## SC: Check if any racket is behind missing kids

**New Delhi, Feb 10:** The Supreme Court Tuesday asked the Centre to ascertain whether there is a nationwide network or state-specific group behind the incidents of children going missing from different parts of the country.

A bench of Justices BV Nareshna and Ujjal Bhuyan emphasised the need to ascertain whether there is a pattern behind these incidents or if they are random ones, and asked the Centre to collate data from all states.

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, appearing for the Centre, said some states have given their data on missing children and that of prosecution, but around a dozen states have not given their data.

She submitted that the analysis can be made only after the Union government gets complete data.

The top court suggested to Bhati that children who have been rescued should be interviewed to ascertain who is responsible for such incidents. The bench was also critical of the states that have not furnished the data, and said it may pass harsh orders if needed.

Senior advocate Aparna Bhattacharya said the Centre has taken the initiative and direction be issued to all states to furnish the data.

The bench was hearing a PIL filed by an NGO, 'Guria Swayam Sevi Sansthan', that highlighted the rising number of children who remain untraced across several states.

The top court December 9 directed the Centre to furnish six years of nationwide data on missing children and appoint a dedicated officer in the Union Home Ministry for ensuring effective coordination with states and Union Territories in compiling such data.

## 3 women killed, four hurt in jumbo attack





**Dhenkanal, Feb 10:** Three women were killed while four others sustained grievous injuries in an attack by a wild elephant at a forest in Dhenkanal district Tuesday, a senior officer said. The incident occurred near Lochapali village in Patpuri forest of Dhenkanal Sadar range, he said. The deceased were identified as Indumati Pradhan, 60, Tuni Behera, 50, and Kuntala Pradhan, 40. The injured were identified as Rama Dehuri, 40, Rashmita Pradhan, 35, and Jhili Pradhan, 35. The identity of the other injured woman is yet to be confirmed. The women had gone to the dense forest to collect firewood when they came across the tusker. "The elephant suddenly appeared before us and attacked without any provocation," one of the survivors said.

DFO Sumit Kumar Kar said, "A forest patrol team rescued the women immediately, but three of them lost their lives." Sadar Range officer Uchhab Pradhan said forest staff on patrol had warned villagers about the presence of the tusker and advised them not to venture into the forest, but to no avail.

The district administration provided ₹10,000 each from district Red Cross fund to the victims' families, Sadar tehsildar Swadhin Behera said.

On several occasions, opposition parties have just not been allowed to speak, which is their basic democratic right in Parliament, the notice said.

The notice said that Rahul Gandhi was not allowed to complete his speech on the Motion of Thanks to the President's Address February 2. This is not an isolated instance. The Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha is almost invariably not allowed to speak, it claimed. Eight Opposition MPs were "arbitrarily suspended" for the entire Budget Session February 3, the notice mentioned.

## ARSON, FIRING ROCK MANIPUR

**Imphal, Feb 10:** In a fresh bout of violence over the alleged assault of a Tangkhul Naga community member in Manipur's Ukhru, several abandoned houses were set on fire and shots fired Tuesday morning, prompting the state government to suspend internet services in the district for five days, police said.

The fresh firing and arson in Litan Sareikhang area comes a day after two Tangkhul Naga organisations restricted the movement of Kukis in Ukhru and Kamjong districts.

"Armed men set ablaze abandoned houses and fired several rounds of bullets at Litan Sareikhang. The situation remains tense, and security forces are trying to bring the situation under control," a police officer said.

The Manipur government Tuesday ordered suspension of internet, including services through broadband, VPN and VSAT in the revenue jurisdiction of Ukhru district for five days as a preventive and precautionary measure, he said.

Locals, who fled their residences, confronted security forces for their alleged failure to stop firing in the area.

## Global name hunt ends; it's 'The people's mollusc'

Newly found deep-sea chiton Ferreiraella populi (Senckenberg Ocean Species Alliance)

of over 5,500 metres (3.4 miles), according to a report by 'The Independent'.

Following its discovery, a public naming campaign began after YouTuber Ze Frank

featured the rare chiton from the genus Ferreiraella in an episode of his "True Facts" series, the report said.

Over 8,000 suggestions for its name were submitted through social media, and after reviewing the entries, scientists selected the name 'Ferreiraella populi', where the species name in Latin means "of the people".

Eleven different participants independently suggested the same name during the online process, researchers say.

The mollusc has eight armoured shell plates and an iron-clad radula, or tongue, and belongs to a rare group known for living only on sunken wood in the deep sea. Chitons, espe-

cially deep-sea ones, are rarely studied despite their key role in nutrient circulation within seafloor wood-fall ecosystems.

It also hosts a small group of worms that feed on its excrement near its tail, according to details of the species revealed in the 'Biodiversity Data Journal'.

"We were overwhelmed by the response and the massive number of creative name suggestions!" said study author Julia Sigwar from the Natural History Museum Frankfurt.

Other suggestions were also made in the online poll, including the name Ferreiraella ohmu, referencing a chiton-like creature from a Studio Ghibli film.




## ₹4,111CR INDUSTRIAL PROJECTS OKAYED

**Bhubaneswar, Feb 10:** In a boost to Odisha's industrial ecosystem and job-led economic growth, the State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLSWCA), headed by Chief Secretary Anu Garg, approved 23 industrial projects involving an investment of ₹4,111.80 crore, with the potential to generate 9,924 jobs, Tuesday.

Nipha Limited's proposal to establish a railway component manufacturing unit in Khurda got the SLSWCA approval.

With an investment of ₹384 crore, the facility is expected to create jobs for 310 individuals. Inventgrid India Private Limited got the go-ahead to set up an advanced multi-drone manufacturing centre in Ganjam with an investment of ₹300 crore, generating 1,000 jobs.

Northernexpress InfraDevelopers Private Limited received the state government's approval to develop a shipbuilding and ship-repair facility in Bhadrak. With an investment of ₹339.40 crore and potential to create 507 employment opportunities, the facility will position Odisha as an emerging maritime industrial hub.

JG Hosiery Private Limited is set to establish an apparel manufacturing unit in Khurda.



da with an annual production capacity of 149.76 million pieces. With an investment of ₹100 crore, the apparel manufacturing unit is expected to provide jobs to 2,350 individuals.

Alventra Pharma Limited will set up a pharmaceutical formulation unit in Khurda with an investment of ₹100 crore, creating 250 jobs, while Blue Mount Energy Private Limited got the state government's nod to establish a sorbitol manufacturing unit in Cuttack having a production capacity of 17,000 MT per annum, with an investment of ₹100 crore, generating 100 jobs.

Growing Tree Oil Refinery Private Limited also got the go-ahead to develop an integrated solvent extraction unit, oil refinery, fish feed, prawn feed, cattle feed and poultry feed manufacturing complex in Cuttack. With an investment of ₹100 crore, the initiative is expected to create 250 jobs.

Sarvesh Refractories Ltd will expand its existing unit by setting up a silica brick

manufacturing plant in Sundargarh with an investment of ₹62 crore, generating 100 jobs, while Jharkhand Grind Chem Private Limited will establish a refractories unit in Jajpur with an investment of ₹67.15 crore, creating 225 jobs.

Yash Flexi Pack Private Limited will establish a 12,400 MT flexible packaging products unit in Balasore with an investment of ₹51 crore, creating 150 jobs, while JBSS Glass Private Limited will set up a glass manufacturing unit in Cuttack with an investment of ₹50.85 crore, generating 263 jobs.

The SLSWCA approved Kalingga Metalics Limited's proposal for a 4 MTPA iron ore beneficiation plant in Sundargarh with an investment of ₹600 crore, creating 700 jobs. Shree Ram Iron and Alloys Private Limited's plan for 0.8 MTPA pellet plant in Deogarh with an investment of ₹250 crore, generating 475 jobs also got the government's nod. While Rashmi Metallurgical Industry Private Limited will establish a

3.0 MTPA iron ore beneficiation plant with tailing pond in Sundargarh with an investment of ₹350 crore, creating 200 jobs, Aryas Ore Refinery Private Limited's plan for iron ore beneficiation plant in Sundargarh with an investment of ₹51 crore, generating 149 jobs also got the approval.

