

Scolded by parents, four girls end lives

Aurangabad: Four girls allegedly died by suicide together after their parents scolded them for mingling with boys at a place in Bihar's Aurangabad district, a senior police officer said on Monday. Five girls, aged between 10 and 14 years, had reportedly consumed some poisonous substance on January 29 in a Dalit settlement in Haspura police station area, and only one of them survived. They were cremated on the same day without a postmortem examination, and the police have begun an investigation after the local media reported it. **P9**

Oppn to move motion for Birla's removal

Amid the ongoing Budget Session, the Opposition has signalled it will move a no-confidence motion against Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, accusing him of procedural bias for limiting Opposition participation, especially by denying Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi opportunities to speak. The proposed move reflects deepening political friction and distrust between the Opposition and the Speaker over parliamentary conduct as Birla had also faced similar situation in the past

moving a resolution against the Speaker for his removal, for disallowing the LoP from speaking in the House on the motion of thanks, for not initiating action against BJP MP Nishikant Dubey, for making unsubstantiated charges against women MPs of the Congress and suspension of eight opposition MPs, the sources said.

They said a resolution in this regard would soon be moved in the Lok Sabha and signatures of MPs are being procured.

The resolution is likely to have signatures of 100 MPs in the Lok Sabha and getting the signatures of various Opposi-

tion MPs is under process.

Sources said the decision to move the resolution was taken at a meeting of Opposition leaders held in the chamber of Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge this morning.

The TMC also attended the meeting besides other parties, including the left, DMK, SP, RJD, Shiv Sena (UBT) and NCP (SP) and RSP.

This will be the fourth such notice against the sitting Speaker of Lok Sabha.

The first such resolution was moved against MV Malavankar, which was defeated. Later, a resolution was moved against them Speaker Hukum Singh, which could not be taken up due to lack of numbers in the House.

Later another similar resolution, the third one, was moved against them Speaker Balram Jakhar, which was also defeated.

Separately, women Congress MPs have written to Speaker Om Birla over the "unsubstantiated allegations" made by him against Congress women MPs.

FIR over circulation of Narvane's book

New Delhi, Feb 9: The Delhi Police has registered an FIR over the circulation of an unpublished book of former Chief of Army Staff Gen MM Naravane on social media, an official statement said Monday.

The Delhi Police has taken cognisance of information circulating on social media platforms and online news forums claiming that a pre-print copy of a book titled Four Stars of Destiny is being circulated without mandatory clearance from competent authorities," the statement said.

"Upon verification, it was found that a PDF copy of a type-set book with the same title and apparently prepared by M/s Penguin Random House India Pvt Ltd is available on certain websites and, also, some online marketing platforms have displayed the finished book cover as if it is available for purchase," it read.

The police said a case has been registered with the Special Cell in order to carry out a thorough investigation into this purported leak or breach of a yet-to-be-approved publication and an investigation is being taken up.

Bhumi's concern

Mumbai: As the crime thriller *Bhakshak* completes two years since its release, actress Bhumi Pednekar says the film feels even more heartbreak today, as the grim realities it highlighted continue to dominate headlines across the world.

Bhumi took to Instagram, where she wrote: "Two years ago, *Bhakshak* travelled across borders, messages poured in from every corner of the world, not because people just watched it, but because people felt it. I was overwhelmed then. I'm heartbroken today. Because the truth is, this story is still so relevant. Sexual violence on women and children is becoming the basic thread of us".

Bhumi pointed out that recent global developments have once again exposed how unsafe the world continues to be for children. Her remarks come at a time when international cases such as the Jeffrey Epstein scandal continue to resurface in public discourse.

"The last few weeks have reminded us how unsafe the world can be for children. No child should have to grow up hyper-aware of danger. That burden belongs to us not them," she added.

"Children deserve freedom. To play. To dress as they choose. To be protected, accepted, and held by society when they have no one. Some films end when the credits roll. Some refuse to let us look away."

Despite these challenges, Ayesha said she chooses to focus on the positive aspects of her journey and appreciates those who show empathy and respect.

Meanwhile, Sunny Deol is at number three after *Border 2*, Zoya Afroz ranks fourth, and Samara Tijori is fifth.


Shah Rukh Khan and Aishwarya Rai hold eighth and tenth positions.

Bhubaneswar: At least 18 children were admitted to hospital after having ice-cream in Cuttack district Monday, police said. 94% GRIEVANCES RESOLVED: CMO

Bhubaneswar, Feb 9: Of the 14,054 complaints received during the last 16 hearings at the Chief Minister's Grievance Cell, 13,169 — about 94 per cent — have so far been resolved, the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) said, as CM Mohan Charan Mahi conducted the 17th round of public grievance hearings at Unit-II here Monday.

Accompanied by five senior ministers and senior officers from various departments, the CM personally listened to grievances raised by citizens.



As is customary, the CM began the programme by meeting differently-abled persons outside the grievance cell, patiently listening to their problems and issuing on-the-spot instructions to officials for immediate redressal.

"Out of 32 differently-abled complainants, financial assistance was sanctioned for those suffering from critical illnesses. Brajakishore Bandha of Bhadrak was granted ₹1 lakh, while Kartik C of Jajpur received ₹1.50 lakh for medical treatment. The CM also directed departments to take prompt

action on other medical assistance requests," the CMO said.

In another case, Tilotama Pandey from Patnagarh, suffering from kidney and neurological ailments, was assured medical support along with travel expenses. The CM personally interacted with all complainants suffering from serious ailments and instructed officials to ensure compassionate and time-bound solutions.

Subsequently, complaints registered inside the grievance cell were taken up and reviewed.

SC terms digital arrests dacoity

Delhi, Feb 9: The Supreme Court on Monday termed the siphoning of over ₹54,000 crore through digital arrests so far as nothing short of "robbery or dacoity" and directed the Centre to formulate a standard operating procedure (SoP) to tackle such offences.

A bench led by Chief Justice of India Surya Kant, along with Justices Joymalya Bagchi and NV Anjaria, noted that the money lost to digital fraud exceeds the annual budgets of several small states.

"These offences may occur due to either collusion or negligence on the part of bank officials. This necessitates prompt action by the RBI and banks," the bench observed, according to this agency.

The top court pointed out that the Reserve Bank of India has already framed an SoP requiring banks to temporarily block debit cards to prevent cyber-enabled fraud. It directed the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) to examine the RBI's SoP, along with similar protocols or decisions taken by the Department of Telecom (DoT), and prepare a draft memorandum of understanding (MoU) within four weeks to effectively address such crimes.

The bench also instructed the CBI to identify cases involving digital arrests and directed the Gujarat and Delhi governments to grant sanction to the agency to proceed with investigations in these matters.



Further, the Supreme Court asked the RBI, DoT, and other stakeholders to hold a joint meeting and develop a framework for compensating victims of digital arrest scams. Emphasising the need for a "pragmatic and liberal approach" in awarding compensation, the court posted the matter for further hearing after four weeks and asked authorities to submit fresh status reports before the next date.

Earlier, on December 16 last year, the bench had asked the Centre to consider suggestions made by the amicus curiae on ensuring compensation for victims, while expressing concern over the massive sums siphoned out of the country by cybercriminals.

