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Scolded by parents, four girls end lives

Aurangabad: Four girls allegedly died by suicide together after their parents scolded them for mingling with boys at a place in Bihar's Aurangabad district, a senior police officer said on Monday. Five girls, aged between 10 and 14 years, had reportedly consumed some poisonous substance on January 29 in a Dalit settlement in Haspura police station area, and only one of them survived. They were cremated on the same day without a postmortem examination, and the police have begun an investigation after the local media reported it. **P9**

Minor Tibetan girl raped in Gajapati

Paralakhemundi, Feb 9: A seven-year-old Tibet-origin girl was allegedly raped by her 17-year 'brother' in Gajapati district, police said Monday. The incident took place in a village under Mohana police station limits Sunday, and the accused was apprehended. The survivor's family is one of the thousands that had fled from Tibet along with their spiritual leader in the 1960s and settled in the district. The accused who lives in the same area but belonging to another community allegedly raped the minor inside her home, while she was alone. Her parents had gone to attend a social function leaving there, police said. The mother of the girl filed a police complaint against the boy, after the victim narrated the incident. "We have registered a case against the boy under various sections of the BNS and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act and launched an investigation" Gajapati Superintendent of Police Jatindra Panda said. He said that medical tests of

both the accused and the victim have been conducted. Sources said the accused had been living with the girl's parents, for several years as their foster son. The couple had taken responsibility for his upbringing and education expenses. District Child Protection Officer Arun Kumar Tripathy confirmed that both the victim and the accused were handled according to juvenile justice procedures. He said the girl's welfare remains the priority, with authorities ensuring she is under parental care and protection. Meanwhile, Odisha Congress president Bhakta Charan Das said, "The sexual assault on a Tibetan minor exposes a disturbing collapse of law & order under the BJP government. Such disgraceful crimes tarnish the state's global image and wound our collective conscience."

Oppn to move motion for Birla's removal

Amid the ongoing Budget Session, the Opposition has signalled it will move a no-confidence motion against Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, accusing him of procedural bias for limiting Opposition participation, especially by denying Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi opportunities to speak. FIR over circulation of Narvane's book

New Delhi, Feb 9: The Delhi Police has registered an FIR over the circulation of an unpublished book of former Chief of Army Staff Gen MM Naravane on social media, an official statement said Monday. "The Delhi Police has taken cognisance of information circulating on social media platforms and online news forums claiming that a pre-print copy of a book titled Four Stars of Destiny is being circulated without mandatory clearance from competent authorities," the statement said. "Upon verification, it was found that a PDF copy of a type-set book with the same title and apparently prepared by M/s Penguin Random House India Pvt Ltd is available on certain websites and, also, some online marketing platforms have displayed the finished book cover as if it is available for purchase," it read. The police said a case has been registered with the Special Cell in order to carry out a thorough investigation into this purported leak or breach of a yet-to-be-approved publication and an investigation is being taken up.

Mumbai: As the crime thriller *Bhakhshak* completes two years since its release, actress Bhumi Pednekar says the film feels even more heartbreaking today, as the grim realities it highlighted continue to dominate headlines across the world.

Bhumi took to Instagram, where she wrote: “Two years ago, *Bhakhshak* travelled across borders, messages poured in from every corner of the world, not because people just watched it, but because people felt it. I was overwhelmed then. I'm heartbroken today. Because the truth is, this story is still so relevant. Sexual violence on women and children is becoming the basic thread of us”.

Bhumi pointed out that recent global developments have once again exposed how unsafe the world continues to be for children. Her remarks come at a time when international cases such as the Jeffrey Epstein scandal continue to resurface in public discourse.

“The last few weeks have reminded us how unsafe the world can be for children. No child should have to grow up hyper-aware of danger. That burden belongs to us not them,” she added.

“Children deserve freedom. To play. To dress as they choose. To be protected, accepted, and held by society when they have no one. Some films end when the credits roll. Some refuse to let us look away.”

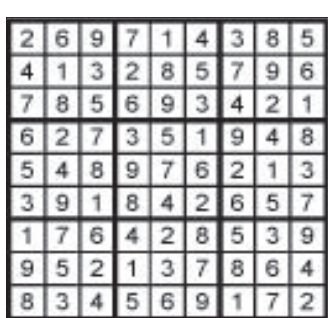

18 KIDS ILL AFTER HAVING ICE-CREAM

Bhubaneswar: At least 18 children were admitted to hospital after having ice-cream in Cuttack district Monday, police said. The incident took place at Kumusar village within Banki police station limits in the district. The kids ate the ice-creams after attending a religious festival. Soon after consuming it, they complained of uneasiness, irritation in the mouth and other symptoms, triggering panic among villagers, police said. Some parents also reported health issues after having the ice-cream, police said, adding that they reached the spot after receiving information from locals. They were rushed to the Banki sub-divisional hospital, where they were treated and later discharged. The ice-cream vendor has been detained.

SC terms digital arrests dacoity

Delhi, Feb 9: The Supreme Court on Monday termed the siphoning of over ₹54,000 crore through digital arrests so far as nothing short of “robbery or dacoity” and directed the Centre to formulate a standard operating procedure (SoP) to tackle such offences.

A bench led by Chief Justice of India Surya Kant, along with Justices Joymalya Bagchi and NV Anjaria, noted that the money lost to digital fraud exceeds the annual budgets of several small states.

“These offences may occur due to either collusion or negligence on the part of bank officials. This necessitates prompt action by the RBI and banks,” the bench observed, according to this agency.

The top court pointed out that the Reserve Bank of India has already framed an SoP requiring banks to temporarily block debit cards to prevent cyber-enabled fraud. It directed the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) to examine the RBI’s SoP, along with similar protocols or decisions taken by the Department of Telecom (DoT), and prepare a draft memorandum of understanding (MoU) within four weeks to effectively address such crimes.

The bench also instructed the CBI to identify cases involving



digital arrests and directed the Gujarat and Delhi governments to grant sanction to the agency to proceed with investigations in these matters.

Further, the Supreme Court asked the RBI, DoT, and other stakeholders to hold a joint meeting and develop a framework for compensating victims of digital arrest scams. Emphasising the need for a “pragmatic and liberal approach” in awarding compensation, the court posted the matter for further hearing after four weeks and asked authorities to submit fresh status reports before the next date.

Earlier, on December 16 last year, the bench had asked the Centre to consider suggestions made by the amicus curiae on ensuring compensation for victims, while expressing concern over the massive sums siphoned out of the country by cybercriminals.

CRPF JAWAN DIES BY SUICIDE AT CAMP

Rourkela, Feb 9: A Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) jawan shot himself dead allegedly from his service revolver at a CRPF camp in Mathakamjharan under Lathikata police limits in Sundargarh district Monday morning, officials said.

The deceased was identified as Subhash Prasad, 56, a native of Nandgaon in Uttar Pradesh’s Pardia district. Police have registered a case-2/26 of unnatural death and launched an investigation.