Shrishti Trading Corporation Private Limited will develop a logistic park and warehousing facility in Cuttack with an investment of ₹160.75 crore, generating 595 jobs.

The SLSWCA also approved the proposals of Panda Resorts Private Limited and Shankari Devi Enterprise for 4-star hotels in Puri and Sambalpur with investments of ₹70 crore and ₹64.10 crore, generating 240 and 165 jobs, respectively.

Among others, Water Tech India Private Limited will establish a facility for plastic-based products in Ganjam with an investment of ₹387 crore, generating 975 jobs.

## Salary hike for contractual AYUSH doctors

**Bhubaneswar, Feb 10:** Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Tuesday approved a proposal to enhance the salaries of contractual AYUSH doctors working under the National Health Mission (NHM) in Odisha, recognising their contribution to public healthcare.

The hike ranges from ₹20,000 to ₹40,000 per month, depending

on their period of service, said a statement issued by the Chief Minister's Office (CMO).

Doctors with less than five years of experience will get a hike of ₹20,000, and their salary will now become ₹56,948, it said. Those with five to 10 years of experience will get a hike of ₹25,000, raising their salary to ₹74,467. Doctors with experience between 10 and 15 years will get a hike of ₹30,000,

resulting in a salary of ₹80,467 per month. Those with more than 15 years of service experience will get the highest hike of ₹40,000, taking their salary to ₹91,467, the statement said.

The decision will benefit 2,912 AYUSH doctors working on a contractual basis under NHM. The salary revision is estimated to cost the state exchequer an additional ₹1 crore per annum.

## Constitute 15th Press Council of India: BJD

**New Delhi:** BJD MP Sasmit Patra Tuesday urged the government to constitute the 15th Press Council of India in order to uphold democratic values and strengthen media accountability. Speaking in the Rajya Sabha, Patra noted that there is concern over the prolonged non-functioning of the Press Council of India, a statutory and autonomous body established by an Act of Parliament in 1978 to safeguard the freedom of the press and to uphold ethical standards in journalism. The 14th Press Council of India completed its term October 5, 2024, yet the 15th Press Council of India has not been convened even after more than 16 months, he added. The situation has been further aggravated by the expiry of the extended tenure of the former chairperson, Justice Ranjana Desai, December 17, 2025, without the appointment of a successor, Patra said. "I urge the Government to treat this matter with the seriousness it deserves and to take immediate steps to complete the appointment of the Chairperson and constitute the 15th Press Council without any further delay," Patra said.

"It has been enacted to ensure the safety of road users and reduce environmental pollution and the state government has implemented it accordingly. In this regard, Advocate General Shri Pitambar Acharya had sided with the Government. The Hon'ble High Court examined this and clarified that the Government's decision was in accordance with the law," he added.

## Clear challans older than 90 days: HC on PUCC

**Bhubaneswar/Cuttack, Feb 10:** The Orissa High Court Tuesday observed that vehicle owners have to clear outstanding challans older than 90 days before obtaining a Pollution Under Control Certificate (PUCC).

While rejecting a PIL filed by advocate Snigdha Patra opposing the state government's decision making mandatory clearing of challans for pollution testing of vehicles, a division bench of Chief Justice Harish Tandon and Justice Murahari Sri Raman stated that motor vehicles with pending challans older than 90 days are not eligible for pollution testing. The court observed that clearing outstanding challans older



than 90 days before undergoing PUCC testing is a mandatory legal requirement.

Taking to X in the evening, Commerce and Transport Minister Bibhuti Bhushan Jena said the controversy over pollution certificates that has been going on for the past few days has come to an end after the de-

cision of the HC. "The Central Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 and the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 have been framed by the Parliament. As per Section 167 and Sub-Section 12 of this Act, it is mandatory to pay the challans outstanding for more than 90 days to get a pollution certificate," Jena said.

"It has been enacted to ensure the safety of road users and reduce environmental pollution and the state government has implemented it accordingly. In this regard, Advocate General Shri Pitambar Acharya had sided with the Government. The Hon'ble High Court examined this and clarified that the Government's decision was in accordance with the law," he added.

## IIT develops digital power substation

**Bhubaneswar:** IIT-Bhubaneswar has developed an advanced digital substation equipped with a centralised monitoring and protection system. Energy department's Additional Chief Secretary Vishal Kumar Dev inaugurated the system at the 33/11 kV campus substation in the presence of IIT-Bhubaneswar Director Shreepad Karmalkar Tuesday. The system will enable real-time monitoring and protection of the institute's entire electrical distribution network, a statement said. The project was undertaken as a demonstration initiative under the National Perspective Plan (NPP) of the Central Power Research Institute (CPR), Bengaluru, it said. The objective of the project was to design, develop, and demonstrate a centralised protection and monitoring (CPM) system for a distribution substation, including integration of distributed energy resources, it added. This is one of the indigenously developed digital substation frameworks in the country, leveraging intelligent merging units that eliminate the need for conventional physical Intelligent Electronic Devices (IEDs) within the substation, the statement said.

## Form high-level inquiry committee: OHRC

**Bhubaneswar, Feb 10:** The Odisha Human Rights Commission (OHRC) has directed the state government to constitute a high-level inquiry committee comprising officials from various departments within four weeks to probe the flawed process of village relocation in the Satkosia Tiger Reserve (STR) in Angul district.

Raising serious concerns over violations of various procedures during the relocation process, the OHRC has also directed that the committee should identify officers responsible for such violations and recommend departmental as well as criminal action wherever warranted. It issued the directions while acting on complaints filed by the affected residents of Bhurkundi, Asanbhal,

Kataranga, Tuluksa, Tikarapada, Gopalpur, and other adjoining villages, who alleged violations of their basic human rights due to irregularities in the relocation process. The OHRC observed that the relocation from a core or critical tiger habitat is governed by Section 38V of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, as

amended, and the guidelines issued by the NTCA. It further noted that the relocation requires strict legal compliance, habitat assessment, settlement of rights under the FRA, 2006, and informed consent of Gram Sabha. Relocation must be genuinely voluntary and based on a mutually agreed rehabilitation package.

However, the OHRC found that the relocation in several instances was done without following prescribed procedures.

"The Commission recommends the Government of Odisha to constitute High-Level Inquiry Committee within four weeks, consisting of the Secretary, Forest and Environment Department, with Secretaries of the ST & SC Development Department, Revenue & Disaster Management Department, Law Department and one independent expert having knowledge of wildlife law, the FRA, 2006 and rehabilitation policy to be nominated by the government," directed the OHRC.

It also asked the Chief Secretary to decide who will head the committee and submit the compliance report regarding the formation of the committee within six weeks.

## Odisha launches MDA programme in 5 dists

**Bhubaneswar, Feb 10:** Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) Minister Mukesh Mahaling launched the Mass Drug Administration (MDA) programme in five districts Tuesday, aimed at accelerating the elimination of lymphatic filariasis (LF), a chronic mosquito-borne disease that can cause long-term disability if left untreated.

The 10-day campaign, scheduled to conclude February 19, will cover an estimated 7.4 lakh population across seven endemic blocks and urban areas in five districts—Bolangir, Bargarh, Ganjam, Dhenkanal and Jajpur.

In order to ensure effective implementation, 2,200 drug administrators have been deployed for supervised drug consumption, supported by 210 supervisors to monitor field activities, according to the H&FW department.



The national-level launch of the programme was also conducted in hybrid mode by Union H&FW Minister JP Nadda. The event was also attended by Mahaling, along with senior officials, department's Commissioner-cum-Secretary, and NHM Odisha Mission Director among others in the City.

Over the past few years, Odisha has made remarkable progress in its fight against LF. The number of Implementation Units (IUs) under MDA has seen a sharp de-

cline—from 349 blocks and urban areas in 2023 to 162 in 2025. During February 2025 round, MDA was conducted in 47 units, which has now reduced further to just seven units in February 2026.