CRPF JAWAN DIES BY SUICIDE AT CAMP

Rourkela, Feb 9: A Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) jawan shot himself dead allegedly from his service revolver at a CRPF camp in Mathakamjharan under Lathikata police limits in Sundargarh district Monday morning, officials said.

The deceased was identified as Subhash Prasad, 56, a native of Nandgaon in Uttar Pradesh's Padia district. Police have registered a case-2/26 of unnatural death and launched an investigation.

The incident occurred at the Mathakamjharan camp. Prasad was on duty when the incident took place. He was rushed to the Rourkela Government Hospital (RGH), where doctors pronounced him dead.

After a postmortem conducted around 2 p.m., the body was handed over to the CRPF. In the evening, it was sent to Ranchi, from where it is to be airlifted to Uttar Pradesh, sources said.

According to officials, the camp was inaugurated in October last year under Lathikata police limits as part of anti-Maoist operations along the Odisha-Jharkhand border, in coordination with the CRPF. Prasad had been posted at the camp since its opening.

While the exact cause of death is yet to be ascertained, preliminary information suggests possible personal or family-related stress, police said. An investigation is underway.

28-year-old man killed by girlfriend's live-in partner

Bhubaneswar, Feb 9: A 28-year-old man was allegedly stabbed to death by his girlfriend's live-in partner in Niladri Vihar under Chandrasekharpur police limits here late Sunday night, police said Monday.

The deceased was identified as Satyabrata Pradhan of Hasinapur in Brahmagiri. Based on a complaint lodged by his brother Rajesh, Chandrasekharpur police registered a murder case (124/26) and launched an investigation.

Police have detained the woman for questioning, while the prime accused, Dinabandhu Nayak, is absconding. Senior officers and a forensic team visited the spot and seized blood samples and a knife believed to have been used in the crime.

According to police, Dinabandhu and the woman, both from Erasama in Jagatsinghpur district, had been in a relationship since their school days. After moving to Bhubaneswar for work, they had been living together in Niladri Vihar Sector-II for about eight months.

The woman later came in contact with Satyabrata through Instagram and the two developed a relationship. On Sunday night, Satyabrata was visiting her to celebrate Chocolate Day when Dinabandhu arrived unexpectedly. Enraged on seeing them together, he allegedly stabbed Satyabrata with a kitchen knife.

The injured man was

rushed to Capital Hospital by the woman and Dinabandhu, where doctors declared him dead on arrival. The woman later informed the car owner about the incident. While returning after retrieving the vehicle, the driver—allegedly under the influence of alcohol—lost control, and the car veered off a bridge near Sishu Bhawan Square.

Capital police reached the accident site, recovered the damaged vehicle, and detained the car owner and driver for questioning.

6-lane NH-55, 4-lane state highways soon

Bhubaneswar, Feb 9: If things go well, National Highway (NH) 55 connecting Sambalpur and Cuttack will be widened to six lanes, while all state highways will be expanded to four lanes, as Works Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan Monday directed officers to fast-track measures for the mega initiative.

Reviewing various ongoing and proposed development projects of the Works department at Lok Seva Bhawan here, Harichandan directed officials to significantly speed up execution to meet Odisha's long-term infrastructure goals.

Emphasising the vision of the Prime Minister for Odisha's development and the state's resolve to build a 'Viksit Odisha' by 2036, Harichandan said that rapid implementation of road and infrastructure projects is essential. He instructed senior officers and engineers to leverage modern software, technology and professional expertise to improve efficiency and project delivery.

He stated that the overall development of the state cannot be achieved by focusing only on major cities. Instead, strong and seamless connectivity across all regions must be ensured.

Drawing parallels with the Bhubaneswar city expansion plan, Harichandan stressed the need to prepare a proposal



for the construction of an outer ring road for Cuttack city.

Highlighting the importance of strengthening east-west connectivity in Odisha, he discussed with officers regarding a survey to expand the Sambalpur-Cuttack NH-55 into six lanes. Additionally, the minister directed officials to take fast-track steps to upgrade all state highways to four lanes, and to initiate surveys and submit detailed reports to the government at the earliest.

In the presence of Works department Principal Secretary Sanjay Kumar Singh and OBCC Managing Director Anupam Saha, the meeting reviewed several key road projects, including Jayadev Vihar-Nandankanan Road and the Left Parallel Road, Pataragadia-Daruthen-

ga Road, proposed Kelucharan-Pulnakhara Road, Palasuni to Garage Square Road, Acharya Vihar-Kalinga Hospital Road, Kaimatia Square-Gothapatna Road, Gohuria to Chhatbar via Madanpur Road and AIIMS access road.

The review also included major NH projects such as widening of the Konark-Puri-Satapada Road, new alignment for the Pipili-Konark Road, Cuttack-Kandarpur Road and Kandarpur-Balikuda Road and construction of Jeypore bypass and Bolangir bypass.

The minister reiterated that timely completion of these projects would play a crucial role in boosting connectivity, economic growth and balanced regional development across Odisha.

Mass deworming, Vitamin A campaign to roll out today

Bhubaneswar, Feb 9: In a major push to improve child nutrition, curb anaemia and prevent intestinal worm infections, the state government will roll out National Deworming Day (NDD) February 10 alongside the Vitamin A Supplementation (VAS) programme across all 30 districts of Odisha.

The biannual Vitamin A Supplementation programme will reach an estimated 32 lakh children aged 9 to 60 months, aimed at boosting immunity and reducing child mortality and morbidity.

Speaking on the occasion, Director of Family Welfare Shakti Prakash Mishra said National Deworming Day is a critical public health intervention that protects children from parasitic infections and helps address anaemia among young women.

"Regular deworming supports better nutrition, healthier growth and improved school participation, contributing to long-term development," he said. Nutrition Specialist at Unicef Odisha Sourav Bhattacharjee highlighted the benefits of integration, noting that combining deworming with Vitamin A supplementation allows families to access multiple essential health services through a single platform.

The large-scale campaign will be conducted through government, government-aided and private schools, as well as Anganwadi centres.

**Absence of public toilets hits hygiene at Palasuni**

Bhubaneswar, Feb 9: The Palasuni square is considered one of the busiest junctions in the City as it witnesses huge footfall everyday due to its market area, bus and auto stands. Despite effectively being the entry point to the Capital City of Bhubaneswar and one of the busiest areas, the residents have informed that the place lacks a public toilet, compromising on the sanitation and cleanliness of the place.

The locals informed that due to the lack of public toilet, the local shopkeepers, auto drivers along with the passengers are urinating in open. Women in particular are having a hard time to find a toilet in the area.

"Since the last six years, we have been demanding to set up a public toilet here. Neither the civic body nor the government has addressed the issue. A shop has been erected in the place dedicated for the construction of public toilet," said a social worker Narayana Prusty.

When asked about the land issue concerning the construction



was supposed to build here but the work didn't commence due to a reported land issue. This place also witnesses a lot of passengers who board buses and auto rickshaws here; they also face the similar issue. A public toilet is much needed here," said an auto driver.