The incident occurred at the Mathakamjharan camp. Prasad was on duty when the incident took place. He was rushed to the Rourkela Government Hospital (RGH), where doctors pronounced him dead.

After a postmortem conducted around 2 p.m., the body was handed over to the CRPF. In the evening, it was sent to Ranchi, from where it is to be airlifted to Uttar Pradesh, sources said.

According to officials, the camp was inaugurated in October last year under Lathikata police limits as part of anti-Maoist operations along the Odisha-Jharkhand border, in coordination with the CRPF. Prasad had been posted at the camp since its opening.

While the exact cause of death is yet to be ascertained, preliminary information suggests possible personal or family-related stress, police said. An investigation is underway.

94% GRIEVANCES RESOLVED: CMO

Bhubaneswar, Feb 9: Of the 14,054 complaints received during the last 16 hearings at the Chief Minister’s Grievance Cell, 13,169 — about 94 per cent — have so far been resolved, the Chief Minister’s Office (CMO) said, as CM Mohan Charan Majhi conducted the 17th round of public grievance hearings at Unit-II here Monday.

Accompanied by five senior ministers and senior officers from various departments, the CM personally listened to grievances raised by citizens.



As is customary, the CM began the programme by meeting differently-abled persons outside the grievance cell, patiently listening to their problems and issuing on-the-spot instructions to officials for immediate redressal.

“Out of 32 differently-abled complainants, financial assistance was sanctioned for those suffering from critical illnesses. Brajakishore Bandha of Bhadrak was granted ₹1 lakh, while Kartik C of Jajpur received ₹1.50 lakh for medical treatment. The CM also directed departments to take prompt

action on other medical assistance requests,” the CMO said.

In another case, Tilotama Pandey from Patnagarh, suffering from kidney and neurological ailments, was assured medical support along with travel expenses. The CM personally interacted with all complainants suffering from serious ailments and instructed officials to ensure compassionate and time-bound solutions.

Subsequently, complaints registered inside the grievance cell were taken up and reviewed.

WALKING INTO A TRAP

sector will remain protected, and that no GM crops will enter India as part of the deal. But consider that the ‘no-GM’ imports claim holds by a thin thread – for example, dried distillers’ grains, or DDGs for animal feed, which feature in the first bullet of the trade agreement as announced, come mostly from GM crop. DDGs, a by-product of ethanol production from corn, add nutritional value in animal feed but can it be claimed that the GM “quality” is erased after the heavy processing that the corn goes through as ethanol is extracted? There is no consensus that the transgenic nature is eliminated in the processing. Further, if this is not a red line for India, having given in now, then how long can India hold out on other points, say dairy on which the US has been pushing much like it has on DDGs? Do note that India’s position against milk imports (which is not part of this deal) is seen by the US as a Foreign Trade Barrier. In the Indian view, dairy must only be from animals that are not given blood meals or feeds containing

internal organs or tissue of ruminant or porcine, but the US holds that this view lacks a “discernible animal health or human health justification.” The pressure on dairy from the US will not go away but will likely increase over time, now that India has opened a window. In this light, the statement in the trade agreement that “India also agrees to address long-standing non-tariff barriers to the trade in US food and agricultural products” indicates the nature of the trap that India has walked into. Equally problematic is the statement that within six months India must determine “with a view towards a positive outcome ... whether US-developed or international standards, including testing requirements, are acceptable for the purposes of US exports entering the Indian market in identified sectors.” The executive order issued by Trump lowering tariffs on India also puts in place a committee that “shall monitor whether India resumes directly or indirectly importing Russian Federation oil,” with the threat of punitive duties coming back if it is determined that India has not stopped or has resumed buying Russian oil. None of this should keep India comfortable. The government has of course gone on the aggressive in defending the deal, but it is unlikely that the nation will accept these terms in toto. It would be appropriate for the government not to oversell the deal. Prudence would be to leave room for some backtracking in the light of evolving public opinion.

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Whichever way you spin this, it should be clear that the nation has bowed to the diktats of the US in return for a trade agreement that eases punitive tariffs on India but also barter away the nation’s long term interests and compromises the much-vaunted strategic autonomy that has been the centrepiece of Indian policy framework for long. It is true that not every detail of what was called the “interim agreement regarding reciprocal and mutually beneficial trade” between the two nations is known. But what is known, including the circumstances surrounding the deal, the manner of its announcement, the language of the joint statement and the connected White House executive order, indicate that India has shifted some long-held positions and to that extent this is not a deal between two equals. The US high handedness stretched to simple courtesies like the timing of the release of the agreed statement. Trump announced the broad agreement on his social media platform ‘Truth Social’ on Feb. 2, days ahead of the official release by both nations, on Feb. 6/7. The Indian government announcement of the joint statement on PIB is time stamped Feb. 7, 4.20 am IST, an unconventional hour that presented as a US-led announcement working to US time zones. Trump has condemned Europe to success

The EU was created as an antidote to power politics. But to survive, it must become a superpower, contradicting the very principle on which it was founded. The reason is US President Donald Trump, who is forcing it to transform itself almost against its will. The EU does not need to turn its back on the US; but it must recognize that it can rely only on itself, and that means acquiring hard (military) power. Although Trump’s time in office is limited, Trumpism could endure. Despite his transactional approach and rapidly fluctuating positions, Trump may represent a more lasting doctrine. After all, many of his first-term policies – from tariffs to his confrontational stance toward China – survived his defeat in 2020, and he was hardly the first US president to demand greater contributions from other NATO members. Moreover, the Republican Party is now fully under Trump’s control, having ousted or forced out anyone who did not embrace the MAGA movement. Trump has also subjugated the US financial, legal, and tech elite, and developed a deep bench of potential successors. Safe in his position, he can now focus on establishing a dynasty and

securing his legacy, including through territorial expansion. Although Trump did step back from his threat to use force in pursuing a US take-over of Greenland, that crisis is not over. He dropped his demand for US sovereignty over the island only after Europe signaled a willingness to respond – finally – with something other than appeasement. The European Parliament suspended work on a trade agreement with the US. Many EU leaders called for the bloc’s anti-coercion mechanism to be used, while most refused to join Trump’s bizarre pay-to-play Board of Peace. As long as EU’s most serious problems were Hungarian PM Viktor Orbán and Russian President Vladimir Putin, it could more or less accept the status quo. But the emergence of another Putin in Washington leaves the EU in a completely different position. Fortunately, the EU has all assets it needs to be one of three or four superpowers. Its common market surpasses any other economy in size, and it can match anyone in terms of its alliances and soft power. While Western Europe is reckoning with anaemic GDP growth, Central and Eastern European economies are developing rapidly. No US state has grown as fast as Poland in

