Nitin Nabin elected BJP prez unopposed

NEW DELHI: Forty-five-year-old Nitin Nabin was Monday elected unopposed as the BJP national president, the youngest ever to occupy the post as it seeks to further expand its influence in uncharted territories. Nabin, a five-term Bihar MLA, emerged as the sole candidate for the top party post with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other senior BJP leaders filing nomination papers in his support. Nabin will be formally declared as BJP president Tuesday. He will succeed JP Nadda, who has been at the helm for an extended period since 2020. "I hereby announce that only one name, that of Shri Nitin Nabin, has been proposed for the post of national president of Bharatiya Janata Party," K Laxman, the returning officer for the presidential election, said in a statement.

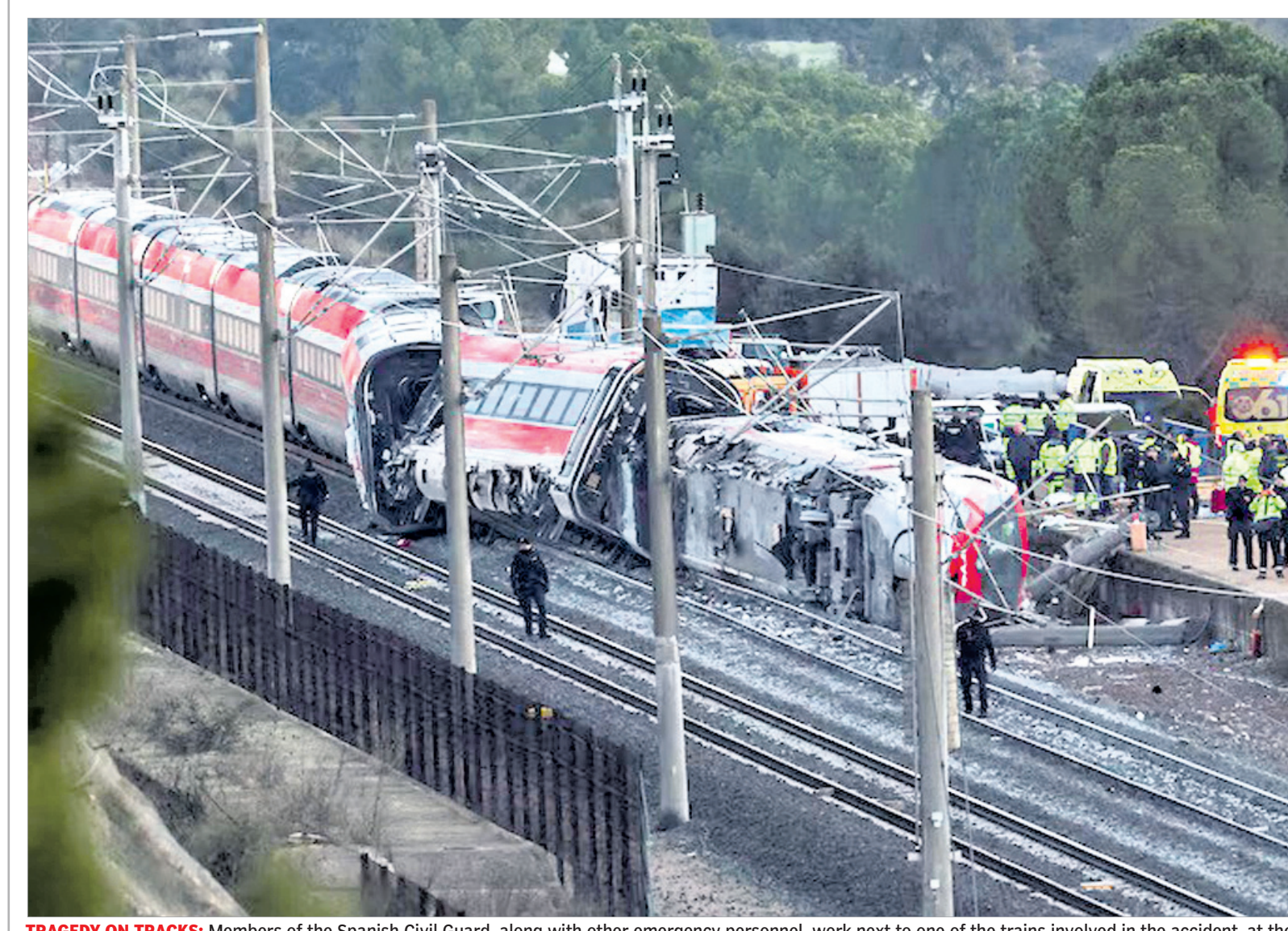
UNNAO: DELHI HC JOLT FOR SENGAR

NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court Monday refused to suspend the 10-year jail term of expelled BJP leader Kuldeep Singh Sengar in the custodial death case of the Unnao rape survivor's father on the grounds of delay in trial, saying it was partly caused by the multiple applications he had filed in the matter. "The application seeking suspension of sentence is dismissed," said Justice Ravinder Dubeja. The judge observed that while Sengar has undergone prolonged incarceration of about seven-and-a-half years, relief could not be granted on the ground of delay alone, as the appellant had repeatedly moved applications for interim suspension, extension of bail and regular suspension of sentence. **P8**

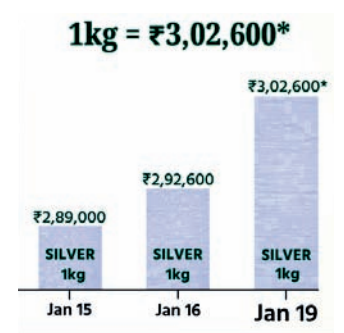

HIGH-SPEED TRAIN COLLISION LEAVES 39 DEAD IN SPAIN

Adamuz (Spain), Jan 19: Spanish police said Monday that at least 39 people are confirmed dead in a high-speed train collision the previous night in the south of the country, as efforts to recover the bodies continue with authorities expecting the death toll to rise. The crash occurred Sunday at 7:45 pm when the tail end of a train carrying some 300 passengers on the route from Malaga to the capital, Madrid, went off the rails at 7:45 pm. It slammed into an incoming train travelling from Madrid to Huelva, another southern Spanish city, according to rail operator Adif. The head of the second train, which was carrying nearly 200 passengers, took the brunt of the impact, Spanish Transport Minister Oscar Puente said. That collision knocked its first two carriages off the track and sent them plummeting down a 4-metre (13-foot) slope. Puente said that it appeared the largest number of the deaths occurred in those carriages. Andalusia regional president Juanma Moreno said Monday morning that emergency services were still searching what he described as a mass of twisted metal where the smashed carriages had derailed. Passengers reported climbing out of smashed windows, with some using emergency hammers to break the windows, according to Salvador Jimenez, a journalist for Spanish broadcaster RTVE, who was on board one of the derailed trains. Spanish police said 159 people were injured, of whom five were in critical condition. A further 24 were in serious condition, authorities said

Silver tops ₹3L/kg

Heightened geopolitical situation and robust industrial demand have propelled silver to an unprecedented ₹3 lakh per kg on MCX, while gold surged ₹1,900 to a record ₹1,48,100 per 10 gm. Investor sentiment turned cautious after US President Donald Trump threatened to impose additional tariffs of up to 25 per cent on European countries over Greenland if no agreement is reached by June. The renewed trade tensions triggered a flight to traditional safe havens such as gold and silver. Besides, a weaker rupee made silver both dearer and safer as ETFs, jewellers and even central banks rushed to hoard the metal

New Delhi, Jan 19: Silver prices surged ₹10,000 Monday to breach the record ₹3 lakh-per-kilogram mark in the national capital, driven by strong demand in domestic and global markets, according to marketmen. The white metal traded at ₹3,02,600 per kilogram Monday against the previous closing level of ₹2,92,600 per kg. Gold prices also witnessed

robust gains in the local bullion market and scaled a fresh record. The yellow metal climbed ₹1,900 to ₹1,48,100 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes). It had finished at ₹1,46,200 per 10 grams Friday. "Gold and silver surged to fresh record highs on Monday, driven by geopolitical tensions, and escalating tariff-related uncertainty after US President Donald Trump threatened to impose additional tariffs on several European countries over the weekend," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst - Commodities at HDFC Securities, said. According to forex.com, spot

silver increased to touch a fresh record of USD 94.13 per ounce, while gold rose to hit an all-time high of USD 4,690.80 per ounce in the international market. "Spot gold hit a fresh record high of USD 4,690 per ounce in the global markets on safe haven demand as Trump announced a 10 per cent tariff on eight EU nations in retaliation for their opposition to his Greenland initiative," Praveen Singh, Head of Commodities, Mirae Asset ShareKhan, said. Meanwhile, Trump Saturday threatened to implement a 10 per cent tariff on goods from European nations, including Denmark, Sweden, France, Germany, the Netherlands, Finland, the UK and Norway, starting from February 1. Tariff will be increased to 25 per cent June 1, 2026. The proposed tariff will be due and payable until a deal is reached for the complete and total purchase of Greenland. President Trump's Greenland-related tariff moves endanger the NATO alliance, a Western security alliance that has been in place since the Second World War, Singh said.

Bank heist: Gold worth ₹7.5cr looted in Barbil



Barbil, Jan 19: Armed miscreants looted gold jewelry worth an estimated ₹7.5 crore and cash of about ₹4.34 lakh from the Bank of Maharashtra's Barbil branch in Keonjhar district Monday afternoon, police said. The robbery took place at the branch located barely 200 meters from the Barbil sub-divisional police officer's (SDPO) office. According to officials, five to six armed men entered the bank, threatened staff and customers at gunpoint, and forced bank officials to open the strong room. The assailants fled with around 5 kilograms of gold jewelry and cash before police could arrive. Keonjhar SP Nitin Kusalkar Dagadu and his team rushed to the spot and launched an investigation. Police sealed the state

Panic over gas pipeline burst

Cuttack, Jan 19: A gas pipeline burst in the CDA area during construction work Monday, causing panic among the people, police said. Emergency teams were rushed to the spot for immediate repairs, a senior officer said. The incident took place at Sector 9 of the CDA area, where many former judges and senior advocates of the Orissa High Court reside. An earthmover struck an underground pipeline of Gas Authority of India Limited (GAIL) during excavation work, causing it to burst. Panic spread among the people as LPG started leaking. Cuttack Additional Commissioner of Police Ananya Awasthi, who has reached the spot, said that the area has been cordoned off as a preventive measure to prevent any untoward incident. Fire services personnel also reached the spot and were coordinating with the gas company's technical team to repair the pipeline.

China's population shrinks to historic low

Beijing, Jan 19: China's population shrank for the fourth consecutive year as birth rates in 2025 fell by about 10 million from a decade earlier, a trend widely blamed on the long-term effects of the former one-child policy. According to the data released by National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) Monday only 7.92 million babies were born in 2025 compared to 9.54 million in 2024, a decline of 17 per cent. This marked the lowest birth figure since records began in 1949 and broke the previous lowest record set in 2023, the year India overtook China as the most populous country, according to a United Nations report. Based on the current fertility rates in China, the United Na-



tions Department of Economic and Social Affairs (DESA) estimated in 2024 that China's population would decline to 633 million by 2100. As per NBS data released on Monday, China's total population fell by 3.39 million in 2025 to 1.4049 billion from 1.4083 billion a year earlier. Also, China is currently grappling with a rapidly ageing population. According to the official data at the end of 2024, the number of people aged 60 and above in China had hit 310 million. By 2035, this demographic is projected to exceed 400 million. By sheer numbers last year marked the steepest annual population decline on record,

apart from during China's devastating famine from 1959 to 1961, the Hong Kong based South China Morning Post reported. Meanwhile, about 11.31 million people died last year- One of the highest totals in five decades. China's serious demographic crisis is blamed on the decades-old one-child policy followed by the ruling Communist Party. Amid warnings that the demographic crisis will seriously impact the economy, China scrapped the one child policy in 2016 and permitted all couples to have two children. As it failed to make an impact, China revised the population policy in 2021, allowing people to have three children in an attempt to address the reluctance of couples to have more

kids due to mounting costs. In the last few years China has implemented policies to boost the birth rates which included the national childcare subsidy scheme offering up to 10,800 RMB (USD 1,534) per year for each child. Beijing also increased the condom tax to encourage couples to have more children. The pace of the decline of population in China is striking, particularly in the absence of major shocks, Su Yue, principal economist for China at the Economist Intelligence Unit. The reluctance among young people to get married, along with rising economic pressures "particularly an increase for women in the perceived cost of stepping away from employment" served as major birth deterrents, she told the Post.

