late in the night. Coupled with a decent performance by Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde's Shiv Sena, the BJP is now in the driver's seat to govern the cash-rich Mumbai civic body.

## Compulsory retirement for non-performing lecturers

*The Odisha government's directive to identify non-performing lecturers for possible compulsory premature retirement reflects a long-overdue attempt to restore accountability in state-run higher education institutions. Authorities have been instructed to examine service records and performance appraisal reports and submit well-reasoned proposals, strictly following service rules and principles of natural justice. The move is aimed at maintaining academic standards and administrative efficiency. Institutions have been asked to submit compliance reports to the department by January 31 for further government review*



administrative efficiency," the letter said.

"All concerned authorities are requested to carefully examine the service records, performance appraisal reports, integrity status, and overall conduct of college teachers working under the administrative control of Higher Education Department and identify such cases which may warrant consideration for compulsory premature retirement, strictly in accordance with the provisions of the relevant service rules and government guidelines in force," the letter said.

The letter also emphasised that the proposal, if any, should be well-reasoned, supported by records, and duly vetted at the appropriate level, ensuring that the principles of natural justice and applicable rules are strictly adhered to.

"The compliance report may be submitted to the department by January 31, positively, for further examination at the government level. This matter may be treated as most urgent and important," the letter said. **P4**

## 2 labourers killed as boulders fall in illegal quarry

**Bhubaneswar, Jan 16:** The Odisha government has asked the authorities of state-run universities and colleges to identify non-performing teachers for compulsory premature retirement and submit compliance reports by January 31, an official said Friday.

In a letter to the registrars

**Malkangiri, Jan 16:** Two labourers were killed, and another was injured when boulders fell on them while digging soil at an illegal stone quarry in Malkangiri district Friday, police said.

The incident took place at a stone quarry near the Tarini Temple. The deceased were identified as Tuna Gadba (21) of Satyamguda village and Mitu Madhi (31) of Champakharai village.

Another worker, Bijay Rao of Champaghari village, also sustained serious injury. He was undergoing treatment at the government hospital, said Malkangiri Model Police Station IIC Regan Kindo. While Tuna Gadba died on the spot, Madhi succumbed to injuries at the district headquarters hospital.

Co-workers said that the trio was engaged in digging soil and loading the excavated soil in a tractor when the stones fell on them. Locals rescued the trapped workers.

## ₹ crashes 44 paise to settle at 90.78/\$

**Mumbai, Jan 16:** The rupee tumbled for the third straight session, losing 44 paise to settle near its lowest level at 90.78 against the US dollar Friday, on strong dollar demand and persistent foreign fund outflows.

Forex traders said lingering concerns over US-India trade negotiations and geopolitical tensions further dented investor sentiment.

At the interbank foreign exchange market was closed on Thursday due to the Mumbai municipal corporation elections. The rupee marked its third straight session of decline, during which it has fallen 61 paise.

On Wednesday, it fell 11 paise to close at 90.34 against the US dollar, after declining 6 paise on Tuesday.

The Indian currency recorded its lowest closing level of 90.93 on December 16, when it also saw its lifetime low of 91.14 in intraday trade.

## BALASORE MOB LYNCHING: 3 HELD

**Balasore, Jan 16:** Odisha Police arrested three persons in Balasore district and launched a manhunt to nab others allegedly involved in the lynching of a man suspected of cattle smuggling, an officer said Friday.

The incident has triggered sharp political reactions, with leaders of Opposition parties blaming the state government for what they described as a rise in cases of "religious intolerance."

Stating that the incident had taken place Wednesday, Balasore Sadar sub-divisional police officer (SDPO) Subhranshu Sekhar Nayak said initially a complaint was lodged regarding a road accident.

Later, the victim's brother in a written complaint alleged that Sk Makandar Mohammad of Astoria died due to mob attack. Two FIRs were registered at Balasore Sadar police station, he said.

"We have arrested three persons, and they were forwarded to judicial custody Thursday. Police have launched a search operation to arrest others involved in the mob attack," the



SDPO told PTI.

The accused were booked under Section 103(2) (murder committed by a mob) of the BNS.

Reacting to the incident, Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav, who is on a two-day tour to the state, said, "BJP's agenda is communal. It takes the communal route whenever it weakens or fails to deliver on its election manifesto commitments."

OPCC president Bhakta Charan Das in an X post said, "The brutal lynching of a 35-year-old Muslim man by cow vigilantes in Balasore over cattle transportation is a grave collapse of law and order in Odisha. No allegation can ever legitimise mob rule or vigilante justice. Taking a life in the name of suspicion is a crime, not justice. Govt must ensure strict accountability and urgently reaffirm the rule of law."

## Trump accepts Nobel medal from Venezuelan Oppn leader

**Washington, Jan 16:** Venezuelan Opposition leader Maria Corina Machado gave her Nobel Peace Prize medal to US President Donald Trump during a White House meeting, in a bid to influence his efforts to shape her country's political future.

A White House official confirmed that Trump intends to keep the medal.

"It was my Great Honour to meet Maria Corina Machado, of Venezuela, today. She is a wonderful woman who has been through so much. Maria presented me with her Nobel Peace Prize for the work I have done. Such a wonderful gesture of mutual respect. Thank you Maria!" Trump said in a post on Truth Social.



## Can a Nobel Prize be shared or transferred?

**REG**ardless of the optics of Machado's gesture, Nobel authorities are clear that a prize cannot be transferred, split, or re-awarded. Once announced, the decision is final. The Nobel Foundation's statutes provide no mechanism for changing laureates, sharing awards retroactively, or revoking a prize, even amid later controversy. "Once a Nobel Prize is announced, it cannot be revoked, shared, or transferred to others. The decision is final and stands for all time," the Nobel Peace Center said January 15.

Latin America expressed hope for Venezuela to begin a process of democratization.

Democratic Senator Chris Murphy, one of the senators who met with Machado, said the

Opposition leader had told senators that repression in Venezuela was no different now than under Maduro.

Venezuela's interim President Delcy Rodriguez is a "smooth operator" who was growing more entrenched by the day thanks to Trump's support, he said. "I hope elections happen, but I'm skeptical," said Murphy, of Connecticut.

Trump has said he is focused on securing U.S. access to the country's oil and economically rebuilding Venezuela.

Trump has on several occasions praised Rodriguez, Maduro's second-in-command, who became Venezuela's leader upon his capture. In an interview with Reuters Wednesday, Trump said, "She's been very good to deal with."

**Lisa on walking away from fame**

**Mumbai:** Known for working in films such as *Kasoor*, *Bollywood/Hollywood* and *Water*, actress Lisa Ray reflected on a defining phase of her life when she chose to step away from mainstream cinema in India at the height of her career in 2001, sharing that the decision helped her rediscover depth, meaning and her true self.

Lisa took to Instagram, where she shared a reel featuring various scenes from the films she had done. The video clip had the acoustic version of *Girls Like You* playing in the background.

"In 2001, I walked away from fame in India. Not because the work wasn't coming — it was. I had successful films behind me, many offers ahead of me, and a very clear sense of how I was being seen: model, too pretty, not gritty enough. My voice. My personality. Flattened."

After stepping away, Lisa says she "chose the long road."