"The land belongs to water resource department. We have written to them and waiting for their nod. Once we get the clearance, the construction will commence," said City Engineer Narad Chandra Rath.

Meanwhile, BMC Additional Commissioner Kailash Chandra Das has informed,

"We have a proposal for Palasuni and in March this year,

a public toilet will be built there, which can be accessible by the people".

Naveen urges CM to act on paddy procurement crisis

Bhubaneswar, Feb 9: Expressing grave concern over hardships faced by farmers during the ongoing paddy procurement process, Leader of Opposition Naveen Patnaik Monday alleged widespread exploitation and administrative lapses, urging Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi to take immediate corrective steps to ease farmers' distress.

In a letter to the Chief Minister, Patnaik said the Kharif paddy procurement process has become a severe ordeal for farmers, blaming administrative apathy and the BJP government's failure to honour promises made in its 2024 election manifesto.

He recalled that the BJP had

pledged to raise the Minimum

Support Price (MSP) for paddy and abolish deductions (kati-

ni-chatni) altogether.

However, Patnaik alleged that mandis across the state have become centres of harass-

ment, with farmers facing arbitrary deductions of 5-7 kg per quintal on grounds of moisture content and quality.

He said the practice, reported in several districts, reflects alleged collusion between millers and local officials, depriving farmers of the rightful returns on their labour.

Questioning the government's commitment, the former chief minister asked when the BJP would fulfil its electoral promises and deliver justice to farmers. Patnaik also criti-

cised the government's decision to cap the ₹800 per quintal input subsidy at 150 quintals per farmer, calling it a violation of assurances made to all farmers. He said the ceiling unfairly penalises higher-producing cultivators and contradicts the BJP's own resolution document, while questioning the rollback of the promised ₹3,100 per quintal subsidy on the entire produce.

Highlighting operational lapses, Patnaik said the slow

pace of paddy procurement has forced farmers to stay awake at night to guard their produce from dew and theft.

He cited the lack of basic mandi facilities, a failing token system and delayed payments as factors pushing farmers toward protest. The Leader of Opposition said the BJP's manifesto promise of DBT payments within 48 hours of procurement remains largely unmet, with many farmers waiting over a week.

"Is this not a failure to honour electoral promises?" he asked.

Patnaik alleged that deductions, the 150-quintal ceiling and delays in procurement and payment have created an abnormal situation, pushing farmers into the clutches of unscrupulous traders and millers. Urging immediate intervention, the Leader of Opposition asked the Chief Minister to deploy special squads at mandis to curb illegal deductions, act against erring millers and officials, & withdraw the 150-quintal subsidy ceiling.

to the discussion.



While the walk revived memories of CT Road's cosmopolitan past, participants voiced concern over its declining global appeal, citing congestion, unplanned urban growth and a shift toward mass domestic tourism that has diluted its distinctive character.

3 migrant workers from Ganjam tortured in TN

DIGAPAHANDI POLICE RUSH TEAM TO THE SOUTHERN STATE FOR RESCUE

Digapahandi, Feb 9: Three migrant workers from Ganjam district were allegedly detained illegally and tortured at a private company in Tamil Nadu, prompting Digapahandi police to rush a team to the southern state for their rescue.

The workers were identified as B Budu Reddy (32), son of B Tabat Reddy; B Purna Reddy (30), son of B Ganesh Reddy; and S Dhoba Dora (31), son of S Duryodhan Dora. All of them hail from Lakshmi Narayapuram under B Turubudi panchayat in Digapahandi block. They had travelled to Nagapatinam district in Tamil Nadu around 15 days back along with a labour contractor after being promised work at a



biscuit factory.

As no work was provided, the trio decided to return home and reached the nearest railway station. At that point, another labour contractor allegedly lured them back to a company assuring employment. According to

the complaint, the company owner confined the workers in a room, seized their mobile phones and forced them to work like bonded labour.

The workers alleged that they were denied food for three consecutive days and had access to a mobile phone

for only a few minutes each evening, preventing them from speaking to family members. When they demanded wages, they were reportedly assaulted and subjected to physical torture at the instance of the company owner.

Dhoba Dora managed to

inform his family about the ordeal over the phone Friday, prompting his father Duryodhan, along with Purna Reddy's wife Mukta Reddy and mother Sumitra Reddy, to lodge a complaint at Digapahandi police station Saturday.

Based on the complaint, a case (44/26) was registered, and IIC-cum-DSP Prashant Kumar Patra briefed Berhampur Superintendent of Police Dr Saravanan Vivek M. The SP contacted his Tamil Nadu counterpart and sought assistance.

Following the SP's directions, a police team led by SI Mahaprasad Mohanty left for Tamil Nadu Monday morning to rescue the workers. The matter has also been brought to the notice of the district administration and labour authorities.

Hash oil manufacturing unit busted, 4 arrested

AP incursions force admin to push Raipahad development

Koraput, Feb 9: The Koraput district administration and Nandapur block officials have intensified development efforts in the disputed Raipahad village under Golar panchayat following reports that leaders from Andhra Pradesh visited Raipahad and nearby Gandiguda villages and allegedly attempted to persuade residents to integrate with the neighboring state.

The move comes a day after district and block officials inspected Raipahad to assess the ground situation. In response, the state and Zilla Parishad development departments have initiated steps to resolve long-pending issues and extend welfare benefits to local residents.

Ten families have been included under the Antyodaya housing

"All families will be provided homestead land titles and land pattas for coffee plantation in the coming days," Nandapur Tehsildar Debabrata Moharana said.

Block Development Officer Durga Prasad Dora said construction of a concrete road to Raipahad village has been initiated by the Sunabeda R&B division. The Rural Water Supply and Sanitation department has repaired the defunct spring-based wa-

ter supply system, while the panchayat administration has restored solar-powered streetlights. Construction of houses under the housing scheme will begin Tuesday, officials said.

Land identified for coffee cultivation will be developed under the Nandapur watershed project using funds from the VB-G RAM G Scheme.

Dora said applications related to Aadhaar, ration cards, labour cards, social security pensions and housing schemes will be processed during the upcoming panchayat-level public hearing at the Golar panchayat office.

Local intelligentsia urged the administration to show similar commitment towards development of other border villages in the Nandapur block.

WALKING INTO A TRAP



Battle Over Book

A unseemly controversy has been created over an unpublished book penned by former Army Chief General MM Naravane. It has already rocked the Parliament with Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh objecting to Leader of the Opposition (LoP) Rahul Gandhi's attempt to raise it in the House violating rules that stipulate contents of an unpublished book cannot be discussed in the Lok Sabha. But neither the Speaker nor the government is correct in stonewalling a debate on the specious plea of House rules, when the government is guilty of withholding permission for the publication of the book for far too long. Interestingly, the book is already in circulation on social media platforms on .pdf format. However this resistance by the government to allow publication of the book itself suggests all is not well with it and it is oversensitive about discussion of defence policies, strategic decisions and military manoeuvres that may strengthen democratic institutions with new lights shed by top professionals rather than weaken them. Withholding any information about armed forces and how politicians deal with related issues from the tax payer of a democratic nation can never be defended.