SJTA lodges complaint over Lord Jagannath's AI videos

Puri, Jan 19: The authorities of the Jagannath temple in Puri Monday filed a police complaint against a social media account for circulating AI-generated photos and videos of Lord Jagannath that went viral, triggering widespread outrage among devotees. The Shree Jagannath Temple Administration's (SJTA) complaint was filed at the Singhadwar Police Station against an account named 'vishvrajcreation' for allegedly posting objectionable and fabricated visuals of the deity on social media platforms. "It has come to our notice that some unacceptable AI-generated photos and videos of Lord Jagannath have been posted on social media. These objectionable pictures and videos are being circulated by a person using the handle 'vishvrajcreation'," the SJTA said in a statement. According to the complaint lodged by the temple administration's Special Security Officer, the AI-generated content has hurt the religious sentiments of devotees and sparked resentment. One of the videos shows milk being poured over Lord Jagannath in front of the Puri temple using a crane-an entirely fabricated and unrealistic depiction with no basis in temple tradition, said Jagannath culture researcher Bhaskar Mishra.

Newborn girl found dead at DHH toilet

Bhadrak, Jan 19: The body of a newborn girl child was found in the toilet of the female geriatric ward at the Bhadrak district headquarters hospital (DHH) Monday, triggering shock and concern.

As per hospital sources, the incident came to light after a patient's relative noticed the newborn lying inside the bathroom of the female geriatric ward and alerted hospital staff. The infant was found dead.

Authorities suspect that a woman who had recently given birth abandoned the newborn in the bathroom and fled the hospital. It is believed that the baby may have died shortly after birth, though the exact cause of death is yet to be confirmed.

Neither on-duty health workers and staff nurses, nor security personnel did notice the incident until it was brought to their attention, raising serious questions about hospital supervision.

Hospital authorities said they have launched an internal inquiry to ascertain how the incident occurred and identify the woman involved. Efforts are also underway to determine the circumstances under which the baby was delivered and abandoned.

Police have been informed and further action will be taken after completion of preliminary inquiries and medical examination, officials said.

DFO writes to YouTube for removal of wildlife videos

Keonjhar, Jan 19: The Forest department has initiated action against posting of videos on social media that show harassment, capture or disturbance of wildlife for monetary gain ignoring existing restrictions. Keonjhar Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Dhanraj HD has written to YouTube January 15 seeking the removal of a video which allegedly shows illegal wildlife hunting activity. The move has drawn public attention.

According to officials, a video titled "King Cobra Egg Rescue and Release in Keonjhar" was uploaded August 7, 2019, from a YouTube account named "Mirza Md Arif". The video shows a king cobra laying eggs in a nest made of dry leaves inside a protected forest area under the Ghatgaon range of Keonjhar forest division.

Without informing the Forest department, the individual allegedly destroyed the nest and removed the eggs, only to dump those later in another forest area. Officials said destroying a nest and removing eggs from within a protected forest is illegal.

The king cobra, also known as Ophiophagus hannah, is listed under Schedule I of the Wild-



life (Protection) Act, making any disturbance to the animal, its nest or eggs a punishable offense. Under Section 2(16) of the Act, destroying the nest of any bird or reptile and removing its eggs constitutes hunting.

Citing these provisions, the DFO has issued a notice to YouTube seeking immediate removal of the video. The department has warned that in the next stage it may invoke Section 52 of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, related to abatement, against the platform if necessary, officials said.

The Forest department said it will issue a statutory summons to officials of YouTube, asking them to appear in Keonjhar to record statements in connection with an alleged wildlife law violation.

Officials said a file related to transactions carried out by a social media company on the account of snake handler Mirza was forwarded to the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in 2023 for scrutiny. The Keonjhar DFO is expected to open the file, sources said.

Subhendu Mallik, general secretary of the Snake Helpline, said Section 58(c) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act bars any company from deriving illegal benefit from wildlife offenses. Since platforms such as YouTube are allegedly involved, he said a case should be registered under Section 58 of the Act.

Mallik added that several videos showing snakes being caught with Mirza's assistance are available on social media. He called for the arrest of those who illegally posted such videos along with Mirza, and demanded an ED probe into the financial aspects.

In March 2013, then Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF) and Chief Wildlife Warden Sushant Nanda declared that capturing wildlife for photographs or videos is illegal. Bhadrak-based snake handler Mirza Mohammad Arif was later arrested for violating the order by posting snake-catching videos. Subsequently, Monalisa Bhadra and her husband, Badri Narayan Bhadra, were arrested in Jajpur for videos showing monkeys being captured and fed. Despite those cases, illegal videos and photographs of captured wildlife continue to circulate on social media, allegedly due to lax enforcement.

The Keonjhar DFO's move to initiate action against social media companies has been welcomed by various quarters.

Poppy plants worth ₹1.91 crore destroyed

Baripada: Opium plantation was detected inside Similipal National Park in Mayurbhanj district and poppy plants worth ₹1.91 crore were destroyed, police said Monday. A joint team of police, Excise and Forest departments detected two patches of illegal poppy plantation on a total of 1.09 acres of land under the jurisdiction of Jashipur police station and carried out the drive Sunday. The area had been devoid of human activities and is traversed by tigers and other wild animals, an official statement said. A total of 95,850 opium plants worth ₹1.91 crore were destroyed, it said. The illegal cultivation was carried out deep inside the national park in gross violation of forest and wildlife protection laws, the statement said. Two cases have been registered at Jashipur police station and further investigation is underway to identify those involved and ascertain how such large-scale cultivation was carried out inside the national park, it added.



Nuapada BDO assaulted; 1 held

Nuapada, Jan 19: In a shocking incident, the BDO of Nuapada Sadar block was assaulted by miscreants here, Monday.

Police have arrested a person - Hemnath Banjara, 35, of Mudhela village under Jonk police limits- and detained three others - Manoj Banjara, Prem Shankar Sahu and Johar Satnami - in the matter.

According to police, BDO Rohit Bhoi was allegedly assaulted while leaving his official residence to attend a government programme at Khairani panchayat. The incident followed a dispute over the construction



of a panchayat office building under Bhainshatal panchayat.

Police said the dispute centred on the construction of the panchayat office at Baloda village instead of Bhainshatal, the designated panchayat headquarters.

During discussions Monday, the BDO reportedly informed the group that construction had already been stopped following a court direction. However, the situation escalated and Hemnath allegedly slapped Bhoi and fled.

Following the incident, elected representatives staged a sit-in outside demanding immediate arrests of the accused.

Majhighariani hundis yield ₹1.05cr, 30 gm gold

Rayagada: All the nine hundis (donation boxes) of Maa Majhighariani temple, the presiding deity of this district, were opened Monday and counted in the presence of a magistrate and police officials, temple authorities said. During the counting, cash amounting to ₹1,05,52,845, along with 30 grams of gold and 2,150 grams of silver, was collected from the hundis. In addition, 23 foreign currency notes from five countries were found, including notes and coins from the United States, Sri Lanka and the UAE. Temple officials said the foreign currency was likely donated by devotees residing abroad who visited the temple. The hundis were opened at around 9 a.m., and the counting process continued for nearly eight hours. Bank staff and several volunteers assisted in the exercise, while elaborate security arrangements were made by police and temple security personnel. Earlier, July 7, the temple hundis had yielded ₹1,04,36,963 in cash, along with 83 grams of gold and 2,505 grams of silver, besides foreign currency notes from different countries.

Life term for accused in Subhasmita murder case

Chhatrapur: A local court Monday sentenced a man to life imprisonment for the murder of his girlfriend in the 2021 Subhasmita case. Additional District Judicial Magistrate (ADJM) Pradeep Kumar Samal convicted Krushna Chandra Sahu for burning his girlfriend, Subhasmita Khadanga, alive inside an abandoned house in Pratappur village under the Purushot-tampur police limits in July 2021. According to the prosecution, Sahu and Khadanga were in a romantic relationship for more than six years. Khadanga repeatedly urged Sahu to marry her, but he refused saying his marriage had been fixed elsewhere. Even after learning about his impending marriage, Khadanga continued to insist. Investigators said Sahu, enraged and seeking to end the relationship, planned the murder and called Khadanga to his native village. He allegedly poured spirit on her and set her on fire. Khadanga later gave a dying declaration to the police, naming Sahu as the assailant. Police registered a case (334/2021) and arrested Sahu based on her statement. During the investigation, Sahu denied the allegations and claimed he was not present in the village at the time of the incident. After a thorough investigation and examination of evidence, the court found Sahu guilty and sentenced him to rigorous life imprisonment. The court also imposed a fine of ₹10,000 on the accused.

Man sentenced to life for murder

Angul: Angul District and Sessions Court Monday sentenced Chaturhuj Majhi to life imprisonment after convicting him in a murder case. The incident took place November 4, 2024, at Changudia village under the jurisdiction of Chhendipada PS in Angul district. The accused brutally murdered his relative, Chikun Majhi, following a family dispute. After receiving information about the crime, local police promptly reached the spot, arrested the accused, and produced him before the court. The conviction was based on strong evidence gathered during the investigation and the testimonies of witnesses. Sources at the Odisha Police Headquarters stated that since the implementation of the new criminal laws, investigations and trials have been expedited, resulting in a higher conviction rate across the state.

17 injured as auto falls into ghat in Gajapati

Berhampur: At least 17 people, including eight children and three women, were injured after an auto-rickshaw fell nearly 10 feet down a slope in Gajapati district Monday, police said. The accident occurred near Jarau ghat under the Mohana police station limits, when the vehicle hit a roadside electric pole and overturned before plunging down the slope at the Ganjam-Gajapati district border, they said. All the injured, including the driver, were rescued and admitted to MKCG Medical College and Hospital here. The condition of five of them is stated to be serious, officials said. Police said the auto-rickshaw was travelling from Gobindapur to Badagada carrying 17 passengers at the time of the accident. Personnel from fire services units in Mohana and Badagada rushed to the spot and carried out rescue operations. The damaged vehicle has been seized and an inquiry initiated.

Marginal increase in saltwater croc count

Rajnagar, Jan 19: The population of saltwater or estuarine crocodiles in Odisha's coastal river systems has marginally increased by 32 individuals, with the latest census recording 1,858 of the reptile species, according to the 2026 estimation conducted by the Rajnagar Mangrove Forest (Wildlife) Division.

The annual estimation of saltwater crocodiles (*Crocodylus porosus*) was carried out from January 8 to 10 across river systems in and around Bhitarkanika National Park and Wildlife Sanctuary, Gahirmatha Wildlife Sanctuary, the Mahanadi deltaic region, and the Devi river mouth area.

Forest officials said the increase reflects the success of sustained conservation and protection measures implemented in the region over the years.