"I moved to London to study acting in ways that felt aligned. I lived at Balliol College, Oxford, immersing myself in Shakespeare and poetry. I wandered the V&A. I studied Buddhism and yoga (the irony is not lost on me, I was only exposed to yoga once I left Bombay) I built a life rooted in learning, spirit, and curiosity — not visibility," she added. It was after this pause that she returned to cinema through independent films, often made on shoestring budgets but driven by faith and optimism rather than commerce.

mours. As of now, neither Dhanush nor Mrunal has issued any official statement or shared updates regarding the matter.






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# Forced retirements may leave classrooms empty

Experts warned that granting local authorities the power to prepare lists of non-performing teachers could lead to favouritism and political interference

**Bhubaneswar, Jan 16:** The state government's directive to identify non-performing teachers for compulsory premature retirement has sparked concern among educationists and academics, who warn that the move could worsen the situation as there is an acute shortage of qualified faculty in state-run universities and colleges.

The Higher Education department Friday asked institutional heads to review service records, performance appraisal reports, integrity status, and overall conduct of teachers and submit compliance reports by January 31. The government said the exercise aims to improve academic standards and administrative efficiency.

However, experts see the other way round as they raised questions about the lack of clearly defined criteria for determining "non-performance."

Educationist Prasanna Kumar Bisoi said, "Decisions of such gravity should not be taken in haste. A proper and transparent examination must be conducted before taking such a decision, ensuring that teachers are evaluated fairly and objectively."

Academic expert Naba Kishore Pujari described the policy as paradoxical, noting that while the government seeks to retire experienced teachers for alleged non-performance, it continues to rely on retired educators to fill vacancies in aided colleges. He warned that granting local au-

thorities the power to prepare lists of non-performing teachers could lead to favouritism and political interference.

He pointed out that teachers, particularly in rural and under-funded institutions, are often burdened with non-academic duties such as election work, administrative responsibilities, and data-related tasks, which adversely affect classroom performance. Penalising teachers without addressing these systemic issues, they argue, would be unjust.

Faculty members also expressed apprehension that compulsory retirement could demoralise teachers who have dedicated decades to the profession. Sabyasachi Nayak, an assistant professor at Utkal University, said improper implementation of the decision could harm both teachers' careers and institutional stability.

Students, too, expressed cautious support coupled with concerns over fairness. Anandita Mishra, a student of BJB College, said while action against genuinely inefficient teachers is necessary, the process must be impartial. "Performance evaluation should be done by independent experts who have no personal or professional relationship with the teachers concerned," she said.

## BJD supremo suspends two more for anti-party activities

**Bhubaneswar, Jan 16:** BJD president Naveen Patnaik Friday suspended two more frontline leaders for alleged "anti-party activities", sending a clear message to party members to maintain discipline and unity.

The suspended leaders are Nalini Prabha Jena, president of the zilla parishad in Jajpur district, and Ganeswar Baral, vice-president of the party's Jajpur district unit.

The moves came a day after two MLAs, Arvind Mohapatra (Patkura in Kendrapara district) and Sanatan Mahakud (Champua of Keonjhar district) were also suspended for anti-party activities.

These suspensions followed Patnaik's three rounds of meetings with party MLAs since January 12. So far he has met 29 legislators.

While Mahakud is a two-time MLA and Odisha's wealthiest legislator, Mohapatra is a new entrant in politics and made his

debut 18 months ago. Both the MLAs rejected the allegations against them.

"I have not received any show-cause notice before being suspended from the party. I reject the allegations made against me. I will be happy, if the party gives evidence on the charges against me," Mohapatra said. In a related development, Patnaik announced names of 126 block presidents and 41 nagar presidents under 15 organisational districts of the party.

These 15 organisational districts are Boudh, Baragarh, Cuttack, Deogarh, Gajapati, Jagatsinghpur, Jharsuguda, Kandhamal, Koraput, Nayagarh, Nuapada, Rourkela, Rayagada, Sundargarh and Subarnpur, an official release of the party said.

The BJD had earlier announced the block and nagar presidents of nine organisational districts. With Friday's declaration, the party has completed the announcement of block and nagar presidents for all 24 organisational districts.

## Scientists build affordable DNA analysis system

**Bhubaneswar, Jan 16:** The Capital city marked an important milestone in Indian science Friday on the occasion of National Startup Day, with the launch of GelGenius, India's first fully integrated agarose gel electrophoresis system, unveiled at department of Bio technology (DBT)-Institute of Life Sciences (ILS) bioincubator.

The device was developed under the leadership of ILS scientist Amarendra Panda. Designed and manufactured in City, GelGenius reflects the

spirit of make-in-India and 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' in the life sciences sector.

An electrophoresis system is a lab setup using an electric current to separate molecules like DNA, RNA, or proteins in a gel (agarose/polyacrylamide) based on their size, shape, and electrical charge, moving them from a negative to a positive electrode. Smaller, lighter molecules travel faster through the gel's pores, creating distinct bands that reveal sample composition and are vital in diagnostics, forensics, and research.

Traditional electrophoresis

requires multiple instruments and involves safety risks due to UV light. GelGenius simplifies this process by combining agarose heating, gel casting, electrophoresis, visualisation, and documentation into a single compact unit.

"Our aim was to make molecular biology affordable and accessible for students and institutions with limited resources," said Panda. With GelGenius, students can learn DNA analysis without depending on expensive laboratory setups, he added.

The system uses safe blue-light technology instead of UV light, making it safer for users. Its all-in-one design saves laboratory space and reduces equipment costs, especially for schools and colleges.

Calling it a proud achievement for Odisha, ILS director Debasis Dash said the innovation shows how indigenous technology can replace costly imported lab instruments.

With GelGenius, the startup aims to support hands-on learning and inspire the next generation of Indian scientists.



## Raisina Exodus

For decades, Raisina Hill was not just a location but a metaphor. North and South Block symbolised where power resided, where files gathered momentum, and where governance unfolded through proximity as much as procedure. That geography is now being deliberately dismantled as key ministries relocate to the newly constructed Kartavya Bhawan complexes along Kartavya Path.

The shift of nine ministries and departments—including Defence, Law and Justice, Agriculture, Education, Information and Broadcast, Chemicals and Fertilisers, and the CBI—is not a routine administrative reshuffle. It reflects a conscious reordering of the spatial logic of governance. As the Central Vista shapes up, the daily business of the state is being pulled away from colonial-era icons into a consolidated, purpose-built Secretariat, while North and South Blocks are repositioned as heritage structures and museums.

Modern infrastructure, shared facilities, energy savings, and co-location are expected to improve coordination and reduce the operational clutter created by decades of scattered offices across Delhi. The argument is sensible and long overdue.

Yet power in babudom has never been purely architectural. It thrives on proximity, habit, and informal networks. The old Raisina ecosystem worked not because of grandeur but because of density. Relocation disrupts those rhythms, creating new patterns of access and influence that will inevitably favour those quick to adapt to the new geography.

This makes the move as symbolic as it is functional. It reflects a broader attempt to redefine where authority is seen to operate, aligning governance with a reimagined Central Vista that privileges modernity over inherited legacy.

This is not a cosmetic exercise but a recalibration of how the Indian state organises itself, signals power and conducts governance. For babus, where one sits still shapes how one matters.