the last 25 years. Yes, the EU lags behind the US and China in terms of innovation and access to raw materials, but they face difficult challenges, too. China is struggling with inauspicious demographics and very low consumption. US power is being hollowed out from within through the Trump administration’s war on scientific research, higher education, immigration, rule of law, and international institutions. And Russia has pretty much nothing going for it, other than a fully committed war economy. There are good reasons why Ukraine and a dozen other countries dream of joining the EU. Taking inspiration from Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky’s statement the night after Russia’s full-scale invasion on February 24, 2022: half a billion people are here; a huge industrial base is here; one-sixth of the world’s GDP is here; and allies are here. In other words, Europe has massive latent power, and it is beginning to do more to unlock its potential. In the short and medium term, it must fight for time and resolve the “Ukrainian question,” just as the West resolved the “Eastern European question” in the 1990s. Trump has already shifted this problem to Eu-

rope by refusing to finance the Ukrainian army and state. Five years ago, it would have seemed absurdly optimistic to predict that the EU would be able to issue joint debt, buy weapons, and make key decisions without unanimity. No one could have guessed that Sweden and Finland would finally abandon their neutrality and join NATO, significantly strengthening the alliance’s European pillar. Yet all that has happened, and more. European defense companies are now growing much faster than their American counterparts. The fastest-growing European company today is the German arms manufacturer Rheinmetall. If the million-strong Ukrainian army – as battle-hardened and innovative as any in the world – remains on Europe’s side and does not fall into Russian hands, Europe will have everything it needs to be a military superpower in the age of drone warfare. The EU has proven over and over that it is capable of reforming itself, despite resistance from enemies within and outside its borders. To paraphrase Zelensky again: Europe does not need a free ride; it needs arms.

Tobacco baron's son ploughs Lamborghini into crowd in Kanpur

Kanpur, Feb 9: An FIR has been registered against an "unidentified person" after a speeding Lamborghini allegedly driven by a tobacco baron's son ploughed into pedestrians here, leaving at least six injured, police said Monday.

Police said the name of Shivam Mishra, son of Banshidhar Exports Pvt Ltd's owner K K Mishra, is not there in the FIR, but he is part of the investigation.

Recalling the horror, which unfolded on VIP Road in the upscale Gwaltoli area Sunday, eyewitnesses said the car first hit an autorickshaw and then crashed into a stationary motorcycle, flinging its rider nearly 10 feet into the air. An FIR was registered in the matter against an unidentified person late Sunday night, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Central) Atul Kumar Srivastava said.



No one has been detained in connection with the incident, the DCP said in a response to a question, adding that a detailed probe is underway. Asked if the driver was under the influence of alcohol at the time of the incident, the officer said it will be known once the probe has been completed.

According to Gwaltoli police, footage from multiple CCTV cameras installed at nearby shops, traffic intersections and residential buildings is being examined to reconstruct the sequence of events and determine the speed of the vehicle at the time of the crash.

The accused driver has been identified as Shivam Mishra.

Fresh violence in Manipur's Ukhrul as more houses burnt

Imphal, Feb 9: Fresh violence broke out in Manipur's Ukhrul district Monday afternoon after armed miscreants allegedly set fire to more houses in Litan Sareikhong village, officials said.

Armed groups also fired several rounds in the air in the vicinity of the hill village, forcing residents to flee with essential belongings to safer areas in neighbouring Kangpokpi district.

Several Tangkhul villagers were also reported to have left the area. Violence first started in the area Saturday night after a Tangkhul Naga community member was allegedly assaulted by seven to eight persons at Litan village.

The matter was settled by the victim's side and the chief of Litan Sareikhong, and both parties mutually agreed to resolve the issue through customary means, with a meeting scheduled for Sunday, the officials said.



However, the meeting did not take place.

Instead, a group of villagers from nearby Sikibung allegedly launched an attack on the residence of the chief of Litan Sareikhong, they said.

The villagers also reportedly fired several rounds while passing through the vicinity of Litan police station. On Sunday night, two tribal groups engaged in intense stone pelting at the village, prompting the administration to clamp prohibitory orders.

Around midnight Monday, several houses of Tangkhul Naga community members were set on fire at Litan Sareikhong, allegedly by Kuki militants..

A few houses of those belonging to the Kuki community were also torched in a nearby area, officials said.

Bomb threats sent to 15 schools

New Delhi, Feb 9: More than a dozen schools across the national capital received bomb threat emails Monday, prompting heavy security deployment and precautionary evacuations. Of these, eight threats were later declared hoaxes, officials said.

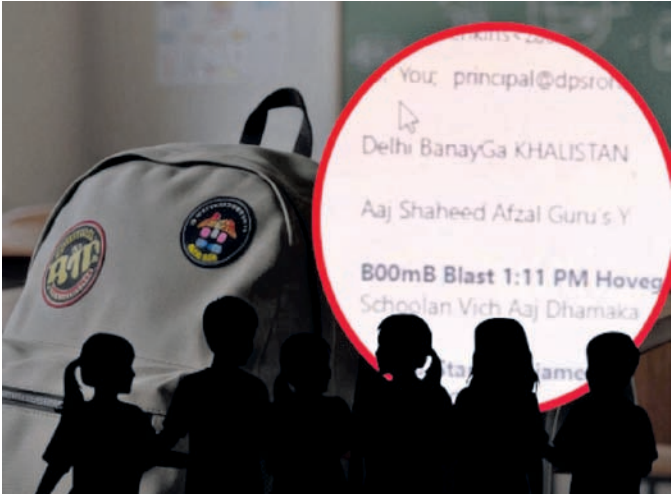
The threatening email carried disturbing and provocative content, claiming, "Delhi will become Khalistan. Punjab is Khalistan. In memory of Afzal Guru."

The email also alleged that a blast would take place inside Parliament February 13 at 1.11 pm, prompting heightened security alerts and coordination among multiple agencies.

According to the Delhi Fire Services (DFS), emergency calls were received from multiple educational institutions across different parts of the city during the morning hours, following which fire tenders and bomb disposal squads were rushed to the locations.

"A total of 15 schools have reported receiving bomb threats so far. Fire service teams immediately reached the premises and thorough checks are underway," a DFS official said, adding that out of the total, eight have been declared a hoax.

The schools that received the threats include Loreto Convent

Two Bihar courts receive bomb threat

Patna: Two courts in Bihar Monday received bomb threats by email, prompting the authorities to conduct searches on their premises, in the second such instance of its kind in a month, officials said. A mail threatening to blow up the Patna Civil Court premises sent the administration into a tizzy.

Police personnel, who rushed to the spot to carry out searches, were so far tight-lipped, even as judicial work was suspended for the day, putting on hold, among other things, the bail plea of Independent MP Pappu Yadav. Security was beefed up at the Bhagalpur Civil court too, following a bomb threat email received by the authorities.

The entire court premises was searched thoroughly, but no suspicious object was found, officials said.

SC REFUSES TO ENTERTAIN SENGAR'S PLEA

New Delhi, Feb 9: The Supreme Court Monday asked the Delhi High Court to accord an out-of-turn hearing to expelled BJP leader Kuldeep Singh Sengar's plea challenging his conviction in the custodial death case of the Unnao rape survivor's father, and said it be decided within three months.