A total of 24 census teams were deployed to survey 54 identified river and creek segments. The exercise followed a division-level training programme held January 7 at the Kanika wildlife range to standardise survey methods and data collection.

The census was conducted using a boat-based direct observation total count method, with both day and night surveys. Daytime counts focused on sub-adult and adult crocodiles basking along riverbanks, while nighttime surveys used powerful spotlights to record hatchlings, yearlings and juvenile crocodiles, which are more visible due to eye-shine.

According to the final data, the highest concentration of estuarine crocodiles was recorded in the Kanika wildlife range. This was followed by the Rajnagar, Mahakalapara and Gahirmatha wildlife ranges.

Officials said the distribution pattern remains consistent with previous years, with Bhitarkanika continuing to serve as a stronghold for the species due to its extensive mangrove cover, protected waterways and prey availability.

In addition to the traditional census, the Forest department conducted a pilot drone-based survey in December to evaluate the feasibility of using unmanned aerial vehicles for crocodile monitoring. The initiative aims to supplement conventional counting methods, reduce observer bias and improve long-term population assessments.

Drone and camera-based identification techniques are being explored as part of future monitoring strategies, particularly in difficult-to-access creeks and dense mangrove areas.

Forest officials said the steady rise in crocodile numbers underscores the effectiveness of habitat protection, anti-poaching measures and community awareness programmes in the coastal ecosystem.

Ignoble Nobel

The world has been shocked by the way the medal of this year’s Nobel Peace Prize – one of the most valued and respected prizes on earth - was transferred from its rightful owner to an unauthorized person. The awardee – Opposition leader of Venezuela Maria Corina Machado – and the usurper of the medal – US President Donald Trump - have not covered themselves with glory for their unprecedented action that has virtually devalued the coveted prize itself. The prize has often been a subject of controversy primarily for the political overtone that the choice of the awardees at times get. All the same it never lost its lustre as the winners are mostly hailed as tireless champions of peace. However, Trump relentlessly kept expressing his desire to get the prize ever since he first took office in 2017. In fact, he has been so obsessed with the prize that he did not hide his deep sense of insecurity that President Barack Obama had won it in 2009 soon after occupying the post for, as the Nobel committee put it, his “extraordinary efforts to strengthen international diplomacy and co-operation between peoples.” Trump of course disputed it and recently said Obama “didn’t even know why he got it.” On the contrary, he has been touting that he deserves it fully as he has stopped “eight wars.” Whatever the worth of the claims, his violent action in grabbing and arresting Venezuela’s democratically elected President Nicolas Maduro and his wife from their presidential residence, in what some say an illegal raid, and his constant threat to possess Greenland rather disqualify him from getting the prize.

The show in the Oval Office of Machado transferring the Nobel medal to Trump was the least that was expected of the two political leaders. One can understand Trump’s injured pride for being ignored for the prize, but the motives of Machado appear to be far more abhorrent. She seems to be using the honour as a quid pro quo, a bargaining chip for her political ambition to capture power in her country. Her party overwhelmingly won the 2024 presidential election in Venezuela, yet Trump did not even bother to install her as President in place of Maduro. Instead, he has begun working with his deputy Delcy Rodriguez, the interim President, and the entire political establishment owing allegiance to the former President.

Machado’s gifting plan is, at least for the moment, not paying the calculated dividends. As she and Trump were meeting, the CIA director, John Ratcliffe, was in Caracas meeting with Rodriguez who was part of the forces that barred Machado from running in the election. In other words, Trump has chosen to operate Venezuela through the very people Machado fought. The prize, however, was mainly given to mark the bravery of those who stood up to the forces that Trump finds no difficulty in working with. Rodriguez seems to be too eager to do his bidding and grant US companies access to the world’s largest oil reserve. Such an arrangement helps the US to run Venezuela’s affairs by remote control without turning Trump’s home constituency hostile.

This is not a conjecture. It was made amply clear after Machado handed over the medal to Trump who did not indicate any shift in his posture on Machado leading Venezuela, while the White House said his earlier assessment on Rodriguez had not changed.

Whether pressure was mounted on Machado or whether she offered the medal on her own is still in the realm of speculation. What is not difficult to understand is that both Trump and Machado made a mockery of a coveted prize for personal gains. The question remains whether the US President’s personal whims and caprices should be allowed to influence the country’s foreign policy as the Nobel medal is virtually being used as bait by Machado to fulfil her own personal desire to rule the country sooner or later with Trump’s help. This is bribing.

However, the Director of the Norwegian Nobel Institute Kristian Berg Harpviken has bluntly told the truth that “receiving the symbols of the Peace Prize does not make anyone a Peace Prize laureate.” The shameful incident should make the committee choosing the winner of the prize far more cautious when it selects future awardees. This is the lesson it can learn from the Trump-Machado medal swap deal scandal.

PETROSTATE DILEMMA

US President Donald Trump’s ongoing efforts to control Venezuela’s oil rest on the assumption that the US can successfully “run” a country twice the size of Iraq. Rather than projecting strength abroad, however, this military overreach reveals the growing vulnerability of a president whose once-firm grip on American politics is steadily weakening.

Against this backdrop, the capture of Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro signals the beginning of a shift toward a more militarized global energy market. It also lays bare the consequences of deliberately destabilizing an oil-dependent economy. Far from resolving Venezuela’s ongoing crisis, Trump’s actions threaten to make it far worse. Regime change in Venezuela is unlikely to end with a clear “Mission Accomplished” moment. Iraq alone required at least nine years of sustained US involvement that plunged the country into a civil war, claiming the lives of more than 100,000 Iraqi civilians and costing American taxpayers roughly \$2 trillion – an expense the US can hardly afford today. This conflict would also unfold much closer to home, less than 965 km from Puerto Rico.

Trump’s intervention raises two critical questions: Who will govern Venezuela? And who will benefit, at least in the short to medium term, from its oil wealth? In petrostates, these questions are inseparable, as the survival of their regimes – whether democratic or authoritarian – depends on their ability to capture profits generated by oil exports and distribute them to key constituencies. The current Venezuelan crisis sets several troubling foreign-policy precedents. Most notably, it is the first US military intervention to dispense entirely with humanitarian and security justifications in favor of an explicit resource grab.

It is also the first US military incursion into mainland South America. If past interventions in Central America and the Caribbean are any guide, it will likely result in the emer-

gence of a criminal regime and new waves of mass migration. As with other resource-rich countries like Iraq, Libya, and Afghanistan, vast oil reserves will not protect Venezuela from a similar fate. Maduro’s removal has left Venezuela with no good options. Its divided opposition may seek a power-sharing arrangement or elections, but a civilian government led by the Nobel Peace Prize laureate María Corina Machado is unlikely to survive for long.

That is why the Trump administration may seek regime continuity through a negotiated settlement with the most powerful elements of the Chavismo coalition. Such an arrangement would leave the armed forces, security services, and civilian militias intact. Senior military officers, handsomely rewarded for preserving the status quo, would likely remain deeply embedded in key sectors such as construction, food distribution, and petroleum.

A second, more dangerous scenario is that Maduro’s removal creates a power vacuum, fueling political and military fragmentation and triggering territorial struggles among competing armed groups and criminal organizations. A violent struggle over territory and illicit markets could transform Venezuela from a corruption-plagued but relatively stable country into a fractured battleground resembling contemporary Libya. With its jungles, mountains, dense urban centers, and porous borders,

Venezuela is particularly well suited to guerrilla warfare.

Political fragmentation and prolonged fighting would turn the country into a center of regional instability, perhaps drawing the US into another “forever war” that air and naval forces would be unable to contain. And the allure of gaining control of Venezuela’s oil reserves would probably keep more armed groups in the fight longer. These reserves – larger than Saudi Arabia’s and more than five times those of the US – represent enormous potential, especially for a relatively small economy with a large and dispersed population. But the operative word is potential. Even during its earlier democratic period, Venezuela’s oil sector was crippled by chronic inefficiencies. Since 1998, production has collapsed by 75%, owing to a toxic mix of low oil prices, US sanctions, corruption, and economic mismanagement.

Who, then, will benefit from what’s left of Venezuela’s oil industry? Trump has announced that Venezuela will transfer up to 50 million barrels of oil to the US, and that the revenues will remain under his personal control. He has also urged major US oil companies to enter – or re-enter – the country, promising to reimburse them for the billions of dollars required to repair its broken infrastructure. In his telling, these investments would allow Venezuela to return to major-exporter status within 18 months. But this timeline is pure fantasy,

since rebuilding Venezuela’s oil industry would require an estimated \$100 billion in investment over a period of 7-10 years. As ExxonMobil CEO Darren Woods put it (much to Trump’s chagrin), high levels of economic and legal uncertainty make the Venezuelan market effectively “uninvestable.”

Herein lies the petrostate dilemma. Global oversupply, low oil prices, and a shortage of investable capital mean that Trump’s approach poses an existential risk to any Venezuelan government. Even without Maduro, the Chavista coalition remains bound together by access to oil rents, criminal networks, patronage systems, the threat of repression, and the emigration of nearly eight million potential dissidents.

Given that Chavismo’s ideological core is oil nationalism, Trump’s rhetoric could unite Venezuelans against what is widely perceived as the plundering of their country’s natural resources. That backlash is already evident, with Maduro’s opponents and allies alike condemning the US. Venezuela’s staggering social and economic collapse during Maduro’s rule underscores the dangers of Trump’s approach. Between 2013 and 2021, the country’s economy shrank to one-quarter of its previous size; inflation is projected to exceed 680% in 2026; and 80% of the population lives in extreme poverty. Diverting Venezuelan oil revenues to the US would necessarily deprive any government of the funds needed to tackle this crisis.

Trump could, in theory, declare victory and abandon his quest to seize Venezuela’s oil. Such an outcome is of course unlikely. Trump came for the oil, and he is determined to get it. But contrary to his expectations, Maduro’s removal may push that goal further out of reach, destabilizing the region and accelerating Trump’s own domestic decline.

Lower cost of capital to stimulate growth

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is buying government bonds to reduce banks’ borrowing costs and encourage economic growth. State and Central governments issue government bonds to raise funds for various projects and welfare initiatives, offering investors a fixed interest rate over the bond’s term. This approach helps the government finance essential programmes that promote development.

Since April 2025, the RBI has invested over Rs 5 lakh crore in bonds via Open Market Operations (OMO) to boost liquidity and lower lending rates. However, rising bond yields pose a challenge, as higher yields reduce the likelihood of rate cuts and hinder credit flows. Recent data reveal a 0.57% increase in 3-month government bond yields and a 0.80% rise in 10-year yields, with an average of only 6.7% in 2025, the lowest in three years. As yields climb, the expected reduction in borrowing costs remains unlikely. Increased bond yields have raised banks’ operating costs, keeping interest rates high on

loans such as home and auto loans, which negatively affects consumer spending and economic growth. In response, the RBI is considering further bond purchases to improve financial conditions. Additionally, rising gold and silver prices, along with geopolitical uncertainties and policies from international leaders such as President Trump, have led to foreign investors’ withdrawing capital, increasing pressure on RBI to provide additional liquidity.

OMO plays a crucial role in liquidity management. When market strains arise, RBI injects liquidity by acquiring government bonds, providing banks with capital to extend credit to businesses and individuals. Given global uncertainties and declining foreign investments, experts predict RBI may need to purchase bonds worth over Rs 2 lakh crore by March 2026. Since April 2024, the RBI has infused Rs 7.7 lakh crore into the banking system through OMOs and lowered the repo rate by 1.25% to support liquidity.