**Trump's man in Delhi**

The arrival of Sergio Gor in New Delhi comes at an awkward moment in Indo-US ties, certainly not at a high point but near a fresh low. Trump's second term has stripped the relationship of its diplomatic cushioning. Stiff tariffs overshadow ties, trade frictions are sharper, and the old comfort of "strategic partnership" is being stress-tested almost weekly.

Gor is no conventional envoy sent to smooth edges. He is Trump's insider—political, transactional, and perfectly aligned with a White House that sees diplomacy as leverage, not reassurance. That matters because India is no longer dealing with a friendly but demanding partner; it is dealing with a sceptical one that believes pressure works. And often, it does.

For India, this changes the playbook. The mandarins in MEA and babus in the Commerce, Finance and Defence ministries can no longer assume policy continuity or goodwill as a default setting. Washington's moves are now driven less by long-term strategy and more by domestic politics and deal optics. One tweet or one off-the-cuff remark can undo months of hard work.

Trade is where the pain is most visible. Tariffs and hard bargaining have replaced the earlier rhetoric of convergence. Indian negotiators must now plan for sharper scenarios, faster coordination and credible fallback options beyond the US market.

There's also a strategic irritant: Gor's wider regional remit revives the risk of India being viewed through a South Asia lens rather than as a distinct Indo-Pacific power. That distinction will need constant reinforcement. For India, this is no longer relationship management; it's damage control mixed with opportunity. If India adapts quickly and strategically, volatility can be managed. If it clings to old assumptions, it will spend Trump's second term permanently on the back foot.

**When PSU chiefs start looking over the fence**

The latest buzz from the Ministry of Steel's corridors is equal parts intrigue and frustration: Amarendu Prakash, the Chairman & Managing Director of Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL), may have submitted his resignation, and might be eyeing a senior role at a global steel giant. However, nobody in the ministry will publicly acknowledge it, and that is precisely the problem.

Prakash isn't some mid-level bean counter. He's a seasoned technocrat with deep roots in steel production and decades of experience in the sector. His leadership was supposed to anchor SAIL through a delicate phase of expansion and policy navigation. Instead, we're left with silence, speculation and whispers—the worst possible currency in administrative governance.

If these rumours are true, it may signal something bigger, that the flight of talent from the public sector to private players isn't just a headline, but a trend. And it shouldn't surprise anyone. When top leaders find better opportunities elsewhere, and when ministries respond with tight-lipped bureaucracy rather than clarity, it tells markets, PSUs and even foreign investors that India's leadership pipeline is volatile.

Worse still, the timing couldn't be more awkward. Critical decisions around key appointments and oversight are in the queue, and the ministry looks like it's stuck between denials and rumour control.

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

**I**nrastructure investment is booming. Around the world, governments are pouring trillions of dollars into roads, power grids, data centers, water systems, and housing, with many responding to intensifying climate shocks and the growing need for adaptation. Yet the construction industry—the single largest force physically reshaping the planet—is among the last major sectors to unlock all the benefits that digital technology offers. As a result, it accounts for about 21% of greenhouse-gas emissions, produces half of global landfill waste, and overspends by \$1.6 trillion a year.

This must change, and AI may offer the solutions that the industry needs. But that will require fully leveraging the potential of institutional collaboration and human networks. While generative AI can write code or summarize documents, building real-world assets like bridges and power grids requires what we might call "cognitive infrastructure": difficult-to-access data, human expertise, domain knowledge, and institutions through which to deploy new tools for planning and delivery. Like electricity without a power grid, AI without this foundation will remain a source of untapped potential.

What would leveraging AI look like in practice? For starters, it would require unlocking and integrating siloed data from thousands of stakeholders, including construction firms, suppliers, government ministries, multilateral agencies, and financiers. It would also involve codifying domain knowledge from past project cycles to understand why delays happen, how risks compound, and where capacity breaks down; and building intelligent digital agents that understand infrastructure-specific workflows (con-

tracting, procurement, permitting, and budgeting). But most importantly, it would demand institutional collaboration. We do not need static roadmaps, but rather dynamic, evolving feedback mechanisms. AIs for infrastructure would learn from every project and apply lessons across organizations.

The opportunity to improve how we build things comes just as the geopolitics of infrastructure is shifting. As President Donald Trump seeks to reverse all his predecessor's clean-energy policies, others are filling the leadership vacuum the United States has created.

China, for example, has reoriented its Belt and Road Initiative toward "green, high-quality" development, pairing massive overseas transportation and energy investments with climate-resilient projects at home.

Similarly, Saudi Arabia, long synonymous with hydrocarbons, has launched a "green initiative" to funnel tens of billions of dollars toward solar and wind projects, green-finance frameworks, and new public-private partnerships. And India has already hit its target of committing 50% of its installed power capacity to non-fossil sources.

It has also launched a National Green Hydrogen Mission, targeting annual production of five million tons by 2030, and has used global platforms such as the G20 and the United Nations Climate Change Conference to champion climate-resilient infrastructure and "green development pacts."

The result is a fragmented map. While the world's largest historical emitter is doubling down on fossil-fuel exports, emerging and middle-income economies are increasingly presenting themselves as voices of climate responsibility. In this new landscape, the contest is not only over whose capital builds the next generation of ports, grids, and railways, but whose data, standards, and AI systems will guide those investments.

The next leader in infrastructure will focus on three immediate priorities. The first is to make the most of available data. Infrastructure know-how tends to be buried in PDFs, contracts, and permit files. Governments, banks, and companies must uncover this hidden history to help all stakeholders avoid past mis-

takes and navigate new policy settings when governments abruptly rewrite the rules (as the US has done).

The second priority is to build AI tools for this specific purpose. What we need is not a generic chatbot, but models trained on materials science, logistics, and local regulations. An AI that understands why projects fail can make success more likely.

Lastly, we must do a better job of sharing knowledge across borders. Instead of having each institution reinvent the wheel, we need a shared knowledge base so that lessons from a dam in India or a metro in Paris can improve projects everywhere.

Over the next decade, infrastructure will define not just climate adaptation, but global competitiveness. It is the muscle of the real economy. The countries that align their climate commitments, industrial policies, and infrastructure pipelines with credible, data-driven intelligence will set the rules of the game for everyone. Those that weaponize uncertainty, or treat sustainable infrastructure as an afterthought, will find their influence eroding.

AI should not be seen as a centralized oracle or as an abstract mind in the cloud. Its real uses lie in targeted applications to connect real-world projects, institutional workflows, and human networks. That is the kind of intelligence that will build not just better roads and resilient grids, but also more effective and efficient systems and organizations.

## Strengthening India-Germany, EU ties

**GERMAN CHANCELLOR FRIEDRICH MERZ SUGGESTED THAT INDIA AND THE EUROPEAN UNION COULD BE CONCLUDING THE FTA BY THE END OF JANUARY**

**G**erman Chancellor Friedrich Merz's two-day visit to India marked a significant milestone in the bilateral relations. Accompanied by 23 CEOs of German companies from various sectors, Merz landed in Ahmedabad on 12 January. Having spent a full day in multiple events, in the company of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Chancellor flew to Bengaluru. The intent and composition of the delegation was reflected in the signing of MoUs and Joint Declaration of Intents which aimed at strengthening economic, technological and security cooperation between the two countries.