When the chiefs of India's armed forces—the Army, Air Force and Navy—fold their uniforms and retire, they have every right like any other citizen of the country to share their experiences and perspectives in the form of books. Such works often take the form of accounts of military decisions, strategy, war memories, leadership principles and national security experiences. It would be diabolical to claim such memoirs can ever be security risks. These books form a treasure trove of historical information and insight into strategy and also for public discourse. Of course, they need to go through several security restrictions and government regulations to ensure no military or strategic secrets are divulged for the benefit of enemies of the country. At the same time, it would be childish to suggest that top military officials are so naive as not to know the rules of the game.

Against this backdrop, the political storm unleashed by excerpts from the unpublished book of Naravane has raised serious concerns for the health of democracy and military accountability, apart from free speech, in the country. The former Army Chief has purportedly shared, among many other experiences, in his unpublished book given to a reputed publisher details of a high-altitude confrontation between Indian and Chinese forces. He has graphically portrayed how he awaited clearance from the top—the Defence Minister and the Prime Minister—for action against an intruding Chinese force. Immediate response was needed to stop the intruders, but the Defence Minister sat on the matter for far too long and then told the Army Chief that the PM's message to him was to act in whatever manner he thought fit. Naravane felt terribly let down and "alone", as the LoP said quoting from excerpts of the unpublished book published by a media outlet.

There is no doubt the clearance processes are vital for preserving military secrets. All the same the government is wrong to maintain prolonged silence and opaque delays for the publication of the book. If it thinks Naravane's book contains too sensitive material to be published, it should say so. No official word till date only strengthens the suspicion that the government has something very big that it desires to hide. Question arises whether there is any conspiracy at work to suppress weakness on the part of politicians who have no qualms in claiming credit for successful military operations, relegating the actual heroes on the battlefield to the background, while refusing to take the blame in case any military manoeuvre goes wrong.

The tendency to make political capital of the heroic exploits of the country's armed forces has become too pronounced in the past decade. Such blatant misuse of the military for political gain by the powers that be was not seen earlier. On the contrary, the political establishment does not show the same courage or leadership to share the blame for any failure in the battlefield.

Several senior officers associated with the Indian Army—former chiefs or senior commanders—have written or dictated books based on war experiences and leadership. General VP Malik's book provides a detailed account of the 1999 Kargil War. Lieutenant General KJS Dhillon has written about recent cross-border operations against Pakistan. Other books focusing on adventure, struggle and military life are also available, revealing soldiers' personal experiences. These works typically describe military decisions, battlefield strategies, difficult leadership choices and the hardships faced by soldiers. The IAF's top leadership has also shared its experiences. Former Air Chief PC Lal and others have books to their credit focusing on Air Force history and personal missions. Numerous writings based on the biographies, war memories and leadership values of senior pilots and commanders are also available as books.

All these suggest authentic, inside stories of the defence establishments and war time experiences are welcome both for public knowledge and understanding defence policies. One more book does more good and no harm but this unpublished book seems it could badly puncture falsely bloated egos of currently powerful people.

Whichever way you spin this, it should be clear that the nation has bowed to the diktats of the US in return for a trade agreement that eases punitive tariffs on India but also barters away the nation's long term interests and compromises the much-vaunted strategic autonomy that has been the centrepiece of Indian policy framework for long. It is true that not every detail of what was called the "interim agreement regarding reciprocal and mutually beneficial trade" between the two nations is known. But what is known, including the circumstances surrounding the deal, the manner of its announcement, the language of the joint statement and the connected White House executive order, indicate that India has shifted some long-held positions and to that extent this is not a deal between two equals.

The US high handedness stretched to simple courtesies like the timing of the release of the agreed statement. Trump announced the broad agreement on his social media platform 'Truth Social' on Feb. 2, days ahead of the official release by both nations, on Feb. 6/7. The Indian government announcement of the joint statement on PIB is time stamped Feb. 7, 4.20 am IST, an unconventional hour that presented as a US-led announcement working to US time zones. If Nehru told us famously that "when the world sleeps, India will awake to life and freedom," then we may say that the deal marks a literal and metaphorical reversal of that dawn of independence and idealism, because as India slept, the US closed a deal that snatches away India's right to

decide its goals, its preferences, its trade partners and to that extent its independence.

A tighter embrace with the US on onerous terms, particularly but not limited to the food and the agri sector, carries the risk of a longer-term ecosystem change that may well be irreversible and forces India on a path that will make many in the country very uncomfortable.

The RSS and its groups will also not be comfortable with what has transpired as can be seen from the statement of the Bharatiya Kisan Sangh, an RSS affiliate, that there should be no route open for genetically modified (GM) related products to enter the country. The Trumpian style of forced deal making and the US' ways of the Wild West may pass with time, but the implications of this trade deal will continue to exact a price on India long after. Compromises for short term inevitably bring disaster for long term.

As farmer groups raise voices of protest against the opening of the agri sector to US imports, the nation has been assured that the interests of India's farmers and MSME

sector will remain protected, and that no GM crops will enter India as part of the deal. But consider that the 'no-GM' imports claim holds by a thin thread—for example, dried distillers' grains, or DDGs for animal feed, which feature in the first bullet of the trade agreement as announced, come mostly from GM crop.

DDGs, a by-product of ethanol production from corn, add nutritional value in animal feed but can it be claimed that the GM "quality" is erased after the heavy processing that the corn goes through as ethanol is extracted? There is no consensus that the transgenic nature is eliminated in the processing. Further, if this is not a red line for India, having given in now, then how long can India hold out on other points, say dairy on which the US has been pushing much like it has on DDGs?

Do note that India's position against milk imports (which is not part of this deal) is seen by the US as a Foreign Trade Barrier. In the Indian view, dairy must only be from animals that are not given blood meals or feeds containing

internal organs or tissue of ruminant or porcine, but the US holds that this view lacks a "discernible animal health or human health justification." The pressure on dairy from the US will not go away but will likely increase over time, now that India has opened a window. In this light, the statement in the trade agreement that "India also agrees to address long-standing non-tariff barriers to the trade in US food and agricultural products" indicates the nature of the trap that India has walked into.

Equally problematic is the statement that within six months India must determine "with a view towards a positive outcome ... whether US-developed or international standards, including testing requirements, are acceptable for the purposes of US exports entering the Indian market in identified sectors." The executive order issued by Trump lowering tariffs on India also puts in place a committee that "shall monitor whether India resumes directly or indirectly importing Russian Federation oil," with the threat of punitive duties coming back if it is determined that India has not stopped or has resumed buying Russian oil.

None of this should keep India comfortable. The government has of course gone on the aggressive in defending the deal, but it is unlikely that the nation will accept these terms in toto. It would be appropriate for the government not to oversell the deal. Prudence would be to leave room for some backtracking in the light of evolving public opinion.

Trump has condemned Europe to success



THE EU HAS PROVEN OVER AND OVER THAT IT IS CAPABLE OF REFORMING ITSELF, DESPITE RESISTANCE FROM ENEMIES WITHIN AND OUTSIDE ITS BORDERS

The EU was created as an antidote to power politics. But to survive, it must become a superpower, contradicting the very principle on which it was founded. The reason is US President Donald Trump, who is forcing it to transform itself almost against its will.