On the other hand, state governments are persistently borrowing from the market, exerting

additional pressure on overall liquidity. To tackle this escalating situation, the RBI has scaled back state borrowing plans by Rs 10,000 crore, even as states aim to borrow an ambitious Rs 5 lakh crore by March 2026. It is crucial to understand that a persistent influx of bonds can drain market liquidity. Excessive government borrowing reduces market liquidity, complicates banks’ lending, and raises loan interest rates.

Banks are currently facing a capital availability crisis for several reasons. Low deposit interest rates have made them less appealing to investors, and recent tax changes on deposits have discouraged savers. Furthermore, attractive stock market and mutual fund opportunities are drawing investors away from traditional savings. Bank staff selling insurance products has also led customers to use deposits for payments, further reducing available funds.

There has been a noticeable gap between the growth rates of bank deposits and loan issuance, with deposits lagging loans, creating a shortage of affordable capital for banks. As of December 12,

deposit growth has slowed to 9.7% year-on-year, while loan growth has increased to 11.7%, creating a 200 bps gap between them. According to RBI, total loans disbursed by banks reached Rs 196.5 lakh crore, up from Rs 175.86 lakh crore a year earlier, marking a rise of Rs 1.2 lakh crore in just two weeks. Total deposits rose to Rs 242.14 lakh crore from Rs 220.06 lakh crore a year prior, although they fell by Rs 45,344 crore in the same fortnight. For comparison, in the fortnight ending November 28, loans grew at 11.5% and deposits at 10.2%.

In light of these trends, to stimulate economic activity, raise growth rates, and realise India’s aspiration to become a developed nation by 2047, both the government and the RBI must facilitate the provision of capital at more affordable interest rates. Additionally, banks must innovate and develop new strategies to attract deposits by offering lower interest rates, thus securing a more cost-effective source of capital.

Sir, The World Health Organization (WHO) identifies obesity as a major global public health challenge driven by lifestyle changes, industrialised food systems, and reduced physical activity. By 2022, one in eight people worldwide was living with obesity. Since 1990, obesity has doubled among adults and increased fourfold among children and adolescents. In 2022, about 2.5 billion adults were overweight, nearly 890 million of them obese, and by 2024 millions of children, including those under five, were also affected. WHO defines overweight as excess body fat and obesity as a chronic, relapsing disease caused by complex interactions of genetic, biological, behavioural, environmental, and market-related factors. Body Mass Index (BMI) is used to classify overweight (BMI ≥25) and obesity (BMI ≥30) in adults, while age- and sex-specific growth standards apply to children. Today, over one billion people live with obesity, with rapid increases in low- and middle-income countries, creating a double burden of undernutrition and obesity. Obesity greatly increases the risk of non-communicable diseases such as heart disease, diabetes, and certain cancers, and childhood obesity raises the likelihood of early and severe health problems, including mental health impacts. Obesity, the WHO emphasises, is a shared societal challenge requiring collective action.

RAHUL ACCUSES BJP OF CENTRALISING POWER

The Congress leader hails Cong-UDF civic poll performance in Kerala

Kochi, Jan 19: Senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi Monday accused the RSS and the BJP of attempting to centralise power, while asserting that his party believes in decentralisation and strengthening grassroots democracy.

Speaking at a Mahapanchayat of newly elected Congress local body members here, he said the grand old party brought the 73rd and 74th Constitutional Amendments to empower the three-tier Panchayati Raj system.

The Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha also alleged that the NDA government was "attacking" the MGNREGA because it was implemented through local self-government institutions.

He stressed that protecting the Constitution also meant protecting decentralised governance at the grassroots level.

The basic principle of democracy was that votes are the voice of citizens and that this voice must be protected, he added.

Drawing a contrast, Gandhi said the BJP and RSS stood for centralisation, while the Congress stood for decentralisation. "They want compliance from people for India, not the

voice of the people of India," he said.

Referring to his interaction with veteran Malayalam writer M Leelavathy at an award function, Gandhi said the 98-year-old author talked about "culture of silence".

Accusing the BJP and RSS, he alleged that their ideological attack was aimed at enforcing silence.

"They want India to be silent. They do not want India to express itself. They want to deliver the wealth of this country to a few business houses," he said, adding that silencing people was necessary to concentrate the nation's assets in the hands of a select few.

However, Gandhi asserted with certainty that the people of Kerala could not be silenced and would speak out through elections.

He also congratulated Congress workers and the United Democratic Front (UDF) for what he described as a strong performance in the local body elections in Kerala, especially at the panchayat level, the third tier of democracy.

He said the Congress and UDF delivered a superb performance at all levels of local self-government and expressed happiness over the results in panchayats.

Gandhi said that while there were differences of opinion among senior leaders during discussions in Delhi, he was confident that the Congress would win the local body and Assembly elections.

He added that the bigger question before the Congress and UDF leadership was what they would do after winning.

"There is a huge unemployment problem in the state, and the UDF and Congress have to provide answers to it," he said, expressing confidence that the leadership had the ability to understand people's needs and deliver.

Gandhi said that for any government to succeed, it must be close to the people and merge with them.

He said he was confident that the Congress and UDF leadership would remain humble and connected to the masses.

Calling the present phase an ideological and political battle, Gandhi said it was an honour for him to serve as a Member of Parliament from Kerala earlier.

He said he had learnt a great deal from the state, including its history, traditions, language and political depth, and above all, its ability to stand together despite diversity.

He said he felt pain at seeing thousands of Keralites go abroad due to unemployment, even as he felt pride at seeing professionals, including nurses, from the state working across the world.

"We need to free people so that what they do abroad can also be done here," he said.

Recalling his sister Priyanka Gandhi's decision to contest from Wayanad Lok Sabha constituency, Gandhi said he had advised his sister that it was an emotional choice, adding that she has since learnt new things from Kerala's society and political culture.

TN CM lays foundation stone for Mamallan reservoir project

Chennai, Jan 19: Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin Monday laid the foundation stone for the Rs 342.60 crore Mamallan reservoir project near Nemmeli aimed at augmenting the drinking water resources for Chennai.

This will be the sixth dam for the city, which depends on Poondi, Cholavaram, Puzhal (Red Hills), Chembarambakkam, and Kannankottai-Theruvoy Kandigai.

In addition, the Veeranam lake and a few desalination plants, too, meet the requirement. "The reservoir is named after Narasimhavarman I, the Pallava emperor (who ruled from 630 - 668) as it is located in Mamallapuram (Mahabalipuram). This project is part of the DMK's consistent efforts to improve the water resources for Chennai and other parts in Tamil Nadu," the CM said after flagging off the work to

commence the construction.

The project has been planned taking into account the ever-expanding boundaries of Chennai and will be etched in history, he remarked. "Some criticise that we have not contributed much. Former Chief Minister M Karunanidhi has done a lot to improve the water resources in the state. Till 2011, the DMK built 43 dams across the state during its rule in the state," Stalin said.

Apart from opening the Mettur dam on time to facilitate agricultural activities, the DMK government has ensured the desilting of the water bodies in the Cauvery delta region to the tune of Rs 459 crore and built 121 check dams.

On the Mamallan reservoir, the Chief Minister said the surplus water from 69 lakes that would invariably drain into the sea will be impounded. The dam will meet the drinking water needs of 13 lakh people in areas such as Sholinganallur,

Medavakkam, Pallikarantai, Siruseri, Kelambakkam, Thirupurur, and Mamallapuram that have become part of Chennai City.

It would provide 120 million litres of water per day and in addition, ensure potable water to the suburbs, he added.

The Mamallan reservoir, located in the Kovalam sub-basin between Kelambakkam and Mamallapuram in neighbour-

ing Chengalpattu district, aims to store the surplus floodwater which currently empties into the sea, and addresses the shortfall for drinking water in Chennai, state Water Resources Department Secretary J Jayakathan said.

"This project will ensure 17 crore litres of water per day to Chennai and 6,605 crore litres per year and it is spread across 5,161 acres of land," he said.

RENEWABLE PUSH TN 'Green School Scheme' can offset 91% power demand: Study

Chennai, Jan 19: The Tamil Nadu government's 'Green School Scheme' could potentially offset nearly 91 per cent of the total electricity consumption of the state's government educational and hospital institutions if scaled to all 45,000 government schools, according to an official impact study released here Monday.

The state government launched the Climate Education and Cool Roof initiatives in 300 green schools in Tamil Nadu. Finance and Environment Minister Thangam Thennarasu and Minister for School Education Anbil Mahesh Poyyamozhi inaugurated the initiative Monday.

According to the impact study prepared in collabora-

tion with the Indian Institute for Human Settlements (IIHS), rooftop solar installations have already reduced grid electricity consumption by approximately 46 per cent per school. On average, each green school saves about 3,572 kWh annually, translating to fiscal savings of approximately Rs 26,000 per school per year.

"Extending the green school energy savings to all 45,000 government schools in Tamil Nadu will result in annual reduction in electricity use would be equivalent to roughly 91% of the current annual consumption of all government and aided educational institutions and hospitals in the state," the study found.

"While indicative, this comparison highlights the trans-



formative potential of school-based rooftop solar and efficiency measures. At this scale, the aggregate monetary savings could reasonably be expected to offset, over time, a substantial share of the capital investment required for solar installations and associated infrastructure," report of the study said.

Green School Scheme prioritises student health by addressing extreme heat, which Tamil Nadu has formally recognised

as a state-specific disaster. Officials noted that classrooms with concrete roofs often reach temperatures of 38°C, causing a significant "cognitive drop" where exam pass rates can fall by 10 per cent when thresholds exceed 32°C.

The "Cool Roof" initiative, piloted in Ambattur, uses high-reflective coatings to reduce indoor temperatures by 3°C and ceiling surface temperatures by 4°C. "Thermal comfort goes beyond cooling; it plays a critical role in supporting students' attention and learning outcomes," a government publication stated.

The scheme also proposes a holistic climate action with smart water management by installing rainwater harvesting structures (initiated in 79

per cent of evaluated schools) and drip irrigation (57 per cent) and waste management by implementing source segregation and vermicomposting to process organic waste into manure for school gardens.

Climate literacy is also part of the scheme and so far 4,000 teachers across all 38 districts have been trained as volunteer "Climate Ambassadors" to lead student nature camps and environmental audits.

The initiative is supported by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) under the BeCool Project, funded by the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC). UNEP Country Head Balakrishna Pisupati described the effort as a national benchmark for sustainable educational spaces.

Kerala Assembly budget session set to be stormy

Thiruvananthapuram, Jan 19: The budget session of the Kerala Assembly, beginning Tuesday, is expected to be a stormy affair, with the ruling LDF and opposition UDF poised for intense confrontations over a host of politically sensitive issues ranging from the Sabarimala gold loss case to the arrest of expelled Congress MLA Rahul Mamkootathil.

The 32-day-long session, scheduled to conclude March 26, is the 16th session of the 15th Kerala Assembly and will begin with the governor's policy statement.

With the assembly polls just months away, the Congress-led UDF is expected to capitalise on its performance in the recent local body by-elections to target the Left government.

Another major flashpoint in the House could be the arrest of senior CPI (M) leaders, including former MLA and president of the Travancore Devaswom Board (TDB), A Padmakumar, in the sensational Sabarimala gold loss case.

CISF cyclothon 2026 to halt overnight in villages to enhance public engagement

Chennai, Jan 19: This year, CISF's 'Vande Mataram Coastal Cyclothon 2026' will halt overnight in select villages to deepen the interaction with the public about national security and blue economy, said officials.

The second edition of the flagship event of CISF, aimed at boosting coastal security awareness and national unity, will be flagged off virtually by Union Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai from Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium in New Delhi January 28.