For Chancellor Merz, it was his first trip to India and Asia as the Head of the German Government. Merz chose India for his first Asian trip as Chancellor, indicating a shift in strategy among European leaders, who previously focused on China. New Delhi is also preparing to receive the EU leaders as the guests in the ensuing Republic Day parade. Soon after, the French President Emmanuel Macron is visiting India.

The New Year seems to be starting with bonhomie between India and the European leadership. German Chancellor suggested that India and the EU could be concluding the FTA by the end of January. Germany being the largest economy in the Union, Merz's voice carries considerable weight. The strategic shift in German foreign and trade policy could be detected in Chancellor's poignant remarks that the world is experiencing "a renaissance of unfortunate protectionism" that harms Germany and India. He did not name any country, but the reference was obvious.

While the United States has imposed heavy tariff on trading partners, China introduced export controls on minerals used in auto manufacturing causing months of supply chain disruption last year. This has badly affected German car makers. Germany has signalled diversification of its trade and search for alternatives to Chinese exports and market. More than once, the German leadership have revealed their preference for India as a dem-

tional trade ties with Europe, Germany and European Union are looking for new partners.

While China remained for a long time the strongest trade partner of Germany and the EU, this may no longer be the case for at least two reasons, one, the growing trade and strategic rivalry between the US and China, and the 'systemic threat' posed by Beijing.

Germany and the EU will have no other option than giving up their China obsession while correspondingly reducing their trade with the country. In that scenario, India emerges as the strongest candidate for an alternative to China.

In India-EU exchanges in the past, China was the elephant in the room, but now it is Russia, and US as well. So, the eyes of the world powers will be focused on the India-EU Summit later this month. New Delhi is certainly bracing up for it and should not let this opportunity slip out of hand.

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### Non-transferable Nobel

Additionally, many world leaders have remained silent on the issue, reportedly wary of antagonising Trump due to his aggressive use of tariffs as a pressure tool, which has already caused economic harm to several nations, even as watchdog groups warn that such theatrics could permanently dilute the Nobel's moral authority.






b. The land identified for raising Compensatory Afforestation shall be notified by the State Government as RF under Section-4 or PF under Section-29 of the Indian Forest Act, 1927 or under the relevant Section (s) of the local Forest Act, as the case may be, before the Stage-II approval;

c. The cost of survey, demarcation and erection of permanent pillars, if required on the identified CA land, shall be deposited in advance with the Forest Department by the user agency. The CA will be maintained for 10 years. The scheme may include afforestation of indigenous species with appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works scheduled for subsequent years;

d. The compensatory afforestation over non-forest land, equal in extent to the forest land being diverted i.e. 66.242 ha, shall be raised by the State Forest Department at the project cost within three years from the date of grant of Stage - II approval;

e. Afforestation on degraded forest land to be selected elsewhere, measuring one and a half times the area under safety zone, shall also be done at the project cost under the supervisions of the State Forest Department and afforestation will be done within three years from the date of Stage-II clearance and maintained thereafter in accordance with the approved Plan in consultation with the State Forest Department;

f. User agency either himself or through the State Forest Department shall undertake gap planting and soil & moisture conservation activities to restock and rejuvenate the degraded open forests (having crown density less than 0.40), if any, located in the area within 100 meter from outer perimeter of the mining lease. The plan for plantation and SMC activities will be prepared and submitted to MoEF &CC before Stage-II Clearance;

g. 25% of the CA cost additionally will be spent towards soil and moisture conservation activities in the proposed CA area as per site requirement and deposited in CAF;

### 3. NPV:

a. The User Agency shall transfer the funds towards the cost of Net Present Value (NPV) of the forest land being diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 28.03.2008, 24.04.2008 and 09.05.2008 in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 202/1995 and the guidelines issued by this Ministry vide its letter No. 5-3/2007-FC dated 06.01.2022 read with 22.03.2022 through online portal of CAMPA account of the State Concerned;

b. At the time of payment of the Net Present Value (NPV) at the present rate, the user agency shall furnish an undertaking to pay the additional amount of NPV, if so determined, as per the final decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India;

4. The CA area has been provided over 64.152 ha NFL; therefore, the State Govt. shall ensure that the equivalent non-forest land to the extent of the forest land being diverted will be provided. Details of the NFL along with the KML will be provided a the time of the submission of the compliance of the Stage-I.

5. Transportation of ore shall be as per the recommendation in the report submitted by CSIR-NEERI;

6. A holistic transportation plan shall be prepared by the State Govt. aiming to have minimum impact in the landscape. The same shall be implemented. Transportation of ore should be as far as possible through common conveyor belt, slurry pipeline, railways, etc. Transportation of ore through road should be minimized in a time bound manner;

7. An Oversight Committee shall be constituted under the Chairmanship of the DDGF (Central) RO Bhubaneswar for 10 years who will monitor and review the compliance of the conditions stipulated in the approval for these five mines [namely- 1. Netrabandha Pahar iron Ore Block (area 112.621 ha, 2. Netrabandha Pahar (West) area 66.242 ha), 3. Lascera Pacheri Manganese & Iron Ore Block (area 94.351 ha), 4. Kalmang West (Northern Part) Block for Iron Mines Iron Ore Block (Area 42.608 ha) and 5. Guli Opencast Iron Ore Mines (area 194.683 ha)] twice a year and submit their yearly report to this Ministry in the month of December. This Oversight Committee shall consist following members and logistics of this Committee shall be borne by State Government at the cost of UAs:

a. DDGF (Central) - Regional Office Bhubaneswar- Chairman.

b. One Representative from IIM Bhopal.

c. One Representative from WI Dehradun.

d. One Representative from ICFRE.

e. One Representative from NEERI.

f. One expert in Geology.

g. Two other experts nominated by MoEF&CC.

The recommendation made by the said committee shall be considered by the Ministry and if agreed the same shall be binding on the UAs;

8. Integrated Regional Wildlife Conservation Plan shall be prepared for 10 years covering the forest Division of Sundargarh, Jharsuguda and Keonjhar Districts at the cost of UA. The works shall be executed as per APO and the regional plan shall have site/species specific wildlife sub/plans/prescriptions;

9. A Bio-diversity Conservation Plan for this entire landscape shall also be prepared by the State Govt at the cost of UA;

10. Soil and moisture conservation measures shall be undertaken in and around 10 KM radius of the mining lease areas at project cost;

11. The conditions stipulated in EC should be strictly implemented and monitored;

12. Compensatory levies to be realized from the User Agency under the project shall be transferred/deposited, through e-challan, to the account of CAMPA pertaining to the State concerned through e-portal (<https://parivesh.nic.in/>);

13. The KML files of diverted area, the CA areas, the proposed SMC treatment area and the WLMP area shall be uploaded on the e-Green watch portal with all requisite details prior to Stage-II approval;

14. Following activities, as per approved plan / schemes, shall be undertaken in the lease area by the User Agency under the supervision of the State Forest Department. Approved scheme/plan shall be submitted to the Ministry along with compliance of Stage-I approval;

a. Mitigative measures to minimize soil erosion and choking of stream shall be implemented within a period of three years with effect from the issue of Stage-II clearance in accordance with the approved Plan in consultation with the State Forest Department;

b. Planting of adequate drought hardy plant species and sowing of seeds, in the appropriate area within the mining lease to arrest soil erosion in accordance with the approved scheme;

c. Construction of check dams, retention /oe walls to arrest sliding down of the excavated material along the contour in accordance with the approved scheme;

d. Stabilize the overburden dumps by appropriate grading/benching, in accordance with the approved scheme, so as to ensure that angles of repose at any given place is less than 28o; and