In 2025–26, the state successfully cleared 25 Evaluation Units (EUs) and 113 IUs under the Transmission Assessment Survey (TAS), achieving an impressive 96 per cent success rate.

## NHRC slams TN's response, seeks answer on negligence

**New Delhi, Feb 10:** The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) Tuesday criticised the Tamil Nadu (TN) government's response to the brutal attack on an Odisha migrant worker in Tiruttani, noting the delayed FIR and the victim's unexplained disappearance from the hospital without follow-up searches.

The NHRC has issued a notice to the Chief Secretary of the state after the youth, with serious injuries, disappeared from the hospital, and the Stalin government had no information about him.

In a disturbing incident that triggered widespread outrage, four 17-year-old drug-addicted boys brutally attacked an Odisha man with a sickle near the Tiruttani railway station in Tiruvallur district in December last year. The victim was later identified as K Suraj (20), from Odisha.

NHRC member Priyank Kanoongo called the incident "the pinnacle of governmental ineptitude".

Taking to X, Kanoongo stated, "The MK Stalin government of the state has responded to our notice regarding the migrant worker Suraj, who was slashed with a sharp weapon in Tamil Nadu, stating that the victim left the hospital in an injured condition and has since disappeared, and the government now has no information about him."

He mentioned that the attack occurred December 27, 2025, and statements from the injured were recorded on the same day. However, the FIR was filed only

December 28, "under pressure from social media".

Kanoongo further stated that the immediate disappearance of the injured thereafter "raises serious questions about the government's functioning" as the administration, according to the NHRC member, did not even attempt to search for the injured or trace his family.

"Therefore, we have issued a notice to the Chief Secretary of the state with the following directives: Search for the injured and ensure his treatment is provided; explain why compensation of 2 lakh rupees should not be given to the victim? Provide details and clarification on the action taken against the negligence of the police and administration," he added.

## Two-week civil aviation security training begins

## Piped water to all villages by March 2027: CM Majhi

**Bhubaneswar, Feb 10:** Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Tuesday set an ambitious target to provide piped drinking water to all villages in Odisha by March 2027, directing officials to fast-track ongoing projects in mission mode to meet the deadline.

According to official sources, out of the state's 46,531 villages, 21,721 villages currently have access to piped water supply. Several initiatives, including solar-powered drinking water systems and mega drinking water projects, are presently under various stages of implementation to bridge the remaining gap.

To achieve universal coverage, the state government has planned a total investment of ₹54,000 crore, of which ₹32,128 crore is being funded under the Jal Jeevan Mission, while the remaining ₹21,109 crore will be borne by the state from its own resources.

The details emerged during a review meeting of the Rural Drinking Water Supply system of the Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water department,

areas for equitable access.

Officials said only three mega drinking water projects were completed in the state between 2017 and June 12, 2024. However, since June 2024, as many as 23 such projects have been completed.

Additionally, over the past 20 months, the state has completed 2,951 single village projects, installed 2,702 solar-powered drinking water systems, and constructed 26,137 tubewells across Odisha.

## Left parties back Feb 12 general strike in Odisha

**Bhubaneswar, Feb 10:** Ahead of the nationwide general strike February 12, Left parties in Odisha—CPI, CPI(M), CPI(ML) Liberation and the All India Forward Bloc—have jointly called for its complete success across the state.

The strike, called by Central trade unions and independent federations, is aimed at protesting what they describe as anti-worker, anti-farmer and anti-people policies of the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government at the Centre, now in its third consecutive term.

The strike will be observed across Odisha from 6 am to 6 pm, with essential services such as medical care, ambulance operations, water supply, news media and fire services exempted.

Addressing a joint press conference at Bhagawati Bhawan here Tuesday, Left leaders said the February 12 general strike was prompted by the government's refusal to repeal the four labour codes, withdraw what they termed anti-worker legislations, and roll back policies affecting job security, pensions and public sector enterprises.

"Despite prolonged agitations and the submission of a 12-point charter of demands by trade unions including INTUC,



AITUC, HMS, CITU, AIUTUC, AICCTU, TUCC, AEPP, UTUC and SEWA, the Centre has allegedly failed to address their core concerns," he said.

Among the key demands were repeal of the four labour codes, withdrawal of the Electricity Amendment Bill 2025, an end to contract, outsourcing and fixed-term employment in permanent jobs, restoration of the old pension scheme by repealing the NPS and UPS, and fixing a minimum monthly pension of ₹9,000, including EPF.

The unions have also sought worker status for scheme workers, including Anganwadi staff, ASHAs, mid-day meal workers, garden companions, gram panchayat employees and livelihood mission workers. The Left parties further

demanded a central law guaranteeing Minimum Support Price for farm produce, repeal of the Seed Bill 2025, withdrawal of education-related legislations they claim restrict access, and immediate steps to curb price rise.

Criticising the BJP government in Odisha, the leaders alleged lapses in women's safety, corruption in recruitment examinations, poor regulation of the grain market, non-procurement of paddy despite the end of the token period, and arbitrary penalties under the Motor Vehicles Amendment Act.

They also expressed concern over what they described as deteriorating law and order, attacks on Bengali-speaking minorities, rising atrocities against Dalits, tribals and

women, displacement linked to mining activities, unfulfilled promises of free electricity up to 300 units per household, and alleged consumer exploitation by power distribution companies.

Calling for broad-based participation, the Left leaders appealed to farmers, youth, students, small traders, transport workers, women and other sections of society to join the strike in solidarity. The press conference was addressed by CPI State Secretary Prashant Kumar Mishra, CPI(M) State Secretary Suresh Panigrahi, CPI(ML) Liberation State Secretary Yudhishtir Mohapatra, and All India Forward Bloc State President Puneet Chandra Padhee, who jointly issued the call for the statewide shutdown.



# Crushers must register on i4MS by Feb 20

Illegal crusher unit owners jittery after minor minerals dept directive

**Jajpur, Feb 10:** Illegal stone crusher units are causing the state to lose revenue worth crores of rupees, officials said. Despite periodic inspections, effective action against unauthorized crushers has remained limited, allowing violations to continue.

The Minor Minerals department has been conducting checks at stone crusher units to verify environmental clearances, transit passes, sale receipts and other mandatory documents. However, visible enforcement against illegal units has so far been lacking.

To curb such violations, the state Steel and Mines Department had earlier issued an order, May 5, 2025, directing all stone crusher units to register on the Integrated Minor Mineral Mining Management System (i4MS) portal. The Directorate of Minor Minerals reiterated the directive through subsequent orders issued May 9, 2025 and October 30, 2025.

However, as per the officials, even after nine months, none of the stone crusher owners complied with the registration requirement, prompting fresh instructions from the government.



In a recent order February 9, 2026, Deputy Director of Minor Minerals Turam Balai Munda directed all Deputy Directors of Mines (DDMs) and Mining Officers (MOs) to ensure that all stone crusher units are registered on the i4MS portal by February 20, 2026.

The directive asked field officers to treat the matter on priority and initiate appropriate action against non-compliant units. Officials said the registration process would help improve monitoring, enhance transparency and prevent revenue loss caused by unauthorized mining and crushing activities.

The Directorate of Minor Minerals under the Steel and Mines Department has issued a standard operating procedure (SOP) for the registration of stone crusher units on the i4MS portal. As per the SOP, all

operational stone crusher units must complete their registration on the i4MS portal within one month.

A private farm has been directed to take the necessary steps for integration of the SOP. The registration certificate will remain valid until the expiry of the sitting criteria or the consent to operate (CTO). Unit owners must apply for renewal through the portal at least 30 days before the registration expires.

For transportation of minerals from crusher units, obtaining permission from the competent authority and securing an e-Transit Permit (e-TP) through the i4MS portal will be mandatory. Crusher unit owners must provide accurate daily details of raw materials received and processed output dispatched through Form-C on the portal. A consolidat-

ed monthly return must be submitted to the authorities within the first week of every month.

All norms prescribed by the Pollution Control Board must be strictly followed. Crusher units will be required to produce mineral stock details and relevant records during inspections by government officials. Installation of CCTV cameras and check gates has been made mandatory to ensure proper monitoring of stock.