The EU does not need to turn its back on the US; but it must recognize that it can rely only on itself, and that means acquiring hard (military) power. Although Trump's time in office is limited, Trumpism could endure. Despite his transactional approach and rapidly fluctuating positions, Trump may represent a more lasting doctrine. After all, many of his first-term policies—from tariffs to his confrontational stance toward China—survived his defeat in 2020, and he was hardly the first US president to demand greater contributions from other NATO members.

Moreover, the Republican Party is now fully under Trump's control, having ousted or forced out anyone who did not embrace the MAGA movement. Trump has also subjugated the US financial, legal, and tech elite, and developed a deep bench of potential successors. Safe in his position, he can now focus on establishing a dynasty and

securing his legacy, including through territorial expansion.

Although Trump did step back from his threat to use force in pursuing a US takeover of Greenland, that crisis is not over. He dropped his demand for US sovereignty over the island only after Europe signaled a willingness to respond—finally—with something other than appeasement. The European Parliament suspended work on a trade agreement with the US. Many EU leaders called for the bloc's anti-coercion mechanism to be used, while most refused to join Trump's bizarre pay-to-play Board of Peace.

As long as EU's most serious problems were Hungarian PM Viktor Orbán and Russian President Vladimir Putin, it could more or less accept the status quo. But the emergence of another Putin in Washington leaves the EU in a completely different position.

Fortunately, the EU has all assets it needs to be one of three or four superpowers. Its common market surpasses any other economy in size, and it can match anyone in terms of its alliances and soft power. While Western Europe is reckoning with anaemic GDP growth, Central and Eastern European economies are developing rapidly. No US state has grown as fast as Poland in

the last 25 years.

Yes, the EU lags behind the US and China in terms of innovation and access to raw materials, but they face difficult challenges, too. China is struggling with inauspicious demographics and very low consumption. US power is being hollowed out from within through the Trump administration's war on scientific research, higher education, immigration, rule of law, and international institutions.

And Russia has pretty much nothing going for it, other than a fully committed war economy.

There are good reasons why Ukraine and a dozen other countries dream of joining the EU. Taking inspiration from Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky's statement the night after Russia's full-scale invasion on February 24, 2022: half a billion people are here; a huge industrial base is here; one-sixth of the world's GDP is here; and allies are here.

In other words, Europe has massive latent power, and it is beginning to do more to unlock its potential. In the short and medium term, it must fight for time and resolve the "Ukrainian question," just as the West resolved the "Eastern European question" in the 1990s. Trump has already shifted this problem to Eu-

rope by refusing to finance the Ukrainian army and state. Five years ago, it would have seemed absurdly optimistic to predict that the EU would be able to issue joint debt, buy weapons, and make key decisions without unanimity. No one could have guessed that Sweden and Finland would finally abandon their neutrality and join NATO, significantly strengthening the alliance's European pillar.

Yet all that has happened, and more. European defense companies are now growing much faster than their American counterparts. The fastest-growing European company today is the German arms manufacturer Rheinmetall. If the million-strong Ukrainian army—as battle-hardened and innovative as any in the world—remains on Europe's side and does not fall into Russian hands, Europe will have everything it needs to be a military superpower in the age of drone warfare.

The EU has proven over and over that it is capable of reforming itself, despite resistance from enemies within and outside its borders. To paraphrase Zelensky again: Europe does not need a free ride; it needs arms.

Thanya Nathan to become Kerala's first judge with visual disability

Thiruvananthapuram, Feb 9: When the Supreme Court last year allowed persons with disabilities to enter the judicial service, 24-year-old Thanya Nathan saw a new opportunity open up.

Inspired by the judgment, the law graduate with a visual disability from Mangad in Kannur district decided to prepare for the judicial service examination.

Now, she has topped the Civil Judge (Junior Division) examination under the persons with disabilities category and is set to become Kerala's first judge with a visual disability.

Speaking to PTI as she awaits her appointment letter, Nathan said she is ready to face the challenges of the profession.

"I know it will be a challenging career. But technology has advanced to a stage where most judicial work can be handled using assistive tools such as screen readers and dictation software," she said.

Blind since birth, Nathan began her education at a special school in Dharmadom, studied up to Class 10 at Parassinikadavu High School, and completed her higher secondary education at Morazha Government Higher Secondary School.

She decided to pursue law while studying plus two. With the support of her family, she cleared the entrance examination and went on to top the LLB course at Kannur University, where she was the only student with a visual disability in the college.

"The staff were not used to

teaching students with disabilities, but they made an effort to understand my needs and support me, which helped me

overcome the gap," she said.

After enrolling as an advocate, Nathan began practising under lawyer KG Sunilkumar in Thaliparamba, Kannur.

It was during this period that the Supreme Court judgment delivered by Justices JB Pardiwala and R Mahadevan in 2025 was pronounced.

"That judgment inspired me to apply when the notification for the examination was issued," she said.

Nathan said she prepared for the examination on her own, making notes using Braille scripts.

For the interview, she sought guidance from a lawyer in Thiruvananthapuram.

"The interview panel asked how I planned to work with my disability. I explained my approach, and I believe my

answers convinced them," she said.

Sunilkumar described her as sharp and methodical.

"After the shift from the IPC to the Bharatiya Nyaya Sahita, even experienced lawyers get confused. But if you ask Thanya, she can recall sections instantly. She handles e-documents with ease and has appeared in court several times," he said.

The Kerala High Court has forwarded the selection list to the state government, which will issue the appointment order. Nathan said infrastructure accessibility would be the biggest challenge ahead.

"Our systems are not fully accessible yet. I hope the government will take appropriate steps so that I can work comfortably," she said.

CMFRI achieves milestone in mangrove clam breeding

Kochi (Kerala), Feb 9: The ICAR-CMFRI has successfully achieved induced breeding of the mangrove clam (*Geloina erosa*) under captive conditions.

This is expected to make a significant scientific milestone for community managed estuarine aquaculture of this threatened resource by integrating with mangrove conservation, a Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI) statement said Monday.

Mangrove clams, also known as mud clams, are a vital yet dwindling resource in estuarine and mangrove ecosystems across South and Southeast Asia, it said.

Despite their dwindling availability, mangrove clams remain a valued local delicacy in many parts of the country, especially in Northern Kerala.

Called as 'Kandal Kakka' in local parlance, the species inhabits organic-rich muddy substrates in intertidal mangrove zones, it said.

Scientists of the Mariculture Division of the institute successfully induced spawning of mangrove clams and completed full embryonic and larval development under controlled condi-



tions, recording successful spat settlement from the 18th day after spawning.

The breakthrough marks one of the very few documented instances globally of induced breeding, larval rearing and spat production of the man-

grove clam, it said.

The scientists are now working to standardise larval rearing and nursery management protocols to enhance survival rates and enable large-scale seed production.

CMFRI scientists are of the view that the development of hatchery technology and grow-out farming in suitable estuarine systems could pave the way for low-input farming.

According to them, the stock of this resource can be sustainably enhanced through ranching of hatchery-produced seeds in critical mangrove ecosystems, thereby supporting the clam restoration and mangrove conservation.