15. Safety Zone Management: Following activities, at project cost, shall be undertaken by the user agency for the management of safety zone as per relevant guidelines issued by the Ministry's guidelines;

a. User agency shall ensure demarcation of safety zone (7.5-meter strip all along the inner boundary of the mining lease area), and its fencing, protection and regeneration by erecting adequate number of 6 feet high RCC boundary pillars inscribed with DGPS coordinates with barbed wire fencing and deploying adequate number of watchers under the supervision of the State Forest Department;

b. Boundary of the safety zone of the mining lease, adjacent to habitation/ roads, should be properly fenced by the user agency;

c. Safety zone shall be maintained as green belt around mining lease and to ensure dense canopy in the area, regeneration shall be taken up in this area by the user agency at project cost under the supervision of the State Forest Department;

d. The State Government and the user agency shall ensure that safety zone is maintained as per the prescribed norms;

16. No damage shall be caused to the top-soil and the user agency will follow the top soil management plan;

17. The User Agency shall prepare a list of existing village tanks and other water bodies with GPS co-ordinates located within 5 km from the mine lease boundary. This list is to be duly verified by the concerned Divisional Forest Officer. The User Agency shall regularly undertake desilting of these village tanks and other water bodies so as to mitigate the impact of silting of such tanks/water bodies. A detailed approved plan for desilting of identified ponds and water bodies to be prepared in consultation with forest department and shall be submitted to MoEF &CC before Stage-II approval;

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to refer to the State Government of Odisha's letter No. FE-DIV-FLD-0028-2023-10F (Cons) 20/2023- 5713/FE&CC dated 28.03.2023, and additional information submitted vide No. 13392/9F(MG)-12/2023 dated 04.07.2023 and 22593/9F(MG)-12/2023 dated 18.11.2023 on the above subject seeking prior approval of the Central Government in accordance with Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. The proposal was considered by the Advisory Committee (AC) in its meeting held on 29.11.2023 and to say that the proposal has been examined by the Advisory Committee constituted by the Central Government under Section - 3 of the aforesaid Act.

2. After careful examination of the proposal of the State Government and on the basis of the recommendations of the Advisory Committee, and approval of the same by the competent authority of the MoEF&CC, New Delhi, the Central Government hereby accords 'in-principle' approval under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 in favour of M/s Raga Tradecon Pvt. Ltd. for non-forestry use of 66.242 (including 2.09 ha. safety zone) of forest land for Mining of iron ore within Netrabandha Pahar (West) Iron Ore Block in villages Baldihi and Sanua under Bonai Forest Division of Sundargarh District of Odisha.

3. The User Agency shall undertake that user agency and the State Forest Department shall create and maintain from funds to be provided by the user agency alternate habitat/ home for the avifauna, whose nesting trees are to be cleared in this project as per the plan duly approved by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) and the Chief Wildlife Warden Odisha. Bird nests artificially made out of eco-friendly materials shall be used in the area, including forest area and human settlements, adjoining the forest area being diverted for the project;

4. The User Agency shall undertake that the project authority needs to take up works for construction and cleaning of garland drains, stabilizing retaining walls, proper terracing of OB dumps and checking gully formation resulting in soil erosion;

5. The User Agency shall undertake that plants which are having lowest translocation factor can be preferred under afforestation on the OB dumps and fruit trees to be avoided in planting during biological stabilization of OB dumps;

6. The User Agency shall undertake that prevention of fall of wild animals into mining pit by fencing the open pit area;

7. The User Agency shall undertake that the angle of repose in OB dumps to be maintained to ensure stability and safety;

8. The User Agency shall undertake that vetter grass can be planted at the lower reaches of the dump to bind the soil and prevent soil erosion giving better stability to the dump;

9. The User Agency shall undertake mining in a phased manner after taking due care for reclamation of the mined over area. The concurrent reclamation plan as per the approved mining plan shall be executed by the User Agency from the very first year, and an annual report on implementation thereof shall be submitted to the Nodal Officer, Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, in the concerned State Government and the concerned Regional Office of the Ministry. If it is found from the annual report that the activities indicated in the concurrent reclamation plan are not being executed by the User Agency, the Nodal Officer or the concerned Addl. Principle Chief Conservator of Forests (Central) may direct that the mining activities shall remain suspended till such time, such reclamation activities area satisfactorily executed;

10. The User Agency shall comply with the Hon'ble Supreme Court order on re-grassing, and re-grass the mining area and any other areas which may have been disturbed due to mining to restore them to a condition which is fit for growth of fodder, flora, fauna, etc. in a timely manner;

11. Period of diversion of the said forest land under this approval shall be for a period co-terminus with the period of the mining lease proposed to be granted under the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, as amended and the Rules framed there-under;

12. The User Agency shall obtain the Environment Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if required;

13. No labour camp shall be established on the forest land and the User Agency shall provide fuels preferably alternate fuels to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas;

14. The boundary of the diverted forest land, mining lease and safety zone, as applicable, shall be demarcated on ground at the project cost, by erecting four feet high reinforced cement concrete pillars, each inscribed with its serial number, distance from pillar to pillar and GPS coordinates;

15. The layout plan of the mining plan/ proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government;

16. No damage to the flora and fauna of the adjoining area shall be caused;

17. Any other condition that the concerned Regional Office of this Ministry may stipulate with the approval of competent authority in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife; and

18. The user agency shall comply with all the provisions of the all Acts, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Hon'ble Court Order (s) and NGT Order (s) pertaining to this project, if any, for the time being in force, as applicable to the project.

19. Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 and action would be taken as prescribed in para 1.21 of Chapter 1 of the Handbook of comprehensive guidelines of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 as issued by this Ministry's letter No. 5-2017-FC dated 28.03.2019.

20. The User Agency shall submit the annual self -compliance report in respect of the above stated conditions to the State Government, concerned Regional Office and to this Ministry by the end of March every regularly;

21. Following receipt of the compliance report on fulfilment of the conditions mentioned above, the proposal shall be considered for final approval under Section-2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980. Transfer of forest land shall not be affected till final approval is granted by the Central Government in this regard.

18. The cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department;

19. Trees should be felled in phased manner as per the requirement in the approved Mining Plan with prior permission of concerned DFO;

20. The User Agency shall undertake that afforestation of the non-mineralized virgin forest land within the mining area shall be taken up at project cost;

21. The user agency shall explore the possibility of translocation of maximum number of trees identified to be felled and shall ensure that any tree felling shall be done only when it is unavoidable and that too under strict supervision of the State Forest Department.

22. A site-specific Wildlife Management Plan shall be prepared by the State Government in consultation with the PCCF (Wildlife) for the protection and conservation of wildlife of the area. A copy of approved Plan shall be submitted to the Ministry along with the compliance of Stage-I approval.