Violation of the SOP may lead to cancellation of registration. The district-level task force will oversee the registration process and ensure compliance. Regular roadside checks will be conducted by the administration to inspect vehicles transporting chips, dust and metals from crusher units. Vehicles found operating without valid e-TPs will face penalties, and action will be initiated against owners and drivers. In such cases, the registration of the concerned crusher unit can also be cancelled.

Officials said strict implementation of these measures is expected to significantly boost revenue and effectively curb illegal mining and transportation of black stone.

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# Pitabas Panda murder case: Accused Bikram hospitalised

**Chhatrapur/Berhampur, Feb 10:** Former MLA Bikram Panda, who is lodged in Berhampur Circle Jail after his arrest in the Pitabas Panda murder case, was admitted to the surgery ward of MKCG Medical College and Hospital Tuesday following health complications.

Panda had returned to jail after receiving treatment at MKCG Medical College and Hospital two days ago. However, he was readmitted after complaining of severe abdominal and chest pain. He is currently under police guard and admitted to Bed No. 320 in the surgery ward.

Hospital sources said Panda is suffering from a gall bladder-related ailment, and surgery may be required.

In a related development, another accused in the case, BJD leader Madan Dalai, was also admitted to the same hospital Tuesday after his health condition deteriorated. Dalai was produced before the district and sessions court Monday in a wheelchair due to his poor health. He has been admitted to the orthopaedics department for treatment.

Dalai has been admitted for medical care in the orthopaedics department.

Police have so far arrested 16 persons in connection with the murder of Pitabas Panda, including former MLA Bikram Panda and former mayor Shibashankar Das, also known as Pintu. All the accused were produced before the court and remanded to judicial custody.

The case was heard on February 9 and subsequently transferred to the court of the Additional District and Sessions Judge-III. The next hearing in the case is scheduled for February 17.

Defence counsel Chakrapani Nahak said the court is expected to hear bail pleas of some of the accused and frame charges on the same day.

The declarations, along with other necessary documents, were formally presented to VIMSAR Director and Dean Pradeep Kumar Mohanty and Head of the Anatomy Department Mamata Sar in the presence of IBODI president Prabhas Acharya, associate professor Sabita Singh, former principal and professor of pharmacology Bhabagri Rath, and organisation members Bipin Panda and Narayan Pradhan.

These donors included both men and women who had earlier taken an oath expressing their consent for body donation.

Speaking on the occasion, Acharya said the institute had so far facilitated pledges from around 50,000 people for organ donation and about 2,600 for body donation. He said such initiatives played a crucial role in strengthening medical education and research.

Sar said medical students showed greater interest in learning from actual human bodies than virtual models, as it significantly aided their understanding of anatomy. She added that the efforts of volunteers encouraging body donation were highly commendable and contributed meaningfully to the training of future doctors.

## Epstein's Sleaze & Politics

Influential people and high dignitaries often willingly get into honey-traps or sex rackets to seek pleasure using their positions. The Dutch dancer Mata Hari used her charm and sexuality during World War I as part of her spying weapon to ferret out secrets from her targeted victims. Italy's Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi organized the infamous "bunga bunga" parties between 2010 and 2011 in his private villa in Arcore, near Milan, for alleged erotic entertainment, including striptease acts by young women, some of whom were reportedly aspiring showgirls. But all these pale into insignificance compared to the sexual exploits influential men from different continents allegedly indulged in as favours from the dubious American financier and human trafficker Jeffrey Epstein. This is because national secrets and trade and commerce have never before been compromised on such a scale as the Epstein files unearthed by US investigators have revealed. These documents demonstrate that unlike Mata Hari or Berlusconi, Epstein and his rich and powerful friends did not remain limited to just sex with young women but more importantly it was the gruesome acts of pedophilia mixed with abominable practice of child sacrifice, drinking the blood of tortured and terrified children and infants and multiple acts that cannot be understood or comprehended, leave alone believed by common people.

Epstein files contain names, references and details of many top world leaders, not just limited to politicians like ministers, Presidents, Prime Ministers, but also judges, top officials, industrialists, business tycoons and billionaires from the US and across the world, including India. Hushed whispers even go as far as to connect the recent US-India trade deal as a product of pressure generated by 'Redacted' Indian names that hold the power of disturbing the power structure in this country.

The UK also is currently in the grip of a severe political crisis in the wake of the disclosures that threaten the survival of British Prime Minister Keir Starmer. The latest casualty is Starmer's chief of staff Morgan Sweeney who has resigned after taking responsibility for backing the appointment of Lord Mandelson as Britain's ambassador to the US, despite what was known about the peer's friendship with Epstein. The resignation was hoped to be a calculated gamble to let the PM off the hook for the role he played in the appointment of Mandelson. But it has compounded matters for Starmer with a call for his own resignation given by Anas Sarwar, Labour's leader in Scotland with ambition to step into Starmer's shoes.

Starmer had earlier sought to deflect the criticism for vetting Mandelson's appointment and indicated that he would move to tighten rules on lobbying, following revelations that Epstein used Mandelson as a conduit for influence and inside information. But Sweeney's exit shows there is deep trouble within the ranks of the ruling Labour Party. Many within the ruling establishment are said to be willing to share Sarwar's view that over the past year and a half there have been "too many incidents where wrong judgment calls have been made."

PM Starmer still has some chance to successfully weather the storm since his would-be challengers are keeping their cards close to their chests. It seems unlikely that any of them would relish the prospect of their party suffering a debacle in elections to several counties in May. Whatever happens, there is no denying the fact his government has now lost control over how events will unfold in the coming months. The Epstein scandal in which two of Starmer's close men have got involved has come as a shot in the arm of the Far-Right political party, Reform UK, of Nigel Farage which seems to have already captured the imagination of a large number of people in that country.

PM Starmer has tried, in the past few days, to insulate himself against the wave of outrage that threatens to engulf him. He condemned in unequivocal terms Mandelson's apparent leaking of market-sensitive information as a cabinet minister in Gordon Brown's government. He has now announced Mandelson will be removed from the privy council.

The Epstein scandal has unnerved Starmer so much that he has been forced to accept the proposal from Kemi Badenoch, the Leader of the Opposition, that all documents relating to Mandelson's appointment should be made public. However, this has landed him in fresh troubles with his own party colleagues questioning the decision to open sensitive documents for public scrutiny.

At the moment there have been a flurry of denials and unconvincing self-defence by many of the bigwigs whose names have figured in the Epstein files for alleged moral turpitude, child trafficking and selling classified information for sexual favours. They have acquired political overtones as an influential elite group of people seemed to have believed itself to be beyond the law. Or, as some claim, so very powerful that no law anywhere can touch them. Time, like many such exposes earlier, may very well never tell whether they were correct since the law is never equal for the weak and the powerful.

**IN A WORLD OF ASYMMETRICAL POWER DYNAMICS AND DEEP INTERDEPENDENCIES, THE ONLY PATH TO STABILITY LIES IN BINDING RULES, CREDIBLE INSTITUTIONS, AND ENDURING ALLIANCES**

The just-concluded talks among representatives of the United States, Russia, and Ukraine in the United Arab Emirates to end Russia's war in Ukraine finished, no surprise, virtually where they began. But the latest effort might shed light on how the US is thinking about Russia's place in the international system – in particular, what a postwar bilateral relationship might look like. Like much of US President Donald Trump's foreign policy, this vision appears to be defined by commercial considerations.

Trump's willingness to put aside human rights or respect for the rule of law in his quest to strike business deals from Pakistan to the Gulf states might look like realpolitik, but Trump's transactional approach should not be mistaken for realism. Whereas a realist foreign policy accounts for constraints, power dynamics, and long-term interests, a transactional approach reduces international politics to a patchwork of narrow bargains. And while realism calls for making the most of norms, alliances, and institutions, transactionalism counsels their evasion or even destruction.

At a time when the postwar order appears to be crumbling, this traditional conception of realism might sound idealistic, and transactional engagement more pragmatic. Unburdened by the responsibility to build institutions or maintain alliances, and unconstrained by principles, a transactional leader, the thinking goes, can deliver results even in challenging circumstances. But the long-term outcomes are likely to be far from desirable.