Speaking to reporters here, SR Saravanan, Inspector General, CISF South Sector HQ Chennai, said the cyclists are expected to reach Chennai from Bakkhali in West Bengal February 12-13.

"In Tamil Nadu, we are starting from Chennai, where we will stay overnight in two villages and then we move on to Puthucherry and Karaikal.



We will then go to one village each in Adirampattinam, Ramanaathapuram, Tuticorin and Kanyakumari," added Saravanan.

Covering 6,553 km along India's mainland coastline over 25 days, the event themed 'Surakshit Tat, Samriddh Bharat' (Secure Coast, Prosperous India) involves two teams of 130 CISF personnel, including 65 women, starting simultaneously

from Lakhpat Fort in Gujarat's Kutch and Bakkhali in West Bengal's South 24 Parganas.

The teams will converge in Kochi, Kerala February 22 after passing key ports like Haldia, Paradip, Visakhapatnam, Chennai, and Kanyakumari, with nightly halts at over 50 coastal villages to engage fisherfolk on threats like narcotics, arms smuggling and human trafficking.

Saravanan told PTI the initiative builds on last year's success, when a similar ride from Thakkolam to Kanyakumari covered 52 villages across Tamil Nadu and neighbouring areas, reaching 9 crore people digitally and 30 lakh personally.

Of the 130 CISF personnel participating, which include seven from Tamil Nadu, 50-60 per cent cyclists are women to motivate female recruitment, added Saravanan.

According to him, the cyclothon seeks to position coastal communities as "Tat Pari Praharis" (sentinels), first responders to incidents ahead of marine police or Coast Guard, informing nearest stations about suspicious activities to protect future generations.

CISF guards 12 major ports including Chennai, Ennore, Tuticorin under ISPS code, expanding to all 72 EXIM ports handling 95 per cent trade amid threats like smuggling and infiltration.

Four killed as pick-up vehicle collides with bus

Nashik: Four people were killed, and two suffered injuries after a pick-up vehicle collided with a luxury bus in Maharashtra's Nashik district in the wee hours of Monday, police said. The accident occurred near Varhane village on the Manmad-Malegaon Road in Malegaon taluka around 1.30 am when the bus was heading towards Malegaon, an official said. A pick-up vehicle coming from the opposite direction collided with the bus, he said. The official said that the impact killed three people in the pick-up vehicle and a man who was travelling in the driver's cabin of the bus.

Minor 'raped', murdered

Latehar: An 11-year-old girl was allegedly raped and murdered by her neighbour in Jharkhand's Latehar district, police said Monday. The minor's body was found on a road in Chipadohar police station area in the morning, they said. "The father of the girl and locals informed police, following which a team rushed to the spot and recovered the body," Chipadohar police station officer-in-charge Yakın Ansari said.

Six arrested over firing during clash

Ranchi: Six people were arrested in connection with firing during a clash over a land-related dispute in Jharkhand's Ranchi, police said Monday. Three persons, including two brothers, suffered bullet injuries during the violent clash near Piska More Saturday night over the division of ₹55 lakh in a land deal.

Unnao rape: Delhi HC jolt for Sengar

New Delhi, Jan 19: The Delhi High Court Monday refused to suspend the 10-year jail term of expelled BJP leader Kuldeep Singh Sengar in the custodial death case of the Unnao rape survivor's father on the grounds of delay in trial, saying it was partly caused by the multiple applications he had filed in the matter.

"The application seeking suspension of sentence is dismissed," said Justice Ravinder Dubeja. The judge observed that while Sengar has undergone prolonged incarceration of about seven-and-a-half years, relief could not be granted on the ground of delay alone, as the appellant had repeatedly moved applications for interim suspension, extension of bail and regular suspension of sentence.

Noting that Sengar was awarded the maximum sentence of 10 years in the case, Justice Dubeja remarked that the offence committed was of "grave magnitude", having a "deep societal impact".

"Purpose would be served if the appeal were heard on merit in an expeditious manner," Justice Dubeja said.

"In the facts and circumstances and after considering the statutory framework, the judicial principles governing suspension, the antecedents of the appellant and the absence of any new circumstance that has emerged, the court finds no ground to grant relief," the court opined. The court listed the appeal for hearing February 3.

Talking to PTI over the

phone from Delhi, the rape survivor expressed satisfaction with the court's verdict, saying the decision had brought her a sense of solace.

"I am very happy with the court's decision. Today, my father's soul has found some peace. I have not even performed my father's thirteenth-day rituals yet. Until his killers are sentenced to death, his soul will not find true peace," she said.

Reiterating her resolve to fight for justice, she said those responsible for her sexual assault and her father's death must face the strictest punishment.

"Kuldeep Singh Sengar, his brother Atul Singh Sengar, and everyone involved in this conspiracy must be awarded the death penalty," she said.

"This is not just my battle... it is a fight for justice and truth, and I will continue it till my last breath," she added. On March 13, 2020, Sengar was sentenced to 10 years rigorous imprisonment by a trial court, besides imposition of a fine of ₹10 lakh, in the case.

Seeking suspension of the sentence, Sengar's counsel submitted before the high court that he had been in custody since April 13, 2018, and spent more than half of his sentence in jail.

J&K: Paratrooper succumbs to injuries

CM orders SIT probe, Noida Authority CEO removed

Lucknow/Noida, Jan 19: The Uttar Pradesh government Monday removed the Noida Authority CEO and ordered an SIT probe into the death of the software engineer whose car plunged into a water-filled pit at an under-construction site in Noida's Sector 150, triggering widespread outrage, protests and allegations of official and developer negligence.

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath took cognisance of the incident and directed the constitution of a high-level Special Investigation Team (SIT) to investigate the circumstances leading to the fatal accident and submit a report within five days. Adityanath has also ordered the immediate identification and rectification of accident-prone spots across Uttar Pradesh, officials said Monday. Shortly after, the state government shunted out Lokesh M, a 2005-batch senior IAS officer, from the post of Noida Authority CEO and placed him on a waitlist, according to an official order.

Lokesh M, who had assumed charge as Noida Authority CEO in July 2023 after replacing Ritu Maheshwari, also served as the de facto managing director of the Noida Metro Rail Corporation (NMRC). A qualified dentist from Karnataka, he had earlier served as divisional commissioner in Kanpur and Saharanpur.

Only a day earlier amid mounting criticism, Lokesh M ordered the termination of a junior engineer and issued show-cause notices to other officials responsible for traffic-related works in Sector 150. In an official statement, the Authority removed junior engineer Naveen Kumar of the Noida

Traffic Cell from service and sought detailed reports on the allotment and construction activities of the developer, Lotus Greens. The now-removed CEO also directed all departments to re-inspect safety measures at ongoing construction sites to prevent recurrence of such incidents. A UP Irrigation Department letter to the Noida Authority in 2023 that flagged the need to construct head regulators to flush out accumulated rain and drain water in Sector 150 has been accessed by PTI. A Noida Authority official said he was not aware of the letter. On the chief minister's directions, a three-member SIT headed by Additional Director General (ADG), Meerut Zone, Bhanu Bhasker, has been constituted. Meerut Divisional Commissioner Hrishikesh Bhaskar and Public Works Department Chief Engineer Ajay Verma are members of the panel.

SC: Exorbitant airfares during fests exploitation

New Delhi, Jan 19: The Supreme Court Monday termed the exorbitant rise in airfares by airlines during festivals as 'exploitation' and said it would interfere with these 'unpredictable fluctuations'.

A bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta asked the Centre and the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) to file their replies to a PIL seeking binding regulatory guidelines to control the unpredictable fluctuations in airfare and ancillary charges imposed by private airlines in India.

"We will definitely interfere. Just see the exploitation of passengers done during the 'Kumbh' and other festivals. Just look at the fares to Prayagraj and Jodhpur from Delhi," the bench told Additional Solicitor General Anil Kaushik appearing for the Centre.

Justice Mehta, in a lighter vein, told Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, who was in the courtroom, that maybe airfares for Ahmedabad may not have increased but they have shot up for other destinations like Jodhpur.

The SC listed the matter for further hearing February 23 after Kaushik sought time to file a reply on behalf of the Centre. On November 17 last year, the SC sought responses from the Centre and others on a plea by social activist S Laxminarayanan, who has sought to establish a robust and independent regulator that ensures transparency and passenger protection across the civil aviation sector.

It has issued notices to the Centre, the DGCA and the Airports Economic Regulatory Authority of India seeking their responses on the plea.

Indore leprosy-afflicted beggar owns houses, vehicles

Indore, Jan 19: Three houses, three autorickshaws and a chauffeur-driven car. One would think these belonged to a jeweller from Indore's Sarafa Bazaar, not a leprosy-afflicted man, who moves around inconspicuously on a wheeled board, seeking alms, but silently lending lakhs in the famed bullion market.

Officials in Indore were left stunned recently when an anti-beggary drive led them to a 50-year-old man who has reportedly amassed property worth several lakh rupees by seeking alms.

The man has lent money in the famous bullion market here and earns handsome daily interest from this business, an official said.

A leprosy patient, rescued from the Sarafa area based on information from the public, has become the talk of the city, said Dinesh Mishra, an official from the Women and Child Development Department, who is the nodal officer for the campaign to eradicate begging.

"We have learned that this man owns three concrete houses, including a three-story building. Besides this, he also owns three autorickshaws that he rents out. He also owns a car in which he goes begging. He has even hired a driver for this purpose. He begs while moving about on a wheeled board," Mishra said.

Elaborating further on the 'riches in rags' story, the official said that the man, who has been begging since 2021,

had lent ₹4-5 lakh to people in the bullion market here and charges interest that nets him between ₹1,000-1,200 per day.

In addition, he receives ₹400 to ₹500 daily in alms, the official said, adding the man was presently lodged in a shelter

home. District Magistrate Shivam Verma said that Indore is a "beggar-free city" and such campaigns to rehabilitate those seeking alms in public are undertaken after information of such activities is received from the public.

INDIA, UAE DEEPEN TIES

Under the defence partnership, India and the UAE are eyeing defence industrial collaboration and cooperation in advanced technologies, cyberspace training, special operations, interoperability of their militaries and counter terrorism

New Delhi, Jan 19: India and the United Arab Emirates Monday unveiled plans to have a strategic defence partnership and sealed an LNG deal as Prime Minister Narendra Modi and UAE President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan set a \$200 billion annual trade target by 2032 while laying out a broad agenda to shore up the ties.

Modi welcomed Al Nahyan at the Delhi airport with a hug and then they travelled together in the same vehicle to the prime minister's residence, where they held talks in the restricted as well as delegation-level formats.

Out of the five documents inked by the two sides, the most striking one was the letter of intent to establish a strategic defence partnership, a move that came four months after Pakistan and Saudi Arabia sealed a defence pact to strengthen their decades-long defence ties.

Under the defence partnership, India and the UAE are eyeing defence industrial collaboration and cooperation in advanced technologies, cyberspace training, special operations, interoperability of their militaries and counter terrorism. Another pact was inked to provide for the purchase of 0.5 million metric tonnes of LNG (Liquefied Natural Gas) by Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL) from Abu Dhabi National Oil Company Gas over a period of 10 years starting 2028. The UAE is India's second-largest supplier of LNG to India after Qatar.

The two sides also decided to explore collaboration in advanced nuclear technologies, including the development of large nuclear reactors and small modular reactors, as well as cooperation in advanced reactor systems, nuclear power



plant operations and maintenance and nuclear safety.

"This has been a short, but extremely substantive visit," Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said at a media briefing after the UAE leader concluded his nearly three-and-a-half-hour visit that came amid increasing tensions in the Middle East and trade disruptions caused by Washington's policy on tariffs.