23. The State Government shall complete settlement of rights, in term of the Scheduled Tribes and Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006, if any, on the forest land to be diverted and submit the documentary evidence, along with compliance of Stage-I approval, as prescribed by this Ministry's letter No. 11-9/1998-FC (Pt.) dated 03.08.2009 revised with 05.07.2013, shall support that user agency would follow the recommendation in the report submitted by CSIR-NEERI;

24. The State Government shall ensure that the implementation of approved holistic transportation plan. Transportation of ore should be as far as possible through common conveyor belt, slurry pipeline, railways, etc. Transportation of ore through road should be minimized in a time bound manner;

## ED attaches Al Falah assets, chargesheets chairman Siddique

**New Delhi, Jan 16:** The Enforcement Directorate (ED) Friday said it has attached the land and building of Haryana-based Al Falah University, worth about Rs 140 crore, that came under the radar of the security agencies following the November 10 Red Fort area blast, and filed a charge sheet against Al Falah Group chairman Jawad Ahmed Siddiqui and his charitable trust.

The 54-acres land of the university based in Dhauj area of Faridabad, its buildings including those belonging to various schools and departments apart from student hostels have been attached as part of a provisional order issued under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), they said.

The value of these properties is Rs 139.97 crore, it said in a statement. PTI had first reported early this week that the ED may attach these properties, owned by the Al Falah Trust, categorising them as "proceeds of crime".

The ED said a charge sheet has also been filed against Siddiqui and the Al Falah Charitable Trust before a special PMLA court located in Delhi.

The two entities have been arraigned as accused and the ED has sought their prosecution under the anti-money laundering law, officials said.

Siddiqui was arrested by the ED in November on money laundering charges linked to cheating with students of the educational institutions run by

his trust (Al Falah Charitable). It was claimed by the agency that the educational institutes did not have the required valid accreditation for teaching

his trust (Al Falah Charitable).

The trust, according to the ED, routed more than Rs 110 crore to family-controlled firms of Siddiqui. He is currently lodged in jail under judicial custody. "Active role of Jawad Ahmad Siddiqui has been found during investigation.

"He exercised dominant control over Al-Falah Charitable Trust, Al-Falah University (including Al-Falah School of Medical Sciences and Research Centre) and related entities, and is found to be a key beneficiary of the unlawful proceeds," the agency said.

An attachment is done under the PMLA to ensure that the proceeds of crime are not dissipated, sold off or transacted.

Officials had said that a government-appointed receiver can be reinstated or vested with the administration of the University campus after the provisional attachment attains finality. This way, the education of the students will not suffer even as the criminal action and prosecution may continue, the officials had said.

A bench of Justices Dipankar Datta and SC Sharma, which had reserved its decision January 8 on Varma's plea, pronounced the verdict.

## SC rejects Justice Varma's plea


**New Delhi, Jan 16:** The Supreme Court Friday dismissed a plea by Allahabad High Court judge Yashwant Varma challenging the Lok Sabha Speaker's decision to admit a motion seeking his removal and legality of the parliamentary panel probing corruption charges against him.

A bench of Justices Dipankar Datta and SC Sharma, which had reserved its decision January 8 on Varma's plea, pronounced the verdict.

Shah had no power to reject a motion and, under the Judges (Inquiry) Act of 1968, only the Speaker and the chairman have the power to accept or reject a motion against a judge.

Justice Varma was repatriated from the Delhi High Court to the Allahabad High Court after burnt wads of currency notes were found at his official residence in New Delhi March 14.

The top court had earlier orally observed that there was no bar under the Judges Inquiry Act on Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla setting up an inquiry committee to probe corruption

charges against Varma after a similar motion was rejected in the Rajya Sabha. The then chief justice of India Sanjiv Khanna had initiated an in-house inquiry and constituted a three-member committee comprising Punjab and Haryana High Court Chief Justice Sheel Nagu, Himachal Pradesh High Court Chief Justice G S Sandhawalia and Karnataka High Court Justice Anu Sivaraman.

After Justice Varma declined to resign, the then CJL forwarded the report and the judge's response to the President and the prime minister, setting the stage for impeachment proceedings.

Subsequently, Birla admitted a multi-party motion for Justice Varma's removal August 12 and constituted a three-member inquiry committee comprising Supreme Court judge Justice Aravind Kumar, Madras High Court Chief Justice Manindra Mohan Shrivastava, and senior advocate B V Acharya.

"Keeping in view the prevailing trend of air quality, AQI forecasts and to prevent further deterioration, the CAQM sub-committee on GRAP (Graded Response Action Plan) today took the call to invoke all actions as envisaged under Stage-III of extant GRAP with immediate effect in the entire NCR as a proactive measure," the official said.

Unfavourable meteorological conditions, along with vehicular emissions, stubble burning, firecrackers and other local pollution sources often push the air quality in Delhi-NCR to hazardous levels during the winter season.

## MEA: India remains engaged with the US

**New Delhi, Jan 16:** India is mulling various options on its engagement in the development of the strategically-located Chabahar port in Iran against the backdrop of the Trump administration threatening a 25 per cent additional tariff on countries doing business with Tehran.

India is a major partner in development of the Chabahar port, located in the Sistan-Balochistan province Iran's southern coast. In September last year, the US imposed crippling economic sanctions on Iran but had granted India a six-month exemption from the punitive measures on the Chabahar port project. The waiver will come to an end April 26.

External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal on Friday said New India is en-

gaged with the US on the issue. His remarks in answering a question came amid reports that New Delhi is looking at withdrawing from it in view of fresh American tariffs on nations having trade relations with Iran.

"As you are aware, on October 28, the US Department of Treasury had issued a letter outlining the guidance on the conditional sanctions waiver

valid till April 26, 2026. We remain engaged with the US side in working out this arrangement," Jaiswal said.

Jaiswal also mentioned India's long-standing relations with Iran and said New Delhi is closely following the evolving situation in the country. Iran has been witnessing massive anti-government protests in which over 2,500 people were killed.

Tensions flared as sections of the mob vandalised a traffic kiosk and damaged a police vehicle during clashes with the police. Brickbattling left at least 12 people injured, several of them media personnel.

**Haridwar, Jan 16:** Amid demands to declare the Haridwar Kumbh area in Uttarakhand a Hindu zone and restrict entry

to non-Hindus at all religious places and Ganga ghats within it, signs reading 'Non-Hindu prohibited area' were put up at Har Ki Pauri Friday.

The Ganga Sabha, the organisation that manages and maintains Har Ki Pauri and the surrounding ghats, has put up these signs on all entry points to the area, including on bridge railings and pillars.

However, the main bathing ghat of Har Ki Pauri and the surrounding area are already restricted for non-Hindus according to the Haridwar Municipal Act of 1916.

These signs were put up after a video went viral three days ago showing two young men

wearing Kandura (traditional Arab attire) roaming in the Har Ki Pauri area. However, it was

later revealed that these two young men were Hindus and had come to make a video for

their YouTube channel.

The Sabha has demanded that

all religious places, temples, and Ganga ghats in the entire Haridwar Kumbh area be restricted for non-Hindus before the 'Ardh Kumbh' next year, a demand that the Uttarakhand government is also seriously considering.

Following the Kandura incident, the Sabha had also appealed to officials of government departments, other organisations, and media houses not to appoint their non-Hindu employees in this area. They stated that this was necessary to maintain the sanctity and purity of the area.