This is almost certainly the case when it comes to America's emerging approach to Russia. The Trump administration seems to view the end of active hostilities in Ukraine less as an end goal than as an opportunity to begin reconfiguring economic and geopolitical relations with the Kremlin. The gradual rollback of sanctions, technology restrictions, and market barriers will then enable the US to continue to shape outcomes as

it wishes.

Crucially, however, these changes will be applied selectively, with actors being forced to negotiate agreements individually. What were conceived as instruments of broad deterrence – mechanisms for forcing a rogue entity back into a rules-based system – will be wielded to shape incentives within elite structures. This pay-to-play approach, devoid of institutional ambition, can hardly be considered economic statecraft, and it is unlikely to work.

Because commercial considerations are always paramount for Trump, he assumes that the same is true for leaders like Russian President Vladimir Putin, and thus that political agreements are more likely to last if they are embedded in commercial arrangements that increase the costs of reversals or violations. This also explains the administration's belief that a partial normalization of the US-Russia relationship would automatically weaken Russia's relationship with China.

According to this "reverse Nixon" strategy, it does not matter that an ideological realignment is not on the cards; drawing Russia back into some Western-connected infrastructure – financial clearing, technological standards, supply chains – will be enough to weaken Russia's alignment with China. Power, in this view, lies less in alliances than in controlling the architecture of connectivity. The Russian elite thus needs to be brought into Western economic and commercial frameworks through a large number

of narrow, overlapping deals.

Whether these assumptions hold in Russia is far from clear. Nearly four years of war, harsh sanctions, and asset redistribution have further consolidated what was already a highly personalized regime. Personalization increases the internal cost of compromise and narrows the space for durable deal-making. What looks appealing on a balance sheet might be politically untenable in the Kremlin, which must reckon with a population that has absorbed around a million casualties in the Ukraine war.

Even if deals are made, the idea that they can underpin a stable, prosperous system is far-fetched. By privileging personalities over processes, leverage over legitimacy, and speed over sustainability, transactional policymaking erodes predictability, and creates space for rule-breaking. This is not good news for the US: it was by acting as a trusted enforcer of shared rules that America was able to secure and retain the global leadership position that brought it so many advantages over the last several decades. But it is even worse news for Europe.

Ukraine's gradual integration is a central geopolitical project for the European Union. A US-Russia arrangement in which Ukraine is little more than a bargaining chip risks hollowing out this project before it is consolidated. How can the EU anchor Ukraine in its institutional order if Ukraine's future is to reflect a transactional settle-

# Mumbai installs barriers to protect oceans

## BLOCKING THE PLASTIC TIDE

**New Delhi, Feb 10:** At least 61 tonnes of plastic is expected to be recovered every year from Trombay and Malad waterways in Mumbai, where barriers will be installed in phases to stop the flow of plastic waste into the Arabian Sea and the Indian Ocean, officials said Tuesday.

The initiative is being led by The Ocean Cleanup, a Nether-

lands-based non-profit organisation that develops technologies to remove plastic from the oceans, in collaboration with the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai and the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB).

"Mumbai will witness the deployment of barriers to stop the flow of plastic waste into the Arabian Sea and the Indian

Ocean. The first deployments will focus on the Trombay and Malad waterways, identified through a data-driven analysis as significant contributors to ocean-bound plastic waste. The technology is scheduled for deployment over 2026. Once operational, these initial systems are expected to recover 61 to 92 tonnes of plastic per year. Research found that 80

per cent of marine litter along India's coastlines is made up of plastic," the Ocean Cleanup said in a statement.

The deployment, which will kick off before the monsoon season arrives, will take place in phases.

According to a survey conducted by the Ocean Cleanup, Mumbai releases about 5 million kg of plastic waste into the Arabian Sea and the Indian Ocean annually, impacting 220 km of the coastline, 152 sq km of mangroves, 107 protected species and nearly 1.9 million livelihoods dependent on coastal and marine ecosystems.

The primary sources of plastic waste in the city are urban runoff, industrial discharge, and inadequate waste management practices.

"India is a critical geography in the global fight against plastic pollution. With such a large proportion of plastic on India's coasts, stopping waste before it reaches the ocean is crucial in safeguarding the ocean against plastic pollution," said Boyan Slat, Founder and CEO, The

## Ocean Cleanup.

"Through our 30 Cities Programme, Mumbai has been identified as a priority intervention point, and by working closely with local government bodies, implementation partners, NGOs and community partners, we aim to deploy solutions that are not only effective but also deeply aligned with local needs and long-term development goals," Slat added.

Research by The Ocean Cleanup reveals that just 1,000 of the world's 3 million rivers are responsible for nearly 80 per cent of plastic emissions into the ocean.

Through the 30 Cities Programme, The Ocean Cleanup aims to cut one-third of global river-based plastic emissions, using its comprehensive strategy and proven technologies to target 30 of the most polluting urban waterways worldwide.

Mumbai is identified as a critical intervention point due to the scale of plastic leakage and its impact on local communities and ecosystems.

# UP to build 1,680 modern toilets at 640 railway stations

using dirty bathrooms," she told IANS.

Highlighting how railway stations cater to people from all walks of life, Aparna Yadav stressed that women passengers often face discomfort due to a lack of hygienic and safe washroom facilities, especially at stations where existing infrastructure is limited.

"Now, women will not feel uncomfortable. Railway stations are such places where every type of person comes. It is not necessary that only educated people come there. People come from different backgrounds, and rail is such a medium through which people can travel at any time. So, it is a welcoming step. I praise the government and the Railway Department," she added.

As per the plan, the 1,680 toilets will be built at 640 stations, including major stations like Charbagh, Almora, Utrecht, and Malwa. The Railway Board has given in-principle approval to the project, which is estimated to cost around ₹84 crore. An amount of ₹15 crore will be allocated for the first phase of the work.

The lack of toilets for women at railway stations has been a long-standing concern in Uttar Pradesh. The Daily Passengers Association had earlier raised the issue with Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnav, following which the Railways took cognisance and moved ahead with the proposal.

of medical colleges has increased from 36 in 2017 to 81 by the end of 2025, including 45 government and 36 private institutions.

The state currently has 38 state universities and 52 private universities.

According to the Periodic Labour Force Survey 2023-24, 53.2 per cent of the workforce is engaged in agriculture and allied sectors, including 78.8 per cent of working women and 44 per cent of working men. Khanna also told the House that a zero-tolerance policy towards crime has been implemented to strengthen women's safety.

**The survey described the state's fiscal position as balanced, noting that the public debt-to-GSDP ratio declined from 29.3 per cent in 2016-17 to 28.0 per cent in 2024-25, lower than national and global averages.**

## Court frames charges against 27 accused

**Mumbai, Feb 10:** A special court here Tuesday framed charges under MCOCA and BNS against 27 accused in the 2024 murder case of former Maharashtra minister and NCP politician Baba Siddique after they pleaded not guilty.

Framing of charges is the first stage in a criminal trial under the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), where the court formalises accusations based on evidence.

Special Judge Satyanarayan R Navander recorded the pleas of all the accused, who all pleaded not guilty and preferred to stand trial.

Speaker Rather, who repeatedly tried to persuade the members to take their seats, later informed the BJP MLAs that their protest will not be recorded.


Referring to the recent India-US interim trade deal, the chief minister claimed it was detrimental to the interests of Jammu and Kashmir. He also made some remarks against the

When asked about the necessary frequency of the digital safety curriculum, 42 per cent

called for monthly sessions, 35 per cent supported termly programmes, 16 per cent advocated biannual sessions, while only 7 per cent believed annual sessions would be adequate.

When asked about how concerned they were regarding the emerging threats, 40 per cent respondents said they were 'extremely concerned' about students' exposure to inappropriate content and online safety threats, describing it as a daily worry requiring immediate action, while 24 per cent said they were 'moderately concerned', the report said.