While refusing to entertain Sengar's plea challenging a January 19 order of the high court that had refused to suspend his 10-year jail term in the case, the apex court said if the victim's family has filed any appeal against the trial court order, that should also be heard by the high court along with the expelled BJP leader's petition.

A bench of Chief Justice of India (CJI) Surya Kant and Justices Joymalya Bagchi and N V Anjaria issued the order while hearing Sengar's plea challenging the high court's order.

During the hearing, the CJI expressed disapproval over the victim's counsel giving statements in the media about the case. "We are not sitting in an ivory tower. We know a media trial is going on outside," Justice Kant said, adding he would not tolerate any "parallel trial" outside the court.

EPS-95: 47L get less than ₹9000 pension

New Delhi, Feb 9: The total number of active member pensioners under Employees' Pension Scheme 1995 (EPS-95) receiving pension of less than Rs 9,000 is 47,04,270. In a written reply to the Lok Sabha Monday, Minister of State for Labour and Employment Shobha Karandlaje stated, "The total number of active member pensioners under EPS-95 receiving pension of less than Rs 9,000 is 47,04,270."

She told the House that representations have been received from various stakeholders, including trade unions and public representatives to increase the minimum pension under the scheme from the existing Rs 1,000 per month. Employees' Pension Scheme, 1995 is a 'Defined Contribution-Defined Benefit' social security scheme.

The corpus of the Employees' Pension Fund is made up of contribution by the employer at the rate of 8.33 per cent of wages; and 1.16 per cent contribution from central government on wages up to Rs 15,000 per month. All benefits under the scheme are paid out of this fund, she stated.

The government is providing a minimum pension of Rs 1,000 per month to pensioners under the EPS, 1995 through budgetary support, which is in addition to the budgetary support of 1.16 per cent of wages towards EPS to Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO), she told the House.

The fund is valued annually as mandated under paragraph

According to the dashboard of Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO), the total number of current pensioners under the EPS-95 is 82,11,182



32 of EPS, 1995.

The objective of the valuation is to determine the long-term viability of the fund, given the expected stream of money inflows from contributions, etc, and the outflows in terms of benefits, the minister stated.

The Government of India is committed to providing robust social security coverage through EPF Scheme, 1952, EPS-95 and EDLI Schemes being run by the EPFO, to the members of these schemes, taking into consideration the sustainability of the respective funds as well as the future liabilities thereon, she stated.

Punjab: Female law student shot dead, classmate critical

Chandigarh, Feb 9: A first-year law student in Punjab's Tarn Taran district Monday allegedly shot dead his fellow woman student in the head inside the classroom before turning the gun on himself and pulling the trigger, as horrified classmates watched.

The weapon used in the crime appeared to be illegal, police said, adding that the accused, Prince Raj, 20, -- the son of a retired Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel -- was critically injured and undergoing treatment, while Sandeep Kaur, 19, died on the spot.

Both Prince and Sandeep were first-year law students and classmates at Mai Bhago Law College in Usma village in Tarn Taran.

A family member of Sandeep alleged that Prince had been harassing her for some time, while her mother, Harjinder Kaur, questioned how a student managed to bring a firearm into the college. Sandeep was engaged to be married, her family said.

Deputy Superintendent of Police Jagbir Singh said Prince opened fire on Sandeep inside the classroom shortly before the class was to begin and then turned the gun on himself.

CCTV footage captured the incident, showing the sequence of events leading to the shooting

Prince was taken to Guru Nanak Dev hospital in Amritsar, where his condition was stated to be critical, police said.

Tarn Taran Senior Superintendent of Police Surendra Lamba said an investigation was underway to determine the motive behind the killing.

"Prima facie, they appear to have been friends. Possibly, the friendship turned bitter. It is all part of the investigation," he said, adding that police will question the friends and family members of the duo.

The SSP said an FIR has been registered on the complaint of the family of the deceased.

The entire incident was captured on a CCTV camera installed in the classroom.

The National Security Service said that Saadoun Sabri al-Qaisi, who held the rank of major general under Saddam and was arrested last year, was convicted of "grave crimes against humanity," including the killing of prominent Iraqi Shiite cleric Mohammed Baqir al-Sadr, members of the al-Hakim family, and other civilians.

53 dead or missing after boat capsizes

Cairo: Two babies are among at least 53 people dead or missing after an inflatable migrant boat sank off Libya, the UN migration agency said Monday, the latest tragedy on a dangerous route for those seeking a better life in Europe. The UN's International Organisation for Migration said in a statement that the boat with 55 African migrants on board departed Libya's western town of Zawia shortly before midnight Thursday. Around six hours later, it began taking on water and capsized Friday morning north of the town of Zuwara, it said.

Tripoli building collapse kills 15

Cairo: The death toll from the collapse of residential buildings in the Lebanese city of Tripoli rose to 15 after search and rescue operations ended, Lebanon's National News Agency said Monday citing the civil defence chief. Civil defence director general Imad Khreiss said rescue teams rescued eight people from the rubble of the collapsed buildings in the northern city's Bab al-Tabbaneh neighbourhood. Officials said Sunday that two adjoining buildings had collapsed.

Takaichi secures landslide election win

ELECTION VICTORY CLEARS PATH FOR JAPAN'S TAKAICHI TO DELIVER TAX CUTS

Tokyo, Feb 9: Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi renewed a pledge Monday to cut a sales tax on food, after a historic election win brightened chances for stimulus measures that have rattled financial markets.

Takaichi's ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) romped to victory in Sunday's poll, helped by a pledge to ease household living costs by suspending for two years the tax of 8% on food, a move she has called a "long-cherished dream".

"Responsible, proactive fiscal policy is at the core of the ... policy transition," Takaichi told a news conference, promising "the earliest date possible" for the tax suspension, while ruling out fresh debt issuance to achieve it.

"We must pull Japan out of excessively tight fiscal policy and a lack of investment."

In an apparent vote of confidence in Takaichi's fiscal policy, stocks swept to all-time peaks, while super-long bonds reversed early weakness. The yen rose after a verbal warning by Japan's top currency diplomat held currency bears in check.

Earlier, investors wary of uncertainty about how Japan, labouring under the developed

Indian-Canadian shot dead in shopping centre's parking lot in Toronto

Ottawa, Feb 9: A 37-year-old Indian-Canadian died after being shot by unidentified men in the parking lot of a busy shopping centre in Toronto, Canada, police said.

In a statement Sunday, the Toronto Police Service identified the victim as Chandan Kumar Raja Nandakumar of Brampton.

At approximately 3:31 pm Saturday, police responded to a call for a shooting in the parking lot of Woodbine Shopping Centre located at Rexdale Boulevard and Highway 27, the statement said.

It said police officers found a man with gunshot wounds when they arrived at the scene. The victim was taken to the hospital with life-threatening injuries. The suspect, or suspects, fled the scene in a vehicle, police said. The victim succumbed to his injuries at the hospital, they said. Nandakumar, originally from Karnataka, was an IT professional.