Regarding the installation



of the new signs, Ganga Sabha president Nitin Gautam told PTI, "According to the Haridwar Municipal Bylaws of 1916, the entry of non-Hindus into the Har Ki Pauri area is completely prohibited. This sign has been put up to inform everyone about this bylaw."

He said that this step has been taken to publicly share information about the law and traditions, so that the sanctity of the pilgrimage site is maintained and no confusion or controversy arises. Haridwar Municipal Commissioner Nandan Kumar also stated that the 1916 bylaws prohibit the entry of non-Hindus into the Har Ki Pauri area.





### SC stays HC verdict disqualifying Mukul Roy

**New Delhi:** In a major reprieve to veteran politician Mukul Roy, the Supreme Court stayed the Calcutta High Court verdict disqualifying him as an MLA of the West Bengal assembly after he defected to the ruling TMC, after having been elected on a BJP ticket in the 2021 elections. On Friday, a bench of Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justice Joymalya Bagchi passed the interim order while issuing notice on a petition filed by Roy's son Subhranshu Roy, challenging the high court's decision.

# Fragmented Oppn hands BJP its first shot at BMC

**Mumbai, Jan 16:** Multi-cornered contests, deep divisions within the Opposition MVA, reflected in the Congress and Shiv Sena (UBT) fighting separately and lack of a robust plan among its rivals helped the BJP in Mumbai polls as it looks poised to rule India's richest civic body for the first time.

The Bharatiya Janata Party Friday won the municipal corporations of Navi Mumbai and Jalgaon while the Congress emerged as the single largest party in Bhiwandi and Kolhapur as the results of 11 of the 29 civic bodies were declared.

As per trends telecast by TV news channels Friday evening for 210 of the total 227 seats in the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), the BJP was leading in 90 seats followed by Shiv Sena (28), Shiv Sena-UBT (57), MNS (9), Congress (15), NCP (3) and others 8.

The BJP contested the January 15 polls in an alliance with the Shiv Sena led by Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, while Shiv Sena (UBT) and Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS), headed by Uddhav and Raj Thackeray, respectively, had a pre-poll pact.

The Congress, part of the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) along with Shiv Sena (UBT) and NCP (SP) at the state level, tied with the Prakash Ambedkar-led Vanchit Bahujan Aghadi (VBA) and Rashtriya Samaj Paksh (RSP).

The overwhelming performance of the Shiv Sena (UBT) and Congress has dealt a severe blow to the MVA, exposing deep organizational weaknesses and raising questions about the Opposition bloc's ability to challenge the BJP-led ruling

## Lankesh murder accused wins

**Jalna:** Shrikant Pangarkar, an accused in the 2017 killing of journalist-activist Gauri Lankesh, Friday won as a corporator from the Jalna Municipal Corporation in Maharashtra. Pangarkar had contested as an Independent candidate from electoral ward No. 13. He defeated his nearest rival, Raosaheb Dhole of the BJP. Pangarkar secured 2,661 votes, while Dhole polled 2,477 votes, a poll official said. Gauri Lankesh was shot dead outside her residence in Bengaluru on September 5, 2017. The killing had triggered widespread outrage.

The split in the original Shiv Sena and the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), coupled with the Congress's decision to contest independently, effectively diluted anti-BJP vote share across nearly 200 wards.

The poor showing of the Congress and Shiv Sena (UBT) in Mumbai, once considered their stronghold, marks a significant political setback for both par-

ties. For Uddhav Thackeray's Shiv Sena (UBT), the outcome represents nothing short of a political disaster. The loss of Mumbai, the city that was the launchpad of the original Shiv Sena movement and remained under the party's control for over two decades, symbolizes the dramatic decline in the outfit since the 2022 split.

**EC 'gaslighting' citizens: Rahul**

**New Delhi:** Amid the row over the quality of 'indelible' ink used in marker pens in Maharashtra civic polls, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi Friday asserted that "vote chori is an anti-national act" and accused the Election Commission of gaslighting citizens. Gandhi shared on X a media report on the row which stated that "opposition, voters cry foul over fading ink markers". "Electoral commission gaslighting citizens is how trust has collapsed in our democracy. Vote Chori is an anti-national act," Gandhi said in his post on X.

## Iran protests ease after deadly crackdown

**Dubai, Jan 16:** Iran's deadly crackdown appears to have broadly quelled protests for now, according to a rights group and residents, as state media reported more arrests Friday in the shadow of repeated US threats to intervene if the killing continues.

Fears of a US attack have retreated since Wednesday, when President Donald Trump said he'd been told killings in Iran were easing.

US allies, including Saudi Arabia and Qatar, conducted intense diplomacy with Washington this week to prevent a US strike, warning of repercussions for the wider region that would ultimately impact the United States, a Gulf official said.

The White House said Thursday that Trump and his team have warned Tehran there would be "grave consequences" if there was further bloodshed.

Trump understands that 800 scheduled executions were halted, White House spokesperson Karoline Leavitt added, saying the president was keeping "all of his options on the table".

More accounts of the violence have been spreading after a communications blackout

was lifted earlier this week.

One woman in Tehran told Reuters by phone that her daughter was killed Friday after joining a demonstration near their home. "She was 15 years old. She was not a terrorist, not a rioter. Basij forces followed her as she was trying to return home," she said, referring to a branch of the security forces often used to quell unrest.

The protests erupted December 28 over soaring inflation in Iran, where the economy has been crippled by sanctions, before spiralling into one of the biggest challenges yet to the clerical establishment that has run Iran since the 1979 Islamic Revolution.

David Barnea, the director of Israel's Mossad intelligence agency, was in the US Friday for talks on Iran, according to a source familiar with the matter who said that the Israeli spy chief was expected to meet White House envoy Steve Witkoff.

The United States is expected to send additional offensive and defensive capabilities to the region, but the exact make-up of

those forces and the timing of their arrival was still unclear, a US official said speaking on condition of anonymity.

**PUTIN CALLS NETANYAHU, PEZESHKIAN**

Russian President Vladimir Putin discussed the situation in Iran in separate calls Friday with Netanyahu and Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian, and said that Moscow was willing to mediate in the region, the Kremlin said.


Pezeshkian told Putin that the United States and Israel had played a direct role in the unrest, Iranian state media reported.

Iranian authorities have accused foreign enemies of fomenting protests and arming people they have identified as terrorists for targeting security forces and carrying out attacks.

HRANA has reported that more than 19,000 people have been arrested, but the state-affiliated Tasnim news outlet said 3,000 people had been detained.

Tasnim also reported what it described as the arrest of a large number of leaders of recent riots in the western province of Kermanshah, and the arrest of five people accused of vandalising a gas station and a base belonging to the Basij in the southeastern city of Kerman.

That compares with the 100% tariff on Chinese electric vehicles imposed by the government of former Prime Minister Justin Trudeau in 2024, following similar US penalties. In

### New Labour Codes drag Wipro's profit

New Delhi: IT services major Wipro Friday reported a 7 per cent decline in consolidated net profit to ₹3,119 crore in the third quarter of FY26, weighed by a one-time provisional impact of ₹302.8 crore due to the implementation of new Labour Codes. The Bangalore-headquartered company had posted a net profit of ₹3,353.8 crore in the year-ago period. On a quarter-on-quarter basis, Wipro's profit fell 3.9 per cent while revenue rose 3.7 per cent.