However, only 12 per cent felt 'very prepared' to actively address online safety. The majority, 51 per cent indicated they feel 'somewhat prepared' but need more resources and training, while 29 per cent admitted they feel 'minimally prepared' and struggle to keep pace with rapid technology changes," it added.

### 5 of family found dead in Mathura

### SC agrees to hear plea against Sarma

**New Delhi:** The Supreme Court Tuesday agreed to consider listing a plea of Left leaders seeking action against Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma over a viral video allegedly showing him taking aim and firing with a rifle at members of a particular community. Referring to the upcoming Assembly polls in Assam, the top court said that the problem is that a part of the elections is fought before it.

"Over the last few days, Congress leaders have been saying that I have benami land of 12,000 bighas (over 3,960 acres). I have filed a case in court so that they can submit the list before the court itself," Sarma told reporters on the sidelines of an official event in Bongaigaon. He said that if they cannot provide the list, they have to pay him ₹500 crore, he added.

In a post on X earlier, the CM said, "Today, I have filed a defamation case seeking ₹500

crore in damages against Congress leaders Jitendra Singh, Bhupesh Baghel and Gaurav Gogoi for making false, malicious and defamatory allegations against me through a press conference."

Addressing a joint press conference here February 4, state Congress president Gogoi had claimed that the party's "investigation" has revealed that "almost 12,000 bighas of land have been occu-

pied by the CM and his family across the state".

Asked about Congress filing a police complaint in Guwahati against the BJP for circulating a controversial video featuring him on social media, Sarma said he will continue speaking up as he has been doing now.

"It is good that they have filed the case. What does communal mean? You all know who I am against," the CM said, in an apparent reference to his stand against 'illegal Bangladeshis'.

"What will happen to me if a case is filed? For me, white is white, black is black. They cannot frighten me. Sibani Bora, Diganta Barman, their malik Rahul Gandhi can file a case against me. My thumb to them," Sarma added, showing his thumb to the camera.

Congress MLAs Bora and Barman lodged the complaint at Dispur Police Station in Guwahati Tuesday against the Assam BJP for a video on its official social media handle, which showed Sarma purportedly taking aim with a rifle and firing a shot at two people, one wearing a skull cap and the other with a beard, with "point-blank shot" as the caption.

The video, posted Saturday, was deleted after a massive political backlash.

Sarma had Monday claimed ignorance of the video, even as Gogoi accused the CM of "inciting genocide" against Muslims through his videos, and urged the police to take suo motu cognisance.

### Bengal para-teachers hold protest march

### ED files money laundering case in Tirupati laddu case


**Amaravati/New Delhi:** The Enforcement Directorate has registered a money laundering case to probe an alleged ghee adulteration scam linked to the preparation of 'laddu prasadam' at the famous Tirumala temple in Andhra Pradesh's Tirupati, officials said. The federal probe agency booked a case under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) sometime back to probe the alleged proceeds of crime or illicit funds generated by the accused, they said. The ED is looking at the FIR, documents and chargesheet filed recently in the case by a CBI-led special investigation team (SIT), the officials said. The SIT has named 36 people, including nine Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) officials and five dairy experts, as accused in the matter. As per the findings of the SIT, the original material which was sold to the Sri Venkateswara Swamy temple body as ghee was chemically processed palmolein oil and other ingredients.

### Bishnoi gang claims responsibility for killing businessman

**New Delhi:** A day after a 35-year-old businessman was shot dead in the Bawana industrial area here, a social media post purportedly issued in the name of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang Tuesday claimed responsibility for the killing. Investigators said that four men were involved in the attack, during which the assailants first attempted to snatch the keys of the victim's car, forcibly took away his laptop bag when he resisted, and then shot him at close range. Multiple teams have been formed to verify the authenticity of the post and trace the assailants.

### Insta user claims Moga shooting; two injured

**Chandigarh, Feb 10:** Two migrant labourers sustained bullet injuries after three unidentified persons on a motorcycle allegedly opened fire at a group of workers in Punjab's Moga district Tuesday, police said.

Following the incident, an unverified post surfaced on Instagram in which an user by the name of Nirvair Singh claimed responsibility for the firing. The post also contains a purported video of the incident.

"The firing that took place on people from UP and Bihar was carried out by us -- Ladi Bhalwan and Nirvair Singh," the purported post claimed.

The post said the firing was carried out in an act of "protest" against these migrant workers who "spoil" the atmosphere of Punjab. It also warned of more violence if migrant workers continued to be employed.

The incident is being seen as the first such instance where migrant labourers have been targeted in such a manner in Punjab.

The alleged incident occurred on Zira road when some labourers were going for a meal after their work at a factory.

Three unidentified men arrived on a motorcycle and one of them allegedly fired at the labourers, injuring two of the workers, police said. It is alleged that one of the assailants even filmed the firing incident, they added. Police said three to four rounds were fired. "We have some clues and we will catch them soon," said Moga Senior Superintendent of Police Ajay Gandhi.

# Advance notice may hinder IT raids: SC

**New Delhi, Feb 10:** The Supreme Court Tuesday highlighted the practical difficulties faced by investigators in the digital age and said giving a prior notice before a search and seizure could effectively end an investigation before it begins.

The top court was hearing a PIL challenging the scope of search and seizure powers under Section 132 of the Income Tax Act on the ground that it has the potential of misuse by the authorities.

**Section 132 of the Income Tax Act empowers IT officials to conduct a search and seizure when they have "reason to believe" that a person has undisclosed income, assets, or documents**

cases, particularly in the digital era.

Justice Bagchi said giving advance notice could defeat the very purpose of an investigation, as electronic evidence can be easily destroyed.

"If notice is given for search and seizure, there is a potential for destroying the evidence. The best way to snub out such an investigation against the digital record is to destroy the device itself," he said.

# India jumps 5 places on Corruption Perceptions Index

**New Delhi, Feb 10:** India climbed five places to the 91st position out of 182 countries and territories on the Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI) 2025 released Tuesday.

India's score has gone up by one point since previous year while its rank has improved from the 96th position, according to the global NGO Transparency International's latest CPI.

There has been a slow growth in anti-corruption progress in Asia Pacific as many countries witnessed public anger in the previous year, the Berlin-based anti-corruption watchdog's report said.

"Leaders must act to tackle abuses of power and the wider factors driving this decline, such as the roll-back of democratic checks and balances, and attacks on independent civil society," the report said.



#### 12 killed, 8 hurt as bus falls into river

**Kathmandu:** Twelve people were killed and eight others injured Tuesday after a passenger bus fell into a river in central Nepal, police said. The incident occurred around 11 am when the bus enroute to Okhaldhunga from Kathmandu fell into the Tamakoshi River in Ramechhap municipality in Bagmati province, 150 km east of Kathmandu, they said. Twelve people were killed in the accident, police said. Ten of the 12 deceased passengers were identified, Manthali Hospital Medical Superintendent Dr Keshab Singh Dhami was reported as saying by The Himalayan Times.

#### Israeli strikes kill 5 in Gaza

**Cairo:** Israeli airstrikes and gunfire killed five Palestinians in Gaza Tuesday, health officials said, the latest violence to undermine a four-month-old, US-brokered truce in the enclave. In Deir Al-Balah in central Gaza, an airstrike killed two people who were riding an electric bike, medics said. Later, Israeli drone fire killed a woman in Deir Al-Balah and troops shot dead a man in Khan Younis in the south, they said. Another man was killed by Israeli gunfire in Jabalia in north Gaza, Palestinian medics said.

#### Indian Students' attacker remanded

**Moscow:** The 15-year-old juvenile, who attacked and wounded four Indian medical students and two police officers Saturday, pleaded guilty and was remanded to two months' judicial custody Tuesday. The teenager, a student of class IX of a local school, pleaded guilty and apologised to his victims for causing suffering to them, Bashinform agency reported. He was produced in the Ufa court and has been remanded for two months of judicial custody till April 7, according to reports from the capital of Bashkortostan, 1200 km east of Moscow. He faces up to a 15-year sentence for the knife attack on four Indian students and two police officers.