The shooting marks Toronto's third homicide of the year.

Images taken from the scene show a white SUV with bullet holes in the windshield and a shattered window on the driver's side, according to CTV News. It said the circumstances surrounding the shooting are not known, but officers believe it was a "targeted" incident.

"I can understand how a shooting like this, especially at a mall, can cause concern for the safety of the public," Insp. Errol Watson was quoted as saying by the CBC news.

China critic Jimmy Lai sentenced to 20 years in jail

Hong Kong, Feb 9: Hong Kong's most vocal China critic, media tycoon Jimmy Lai, was sentenced Monday to 20 years in jail, ending the city's biggest national security case that has fueled global concerns about Beijing's clampdown on freedoms in the ex-British colony.

Lai's sentence on two counts of conspiracy to collude with foreign forces and one for publishing seditious materials ends a legal saga that has lasted nearly five years.

The 78-year-old British citizen had denied all the charges against him, telling the court he was a "political prisoner" facing persecution from Beijing.

Lai, founder of the feisty and

now shuttered Apple Daily newspaper, was first arrested in August 2020 and was convicted last year.

His sentence was within the harshest penalty tier for offences of a "grave nature", reflecting the fact that he was the driving force behind "persistent" foreign collusion conspiracies, the three judges said in announcing their verdict.

They cited prosecution evidence that the conspiracies had sought sanctions, blockades and other hostile acts from the US and other countries while involving a web of individuals including Apple Daily staff, activists and foreigners. Six former senior Apple Daily staffers, an activist and a paralegal were also



sentenced to jail terms ranging from six to 10 years.

Bangladesh votes in world's first Gen Z-inspired election

Dhaka, Feb 9: For years under former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, Bangladesh's opposition had little presence on the streets during elections, either boycotting polls or being sidelined by mass arrests of senior leaders. Now, ahead of Thursday's vote, the roles have reversed.

Hasina's Awami League is banned, but many young people who helped oust her government in a 2024 uprising say the upcoming vote will be the Muslim-majority nation's first competitive election since 2009, when she began a 15-year-rule.

The Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) is widely expected to win, although a coalition led by the Islamist Jamaat-e-Islami is putting up a strong challenge. A new party driven by Gen-Z



activists under the age of 30 has aligned with Jamaat after failing to translate its anti-Hasina street mobilisation into an electoral base.

BNP chief Tarique Rahman told Reuters his party, which is contesting 292 of the 300 parliamentary seats at stake, was confident of winning "enough to form a government".

Analysts say a decisive result in the February 12 vote, instead of a fractured outcome, is vital for restoring stability in the nation of 175 million after Hasina's ouster triggered months of unrest and disrupted major industries, including the garments sector in the world's second-largest exporter.

the roles of rival regional heavyweights China and India in the South Asian nation.

"Opinion polls suggest the BNP has an edge, but we must remember that a significant portion of voters are still undecided," said Parvez Karim Abbasi, executive director at Dhaka's Centre for Governance Studies.

"Several factors will shape the outcome, including how Generation Z - which makes up

about a quarter of the electorate - votes, as their choices will carry considerable weight."

Across Bangladesh, black-and-white posters and banners bearing the BNP's "sheaf of paddy" symbol and Jamaat's "scales" hang from poles and trees and are pasted on roadside walls, alongside those of several independent candidates. Party shacks on street corners, draped in their emblems, blare campaign songs.

CHINA'S INFLUENCE INCREASES AS INDIA'S WANES

The election verdict will also influence the roles of China and India in Bangladesh in coming years, analysts have said. Beijing has increased its standing in Bangladesh since Hasina was seen as pro-India and fled to New Delhi after her ouster,

where she remains.

While New Delhi's influence is on the wane, the BNP is seen by some analysts as being relatively more in tune with India than the Jamaat.

A Jamaat-led government might tilt closer to Pakistan, a fellow Muslim-majority nation and a long-standing rival of Hindu-majority India, analysts say. Also, Jamaat's Gen-Z ally has said "New Delhi's hegemony" in Bangladesh is one of its main concerns and its leaders met Chinese diplomats recently.

Jamaat, which calls for a society governed by Islamic principles, has said the party is not inclined towards any country.

BNP's Rahman has said if his party formed the government it would have friendly relations with any nation that "offers what is suitable for my people and my country".

London, Feb 9: British Prime Minister Keir Starmer signalled Monday he would not heed calls to quit, even by the leader of his party in Scotland, after a second aide resigned from a team in crisis over the appointment of Peter Mandelson as ambassador to the US.

Under pressure over the appointment of a man whose close ties to the late US sex offender Jeffrey Epstein have come into full focus, Starmer has attempted to change the narrative.

But a demand from Anas Sarwar, leader of the Scottish Labour Party, for him to quit and the departure of a second senior aide in as many days did little to stop the questions over his judgment and ability to govern.

The resignation of communications chief Tim Allan followed the exit of Starmer's closest aide, Morgan McSweeney, who said he took responsibility for advising on the appointment of Mandelson to Britain's top diplomatic role in the United States.

Earlier Monday, the British leader sought to raise spirits and encourage unity when he addressed staff at his Downing Street office, again expressing his regret over the appointment.

"We must prove that politics can be a force for good," he told them, praising McSweeney as "a friend" who helped change the Labour Party and win the 2024 national election with one of the largest parliamentary majorities in modern British history.

"I believe it can. I believe it is. We go forward from here. We go with confidence as we continue changing the country."

But Sarwar, speaking in Scotland where Labour has seen its support slump since the 2024 election, said it was with a heavy heart that he had to defend Scotland and call for a change of leader in the UK capital London.

"The distraction needs to end and the leadership in Downing Street has to change," he told a press conference.

In response, a Downing Street spokesperson said Starmer had "a clear five-year mandate from the British people to deliver change, and that is what he will do".

With his statement, Sarwar became the most senior Labour figure to call for Starmer's resignation, and did little to quell a febrile mood in parliament in London's Westminster.

Steel makers under lens

New Delhi: The Competition Commission is probing the alleged cartelisation by steel manufacturers and the investigation report has been shared with the parties concerned to provide their objections and suggestions in accordance with the competition law, the government said Monday. The corporate affairs ministry also informed the Lok Sabha that the Competition Commission of India (CCI) registered 54 cases related to anti-competitive practices/and received 149 merger (M&A) filings in 2025. In a written reply, Corporate Affairs Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said CCI has registered a case pertaining to the alleged cartelisation by steel manufacturers pursuant to the directions of the Madras High Court. After investigation, CCI's Director General (DG) submitted the investigation report, which has been shared with the parties with directions to file their objections/suggestions in accordance with the provisions of the Competition Act, 2002.