Artificial Intelligence was identified as another priority area of cooperation and it was decided to collaborate on setting up a supercomputing cluster in India with the UAE partnership, Misri said, adding the Gulf nation will also look at investments for expanding data centre capacities in India.

The foreign secretary said the two sides also set a target of USD 200 billion in annual trade by 2032. In 2024-25, the volume of two-way trade between the two sides was USD 100 billion.

To boost trade ties, Modi and Al Nahyan directed their teams to work towards inter-linking the national payment platforms to enable efficient, fast and cost-effective cross-border payments. They also called for the expeditious implementation of key initiatives, such as the 'Bharat Mart', the 'Virtual Trade Corridor' and the 'Bharat-Africa Setu' to promote

MSME products across the Middle East, West Asia, Africa and the Eurasia region, according to a joint statement. The joint statement said the two leaders highlighted deep respect for each other's sovereignty and territorial integrity and the importance of strategic autonomy.

It said Modi and Al Nahyan acknowledged steady and strong bilateral defence and security cooperation as a core pillar of the comprehensive strategic partnership.

Another letter of intent was also signed for joint work in developing space infrastructure.

Under this initiative, both sides will look to set up new launch complexes, satellite fabrication facilities, joint missions, space academy and training centres, the foreign secretary said.

A separate document was inked to provide for the UAE's participation in the development of a special investment region in Gujarat's Dholera.

This initiative will look at the establishment of an international airport, a pilot training school, an MRO (Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul) facility, a greenfield port, a smart urban township, as well as projects related to railway connectivity and energy infrastructure, Misri added.

'CENTRE TO SOON LAUNCH COASTAL VIBRANT VILLAGES PROGRAMME'

India ranks 16th in Responsible Nations' Index

New Delhi, Jan 19: Singapore ranked first and India 16th in the Responsible Nations' Index (RNI) launched by former president Ram Nath Kovind here Monday. Switzerland was second, Denmark third and the Central African Republic stood last on the 154-nation index.

India's neighbour Pakistan was in the 90th place. China was ranked 68th and the US 66th, according to the RNI. Kovind launched the RNI, a first-of-its-kind global index that evaluates countries based on how responsibly they exercise power towards their citizens, global community and the planet.

The RNI is a global evaluative framework developed by the think tank World Intellectual Foundation (WIF) in academic collaboration with Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) and methodological validation by the Indian Institute of Management (IIM), Mumbai. Kovind underlined the importance of ethical governance, inclusive development, and moral responsibility in shaping sustainable national and global futures. "The index is not a scoreboard which increases competition, but a mirror of morality and responsibility which reflects if countries are doing justice to their citizens," he said. Sudhanshu Mittal, Founder and Secretary, WIF, said the RNI represents a shift from power-centric assessments to responsibility-centric evaluation of nations.

"The Responsible Nations Index asks a fundamental question - how responsibly does a nation exercise its power? Prosperity without responsibility is unsustainable. The RNI seeks to encourage ethical governance, humane development and global stewardship," he said.

SC orders EC to display discrepancy list in WB

New Delhi, Jan 19: Observing that the Special Intensive Revision process in West Bengal should be transparent and not cause inconvenience, the Supreme Court directed the Election Commission (EC) Monday to display the names of those on the "logical discrepancies" list at gram panchayat bhavans and block offices, where documents and objections will also be submitted.

Logical discrepancies in progeny linking with the 2002 voter list include instances of a mismatch in the parent's name and the age difference between a voter and their parent being less than 15 years or more than 50 years. Noting that 1.25 crore voters in the state figure on the "logical discrepancies" list, a three-judge bench of Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justices Dipankar Datta and Joymalya Bagchi directed that the offices for submitting documents and objections be set up within the panchayat bhavans or block offices and asked the West Bengal government to provide ade-

quate manpower to the election authorities. The court directed that the director general of police (DGP) of West Bengal shall

be obligated to ensure that there is no law-and-order problem and that all the activities shall be completed smoothly. The apex court was hearing pleas alleging arbitrariness and procedural irregularities in the ongoing SIR exercise in West Bengal, including those related to the "logical discrepancies" category. The bench noted that notices have been issued that are broadly classified in three categories - mapped, unmapped and logical discrepancy.

The top court added that under the 'logical discrepancy' category, mismatches in father's name or parents' age, and a difference in the age of the grandparents were noticed by the authorities. The apex court said those likely to be affected by the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral rolls in West Bengal must be allowed to submit their documents or objections.

The top court directed that the office for submitting the documents and objections shall be set up within the panchayat bhavans or block offices.

Bengaluru civic body polls will be held after May 25, says State EC

Bengaluru, Jan 19: Elections to the five city corporations under the Greater Bengaluru Authority (GBA) will be held after May 25 with ballot papers instead of EVMs, Karnataka State Election Commissioner G S Sangreshi said Monday.

He also said that zilla and taluk Panchayat polls, which are expected later this year, will also be held using ballot papers.

"Elections will be held tentatively after May 25, after SSLC (class 10) and PUC (class 11 and 12) examinations are over, and before June 30," Sangreshi added.

The Supreme Court had last week asked the Karnataka government and the state election body to hold Bengaluru local body polls by June 30.

Speaking to reporters here, the Commissioner said, this time the GBA election will be held using ballot papers.

"There are two best practices to hold elections, ballot papers were being used since the beginning, but since 20-30 years ago EVMs are being used.

Use of ballot papers is not barred by law or by the judgments of the Supreme Court," he said, defending the decision to use ballot papers.

The Congress government in Karnataka in September last year had decided to recommend to the State Election Commission (SEC) to hold all the future panchayat and urban local body polls in the state using ballot paper instead of Electronic Voting Machines, claiming there is an erosion of confidence and credibility, among the people towards EVMs.

Noting that developed countries like America too use ballot papers, the state election commissioner said, most elections like Gram Panchayat, Cooperative polls are held using ballot papers, except Assembly and Lok Sabha elections. "However, last time the Bengaluru corporation polls in 2015 were held using EVMs," he noted.

HC quashes 2016 income tax notices to Prannoy Roy, Radhika Roy

NEW DELHI: Termining the reassessment proceedings "arbitrary" and against fundamental and constitutional rights, the Delhi High Court Monday quashed the 2016 income tax notices to NDTV founders Prannoy Roy and Radhika Roy and asked the department to pay Rs 1 lakh to each of them as token cost. A bench of Justices Dinesh Mehta and Vinod Kumar observed that authorities subjecting Prannoy Roy and Radhika Roy to reassessment proceedings for the second time for the same transaction and "practically for the same issue" was without jurisdiction.

Mulayam's son to divorce wife Aparna

LUCKNOW: Samajwadi Party founder Mulayam Singh Yadav's son Prateek Yadav Monday alleged that his wife Aparna Bisht Yadav, a BJP leader, had ruined his family ties and he would seek a divorce from her at the earliest. Mentally-ill homeless people destitute to extreme: SC

New Delhi, Jan 19: The Supreme Court Monday described homeless people suffering from mental illnesses as "destitute to the extreme" and "most vulnerable", and gave the Centre a last opportunity to come up with standard operating procedures for rehabilitating them.

A bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta made the remarks while posting a public interest litigation (PIL) matter for hearing February 9, after the Centre's counsel sought some time to file a reply to the plea.

"We are giving you a last opportunity to frame the SOPs and file the reply. It is a sensitive issue and all depends on the effective implementation of the SOPs. These are people who are destitute to the extreme and most vulnerable. Please file the draft SOPs on the next date of hearing," the bench told senior advocate Nachiket Joshi, who appeared in the court on behalf



of the Centre.

The lawyer informed the bench that Additional Solicitor General Brijender Chahar was appearing in the matter but he was indisposed and could not file the reply.

Advocate Gaurav Bansal, who is the petitioner in-person, submitted that this is the third time that the Centre has failed to file a reply to the PIL that has sought directions for

the formulation and implementation of a policy for the homeless suffering from psychosocial disabilities. "The issue pertains to homeless people who are mentally ill and roam around the streets and public places for food. They need to be rehabilitated," Bansal said.

The court was informed by the Centre on December 19 last year that two sets of draft SOPs are being prepared for the reha-

bilitation of these people.

The top court had earlier asked the Centre to take the issue "very seriously", after the government said authorities are already deliberating on the matter and meetings are being held.

Psychosocial disabilities refer to challenges people with mental health issues face due to discrimination and a lack of support, among other reasons.

The plea has sought directions for the framing and implementation of SOPs for key stakeholders, including the de-

partments of law enforcement (police) and medical health, to ensure humane and effective handling of homeless persons with psychosocial disabilities.

It has highlighted the issues faced by such people, who, instead of being provided with appropriate care, are often subjected to neglect, social isolation and physical and sexual abuses.

"Despite existing legal and policy frameworks, including the Mental Healthcare Act, 2017, and the National Mental Health Policy, 2014, respondents have failed to operationalise the provisions intended to protect and assist homeless individuals suffering from mental illnesses," the plea has said.

The petitioner has said the lack of a structured national policy on homelessness and mental illnesses has resulted in a "complete breakdown of the system, leaving thousands of individuals to fend for themselves", without access to medical care, shelter or social entitlements.

B'desh court opens Hindu monk's trial

Dhaka: A court in Bangladesh Monday indicted Hindu monk Chinmoy Krishna Das and 38 others in connection with the death of a lawyer in southeastern port city of Chattogram in November 2024. Das, a spokesperson for the Bangladesh Sammilita Sanatani Jagran Jote, was arrested from Dhaka's Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport November 25, 2024 for alleged sedition. Das, a former ISKCON leader, was denied bail and jailed by a Chattogram court. His arrest sparked protests, with his followers demonstrating in Dhaka and other places the next day. The protest turned violent in Chattogram, where the lawyer was killed November 26. On Monday, "the court framed charges against Chinmoy under Sections 302 and 109 of the Penal Code and brought charges against 22 others under different sections," a prosecution lawyer told reporters after the indictment by the Chattogram Divisional Speedy Trial Tribunal.

At least 7 killed in Kabul hotel blast

Kabul: An explosion tore through a hotel in a heavily guarded part of central Kabul Monday, killing seven people and injuring several others, authorities in the Afghan capital said. Kabul police spokesperson Khalid Zadrان said the hotel was in the commercial Shahr-e-Naw neighbourhood that includes large office buildings, shopping complexes and embassies. The district is considered one of the safest in Kabul. Videos shared on social media showed debris scattered on the street outside and smoke spewing from a large hole torn into the front of the hotel building.

Chile wildfires leave 19 dead

Concepcion: Wildfires in Chile have left at least 19 people dead, authorities said Monday, as the government carried out mass evacuations and fought nearly two dozen blazes exacerbated by intense heat and high winds. While weather conditions overnight helped control some fires, the largest were still active, with adverse conditions expected throughout the day, security minister, Luis Cordero, said at a news briefing Monday. "The projection we have today is of high temperatures," Cordero said, and the main worry was that new fires would be triggered throughout the region.

Trump links Greenland threat to Nobel snub

Paris/Oslo, Jan 19: US President Donald Trump linked his drive to take control of Greenland to his failure to win the Nobel Peace Prize, saying he no longer thought "purely of Peace" as the row over the island Monday threatened to reignite a trade war with Europe. Trump has intensified his push to wrest sovereignty over Greenland from fellow NATO member Denmark, threatening punitive tariffs on countries which stand in his way and prompting the European Union to weigh hitting back with its own measures.

The dispute is threatening to upend the NATO alliance that has underpinned Western security for decades and which was already under strain over the war in Ukraine and Trump's refusal to protect allies which do not spend enough on defence.