### Retail weakness weighs on Reliance

Mumbai: Reliance Industries Ltd Friday reported almost a flat net profit of ₹18,645 crore for the third quarter, as weakness in its retail business offset gains in other segments. The country's largest conglomerate saw muted earnings growth in the retail business on GST rate rationalisation, even as its energy and digital businesses provided support. Its net profit of ₹18,645 crore in October-December - the third quarter of the current 2025-26 fiscal year - compared to ₹18,540 crore a year back.

### Central Bank zooms as bad loans drop

New Delhi: State-owned Central Bank of India has posted a 32 per cent jump in profit at ₹1,263 crore in the third quarter ended December 2025, aided by improvement in bad loans. The Mumbai-based bank had earned a net profit of ₹959 crore in the same quarter a year ago. Total income increased to ₹10,969 crore during the quarter under review against ₹9,739 crore in the same period of last year, Central Bank of India said.

### Tech Mahindra profit up 14% to ₹1,122cr

Mumbai: IT services company Tech Mahindra Friday reported a 14.11 per cent jump in profit to ₹1,122 crore in the December quarter. The Mahindra group company had reported a net profit of ₹983.2 crore in the year-ago period, and ₹1,194 crore in the preceding September quarter.

# Silver defies gravity

Amid geopolitical tensions, silver remains resilient on the back of persistent industrial offtake, shrugging off weak global trends

New Delhi, Jan 16: Silver price extended its record-setting rally for the sixth straight day by rising ₹3,600 to ₹2,92,600 per kg in the national capital Friday amid sustained buying by stockists, according to the All India Saraf Association.

However, gold of 99.9 per cent purity retreated from its all-time high level and declined by ₹1,100 to ₹1,46,200 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes) from ₹1,47,300 per 10 grams in the previous session.

Silver had closed at ₹2,89,000 per kilogram Thursday.

Silver continues to outpace gold for the second consecutive year, delivering 22.4 per cent returns.

Meanwhile, spot gold and silver extended their decline for the second straight day in the international markets, with prices dipping amid a stronger US dollar and fading geopolitical risk premium after reduced tensions in the Middle East.

Spot gold fell by \$12.46, or 0.27 per cent, to \$4,603.51 per ounce.

## Forex kitty surges to \$687.19 billion

Mumbai, Jan 16: India's forex reserves increased by \$392 million to \$687.19 billion during the week ended January 9, the Reserve Bank of India said Friday.

In the previous reporting week, the overall kitty had dropped by \$9.809 billion to \$686.80 billion.

For the week ended January 9, foreign currency assets, a major component of reserves, decreased by \$1,124 billion to 4550.866 billion, the central bank's data showed.

Value of the gold reserves jumped by \$1,568 billion to \$112.83 billion during the week, the RBI said.

The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were down by \$39 million to \$18.739 billion, the apex bank said.

India's reserve position with the IMF was down by \$13 million to \$4,758 billion in the reporting week, according to the apex bank's data.



Mumbai, Jan 16: EPFO subscribers will be able to withdraw their employees' provident fund (EPF) directly to their bank accounts through UPI payment gateway by April this year, a top source has said.

The labour ministry is working on a project where a certain proportion of the EPF will be frozen, and a large chunk will be available for withdrawal through their bank account using Unified Payment Interface (UPI), the source told PTI.

He explained that the subscribers will be able to see the eligible EPF balance available for transferring into their seed bank accounts.

They will be allowed to use their linked UPI pin for completing the transaction to ensure a secure transfer of money into their bank accounts.

Once the money is transferred into bank accounts, the members can use the money the way they want, like making payments electronically or withdrawing through bank ATMs using debit cards.

The source stated that the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) is trying to resolve software glitches for the smooth implementation of this system, which will benefit around eight crore members.

Presently, the members of EPFO have to apply for withdrawal claims to access their EPF money, which is time-consuming.

Under the auto-settlement mode, the withdrawal claims are settled electronically without manual intervention within three days of filing the application form.

However, a depreciating rupee, spike in international crude prices and unrelenting foreign fund outflows capped the gains, traders said.

In a choppy session, the 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 187.64 points, or 0.23 per cent, to settle at 83,570.35. During the day, it jumped 752.26 points, or 0.90 per cent, to 84,134.97.

The 50-share NSE Nifty rose 28.75 points, or 0.11 per cent, to 25,694.35. In a holiday-shortened week, the BSE benchmark dipped 5.89 points, and the Nifty went up by 11.05 points.

Market sentiment was supported by earnings-related optimism, though mixed global cues continued to cap aggressive positioning. The earnings upgrade from Infosys helped improve risk appetite and brought some stability after recent uncertainty. At the same time, concerns around a weaker rupee and ongoing global trade-related issues remained on participants' radar. Overall participation stayed selective and stock-specific, reflecting continued caution amid geopolitical and macroeconomic uncertainties," Ajit Mishra - SVP, Research, Religare Broking Ltd, said.

From the 30-Sensex firms, Infosys jumped 5.67 per cent after the Bengaluru-headquartered firm saw its revenue from operations grow by 8.9 per cent to ₹45,479 crore in the third quarter of the current fiscal from ₹41,764 crore in the year-ago period. It has raised

its revenue growth guidance for FY26 to 3.3 per cent in constant currency from 2-3 per cent earlier. Tech Mahindra, HCL Tech, State Bank of India, UltraTech Cement and HDFC Bank were also among the gainers.

In contrast, Eternal, Asian Paints, Bharat Electronics, Sun Pharma and Maruti were among the laggards.

On the geopolitical front, tensions between the US and Iran eased slightly after reports that the US informed Tehran it would not imminently attack, following diplomatic pressure.

February 1 Budget turns Sunday into trading day

Leading stock bourses NSE and BSE Friday said they will conduct live trading Sunday, February 1, when Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will present the Union Budget. In a circular issued to investors, the NSE said it will be conducting a live trading session February 1 as per the standard timings "on account of the presentation of the Union Budget". As per the NSE circular, the pre-open market will start at 9 am and end at 9.08 am, and the normal market will function between 9.15 am and 3.30 pm. Its rival BSE also put up a similar circular for investors. February 1 is declared as a "special trading day by the exchange", the BSE notice said, adding that markets shall remain open for regular trading hours.

## E-commerce giants fined over illegal walkie-talkie sales

New Delhi, Jan 16: The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has initiated suo motu action against e-commerce platforms for listing and selling unauthorised walkie-talkies in violation of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 and telecom laws, issuing final orders against eight entities and imposing penalties totalling ₹44 lakh.

The CCPA found that platforms were facilitating the sale of Personal Mobile Radios (PMRs) operating outside the license-exempt frequency band, without Equipment Type Approval (ETA) certification or proper disclosure of licensing

requirements. The authority imposed penalties of ₹10 lakh each on Meesho, Meta Platforms Inc. (Facebook Marketplace), Flipkart, and Amazon, and ₹1 lakh each on Chimiya, JioMart, Talk Pro, and MaskMan Toys for violations of consumer rights, misleading advertisements, and unfair trade practices. Consumer Affairs Secretary Nidhi Khare told PTI.

Meesho, Meta, Chimiya, JioMart, and Talk Pro have

paid their penalties. Payment from the remaining platforms is awaited, she added.