Maruti's despatch record

New Delhi: Maruti Suzuki India Monday said it despatched over 5.85 lakh cars through railways last year, an year-on-year growth of 18 per cent over 2024. The auto major said its share of rail mode in outbound logistics has grown exponentially, rising from 5.1 per cent in 2016 to 26 per cent in 2025, significantly reducing carbon emissions, country's oil imports and easing road congestion. "During the year, we strengthened our green logistic efforts through two landmark events-the inauguration of India's largest automobile in-plant railway siding at our Manesar facility, and second was we dispatched vehicles by rail to Kashmir valley through the world's highest railway arch bridge over Chenab river, a first by any automobile manufacturer," Maruti Suzuki India MD and CEO Hisashi Takeuchi said.

BoB cuts car loan rates

New Delhi: State-owned Bank of Baroda (BoB) Monday announced a 30-basis-point reduction in its car loan interest rates, effective immediately. The bank's floating rate now starts from 7.6 per cent per annum, BoB said in a statement. The bank also offers an attractive fixed rate of interest on Baroda car loans, starting at 8.5 per cent per annum. The new rate beginning at 7.6 per cent is available on the purchase of a new car and is linked to a borrower's credit profile, it said. In addition to a reduced rate of interest, the bank is also offering borrowers zero prepayment/part-payment charges on floating rate car loans for individual borrowers, it said.

PSBs' profit rises to record ₹52,603 cr

New Delhi, Feb 9: Led by the country's biggest lender State Bank of India (SBI), public sector banks logged a record cumulative profit of Rs 52,603 crore in the third quarter of the current fiscal, reflecting an 18 per cent year-on-year growth.

All 12 public sector banks (PSBs) together made a profit of Rs 44,473 crore in the December quarter of FY25. Thus, the increase in profit in absolute terms was Rs 8,130 crore as compared to the same quarter of the previous financial year.

Market leader SBI alone contributed 40 per cent to the total earnings of Rs 52,603 crore, as per the published numbers on stock exchanges. SBI posted the highest quarterly net profit of Rs 21,028 crore in Q3 FY26, 24 per cent higher than the same period of the previous fiscal.

In percentage terms, Chennai-based Indian Overseas Bank reported the highest net profit growth of 56 per cent to Rs 1,365 crore, followed by Central Bank of India with a 32 per cent rise to Rs 1,263 crore.

During the quarter, all 12 public sector banks (PSBs), except Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, Indian Bank, and Bank of India, reported profit growth in single digits.

On an annual basis, PSBs recorded a slightly lower profit of 9 per cent to Rs 49,456 crore in the second quarter as compared to Rs 45,547 crore in the September quarter of FY25.

For the nine months ended December 2025, the aggregate profit of PSBs crossed Rs 1,45,000 crore for the first time.

India eases auto, alcohol imports

QUOTA-BASED AUTO DUTY CUTS, TARIFF REDUCTION ON ALCOHOL

New Delhi, Feb 9: India will grant quota-based duty concessions in the automobile sector, while access to alcoholic beverages has been offered under tariff reduction and minimum import price-based formulations under the trade pact with the US, the government said Monday.

It also said that under the agreement, tariffs on \$30.94 billion of India's exports will be reduced from 50 per cent to 18 per cent, while the reciprocal tariffs on another \$10.03 billion will be eliminated.

"This means a substantial share of Indian goods entering the US market will now face either sharply lower tariffs or completely duty-free access, significantly improving price competitiveness," the government said.

It said that \$1.36 billion of Indian agricultural exports receive zero additional US duty access. Key products include spices, tea, coffee, fruits, nuts and processed foods.

It said that sensitive sectors such as automobiles have been liberalised through a combination of quota and duty reduction mechanisms.

According to an official, India is not granting any duty concessions on electric vehicles to the US.

Medical devices have been addressed through long and staggered phasing schedules, and precious metals and other sensitive industrial products have been managed through

quota-based tariff lowering.

"Alcoholic beverages have been offered under tariff reduction along with minimum import price-based formulations, consistent with India's approach in other FTAs (free trade agreements)," it added.

Listing out sectoral gains for India, it said tariffs on textile exports will be cut down from 50 per cent to 18 per cent, while silk receives nil duty access, opening enhanced opportunities in the US market valued at \$113 billion.

Similarly, tariffs will be reduced to 18 per cent for the domestic gems and jewellery sector, providing preferential access to the American market valued at \$61 billion.

"In addition, 0 per cent duty market access has been secured for major product categories including diamonds, platinum and coins, covering a US market of \$29 billion," it said adding.

Key export categories expected to benefit include cut and polished diamonds, lab-grown synthetic diamonds, coloured gemstones, synthetic stones and articles of gold, silver, and platinum.

AGRI SECTOR

It said India maintains a trade surplus of \$1.3 billion in agricultural trade with the United States, with exports of \$3.4 billion and imports of \$2.1 billion in 2024.

The United States will apply zero additional duty on Indian exports worth \$1.36 billion.

Beneficiary products include



spices; tea and coffee; copra and coconut oil; nuts such as cashew nuts and chestnuts; fruits including avocados, bananas, guavas, mangoes, kiwis, papayas, pineapples, and mushroom.

Cereals such as barley and canary seeds; bakery products; cocoa, and cocoa preparations; sesame and poppy seeds; and processed products such as fruit pulp, juices and jams will also be benefitted.

In line with India's approach in previous trade agreements, agricultural market access has been structured based on product sensitivity.

The offer is categorised into immediate duty elimination, phased elimination (up to 10 years), tariff reduction, margin of preference and tariff rate quota mechanisms.

It said highly sensitive agricultural sectors remain fully protected under a carefully crafted exemption category.

These broadly include meat, poultry and dairy products; GM food products; soyameal; maize; and cereals.

For select sensitive agricultural products, the tariff reduction category has been applied to ensure that a measured level of duty protection continues.

Examples include parts of plants, olives, pyrethrum and oil cakes.

Certain highly sensitive items have been liberalised under Tariff Rate Quotas (TRQs), where limited quantities are allowed at reduced duties.

Products under this category include in-shell almonds, walnuts, pistachios, and lentils, it said. It added that phased elimination of tariffs over up to ten years has been adopted for certain intermediate products used by India's food processing industry and sourced from multiple countries.

These include albumins, certain oils such as coconut oil,

Silver surges 6%, gold up nearly 1%

New Delhi, Feb 9: Silver prices climbed more than 6 per cent to Rs 2.72 lakh per kilogram in the national capital Monday, while gold rose nearly 1 per cent to Rs 1.58 lakh per 10 grams, driven by firm global trends and a weaker US dollar.

According to local marketmen, the white metal climbed Rs 17,000, or 6.66 per cent to Rs 2,72,000 per kilogram (inclusive of all taxes), from Friday's closing level of Rs 2,55,000 per kg.

In addition, gold of 99.9 per cent purity increased Rs 1,300, or 0.83 per cent to Rs 1,58,500 per 10 grams (inclusive of all taxes). It had closed at Rs 1,57,200 per 10 grams in the previous session.