It has also plunged trade relations between the EU and the US, the bloc's biggest export market, into renewed uncertainty after the two sides painstakingly reached a trade deal last year in response to Trump's swingeing tariffs.

In a written message to Norway's Prime Minister Jonas Gahr Støre that was seen by Reuters, Trump said, "Considering your Country decided not to give me the Nobel Peace Prize for having stopped 8 Wars PLUS, I no longer feel an obligation to think purely of Peace, although it will always be predominant, but can now think about what is good and proper for the United States of America."

NOBEL COMMITTEE GAVE 2025 PEACE PRIZE TO MACHADO, NOT TRUMP

The Norwegian Nobel Committee annoyed Trump by awarding the 2025 Nobel Peace Prize not to him but to Venetian opposition leader Maria Corina Machado. She gave her medal last week to Trump during a White House meeting, though the Nobel Committee said the prize cannot be transferred, shared or revoked.

In his message, Trump also repeated his accusation that Denmark cannot protect Greenland from Russia or China.

"... and why do they have a 'right of ownership' anyway?"

he wrote, adding, "The World is not secure unless we have Complete and Total Control of Greenland." Trump vowed Saturday to implement a wave of increasing tariffs from February 1 on EU members Denmark, Sweden, France, Germany, the Netherlands and Finland, along with Britain and Norway, until the US is allowed to buy Greenland, home to only 57,000 people.

TALKS WITH TRUMP IN DAVOS? Norway's Støre amended his schedule, announcing that he would attend the World Economic Forum in Davos Wednesday and Thursday, overlapping with Trump's planned appearance at the annual gathering of the global political and business elite.

Støre had not been scheduled to attend this year's conference at the Swiss Alpine resort, where Trump is expected to deliver a keynote address Wednesday in his first appearance at the event in six years.

German Chancellor Friedrich Merz said he too would try to meet Trump Wednesday, adding that a trade dispute was not wanted.

Trump invites Putin to Join Gaza Peace Board: Kremlin

Moscow, Jan 19: Russian President Vladimir Putin has received an invitation to join US President Donald Trump's Gaza Peace Board, and the invitation is under consideration, the Kremlin said Monday.

"Indeed, President Putin also received an offer through diplomatic channels to join this Peace Board," the Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov told reporters.

"We are currently studying all the details of this proposal, and we hope to contact the American side to clarify all the details," he said.

Several other countries have received offers from the US to join this body. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Pakistani counterpart Shehbaz Sharif have also received invitations to join the Peace Board.

The US president unveiled the board as part of the second phase of a ceasefire agreement between Israel and Hamas in the Gaza Strip.

In October, Israel and militant group Hamas agreed to Trump's peace plan.

The board is being projected by Washington as a new international body to usher in peace and stability in Gaza and beyond, triggering speculations that it may respond to other global conflicts as well.

"Russia sees the Gaza Peace Board as the US attempt to create a rival of the United Nations Organisation with a broader mandate," Russia's Channel-1 TV said Monday in its 'Pryamoi Efir' (Live Broadcast) political show.

Dhaka, Jan 19: The majority of incidents involving members of minority communities in Bangladesh during 2025 were "criminal in nature" and not driven by communal motives, the interim government said Monday.

The statement came days after India, January 9, pressed Dhaka to "swiftly and firmly" deal with attacks on minorities in Bangladesh and described as "troubling" the attempts to attribute the incidents to extraneous reasons.

New Delhi's reaction had come against the backdrop of the killing of several Hindu individuals in Bangladesh in the last few weeks.

Citing a yearlong review of official police records, the statement issued by Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus' office said a total of 645 incidents involving minority communities were recorded between January and December 2025 across Bangladesh.

"While every incident is a matter of concern, the data presents a clear and evidence-based picture: the overwhelming majority of cases were criminal in nature rather than communal," it said.

According to the statement, of the 645 incidents, 71 were identified as having communal elements.

These included 38 cases of temple vandalism, eight of arson, one of theft, one murder and 23 other incidents such as threats to break idols, provocative social media posts and damage to worship pavilions.

Police cases were filed in 50 of these incidents, and arrests were made in an equal number, while other preventive or investigative measures were taken in 21 cases, the statement said.

The remaining 574 incidents were linked to criminal or social disputes unrelated to religion, including neighbourhood disputes (51), land-related conflicts (23), theft (106), prior personal enmity (26), rape (58) and 172 cases of unnatural death.

Police registered 390 cases in this category, filed 154 unnatural death reports and made 498 arrests, with additional measures taken in 30 incidents.

The interim government said the report "does not deny challenges, nor does it claim perfection; rather, it seeks to provide a factual, evidence-based picture of crime trends affecting minority communities within the broader national context".

"While all crimes are serious and demand accountability, the data demonstrates that most incidents involving minority victims were not driven by communal hostility, but by broader criminal and social factors that affect citizens across religious and ethnic lines," it said.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Hindu Buddhist Christian Unity Council (BHBCUC) leader Kajal Debnath questioned the government's classification of incidents involving minorities as "non-communal".

KARACHI MALL FIRE

21 killed, dozens missing

Karachi, Jan 19: Pakistani firefighters began pulling bodies from the smouldering remains of a sprawling Karachi shopping mall Monday where more than 60 people were still missing after a massive fire that killed at least 21.

The city's biggest fire in over a decade started late Saturday at Gul Plaza, which houses 1,200 shops in a multi-storey complex spread across an area larger than a football field. The blaze in Karachi's historic centre raged for more than 24 hours before it was mostly extinguished.

Videos showed flames ripping through the building as firefighters laboured through the night to put out the blaze. They began cooling the structure and clearing twisted metal and debris strewn across the street Monday, along with fallen air-conditioning units and shop signboards.

Japan PM to call Feb 8 snap election

Tokyo, Jan 19: Japan's Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi will call a national election February 8 to seek voter backing for increased spending, tax cuts and a new security strategy that is expected to accelerate a defence build-up.

Takaichi plans to dissolve parliament Friday ahead of the snap vote for all 465 seats in the lower house of parliament, in her first electoral test since becoming Japan's first female premier in October.

"I am staking my own political future as prime minister on this election," Takaichi told a press conference Monday. "I want the public to judge directly whether they will entrust me with the management of the nation."

She promised a two-year halt to a consumption tax of 8% on food, adding that her spending plans would create jobs, boost

household spending and increase other tax revenues.

The prospect of such a tax cut, which the government estimates would reduce its revenue by 5 trillion yen (\$32 billion) a year, sent the yield on Japan's 10-year government bonds to a 27-year high earlier Monday.

Calling an early election allows Takaichi to capitalise on strong public support to tighten her grip on the ruling Liberal Democratic Party and shore up her coalition's fragile majority.

The election will test voter appetite for higher spending at a time when the rising cost of living is the public's top concern. Prices were the main worry of 45% of the respondents in a poll released by public broadcaster NHK last week, followed by diplomacy and national security at 16%.

Takaichi has not set a new spending target beyond that level, but rising tension with China over Taiwan.

China's wedding dress sellers pin hopes on rise in marriages

Suzhou, China, Jan 19: Wedding vendors at Huqiu Bridal City in Suzhou, one of China's largest wedding dress markets, are hopeful the country's positive marriage trends will continue this year.

The rise in marriages in the first nine months of 2025 is a bright spot in China's otherwise grim population landscape. Official data Monday showed the country's birth rate hit a record low last year and its total population fell for the fourth straight year.

Marriage rates rose 8.5% for the first nine months of 2025, according to Ministry of Civil Affairs data earlier this month, buoyed by policy changes and favourable cultural factors.

That increases the likelihood that overall marriage numbers in 2025 will halt a downtrend in annual nuptials that has gone almost uninterrupted for more than a decade.

Chen Juan, the co-owner of Luoyi Bridal, where dresses are priced from 1,000 yuan (\$143.51) to around 4,000 yuan for more ornate styles, said marriage rates dropped significantly in 2024 as it was considered an inauspicious year to tie the knot, with many couples delaying weddings to 2025.

The sprawling Huqiu Bridal City is home to more than 800 stores filled with frothy white taffeta, silk and lace dresses.

A nationwide policy change in May 2025, allowing couples to marry anywhere in China rather than in their place of



residence, also contributed to the rebound, Chen and other vendors said.

In response, local governments scrambled to attract a new wave of marriage tourists,

setting up registration offices around scenic spots, at music festivals - and even in subway stations, shopping malls and parks.

Mumbai, Jan 19: The rupee depreciated 12 paise to close at 90.90 against the greenback Monday, a tad above its record low closing level, weighed down by robust greenback demand from metal importers and persistent foreign fund outflows.

Forex traders said rising geopolitical uncertainty, including renewed US expansionary signals, has increased risk aversion and kept emerging market currencies under pressure.

Selling pressure in domestic equities further dented investor sentiment. Moreover, investors were also concerned after US President Donald Trump announced tariffs on European countries if they resisted his plan to control Greenland.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 90.68 and slid past the crucial 91.01 against the greenback during the session. It finally settled 12 paise lower at 90.90 against the dollar, just 3 paise above its record low closing level. On December 16, 2025, the rupee reached its lowest intra-day level of 91.14 and its lowest closing level of 90.93 against the American currency.

On Friday, the rupee crashed 44 paise to settle near its lowest level at 90.78 against the US dollar, after losing 17 paise in the preceding two sessions.

Meanwhile, the dollar index, which measures the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading 0.29 per cent lower at 99.10. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, was trading 0.37 per cent lower at USD 63.88 per barrel in futures trade.

According to Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst at Mirae Asset ShareKhan, the rupee is expected to trade on a negative bias amid risk aversion in global markets and brewing geopolitical tensions between the US and European nations over control of Greenland.

Foreign institutional investors offloaded equities worth ₹3,262.82 crore Monday, according to exchange data.

IMF raises India FY26 growth forecast to 7.3%, sees slower pace in next two years

New Delhi, Jan 19: The International Monetary Fund raised its forecast for India's economic growth in fiscal 2026 by 0.7 percentage points to 7.3%, citing strong momentum, but said growth is likely to slow to 6.4% in the following two fiscal years

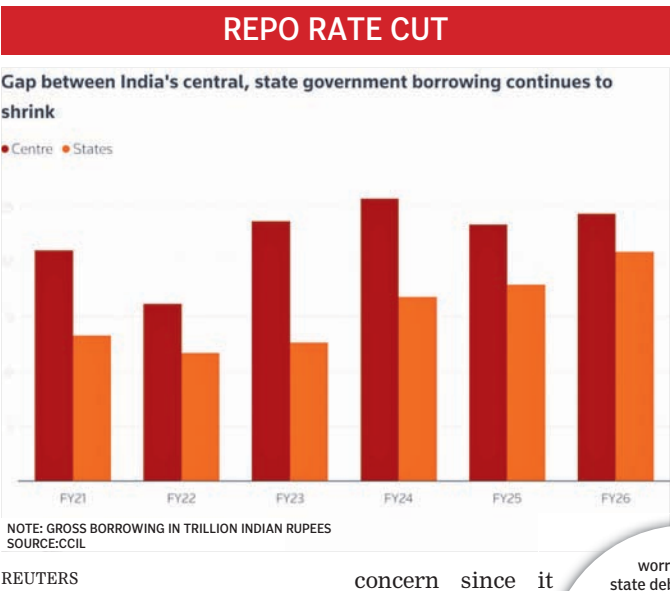
The upgrade follows a revision earlier this month by India's National Statistics Office, which raised its estimate for growth to 7.4% in the year ending March 31, above the government's initial projection of 6.3% to 6.8%. In its World Economic Outlook report released Monday, the IMF said the upward revision for fiscal 2026 reflected "better-than-expected outturn in the third quarter of the year and strong momentum in the fourth quarter."