Sarma 'inciting genocide' against Muslims: Gaurav

CM feigns ignorance of any 'shooting video'

Guwahati, Feb 9: The political slugfest in Assam escalated Monday with Himanta Biswa Sarma upping the ante against Congress leader Gaurav Gogoi over his alleged Pakistan links and the latter accusing the chief minister of "inciting genocide" against Muslims through his videos, and demanding police action.

Meanwhile, Sarma, who is under attack for a video showing him purportedly taking aim with a rifle and firing a shot at two people, one wearing a skull cap and the other with a beard, with "point-blank shot" as the caption, expressed ignorance about the visual clip.

The video, posted by Assam BJP on its official social media handle Saturday, was deleted after a huge political backlash.

The Sarma-Gogoi confrontation has deepened the battle lines in the state ahead of the assembly polls. The elections to the 126-member Assam assembly are scheduled to be held in the next three months.

Addressing a press conference, a day after Sarma accused Gogoi of clandestinely visiting Pakistan in 2013, and claimed that it is suspected that he had undergone "some kind of training there", the Congress leader said there was nothing in the Assam Police report to prove Sarma's allegations of 'Pakistani links' against him. Gogoi also questioned why the BJP leader was 'sitting' over the report for six months if there was any evidence of his involvement in 'anti-national' activities.

As Gogoi shared details of his 2013 Pakistan visit, Sarma demanded a "transparent explanation" over the trip to Rawalpindi district, asserting that his visa "explicitly permitted travel only to Lahore, Karachi and Islamabad" and under Pakistan's immigration rules,



travel beyond visa-designated cities is not permitted without specific authorisation.

In an apparent reference to the deleted video, Gogoi alleged that "the Assam Chief Minister is inciting genocide against Muslims through his videos... Police must take suo motu cognisance of Sarma targeting a particular community, and sharing vicious social media videos." Speaking to reporters on the sidelines of an official function at Dibrugarh later, Sarma said, "I don't know anything about any video."

"The chief minister did not want to reveal the SIT report. He sat over it for six months. He went page by page through it but could not find any evidence to back his allegations of my undergoing some training (in Pakistan), being an ISI agent, etc. If the findings were so important from the national security point of view, why did he wait for six months? Multi-state quake mock drill held in Arunachal, Meghalaya, Mizoram

Itanagar, Feb 9: A multi-state mock drill on earthquake preparedness was conducted across Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya and Mizoram Monday in collaboration with the National Disaster Management Authority to enhance disaster response coordination and identify preparedness gaps, officials said.

In Arunachal Pradesh, the state disaster management department organised a table-top exercise in Itanagar based on a multi-state earthquake scenario, an official communiqué informed.

The exercise was aimed to create awareness, strengthen coordination among departments and agencies, and assess readiness to handle natural calamities.

NDMA senior consultant Na-deem Arshad said disasters do not recognise man-made boundaries and such exercises help strengthen disaster resilience, inter-state collaboration and effective response mechanisms.

He stressed the need to empower state and district disaster management authorities to lead response efforts at the local level and emphasised the inclusion of more casualty simulations in future mock exercises.

Arshad also underlined that the use of standard operating procedures (SOPs) during such

drills is mandatory.

Highlighting the importance of regular preparedness activities, State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA) secretary Dani Salu said Arunachal Pradesh has been conducting mock exercises periodically to improve response, mobilisation and inter-departmental coordination.

He also stressed the involvement of community-based organisations (CBOs), panchayati raj institutions (PRIs) and NGOs for wider participation.

The mock drill was successfully conducted in four districts of the state.

District Disaster Management Officers (DDMOs) from West Kameng, Pakke-Kesang, Papum Pare and the Itanagar Capital Region attended the meeting virtually along with representatives from key departments and emergency response agencies, including the Border Roads Organisation (BRO), National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP).

The email also alleged that a blast would take place inside Parliament February 13 at 1.11 pm, prompting heightened security alerts and coordination among multiple agencies.

According to the Delhi Fire Services (DFS), emergency calls were received from multiple educational institutions across different parts of the city during the morning hours, following which fire tenders and bomb disposal squads were rushed to the locations.

"A total of 15 schools have reported receiving bomb threats so far. Fire service teams immediately reached the premises and thorough checks are underway," a DFS official said, adding that out of the total, eight have been declared a hoax.

Punjab: Female law student shot dead, classmate critical

Chandigarh, Feb 9: A first-year law student in Punjab's Tarn Taran district Monday allegedly shot dead his fellow woman student in the head inside the classroom before turning the gun on himself and pulling the trigger, as horrified classmates watched.

The weapon used in the crime appeared to be illegal, police said, adding that the accused, Prince Raj, 20, - the son of a retired Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel -- was critically injured and undergoing treatment, while Sandeep Kaur, 19, died on the spot.

Both Prince and Sandeep were first-year law students and classmates at Mai Bhago Law College in Usma village in Tarn Taran.

A family member of Sandeep alleged that Prince had been harassing her for some time, while her mother, Harjinder Kaur, questioned how a student managed to bring a firearm into the college. Sandeep was engaged to be married, her family said.

Deputy Superintendent of Police Jagbir Singh said Prince opened fire on Sandeep inside the classroom shortly before the class was to begin and then turned the gun on himself.

Prince was taken to Guru Nanak Dev hospital in Amritsar, where his condition was stated to be critical, police said. Tarn Taran Senior Superintendent of Police Surendra Lamba said an investigation was underway to determine the motive behind the killing. "Prima facie, they appear to have been friends. Possibly, the friendship turned bitter. It is all part of the investigation," he said, adding that police will question the friends and family members of the duo.

The SSP said an FIR has been registered on the complaint of the family of the deceased.

Sharad Pawar hospitalised after breathing problem

The 85-year-old Rajya Sabha member was brought to Ruby Hall Clinic in the afternoon from his residence in Baramati town in Pune district after he complained of difficulty in breathing and persistent cough.

He underwent a series of medical tests at the hospital and is currently under treatment in a general ward, said the doctors.

A CT (computed tomography) scan was performed on Pawar and it showed infection in his chest, Ruby Hall Clinic chief cardiologist and managing trustee Dr Parvez Grant said.

Dr Abhijit Lodha, one of the treating doctors, said, "Due to physical exertion, he developed cough and chest congestion. Various tests have been conducted, and treatment is currently underway. His condition is stable. Any modifications to the treatment will be decided once all test reports are received. His vital parameters, including oxygen saturation levels, are stable. He is in a regular room and is not in the ICU."

Immediately after arrival from Baramati, around 100 km from Pune city in western Maharashtra, the former Union minister, who lost his nephew and deputy CM Ajit Pawar in an air crash January 28, was wheeled inside the leading private hospital.

SIR: Surge in domicile certificate applications

Kolkata, Feb 9: The Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) has received more than 19,000 applications for domicile certificates in the past one-and-a-half months, an unprecedented spike linked to the Election Commission's ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, officials said Monday.

Cumulative figures available till February 9 show that 19,167 applications were submitted, far exceeding the usual monthly average of fewer than 200 requests, sources in the civic body said.