"Gold traded higher on Monday, supported by a pullback in the US dollar and bargain buying. The dollar index is trading lower by almost 0.30 per cent at 97 level, offering support to bullion prices," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst - Commodities at HDFC Securities - said.

Sensex reclaims 84k, Nifty nears 26k

Mumbai, Feb 9: Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty extended their gains for the second straight session Monday, driven by robust buying across all segments after India and the US reached a trade deal, putting an end to tariff uncertainties.

The 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 485.35 points, or 0.58 per cent, to close at 84,065.75. During the day, the benchmark surged 734.28 points, or 0.87 per cent, to hit an intraday high of 84,314.68.

The 50-share NSE Nifty appreciated by 173.60 points, or 0.68 per cent, to settle at 25,867.30. During the session, the index climbed 228.55 points, or 0.88 per cent, to hit a high of 25,922.25.

Among the 30-share constituents, State Bank of India, Titan, UltraTech Cement, Tata Steel, Eternal, Bharat Electronics Ltd, Kotak Mahindra Bank, IndiGo, Trent, Mahindra & Mahindra, Larsen & Toubro, Sun Pharmaceuticals, and Asian Paints were the gainers.

On the other hand, PowerGrid, NTPC, ITC, ICICI Bank,



Infosys, HDFC Bank, Tech Mahindra, Maruti Suzuki India and Axis Bank were the laggards. On the BSE, the Small-cap Select index rose 2.31 per cent, while Midcap Select index went up 1.27 per cent.

Among sectoral indices, PSU Bank climbed the most by 2.83 per cent, followed by Consumer Durables (2.76 per cent), Realty (2.64 per cent), and Commodities (2.06 per cent). While Industrials and Telecommunication rose by 1.94 per cent each, Capital Goods increased 1.89 per

cent, Consumer Discretionary gained 1.73 per cent, and Metal went up by 1.54 per cent. A total of 3,110 stocks advanced, while 1,254 declined and 163 remained unchanged on the BSE.

On Friday, the 30-share BSE Sensex advanced 266.47 points to settle at 83,580.40, while the NSE Nifty climbed 50.90 points to end at 25,693.70.

The rupee witnessed a volatile trading session and settled for the day on a slightly lower note, down 1 paisa at 90.66 against the US dollar Monday.

RBI amends MSME lending directions

Collateral-free loan limit increased to ₹20 lakh

Mumbai, Feb 9: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Monday announced amendments to its lending directions for the micro, small and medium enterprises (MSME) sector, increasing the collateral-free loan limit for micro and small enterprises (MSEs) to Rs 20 lakh in a move aimed at improving credit access for smaller businesses.

"Banks are mandated not to accept collateral security in the case of loans up to Rs 20 lakh extended to units in the MSE sector. Banks are also advised to extend collateral-free loans up to Rs 20 lakh to all units financed under the Prime Minister Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) administered by KVIC," amended guidelines said.



Banks may, on the basis of good track record and financial position of the MSE units, increase the limit to dispense with the collateral requirement for loans up to Rs 25 lakh as per their internal policy and banks may avail the benefit of Credit Guarantee Scheme cover, where applicable, according to new norms.

However, accepting gold and silver as collateral pledged voluntarily by borrowers for loans sanctioned by the banks up to the collateral free limit, will not be construed as a violation of the mandate, it said.

The amendments have been made to the Master Direction Lending to MSME Sector, which was last updated in July 2025.

According to the RBI, the revised norms are intended to strengthen last-mile credit delivery to micro and small enterprises that often face constraints in providing collateral due to limited asset bases.

Draft Income Tax Rules propose higher PAN limits

The new rules will give effect to the new Income Tax Act, 2025, which will be implemented from April 1

New Delhi, Feb 9: Draft Income Tax Rules have proposed significantly raising transaction limits for quoting of PAN for cash deposits/withdrawal in banks, purchase of motor vehicles and property, and payment of hotel bills.

The draft also proposes raising the value of perquisites provided by employers, and making it mandatory for crypto exchanges to share information with the tax department. It also includes Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) as an accepted mode of electronic payment.

The draft rules have expanded the list of Category 1 metropolitan cities to include Bangalore, Pune, Ahmedabad, and Hyderabad for the purpose of claiming house rent allowance

(HRA). The list includes Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, and Chennai.

The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) will finalise rules after stakeholder consultation and will notify them by the first week of March, Finance Ministry sources said.

The Income Tax Rules are being finalised to give effect to the Income Tax Act, 2025, which will be implemented from April 1.

According to the proposed Income Tax Rule, 2026, quoting of Permanent Account Number (PAN) will be mandatory for making cash deposits or withdrawals aggregating to Rs 10 lakh or more in a financial year, in one or more accounts of a person.

Presently, PAN is required for cash deposits exceeding Rs 50,000 during any one day with



a banking company or a cooperative bank.

In case of purchase of motor vehicles (including motor cycles), a buyer has to quote his/her PAN if the price exceeds Rs 5 lakh.

The current Income Tax Rules, 1962, do not provide for quoting of PAN for purchase of two-wheelers, while for motor vehicles it was mandatory irrespective of price.

In case of hotel/restaurant bills, payments made to convention centres or banquet

halls or a person engaged in event management, PAN will be mandatory if the payment exceeds Rs 1 lakh.

The current I-T Rules specify a Rs 50,000 threshold for quoting PAN in case of hotel/restaurant bills.

In case of purchase or sale or gift or joint development agreement of any immovable property, PAN will be mandatory if the transaction cost is more than Rs 20 lakh, as against the existing limit of Rs 10 lakh.

Under the draft rules, PAN

will be mandatory for starting an account-based relationship with an insurance company. Currently, payments aggregating to more than Rs 50,000 in a financial year as life insurance premium require PAN.

Sources said the intent behind rationalising the PAN quoting threshold is to capture only "relevant information" and "leveraging tech-enhancements of reporting entities" under the Income Tax Act.

The value of tax-free perquisites for official vehicles and free meals is proposed to be enhanced in view of the current market realities.

In case of free food and non-alcoholic beverages provided by the employer to an employee, the perquisite value has been fixed at Rs 200 per meal.

For motor cars, the allowance of cars below the engine capacity of 1.6 litres will be Rs 8,000/month, while for others it will be Rs 10,000/month. These would include allowance for drivers.

Lahore, Feb 9: The Pakistan government has withdrawn its decision to boycott the T20 World Cup match against India after the country's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif was persuaded by Sri Lanka and Bangladesh, a top government source told PTI Monday.

The game against India is scheduled to be held in Colombo February 15.

"Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif received calls from both Sri Lanka and Bangladesh and he has agreed to their request to withdraw the boycott call," the source said.

It was clear that the country would withdraw the call after Bangladesh Cricket Board chief Aminul Islam issued a statement urging Pakistan to take the field for the greater good of the game. Pakistan Cricket Board chief Mohsin Naqvi had earlier stated



that a formal announcement on the matter would be done in the next 24 hours.