#### Immigration chiefs to testify in Congress

**Washington:** The heads of the agencies carrying out President Donald Trump's mass deportation agenda will testify in Congress Tuesday and face questions over how they are prosecuting immigration enforcement inside American cities. Trump's immigration campaign has been heavily scrutinised in recent weeks, after the shooting deaths in Minneapolis of two protesters at the hands of Homeland Security officers.

# China ramps up Taiwan rhetoric

China to support 'reunification forces' in Taiwan, go after 'separatists'

**Beijing, Feb 10:** China will offer firm support for "patriotic pro-reunification forces" in Taiwan and strike hard against "separatists", the top Chinese official in charge of policy towards the democratically-governed island said in comments published Tuesday.

China, which views Taiwan as its own territory despite the objections of the government in Taipei, has ramped up its military and political pressure against the island as Beijing seeks to assert its sovereignty claims.

Addressing this year's annual "Taiwan Work Conference", a key meeting which sets the tone for China's policy towards the island, the ruling Communist Party's fourth-ranked leader Wang Huning said officials must advance the "great cause of national reunification", the official state-run Xinhua news agency said.

phrased him as saying. Taiwan's government, which says only the island's people can decide their future, said in response to Wang's remarks that he was repeating the usual Chinese talking points about opposing separatism and taking eventual control of the island.

China's "ultimate goal is to eliminate the Republic of China and advance unification," Taiwan's China-policy making Mainland Affairs Council said in a statement, referring to the island's formal name.

While the Xinhua report made no mention of the use of force, China has never renounced using military means to bring Taiwan under its control, the Chinese defence ministry struck a stronger note commenting on Taiwanese military deployments.

"If the 'Taiwan independence' armed forces dare to provoke a conflict, they will inevitably be wiped out," ministry spokesperson Jiang Bin said Tuesday in Beijing.

#### 'ONE COUNTRY, TWO SYSTEMS'

China has long offered Taiwan a Hong Kong-style "one country, two systems" model of autonomy, though no major Taiwanese political party supports that.

Taiwan's government says Beijing's rule in the former British colony has only brought repression, with Taiwan President Lai Ching-te Tuesday citing the sentencing of Hong Kong tycoon Jimmy Lai to 20 years in prison the previous day.

Bangladesh will hold parliamentary elections February 12 - the first since the ouster of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in massive country protests in August 2024.

# Trump set to repeal landmark climate finding

**Washington, Feb 10:** The Trump administration is set this week to overturn an Obama-era scientific finding that serves as the legal basis for federal greenhouse-gas regulation, the Environmental Protection Agency said Monday.

Repealing the so-called endangerment finding, a scientific determination that greenhouse gas emissions endanger human health, would remove the legal foundation for broader greenhouse gas regulation and would mark the Trump administration's most wide-reaching climate policy rollback.

The Wall Street Journal reported Monday that the repeal is expected to be published later this week, and cited EPA Administrator Lee Zeldin saying it would amount to "the largest act of deregulation in the history of the United States."

The Trump administration has been working on the repeal for over a year. The proposed rule was sent to the White House Office of Management and Budget for review January 7. The proposal, unveiled last summer, got over a half a million public comments.

The repeal would remove the regulatory requirements to measure, report, certify, and comply with federal GHG emission standards for cars, administration officials told the Wall Street Journal, but would not apply to stationary sources such as power plants.

An EPA spokesperson said the endangerment finding was used by the Obama and Biden Administrations to "justify trillions of dollars of greenhouse gas regulations covering new vehicles and engines."

# Lavrov accuses US of blocking Russian oil buyers

**Moscow, Feb 10:** Russia has accused the US of attempting to prevent India and other countries from buying Russian oil, saying Washington is using a wide range of "coercive" measures, including tariffs, sanctions and direct prohibitions, to fulfil its objective of global economic dominance.

Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov also accused the US of using "unfair methods" to suppress competitors by imposing sanctions on Russian oil companies. "The US is attempting to

control our trade, investment cooperation, and military-technical ties with major strategic partners, such as India and other BRICS members," Lavrov said in an interview with TV BRICS Monday.

He said that the West is reluctant to relinquish its formerly dominant positions. "With the arrival of the (US President Donald) Trump administration, this struggle to suppress competitors became particularly pronounced and open," he said.

Lavrov said that Russia accepted America's proposal on Ukraine during the Alaska

talks between President Vladimir Putin and his US counterpart Trump last year.

"We were told that the Ukrainian issue must be resolved. In Anchorage, we accepted the United States' proposal. To put it straightforwardly, they proposed, and we agreed - the problem should be solved," he said.

"Having accepted their proposals, we essentially fulfilled the task of resolving the Ukrainian issue and moving toward comprehensive, broad, mutually beneficial cooperation," he added.

"In practice, however, the opposite occurs: new sanctions are imposed, attacks on tankers are staged in international waters in violation of the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea, and India and other partners are discouraged from purchasing affordable Russian energy, while Europe has long prohibited such purchases, forcing them to buy American liquefied natural gas at significantly higher prices. Thus, in the economic sphere, the US has effectively declared a goal of economic domination," he said.

# Tariffs threaten Colombian flower industry amid Valentine's Day rush

**Bogota, Feb 10:** Millions of Colombian roses arrived in the US just in time for Valentine's Day, but growing economic challenges are threatening to wilt the romance for the world's second-largest flower exporter.

Colombia, which trails only the Netherlands in global exports, shipped approximately 65,000 tons of fresh-cut blooms between January 15 and February 9. The Valentine's Day season typically accounts for 20% of annual sales for a sector that serves as the primary supplier to the US market, according to industry group Asocolflores.

Growers are also battling a peso that has strengthened almost 12% against the dollar over the past year and a 23% rise in minimum wage, factors that are eroding competitiveness and squeezing margins.

"We are in very adverse, very complicated situations," said Jose Antonio Restrepo, manager of Ayure SAS Eclipse Flowers near Bogota. Without a shift in economic conditions,

**Critical minerals deals: India in talks with Brazil, Canada, France, Netherlands**

**New Delhi, Feb 10:** India is in talks with Brazil, Canada, France and the Netherlands over deals to jointly explore, extract, process and recycle critical minerals, sources said, as it broadens its global outreach to secure supplies of key raw materials.

The focus would be on lithium and rare earths, and India would also seek access to mineral-processing technologies, the sources said, declining to be identified because the discussions are confidential.

Heavy reliance on arch rival China, which dominates global supplies of many minerals and has advanced mining and processing technology, underscores the need for India to reach out to a range of countries as it accelerates its energy transition to cut emissions, mining experts said.

However, from discovery to production, mining can take years, as exploration alone runs five to seven years and often ends without a viable mine.

India aims to replicate elements of a critical minerals agreement it signed with Germany in January, which covers exploration, processing and recycling, as well as the acquisition and development of mineral assets in both countries and in third countries, one of the sources said.

There are requests and we are talking to France, Netherlands and Brazil while the agreement with Canada is under active consideration, the source said.

The Ministry of Mines is leading the effort, the sources said.

Canada's Prime Minister Mark Carney is likely to visit India in early March and sign deals on uranium, energy, minerals and artificial intelligence.

Asked for comment, Canada's Natural Resources Department referred to a January statement saying both sides had agreed to formalise cooperation on critical minerals in the coming weeks.

Brazil's embassy in New Delhi, India's Ministry of Mines and the foreign ministry did not respond to Reuters' requests for comment. The embassy of the Netherlands did not comment while the embassy of France declined to comment.

India has been scouting globally for critical minerals and has signed pacts with Argentina, Australia, and Japan, and is in talks with Peru and Chile on broader bilateral agreements that also cover critical minerals.

India's expanding international engagement comes at a time when finance ministers from the G7 and other major economies met in Washington last month to discuss ways to cut dependence on rare earths from China.

In 2023, India identified more than 20 minerals, including lithium, as critical for its energy transition and to meet rising demand from industry and the infrastructure sector.

# Gold ETF inflows top equity mutual funds for first time

**New Delhi, Feb 10:** Equity mutual funds attracted net inflows of Rs 24,028 crore in January, a slump of 14 per cent from the previous month, as investor sentiment remained cautious amid subdued market conditions and ongoing geopolitical concerns.