Rising state borrowings embroil RBI's playbook

Mumbai, Jan 19: A surge in borrowing by Indian states is complicating the central bank's efforts to lower interest rates as officials worry the increased supply of state bonds could affect the yield curve, according to people familiar with the central bank's thinking and analysts.

State governments are issuing debt at a pace that increasingly rivals sovereign borrowing, significantly boosting bond supply for a shared pool of investors.

Amid the increased supply of state debt, which typically offers a modest yield premium over federal bonds, investors are now demanding higher returns on central government securities, making it more difficult for the Reserve Bank of India to bring down borrowing costs despite recent interest rate cuts.

Sub-sovereign borrowing overtaking central government issuance is a mounting

concern since it risks distorting the yield curve and weakening the transmission of monetary policy and liquidity measures, one of the sources familiar with the central bank's thinking said, requesting anonymity because they were not authorised to speak publicly.

STATE BORROWINGS MAY RISE FURTHER

State borrowings could rise further following the recent revamp of the rural jobs scheme, which shifts more of the financial burden onto state governments, the person said, adding that states may overtake the federal government in borrowings over the next few years.

In the current fiscal year, which runs from April to March, Indian states are set to borrow nearly as much as the central government, with gross

issuance of about ₹12.5 trillion (\$137.66 billion) versus ₹14.6 trillion at the sovereign level.

Net borrowing by states, at roughly ₹9 trillion, is approaching the central government's ₹10.3 trillion. Investors generally view debt issued by Indian states as equivalent to federal government debt, since a reserve pool of funds held by the central bank is used for payouts during periods of financial stress. This means that while state debt offers investors a spread of 80 to 100 basis points over federal debt, the risk of default remains negligible.

Higher state borrowings have eroded benefits from the 100 basis points in interest rate cuts this fiscal year and pushed up costs for corporate borrowers, four analysts and traders said.

The yield on the 10-year central government bond has risen by 10 basis points in the current fiscal year, while benchmark yields for top-rated corporates have increased by 30 basis points.

To keep yields in check, the RBI is expected to purchase about ₹5.7 trillion of central government bonds this year, an amount equivalent to more than half of the government's net borrowing, effectively easing the supply burden.

AIBPARC demands immediate pension updation

retired bankers.

The conference was inaugurated by former Executive Director of Bank of India and former Canara Bank Board Director Bimal Prasad Sharma, who highlighted possible resistance from the Indian Banks' Association (IBA) and called for well-planned organisational strategies to counter it. He expressed

confidence that the movement would achieve success.

AIBPARC General Secretary Suprita Sarkar, delivering the keynote address, outlined the organisation's journey since its formation in 2012 and detailed sustained representations made before the legislature, bureaucracy, judiciary and media. He also presented the future roadmap of action. The conference, presided over by State President Amit K Motayed, concluded with the unanimous election of new office-bearers for the 2026-2029 term.

Billionaires' wealth hits new peak as their clout grows

Washington, Jan 19: Billionaire wealth surged at three times its recent pace last year to reach its highest level on record, deepening economic and political divides that threaten democratic stability, anti-poverty group Oxfam said Monday.

In a report timed for the opening of the World Economic Forum in Davos, the charity said the fortunes of global billionaires jumped 16% in 2025 to \$18.3 trillion, extending an 81%

rise since 2020.

The gains happened even as one in four people worldwide struggle to eat regularly and nearly half the global population live in poverty.

Oxfam's study, which draws on academic research and data sources ranging from the World Inequality Database to Forbes' rich list, argues that the wealth boom is being matched by a dramatic concentration of political clout, with billionaires 4,000 times more likely than ordinary citizens

to hold political office.

The group links the latest wealth surge to policies under US President Donald Trump, whose second administration has cut taxes, shielded multinational corporations from international pressure and eased scrutiny of monopolies.

Soaring valuations of artificial intelligence companies have added further windfall gains for already wealthy investors.

Oxfam urged governments to adopt national inequality reduction plans, impose higher taxes on extreme wealth and strengthen firewalls between



money and politics, including curbs on lobbying and campaign financing.

Wealth taxes are levied in just a few countries such as Norway at present but others, from Britain to France and Ita-

Billionaires now own more than half of the world's major media firms, Oxfam said, citing holdings by Jeff Bezos, Elon Musk, Patrick Soon-Shiong and France's Vincent Bolloré.

Rabat, Jan 19: African football would have been hoping for a thrilling end to a slick and competitive Cup of Nations tournament but will wake up Monday with a major headache after the final between Senegal and hosts Morocco descended into farce. Senegal, who won 1-0 after extra time, staged a walk-out after they had a penalty awarded against them deep in stoppage time at the end of the match. They were ordered off the field by their coach Pape Bouna Thiaw, with some players going back to the dressing room, and



it was only after Sadio Mane cajoled them back that the game continued. "What did we say to each other? That's between us. We did it together and we came back together, that's all that matters," said goalkeeper Edouard Mendy, one of those involved in ugly scenes of jostling and arguing between the players. A 14-minute delay between the awarding of the penalty, after a lengthy VAR review, and the taking of the kick was

New Delhi, Jan 19: India's Pramod Bhagat and Sukant Kadam clinched a gold medal each in the singles events of their respective categories and then combined together to stand on top of podium in doubles at the SPIRO SPATHIS Egypt Para Badminton International 2026 in Cairo.

Bhagat showcased grit and experience in the SL3 men's singles final, defeating compatriot Umesh Vikram Kumar in a thrilling three-set contest. After conceding a closely-fought opening game 19-21, Bhagat raised his intensity and tactical sharpness to take the next two sets 21-15 and 21-13, sealing victory in a match lasting over an hour. In the SL4 men's singles category, Sukant Kadam underlined his consistency and mental toughness, overcoming India's Surya Kant Yadav in straight sets. Both games went down to the wire, with Kadam prevailing 27-25, 21-18 in a high-quality final. In SL3 class, a player must play standing and can have an impairment in one or both lower limbs, and poor movement balance. SL4 class players have a lesser impairment than those in SL3. SL 4 players can have impairment in one or both lower

limbs and minimal impairment in walking/running balance. The Indian duo then combined forces in the SL3-SL4 men's doubles event, where Bhagat and Kadam were awarded the gold medal following a walkover in the final against fellow Indians Umesh Vikram Kumar and Surya Kant Yadav, completing a memorable double-gold outing for both. India enjoyed a highly successful campaign in the tournament, with gold medals also coming from Nitesh Kumar, Thulasimathi Murugesan, Alpha James, and the women's doubles pair of Manasi Joshi and Thulasimathi Murugesan. An elated Bhagat said, "This tournament was extremely important for me, especially with the World Championships coming up next month. The singles final tested my patience and fitness, and I'm really happy with the way I responded after losing the first set. Winning double gold with Sukant makes it even more special. It's a great confidence booster." Kadam, on his part, said, "The singles final was mentally demanding, and I had to stay composed till the very end. Partnering with Pramod in doubles and winning gold together is always special. This is exactly the kind of start we were aiming for this season."

T20 WORLD CUP

ICC gives final deadline to BCB

New Delhi, Jan 19: The ICC has asked the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) to decide on its participation in the T20 World Cup in India by January 21 or "risk being replaced by another team" in the tournament beginning February 7. Despite the back and forth between ICC and BCB, no solution has been found to the crisis that was triggered by the removal of Bangladesh pacer Mustafizur Rahman from the 2026 Indian Premier League on BCCI's instructions for unspecified "devel-

opments all around." "The BCB officials have been told to decide on the participation by January 21. If they refuse to travel to India, then they should be ready to be replaced by another team as per rankings," said an ICC source. In case Bangladesh continue to be unyielding, the replacement team would most likely be Scotland based on current rankings. Bangladesh are scheduled to play three leagues games in Kolkata and one in Mumbai. The BCB has remained adamant on either a change of venue or a change of groups to facilitate its games in Sri Lanka.

Pak halt preparations in solidarity with B'desh

Acting on its threat to withdraw from the upcoming ICC Men's T20 World Cup in support of Bangladesh's demand to move its matches out of India, the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has halted its team's preparations for the event, to be organised by India and Sri Lanka next month, according to a news report. A day after Pakistan threatened to pull out of the T20 World Cup if Bangladesh's demand to relocate its matches out of India was not accepted, the PCB has acted and asked the team to ease up on its preparations for the event, Telecom Asia Sport reported Monday. "The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has put on hold all preparations for the national team ahead of the ICC T20 World Cup 2026, with the team management briefed about the plans," top PCB sources told www.telecomasia.net.

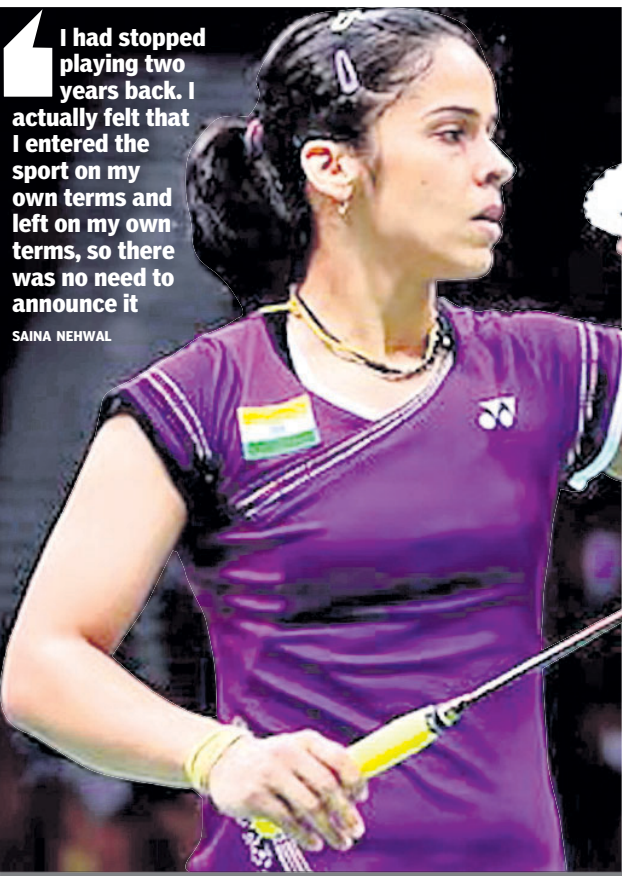

Melbourne, Jan 19: Novak Djokovic equaled two all-time tennis records by starting his 21st Australian Open, and he added another milestone Monday night with his 100th win at Melbourne Park. He liked the sound of it. "I mean, what can I say? I like the sound of it — centurion is pretty nice," the 24-time major winner said after his 6-3, 6-2, 6-2 first-round win over Pedro Martinez of Spain. "Nice feeling." The 38-year-old Djokovic is now 100-10 at the Australian Open, where he's won 10 titles. He also has won 102 at Wimbledon and 101 at Roland Garros. What he really wants more than anything is six more in the next two weeks, enough to win a 25th major and become the most



decorated tennis player of all time. By starting his 21st Australian Open campaign, he equaled the tournament

tensity training impossible. The 2012 London Olympic bronze medallist last played a competitive match at the Singapore Open in 2023 but did not formally announce her retirement at the time.

She has twice reached the semifinals. Yuan was swinging freely and rifling winners as she took a 5-3 lead, and Swiatek had to switch things up. "I was a bit rusty at the beginning," she said. "Many ups and downs, but overall I have some stuff to work on. I'll just focus on that."