Bangladesh have been ousted from the tournament for refusing to play in India citing security concerns. The trigger for Bangladesh's refusal to play in India was the release of their pacer Mustafizur Rahman from the KKR squad on BCCI's instructions.

BCB chief Islam issued a statement in Dhaka, expressing his gratitude towards Pakistan for backing his country but re-

"We are deeply moved by Pakistan's efforts to go above and beyond in supporting Bangladesh during this period. Long may our brotherhood flourish," Islam said in a statement.

In addition, the ICC also agreed to give the hosting rights of a global event to Bangladesh between 2028 and 2031.

It is understood that during his meeting with ICC deputy chair Imran Khawaja Sunday, Naqvi had kept a few demands, including resumption of Indo-Pak bilateral cricket and a tri-series involving Bangladesh, to offset the losses that the BCB has incurred following their shocking ouster from the global event.

While Indo-Pak bilateral cricket isn't under ICC's purview, the demand for a tri-series was summarily rejected. India haven't played any tri-nation tournament for more than a decade now. However, the ICC might consider awarding the next men's Under-19 World Cup to Bangladesh.

T20 WORLD CUP

Debutants Italy lose

Kolkata: George Munsey struck a half-century and shared a century opening stand with Michael Jones as Scotland defeated debutants Italy by 73 runs in a T20 World Cup match here Monday. Munsey hammered 84 off 54 balls while Jones contributed 37 off 30 deliveries, the duo laying the foundation with a 126-run opening partnership as Scotland posted a strong 207 for 4. In reply, Italy showed plenty of heart, with Ben Manenti clobbering a 31-ball 52 and brother Harry scoring 37. However, they were ultimately undone by inexperience and were bowled out for 134 in 16.4 overs. Italy suffered an injury blow when skipper Wayne Madsen was injured while fielding after diving to stop runs in the fourth over of Scotland's innings. The 42-year-old was in visible pain as he walked off the field, his left arm supported by a makeshift sling fashioned from his jersey.

Zimbabwe beat Oman

Colombo: Opening batter Brian Bennett made a sparkling 48 not out to help Zimbabwe beat Oman by eight wickets in their T20 World Cup match here Monday. Bennett hit seven fours during his 36-ball unbeaten knock while wicketkeeper-batter Brendan Taylor (31 retired hurt) and Tadiwanashe Marumani (21) chipped in with important contributions as Zimbabwe chased down a small target of 104 with 39 balls to spare. Zimbabwe reached 106 for 2 in 13.3 overs. Sikandar Raza got the remaining wicket for Zimbabwe after Ngarava (3/17), Muzarabani (3/16) and Evans (3/18) got three each.

Proteas thrash Canada

Ahmedabad: South Africa defeated Canada by 57 runs in their opening match of the T20 World Cup here Monday. Skipper Aiden Markram made a 32-ball 59 as South Africa posted 213 for four and then limited Canada to 156 for 8 in 20 overs. Apart from Markram, Ryan Rickelton (33), Quinton de Kock (25), Tristan Stubbs (34) and David Miller (39) also made useful contributions after being asked to take first strike. Navneet Dhaliwal (64) was the top scorer for Canada. Lungi Ngidi (4/31) was the most successful bowler for SA.

But Haaland sent the away fans wild by firing into the bot-

tom corner from the spot in the 93rd after Liverpool goalkeeper Allison brought down Matheus Nunes in the box.

Even after Haaland's goal, the drama was far from over.

City goalkeeper Gianluigi Donnarumma produced a spectacular save to push Alexis Mac Allister's shot away from the top corner.

And then substitute Rayan Cherki scored from the halfway line - only for VAR to overrule it and send off Szoboszlai for a foul on Haaland before the ball crossed the line.

Ro-Ko downgraded to group B

New Delhi, Feb 9: Senior superstars Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma were on expected lines downgraded to group B of the latest annual central contract awarded by the BCCI which also abolished the prevailing A+ category carrying a retainership fee of Rs 7 crore.

The BCCI Monday awarded central contract to 30 men and 21 women cricketers classified in group A, B and C.

Two-format skipper Shubman Gill along with senior pacer Jasprit Bumrah and premier

Test all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja were retained in group A.

However, the BCCI didn't mention the quantum of retainership fees for the three categories. With A+ being done away, in the earlier seasons, group A was valued at Rs 5 crore, group B at Rs 3 crore annually, and group C at Rs 1 crore.

As far as Kohli and Rohit are concerned, their retirement from Tests and T20s effectively makes them one-format players and hence as per criteria, they couldn't have been retained in the top-most category.

Breezy, Malinin star for US as Vonn crashes

Milan, Feb 9: The crash. The gasps. The helicopter. Lindsey Vonn's frightening fall in the women's downhill at the Milan Cortina Olympics couldn't help but overshadow US teammate Breezy Johnson's feat - winning her country's first gold medal at these Games.

Johnson's victory Sunday in Cortina wasn't the Olympic comeback story everyone expected, as the focus was on Vonn going for gold despite a torn ACL. Even as Johnson sat in the leader's box on the verge of securing her first Olympic gold medal, her emotions swung from anticipation to anguish when Vonn went down.

"It was one of the most heart-breaking moments of my life," Johnson said.

Still, the 30-year-old Johnson became only the second



American woman to win the Olympic downhill - Vonn won it in 2010 - and it came after her own injury concerns as well as a 14-month ban for violating "whereabouts" rules when it comes to testing for doping.

Sometimes, she said, "you

just have to keep going because that's the only option."

Ilia Malinin, the Quad God, delivers for US

No delays this time.

The US defended its team figure skating gold medal by

edging Japan Sunday.

Ilia Malinin beat rival Shun Sato in a head-to-head showdown to break a deadlock in the final session of the competition. The US ended up with 69 points while Japan finished with 68.

Malinin, nicknamed the "Quad God," landed five quadruple jumps and scored 200.03 points for his free skate. Sato followed him with three quads in his program, but he could only manage 194.86 points, leaving the Japanese with a second straight silver medal in the team event.

Four years ago, the Americans - and Japanese - were denied a medal ceremony in Beijing because of a lengthy investigation into Russian doping, which kept them from receiving their medals until the 2024 Summer Games in Paris.

Italy celebrates big haul of medals

Must be the home cooking.

Host nation Italy won six medals Sunday - five bronze and one silver - the most Italy has ever won in a single day at the Winter Olympics.

The Italy team delivered the silver medal in the mixed relay biathlon race.

Downhill skier Sofia Goggia won Italy's first bronze medal of the day, followed by Lucia Dalmasso's third place in snowboarding's parallel giant slalom. Riccardo Lorello claimed bronze in the men's speedskating 5,000 meters.

Dominik Fischnaller took bronze in men's singles luge before Italy rallied for third place in the figure skating team event. That followed Italy's Day 1 total of three medals, led by speedskater Francesca Lollobrigida's gold in the 3,000 meters.