This was the second consecutive month of moderation in equity inflows.

Over the past several months, equity markets have delivered muted returns, while commodities, especially gold and silver, have seen strong momentum.

As a result, a portion of investor money shifted toward commodities during this period, Swapnil Aggarwal, Director, VSRK Capital, said.

Gold exchange-traded funds (ETFs) recorded a sharp surge in inflows in January, attracting Rs 24,040 crore -- more than double from Rs 11,647 crore in the preceding month -- as gold prices climbed amid rising geopolitical risks.

With this, inflows into gold ETFs marginally surpassed those into equity mutual funds for the very first time.

According to data released by Association of Mutual Funds in India (Amfi) on Tuesday, equity inflows softened sequentially from Rs 28,054 crore in December and Rs 29,911 crore in November, although they remained higher than Rs 24,690 crore recorded in October.

Himanshu Srivastava, Principal Research, Morningstar Investment Research India, said the flows remained constructive despite bouts of market volatility, supported by steady SIP contributions and continued confidence in the long-term structural growth prospects of Indian equities.

Retail participation through systematic investment plans (SIPs) remained steady at Rs



31,000 crore in January, suggesting their preference for disciplined and long-term wealth creation strategies.

According to Srivastava, the moderation in equity inflows was largely driven by cooling momentum in the mid and small-cap segments. While the categories continued to attract healthy inflows, the pace slowed sharply compared with the preceding month, reflecting elevated valuations and recent corrections prompting investors to adopt a more cautious and selective approach.

Mid and small-cap attracted inflows of Rs 3,185 crore and Rs 2,942 crore, respectively. This was a sharp decline compared with Rs 4,176 crore and Rs 3,824 crore in December.

Within equity schemes, flexi-cap funds led inflows with net additions of Rs 7,672 crore, besides, large &amp; mid-cap funds added Rs 3,182 crore and large-cap funds attracted net inflows of Rs 2,005 crore.

In contrast, equity-linked savings schemes (ELSS) witnessed net outflows of Rs 594 crore, reflecting some profit booking and tax-related adjustments by investors.

Going ahead, flow into equity mutual fund inflows is expected to gradually improve

as investor interest returns to the equity segment, VSRK Capital's Aggarwal said.

"With valuations becoming more reasonable and market consolidation largely behind us, equities are well-positioned for a stronger performance in the current calendar year, with the potential for meaningful returns as sentiment and participation improve," he added.

Despite the slowdown in equity investments, the mutual fund industry's overall asset base continued to expand. Total assets under management (AUM) rose to Rs 81.01 lakh crore in January from Rs 80.23 lakh crore in December.

Overall, the industry recorded net inflow of Rs 1.56 lakh crore during the month, recovering from net outflow of Rs 66,591 crore in December, supported by inflows across multiple fund categories.

Debt mutual funds also staged a turnaround, recording net inflow of Rs 74,827 crore in January after witnessing significant outflow of Rs 1.32 lakh crore in the previous month and Rs 25,692 crore in November. This suggests strong preference for fixed income and liquidity products as part of overall asset allocation.

# FDI in banking sector down from \$898mn in FY23 to \$115mn in FY25

**New Delhi, Feb 10:** Foreign direct investment (FDI) equity inflow in the banking sector has declined from USD 898 million in FY23 to USD 115 million in FY25, Parliament was informed on Tuesday.

Total FDI inflow includes equity inflow, equity capital of unincorporated bodies, re-invested earnings, and other capital, Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary said in a written reply in the Rajya Sabha.

FDI is considered as a major source of non-debt financial resource for the economic development, he said.

He further said, FDI flows into India have grown consistently since liberalization and are an important component of foreign capital since FDI infuses long term sustainable capital in the economy and contributes towards technology transfer, development of strategic sectors, greater innovation, competition and employment creation amongst other benefits.

As per Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Master Directions on 'Acquisition and holding of shares or voting rights in Banking Companies', he said, share acquisition of a bank resulting in any person owning or controlling 5 per cent or more of the paid-up capital of the bank, requires prior approval of RBI.

The Reserve Bank of India has, from time to time, issued a number of instructions/guidelines to banks to regulate Priority Sector Lending (PSL) which is applicable to all commercial banks unless otherwise provided, he added.

Sharing details for foreign shareholding including FDI, FPI/FII/NRI/OCB holdings in public sector banks, Chaudhary said, foreign holding in



State Bank of India (SBI) stood at 11.07 per cent at the end of March 2025, the highest in state-owned banks.

SBI was followed by Canara Bank with 10.55 per cent at the end of financial year 2024-25, Bank of Baroda at 9.43 per cent, Union Bank of India 7.48 per cent and Punjab National Bank at 5.85 per cent, he said.

Replying to another question, Chaudhary said, more than 56.31 crore mudra loan accounts, amounting to Rs 37.31 lakh crore have been disbursed as on January 2, 2026, under the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY), since the launch of the Scheme.

The data is being uploaded by Member Lending Institutions (MLIs) on the Mudra portal, maintained by Mudra Ltd, he said.

In another response, he said, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) receives complaints from investors on various issues, including those relating to misleading claims and advice disseminated by unauthorised persons on social media platforms.

"SEBI has been taking enforcement action, as per extant regulations, against entities providing unregistered investment advisory services, including issuance of enforcement and interim orders, wherever required. Such actions, inter alia, include directions for refund to aggrieved investors," he said.

Later in the junior women's 3P final, India's Prachi Gaikwad emerged triumphant with a score of 353.3. 14-year-old Kazakh shooter Tomiris Amanova won silver with 351.4 while Anushka Thokur bagged another bronze for the hosts with an effort which ended after the 34th shot at 341.1.

Prachi, Anushka and Hazel also won the team gold in the event with a tally of 1748, seven clear of team Kazakhstan. In the senior women's 3P, the Kazak shooters turned the tables on the Indians by four points, to win gold with

a combined score of 1760.

Paris Olympian and bronze medallist in the Buenos Aires World Cup last year, Ariana Malinovskaya topped the women's 3P qualification field with a score of 588 after 20 shots each in the kneeling, prone and standing positions.

Anjum shot 587 to take second spot while Ashi Chouksey was fourth with 586. Aakriti took the sixth qualifying spot with a total of 583 while the winner Shulzhenko shot 587 to take third spot behind Anjum.

In the final, the three Indians were on top after the first kneeling position with Aakriti in the lead, but Shulzhenko had a strong display in the second prone position to rise up to second.

Thereafter, she was the only

shooter to log above 50 points in both the five-shot series of the standing position, to take a decisive lead, which kept stretching till the end as her challengers faded out.

Also on the day, Adarsh Singh of India took pole position after the first precision round in the 25m rapid-fire pistol men's competition, with a score of 291/300.

Favourite Anish Bhanwala shot 287 to remain in contention for a finals berth while Neeraj Kumar's 277 meant that he would have to work hard on Wednesday to make the finals cut, which will follow the second rapid-fire round.

India's medal tally currently stands at 39 gold, 15 silver and 12 bronze medals and they comfortably head the standings.

**Karachi, Feb 10:** The ICC has promised a few concessions to the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) for ending its boycott of the India game but those will only be announced after the conclusion of the T20 World Cup, a source said Tuesday.

"Whatever concessions the PCB has got from the ICC on ending their boycott will only be made public after the end of T20 World Cup," a PCB source told PTI Tuesday.

The ICC has already announced that Bangladesh Cricket Board will not face any sanctions from the global body and will also be given an ICC event in the 2028-2031 cycle (preferably U19 men's World Cup).

Pakistan Prime Minister

Shehzad Sharif announced that the national would boycott the T20 World Cup group league match against India in Colombo February 15 in solidarity with Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB), who were replaced after refusing to play their matches in India citing security reasons.

After hectic parleys and back-channel talks which also included intervention from Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayake and the Bangladesh Cricket Board, which requested Shahbaz Sharif to change their stance keeping broader interests in mind, the boycott did end on Monday night.

The PCB has now also been given clearance to play India if both countries have to face off again in the latter stages of the World Cup.