Officials and Trinamool Congress councillors said the demand for resident certificates has "shot up sharply" since the revision process began, as the document has emerged as a key proof of residence for voters whose names were either flagged or left out during the verification exercise.

Of the total applications received, 18,962 have already been forwarded to the Kolkata Police for field verification, officials said. Police have submitted 18,390 enquiry reports so far, based on which 16,925 domicile certificates have been issued from KMC offices, while 1,413 applications were rejected following adverse police verification reports, they added.

The civic body had opened dedicated counters at its headquarters and across borough offices following instructions from Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee to ensure residents do not face difficulties in securing required documentation during the revision process.

A member of the KMC may-



or-in-council said the large volume of applications over such a short period has taken officials by surprise, describing the trend as "unprecedented" compared to routine demand patterns.

Applications received by the civic body are routed to the Kolkata sector collector's office and verified through police checks before a WBCS-rank officer grants final approval for issuance of the certificates.

Officials said that, at present, applications are being accepted primarily for requirements linked to the SIR exercise.

The surge comes amid heightened political activity around the electoral roll revision. Earlier, addressing a meeting of Trinamool Congress booth-level agents, Banerjee had accused the Centre and the Election Commission of bias in the SIR process and asked party workers to assist voters facing scrutiny.

The officials said the push to expedite certificate issuance gathered pace after Mayor Firhad Hakim announced that the process would be streamlined and accelerated to help residents produce domicile proof during hearings conducted by election authorities.

Previously, education-related domicile certificates were issued from Kolkata's Town Hall, while councillors provided address-related residency attestations.

DJB PIT DEATH NBWs issued against two contractors

No roadblocks in SIR, SC sends clear message to states

New Delhi, Feb 9: The Supreme Court Monday made it clear to the states that it will not allow anyone to create any impediment in completion of the Special Intensive Revision of electoral rolls and directed the director general of police of West Bengal to file an affidavit on the Election Commission's allegation of burning of its notices by miscreants.

Noting that West Bengal has provided a list of 8,505 Group B officers to the poll panel for the SIR exercise, the apex court also extended the deadline for scrutiny of documents submitted by affected persons by one week beyond February 14 as this process is likely to take

some time and to help electoral registration officers (EROs) to take appropriate decisions.

A bench of Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justices Joymalya Bagchi and N V Anjaria said it would issue whatever orders or clarifications are required in the matter.

"We will not allow anyone to create any impediment in the SIR exercise. It must be clear to the states," the CJI said while hearing a batch of petitions, including the one filed by West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, related to the ongoing SIR of electoral rolls in the eastern state.

In its additional affidavit, the EC submitted that deliberate and systematic attempts are being made to derail, paralyse and frustrate the SIR exercise in West Bengal.

Passing a slew of directions, the bench said the 8,505 Group B officers provided to the poll panel may be trained and employed in the SIR process.

toral registration officer and employ the services of these officers subject to their suitability.

It said from the list of 8,505 officers, the EC, after scrutinising their bio-data and work experience, may also shortlist the officials equivalent to the strength of micro-observers already engaged.

The bench said these officers be imparted training for a day or so for the purpose of assisting EROs or AEROS along with micro-observers.

It said final decisions on revision of the electoral rolls will always be taken by the electoral roll officers. The top court said the manner of employment and work profile of these 8,505 officers will be decided by the poll panel.

The bench took note of the affidavit filed by the EC, which alleged violence and burning of its notices by some miscreants.

The poll panel submitted that so far, no FIR has been registered against those who are suspected to be involved in the alleged burning of notices and other unlawful activities. The counsel appearing for the state refuted the EC's claim.

The bench then issued a show-cause notice to the DGP of West Bengal to file his personal affidavit on the statements made about the violence.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, referred to the EC's affidavit and said, "A message must go that the Constitution of India applies to all states."

Takaichi secures landslide election win

ELECTION VICTORY CLEARS PATH FOR JAPAN'S TAKAICHI TO DELIVER TAX CUTS

Tokyo, Feb 9: Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi renewed a pledge Monday to cut a sales tax on food, after a historic election win brightened chances for stimulus measures that have rattled financial markets.

Takaichi's ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) romped to victory in Sunday's poll, helped by a pledge to ease household living costs by suspending for two years the tax of 8% on food, a move she has called a "long-cherished dream".

"Responsible, proactive fiscal policy is at the core of the ... policy transition," Takaichi told a news conference, promising "the earliest date possible" for the tax suspension, while ruling out fresh debt issuance to achieve it.

"We must pull Japan out of excessively tight fiscal policy and a lack of investment."

In an apparent vote of confidence in Takaichi's fiscal policy, stocks swept to all-time peaks, while super-long bonds reversed early weakness. The yen rose after a verbal warning by Japan's top currency diplomat held currency bears in check.

Earlier, investors wary of uncertainty about how Japan, labouring under the developed



world's highest debt burden, would fund the proposal, had triggered a sell-off in government bonds, pushing the yen towards historic lows against other currencies.

Some analysts had suggested that Takaichi's strong mandate might give her leeway to retreat from the plan, with heavy defeats at the ballot box handed to opposition parties calling for even bolder tax cuts.

CROSS-PARTY DEBATES TO DECIDE TIMETABLE, ALTERNATIVES

Takaichi said cross-party debates on social welfare and taxation would help thrash out a timetable and ways to fund the suspension, as the government considered alternatives such as

- Focus on debate over funding, risk of market revolt

China critic Jimmy Lai sentenced to 20 years in jail

Hong Kong, Feb 9: Hong Kong's most vocal China critic, media tycoon Jimmy Lai, was sentenced Monday to 20 years in jail, ending the city's biggest national security case that has fueled global concerns about Beijing's clampdown on freedoms in the ex-British colony.

Lai's sentence on two counts of conspiracy to collude with foreign forces and one for publishing seditious materials ends a legal saga that has lasted nearly five years.

They cited prosecution evidence that the conspiracies had sought sanctions, blockades and other hostile acts from the US and other countries while involving a web of individuals including Apple Daily staff, activists and foreigners. Six former senior Apple Daily staffers, an activist and a paralegal were also

now shuttered Apple Daily newspaper, was first arrested in August 2020 and was convicted last year.

His sentence was within the harshest penalty tier for offences of a "grave nature", reflecting the fact that he was the driving force behind "persistent" foreign collusion conspiracies, the three judges said in announcing their verdict.

They cited prosecution evidence that the conspiracies had sought sanctions, blockades and other hostile acts from the US and other countries while involving a web of individuals including Apple Daily staff, activists and foreigners. Six former senior Apple Daily staffers, an activist and a paralegal were also



sentenced to jail terms ranging from six to 10 years.

'EVIL DEEDS WERE BEYOND MEASURE'

The US, Britain, Australia, the European Union, Japan and Taiwan expressed concerns about the impact of the sentencing.



US Secretary of State Marco Rubio called the sentence "unjust and tragic", saying it showed the lengths to which China would go to silence advocates of basic freedoms in Hong Kong.

Affairs Office, under China's State Council, said the sentence was "a solemn and powerful declaration that whoever dares to challenge the law on safeguarding national security will be severely punished".

Hong Kong's leader John Lee said, "(Jimmy Lai) has committed numerous heinous crimes, and his evil deeds were beyond measure."

Lai's trial has drawn criticism from global leaders, opens new tab including US President Donald Trump and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer, spotlighting a years-long national security crackdown in the China-ruled Asian financial hub, following mass pro-democracy protests in 2019.

Bangladesh votes in world's first Gen Z-inspired election

Dhaka, Feb 9: For years under former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, Bangladesh's opposition had little presence on the streets during elections, either boycotting polls or being sidelined by mass arrests of senior leaders. Now, ahead of Thursday's vote, the roles have reversed.

Hasina's Awami League is banned, but many young people who helped oust her government in a 2024 uprising say the upcoming vote will be the Muslim-majority nation's first competitive election since 2009, when she began a 15-year-rule.

The Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) is widely expected to win, although a coalition led by the Islamist Jamaat-e-Islami is putting up a strong challenge. A new party driven by Gen-Z

activists under the age of 30 has aligned with Jamaat after failing to translate its anti-Hasina street mobilisation into an electoral base.

Analysts say a decisive result in the February 12 vote, instead of a fractured outcome, is vital for restoring stability in the nation of 175 million after Hasina's ouster triggered months of unrest and disrupted major industries, including the garments sector in the world's second-largest exporter.

**PSBs' profit rises to record ₹52,603cr**

New Delhi, Feb 9: Led by the country's biggest lender State Bank of India (SBI), public sector banks logged a record cumulative profit of Rs 52,603 crore in the third quarter of the current fiscal, reflecting an 18 per cent year-on-year growth.

All 12 public sector banks (PSBs) together made a profit of Rs 44,734 crore in the December quarter of FY25. Thus, the increase in profit in absolute terms was Rs 8,130 crore as compared to the same quarter of the previous financial year.

Market leader SBI alone contributed 40 per cent to the total earnings of Rs 52,603 crore, as per the published numbers on stock exchanges. SBI posted the highest quarterly net profit of Rs 21,028 crore in Q3 FY26, 24 per cent higher than the same period of the previous fiscal.

In percentage terms, Chennai-based Indian Overseas Bank reported the highest net profit growth of 56 per cent to Rs 1,365 crore, followed by Central Bank of India with a 32 per cent rise to Rs 1,263 crore.

During the quarter, all 12 public sector banks (PSBs), except Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, Indian Bank, and Bank of India, reported profit growth in single digits.

INDUSTRIAL GOODS

The agreement secures zero additional duty access for industrial exports valued at \$38 billion, the government said.

India will face zero-reciprocal duty in major industrial product categories, including gems and diamonds, platinum and coins, clocks and watches, essential oils, inorganic chemicals, articles of paper, plastics and wood, and natural rubber.

On the other hand, market access for American industrial goods has been structured strictly on the basis of product sensitivity, combining immediate tariff elimination, phased reduction (up to ten years) and quota-based access.

DIGITAL TRADE

In 2024, India's digitally-delivered services exports stood at \$0.28 trillion, growing at 10.3 per cent year-on-year.

India ranks 5th in exports of global digitally-delivered services and 11th in imports.

While the United States holds the first rank in both exports and imports. "A structured digital trade framework between the two countries reduces regulatory uncertainty, lowers compliance friction and facilitates smoother cross-border service delivery," it said.

These broadly include meat, poultry and dairy products; GM food products; soyameal; maize; and cereals.

For select sensitive agricultural products, the tariff reduction category has been applied to ensure that a measured level of duty protection continues.

Examples include parts of plants, olives, pyrethrum and oil cakes.

Certain highly sensitive items have been liberalised under Tariff Rate Quotas (TRQs), where limited quantities are allowed at reduced duties.

Products under this category include in-shell almonds, walnuts, pistachios, and lentils, it said. It added that phased elimination of tariffs over up to ten years has been adopted for certain intermediate products used by India's food processing industry and sourced from multiple countries.

RBI amends MSME lending directions

Collateral-free loan limit increased to ₹20 lakh

Mumbai, Feb 9: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Monday announced amendments to its lending directions for the micro, small and medium enterprises (MSME) sector, increasing the collateral-free loan limit for micro and small enterprises (MSEs) to Rs 20 lakh in a move aimed at improving credit access for smaller businesses.

"Banks are mandated not to accept collateral security in the case of loans up to Rs 20 lakh extended to units in the MSME sector. Banks are also advised to extend collateral-free loans up to Rs 20 lakh to all units financed under the Prime Minister Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) administered by KVIC," amended guidelines said.

**Silver surges 6%, gold up nearly 1%**

New Delhi, Feb 9: Silver prices climbed more than 6 per cent to Rs 2.72 lakh per kilogram in the national capital Monday, while gold rose nearly 1 per cent to Rs 1.58 lakh per 10 grams, driven by firm global trends and a weaker US dollar.

According to local marketmen, the white metal climbed Rs 17,000, or 6.6 per cent to Rs 2.72,000 per kilogram (inclusive of all taxes), from Friday's closing level of Rs 2,55,000 per kg.

In addition, gold of 99.9 per cent purity increased Rs 1,300, or 0.83 per cent to Rs 1,58,500 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes). It had closed at Rs 1,57,200 per 10 grams in the previous session.

"Gold traded higher on Monday, supported by a pullback in the US dollar and bargain buying. The dollar index is trading lower by almost 0.30 per cent at 97 level, offering support to bullion prices," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst -- Commodities at HDFC Securities -- said.

According to the RBI, the revised norms are intended to strengthen last-mile credit delivery to micro and small enterprises that often face constraints in providing collateral due to limited asset bases.

New Delhi, Feb 9: Olympic double bronze-medallist Manu Bhaker came agonisingly close to winning a gold, missing out by a whisker in a tense shoot-off as she clinched a silver in 25m pistol event, while fellow Indian Esha Singh claimed a bronze at the Asian Championship here Monday.

In one of the most closely-contested events of this edition of the continental championship, both gold medalist Nguyen Thuy Trang and Manu shot an identical 35 in the final, forcing a shoot-off, where the Vietnamese held sway.

In fact, the final turned out to be a battle of nerves, with former Asian air pistol champion Trang, Manu, Esha, and Olympian Rhythm Sangwan all tightly packed and in contention for the top spot.

Esha started with a perfect five in the first series while Manu and Trang hit four. All three Indian shooters were trading the medal positions after each

series but a perfect five in the sixth series saw the Vietnamese take a two-point lead. Manu and Esha capitalised on Trang's poor seventh series, where she managed to hit only one target, closing the gap.

Esha, who had been leading with a score of 30 at the end of the eighth series, missed all her shots in the ninth and had to settle for the bronze medal.

In the final series, Manu hit three targets while Trang managed two, bringing their totals to 35 each and forcing a nail-biting shoot-off. Earlier, Esha topped the qualification round, which comprised the 'precision' and 'duelling' stages, scoring 589, followed by Manu (584), as three Indian shooters advanced to the eight-shooter final.

The trio of Esha, Manu, and Sangwan claimed the team gold with a combined total of 1,751, while Chinese Taipei with 1,735 and Vietnam with 1,729.

The junior Indian team also secured the team gold in the event.


